FOREWORD

We are happy to bring this report on the IV All India Educational Survey in Karnataka sponsored by the Government of India and administered through NCERT.

The Government of India have accorded high priority to the programme of universalisation of elementary education in the Sixth Plan. Realisation of the goals of Universalisation of elementary education and the implementation of the scheme in the Country called for the provision of schooling facilities in the individual habitations, increasing proportion of enrolment and improving the basic facilities in schools. All these had to be made on the basis of an up to date baseline data. This necessitated the conduct of IV All India Educational Survey.

The data collected in this survey will provide adequate basis for redistribution of existing facilities on a rational basis and for planning new developmental proposals.

This report provides a comprehensive analysis of the data collected for the different stages of education highlighting the specific issues that may need immediate attention. An attempt is also made to provide interdistrict comparisons and identify the possible solutions. This report serves as a guideline for future planning of educational development in the State.

All the Survey Officers have contributed equally in the compilation of statistical data and preparation of the report. I would like to express my appreciation of the work of the Assistant Educational Officers, District Survey Officers and the Staff of the State Survey Unit.

I also would like to record my appreciation of the Officers of the other Departments who have co-operated in this endeavour. I am particularly grateful to the Officers of the N.C.E.R.T. for their valuable guidance to our staff at all stages of the Survey.

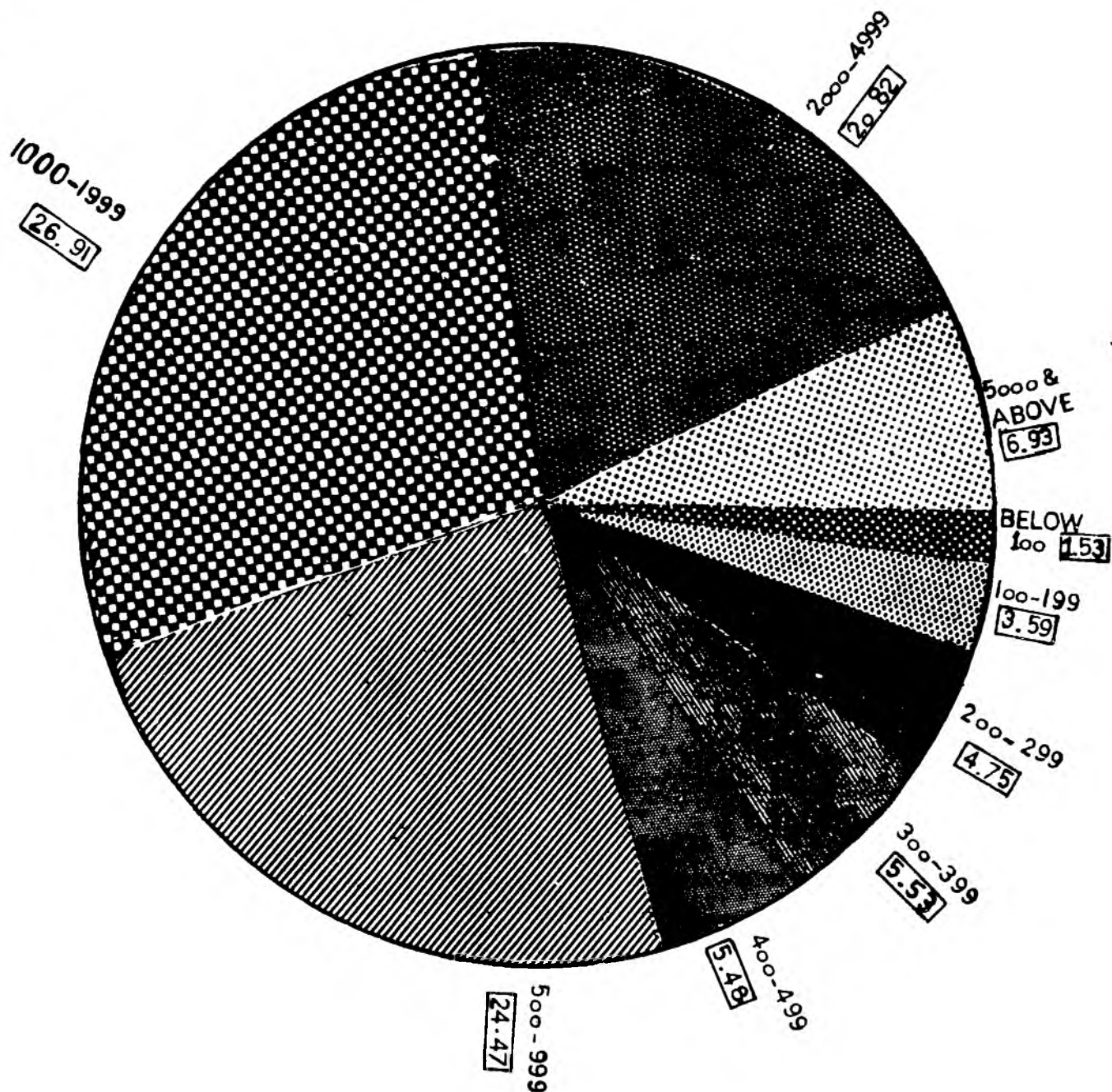

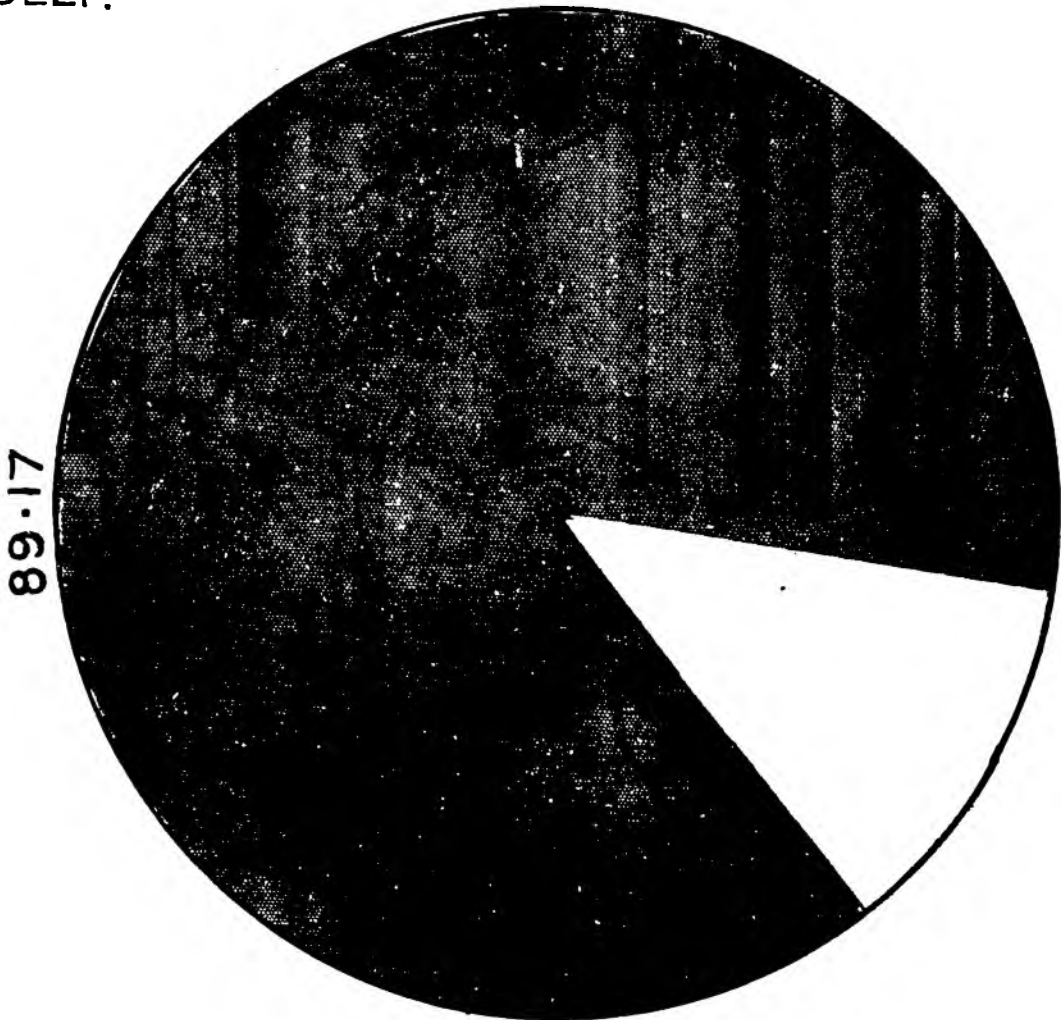

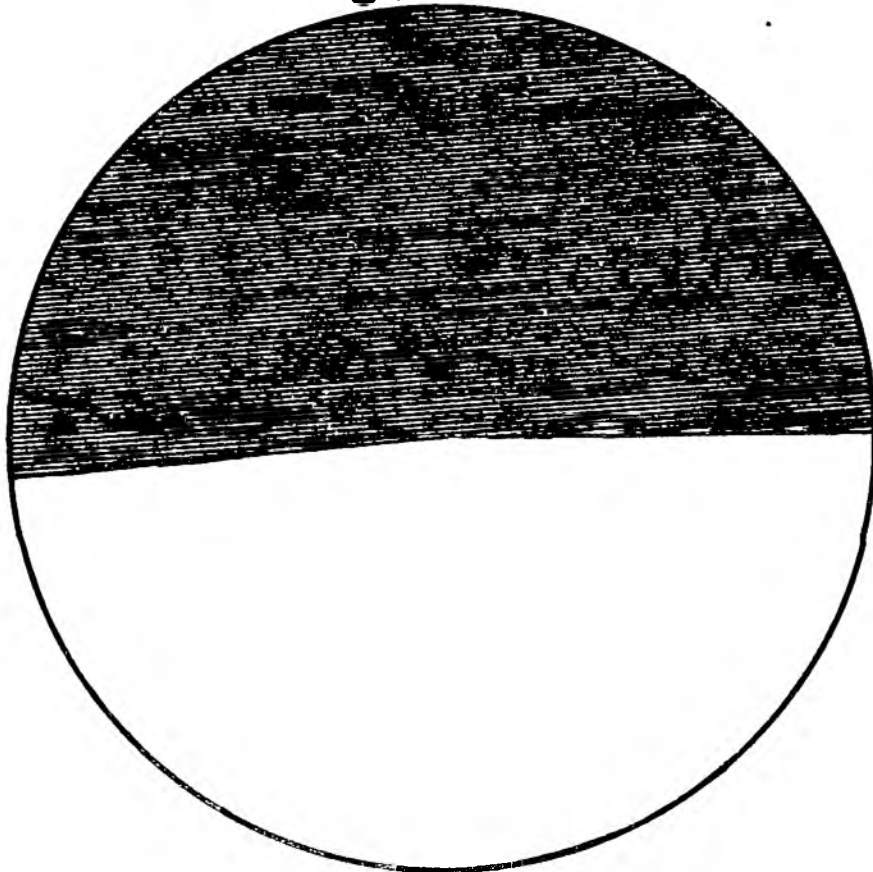
POPULATION SERVED WITH SCHOOLING FACILITY.



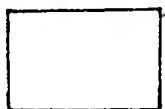

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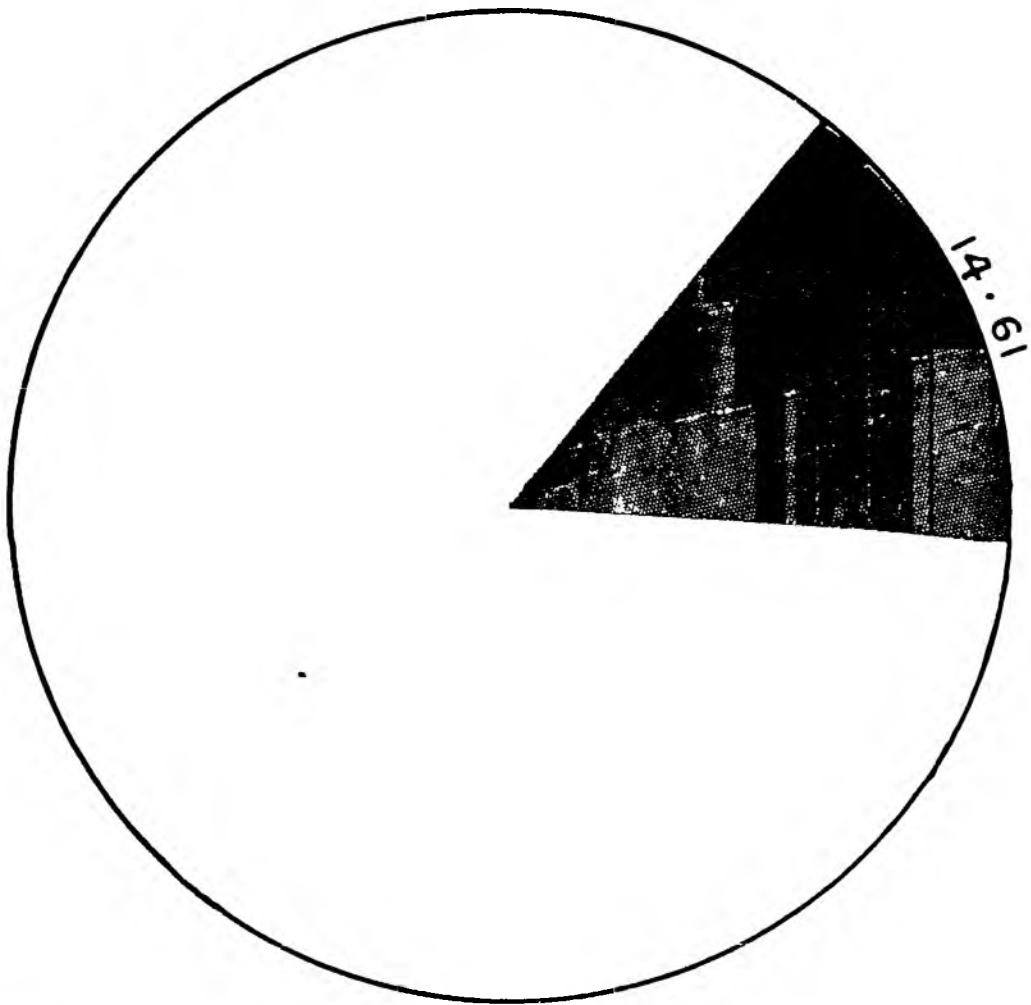


POPULATION SERVED WITH SCHOOLING FACILITY

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SEC-SCHOOLING FACILITY IN THE HABITATION ITSELF

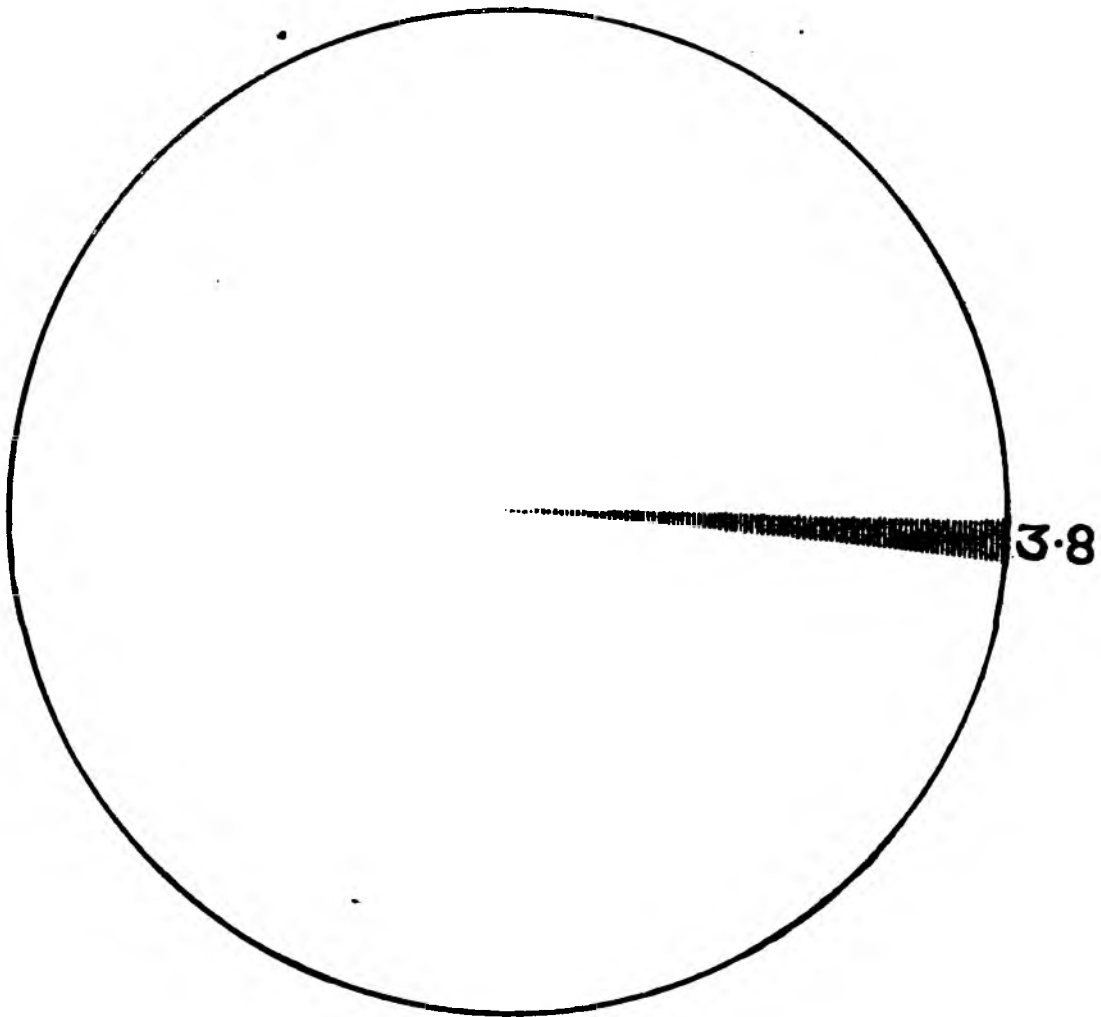


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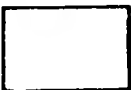

