C H A P T E R - I

The District derives its name from Adilabad its Headquarters town which was named after Ali Adhilshah, the ruler of Bijapur, prior to 1905, the district consisted of Edilabad, (Adilabad) Rajura, Sirpur and few jagirs, and it was deemed as a sub-district. In 1905 it was made a full-fledged district by adding Luxettipet and Chennur from Karimnagar district, Nirmal and Narspur from Nizamabad district. A new taluk of ~~Kinwat~~ <sup>Kinwat</sup> was made by taking same portion from Nirmal and Edilabad Taluks and Narsapur was merged in Nirmal taluks. In 1907 a new taluk namely from Sirpur and Luxettipet taluks. In the subsequent decade i.e., 1911 to 21 new taluks of Boath and Utnoor were created. In the decade 1941, to 51 Khanapur sub-taluk was formed.

In 1956 due to re-organisation of states Andhra Pradesh was formed and Adilabad was made a constituent district unit of A.P. Marathi speaking areas of Rajura and kinwat taluks and Islapur circle of Boath taluk and are last taken away from Adilabad and gained Mudhole taluk from Nanded excluding Dharamabad circle. At that time there were (Ten) 10 taluks namely Adilabad, Beath, Utnoor, Nirmal, Mudhole, Khanpaur (sub-taluk), Luxettipet, Chennur, Asifabad and Sirpur. In 1978 Khanapur sub-taluk was upgraded into fullfledged taluk. A new taluk namely wankidi was created out of Asifabad on 1st December, 1979. This taluk has predominantly tribal population.

On 14 January, 1987 the Administrative units have been re-organised and Mandal system was introduced. Now Adilabad district have 5 Revenue divisions (see table 1) 52 Mandals besides 12 urban towns.

LOCATION:

Adilabad district is the Northernmost district of A.P. The district is situated between 77°46' and 80°0' of the northern latitudes in the peninsular India.

The district is bounded by on the north by Painganga, Godavari in the south and <sup>Pranahita</sup>Pranahita river in the <sup>east</sup>east. On the north, Adilabad district is bounded by Yeotmal and Chanda districts of Maharashtra, on the east by Chanda district of Maharashtra. On the south the district is bounded by Nizamabad and Karimnagar districts of this state.

Population and area:

As per 1981 census the district has a population of 13,22,020, of which Male Population is 664171 and Female Population 657849.

Economy:

The eastern sector of Adilabad district has large

Industry:

large sacale industries, such as sirpur paper mills, sirsilky

at Kagaznagar. ACC Cement factory at Manerial. Orient Cement

Factory at Devapur. The western sector has relatively less number

of industries when compared to the eastern part. Unit of CCI Cement factory is at Adilabad, One spinning mill and 28 Ginning & Pressing mills<sup>are</sup> at Adilabad. The eastern sector has more mineral and forest based industries. The economy of the western part of the district is based on agriculture. Adilabad, Nirmal and Bhainsa have many Ginning and pressing mills with one spinning mills each at Adilabad & Nirmal.

Besides these industries some cottage industries are at Nirmal and Chennur, Nirmal town industry has earned world wide reputation.

Nearly 40% of the area is covered by the forest. Total cultivable land is 60287 hectares of which gross irrigated area is 37033. (This includes all types of lands) The irrigational facilities are comparatively poor in the northern Taluks. Luxetipet Khanapur, Nirmal, Chennur Taluks are better off in respect of Agriculture than their counter parts of northern Taluks. Efforts <sup>are</sup> being made to boost forest based crafts under an auspices of I.T.D.A.

The fishing potential of the district is considerably rich with its perennial ~~sources~~ sources like the river Godavari the Painganga the Wardha, the Pranahita and about 1000 small tanks.

Milk consumption of the district is also less than that of other districts in the summer fodder scarcity is also experienced.

Culture: Saraswathi is the Goddess of music and learning, her abode is in Basar, Mudhole Taluks of Adilabad district. The Gnana Saraswathi temple of Basar is one of the only two rekndun temples in India the other being in Kashmir.

The district has many other places of artistic and cultural interest. Jainad village of Jainad mandal has a beautiful temple built by a pallava chief.

Keslapur is the centre of tribal culture. Every year Nagga (snake god) festival is celebrated with traditional gaiety by the Gonds (Chief tribe of the district). The festival is a symbol of Gond unity with the Gonds of the neighbouring States. Some parts of the district were ruled by Gond kings of Sirpur and Chanda.

Kuntala waterfall<sup>is</sup> the highest in A.P. which gives pictures the scenery which lures painter and cameraman.

Nirmal is famous for its toy industry and paintings. It is also famous for technique of decoration. Nirmal plates contain paintings of Lord Buddha Natraja, Geethopadesh and Mogal miniature painting floral and Ajanta pictures.

Festivals of Deepavali and Dasara, are celebrated with pomp and gaiety.

Linguistically Adilabad district is a confluence of three languages that are Telugu, Marathi, Urdu, <sup>S. Ramana</sup> Vardha chary who is called Abhinava Pothana hails from this district. His contribution to modern Telugu literature ranks high and secured praised from the different regions of the state.

Adilabad district is symbol of national intergration where poets of Telugu, Marathi and Urdu<sup>all</sup> together to make a confluence of different languages and this help in making a <sup>Composite</sup> competitive culture.

Mancerial and Adilabad have biggest units of cement production which symbolise modern science and technology.

Although Adilabad is the second biggest district of the State<sup>in area</sup> it lacks in means of transport and communications.

