

HIGHLIGHTS.

GEOGRAPHICAL FEATURES.

The East Kameng District lies approximately between the latitude $26^{\circ} 56'$ and $27^{\circ} 30'$ and longitude $92^{\circ} 36'$ and $93^{\circ} 24'$ E'. Its geographical area is approximately 4134 sq.km. The district is bounded by Lower Subansiri District in the East, West Kameng District in the West, Sikkim Line (international boundary) and a part of Lower Subansiri District in the north and Sonitpur District of Assam in the south.

I. TOPOGRAPHY.

The entire district barring a small area on the southernmost tip which borders of Assam is mountainous. The deep gorges and narrow valleys frequently open up to wide fertile valley which sustain permanent agriculture.

The mighty Kameng river originating from the glacial lakes below (GORICHEN) flow through this district to the plains of Assam. Besides this, the other important river mingling in the Kameng are Pacha, Pachuk, Para, Papu, Pekke, Bichom and Dibru. These rivers are turbulent and full of rapids and hence not navigable.

The principal tribes inhabitating this district are Bangnis, Akas, Mijis and the Purioks (Sulong). All these tribes have different dialects. The Bangnis constitute the major tribe and are scattered throughout the district. The male population and the female population differs by a slight margin. The district with its formidable physical and unique demographic features is challenge to any administration.

III. CLIMATE.

Because of its varieties topography different climatic conditions occur within a short distances. The area experiences heavy rainfalls for nearly 6 to 7 months in a year and winter months are extremely cold. Average annual rainfall is 2824.98 cms.

IV. POPULATION.

According to 1991 Census, the decennial growth rate of this district is 17.55% with its total population of 50238 having no urban population, spread over 275 villages. The density of population is 1215% per sq.km. The literacy rate of the district is 20.42% and sex ratio is 966 female per thousand males.

Out of total population, the permanent inhabitants of this district are schedule tribes. The principal tribes such as Nishing, Aka, Miji and Puriok (Sulong) only. The Nishings constitute the major tribe and are scattered throughout the district. Akas are mostly concentrated in the southernmost point of Seppa circle. Mijis are inhabitating in Lada circle and Purioks are living usually in high hills of Khenewa, Chayangtajo and Bameng circle.

V. POLITICAL SET UP.

As per the panchayat Raj Regulation Act, 1967 the Panchayat system has been introduced in the district in 1976 with a view to give concerted effect of participative democracy for socio-economic development in the rural community as a whole. Zilla Parishad is the apex body at the district level while the Anchal Samity are the Block level and Gram Panchayat are the grassroot village level.

The district has a segment of 1-Arunachal Parliamentary constituency and five assembly constituencies viz 8-Bameng (ST), 9-Chayangtajo (ST), 10-Seppa East (ST), 11-Seppa West (ST), 12-Pakke-Kessang (ST) assembly constituency.

VI. ADMINISTRATIVE SET UP.

East Kameng District comprising of 8 administrative centres of which Bameng and Chayangtajo are under the charge of Extra Assistant Commissioner and Lada, Khenewa, Pipu-Dipu, Pakke-Kessang and Seijosa are under the charge of Circle Officer. The Deputy Commissioner is the over all in-charge of the district with its headquarter at Seppa.

VII. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION.

The District headquarter Seppa is connected by a 213 kms all weather road with Tezpur, the headquarter of Sonitpur District of Assam. Nearest Railway Station is Bhalukong of West Kameng District at a distance of 148 kms and nearest Air Port is Salonibari of Sonitpur District of Assam at a distance of 200 kms. Of the other seven administrative centres only Seijosa is connected by all weather road with National Highway-52 running alongwith north bank of Brahmaputra river of Assam. The distance of Seppa and Seijosa via Balipara is 249 kms. Seppa is also connected with Chayangtajo by fair weather road of 81 kms length and another road is under construction connecting Seppa with Itangar via Pakke-Kessang. This road is through upto 126 kms, boundary point of the district.