POPULATION IN RURAL AREAS SERVED WITH
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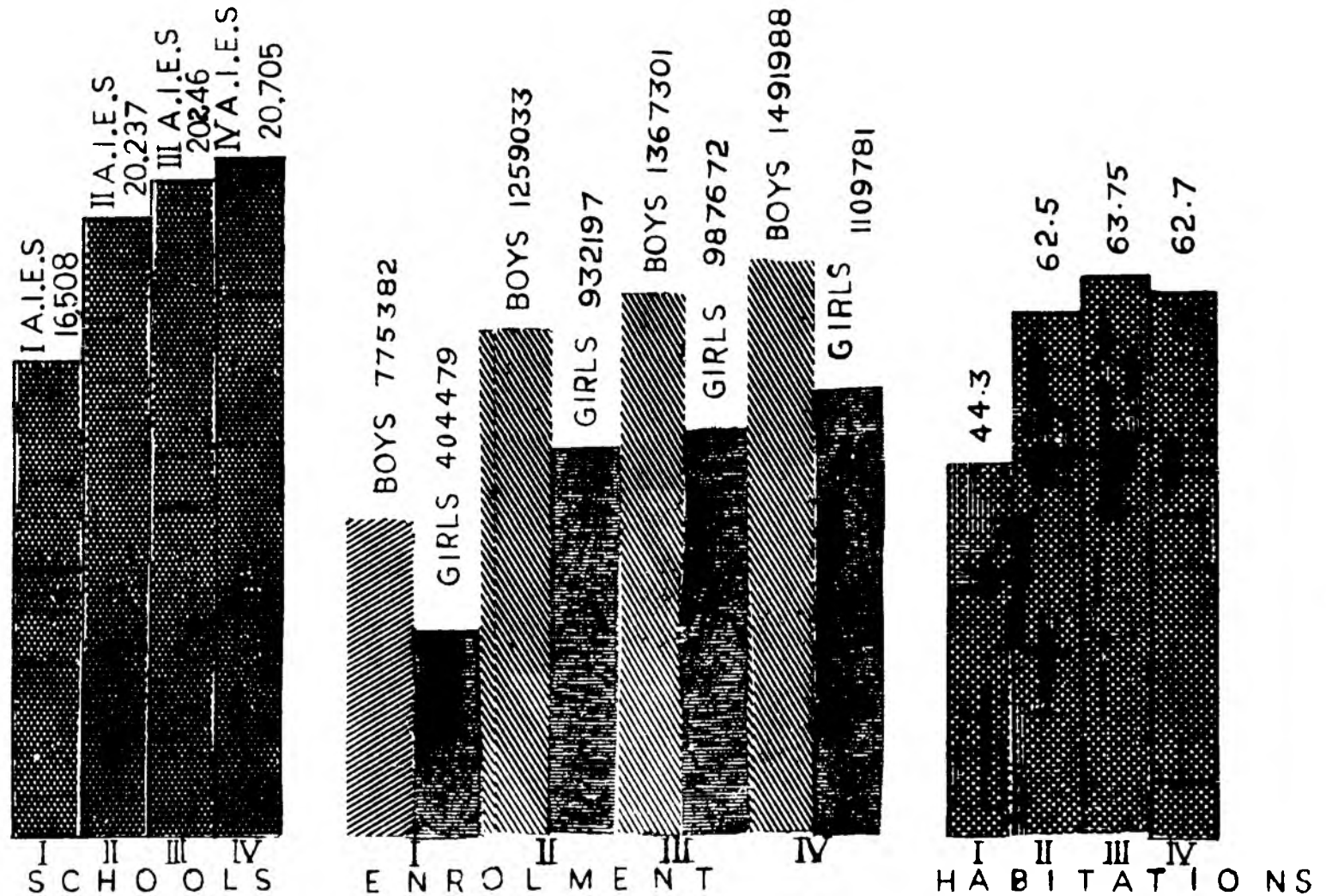


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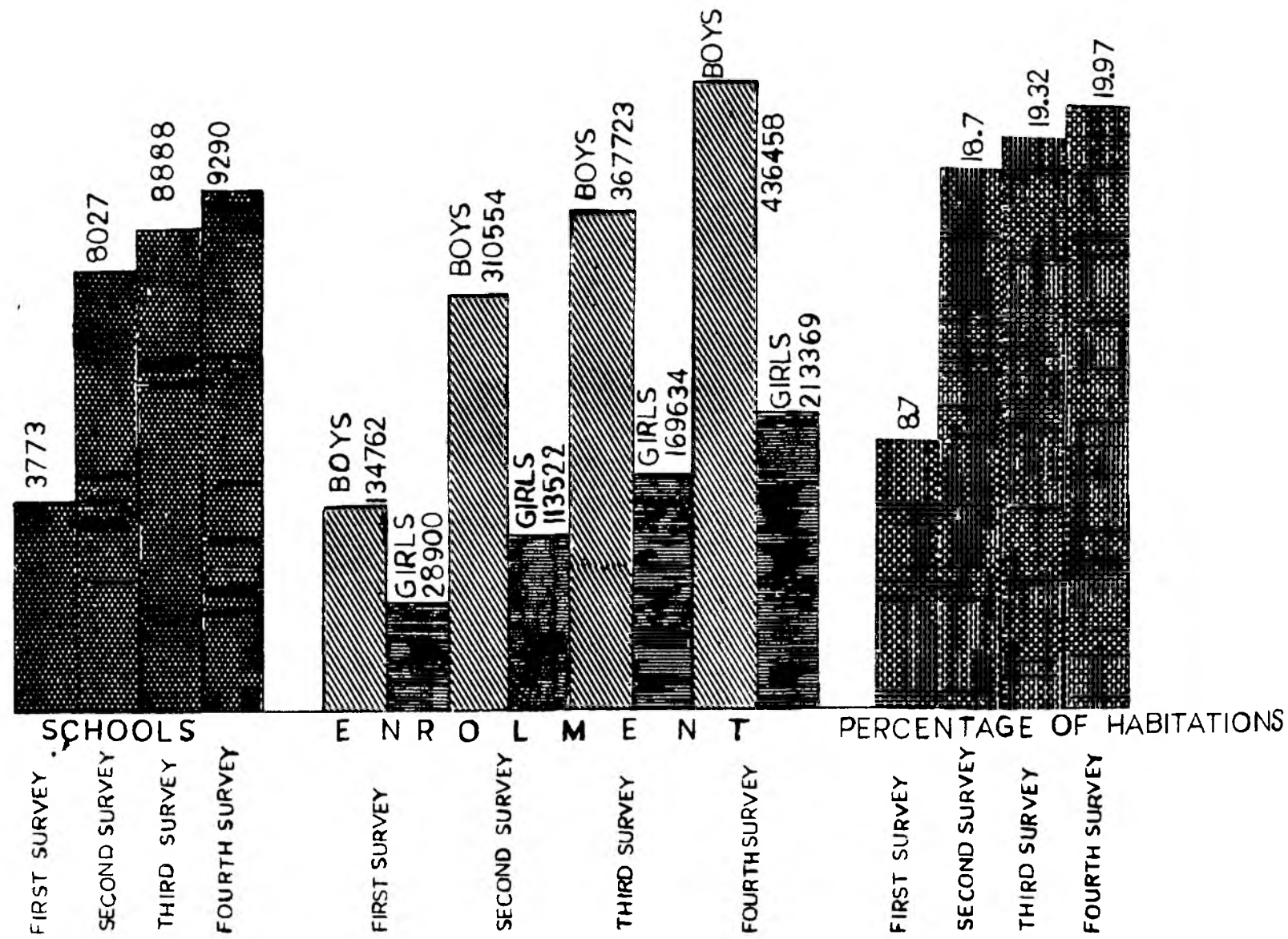


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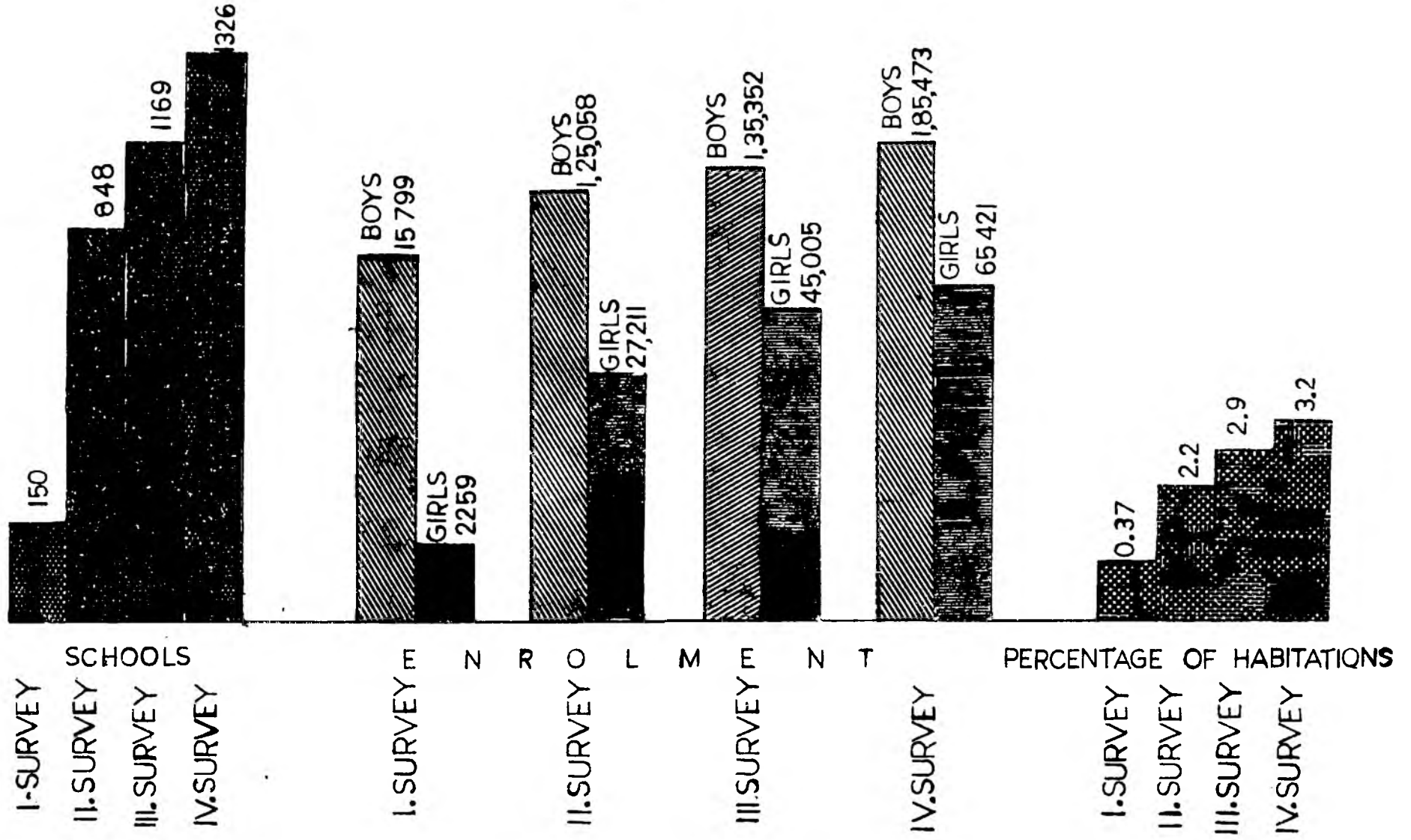

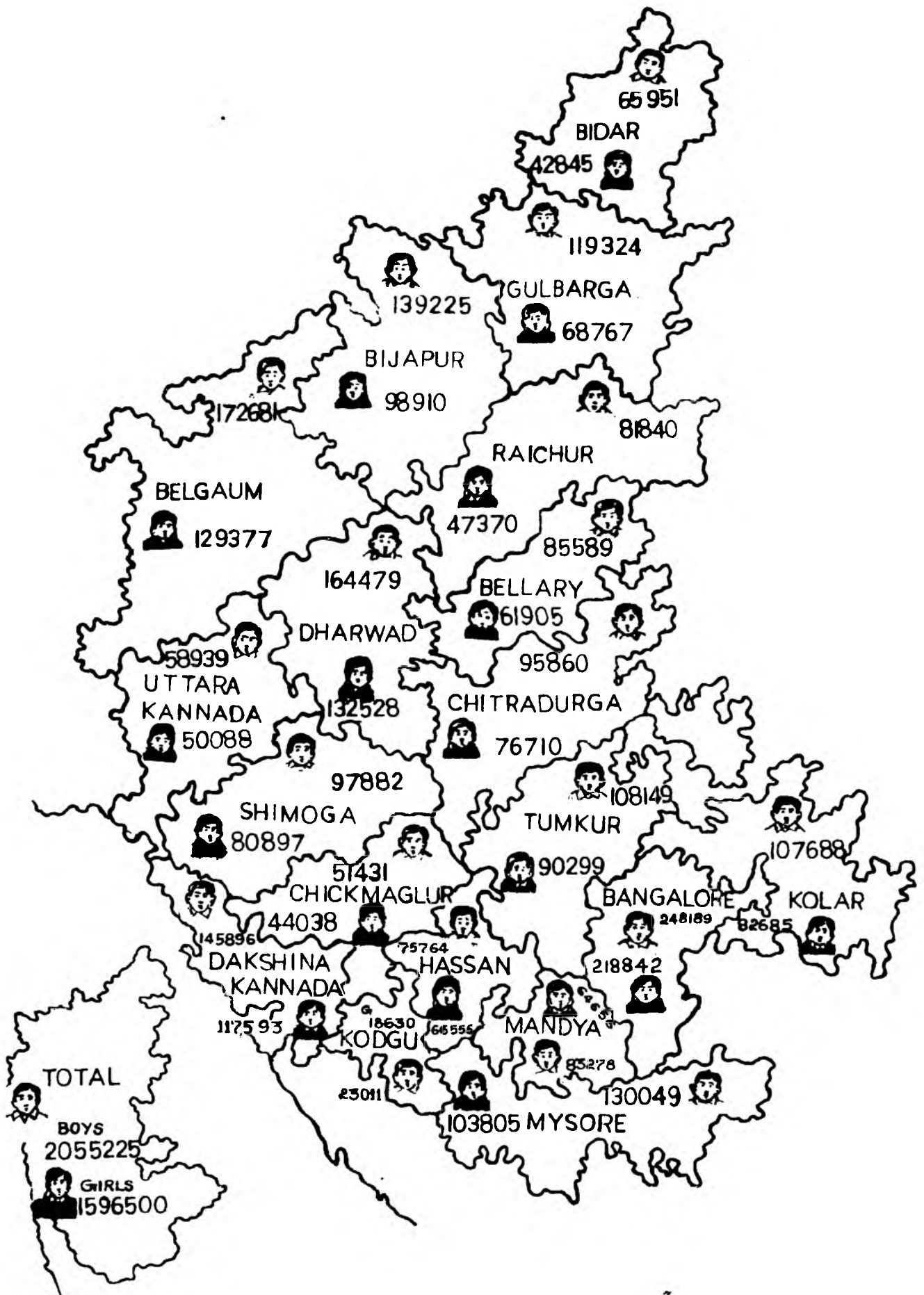

ENROLMENT IN PRIMARY STAGE.



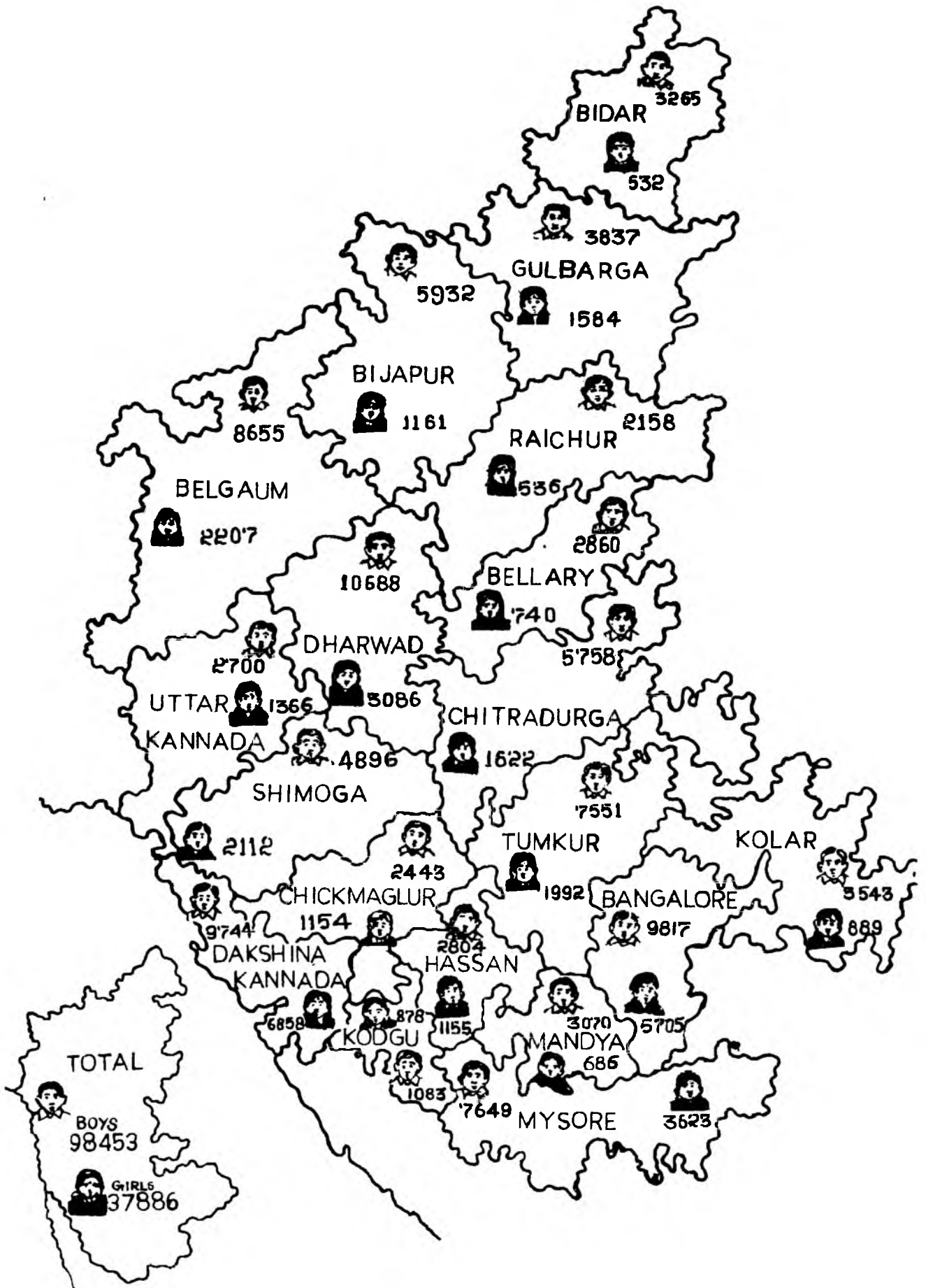
ENROLMENT IN MIDDLE STAGE.

