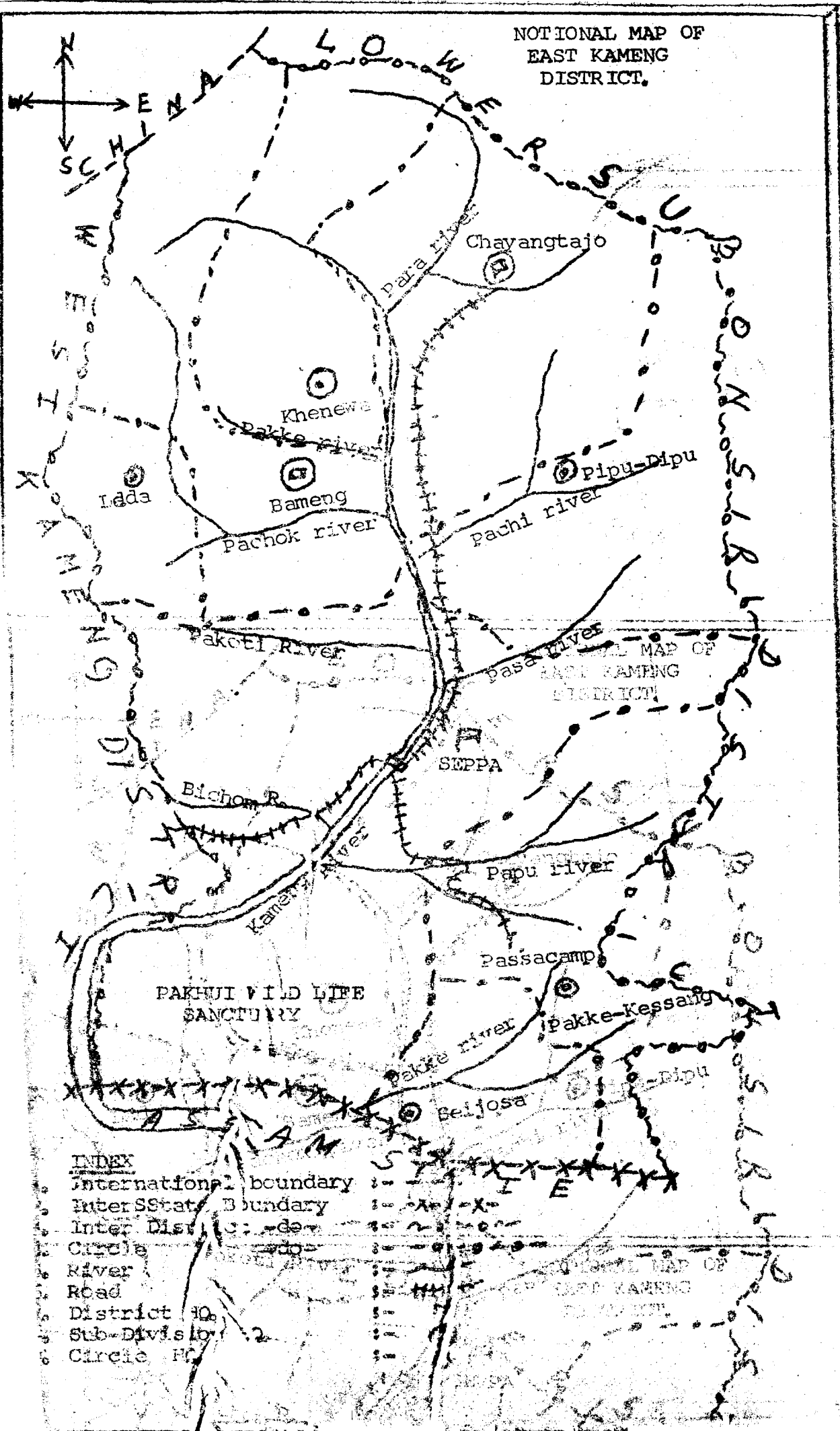
Any suggestion for improvements of this publication are most welcome.

EAST KAMENG DISTRICT

I. GEOGRAPHICAL FEATURES

The East Kameng District lies approximately between the latitude  $26^{\circ} - 54'$  and  $28^{\circ} - 3'$  North and Longitude  $92^{\circ} - 40'$  and  $93^{\circ} - 23'$  East. Its geographical area is approximately 4100 Sq. Km. The District is bounded by Lower Subansiri District in the East, West Kameng District in the West, Macmohon line (International boundary) and a part of Lower Subansiri District in the North and Sonitpur District of Assam in the South.