- (XI) -

Bameng, the EAC's headquarter and Khenewa the CO's headquarter are also connected by fair weather road from the left bank of the Kameng river at Pakke-point and Marjingla on the Seppa-Chayangtajo road. The CO's headquarter Lada and Pipu-Dipu are yet to be connected by roads.

The district has a total length of road 695.41 kms as constructed by various agencies like PWD-264.89, RWD-144.42, Forest-97.10 and BRTF-187.00.

Services of Arunachal Pradesh State Transport Services started in this district in the year 1982. All together six state transport buses are station at Seppa/Tezpur and plying on Seppa-Tezpur road and Seppa-Chayangtajo road. Services on Seppa-Chayangtajo road are not regular.

Out of total 13 post offices, one is having telegraph facilities and located at district headquarter Seppa and another one without telegraph facility located at Seijosa. The remaining 11 numbers are functioning as Extra Departmental Branch post office.

VIII. ELECTRICITY AND POWER

The district is still deficient in the supply of power. One Micro Hydel Project has been commissioned at Seppa with an installed capacity of 200 KW and three Diesel-generating sets installed capacity of 250 KW at Seppa, 96 KW at Chayangtajo and 24 KW at Pakke-Kessang which covers 40 villages of Seppa circle from Power House and Chayangtajo headquarter by Chayangtajo Power House and Pakke-Kessang headquarter by Pakke-Kessang Power House. In Seijosa circle all together 10 villages and the Seijosa H.Q. have been electrified out of 165 KVA Thermal power supplied from ASEE.

IX. MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH.

The age old traditional system of diagnosis and care by worshipping the evil spirits is till prevalent in the local community. It has been strong belief in them. Gradually efforts have been made to make the people educate on the benefit of using the modern scientific method. There are one District Hospital at Seppa, two Homeo Dispensaries, one at Seppa another at Seijosa, 13 Health Unit/Dispensaries at Bana, Pichang, Pachi, Pipu-Dipu, Tagang-Wernang, Pakke-Kessang, Veo, Seijosa, Namorah, Lada, Chayangtajo, Khenewa and Bameng are functioning in the district.

The district is also covered various National Programmes such as National Eradication Programme, Expanded programme of Immunisation, Mother Child Health Programme, Family Welfare programme etc.

X. EDUCATION.

Education plays a vital role as one of the main factor for social and economical upliftment of the society likewise, the education department of this district also aims at improvement of discipline environment in the field of education. To eradicate illiteracy from the masses of this locality two Higher Secondary School, 4 Secondary School, 17 Middle School, 24 I.V. School, 69 Primary School and 19 Pre-primary Schools i.e. 135 Govt. educational institutions are functioning as on reference year. Apart from that, under centrally sponsored scheme of Rural Functional Literacy Programme and State Adult Education Programme total 101 Adult Education Centres are functioning in the district.

In addition to above, Govt. educational institutions there are 2 private schools, namely Lal Bahadur Bal Niketan Pre-primary School at Seppa and Viwekananda Kendra Vidyalaya Primary School at Seijosa are functioning in the district. One more educational institution named Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya Secondary School at Seppa is also functioning in the district. No College/ University of general/technical discipline has yet been established in the district. So with an aim to establish a bright prospect many students are studying outside this district.

XI. AGRICULTURE.

Agriculture is the principal occupation of the people of this district, out of total population 50%(approx) are cultivators,

Agriculture Department of this district is presently undergoing process of transition from traditional shifting cultivation which is popularly known as 'JHUM' cultivation to permanent cultivation with the introduction of modern technology. Concreted efforts are in steady progress to educate the people in using improved tools and implements, modern techniques improved seeds of high yielding varieties, fertiliser, irrigation facilities etc. The response of the people in this regard is quite encouraging.

The area under cereals is 11751 hectares, vegetable 340 hectares, pulses 594 hectares, commercial crop 383 hectares & total 15528

(XIII)

Apart from agriculture, progressive farmers have been taking a keen interest to horticulture activities in the district total area under horticulture is 238 hectares.