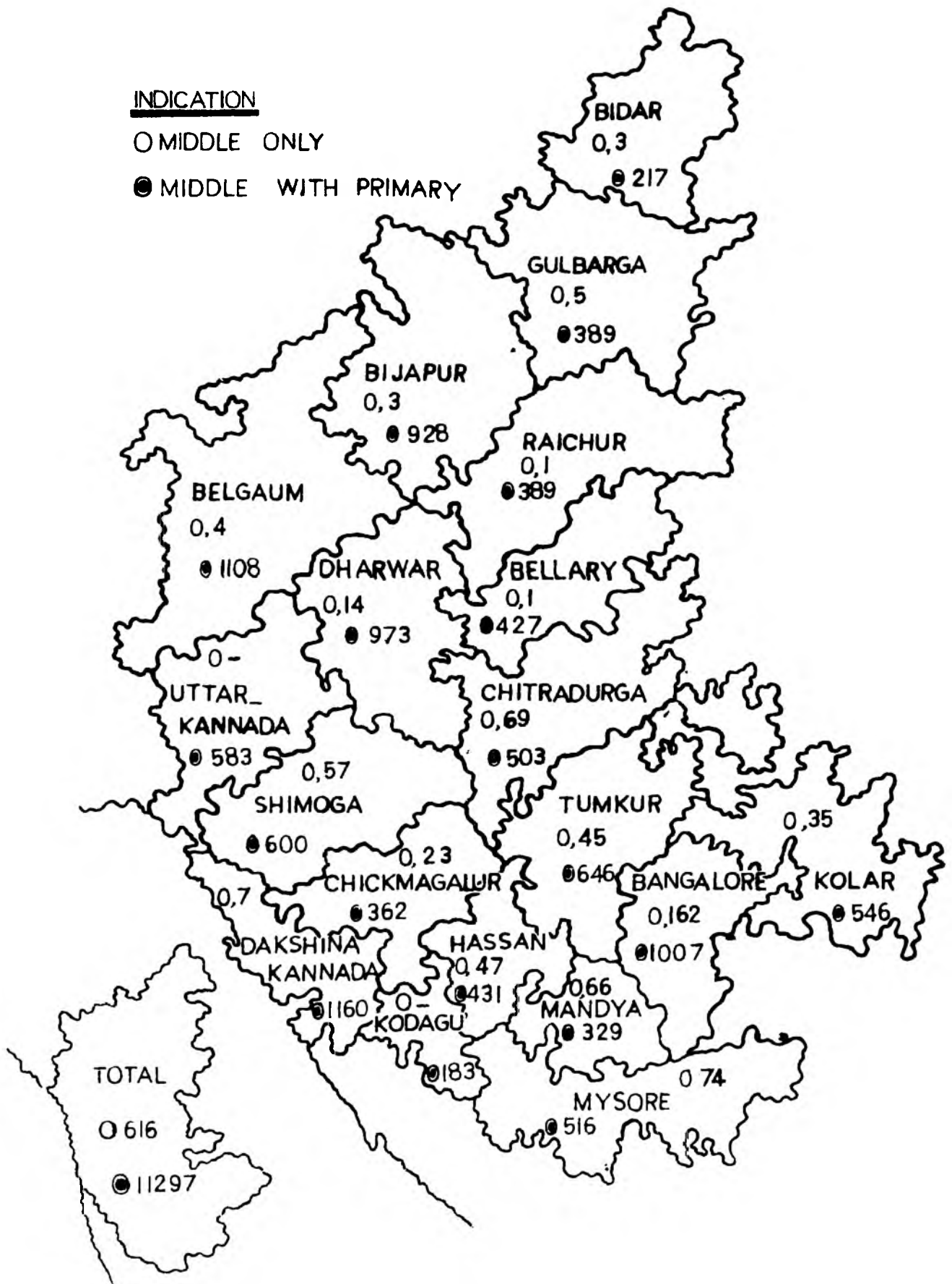

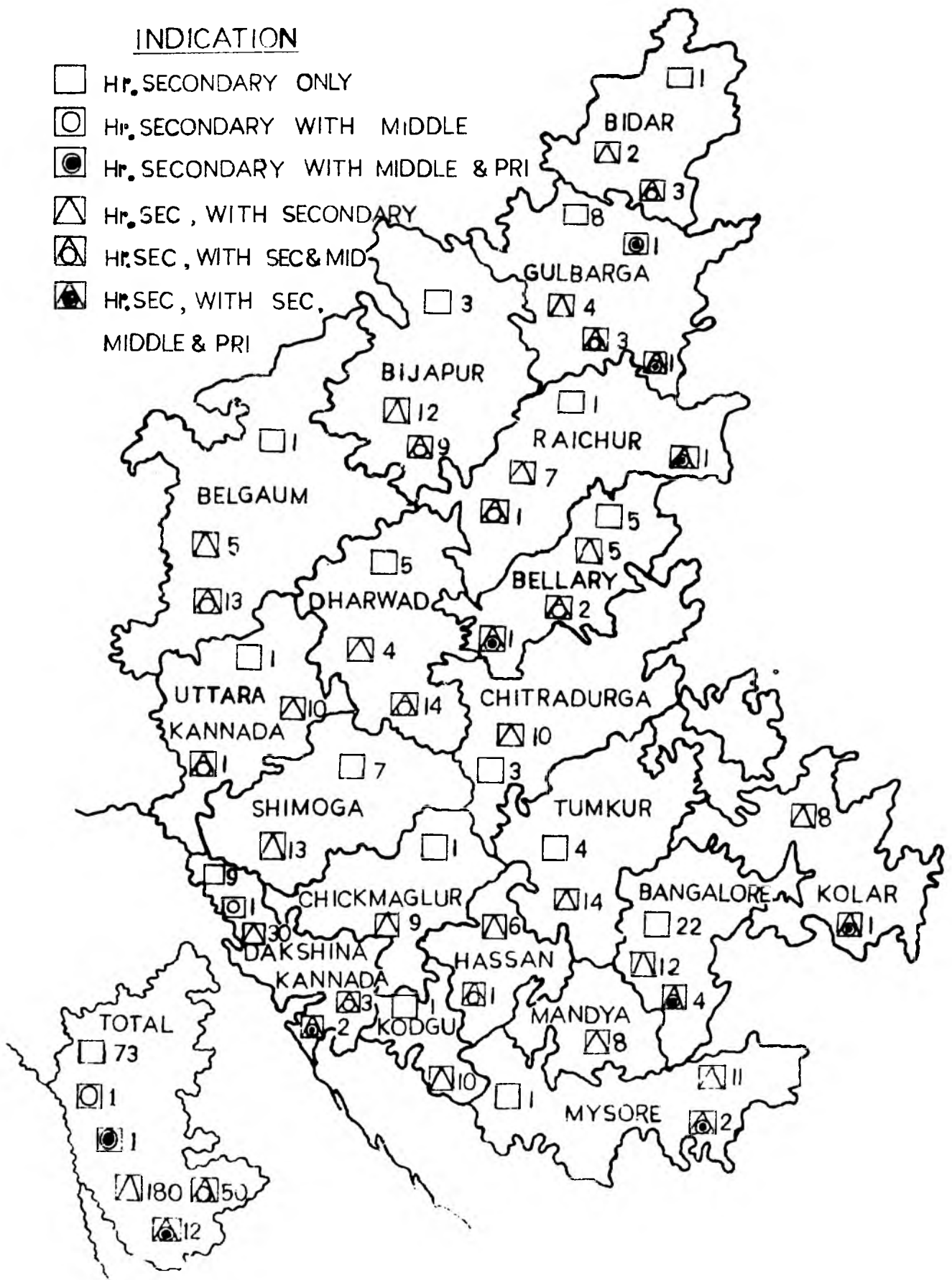

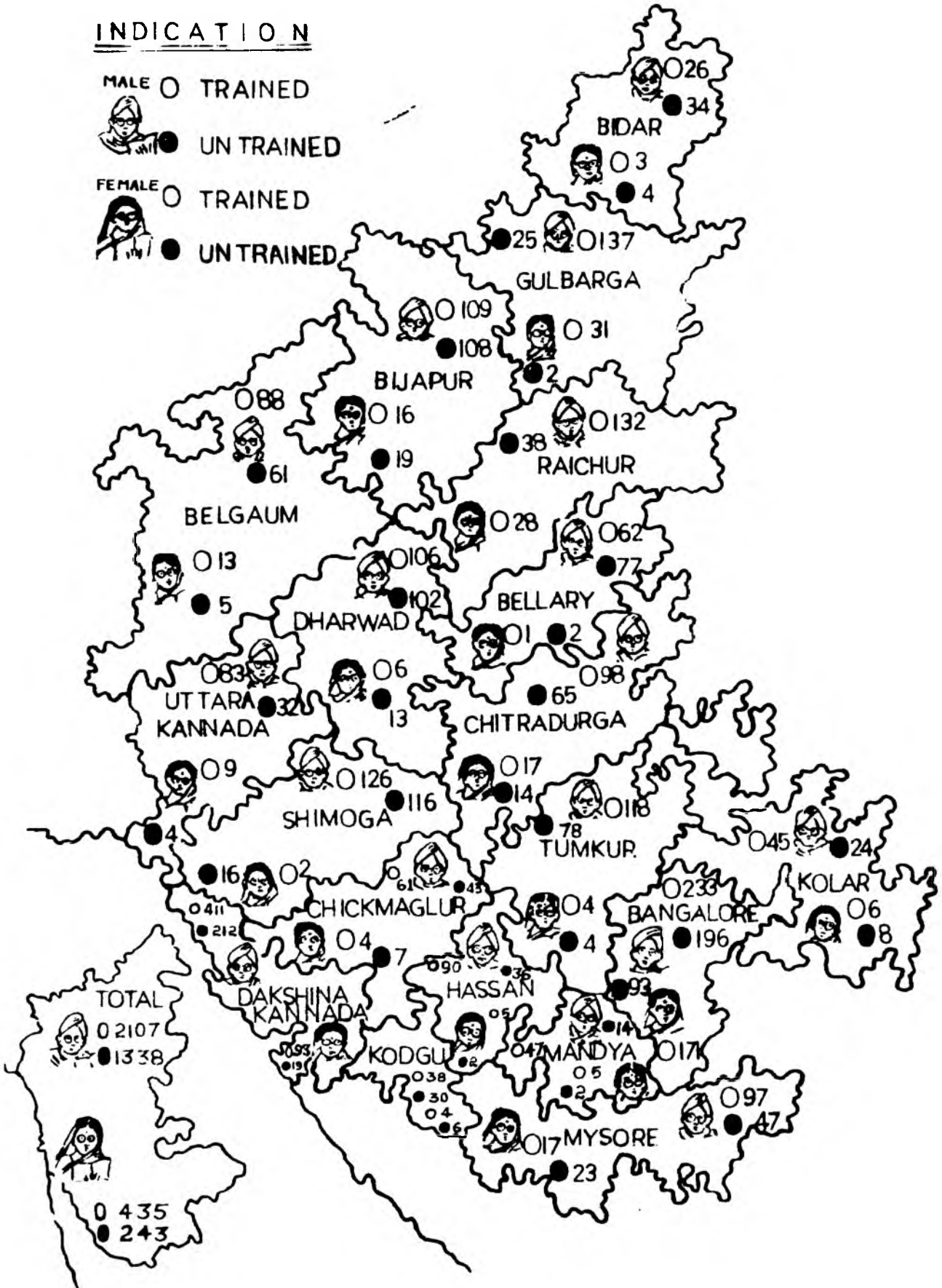

INTRODUCTION

CHAPTER I

A democratic Government depends upon educated and enlightened citizens for its stability and progress. The same principle is applicable to our nation which has embraced democratic type of Government. It is the education of the right kind to each and every one that can lead the people to enduring freedom and prosperity. Besides our national leaders realised that it was education that awakened and strengthened them in their struggle for political freedom from the Britishers. Realising the importance of education, the constitution of India has adumbrated the Directive principles of state policy ; one of which is free and compulsory primary education. It reads as follows :—

“45—the State shall endeavour to provide within a period of ten years from the commencement of this constitution for free and compulsory education of all children until they complete the age of 14 years.”

Achieving universalisation of elementary education in a vast country like ours, is a stupendous task. This stupendous task needs men, materials and money. In addition, it needs enormous ground work, large scale preparation and long term planning. Apart from this, if the plan of action is to be effective and useful comprehensive view of the existing condition of the educational facilities and the needs of the state is very essential. In order to collect such data, the first survey was taken up in collaboration with State Government in the year 1967.

The ministry of Education of a free nation has to assume the role of determining the policies, schemes and national goals of education. And it is obvious that the Government has to prescribe the standard and quality of education, tone up educational administration and expand and channelise our education system in order to keep abreast of other nations. To achieve all these goals, the scheme of action has to be based on correct facts and figures, which can be obtained through educational surveys. Thus the need for frequent educational surveys is established. Three educational surveys have already been conducted and this is the IV All India Educational Survey taken up in 1978. It is entirely financed by N.C.E.R.T.

In this report on the IV All India Education Survey it is proposed to present the data on :

- (1) The enrolment of children belonging to weaker sections and girls
- (2) Educational facilities at the four stages (Primary, Middle, Secondary and Higher secondary) of school education.
- (3) The distance, the children have to cover to reach their Schools
- (4) Availability of basic facilities such as school building, furniture, Library, Equipment, health and sanitation.
- (5) Habitations with their population and schooling facility available
- (6) The Teacher-pupil ratio in the Schools
- (7) Villages in various population slabs according to proportion of SC/ST population and availability of educational facilities.
- (8) Villages according to facility for non-formal education

The analysis of data has been made with main accent on variables like rural and urban managements of schools such as Government, Local Body, recognised aided schools and recognised un-aided schools under the State Government Control as well as Central Government. Analysis has also been made keeping in view the four stages of education Primary-Middle-Secondary and Higher Secondary.

In interpreting the results, an over all view has been taken and inter district comparisons are given presenting briefly the districts showing maximum and minimum achievement in different aspects detailed above. This is followed by position in the rural and urban areas though the main emphasis is on studying the availability of educational facilities as well as potentialities for expansion of educational facilities in rural areas in particular.

CHAPTER II

First All India Educational Survey

The first All India Educational Survey was taken up in 1957 and completed in a period of two years. The immediate objective of the Survey was to make provision for universal elementary education in the third five year plan by establishing a Primary School within the radius of one mile and a middle school within the distance of 3 miles from the home of every child. It was thus necessary to find out the number of Primary Schools and Middle Schools needed to implement the programme in suitable places where they could be economically located. Incidentally, a good deal of useful information about the existing primary, Middle and Secondary Schools was collected during the survey and proposals for planned location of Secondary Schools were also made. This survey was conducted by the Government of India, Ministry of Education in collaboration with the State Governments and the Administration of the Union territories of the country.

The reference date for collection of data was 31st March 1957.

Second All India Educational Survey

The need for the revision of the data of the first survey arose because of many developments that had taken place since 1957. As a result of the economic Development and growth of population many changes had taken place in different habitations. New habitations had sprung up and many habitations had either merged with urban areas or become urban habitations. There had been considerable expansion of educational facilities since 1957. The scope of the first All India Survey was limited to Identifying and delimiting of school areas. There were many other important problems which needed thorough investigation. With these points in view the Ministry of Education, Government of India, decided that the second all India Educational Survey should be undertaken. The organisation of the survey was entrusted to the N.C.E.R.T., New Delhi, and was conducted in collaboration with the State Government.

The objectives were :

(1) To assess the educational facilities available for the three stages of education Primary, Middle and Secondary in rural and urban areas, to revise the data of the First Educational Survey in terms of distribution and size of Habitations and delimitation of school areas.

(2) To collect data for the location of new schools at the Primary, Middle and Secondary stages in rural and urban areas for the preparation of District Development plans.

(3) To study intensively the existing conditions of Educational Institutions, Primary Middle, Secondary schools in respect of teachers and their qualifications, experience, age enrolment, and physical facilities in the form of classrooms, Laboratories, Play ground, and Hostels.

Third All India Educational Survey

Objectives of the III All India Educational Survey :

(1) To revise the data of the Second Survey in terms of the distribution, size of habitations with a view to grouping them together for the delimitation of school areas of existing Primary, Middle and High Schools and also the Junior Colleges.

(2) To Study intensively :

(a) The existing conditions of Educational Institutions in respect of staff, their qualifications, experience, age, enrolment, physical facilities in the form of buildings, libraries, Laboratories and equipment.

(b) Some educational problems such as impediments regarding opening of new schools in backward areas, single teacher schools and schools for children of age group below 5 to 17.

(c) The fifth plan programmes are proposed to be planned, based on the findings of this data.

(3) To estimate the requirements for additional schooling facilities at the Primary, Middle and Secondary Stages and to suggest location of the schools at every stage.

(4) To identify the sections of the Community from which the children are not sent to schools or the percentage of children enrolled is relatively low.

(5) To identify the schools where the number of teachers allocated is not proportionate and to suggest measures for proportionate allocation of teachers.

(6) To identify the teacher's work commensurate with their qualification, and to suggest the number of additional teachers required.

(7) To identify grade-wise enrolment in schools with different grades namely Primary, Secondary and Junior Colleges.

(8) To identify teachers in Primary, Secondary and Junior Colleges according to managements.

(9) To identify the relationship between the age and experience of untrained teachers in Primary and Secondary Schools according to managements.

(10) To identify the types of ownership of school buildings in Primary and Secondary schools according to managements.

The reference date for the collection of this data was 31st December 1973. This survey was conducted with the guidance of the officers of the N.C.E.R.T. and the Officers and officials of State Government.

Fourth All India Educational Survey

The main objectives of the fourth survey are :

(1) To assess the present position of the provision of Educational facilities at various stages of school education in respect of coverage of school going population, the distance to be covered by a child to have access to the school, enrolment of children belonging to weaker sections of the Society and enrolment of girls.

(2) To assess the availability of minimum basic facilities in the school such as building, furniture, library, equipment, health and sanitation and incentives.

(3) To prepare block maps with existing schooling facilities and to indentify clusters of habitations where institutions ought to be opened or existing schools ought to be up-graded.

(4) To prepare the ground for conducting quarterly monitoring of information relating to school attendences and systematic uptodating of the data relating to enrolment and other educational facilities provided in institutions at block level, annually.

These objectives of the Survey envisage the collection of informat'on on the following main items.

(a) Enumeration of every distinct habitation

(b) Enumeration of every Primary, Middle, Secondary and Higher Secondary School/Intermediate/Pre-University/Junior College.

(c) Habitations with and without educational facilities at Primary, Middle, Secondary and Higher Secoudary stages.

(d) In case of habitations without schooling facilities at these stages, the distance at which these facilities are available and also habitations under various population slabs.

(e) Schooling facilities at various school stages in habitations predominantly populated by scheduled caste and scheduled tribes.

(f) Proportion of schedule caste and scheduled tribe population in the villages and Schooling facilities in them.