II. TOPOGRAPHY

The entire district barring a small area on the Southernmost tip which borders Assam is mountainous. The deep gorges and narrow valleys frequently open up to wide fertile valleys which sustain permanent agriculture. The area experiences heavy rainfall for nearly 6 to 7 months in a year and the winter months are extremely cold.

The mighty Kameng River originating in the glacial lakes below 'Gorichen' flows through this district to the plains of Assam. Besides this, the other important rivers mingling in Kameng are Pacha, Pachi, Para, Papu and Pakke. These rivers are turbulent and full of rapids and hence not navigable.

The principal tribes inhabiting this district are Tangnis, Akas, Mijis and the Furoiks. All these tribes have different dialects. The Tangnis constitute the major tribe and are scattered throughout the district. The male population out-numbers the female population by a slight margin. The district with its formidable physical and unique demographic features is a challenge to an administrator.

III. POPULATION

According to 1981 Census, the decennial growth rate of this district is 21.60 with its total population of 42,722 having no urban population and spread over 279 villages. The density of population is 10.34 per Sq. Km. The literacy rate of the district is 6.94 percent and sex ratio is 943 per 1000 males.

Out of total population, the permanent inhabitants of this district are Scheduled Tribes which

figure to be 37286 and this comprises of Principal Tribes such as Bangni, Aka, Miji and Puroik (Sulung) only. The Bangnis constitute the major tribe and are scattered through out the district. The Akas are mostly concentrated in the Southern part of Seppa Circle. Mijis are inhabiting in Bameng and Lada Circle. And the Puroik (Sulung) are usually living in high hills of Khenewa, Chayangtajo and Bameng Circles.

#### IV. POLITICAL SET UP

As per the Panchayat Raj Regulation Act, 1967, the Panchayat system had been introduced in the district in 1976 with a view to give concerted effect of participative democracy for social and economic development of the rural community as a whole. Zilla Parishad is the apex body at district level while the Anchal Samities are bodies at Block level and Gram Panchayats are grass-root bodies at village level.

The district has two Assembly constituencies viz. 5-Seppa and 6-Chayangtajo, and is a Segment of 1-Arunachal West Parliamentary Constituency.

#### V. ADMINISTRATIVE SET UP

East Kameng District comprising of 8 (eight) Administrative Centres of which Bameng and Chayangtajo are under the charge of Extra Assistant Commissioner and Lada, Khenewa, Pipu-Dipu, Pakke-Kessang and Seijosa are under the charge of Circle Officers. Deputy Commissioner is the over all in-charge of this district with its headquarter at Seppa.

#### VI. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION

The district headquarter (Seppa) is connected by a 213 Km. all weather road with Tezpur, the headquarter of Sunitpur district of Assam. Nearest Railway station is Balipara at a distance of 177 Kms. and nearest Aerodrome is Saloni Bari. Both these places are in Sonitpur District of Assam. Of the other seven Administrative Centres, only Seijosa is connected by all weather road with the National High Way-52 running along North Bank of Brahmaputra river in Assam. The distance of Seppa and Seijosa (via Palipara) is 249 Kms. Seppa is also connected with Chayangtajo by a fair weather road of 81 Kms. length and another road is under construction connecting Seppa with Itanagar via Pakke-Kessang. This road is through upto 70 Kms. i.e. Passa Camp towards Pakke-Kessang. The EAC's HQ at Bameng and CO's HQ at Khenewa are connected by porter track from the left Bank of the Kameng river at Pakke and Marjingla respectively on the Seppa-Chayangtajo road. The CO's HQ at Lada and Pipu-Dipu are yet to be connected by roads.

This district is having a total length of road 617.90 Kms. as constructed by various agencies like F.W.D. (276.50) Kms, R.W.D. (178.10) Kms, Forests (33.30) Kms and D.R.T.F. (130.00) Kms.

Services of Arunachal State Transport Corporation started in this district in the year 1982.

All together 3 (three) State Transport buses are stationed at Seppa and plying regularly on Seppa-Tezpur road. In addition to this services, 1 (one) Anchal Samity Bus is also stationed under control of Executive Officer, Seppa Anchal Samity and plying on Seppa-Tezpur road.

Out of total 13 post offices, one is having telegraph facilities and located at district HQ Seppa and another one without telegraph facilities located at Seijosa. The remaining 11 numbers are functioning as Extra Departmental Branch Post Office.

#### VII. POWER AND ELECTRICITY

The district is still deficient in the supply of power. Only one Micro Hydel Project has been commissioned at Seppa with an installed capacity of 200 KW which covers only Seppa Township and Donigaon, Rang villages. There is one diesel generating set at Chayangtajo with an installed capacity of 30 KW and covers the township only. In Seijosa Circle, all together six villages have been electrified out of the 135 KW Thermal Power supplied from A. S. E. P.