XII. FISHERIES.

Prior to set up of the department of Fishery in the year 1971 it was under general supervision of the Agriculture Department. The people of this district were fully un-aware about the role of the fisheries from various view points. Since 1981 this department started its functioning independently at the district level by direct supervision of Superintendent of Fisheries.

The pisciculture programme has a direct impact on the socio-economic upliftment of the people of this district. It has been experiencing that due to great headway in the development of pisciculture in the district, villagers from far-flung areas are taking keen interest to take up various fishery schemes. With the availability of infrastructural facilities, a considerable number of fish ponds, farms have been constructed in the district. The total water area developed as on the year 1991-92 is 55.83 hectares.

During the reference year total area under paddy-cum-fish culture is 27.00 hectares. Since fingerlings are not easily available item, the department has supplied 229300 nos of fingerlings to the needy pisciculturist in the district during the year 1991-92-

XIII. ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND VETERINARY.

The Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Department in the district is playing a vital role in uplifting the rural economy. It is considered as one of the main asset of the local people. The rearing of livestock in the district are mainly mithun, cattle, poultry birds etc.

The department extends free treatment to the livestock population and takes precautionary measures to protect them from epidemic. At present there are 7 Veterinary Dispensary, 8 Veterinary Aid Centres, 12 Cattle-Up grading Centres, 1 Mobile Veterinary Dispensary at Seppa. In addition to above one diagnostic laboratory functioning at Seppa.

XIV. FOREST.

The activities of Forest Department started in this district with its Forest Range at Selusai. It came into being fully by order of Govt. on 10.01.1951.

-(XIV)-

At present there are two Division viz. Seppa Forest Division at Seppa and Pakhui Wildlife Division at Seijosa. Each of the above division is having 4 and 3 Forest Range respectively. In addition Seijosa and Nanochah Forest Range which are under control of Khellong Forest Division with its headquarter at Bhalukpong under West Kameng District. As on 31st March/92, the district has 210553.80 hectares reserved forest and protected forest area under the legal enactment.

During the year 1991-92 total outturn of timber is 15206.56 Cu.mtrs and fuel is 901.95 MT in the district. The supply of sleepers to railway by forest department of this district during the year 1991-92 is nil. The forest revenue earned by the department is 98.84 lakhs during the reference year.

XV. RURAL WORKS.

The main tasks of the Rural Works Department are relation to rural water supply, construction of minor irrigation project etc.

So far 219 recognised villages and 60 non-recognised villages have been provided with water supply facilities. Uptill now 96 minor irrigation projects have been implemented and 4 such projects are in progress.

In order to have rapid development of linking villages by road, the rural works department being a rural road construction agency in the region has constructed 5.21 kms of rural link road during the year 1991-92. Also an amount of Rs. 59.04 lakhs has been spent by the department in the expenditure towards rural road construction.

XVI. INDUSTRY.

Cottage industry plays an important role in the tribal society. And most of the local tribes of the district have their traditional skill in handicrafts. So, to promote the tribal arts and crafts, the department is giving a stress to motivate the local people in undergoing a comprehensive training in improved method of various crafts and to arose interest in them to take up cottage or small scale industry.

There are two craft centres located at Seppa and Chayangtajo respectively with knitting, weaving, cane and bamboo trade units etc and 4 weaving centres running independently at Khenwa, Lada, Bameng, Pakre-Kesseng administrative centres.

(XV)

During the year 1991-92 all together 27 numbers trainees trained in these craft centre/weaving units. The total annual outturn is Rs. 4.51 lakhs and sale proceeds Rs. 1.32 lakhs of these craft centre/weaving units.

With a view toculcate the habit of rearing Eri Worm amongst the local tribal people for making eri clothes by themselves a sericultural demonstration farm was set up during 1980-81 at Bana Bhasti. Eri clothes are prestige symbol for local Nishing people which they buy from plains of Assam at the exorbitant prices. During the year 1991-92 outturn of Eri cocoons 450 kg.