(g) Agewise enrolment of pupils at various school stage (Classwise).

(h) Agewise enrolment of pupils belonging to scheduled caste and scheduled tribe.

(i) Qualification of teachers (Stagewise) working in Schools

(j) Proportion of girls in Schools

(k) Non-formal education being carried out in the locality

In connection with the IV Survey, only two forms were canvassed viz., village information form and school information form. Based on the information furnished in these forms, the Block, District and State tables were prepared.

Organisation of the Survey

Sanction was accorded for the creation of the following posts as per G.O. No. ED 172 MHS 77, dated 10th March 1978.

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The State survey unit connected with IV All India Educational Survey started functioning in the Second week of July 1978, when the State Survey Officer Sri K. K. Veerappa, reported to duty after undergoing training at the State level Survey officers conference held in Bangalore from 26th June 1978 to 4th July 1978.

The State Survey Officer with the assistance of the Staff of the permanent Survey Unit conducted the orientation programme for the District Survey Officers, from 17th. August 1978 to 26th August 1978 Sri Abrol and Sri Bhatkulikar, Officers of the N.C.E.R.T were present during the training programme and offered clarifications and guidance wherever necessary. In this programme, the District Survey Officers were oriented regarding the forms to be canvassed the procedure for scrutiny of filled-in-forms, preparation of tables at block and District Levels, drafting of the report and preparation of Block Maps.

District Survey Officers in turn organised orientation programmes for Assistant Education Officers and Inspector of Schools for a period of 4 days from 13th September to 26th September 1978. Officers from the State Survey unit were also present during these training programmes and offered guidance wherever necessary.

In this programme, the Assistant Educational Officers were oriented regarding the forms to be canvassed and procedure for scrutiny of filled-in-forms, preparation of tables at the block level and preparation of Block Maps. In addition, the quarterly attendance cards for Primary Schools were also introduced as per the direction of Government of India.

The Assistant Educational Officers conducted orientation programme to the Heads of Institutions for two days guiding them in the method of filling the forms.

A time schedule was prepared for preparation compilation of survey Tables at the Taluk, District and State Level which was adhered to.

Officers of the other Departments also co-operated with the education department, for obtaining the base line data with regard to compilation and preparation of the Survey tables at the Taluk, District and State Levels.

CHAPTER III

DEMOGRAPHIC INFORMATION ABOUT THE STATE HISTORY

The name of Karnataka is derived from 'Karunadu' literally known as lofty land. The name is entirely identified because much of Karnataka is a high plateau. The History even goes back to the dim days of the epics. The capital of Vali and Sugreeva 'Monkey King' of the Ramayana is said to have been Hampi in Bellary. Vatapi associated with sage Agasthya is obviously Badami in Bijapur District.

In the 4th Century B.C. Karnataka was part of the great Mouryan Empire and later on Garga's ruled here. In 6th Century A.D. the Chalukyas established a new empire. They were followed by Rashtrakutas and then by Yadava and Hoysala. Even to-day, a number of monuments representing the art and architecture of these kingdoms is found here. It was in the 14th Century, under the rule of Vijayanagar emperors Karnataka experienced days of prosperity and glory. In the 14th, 15th and 16th Century the Wodeyar dynasty ruled over Karnataka but was overthrown by Muslim rule. (Tippu-sultan's and Hydar Ali's). When British established their rule, the Wodeyars were restored to power as a feudatory of the British.

During the British rule, the Karnataka area was distributed among the Princely States of Mysore, Hydarebad and the British provinces of Bombay and Madras and Coorg.

The formation of the present state represents the fulfilment of the age old aspiration of Kannada speaking people to come together in a single state. The old kingdom of Mysore formed the nucleus of this new state. Under the States re-organisation Act the Kingdom of Mysore gathered around itself in 1956, the districts of Kanara, Bijapur, Dharwar and the major portion of Belgaum District in the old Bombay State, the major portion of Gulbarga, Raichur and Bidar Districts, from the princely state of Hyderabad, the South Kanara District from the Old Madras State and the whole of the Part 'C' State of Coorg.

Physlography :

Karnataka is situated on the western edge of the Deccan Plateau and has for its neighbours Maharastra and Goa on the north, Andhra Pradesh on the east and Tamil Nadu and Kerala on the South. On the west, it opens out on the Arabian Sea.

Physiographically the State can be divided into four regions :

- (1) The coastal region
- (2) The Malnad
- (3) The Northern Plains
- (4) The Southern Plains

The coastal region, consisting of the western portions of North Kanara and South Kanara Districts about 240 K.M. wide between the Arabian Sea and the western ghats. The annual rainfall here is more than 250 cms. The coastal plateau is covered with alluvium deposited by the short, turbulent rivers.

The Malanad is the mainly forested hilly country laying east of the western ghats. The districts of Coorg, Chickmagalur, Hassan, Shimoga and western portions of the districts of Mysore, Dharwar and Belgaum and the eastern half of North Kanara are included in the Malnad. The land is about 150 Meteres above the sea level and consists of ranges of hills with an average height of 900 metres. It is characteristically a region of heavy rainfall. (250 cms.a year). The climate is generally hot and wet. The area is practically covered with thick evergreen forests.

The Northern plain consists of the districts of Bidar, Bijapur, Raichur, Gulbarga and the eastern portions of Dharwar and Belgaum. The range of annual rainfall here

is between 50 to 75 cm. The soils are known as black cotton soil and are retentive of moisture and of average fertility.

The southern plain covers Bangalore, Kolar, Mandya, Tumkur and the eastern part of the Mysore District. This region presents a beautiful landscape, mainly because of the different types of vegetation that the land supports.

The two important river systems of this State are the Krishna and its tributaries (Bhima, Ghataprabha, Malaprabha, Tungabhadra and Vedavathi) in the north and Cauvery and its tributaries (Hemavathi, Shimsha, Arkavathi, Lakshmana Thirtha and Kapini) in the South.

Both these rivers flow eastward and fall into the Arabian Sea. Besides these Sharavathi, Kalinadi and Netravati are important to Karnataka. They are being tapped for Hydroelectric power.

Land Use

The total geographical area in the State is about 1,91,77,300 hectares. The following are the details regarding the land used for cultivation, waste land, forest etc.

Rice is the major food crop of the State. The share of this state in the total out put, of the country is 5%. The second important food crop is jowar and the third important food crop being Ragi.

Among cash crops, sugarcane, Ground Nut, Castor Seed, Safflower and Cotton, Orange Cardamum and Rubber are important. Karnataka enjoys a virtual monopoly in Coffee cultivation and accounts for over 70% of the total production of Coffee in the Country.

Forests occupy 15.4% of the total geographical area of the State. The concentration of forest is found mostly in the hilly regions of the western District viz., Belgaum, North Kanara, Shimoga, Chikmagalur, South Kanara, Coorg and Mysore District. The most heavily forested area of the State is North Kanara District (81%)

This State has practically a monopoly in Sandal Wood. The forests yield a variety of timbers, teak, Rose Wood, Sandal Wood and several species of Softwood and Bamboos. Among the minor forest produce, mention may be made of myrobalans, Wattlebark, Rattan cane, Ivory, Honey etc., of particular significance of the state is Sandal woodoil which is extensively used in soaps, Chemicals and Cosmetic Industries.

Minerals

Karnataka is the home of a large number of minerals of economic importance. It contributes all the gold and silver produced in the Country. Among the other minerals Iron ore, Lime stone, Manganese, Chromite and Copper are important.

Industries

The Industrial policy of the State is to create the necessary climate for industrial investment and actively encourage small scale and cottage Industries. The resources of the State do not permit large scale investment directly on industrial projects. A wide range of measure have been taken to encourage industrial investment.

The State has made appreciable progress in maximising industrial development and in creating employment opportunities.

The State has adequate land, water, and credit facilities to encourage new industries to come up. Availability of skilled and semi skilled man power, political and social stability have created the requisite climate for industrial investment.

The department of industries and commerce has a fairly well knit unit which actively assists small scale and cottage industries and handicrafts. The technical consultancy services organisation of Karnataka provides technical guidance for establishment of Industries.

The number of small scale Industries registered in the State in the year 1977-78 are 20,007.

Educational Development (Report of the State Educational Department) :

Karnataka ranks 14th in Literacy with the percentage of 31.52. However its progress in education is good.

A rapid expansion in providing educational facilities has taken place in the State. On account of various measures under taken in the field of education, there has been considerable increase in the number of educational Institutions, students and teachers at all levels. An attempt is also made to improve the basic facilities required in the schools gradually. Apart from the regular courses of instruction, the State Education Department offers various other courses like Commerce, Sanskrit, Hindi, Vocational Education, etc. The details of these courses and the other functions of the departmental wings is detailed below.

Commerce Education :

The Number of Commerce Institutions increased from 620 in 1977-78 to 651 during 1978-79 accounting for an increase of 31 Institutions.

The scheme of sanctioning stipends to SC/ST students learning Kannada and English Typewriting and Shorthand sponsored by the Department of Social Welfare was continued.

The following schemes sponsored by the Directorate of Languages and Development of Kannada were continued during 1978-79.

(a) Grant of lumpsum stipends to Government Officials (other than Stenos and Typists) for having passed Kannada Typewriting and Shorthand. The rate of Stipend was Rs. 300 for Junior Grade and Rs. 500 for Senior Grade.

(b) The scheme of paying a grant of Rs. 350 to recognised Commerce Institutions for purchasing Kannada Typewriter was continued.

(c) Financial Assistance of Rs. 1,000 was given to Commerce Institutions giving training in Kannada Shorthand and presenting not less than 10 candidates for November 1977 and May 1978 examinations for the first time.

(d) Rs. 25,000 was spent for awarding 200 Scholarships to poor students learning Kannada Typewriting and Kannada Shorthand.

Sanskrit Education :

Sanskrit was introduced as a Language of study in a few selected Primary Schools from each district from Standard I during 1976-77. This programme is being implemented on a large scale in the succeeding years. There is a school in every Taluk which sponsors this scheme thus the programme is extended to 269 schools in the State.

The study of this language at the Primary Level is made optional and the text books are supplied free of cost.

The course of instruction is simplified and with out any prejudice to the normal work and without any dislocation in the regular administration work.

There are about six Sanskrit Colleges in the State with an enrolment of 1980 students providing instruction at the Vidwath and Pre-Vidwath levels. There are nearly 265 Sanskrit Pathashalas imparting instruction at the Pre-Vidwath levels. The enrolment in the Pathashalas is 20,531. Besides there are 42 Veda Pathashalas with an enrolment of 495 students.

Hindi Section :

There are three Hindi Shikshak Colleges at Mysore, Bagalkot and Raichur which continued to impart training to Hindi Teachers. This training is equivalent to elementary school teachers training course.

During 1978-79 sanction was accorded for the creation of 200 posts of Hindi Teachers for Primary Schools under the centrally sponsored scheme.

World Food Programme :

The World Food Programme is under implementation in the State since 4th September 1972 under Project 614 and 620. Initially the World Food Programme authorities agreed to supply, food articles viz., heat, Oil and Milk Powder for a period of 5 years. Subsequently the period has been extended till 31st March 1979. It is likely that the scheme will continue.

Physical Education :

Sports competitions were held at the District and State Levels to provide maximum facilities to students.

Students studying in Secondary Schools were selected to participate in tournaments at the All India Level such as Subroto Mukherji Cup Foot-Ball Tournament, Junior Nehru Hockey Tournament, C.K. Nagendra Cricket Tournament, in autumn and winter meets of the school games federation of India.

The national physical efficiency drive scheme was continued during 1978-79.

Technical Education :

Technical Education at Diploma, Degree and Post-Graduate level come under the purview of the Department of Technical Education. The Polytechnics offer the Diploma Courses and a few certificate courses. The Engineering Colleges and Technological Institutes offer courses at Graduate and Post-Graduate Levels. A few short term courses of ten months duration are in seven Polytechnics which are also offering a few professional courses such as secretarial practice, Business Administration, Food Crafts, Arts and Crafts, Library Science and Costume Design and Dress Making. The Junior Technical Schools offering Education at Secondary level with some technical subjects also come under the purview of this Department.

The academic control of the Diploma and certificate courses vests with the Board of Technical Examinations, which is functioning under the Department of Technical Education, whereas the academic control at degree and post-graduate levels vests with the respective universities.

Department of Vocational education :

The Department of Vocational Education was organised as a separate Department to plan for and implement some selected Vocational Courses which have relevance in the present socio economic frame work. It is being implemented from July 1977 onwards under a central sector scheme under plan provision.

Department of State educational Research and Training :

This is an academic wing of the Department of Public Instruction comprising six different units of the department.

(1) *State Institute of Science.*—Science education is being given its due place in the educational system in India and so also in the State. The very approach of teaching science in the schools has changed to-day and hence emphasis is laid on the activities rather than in theoretical learning. 'Learning by doing' has been the slogan of the day.

This unit takes up various programmes for the improvement of science education in standards I to X by way of offering orientation courses to the teachers and guiding the schools in organising science clubs and activities in developing low cost science equipment made of indigenous materials.

(2) *State Institute of Education.*—This unit takes up several experiments in the field of education almost every year. It also takes up the responsibility of organising inservice training, correspondence training courses and orientation courses especially to the Teacher Trainees.

(3) *State Evaluation Unit.*—This Unit introduces the latest evaluation techniques in the regular teaching course by orienting and guiding the teachers. This Unit also deals with selecting teachers to various other courses like Dance, Drama, etc.

(4) *Text Books.*—This unit takes up the development of curriculum drafting the syllabus, revising the syllabus and simultaneously the preparation of nationalised text books for standard I to X and for elementary teacher training courses.

(5) *Audio-Visual Section and Technology Cell.*—The Audio Visual Section deals in film circulation programme in High Schools and arranges for the supply of education films to schools which possess 16 mm. Projector. The department is also keenly interested in equipping the Audio-Visual Education section in Primary Schools, T.T.I's, B.Ed., Colleges and Project Schools. Further this year the Government have sanctioned 100 sets of tape Recorders, 42 over Head Projectors and Maps and Charts for distribution among Government Teacher Training Institutes, B.Ed., Colleges and Project schools in the State.

The technology cell had taken up the site programme in Primary Schools and is heading at new ventures in the field of education.

DEPARTMENT OF ADULT EDUCATION

Adult Literacy Programme

An amount of Rs. 19.3 lakhs was provided in the State Plan sector for the implementation of Adult Literacy Programme in the State for the year 1978-79, Rs. 1.61 lakhs have been spent for launching of National Adult Education Programme in the State. The amount was utilised for organising conferences, seminars of teachers and Learners, Conference of Women on Adult Education at State, District and Taluk Levels for

creating desirable environment and awareness among the illiterate adult population and for motivating them to join the adult education classes in large numbers.

The department of Adult Education was created with a Director of Adult Education as its head. The Department started working from 2nd November 1978. It has almost completed all the preliminary work relating to the organisation and implementation of Adult Education programme in the State in the Mid Term Plan periods as a part of National Adult Education Programme. The Department has started a cell with one Director and 4 Office staff which will be expanded shortly with 2 Deputy Directors, 3 Assistant Directors, 3 Office Assistants, 2 Statistical Assistants, 1 Junior Accounts Officer, 3 Stenographers, 3 Typists, one Driver and 3 Peons to organise the National Adult Education Programme. The State Resource Centre has been set up as a wing of Karnataka State Adult Education Council. This will prepare the teaching-learning materials required for Adult Education Programme together with training the staff for adult Education Programmes. It will also undertake the evaluation of the Adult Education programme in the State. An amount of Rs. 2.3 lakhs have been sanctioned towards the State Resource Centre for this purpose of which 75 per cent is made by Centre, 15 per cent by State and 10 per cent by Karnataka State Adult Education Council, Mysore.

Details of the Un-Graded School System Project in Karnataka :

Primary Education is not only the first stage of Education, but it also lays down the foundation for all educational growth of a citizen. It is for this reason that Primary Education should be made fully functioning and effective. To achieve this objective the ungraded school system project was introduced in Karnataka.

This scheme was introduced during 1971 in three village primary schools near by Bangalore. The scheme has been introduced in 100 more Rural Primary Schools in the State (at the average rate of 5 schools each in 20 educational districts in Karnataka).

In the ungraded schools, children will learn according to their own particular abilities, without annual examinations. The emphasis will be on self teaching but with the guidance of teachers.

The Scheme of Part-Time and Continuing Education under non-Formal Education

The Government have provided adequate schooling facilities and necessary incentives to children all these years. In this context, non formal education is being accepted as an indispensable component Education System and Significant step towards the growth of the society. The Government have been pleased to sanction provision for Educational Facilities to the dropouts and non attending children of the age group 10-13 years by way of part time and continuing Education Programme under non-formal education. The Scheme was introduced in 4 Districts during 1977-78 *viz.*, Bangalore (Rural), Hassan, Gulbarga and Belgaum. During 1978-79 the benefit of the scheme was extended to more districts *viz.*, Kolar and Raichur making 100 part-time and 100 continuing Education Programme Centres. The teachers selected, were oriented at the Head Quarters of each of the six Districts as to the concept of the programme and the procedure to be followed for learning in the centres.

CHAPTER IV

Concepts and Definitions.

The following are the definitions of important concepts and terms used in the report.

(i) *Habitation*.—A habitation is a distinct cluster of houses with a local name. It is a centre where people live in compact and contiguous manner. A village may have more than one habitation, and a village with a single habitation can be called a village or habitation.

(ii) *Village*.—Village is a parcel of land the boundaries of which are defined and settled for revenue purposes.

(iii) *Urban area*.—All areas which are identified as 'Urban' at the time of 1971 census or subsequently notified to be so are treated as urban.

(iv) *Rural area*.—Areas which are not urban shall be treated as rural.

(v) *School Stages*.—Various combination of classes of the school system constitute Primary, Middle, Secondary and Higher Secondary stages.

(vi) *Sections*.—The group of classes at Primary stage in a school constitute a Primary section ; classes at the middle stage constitute the middle section and classes at the Secondary and Higher Secondary stages constitute Secondary and Higher Secondary Sections respectively.

(vii) *Trained Teacher*.—A trained teacher is one who has successfully undergone a course of teacher training.

(viii) *Distance*.—The distance between two habitations or between a school and a habitation is the convenient walking distance between the central points of the two habitations or the school and the Central point of the habitation.

If there are two habitations and the arial distance or the distances as the crow flies is one K.M. but the actual convenient walking distance by road or path is 1.5 kms, then the distance between the two places is 1.5 kms. If there are two habitations on the opposite sides of a stream then the distance between the two habitations will be actual convenient walking distance across the bridge and not the distance across the stream.

(ix) *Population*.—Wherever the term population is used in this context, it should be taken as the estimated population.

