DISTRICT SOCIO-ECONOMIC REVIEW 1983-84

1. General

After independence the princely state Bilaspur was taken over under the Central Government Administration in October, 1948. Subsequently by an act of Parliament, this was merged in Himachal Pradesh on 1st July, 1954 which hereafter was converted into a district with the erstwhile princely State's jurisdiction intact.

Physical features:- The Bilaspur district is predominantly situated in the basin of the river Satluj. It lies between $31^{\circ} 12' 30''$ and $31^{\circ} 35' 30''$ north latitude and between $76^{\circ} 23' 45''$ and $76^{\circ} 55' 40''$ east longitude. It has an area of 1,167 sq. Kms. Its largest length from east-west is 44.66 Km and breadth from north to south is 41.83 Km.

The district is almost equally half divided by the river Satluj and is bounded on the north by Mandi and Hamirpur districts, on the west by Una and Hamirpur districts, on the south by Nalagarh tehsil and on the east by Arki tehsil thereby giving an oblong configuration. The district is criss-crossed by low hills and deep valleys, the highest hill point is called Dhar Bahadurpur which is at 6,378 ft. above sea level and the lowest point is about 1000 ft. from sea level. The district is divided into seven Dhars (hills) popularly called Dhar Naina Devi, Dhar Kot, Dhar Tiuni, Dhar Bandla, Dhar Jhinjar, Dhar Ratanpur and Dhar Bahadurpur. Of these seven Dhars, the principal Dhar is Naina Devi where the Kot Kahlur, the ancient capital of the state, had been situated.

River System:-

The principal river that passes through the district is the Satluj river which divides the district almost into two equal halves. It enters the district near Kasol in the north-east and traversing it in a course of 89.6 Kms leaves at near Naila in the South-West. The Satluj river is joined by seven tributaries from both sides. These are three main tributaries known as Alikhad, Gamrola Khad and Sir Khad.

Administratively, the district has been divided into two Sub-Divisions, two tehsils viz. Bilaspur Sadar and Ghumarwin. The jurisdiction of the Sub-Divisions and tehsils is co-terminus. During the year 1980, a new Sub-tehsil namely

Naina Deviji with headquarters at Swarghat has been created by carving out some areas of tehsil sadar. There are three community Development Blocks, namely Bilaspur sadar, Ghumarwin and Jhandutta. The district comprises of 89 panchayats and is served by 107 Co-operative Societies. The rainfall is unevenly distributed. The climate of the district varies from temperate to Sub-tropical but the summer season is extremely hot.

The total population of the district according to 1981 census is 2,47,368 (1,23,572 males and 1,23,796 females) giving a sex ratio of 1,002 females per thousand males. The density of population is 212 persons per sq. km.; 95.32 percent population (2,35,784) of the district is rural while the rest 4.68 percent (11,584) is urban. The literacy percentage has gone up from 32.87 to 44.69 during 1971-81 decade. In all, there are 64,284 Scheduled Castes and 6,604 Scheduled Tribes persons in the district as per 1981 census

2. Vital Statistics

In this district, during 1983 birth rate was 21.42, death rate 4.79 and infant mortality rate was 24.31 per thousand.

3. Health and Family Welfare

At the end of 1983 there were 47 institutions functioning in the district out of which 4 were primary health centres 19 allopathic dispensaries and 22 ayurvedic dispensaries one civil hospital and one ayurvedic hospital. In these Institutions, 66,278 indoor and 6,10,522 outdoor patients were treated. In all 275 beds were available in these institutions. Besides the National programme of Malaria and Small Pox eradication, Leprosy, V.D and T,B, control as also the family Welfare programme were the other important activities in this field. During 1983-84 2032 sterilisation operations and 835 I.U.C.D. insertions were done.

4. Education.

A healthy educational structure is the foundation of any society which inculcates spirit of discipline and devotion. There were 331 primary Schools, 66 middle Schools and 34 high/higher secondary Schools at the end of 1983-84. In all 2010 teachers were employed in these institutions where in 71,706 students were getting education.

The Government Degree College at Bilaspur continued to provide educational facilities to students leading to graduation in arts and Science. During the year 1983-84 there were 35 teachers including Principal and 1187 students were getting education.

The well stocked District/continued to provide facility of reading to students and public.

5. Social Welfare.

For the upliftment of economically weaker sections of the society, various schemes have been implemented for assisting the scheduled castes, scheduled tribes and backward classes in the fields of education, housing and small scale industries. Special programme was also implemented for the welfare of women, children and the handicapped. An old age pension of 50/-P.M. is also granted to resourceless males above 65 years of age and females above 60 years of age and 2233 person have been covered under this scheme. Pension to 160 widows of this district have also been granted.

6. Employment and Labour Welfare.

The District Employment Exchange Bilaspur provides the necessary link between the employers and employment seekers. In all, 3534 persons were registered, 711 vacancies were notified and 444 were placed. The number of registrants on the live register was 13,555 at the end of the year. There were 4,640 Himachal Government Employees regular employees as on 31-3-83 and 4999 as on 31-3-84 out of which 189 were gazetted and 4810 were non-gazetted.

