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Back Ground of Tumkur District

Tumkur district is one among 27 districts of Karnataka state having an area of 10596 sq. kilometers. The district is surrounded by Bangalore & Kolar towards east, towards west Hassan and Chitradurga Dists and Ananthapur district of Andhra in north. The district is having diversity in geographical social and cultural activities. There are 10 taluks in this district. Major language spoken is Kannada. Hence the medium of instructions in all Govt. schools is Kannada and Urdu in all govt. Urdu schools. Urdu is also found to be the second spoken language of the District. As such there are 175 urdu medium schools in the district. There is one Arabic school at Kunigal. One Telugu medium primary school is functioning in Pavagada taluk of this dist.

KALI NALI PROGRAMME

This programme has been prepared through the collaborative effort of the five participating UN agencies and the Human Resources development department. It is the goal of the UN system to target girls and marginalized populations of children in selected areas. Three taluks are selected in Tumkur dist. Namely Madhugiri, Pavagada and Sira where the female literacy is very low. To improve their attendance and performance in Primary Education, a new system of education is evolved for working children, tribals and scheduled castes, minorities, disabled children, and children in remote areas. Girls of these population groupings are usually marginalized to the extreme.

In recent years the results are deteriorating, and values are at low ebb, the Govt. of Karnataka thought of promoting the girl's education particularly. Three general aims are strictly followed in Sira, Pavagada and Madhugiri Taluks. (1) To enhance the capacity for community participation in effective school management and the protection of child rights. Training was given to Teachers to teach 1std without the text books. Text book ridden is lessened. To solve this problem training was imparted from 19/02/1999 to 06/10/1999 incurring a sum of Rs. 786040/-. Teachers will be trained periodically. Probable expenditure for each batch will be Rs. 93746/- for all the selected teachers of Madhugiri, Sira and Pavagada. To improve the performance of teachers, they are trained in interactive, child-centered and gender-sensitive methods of teaching. Each taluk is divided into 35 clusters. All the 35 teachers were appointed as CRPS and these teachers are expected to visit atleast once in a month and offer

suggestions. To improve the social conditions, which effect the attendance and performance of aged girls, teachers are directed to meet once in a month and discuss the problems of education and strategies of teaching in Sira, Pavagada and Madhugiri Taluk. This kind of meetings funds are reserved for this programme. Children are receptive and enjoy learning. This is the outcome of orientation training programmes, conference, workshops, meetings, seminars. This provides academic and professional guidance to teachers where they get new ideas like Kala Jatha, movements to identify dropouts, chinnara mela etc. This entire programme is guided and supervised by the Director DSERT- Bangalore is our state.