(x) *Block*.—Block in this Survey cannotes the block under the community Project administration. In this survey the block is the unit for collection and compilation of data. In the states where the scheme of Community development blocks is not in Vogue, tahsil/taluk will be the unit for collection and compilation of date.

(xi) *Recognised schools*.—A recognised school is one in which the course (s) of study followed is/are prescribed or recognised by Government (Central/State) or a University or a Board constituted by law or by any other agency authorised in this behalf by Central or State Government and which satisfied one or more of the authorities e.g., Directorate of Education, Municipal Board, Secondary Board, etc., with regard to its Standard of efficiency. It runs regular classes and sends candidates for Public examinations, if any.

(xii) *Management*.—The authority which runs a school determines type of its management. It may be Government, Local body or Private Body receiving Government aid, or not receiving Government aid. The schools may, therefore, be classified according to their management as Government schools, local body or Private body receiving aids, or not receiving Government aid.

All Schools run by the State or Central Government Public undertakings and Autonomous organisations completely financed by the Government will be treated as Government schools.

CHAPTER V

Educational facilities in the rural areas of the State :

The scope of the IV All India Educational Survey is to identify rural habitations with and without schooling facilities in order to plan the location of future schools.

(ii) *Population.*—The total estimated population in the rural areas of the state according to the present survey is 2,63,11,690.

(iii) *Distribution of habitations.*—There are 43,108 habitations in the rural area of the State. The distribution of the habitations and population according to the various population slabs is as follows :

Habitations with and without Primary section in Rural Areas of Karnataka State :

Facilities for Primary Education.—(1) State table 11 shows the distribution of habitations having primary Schooling facility in the State according to different Population slabs for the communities. The Table indicates the number of habitations having Primary Schooling facility coming under various Population slabs (Habitation with population below 100 to over 5,000). Out of the total habitations of 43,108, 27,040 habitations have a Primary section in the habitation itself. These schools cater to the needs of a population of 2,34,61,803. These figures indicate that 89.1% of the population in the rural areas is having facility of a Primary school within the habitations itself.

13,864 habitations of the State with a population of 25,38,042 constituting 9.65 per cent of the State's population have Primary Schooling facility at the distance ranging Between 0.5 kms. to 2 kms.

Priority has to be given for opening of schools in the 2,204 habitations of the state with a population 3,11,845 where there is no schooling facility and facility is available only at a distance of more than 2 kms. But schools are needed immediately where there is a population of 200 and above in the habitation. There are 217 such habitations and the location is furnished in the table above.

Some of the districts have achieved tremendous expansion in the field of education by providing educational facilities in almost all the habitations of rural parts of the districts. Belgaum, Bijapur, Gulbarga, Bidar, Raichur and Bellary provide schooling facility to nearly 98 per cent of the population of the respective habitations. Whereas Coorg, North Kanara and South Kanara districts have yet to achieve as they provide educational facilities only to 64 to 68 per cent of the population of their habitations.

Though Shimoga district in general has made moderate achievement there is a habitation 'Kilardur Jungle' in Hosanagar Taluk which, in spite of having a population above 10,000 has no school within the habitation. The school going children of this habitation have to walk a distance of more than 2 kms. to reach the school.

Studying the schooling facility to the figures of III Survey it is noted that provision within the facility is almost in the same position but considerable improvement is found for the children walking more than 2 kms. distance to reach the school by reducing the percentage of the children denied of schooling facility.

Facilities for Primary Education in the Habitations Predominantly populated by Scheduled Castes.

Out of the 43,108 habitations with a total population of 2,63,11,690 in the State, 2,354 habitations with a total population of 7,23,498 are predominantly populated by Scheduled Castes, schooling facilities in such habitations are identified here.

Out of these 2,354 habitations, 1,094 habitations with a total population of 5,30,382 constituting 73.3 of the total SC Population of the predominantly SC populated habitations of the State has a Primary school in the habitation itself. 375 habitations out of 2,354 habitations, with a total population of 74,592, are in the population slab of 'Below 300'. There are no habitations predominantly populated by Scheduled Caste in the population slab of "500 and above" in the State.

Twelve (12) habitations, with a total population of 32,329 are in the population slab of '2,000—4,999' and are situated in the districts noted down which have primary schooling facility within the habitation. The achievement of providing facility is 100 here. These habitations are located in :

219 habitations with a population of 5,3164 are in 200—299 population slab. 54.1% of the population have schooling facility within the habitation.

In 100—199 population slab, there are 122 habitations with a population of 18,81 which provide schooling facility only to 24.3% of the population.

In the population slab of below 100 there are 34 habitations with a population of 2,610 providing facility only for 8% of the population.

It is clear from the above mentioned data that maximum schooling facility is provided in these habitations where population is thick. Only the habitations thinly populated do not have schooling facilities. They have to walk to the neighbouring schools.

106 out of the State's 2354 habitations predominantly populated by SC. with a total population of 14,804, constituting 2.1% of the States population have a Primary School at a distance of 2 kms. situated in a neighbouring habitation. These School less habitations are concentrated in Bangalore, Chickmagalur, Hassan and mysore.

92 habitations, out of these 106 habitations, with a total population of 9,522 are in the population slab of " Below-300 ".

2 habitations, with a total population of 1,135 are located in Bangalore and Chickmagalur. They come under the " 1,000—1999 " population slab.

One (1) habitation with a population of 412, is situated in the Bangalore District.

11 (Eleven) habitations, with a total population of 3,735 in the population slab 300—399 are located in the districts of Bangalore (2), Bellary (1), Chikmagalur (2), Shimoga (2) and one habitation each in the districts of Gulbarga, Hassan, Kolar and Mandya.

Facilities for Primary Education in the habitations predominantly populated by Scheduled Tribes

There are 43,108 habitations in the State with a population of 2,63,11,690 comprising all communities.

There are 317 habitations in the State which are predominantly habitated by Scheduled Tribes, with a total population of 84,123.

Five districts out of the Nineteen districts of the State have no habitations predominantly populated by Scheduled Tribes. These districts are Bellary, Bidar, Bijapur, Gulbarga and Raichur.

Out of the total 317 habitations, 137 habitations with a total population of 57,123 have a Primary School in the habitation itself. This population of 57,123 constitutes 67.9 per cent of the total population of the habitations predominantly habitated by Scheduled Tribes.

Out of these 137 habitations, only one habitation has a population of 3,380 and is situated in Udupi Taluk of S. Kanara District.

Five out of the 137 habitations with a total population of 6,190 in the population slab " 1,000—1,999 " are situated in the districts of Belgaum (3), Coorg (1) and Tumkur (1)

31 of these 137 habitations, having a population between 500—999 and with a total population of 21,581, are located in the districts of Belgaum (4), Bellary (2), Dharwar (3), Coorg (3), Hassan (1), Kolar (2), Mysore (5), Shimoga (3), South Kanara (5) and Tumkur (3).

14 habitations out of these 137 habitations, having a population between 400—499 and with a total population of 6,036, are identified in the Districts of Belgaum (1), Chitradurga (1), Coorg (2), Mardya (1), Mysore (3), Shimoga (1), S. Kanara (4) and Tumkur (1) .

Out of these 137 habitations, 26 habitations with a population in the slab of 300—399, and with a total population of 9,007, are located in the districts of Belgaum (5), Chitradurga (2), Coorg (1), Hassan (2), Mysore (3), North Kanara (5), Shimoga (2), S. Kanara (3), and Tumkur (3).

60 habitations, with a total population of 10,929, are having a population " below 300 ". the Schooling facility is fairly satisfactory.

65 habitations with a total population of 7,784 constitute 9.2 per cent of the total population of " the habitation predominated by ST Tribe " of the State. These 65 habitations have a Primary School at a distance of more than 2 kms. situated in a neighbouring habitation.

3 of the 65 habitations are in the population slab of '500—999, with a total population of 2,236. These three habitations are situated in Coorg District.

Two of the 65 habitations are in the population slab of "300-399", with a total population of 625. These 2 habitations are situated in Bangalore (1), Coorg (1) Districts

60 of these 65 habitations with a total population of 4,923 are in the population slab of "Below 300".

Habitations with or without Middle School Facility

Out of the 43,108 habitations in the State, 8,610 habitations with a population of 1,35,13,113, have a middle school in the habitation itself constituting 51.36 per cent of the total population of the State. The primary schools in the rest of the habitations might be upgraded in order to provide middle schooling facility within the habitation to a larger percentage of the population.

In 31165 habitations of the State with a population of 1,16,69,133 have middle school facility at a distance ranging between 1 km. to 5 kms. constituting 44.35 per cent of the State's population.

Pupils in 3,333 habitations with a population of 11,29,444 constituting 4.29 per cent of the State's population, have to walk more than 5 kms. to reach a middle school. District-wise location of these habitations is mentioned below.

Priority has to be given to provide middle schools in all the 3,333 habitations as the pupils here have to walk more than 5 kms. to reach the school. But, middle schools have to be started immediately in 791 habitations of the State as they have a population above 500 in each of the the habitations.

In the districts of Belgaum, Bijapur and Dharwar achievement is fairly good as they provide middle schooling facility within the habitation to 75 per cent of their population of their district. Whereas in Bangalore, Coorg, Hassan, Kolar and N. Kanara, the middle schooling facility is available only to 35 per cent of their population. In the rest of the districts achievement is moderate.

Comparing the figures with that of the III Survey, it is noted that provision within the facility is almost the same but considerable improvement is found for the children walking above 5 kms. to reach the school as the percentage is reduced from 7.2 to 4.29 now.

Middle School facilities in the habitations Pre-dominantly populated by Scheduled Caste.

2,354 habitations, with a total population of 7,23,498 which constitutes 2.75 percent of the State's rural population of 2,63,12,690, are predominantly populated by Scheduled Castes.

96 out of these 2,354 habitations with a population of 95,792 constituting 13.2 percent of the State's rural predominantly Scheduled Caste Habitations population have Middle School in the habitation itself.

29 habitations, out of these 96 habitations, with a population of 8,855 are in the population slab of "below 500".

8 habitations, with a total population of 23,524 in the slab of "2,000—4,999", are located in Belgaum (1), Bellary (2), Coorg (1) and Mandya (4).

33 habitations, out of these 96 habitations are in the population slab of "1,000—1,999". Their total population is 44,291. These habitations are situated in the district of Bangalore (1), Belgaum (1), Bellary (3), Bijapur (1), Chickmagalur (7), Coorg (2), Hassan (1), Kolar (1), Mandya (5), Shimoga (8), South Kanara (2), Tumkur (1).

26 habitations, out of these 96 habitations, with a total population of 19,122, are situated in the following districts: Bellary (2), Chitradurga (2), Coorg (1), Hassan (4), Kolar (4), Mandya (1), Mysore (4), Raichur (1), Shimoga (3), South Kanara (1) and Tumkur (3).

189 habitations with a total population of 48,479 constituting 6.7 percent of the States total (rural) Scheduled Caste population, of the predominantly populated Scheduled Caste habitations, have a middle school at a distance of more than 5 kms.

165 habitations out of the above 189 habitations having a total population of 28,967 are in population slab of 'Below 500'.

1 (one) habitation out of the above mentioned 189 habitations with a population of 2,011 is located in Bellary District.

5 of the above 189 habitations, with a total population of 6,133, under the population slab 1,000—1,999, are situated in Bellary (1), Mysore (1), Shimoga (2) and Tumkur (1) districts.

18 of the above 189 habitations with a population of 11,368, under the population slab '500—999' are located in the districts of Bangalore (1), Bellary (2), Chickmagalur (1), Chitradurga (1), Kolar (3), Mandya (1), Mysore (2), Raichur (5), Shimoga (1) and Tumkur (1).

Middle schooling facility is not satisfactory in the habitations predominantly populated by Scheduled Caste.

Middle School facilities in the habitations predominantly populated by Scheduled Tribes.

There are 317 habitations predominantly populated by Scheduled Tribes with a population of 84,123 in the State.

19 habitations with a total population of 14,470 constituting 17.2 percent of the total population of the habitations predominantly populated by Scheduled Tribes. These 19 habitations have a Middle School in the habitation itself. 10 of the 19 habitations with a total population of 3,041 are in the population slab of "Below—500".

1 (one) out of these 19 habitations have a population of 3,380 and is situated in South Kanara District.

3 of these 19 habitations are situated in the districts of Belgaum (1), Coorg (1) and Tumkur (1). Their total population is 4,063 and are in the '1,000—1,999' population slab.

5 of the habitations with a total population of 3,986 in the population slab '500—999' are situated in the districts of Chitradurga (1) and South Kanara (4).

88 habitations with a total population of 14,804, constituting 17.6 of the total population of the habitations predominantly populated by Scheduled Tribes. These 88 habitations have a middle school in the neighbouring habitation at a distance of "more than 5 kms".

81 habitations, out of these 88 habitations, with a total population of 9,217 are in the population slab of "Below—500".

6 habitations out of these 88 habitations with a total population of 4,538, in the population slab of 500—999, are located in Belgaum (2), Coorg (2) and Mysore (2).

1 (one) habitation under population slab 1,000—1,999 with a population of 1,049 is situated in Belgaum District. These 88 habitations need middle schools quite urgently as the children here have to walk more than 5 kms. to reach a middle school.

Habitations with/without Secondary Schooling facility

1,381 habitations out of State's 43,108 habitations with an estimated total population of 38,45,305, constituting 14.69 of the State's estimated population have a Secondary School within the habitation. Out of these 1,381 habitations 219 have a population of "5,000 and above"; 545 habitations with a population of "2,000—4,999"; 309 habitations with a population of "1,000—1,999"; 182 habitations with a population of "500—999"; 126 habitations have a population of "Below—500".

32,096 habitations of the State with a population of 1,75,11,602 constituting 66.5 of the State's population have Secondary Schooling facility at distance ranging between 2 kms. to 8 kms.

There are 9,631 habitations in the State with a population of 49,54,783, constituting a percentage of 18.83 of the State's population have Secondary Schooling facility at a distance of above 8 kms.

Dharwar and Belgaum Districts record highest Secondary Schooling facility within the habitation. Minimum facility in respect of Secondary Schools is seen in South Kanara and Kolar.

Secondary School facility in the Habitations predominantly populated by Scheduled Caste.

A population of 14928 dwelling in 13 habitations constituting 2.1% of the total Schedule Caste (rural) population of the predominantly populated Scheduled Caste habitations of the State, have a Secondary School in their habitation itself.

Six (6) of the above referred 13 habitations, with a total population of 1202 come under the population slab of "below-500".

3 habitations out of the 13 habitations mentioned above with a total population of 8991 under the population slab 2000-4999 are situated in the districts of Bellary (1) and Mysore (2).

3 habitations with a total population of 3859, under the slab 1000-1999, are located in Chitradurga (1), Raichur (1) and South Kanara (1) Districts.

1 habitation, in the population slab 500-999, with a population of 876 is situated in Mysore district.

507 habitations, with a total population of 130531 constituting 18.0 % of the total Scheduled Caste (rural) population of the predominantly populated Scheduled Caste habitations of the State. These habitations have a Secondary School at a distance of more than 8 kms. situated in a neighbouring habitation.

450 of these 507 habitations, with a total population of 81051, are having a population of "Below-500".

2 of the 507 habitations have population of 2544 and 2812 and are located respectively in the Districts of Belgaum and Bellary.

13 of the 507 habitations with a total population of 17824, coming under the "1000-1999" population slab, are situated in the districts of Belgaum (1), Bellary (4), Chitradurga (1), Dharwar, (1) Gulbarga (1), Mysore (3), Shimoga (1), Tumkur (1).

42 of the 507 habitations with a total population of 26300, coming under the "500-999" population slab, are situated in the districts of Bangalore (2), Bellary(3), Chickmagalur (6), Chitraduraaa (3), Gulbarga (1), Hassan (1), Kolar (2), Mandya (1), Mysore (8), Raichur (9), Shimoga (4), Tumkur (2), Total 42.

Secondary School facility is not very encouraging in these habitations.

Secondary School facilities in the habitations predominantly populated by Scheduled Tribes

Out of the 317 habitations predominantly populated by Scheduled Tribes with a total population of 84123, two habitations with a total population of 3720 have a Secondary School in the habitation itself with a percentage of 4.4.

One habitation has a population of 3380 and is situated in the South Kanara District. The other habitation has a population of 340 and is located in North Kanara District.

119 habitations, with a population of 26167, constituting 31.1 % of the total population of all the habitations predominated by Scheduled Tribes, have a Secondary School in a neighbouring habitation at a distance of more than 8 kms.

107 of these 119 habitations with a total population 15644 are in the population slab of "Below-500".

9 habitations with a total population of 6452, in the population slab "500-999" are situated in the districts of Belgaum (3), Coorg (2), Dharwar (1), Mysore (1), South Kanara (1) and Tumkur (1).

3 habitations of these 119 habitations have a total population of 4071 are in the population slab of 1000-1999. These habitations are located in the districts of Belgaum (1), Coorg (1) and Tumkur (1).

HIGHER SECONDARY

Out of 43108 habitations only 86 habitations with a total population 276314 constituting 1.05 % of the total estimated population have a higher Secondary School in the habitation itself. These habitations are located in Bangalore (2), Belgaum (4), Bidar (1), Bijapur (4), Chickmagalur (3), Chitradurga (3), Coorg (7), Dharwar (5), Gulbarga (2), Mandya (5), Mysore (2), N. Kanara (7), Shimoga (9), South Kanara (2 5), Tumkur (7) Total 86.

32184 habitations out of the State total 43108 habitations, with a total population of 19236712 have a higher secondary school in a neighbouring habitation situated at a distance of more than 8 kms. 20183 habitations out of the 32184 habitations with a total population of 4104572 are in the population slab of "Below-500".

10838 habitations with a population of 6798664 constituting 25.84 % of the States estimated population have Higher Secondary Schooling facility at a distance ranging between 2 kms. & 8 kms.

32184 habitations in the State with a total population of 19236712 constituting a percentage of 73.11 % of the States estimated population have Secondary Schooling facility at a distance of more than 8 kms.

Bellary, Hassan, Kolar and Raichur Districts do not have Higher Secondary facility within the habitations. The pupils of rural areas of these Districts will have to walk the distance ranging between 2 kms to more than 8 kms to reach the Higher Secondary School situated in Urban areas of the District.

Higher Secondary Schooling facility in the habitations Predominantly populated by Scheduled Castes

Only one habitation with a population of 346 constituting 0.1 per cent of the total Scheduled Caste (rural) population of the "Predominantly populated Scheduled Caste habitation of the State, has a higher Secondary School in the habitation itself. This is situated in South Kanara District.

1,703 habitations, with a population of 4,92,091 constituting 68.0 per cent of the total Scheduled Caste (rural) population of the "predominantly populated Scheduled Caste Habitations of the State" have a Higher Secondary School in a neighbouring habitation at a distance of more than 8 kms.