7. Pollice.

The law and order situation in the district remained well under control, only 84 crimes were reported in 1983. There were 5 police stations and 4 police posts which were manned by 394 personnel.

8. Agriculture.

The economy of the district leans heavily on the agriculture 82 percent of the population depends directly or indirectly for their livelihood on agriculture. The ever increasing population is exerting great pressure on land and its availability is around 0.08 hectares per head on the basis of 1981 census. The irrigated area constitutes only 8.13 percent

of net area sown. Wheat, Maize and Paddy are the major crops grown in the district. For increasing agricultural production, the department of agriculture has distributed seed of high yielding varieties and fertilizers to the farmers as per their requirements.

9. Horticulture.

Development of horticulture goes a long way in ameliorating the economic conditions of the people in Bilaspur district. Some areas of the district are suitable for growing stonefruits, citrus fruits, mangoes, ber, litchi, guava, papaya and banana. Upto this time, concerted efforts in this direction have been made but more is to be done to make horticulture a paying proposition for the inhabitants of the district. During the year 1983-84, 4314 hectares of area was under fruit plants and 2338 tonnes of fruits were produced. Two fruit canning and units one in public sector/are functioning which have made it one in private sector easy for the growers to dispose of their horticultural produce on reasonable prices.

10. Forest.

Forests are a vital link in our life cycle. The modern Sili-cultural practices relating to conservation of our forest wealth alongwith its impact on the environs hold the key to the better soil and souls of not only Himachal Pradesh but has wider repercussions going down to the country as a whole. In Bilaspur district, forests covered an area 11,453 hectares (9.94 percent of total area) according to village papers during the year 1983-84 as against 43,068.60 hectares according to forest Department.

11. Livestock and Poultry.

In a predominantly rural economy livestock and poultry occupy an important place. According to 1982 livestock census, the population of livestock was 2.37 lacs in this district. The development programme include veterinary aid, cattle breeding sheep breeding and poultry. In order to cater to the requirements of veterinary aid, there were 49 institutions working in this district during 1983-84. The department maintained Jersey cows, bulls and murrab buffalo bulls at various institutions to improve the indigenous breed.

12. Fisheries.

With innumerable streams and rivers culminating in the picturesque Govindsagar, the development of fisheries has great scope to provide an attraction for the tourists. From the year 1975-76, a mirror carp farm at Deoli is functioning. In 1983-84, 930 fishermen were registered in the district who made available 488 tonnes of fish valued at Rs. 44.88 Lakhs. 374 offences were detected and an amount of Rs. 16249 was realised as compensation.

13. Power.

The provision of cheap and undisrupted electric supply in the district is essential for the economic uplift of the people. This district is in the forefront of rural electrification in the Pradesh. Out of 942 inhabited villages 830 have been electrified by the end of 1983-84 thus covering 88.11 % of the villages.

14. Industries.

This district is rich in natural resources like lime stone, Bhabar grass, resin etc. For the development of industries, the DIC is providing guidance and finances to various industrialists. Various incentives to small scale industries in the shape of exemption from tax etc are provided.

A cement plant at Gagaj in the private sector by M/S Associated cement companies Ltd. started production during the year 1983-84. Which will prove to be a booster for the economic upliftment of the district.

The RITI & GITI continued providing training in 7 trades.

The Khadi and village Industries Board is also helping the people in the establishment of village Industries.

15. Banking.

Banks are doing good work in providing loans to the parties recommended by various Govt. departments/agencies. The credit deposit ratio of Uco bank is highest i.e, 67% and that of State Bank of Patiala. lowest i.e, 22% and New Bank of India 24% .

16. Transport and Communications.

Economic and social development of a state depends mostly on an efficient system of transportation. In hills, this being the only mechanised means available, it has to play a pivotal role in providing intensive and extensive services to meet the needs of ever-increasing population pressure and to cater to the needs of newly opened areas. The total fleet strength of Bilaspur depot of HRTC at the end of March, 1984, was 67 which covered a distance of 42.88 Lakh Kms.

In this district there were 4 head post offices, 101 Sub-offices and 362 branch post offices at the end of 1982-83.

17. Roads

The roads are like the lines of destiny—the longer they are the better would be prognosis of socio-economic ailments. As such, these have been provided increasing importance in our successive plans. As a result of this, the interiors of the district have been opened to vehicular traffic with far reaching consequences towards economic uplift of the people of the district. By the end of March, 1984, the total road length (motorable double & single lane) was 783 Kms having a density of about 67.09 Kms per 100 sq. Kms of area.

18. Co-operation.

The Co-operatives have maintained a significant place in the successive five year plans and have been recognised as an important tool of Socio-economic development. At the end of 1983-84, there were 107 Co-operative Societies which covered all the villages with a membership of 39000 and working capital of Rs. 249 Laks.

19. Public Finance and Taxation.

The Exise and taxation policy is an important tool for the mobilisation of internal resources. An amount of Rs. 186.32 Lakhs was collected during the year 1983-84.


