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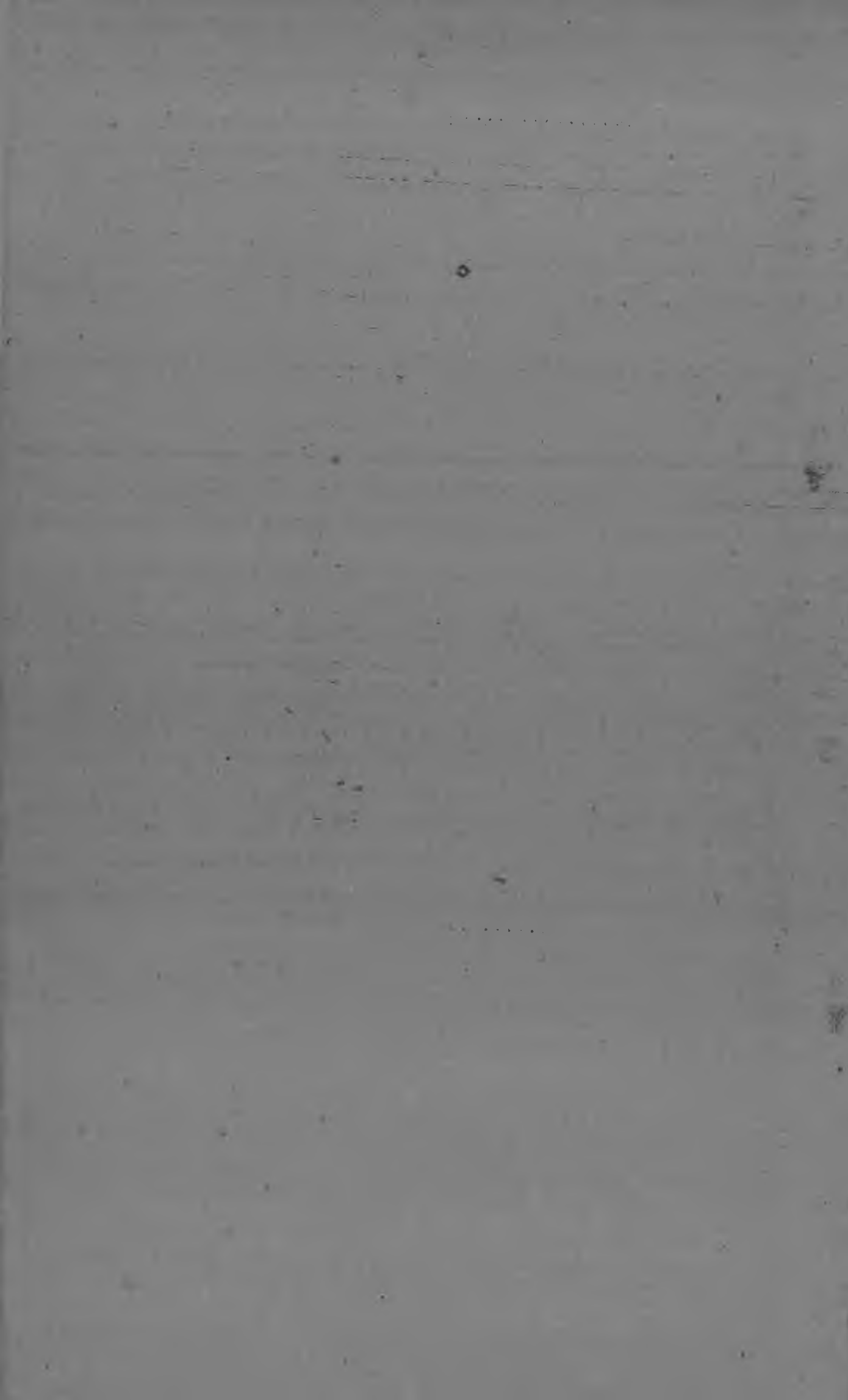

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DISTRICT BACK GROUND

District Baramulla is known after its Head-Quarters Town of Baramulla which is located at a distance of 56 Kms. from Srinagar, towards north west. The District is bounded by north and west by the line of control.

There are 675 villages, 659 inhabited and 16 un-inhabited. Agriculture is the main stay of the economy. The total reporting area of the District is 1.44 lakhs hectares with 0.88 lakhs hectares only as the net area sown. 0.90 lakhs hectares is the Gross area sown and area sown more than once is marginal only half of the cultivated area is irrigated. The Zamindari Khuls is the main source of irrigation.

The provisional population of the District as per census 1981 is 6.69 lakhs as against 5.18 lakhs in 1971. As per census of 1971 about 89% of the population live in rural areas. 80% of the working force is engaged in agriculture which forms the backbone of the economy in the District. The district enjoys adequate rainfall except areas such as Kandi tracts of Baramulla thesil and other similar villages of Handwara thesil where difficient rains are responsible for frequent failure of the crops. The annual rainfall is about 31" per year. The District experiences severe cold in winter and moderate temperature in summer.

The present issue of the District Statistical Hand-book is the second after the District came into existance in its present form. Information on the various facts of the economy of the District appear in the publication.

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POPULATION

This chapter gives data pertaining to population structure of District Baramulla. Data on the composition of population by sex, religion, rural/urban area of working force and its distribution by occupational groups are given.

About 87% of the population lives in rural areas, 80% of the working force is engaged in agriculture which forms backbone of the economy in the district.

The results of the 1981 census are also given in this chapter.

Bulk of population ~~xxx~~ in District Baramulla lives in rural areas and agriculture is their primary occupation. The main Source of Agriculture Statistics Return compiled in the Revenue Department. The total area according to village papers 1.44 lakh hectares, out of which total cropped area is 0.88 lakh hectares. Irrigation is mostly provided by Cannals. Other source of irrigation make marginal contribution. 0.43 lakh hectares is the net area irrigated.