1,436 habitations out of the above 1,703 habitations have a population of below 500. Their total population is 2,71,077.

5 of the 1,703 habitations have a total population of 16,016. The population of these habitations come under '2,000—4,999' slab. These 5 habitations are located in Belgaum (1), Bellary (2) and Mysore (2).

58 of the 1,703 habitations, have a population of more than 1,000. Their total population is 71,050. These habitations are located in the districts of Bangalore-1, Belgaum 3, Bellary 9, Chickmagalur 2, Chitradurga 9, Coorg 1, Dharwar 2, Gulbarga 1, Mysore 12, Shimoga 13, S. Kanara 1, Tumkur 4, Total 58.

204 habitations, out of 1,703 habitations, with a total population of 1,33,948, under the population slab of '500—999' are situated in the following districts : Bangalore (16), Belgaum (1), Bellary (14), Chickmagalur (22), Chitradurga (17), Coorg (1), Dharwar (3), Gulbarga (4), Hassan (11), Kolar (25), Mandya (6), Mysore (31), Raichur (9), Shimoga (25), S. Kanara (2), Tumkur (17).

**Higher Secondary School facilities in the habitations predominantly
populated by Scheduled Tribes**

One of the 317 habitations predominantly populated by Scheduled Tribes in the State with a population of 3,380, constituting 4.0 per cent of the total population of all the habitations predominantly populated by Scheduled Tribes, has a Higher Secondary School in the habitation itself, which is situated in South Kanara District.

Population of 62,510 living in 254 habitations, and constituting 74.3 per cent of the total population of the predominantly habitated by Scheduled Tribes have a higher Secondary School in the neighbouring habitation situated at distance of "more than 8 kms."

221 out of these 254 habitations with a total population of 36,626 are in "Below—500" population slab.

28 habitations out of these 254 habitations with a total population of 19,694 are in "500—999" population slab. These habitations are in the districts of Belgaum (4), Chitradurga (1), Coorg (6), Dharwar (1), Hassan (1), Kolar (2), Mysore (4), Shimoga (1), South Kanara (5) and Tumkur (3).

5 habitations with a total population of 6,190, in the population slab of 1,000—1,999 are situated in the districts of Belgaum (3), Coorg (1) and Tumkur (1).

CHAPTER VI

Primary Sections/Schools

The words "Primary Schools" mentioned in this part are independent primary schools only. In some areas Primary Sections are attached to either middle sections or to Middle and Secondary sections or to Middle, Secondary and Higher Secondary Sections in Composite Schools.

Rural Area.—(1) There are 20,705 independent Primary Schools, 9006 Primary Sections attached to Middle Schools, 8 Primary Sections attached to Secondary Schools and one Higher Secondary with Primary and Middle sections in the State.

20,705 schools comprise of 20,600 Government Schools, 7 Local Body schools, 76 Private aided and 22 Private un-aided schools.

Out of 20,600 Government Schools, 505 are Boys Schools, 324 are Girls Schools and 19,771 are co-educational schools.

7 Local body schools comprise of 1 Boys and 6 co-educational schools.

76 Private aided schools comprise of 6 Boys and 70 co-educational schools.

Out of 22 Private un-aided schools 1 is boys school and 21 are co-educational schools.

Urban Area.—There are 1823 independent primary schools, 2291 Primary sections attached to Middle schools, 21 Primary sections attached to the Secondary and Middle sections, 12 primary sections attached to Higher secondary schools with secondary and Middle Sections.

(i) 1823 Primary schools comprise of 1416 Government schools, 2 local body schools, 246 Private Aided schools and 159 Private un-aided schools.

(ii) 2291 Primary sections attached to Middle Schools comprise of 1502 Government Schools, 11 Local body schools, 526 Private Aided Schools, 252 Private un-aided schools.

(iii) 21 Primary sections with secondary and Middle sections comprise of 5 Government Schools, 1 Local body school, 3 private aided schools, 12 private unaided schools.

(iv) 12 Primary sections attached to Higher Secondary schools with secondary and middle sections, comprise of 4 Government Schools, 5 private aided Schools, 3 private un-aided schools.

The number of Primary schools during the first survey was 22,250, 31,112 during 2nd Survey 32,802, during the 3rd Survey and during IV survey 34,441 (as on 30-9-1978).

Incomplete Schools.—There are 947 incomplete Primary schools in Rural area and 212 in Urban area.

Number of teachers actually working in 20,705 schools of the rural area are 26,745 and 8077 teachers are working in 1823 schools of the Urban area in the State. (Teachers of Purely primary schools only I to IV).

The table here presents the distribution of teachers in the primary schools of the state. There are nearly 360 schools in the rural area and 21 in the urban area where no teacher is working. This may be attributed to various causes like decreasing enrolment single teacher schools etc,

(iii) of the 26,745 teachers in Primary schools in the rural area in the state, 2,5 teachers are working as part-time teachers and 26,720 are working as full time teachers. 2428 teachers belong to Scheduled castes and 321 teachers belong to Scheduled Tribe.

According to the 3rd All India Educational Survey 25,900 were full time teachers and 261 were part time teachers.

(iv) of the 8077 teachers in Primary Schools in the Urban areas in the State, 38 are working as part-time teachers and 8039 are working as full time teachers. Out of these, 702 belong to scheduled caste and 98 belong to scheduled tribes.

According to table 107 ; there are 40,808 trained and 6127 un-trained teachers working at the Primary stage of the schools in the rural area in the State. Out of the 40,808, 35314 and 5494 are male and Female teachers respectively. 6127 untrained teachers comprise of 5438 Male teachers and 689 Female teachers.

According to table 108, there are 17219 trained and 2338 untrained teachers working in the Urban area. Out of 17219 trained teachers 7028 are Male teachers, 10,191 are female teachers. Out of 2338 un-trained teachers, 1064 one male, 1274 one female teachers. Female teachers number exceeds male teachers in urban areas. But it is the other way in the rural area.

Following is the distribution of the trained and un-trained teachers according to qualification sex and stage.

A comprehensive study of the teachers working at each stage according to their qualification sex and stage is consolidated. It is surprising to note that even at the primary stage teachers with post graduate qualification are working both in rural and urban areas of the state. Percentage of trained teachers is more than untrained teachers all over the state.

Out of 20,705 Primary schools of the state 15995 schools are single teacher schools in the rural area constituting 77.257 to the total number of schools. In the urban areas out of 1823 of primary schools 346 schools are single teacher schools.

Teacher pupil ratio is not very satisfactory as we can notice extreme situation here, (see Table 1715) i.e., 144 primary sections in rural areas and 32 sections in urban area with "Zero" enrolment have teachers in these schools ranging from 1 to 10. On the other hand in the schools with an enrolment above 200 the availability of teachers does not fulfil the condition of fixed ratio of 1 : 40. This uneven distribution of teachers can be overcome by taking up redistribution as per the Government fixed ratio. Though establishing such an ideal situation is impossible, at least the improper distribution can be minimised to a great extent.

According to the figures of the IV Survey 63.7% and 64.9% of primary schools of rural and urban areas respectively show a satisfactory distribution of teachers. In identifying this position according to the managements in rural areas it is found that Government schools claim the higher place with 96.4% of schools having proper distribution of teachers and 84 % of private aided and 43.2% of private unaided schools adhere to this category. But, in urban areas the private aided schools take the lead with 69.9% of schools claiming right distribution of teachers followed by 66.9 % of Government schools, 57.1% local body schools and 42.9 % private unaided schools.

Private un-aided schools show same condition both in urban and rural areas

Though the position is fairly satisfactory there is scope for improvement.

Total enrolment in different age groups in the state throws light on the enrolment position and shows how many eligible children are in schools. According to the compulsory primary Education act, all children in the age group of 6-11 years should be in schools. But these figures indicate that only 85.78% of Boys 68.12% Girls under this age group are enrolled. This gradually declines in the higher age groups. The percentage of enrolment in the age of group of 17 to 18 is 4.75 % of Boys and 1.42 % of Girls.

In 6-11 age group enrolled in the schools 94.9% of Boys and 95.98% of Girls in the rural area and 88.35% Boys and 88.8% of Girls in the urban area are studying in classes I to IV children of all age groups are enrolled in these classes but their percentage is very low.

A comparative study of the enrolment position in respect of Primary sections in different districts of the state indicate that the enrolment index is highest in Shimoga and South Kanara District and lowest enrolment index is in Gulbarga District followed by Coorg District. In all other Districts enrolment is moderate.

The schools are distributed according to the existence of metalled or non-metalled road within a distance of 1.5 Kms. of the School. The types of Road in existence to reach the school is classified as :

Metalled, non-metalled, both metalled and non-metalled and none.

There is a metalled road passing within 1 1/2 Kms. in respect of 6,430 schools. Non metalled road in respect of 9,541 schools, both metalled and Non-metalled road in respect of 3,371 schools. No road is in existence in respect of 1,363 schools. Such schools are in existence in almost all the districts. There is greater concentration of such schools in Gulbarga, Mandya, Raichur and Chitradurga

(iii) 4,907 Primary Schools are situated at a distance of more than 4 Kms. from the Bus Stop or Railway Station. Inspecting staff will have difficulty in maintaining strict supervision due to the long distance. Such Schools are found in Gulbarga Raichur and Bangalore.

There are 180 schools having Zero enrolment, 152 schools have an accommodation of single room and 2 rooms. Such uneconomical schools are found in Kolar and Tumkur. Even in the Urban areas too there are 32 schools where there is no enrolment. Mysore has 17 such schools even with a single room for no students to study. Bangalore has 5 such schools. Contradictory to this situation there are 19 schools above 250 enrolments but with a single room in each school. These schools are concentrated in Bangalore, Gulbarga, Kolar and Shimoga Districts.

Table 76 : Schools running in shifts : Due to scarcity of space a good number of schools are run in shifts and the purpose for which the school building is utilised and managementwise distribution with their percentage to the total number of schools is detailed here.

Out of 22,528 Primary Schools in the State, only 13 Government Schools are run in shifts in rural parts. 108 Government 30 Private aided and 2 Private unaided schools in Urban area are run in shifts.

The percentage of Primary Schools running in shifts under rural Government is 0.63 (7.62 per cent) under Government 12.19 per cent Private aided, 1.26 per cent under Private Unaided Schools in urban parts of the State are running in shifts.

Table 77 : Out of 22,528 Primary Schools in the State, the building/space of 51 Government Schools (rural) and 4 aided schools in rural and 90 Government, 12 Private aided and 5 unaided in Urban area are used to run other schools or Colleges. 386 Government Schools and one Private aided in rural area 5 Government in Urban area are used to conduct Panchayath meetings.

1,007 Government, 6 Private aided schools in rural area, 54 Government 12 Private aided and 10 Private unaided schools in urban area are used for religious purposes.

118 Government schools in rural, 12 Government, 4 Private aided and one Private unaided in Urban area are used to run part-time courses.

142 Government, 4 Private aided, one Private unaided, in rural, 9 Government, one Private unaided, in Urban areas are used for other purposes.

On the whole out of 22,528 Primary Schools in the State 18,947 schools is rural constituting 84.100 and 1,614 schools in urban area constituting 7.16 per cent, are used only for running the schools and not used for any other purpose.

Schools According to Adequacy of mats furniture for Students.

Information is collected from the schools regarding the number of Class rooms (including sections) not having any furniture, having inadequate furniture and having adequate furniture.

Area and Managementwise distribution of Primary Schools according to percentage of classes (including sections) is tabulated in State Table 79.

Ex : If there are 10 sections in a school, and 4 of them are not having any furniture, 3 of them are having in adequate and 3 adequate, the percentage will be 40 %, 30% and 30% respectively. Total number of schools not having any furniture in different percentage of their class rooms is given in the first part of Table 79 and similarly for schools not having adequate furniture in different percentage of class rooms, in second part of State Table 79, schools having adequate furniture in different percentage of their class-rooms in 3rd part of State table 79.

Table 76 :

Out of 20705 schools in rural area, 5061 schools do not have any mats/furniture for students in 76-100% of their classes. 2096 schools have inadequate and 3400 schools have adequate number of mats/furniture for students.

It can be concluded from the Table that only 16.4% of Government Schools in rural area are almost equipped with mats/furniture for students. The position of Government Schools in rural area should be improved as only 16.25% of Government Schools are equipped with mats and furniture for 76-100% of their classes.

Where as as in urban area, out of 1823 schools, 287 schools do not have any mats/furniture for students in 76-100% of their classes. 130 schools out of 1823 schools have inadequate mats/furniture. Only 684 schools constituting a percentage of 37.5 have adequate mats/furniture for students.

In urban area also a meagre percentage of 28.6% Government Schools have adequate mats/furniture for students. Even though this position is better when compared to rural area, it needs improvement.

After collecting information regarding availability of furniture in class-rooms (percentage) for pupils, the availability of table and a chair for each classroom was considered. Number of schools with the percentage of classes (including sections) having a chair and a table for the teacher is tabulated in State table 83.

Out of 20,205 schools in rural area, 10,912 and 9,56 schools have chairs and tables for the teachers in 81 to 100 per cent of their class rooms respectively constituting a percentage of 52.7 and 46.2. It is almost the same in case of Government Schools having this facility.

Whereas schools in urban area is concerned, 1,072 and 906 schools have chairs and tables for the teacher in 81-100 per cent of their classes respectively constituting a percentage of 56.33 and 49.7.

52.2 per cent and 44.9 per cent Government Schools in urban area have Chairs and tables for the teachers in 81 to 100 per cent of their class rooms respectively.

There is not much difference in facility for teachers between rural and urban areas.

In addition to the study of availability of furniture in the primary schools of the State, the data regarding various other essential facilities is collected and the analysis is given on managementwise variables.

The other aspects studied are schools owning text-books and having libraries and the size of the library is also taken into consideration. The statistics on this issue is presented in State Table 87, 88 and 89 respectively.

In State table 90 to 96, the administrative aspect of the school such as possession of Black boards and the arrangement for continuous supply of chalk and sufficient contingency funds is collected. Along with this number of schools arranging for medical check up, provision of sports materials, providing drinking water and sanitary facility and introduction of incentive schemes is enumerated.

In all these aspects schools in the urban areas show a significant contrast to the schools in the rural areas. Only in respect of availability of sports materials the urban area schools lag behind. Almost all type of schools in the rural area show very poor progress in these aspects and are yet to introduce these schemes in fulfilling the basic minimum requirements of a school.

CHAPTER VII

Middle School

The words "Middle Schools" mentioned in this report include independent Middle Schools (V to VII Classes) as well as Middle Sections (V to VII) attached to Higher Primary Schools.

Besides Middle Schools middle sections are attached to Secondary and Junior Colleges also in some areas.

Rural Area.—(i) There are 284 independent Middle Schools 9 006 Middle Schools with Primary sections, 32 Middle Sections attached to Secondary Schools, 7 Middle Sections attached to Higher Secondary schools in the State.

(a) 284 independent Middle schools comprise of 265 Government schools, 19 private aided schools, out of 9,006 Middle with Primary Sections, 8,564 are Government, 422 are Private aided and 20 are Private unaided, out of 32 Middle sections attached to Secondary Schools, 8 are Government schools, 22 private aided and 2 Private unaided out of 71 Middle sections attached to Higher Secondary Schools, 2 are Government and 5 are Private aided.

Urban Area.—(1) There are 332 independent Middle Schools 2,291 Middle Schools with Primary Sections, 134 Middle sections attached to Secondary Schools, 57 Middle Sections attached to Higher Secondary Schools in the state. Out of 377 independent Middle Schools 254 are Government 72 Private aided and 6 Private Un-aided, out of 2,291 higher Primary Schools, 1,502 are Government Schools. 11 local body, 526 Private aided, 252 Private Un-aided. Out of 134 Middle Sections attached to Secondary Schools, 26 are Govt. 5 local body 89 private aided and 14 are unaided. Out of 57 Middle sections attached to Higher Secondary Schools, 17 are Government, 3 local body, 34 private aided and the remaining 3 are private un-aided.

Incomplete Schools.—There are 1,579 and 415 incomplete Middle Schools in the rural and Urban Areas respectively.

Teacher Pupil Ratio-Estimated Child Population and Enrolment in the Middle Schools

44,918 teachers are working in 9,290 schools in the rural area and 27,618 teachers are working in 2,623 schools in the Urban areas in the State.

Rural Area.—Of the 44,918 teachers, 44,901 are full time and 17 are part time teachers ; 3,410 belonging to schedule caste (3,407 full time +3 Part time) and 296 belonging to (296 full time) scheduled tribe are working in the Middle Schools of the State.

Urban Area.—Of the 27,618 teachers, 27,380 are full time and 238 are part time teachers. 1,699 (1,695 full time and part 4 time) belonging to Scheduled Caste and 115 full time teachers belonging to Scheduled Tribes are working in the Middle Schools of the State.

According to State Table 107, there are 22,287 trained and 2,628 untrained teachers working in the Middle stage in the rural areas in the State. Out of the trained teachers 19,366 are male teachers and 2,921 are female teachers. Out of 2,678 untrained teachers, 2,340 are male teachers and 338 are female teachers.

According to State Table 108, there are 15,262 trained and 2,188 untrained teachers working in the Middle Stage of the Urban Area. Out of the trained, 6,929 and 8,333 are male and female teachers respectively. Out of 2,188 untrained teachers, 1,178 and 1,010 are male and female teachers respectively.

A close examination of State Table 108 reveals that the percentage of trained teachers is more than that of untrained teachers. And large number of teachers come under Matriculate qualified group. Even post-graduate teachers are working in these schools. These postgraduate teachers are mostly in the composite schools rather than in the purely middle schools. Again it is noticed that number of female teachers is larger in urban areas than in rural areas.

As in case of primary schools the distribution of teachers is not very satisfactory. There are about 664 sections with single teacher each for an enrolment below 20. In practice the services of teachers is utilised properly either by deputing them to the needy schools or by allotting work in the lower Primary Schools attached to the middle schools. In rural areas such conditions are inevitable according to the needs of the habitation. In the urban area of Bellary District, many such uneconomic schools are found.

According to the figure of the IV Survey, 42.74 per cent and 44.88 per cent of middle sections of rural and Urban areas of the State respectively show satisfactory distribution of teachers. The percentages themselves reveal the unsatisfactory distribution. The situation at the Primary stage is far better than the middle section in the State. In identifying this position according to the managements in rural areas it is found that Private aided schools take the lead with 66.45 per cent and in Government Schools it is 41.55 per cent. But in Private unaided schools the percentages of schools having satisfactory distribution of teachers is only 18.18 per cent. But in urban areas local body schools take a lead with 78.94 per cent of schools having fair distribution of teachers. In Government 37.51 per cent of schools 62.82 per cent of private aided and 43.27 per cent of Private unaided schools have proper distribution of teachers. This situation needs improvement.