Most of the villages are remote not connected with the main roads. Even some mandal Headquarters such as Bejjur, Dahagan, Kowthala, Bheemini in former Sirpur taluk Tiryan in Markidi taluk and Sirpur(U) in Untoor taluk <sup>have</sup> ~~have~~ no road facilities. This is a major bottle neck for the general development of the district and particularly to the educational development. Therefore, the Educational facilities are not available to the large section of the population.

1.2.

The fifth all India Educational Survey has been undertaken with an objective of preparing an action plan, for the development of education in general and achieving universalisation of primary education in particulars. The reference date of the survey is 30th September, 1986. Three questionnaires namely (1) Village information form for the rural area (2) Urban information form for the urban areas (3) School information form, have been sent to the schools.

The village information forms filled up by the Headmasters of the school having highest class within the village. This form contains 15 items to be responded.

Items 1 to 5 denote general information of the village such as name and its code number as per 1981 census, Revenue Mandal and district and state to which the village belongs.

Item No. 6 population figures in respect of sex and community as per 1981 census. Items 7, 8 and 9 indicate the estimated population figures. Item No. 9 gives distribution of estimation number of children sex wise in the age group names, 4-6, 6-11, 11 to 14, 14 to 16 and 16 to 18. Item No. 10 existing educational facilities and the distance and the child has to walk for orientiya Schooling facility. 15 and 16 (Columns of the item no. 10) denotes whether the village is predominely populated by SC or ST.

Item No.11 deals with Non-Formal Education (NFE) centres on the reference date. It provides data about the no. of centres by management and enrolment. In the same way item No. 12 tells about adult education centres on the reference date covering No. of centres by management and enrolment.

Item 13 tells about the educational facilities available for the physically handicapped children.

Item 14 reveals about the schooling facilities in the neighbour hood.

Item 15 provides information about pre-primary educational facilities.

The UIFs contain same information as contained in VIFs. Item Numbers 1 to 15 with regard to urban towns.

School Information forms contains Two parts and contains 44 items. The first part denotes name, rural/urban, address of the school.

In the part B, deals with the management type of school number of classes, languages taught nature of the building, school area, plinth area no. of rooms, play ground. Additional rooms required and general nature of utilisation of the school premises.

The district survey officer was posted on 1.7.87, He <sup>was</sup> training at the effect of the Director of School Education about the procedures to be followed for data collection, scrutiny and tabulation at the district level.

In turn he gave training to <sup>U</sup> Deputy Educational Officer and Mandal Educational Officers in the procedures to be followed in the collection of data, scrutiny and tabulation at the mandal level. They in turn organised training classes for the benefit of Heads of institutions.

The requisite number of VIFs, SIFs and UIFs were provided to all the Mandal Educational Officers for onward distribution among Headmasters in the respective mandals.

The secondary and higher secondary schools Headmaster filled in the SIFs of their institutions and submitted. The Headmasters of Primary Schools and Upper Primary Schools

filled in the forms under the guidance of the concerned Mandal Educational Officers. The filled in forms were scrutinised by Mandal Educational Officers who later consolidated the data received <sup>from by the</sup> ~~from the~~ Heads of Institutions. Their respective mandals and submitted consolidated Mandal level data to the Dist. Educational Officer. The Dist. Survey Officer verified all the tables and arranged for the consolidation of data at District Level.

The post of District Survey Officer was wound up on 29-2-1988. The remaining survey work was got completed with the help of experienced Mandal Educational Officers and a few able teachers. The District level data was submitted to the Director of School Education.

# CHAPTER-II

## PRIMARY EDUCATION

Primary Education is a main and base link in educational ladder. The 5th All India Educational Survey has probed into the details of the needs and the problems of primary Schools & the statistical data reveals following features.

No.1 In this district there are 2608 habitations, these habitations are scattered and they are at very remote areas, and some of them are in Forest areas.

Among these habitations, 196 are predominantly populated by scheduled <sup>Castes</sup> ~~caste~~. 1145 habitations are <sup>a Predominantly</sup> ~~subdivided~~ populated by scheduled tribes. 2608 habitations have a population of 14,79,452. There are twelve urban areas and their population is 3,53,428. These twelve urban areas are served by 61 primary schools. Nirmal, Dilwarpur, Memda and other Mandals are fully served by primary schools, inconstituted eastern namoor, Sirpur, Piryngal Karameri, have more number of habitations having primary schools within radius of 1.k.m. from the home of the child is 2213 with a population of <sup>of</sup> 24,21,393, <sup>395 habitations out</sup> have primary schools facilities within 1.k.m. they depend on other habitations situated ~~also~~ beyond 1.k.m. the population <sup>in these</sup> with 395 habitations is 58,059. This population <sup>available</sup> ~~is~~ the facility available beyond <sup>a</sup> distance of one k.m.1.

Upper primary Schools constitute very important link in our education system:

The statistical data and figures indicate the following features.

1. 1445 Habitations with a population of 10,23,192 are served of upper Primary Schools facility within the radii of 3 K.ms. Approximately 60% of population is thus served by Upper Primary School Facility. 1163 Habitations with a population of 456260 (31 %) avail the facility available beyond 3Km.

(SECONDARY AND HIGHER SECONDARY EDUCATION)

The secondary Schools are link to the higher educational insitutions. Secondary -schools provide education to the pupil and give a completion to their secondary education The higher secondary education schools link to the higher education.

1. 1722 habitations with a population of 11,25,332 covering 76% of population <sup>are</sup> served by the secondary schools, within a radius of 8.k.ms 886 habitations with a population of 3,54,120 covering 24% of population are having the secondary School facility at a distance beyond 8 kms.
