Most of the 1668 Government (90 Aided Primary Schools do not have proper furniture. During 1974-75 and 1975-76, 236 Obvernment Primary Schools (136 in the hills and 100 in the valley) have been supplied with furniture. Rs.25,000/- were sanctioned as grants to the 50 Aided Primary Schools (30 hills and 200 valley) @ Rs.500/- each for purchase of furniture during 1976-77.

During 1977-78-75 Covernment Primary Schools (37 in the hills and 38 in the valley) will be provided with furniture @ Rs.1,000/- each. 50 Aided Primary Schools (26 hills and 24 valley) will also be given grants @ Rs.500/- per School for the purpose. This will reduce the number of schools without adequate furniture as 1947 (1357 Covernment and 590 Aided).

The Scheme is likely to be continued in the coming year also.

Sub-Head A.P(7) - Improvement of Science Education in Primary Schools

The Scheme is being implemented in collaboration with the UNICEF. The programmes aim at providing better facilities for Science Education in the Government and Government Aided Primary Schools. It has three components viz (i) Training of Teachers and inspecting staff for Science Education (ii) providing science equipments and consumable naterials like chemicals, glass ware etc. to the Schools and (iii) maintenance of 2 Science Supervisers and a UNICEF Jeep.

(A) Training Programe:

- (i) Inspecting Staff- 40 Assistant Inspectors of Schools will be given 10 days Orientation Training for effective supervision of Science Education Programmes.
- (ii) Teachers 300 Teachers of Primary Schools (150 hills and 150 valley) will be given 4 weeks Orientation Training in the teaching of Science.

75% of the expenditure incurred on the programmes under (i) and (ii) above will be re-inbursed to the State by the UNICEF.

(iii) 173 more teachers will also be given Orientation Training for 4 weeks. The entire expenditure will be met from state Flan funds. This is to cover all the 473 Primary Schools which will be given Science kits.

(B) Science Equipments 1

- (i) Primary Science Kits Primary Science Kits will be provided to 473 Primary Schools from which the Teachers have been drawn and trained in their use. 200 kits are already available with the Department purchased during the previous year. 200 kits are to be supplied by the UNICEF. 100 Science kits will be purchased during this year.
- (ii) Consumable Materials 200 Primary Schools which have already been covered under this Scheme during the previous year will be given consumable goods at the rate of Rs.75/- per School during the year. This is meant to replace the broken it to and the items of consumable nature for the kits already supplied.
- (iii) Contingent Allowence The above 200 Schools will be given a run of Rs.5,000/- @ Rs.25/per School for purchasing the items of daily use in connection with the use of Primary kits.

(C) Maintenance of 2 Science Supervisors and UNICEF Teep:

The two Science Supervisors will be paid salary, T.A. etc. from this fund and the POL for UNICEF Jeep, given exclusively for the UNICEF - assisted Science Education Programme will be purchased.

1. Opening of Colleges:

The Government has decided in principle to take over two aided Colleges in the hill areas viz, Pattigrew College, Ukhrul and Churachandpur College, Churachandpur. The Pettigrew College is given grant-in-aid from Plan Fund. The Churachandpur College had been given additional posts from the Plan Fund for opening P.U.Sc. classes. On actual taking over, only the expenditure in respect of additional posts already provided to the Ghurachandpur College will be incurred from the Plan Fund, while the other expenditure will be borne from the Non-Plan fund:

2. Improvement of existing Colleges:

Under this programme the additional staff provided to the three Government Colleges in the previous years will be continued.