In classes V to VII in our State we find the children of all age groups between 6 to 18 years are enrolled. This is found both in rural and urban areas; but the majority of the children are in the age group of 11 to 14 years and 14 to 15 years, both in rural and urban areas of the State.

Comparing the figures of enrolment at the middle stage with the Primary stage there is a decrease in enrolment at the middle stage, both in rural and urban areas. 52,16,039 children are enrolled at the Primary stage in the entire State and only 10,39,192 at the middle stage. Further details are furnished in the Table given below.

South Kanara, Bangalore, Bellary, Bijapur and Gulbarga District have schools with 1 to 2 rooms for a strength above 500.

Schools running in shifts due to scarcity of space on managementwise variables and the purpose for which the school building is utilised is detailed below.

Only 49 Government Middle Schools are running in shifts in rural area and rest of the Schools in rural area are running in one session only. Percentage of schools running in shift is less than one.

In Urban areas 288 Government, 2 local body, 58 Pri-aided and 22 Pre-unaided schools are running in shifts. The percentage of such schools is as follows :

Government—288 out of 1756—16.40%

Local body—2 out of 11—18.19%

Pri-aided—58 out of 598—9.69%

Pri-unaided—22 out of 258—8.52%

It is evident from the above data that the scarcity of space is seen only in urban areas. Most of the middle schools are not used for other purposes.

Only 60 out of 9,290 in rural (.64 per cent) and 184 out of 2,623 (.70 Per cent) are used for running other schools .70 (.75 percent) in rural 4 (0.15 per cent) in urban area are used for Panchayat meetings.

97 (1.04 per cent) middle schools in rural 66 (2.51 per cent) in urban area are used for religious purposes.

151 (1.62 per cent) in rural, 39 (1.48 per cent) in urban area are used for running part-time courses.

124 (1.33 per cent) in rural and 38 (1.44 per cent) in urban area are used for a any other purpose not specified above. Some of them are used for more than one purpose
School having playground facility :

5,940 Government Middle Schools out of 8,829 (67.27 per cent) 377 out of 441 Pri-aided (85.48 per cent), 17 out of 20 Pri-unaided (85 percent) schools are having playground facility in the rural area.

1,020 Government schools out of 1,756 (58.08 per cent), 8 out of 11 Local body schools (72.7 per cent), 424 out of 598 Pri-aided (70.9 per cent) and 166 Pri-unaided out of 258 (64.34 per cent) schools in Urban area are having playground facility.

Schools according to adequacy of mats/furniture for students :

State table 80 gives the number of middle schools (i) not having any, (ii) not having adequate and (iii) having adequate furniture in different percentage of their classrooms
Schools according to Availability of Chairs, Table for teachers :

Schools according to the availability of chairs and tables for teachers according to different percentage of their class rooms is detailed in State Table 84.

While collecting data on the ownership of the building and adequacy of classrooms, information regarding availability of certain essential facilities in the Middle Schools such as, Schools having Text Books, adequacy of Black board and continuous supply of chalk, library facility, drinking water and sanitary facility ; data on schools arranging for medical inspection and introducing incentive scheme is also collected. Information is furnished in the State. Table 87 to 96.

Provision of the above mentioned facilities are fairly satisfactory in the middle schools of the State. Yet there is scope for further improvement. Immediate attention is to be paid in providing drinking water and sanitary facilities in the Middle Schools.

CHAPTER VIII

Secondary Sections/Schools

The words "Secondary Schools" mentioned in this report include independent Secondary Schools (VIII to X Classes) as well as Secondary Schools with Primary/Middle Sections attached to Secondary Section or Stage means all Secondary Classes (VIII to X) whether independent or attached to primary or middle sections.

Rural Area There are 1294 independent Secondary Schools, 24 Secondary with Middle Sections, 8 with Primary and Middle Sections, 60 Secondary Sections under Junior Colleges only, 6 Secondary sections with Middle sections and Junior Colleges.

1,326 Secondary schools inclusive of composite Secondary Schools with Primary and Middle comprise of 460 Government Schools, 2 Local Body Schools, 773 Private aided schools, 91 Private unaided Schools.

(1) 460 Government Secondary Schools comprise of 5 boys, 2 girls and 453 co-educational schools

(2) 2 Local body schools are co-educational schools.

(3) 773 Private aided institutions comprise of 8 Boys, 18 Girls and 747 co-educational schools.

(4) 91 Private unaided Institutions Comprise of 2 Boys, and 89 co-educational schools.

Urban Area : There are 724 independent Secondary schools, 113 secondary with Middle sections, 21 secondary with Middle and Primary Sections, 118 Junior Colleges with Secondary Sections 44 Junior Colleges with Secondary and Middle Sections, 12 Junior Colleges with Secondary, Middle and Primary Sections.

858 Secondary Schools inclusive of composite secondary schools (Primary and Middle School) comprise of 152 Government Schools, 27 Local Body Schools, 595 Private Aided Schools, 84 Private unaided schools.

(i) 152 Government Schools comprise of 27 Boys, 67 Girls and 56 Co-educational Institutions.

(ii) 27 Local Body Schools comprise of 12 boys, 10 Girls and 5 Co-educational Institutions.

(iii) 595 Private Aided Schools comprise of 102 Boys, 231 Girls and 262 co-educational Institutions.

(iv) 84 Private unaided schools comprise of 13 boys, 29 Girls and 42 co-educational Institutions.

Incomplete Schools : There are 59 incomplete Secondary schools in Rural area and 35 incomplete secondary schools in urban area.

Teachers, Teacher Pupil ratio and enrolment :

No. of Teachers actually working : (1) 10,518 teachers are working in 1,326 schools of the rural area and 11,804 teachers are working in 858 schools of the urban area in the State.

Out of 10 518 teachers, 199 are part-time teachers and the rest are full time teachers. 222 (Full time 216 Part-time 6) belong to Schedule Castes. 78 (all full time) belong to schedule tribes in the Rural area.

In the secondary schools of Urban area, 11,568 are full time teachers and 236 are part-time teachers. Out of these teachers 231 (224 full time 7 part-time) belong to scheduled caste and 88 (all full time) belong to schedule tribe.

According to State Table 107, there are 9 299 trained teachers and 1,540 untrained teachers working in the Secondary Stage of rural area. Out of these trained teachers 8,583 are male teachers and 716 are female teachers. Out of 1,540 untrained teachers, 1,388 are male and 152 are female teachers. Comparing the number of trained teachers to the III All India Survey figures there has been an overall increase in the percentage of trained teachers both in rural and urban areas.

According to State Table 108, there are 11,736 trained and 1,814 untrained teachers working in the Secondary stage of Urban area. Out of these trained teachers, 7907 are male and 3,829 are female teachers. Un-trained teachers comprise of 1,235 male and 579 female teachers. Studying the percentage of female teachers working in rural and Urban areas, it is found that the female teachers are more in Urban areas than in rural areas. There are 32.5 per cent female teachers in Urban areas and 8 per cent in rural area.

Following is the Areawise distribution of the trained and untrained teachers according to qualification, sex and stage. Percentage of trained teacher is more than the untrained one.

Taking the overall picture of the State, the teacher-pupil ratio is fairly satisfactory. There is not much variation between the rural and urban area schools. Even according to the managements, the variation noticed is marginal.

TEACHER PUPIL RATIO

There are 33 Secondary Sections in rural area and 32 in Urban area where the teacher pupil ratio is very low. These come under uneconomical schools. Such schools are concentrated in the districts of Belgaum, Bellary, Bidar, Chickmagalur Raichur, Chitradurga, Dharwar, Gulbarga, Mysore, Shimoga and Tumkur Districts.

Out of 33 Sections in rural area, 27 are Government, 2 Private aided and 4 Private unaided. Bangalore, Bidar, South Kanara, Belgaum, Chickmagalur, Dharwar, Gulbarga, Bellary, Bijapur, Hassan, South Kanara Districts have such schools. In urban area, out of 32 sections, 3 are Government, 16 Private aided, 13 Private unaided.

According to the table given here it is seen that the children enrolled to Classes VIII to X, are mostly in the age groups 14—15, 15—16 and 16—17 years in the Urban areas but in rural areas the percentage of enrolment is high in the higher age group like 16—17 and 17—18, 18 and above. The percentage of enrolment in urban areas is more than

that of the percentage of enrolment in rural areas of the state to the secondary stage classes. Only 35 per cent of the students enrolled at the middle stage are enrolled at the secondary stage. Through 12 years is the minimum age for admission in to High Schools, the enrolment below 11 years of 21 candidates in rural area may be taken as voluntary admission case.

(1) Types of Road passing within 1- kms. in rural area :

The schools are distributed according to the existence of metalled or non-metalled road within a distance of 1.5 kms. from the school. The type of roads in existence is classified as follows :

Metalled, Non-Metalled, both metalled and non-metalled and none.

There is a metalled road passing within 12 kms. in respect of 679 schools, non-metalled road in respect of 204 schools, both metalled and non-metalled road in respect of 488 schools. No road is in existence in respect of 5 schools, Bijapur, Chickmagalur, Kolar and North Kanara have these schools without any roads.

(2) Rural schools according to distance from Railway Station/Bus station :

(i) 1,080 Secondary schools are situated within a distance of 1.5 kms. from the Bus stop or Railway Station.

(ii) 104 secondary schools are situated between the distances 1.5 to 4 kms. from the bus stop or Railway station.

(ii) During the third survey cut of 1141 schools there were 817 Pucca buildings (Government 289, Local body 19, Private aided 440, Private unaided Recognised 63, Private Unaided unrecognised (6). 114 had partly Pucca buildings (Government, 30, Local body 3) Private aided 67, Private unaided recognised 18, Private unaided recognised 1) 200 had kucha buildings (Government 65, Local body 9, Pri-aided 98, Pri-unaided recognised 25, Pri-unaided unrecognised 3) 9 schools were conducted in thatched huts (Government 4, Local body 1, Pri-aided, 2 Pri-unaided Recognised (2). One Government school was conducted in tent.

Urban Area.—(i) Out of 858 schools, 757 have Pucca buildings (Government 143, Local body 26, Pri-aided 517, Pri-unaided 71) 66 have partly pucca buildings (Government 2, Local body 1, Pri-aided 57, and Pri-unaided 6). 32 schools have kucha buildings (Government 6, Private aided 20, Private unaided 6). 2 Schools are held in thatched huts (Government 1, Private aided 1) and 1 Private unaided is held in tent.

(ii) During the third Survey, 658 schools have pucca buildings (Government 117, Local body 40, Private aided 435 Private unaided recognised 62, and Private unaided 4), 61 had partly pucca buildings (Government 9, Local body 4, Private aided 37, Private unaided recognised 10, Private unaided unrecognised (1). 36 had kuchcha buildings (Government 2, Local body 2, Private aided 26, Private unaided recognised 6) 3 schools had thatched huts (Local body 1, Private aided 2).

(iii) There is only one Government High School held in tent in the South Taluk of Bangalore South District. (Urban area). There are two Government High Schools, one in Raichur District, (Gangavathi Taluk) and another in Dakshina Kannada District (Bantwal Taluk) which are held in thatched huts in the Rural area. More details are furnished with exact locations in Annexure I, II and III.

(5) Distribution of schools according to ownership of accommodation :

Rural Area.—(1) Out of 1326 High Schools 579 Schools are housed in own buildings (Government 277, Local body 2, Private aided 280, Private unaided 20) 473 are held in rented buildings (Government 53, Private aided 388, Private Unaided 32). 274 are housed in Rent free buildings (Government 130, Private aided 105. Private unaided 39).

(2) During the thirdsurvey out of 1141 schools 435 had their own buildings (Government 221. Local body 12. Private aided 215. Private unaided recognised 35. Private unaided unrecognised 2,) 371 schools were held in rented buildings (Government 55 Local Body 5 Private aided 269 Private unaided recognised 36 Private unaided unrecognised 6. 219 schools were held in rent free buildings (Government 93 Local body 13 Private aided 80, Private unaided recognised 32, Private unaided unrecognised 1). 30 schools were housed in partly owned and partly rented buildings (Government 5, Local body 1, Private aided 21, Private unaided recognised 2, Private unaided unrecognised 1) 17 schools were housed in partly owned and partly rent free buildings (Government 10, Local body 1, Private aided 6) and 19 schools were held in partly rented and partly rent free buildings. (Government 5, Private aided 11, Private unaided recognised 3).

Urban Area.—(i) 378 schools have their own buildings (Government 112, Local body 24, Private aided 207, Private unaided 35) 401 schools are held in rented buildings (Government 16, Local body 1, Private aided 348, Private unaided 36). 77 are held in Rent Free buildings (Government 23, Local body 2, Private aided 39 and Private unaided 13.

(ii) During the third survey, out of 758 schools, 384 had ownbuildings (Government 102, Local body 40, Private aided 205, Private unaided recognised 36, Private unaided unrecognised 1) 318 schools were held in rented buildings (Government 14, Local body 4, Private aided 264, Private unaided recognised 33, Private unaided unrecognised 3) 31 schools were held in Rent free buildings (Government 9. Local body 3, Private aided 13, Private unaided. recognised 5, Private unaided unrecognised 1) 14 schools were held in partly owned and partly rented buildings (Private aided 10, Private unaided recognised 2, Government 2, 5 schools were housed in partly owned and partly rent free buildings Private aided 3 Private unaided recognised 1, Government 116 schools were held in partly rented and partly rent free buildings (Private aided 5, Private unaided recognised)

(6) Schools according to covered area :

Rural area : Out of 1,326 schools, 395 (29.79 per cent) schools do not require any additional accommodation, 647 schools require 1—3 rooms, 23 require 4—6 rooms, 38 require 7—9 rooms, 12 require 10—12 rooms, 2 require 13—15 rooms, 1 requires 16—18 rooms and one more than 18 rooms.

Urban area : Out of 858 schools, 362 (42.19 per cent) schools do not require any additional accommodation, 289 schools require 1—3 rooms, 156 schools require 4—6 rooms, 26 require 7—9 rooms, 17 require 10—12 rooms, 3 schools are in need of 13—15 rooms and 3 require 16—18 rooms, 2 in need of more than 18 rooms (Table 69).

(8) Schools according to Class rooms available and enrolment :

The enrolment ranges from upto 100 to above 1,000. The schools are distributed according to the enrolment and class rooms available. Following tables give the details both in the rural and urban areas.

Schools running in Shifts (See State Table 76):

There are schools both in rural and urban areas of the State running in shifts. Managementwise data is collected and presented here along with the percentages of Schools running in shifts, the percentage of such schools is more in urban areas than in rural areas. 3 Government (6.5), 2 Private aided (0.25), 2 Private unaided (2.19) schools in rural area and Government (5.26) 3 local body (11.11), 20 Private aided (3.36), 5 Private unaided (5.96) schools, in urban area are running in shifts. The percentage of schools running in shifts in rural area is very low. Most of the schools are running in buildings meant for high schools.

Whereas in Urban area, the percentage is slightly more than the rural areas.

School buildings used for other purposes (See State Table 77) :

(i) 426 Government (92.60), 2 Local body (100 percent), 725 Private aided (92.79), 82 Private unaided (90.10), schools in rural areas and 125 Government (82.23), 19 Local body (70.37), 527 Private aided (88.57), 70 Private unaided (83.33) high schools in urban area are not used for any other purpose.

(ii) 14 Government (3.04), 11 Private aided (0.14), high schools in rural, and 17 Government (11.18), 4 Local body (14.81), 20 Private aided (3.36), 3 Private unaided (3.57) high schools in Urban area are used for running another school or college.

(iii) 9 Government (1.96), 6 Private aided (0.77), 4 Private unaided (4.39) High schools in rural and none in the Urban area are used for conducting Panchayath meetings

(iv) 9 Government (1.96), 17 Private aided (2.19), 3 Private unaided (3.29), schools in rural and 2 Government (0.43), 2 Local body (7.4), 15 Private aided (1.95) 7 Private unaided (7.69) high schools in urban area are used for religious purposes.

(v) One Government (0.21), 11 Private aided (1.42), 2 Private unaided (2.19), High schools in rural and 2 Government (0.43), 2 Local Body (7.4), 23 private aided (3.80), 3 Private unaided (3.57) high schools in urban area are used for part time course 2 Government (0.43), 12 Private aided (1.55), 1 Private unaided (1.09) in rural and 5 Government (9.86), 12 private aided (2.01) and 1 Private unaided (0.19) high schools in urban area are used for any other purpose.

High school having Playground Facility (See State Table 78) :

346 Government (75.2), 2 Local Body (100 per cent), 669 Private aided (86.41), 66 Private unaided (74.72), high schools in rural and 141 Government (92.79), 21 Local Body (77.77), 455 Private aided (76.47), 67 Private unaided (97.76) high schools in urban area are having playground facility.

Majority of the schools in rural as well as urban areas are having playground facilities.

High Schools according to adequacy of mats/furniture for students :

The number of schools (i) not having any (ii) not having adequate and (iii) having adequate furniture in different percentage of classrooms is given in State Table 81.

Schools according to availability of Chairs/Tables for teachers

State Table 85 gives the number of schools with percentage of classes (including sections) having chairs and tables for the teachers. State Tables 87 to 96 furnish information with regard to various necessary facilities such as Text books, supply of chalk, contingency funds, drinking water and sanitary facilities. Provision of Sports material and library facility, schools introducing incentive schemes, etc., in the Secondary Schools of the State. Information is presented for rural and urban areas separately along with percentage of Schools according to management, providing the above quoted facilities.

CHAPTER IX

Junior Colleges

The words "Junior Colleges" mentioned in this report include independent Junior Colleges (XI to XII Classes) as well as composite Junior Colleges, with Primary/Middle/Secondary sections attached to Junior Colleges.

Rural Area: There are 14 independent Junior Colleges, one Junior College with Middle and Primary Sections, 60 Junior Colleges with Secondary Sections, 6 Junior Colleges with Secondary and Middle Sections

Out of 81 Junior Colleges :

- (1) 34 are Govt.—These are co-educational Institutions.
- (2) 46 are Private aided – One is Girls and 45 are co-educational Institutions.
- (3) One is Private unaided – which is a Boy's Institution.

Urban Area : There are 61 Independent Junior Colleges, 1 Junior College with middle Section, 118 are Junior Colleges with Secondary Sections, 44 with Secondary and Middle Sections, 12 with Secondary, Middle and Primary Sections.

Out of 236 institutions :

- (1) 119 are Govt. – 9 Boys, 5 Girls and 105 Co-educational.
- (2) 7 are local body – 3 Girls, 4 Co-educational.
- (3) 103 Private aided – 10 Boys, 13 Girls, 80 Co-educational.
- (4) 7 Private unaided – 4 Boys, 1 Girls, 2 Co-educational.