#### VIII. MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH

The age-old traditional system of diagnosis and care by worshipping the evil spirits is still prevalent in the local community. It has been a strong belief in them. Gradually, efforts have been made to make the people educated on the benefit of using the modern scientific method. And so, there are one district Hospital, one Sub-Divisional Hospital at Chayangtajo, one Homeo Dispensary (Now attached to district hospital), one T.E. Hospital (attached to district hospital) and seven Health Units/Dispensaries functioning in the district.

The district is also covered by various national programmes such as National Malaria Eradication Programme, Expanded Programme of Immunisation, Mother-child Health Programme, Family Welfare Programme etc.

#### IX. EDUCATION

Education plays a vital role as one of the main factor for social and economical upliftment of the society. Likewise, the education department of this district also aims at improvement of disciplined environment in the field of education. To eradicate illiteracy from the masses of this locality, one Higher Secondary School, one Secondary School, Nine Middle School, Seventythree I.V/Primary Schools and Eighteen Pre-Primary Schools are functioning as on reference year. Apart from that, under centrally sponsored schemes of Rural Functional Literacy Programme, 67 Adult Education Centres with an enrolment of 3009 students only are also functioning in the district.

In addition to above Govt. educational institutions, two private schools, namely, Lal Bahadur Shastri Dal Niketon Pre-Primary School at Seppa with its enrolment of seventy four students and the other is Vivekananda Kendra Vidyalaya, Primary School at Seijosa with the enrolment of 121 boy students only are also functioning in this district.

No college/University of general/technical/Medical disciplines has yet been established in the district. So, with an aim to establish a bright prospects, as many as 17 numbers of students of this district are studying outside this region out of which all together 4 female students are studying at Danasthali only. And the rest being male students are studying in General/Civil Engg./Medical Science/Veterinary Science course.

#### X. AGRICULTURE

Agriculture is the principal occupation of the people of this district. Out of total district population of 42722 persons, the number of cultivators are 19397 as per 1981 Census.

Agriculture Department of this district is presently under-going a process of transition from traditional shifting cultivation which is popularly known as 'Jhum Cultivation' to permanent cultivation with the introduction of modern technology. Concerted efforts are in steady progress to educate the people in using improved tools and implements, modern techniques, improved seeds of high yielding varieties, fertilizer, irrigation facilities etc. The response of the people in this regard is quite encouraging.

Total area under Cereals and vegetable crop cultivation is 3793.00 Hect., under oil seeds and Sesamum cultivation is 190.00 Hect.

Apart from Agriculture, progressive farmers have been taking a keen interest on Horticulture Activities too. They have opened 13 Horticulture gardens under normal schemes and 50 under IRDP schemes. And there are 3 Horticulture Nurseries under normal schemes only.

#### XI. FISHERY

Prior to set up of the department of fishery in the year 1971 under general supervision of the agriculture department, the people of this district were fully unaware about the role of fisheries from various view points. Since 1981 this department started its functioning independently under direct supervision of Superintendent of Fisheries at the district level.

The pisciculture programme has a direct impact on the socio-economic upliftment of the people of this district. It has been experiencing that due to great headway in the development of Pisciculture in the district villagers from far-flung area are taking keen interest to take up various fishery schemes. With the availability of infra-structural facilities, a considerable number of fish ponds/Farms have been constructed in the district. The total water area developed in the year 1985-86 is 11.25 Hect. And during this reference year total area under paddy-cum-fish culture is 10.00 Hect. Since fingerlings are not an easily available item, the department has supplied 10300 numbers of fingerlings to the needy pisciculturists in the district during the year 1985-86.

## XII. ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND VETERINARY

The Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Department in the district is playing a vital role in uplifting the rural economy. It is considered as one of the main asset of the local people. The rearing of livestock in the district are mainly Mithun, Cattle, Pig, Goat, Poultry Birds etc.

The department extends free treatment to the livestock population and takes precautionary measures to protect them from epidemic. At present, there are 5 Veterinary Dispensary, 5 Veterinary Aid Centres, 12 Cattle up grading Centres, one Mobile Veterinary Dispensary at Seppa and one district Diagnostics Laboratory at Seppa.

## XIII. RURAL WORKS

The main tasks of the Rural Works Department are relating to minor irrigation project, Rural Water Supply etc.

So far, two hundred villages have been provided with water supply facilities. Uptil now 75 minor irrigation projects have been implemented and 11 such projects are in progress.