XVII. CO-OPERATION.

The co-operation movement was started in this district in the year 1964 with opening of one co-operative general store at Seppa. The district has 5 consumer stores i.e. one Lamp at Seppa, 3 CGS at Bana Camp, Bameng, Chayangtajo and one Ex-Service men MPCs at Seijosa.

The Seppa Lamp being the principal co-operative societies has been entrusted with the responsibility of feeding the people of this district and it is being done through its 10 Fair Price Shops at various locations.

XVIII. DISTRICT RURAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY.

The agency was set up and registered as society on 1st April/1983 prior to that, all the rural development programme had been implemented by the Deputy Commissioner through the Development Branch of his office.

The general body of this agency consists of 19 members having representation from all the development departments including Vice-president of Zilla Parishad and MLAs of the district.

The agency is directly with planning, implementation and monitoring of schemes under IRDP, ASMF, and JRY, while it is responsible only to co-ordinate the existing 4 blocks under technical guidance and supervision of concerned district technical heads. The schemes under ICDS, SNP are implemented by CDPO, Seppa and Pakke-Kessang and the EDO's at Bameng, Chayangtajo through Anganwadi centres under these two blocks.

XIX. BANKING.

As on reference year all together 2 branches of State Bank of India functioning in this district, out of which one is at Seppa headquarter and another is at Seijosa.

In addition to above, one co-operative Apex Bank is also functioning at Seppa headquarter.

Through these banks, assistance of bank loan are being provided to 146 selected beneficiaries for effective implementation of IRDP schemes etc. During the year 1991-92 amount for bank^{loan} provided to beneficiaries is Rs. 2.95 lakhs.

XX. INFORMATION AND PUBLIC RELATIONS.

The projections units under State Govt. are available at Seppa, Chauangtajo and Pakke-Kessang only. And another projection unit is also available at Seppa which is under control of Central Govt.

The district has one DRS Set provided by the Govt. at Chayangtajo and one T.V. Relay Centre (VLPT-10W) at Seppa headquarter established during the year 1987-88.

XXI. SOCIAL AND CULTURAL ASPECTS.

The major tribes inhabitating this district are Nishings, Akas, Mijis and the Purbiiks (Sulong). They are having their own dialects, custom and religion. Each of the tribal communities observed their traditional festivals. The main festival is Myokum of the Nishings, Sarrok of the Akas, Pungkolem of the Mijis and Gum-kum-gamp of the Purbiiks (Sulong).

So far as the socio-economic status, the most backward and poorest of all the tribes in the district are Purbiiks (Sulong) with a view to improved their socio-economic status, a scheme was taken up during 1977-78 and has till been continuing with providing necessary assistance for construction of dwelling house, drinking water facilities, reclamation of land etc.

XXII. RESEARCH.

The research department was established at Seppa during June/1988 with a fresh posting of District Research Officer, Language Officer and other organisational staff,

- (XVII) -

With a view to have an indepth study among the population inhabiting in this ... region two important projects were undertaken among two selected tribal population namely Nishings(Bangni) and Puroiks(Sulong). The two projects namely "Status of Women and Traditional Village Council" could be completed within a span of three years. One of these two projects namely status of women among the Nishings was published in the department journal "RESAR" in 1991 issue highlighting the changing pattern of traditional status of women in Nishing society of East Kameng District. Moreover, another project namely "Customary Laws of Nishings and Puroiks" is also undertaken by this department.

Side by side collection of folk song,folk tale,folk lore etc are also in full swing which are recorded in the cassette. On the other hand collection of traditional local specimens is an important aspect of this department with a prime objective of establishing a district Museum at Seppe.

The department has a sale counter for selling research publication. Quite a good number of books are available mostly monograph and linguistic books which are of worth buying to acquire specific knowledge about the people of Arunachal Pradesh. During the year 1991-92 a huge number of these publication could be sold out.