Incomplete Schools : There is only one Govt. Junior College in the rural area which is incomplete. Out of 5 incomplete Junior Colleges in urban area 2 are Govt., 2 Private aided, and 1 Private unaided.

Teachers, Teacher Pupil Ratio and Enrolment :

1363 teachers are working in the rural area and 6,376 teachers are working in the urban area.

Rural Area : Of the 1,363 teachers, 1,350 are full time teachers and 13 are part-time teachers. There are 21 full time teachers belonging to Schedule Caste and 10 belonging to Schedule Tribes.

Urban Area : Of the 6,376 teachers 6297 are full time teachers and 79 are part time teachers. Out of the 213 Schedule Caste Teachers, 212 are full time and one is part time. 40 full time teachers belong to Schedule Tribes.

According to state table 107, there are 512 trained teachers and 293 untrained teachers working in the Junior College stage in the rural areas of the State. Out of the trained teachers 480 are male 32 are female ; 293 untrained teachers comprise of 281 male and 12 female teachers in the urban areas. The percentage of female teachers is only 6.66% in rural area and 4.3% in urban areas.

According to State Table 108, there are 2,030 trained teachers and 1,288 untrained teachers working in the Junior College in the Urban areas of the State. Out of the trained teachers 1,627 are male teachers and 403 are female teachers. Out of the untrained teachers 1,057 are male teachers and 231 are female teachers. There has been considerable increase in the proportion of trained teachers from the date of III All India Educational Survey to IV All India Educational Survey.

The Proportion of Trained and Untrained teachers is 15:11 in rural areas and approximately 3:2 in the Urban areas of the State. Female teachers are more in Urban area than in rural areas almost 16 times the number in Rural areas.

There are 45 Junior College sections in the enrolment range 200 and above, which are having upto 5 to more than 15 teachers in the rural area.

In the Urban area, there are 157 Junior College sections in the enrolment range 200 and above which are having upto 5 to more than 1 teachers.

TEACHER PUPIL RATIO

There are 81 Junior College Sections in the rural area and 236 in the Urban area as per State table 118. The sections according to pupil teacher ratio is furnished in (State Table 118).

Mandya and Coorg districts have Junior Colleges which have teachers for a strength of less than 10. Belgaum, Chickmagalur, Hassan, North Kanara, Raichur, Bijapur and Bangalore again have uneconomical Junior Colleges since the teacher pupil ratio is 1:10, in these institutions, 6 are Govt., 1 Private aided, 7 Private unaided in Urban areas and in Rural 1 Govt., and 1 Private aided.

Percentage of enrolment in Classes XI and XII is less than the percentage at the Secondary Stage. Enrolment of children in the age group 17-18 years and 18 and above is more than the other age groups. Urban areas record higher enrolment index than the rural areas especially at this stage, the variation between the enrolment at rural and urban areas at all other stages of education is very narrow. Percentage of boys enrolment is more than the girls both in rural and urban areas of the State.

OTHER FACILITIES

(1) Types of Road passing within 1½ kms. in Rural area :

The schools are distributed according to the existence of metalled or non-metalled road within a distance of 1.5 kms. of the school. Types of roads in existence is classified as follows : Metalled, non-Metalled, both Metalled non metalled and none.

There is a metalled road passing within 1½ kms. in respect of 44 schools, both metalled and non-metalled road in respect of 34 schools.

(2) Rural Schools according to distance from Railway Station/Bus stop :

(i) 74 Higher Secondary Schools are situated within a distance of 1.5 kms. from the bus stop or Railway Station.

(ii) 5 Higher Secondary Schools are situated between the distance 1.5 and 4 kms' from the Bus stop or Railway Station.

(iii) 2 Higher Secondary schools are situated at a distance of more than 4 kms. from the Bus stop or Railway Station.

(3) Schools according to distance from the Office of the Immediate Inspecting Officer :

These schools have been classified according to the distance from the office of the immediate Inspecting Officer, both in rural and urban area.

Distribution of Schools according to ownership of Accommodation :

Rural Area.—(i) 63 schools (Govt. 34, Private aided 28, Private unaided (1) have own buildings ; 18 are in rented buildings (Private aided 18). Ownership of accommodation has not improved since the date of III Survey.

(ii) During the Third Survey, 63 schools had their own buildings (Govt. 33, Pri-aided 35, Pri-unaided (1).

Urban Area.—(i) Out of 236 schools, 183 schools have own buildings, 49 are in rented buildings, 4 are in Rent free buildings. There has been slight improvement regarding the buildings in Urban Areas, from the date of III Survey, as a good number of Institutes have owned buildings.

Schools running in Shifts (State Table 76) :

Only one Government School in rural (29.41) and 23 Government (19.32), 1 Local Body (14.28), 18 Private aided (17.47), 6 Private unaided (85.71) in urban area are running in shifts. Shift system is seen more in Urban areas where there is shortage of accommodation.

School buildings used for other purposes (See State Table 77) :

In rural area none of the 34 Higher Secondary Schools are used for any other purpose.

Out of the 46 Private aided Higher Secondary Schools, 43 are not used for any other purpose, 3 for running another school, and only one for religious purposes. There is only one Private unaided School in rural area and this is not used for any other purpose.

In Urban area, out of 119 Government Schools, 108 are not used for any other purpose, 4 are used for running another school in the College, one is used for conducting panchayat meetings, one is used for religious purposes, 5 for part time courses, 2 for any other purposes.

Out of the 7 local body schools, 4 are not used for any other purpose, 2 are used for religious purposes, and only one for part time courses.

Out of 103 Private aided schools, 80 are not used for any other purpose, 11 are used for running another school/college, 5 are used for religious purposes, 4 for part-time course, 3 for any other purposes.

Out of 7 Private unaided Higher Secondary Schools in Urban area, 6 are not used for any other purpose, where as one school is used for running another school/college and for any other purpose also.

Schools having play-ground facility (See State Table 78) :

22 Government (64.71 per cent), 44 Private aided (96.65 per cent) one Private unaided (100 per cent), schools in rural and 100 Government (84.03 per cent), 7 Local-body (100 per cent), 93 Private aided (90.29 per cent) 7 Private unaided (100 per cent) in Urban area are having Playground facility.

State Table 82 gives the number of schools (Managementwise) according to adequacy of mats/furniture for students.

Details of schools with percentage of classes (i) not having any mats/furniture, (ii) not having adequate mats/furniture, (iii) having adequate mats/furniture for students are given managementwise for schools in rural and urban areas.

Table 86 gives the number of schools according to availability of chairs and Tables for Teachers. Details of schools (Area and Managementwise) with percentage of classes having chair and Table for the teacher.

The following tables furnish information in respect of schools according to their management mentioning the percentage of schools providing the basic facilities that fulfil the ideal conditions of the school. The aspects which are taken into consideration are (a) Availability of furniture, (b) Provision of Black Board and continuous supply of chalk, (c) contingency funds, (d) play ground facilities, (e) library facilities, (f) libraries possessing text books, (g) drinking water and sanitary facilities, (h) Schools introducing incentive scheme and arranging for medical checkup.

(See State Tables 86 to 97).

CHAPTER X

Villages in various population slabs according to proportion of SC/ST population and availability of Education Facilities

There are 26,677 villages in the State. Out of these 403 have population of more than 5,000. 2,541 villages have population ranging between 2,000 to 5,000. There are 5,219 villages coming under the population slab of 1,000—1,999 and 7,281 villages have population between 400—499 and 2,588 villages between 300—399. The remaining 6,426 villages come under below 300 population slab.

All the 26,677 villages do not have schooling facilities. Some villages have any one or a combination of these facilities. For example a Primary schooling facility only or Primary and Middle ; Primary, Middle and Secondary and so on.

Among these 26,677 villages of the State, 21,079 villages have Primary Schools, 8,007 villages have Middle Schools. 1,332 villages have Secondary Schools and 91 Villages have Higher Secondary Schools.

Out of these 26,677 villages, 4,681 villages do not have Scheduled Caste population. 3,567 villages have 26-50 percent of Scheduled Caste population. 17,263 villages have of 1-25% scheduled Caste population. 1166 villages have more than 50% of SC population. Out of 1,166 villages 442 villages are habited by more than 75 percent of Scheduled Caste population.

Out of 1,166 villages which are predominantly populated by Scheduled Castes, 667 villages have Primary Schooling facility in them constituting 57.2 per cent to the total number of such villages. Even though the overall percentage is satisfactory, schooling facility is not encouraging under the population slab of below 300. New schools may be started in some of the school-less villages under this population slab in order to provide more schooling facilities for Scheduled Caste population.

Middle Schooling facility is somewhat satisfactory up to 1,000—1,999 population slab. In the rest of the population slabs it is not encouraging. Even if the overall percentage is considered, only 103 out of 1,166 villages predominantly populated by Scheduled Castes have middle schools in them. This works out to 8.8 per cent to the total number of villages predominantly populated by Scheduled Castes. By starting Primary School and by up-grading the existing Primary School this can be improved.

It is peculiar to note that Secondary Schooling facility is available in all the population slabs except for the villages under the population slab 400-499. A few Secondary Schools may be started under this population slab also according to the needs of the locality.

There is not even a single Higher Secondary School in the villages which are predominantly populated by Scheduled Castes. This facility may be provided atleast for the villages having a population of more than 5,000.

23,874 villages out of 26,677 villages of the State do not have Scheduled Tribe population. There are 2,528 villages in the Scheduled Tribes population range of 1-25 percent and 198 villages in 26-50 percent. 77 villages have more than 50 percent of population of Scheduled Tribes community and out of these, in 41 villages more than 75 percent of population comprises of Scheduled Tribe community.

Out of 77 villages which have more than 50 percent of scheduled tribe population, 45 villages have Primary Schools in them constituting 58.4 percent to the total number of villages populated predominantly by Scheduled Tribes. Primary Schooling facility is available in all the population slabs except in the 2 villages under the population slab 400-499. These villages are located in Coorg and Tumkur Districts which are school-less villages. Primary Schooling facility may be provided in these villages. Middle Schooling facility is not satisfactory in all the population slabs which are populated pre-dominantly by Scheduled Tribes. Existing Primary schools of these areas may be up-graded in order to give more facility for the Backward areas.

Not even a single village pre-dominantly populated by S.Ts. have Secondary and Higher Secondary Schooling facility. Secondary Schooling facility is very necessary atleast for the villages having population between 1,000-1,999.

The following table furnishes the percentage of villages having schooling facility under each population slab.

As could be seen from the table, Primary Schooling facility is encouraging in all the population slabs except in the population slab below 300. Middle Schooling facility is satisfactory up to 1,000-1,999 population slab. The percentage of villages having Middle Schooling facility is not encouraging in the remaining slabs. Primary schooling facility may be provided to more number of villages under the population slab of below 300.

Secondary schooling facility is satisfactory only in 5,000 and above population slab. At least more Secondary schooling facility may be provided for the villages under 2,000-4,999 population slab as only 24.79 percent of villages under this population slab have secondary schooling facility. Higher Secondary Schooling facility is not satisfactory in all the population slabs. Facility is Nil under population slabs 500-999 and 400-499.

CHAPTER XI

Non-Formal Education

Out of the 26,677 villages of the State, 24,594 villages do not have any non-formal education centres for any age group. Only 2,083 villages have non-formal education centres. Out of these, 576 villages are in 2,000 and above population slab, 164 of these villages have non-formal education centres for the age group 6-14 years at the ratio of a centre each in 152 villages, 2 each in ten villages and more than two in 2 villages.

413 villages have non-formal education centres for the age group 14-35 years, 342 villages have only one centre each, 44 villages have two centres each and 27 villages have more than 2 centres.

63 villages have non-formal education centres for the age group above 35 years, 57 villages have one centre each, 4 have 2 centres each and 2 villages have more than 2 centres.

1,000-1,999 Population slab

683 villages come under 1,000-1,999 population slab, 131 villages have a centre each, 2 villages have 2 centres while 6 villages have more than 2 centres for the age group of 6-14 years.

For the age group 14 to 35 years, there is a centre each in 460 villages, 42 villages have 2 centres each and 14 villages have more than 2 centres each.

500-999 Population slab

529 villages in this population slab have non-formal education centres. 98 villages have a centre each for 6-14 age group, 3 villages have 2 centres each and 3 villages have more than 2 centres. 411 villages have centres for the age group 14-35 years, 379 villages have a centre each, 26 villages have 2 centres each and 6 villages have more than 2 centres.

Below 500 Population Slab :

There are 295 villages having non-formal education centres under this slab. Only 49 villages have a centre each for 6-14 age group, 228 villages have a centre each for the age group 14-35 years, 9 villages have 2 centres each, 1 village has more than 2 centres.

For the age group above 35, 42 villages are having a centre each and 2 villages have 2 centres each.

District wise distribution of non-formal education Centres and total number of participants for the age group 6-14 years.—

Of the 26,677 villages in the State, 456 villages have non-formal education centres for the age group 6-14 years constituting to the 1.710 to the total number of villages.

Following is the Districtwise percentage of villages having non-formal education centre calculated to the total number of villages in each district along with the number of participants in each district.

There are 13,894 participants in this age group comprising 10,263 boys and 3,631 girls. South Kanara is the only district where no girls are receiving non-formal education in these centres. While Bijapur has higher number of girl participants i.e., 1114 girls exceeding the boys participants number which is 1096. Mandya, Coorg and North Kanara districts have no non-formal education centres. The villages having higher number of participants are in the Population slab of "2000 and above" whereas the lowest number of participants are in the population slab of "Below 500". The percentage of these participants to the total number of participants is 19.44%.

Age group 14—35 years :—1,568 villages among the 26,677 villages of the State imparting non-formal education to the age group of 14—35 years constitutes 5.9% to the total number of villages. Following is the District-wise percentage of villages having

non-formal education centres calculated to the total number of villages in each district, along with the number of participants in each district.

Among the total number of participants, the percentage of 14—35 years is the highest with 71.39 of the total participants. There are 42,722 male and 8,592 female participants in the State in this age group Chitradurga has the highest number of female participants (1414). Whereas South Kanara has only 20 female participants. The villages recording highest number of participants are in the population slab of 1,000—1,999. Whereas the villages with lowest number of participants are in the population slab of below 500.

Age group above 35 years :—Only 247 villages out of the 26,677 villages of the State have non-formal education centres for the age group above 35 years constituting 0.93s to the total number of villages. Following is the District-wise percentage of villages

having non-formal education centres calculated to the total number of villages in each district along with the number of participants in each district.

There are 5,148 male and 1,548 female participants in this age group in this State and constitutes 9.27 to the total number of participants. South Kanara district has no female participants. Where as Coorg district has no male participants. Only Bijapur has the highest number of female participants. The villages recording highest number of participants come under 1,000—1,999 population slab and the lowest number of participants are in "Below 500" population slab.

CHAPTER XII

Conclusion, Inference and Suggestion.

The preceding chapters have dealt in detail the various aspects of educational facilities at the four stages of education (Primary, Middle, Secondary, Higher Secondary) available in the State. The endeavour in the chapter is to bring into focus some of the main issues that need immediate attention. An attempt is also made, wherever possible, to draw attention to their possible and suggested solutions.

Primary schooling facility in all the habitations of the State in general and of the habitations predominantly populated by Scheduled caste and Scheduled tribes in particular is studied in detail and the findings have been mentioned in the respective chapters. Taking an overall view, the availability of Primary Schooling facility is fairly satisfactory in the State very few habitations do not have primary schools, but it is due to thin population of the respective habitations. Though the provision of schooling facility is commendable the Middle school facility is not very satisfactory. The Primary Schools may be upgraded to cater to the needs of the individual habitations. Similar situation is apparent in case of Provision of Secondary and Higher Secondary Schooling facility.

Enrolment :

A problem common to almost all the districts in the State is enrolment. The principle of universalisation of elementary education is not realised fully in spite of the provision of schooling facility in the rural areas. The percentage of enrolment gradually declines in the higher age groups which clearly indicates an increase in dropouts number. In order to confirm it, whether the dropouts are enrolled at the non-formal education centres, follow-up work of the IV Survey has to be taken up and then the enrolment of dropouts to the respective non-formal education centres should be enforced.

Again the percentage of enrolment of girls is lower than the boys in all age groups. Similarly, in the higher age groups only 6.20 of the eligible girls are enrolled in the schools. As the causes are not apparent at present it needs an in-depth study. In the meanwhile as a preliminary measure incentives like Attendance scholarships, free Text books, etc., may be introduced to encourage the enrolment of girls and of the weaker sections in particular.

Teachers :

The teacher-pupil ratio is quite satisfactory all over the State at all the four stages of Education. The proportion of trained teachers is also encouraging.

Building facilities in the School :

Another issue that needs immediate attention of the Government is the school buildings. Many of the schools and mostly the Primary Schools are run in open space thatched huts and tents. The number of such schools and their exact location mentioning the type of management of the school is tabulated in Annexure I, II, III in order to facilitate the authorities to take immediate action.

The total number of Primary schools run in open space are 112, and all are Government schools. Large number of such schools are found in Raichur, Kolar, Tumkur and Bijapur. There are only 2 Middle schools run in open space. Fortunately there are no secondary or higher secondary schools in the State which are run in open space.

637 Primary schools are run in thatched huts 631 of them are Government schools, 6 are Private aided. These schools are concentrated in Bijapur, Mysore, Chitradurga and Belgaum Districts.

14 Middle schools are run in thatched huts, out of these 14, 9 are Government schools, 4 are Private aided and one Private unaided. Only 3 high schools are run in thatched huts but none of the higher secondary schools are run in thatched huts.

There are 29 Primary schools run in tents and all those are Government schools. There are 3 Middle Schools, 3 High Schools run in tents. All those Middle schools are Government Schools and one such High school is Private aided, located in Gulbarga District.

Chickmagalur, Chitradurga, Kodagu and Dharwar districts do not have any school at any stage running in open space. The Government may be moved to take necessary action as most of them are Government schools.

Necessary Facilities in Schools :

Another important issue that concerns is the condition of the schools. Quite a good number of schools exist because there are students on the roll and nothing else. Since the type of accommodation and provision of basic facilities like drinking water and sanitary facilities, and other essential facilities contribute in influencing the pupils to a great extent. This issue needs attention though, establishment of a school in a particular area is the fundamental necessity. provision of all other facilities is an equally important factor in defining the education pattern in the school and establishing a systematically in the School.

These improvements cannot be made overnight, yet an attempt in this direction will improve the conditions in the years to come. The details of this issue is dealt in the respective chapters. The responsibility of improving the conditions of schools may be entrusted to the local inspecting authority fixing the target to be achieved in an academic year.

All the problems highlighted in this chapter undoubtedly deserve indepth study and quick action.