In order to have rapid development on linking villages, the rural works department being a rural construction agency in the region has constructed 69.00 Kms. of rural link road during the year 1985-86. Also, an amount of Rs. 22.01 lakh has been spent by the department being the expenditure towards rural housing construction in the district during 1985-86 and Rs. 3.00 lakh spent for repair and maintenance of the buildings constructed.

## XIV. FORESTRY

The activities of Forest department started in this district with its forest range at Seijosa. It came into being fully by gradual expansion like opening of division.

At present, there are two divisions viz. Seppa Forest Division and Pakhui Wild Life Division at Seijosa. Each of the above division are having 4 and 2 forest ranges respectively in addition to Seijosa Forest Range which is under control of Dhalukpong Forest Division.

During the year 1985-86 total out turn of timber is 6602.99 Cum. and 6982 M.T. in the district. There was no supply of sleepers to Railway by Forest Department of this district. And the forest revenue earned by the department is 2503.95 thousand Rupees whereas total expenditure incurred 3675.66 thousand Rupees.

## XV. CO-OPERATION

Co-operative movement was started in this district in the year 1964 with opening of one co-operative general stores at Seppa. But at present, there are four consumers stores. The Seppa consumers Co-Operative societies has been converted into a large sized multipurpose co-operative society i.e LAMP in the year 1978-79 with a view to introducing credit and marketing facilities to the local farmers.

The Seppa LAMP being principal co-operative societies has been entrusted with the responsibility of feeding the people of this district and it is being done through its 12 Fair Price Shop at various locations.

#### XVI. INDUSTRY

Cottage industry plays an important role in the tribal society. And most of the local tribals of the district have their traditional skill in handicrafts. So, to promote the tribal arts and crafts, the department is giving a stress to motivate the local people in undergoing a comprehensive training in improved methods of various crafts and to arouse interest in them to take up cottage or small scale industry.

There is a craft centre at Seppa with knitting, weaving, Tailoring, Blacksmithy carpentry, cane and Bamboo trade units and another one at Chayangtajo with weaving, Blacksmithy, carpentry, carpetmaking trade units.

Besides these two craft centres, 4 (four) weaving Units are also running independently at Khenewa, Dameng, Pakke-Kessang and Lada Administrative Centres.

During the year 1985-86, all together 52 (fifty two) trainees are enrolled in those craft Centres/weaving units. The total sale proceeds is 56.54 thousand rupees and total value of out turn is 59.35 thousand rupees under those centres.

With a view to inculcate the habit of rearing Eri Worms amongst the local tribal people for making Eri Cloths by themselves, a sericultural demonstration farm was set up during 1980-81. Eri Cloths are prestige symbol for local Bangni people which they buy from plains of Assam at Exhorbitant prices.

#### XVII. DISTRICT RURAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY

The agency was set up and registered as a society on 1st April '83. Prior to that, all the rural development programmes had been implemented by the D.C. through the Development Branch of his office.

The agency functions with the help of a governing body consisting of 13 (thirteen) members of which the DC is the Chairman and the DRDO is the Member-Secretary.

The general body of this agency consists of 19 (Nineteen) members having representation from all the development departments and including vice president of Zilla Parishad and both the MLAs of the district.

The agency is directly connected with planning, implementation and monitoring of schemes under IRDP, ASMF and NREP/RLEGP while it is responsible only to co-ordinate and monitor schemes taken up under ICDS, SNP and CD programmes by the existing 4 (four) Blocks.



Under technical guidance and supervision of concerned district technical Heads, the schemes under IRD and ASMF programmes and executed by the EDOs. And the R.W.D. Department executes the schemes under NREP/RLEGP. Seppa-Pakke-Kessang Block with its HQ at Seppa being the only ICDS block in this district, the ICDS/SNP schemes are implemented by the BDO, Seppa. There are 33 (thirtythree) Anganwadi centres under this ICDS Block.

XVIII. SOCIAL AND CULTURAL ASPECTS

The major tribes inhabiting this district are the Bangnis, Akas, Mijis and Puroiks (Sulung). They are having their own dialects, custom and religion. Each of the tribal communities observe their traditional festivals. The main festival is Myokum of the Bangnis, Sorrok of the Akas, Pongkolam of the Mijis and Gum-Kum-Gumpa of the Puroiks (Sulung).

The most backward and poorest of all the tribes in the district are puroiks (Sulung). With a view to improve their socio-economic status, a scheme was taken up during 1975-76 and has still been continuing with the objective to regroup and rehabilitate the Puroiks (Sulung) by providing necessary assistance for construction of dwelling houses, drinking water facilities, reclamation of land etc.
