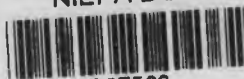
It is believed that the detailed assessment-survey will have significant contribution in shaping up the future plan perspective in the field of educational programme.

CHAPTER - I

PART - I

I. 1. General Informations :-

The Dibang Valley is named after the mighty River Dibang, which flows through the District from North to South to meet Lohit and Siang Rivers in the Plains of Assam. The Dibang Valley District is situated in between 93.15° East Longitude and 27.45° to 29.30° North Longitude. It is situated on the top of the Lower Tibeto-Himalayan range amidst exquisite natural beauty of hilly brooks and water falls, high peak and deep groves, verdant forests and swift rivers, hanging-clouds and mountains covering snows. Dibang Valley claims one of the difficult hilly terrains of Arunachal Pradesh. It covers an area of 13,029 Sq.Km. with the lowest population of 30,978 persons (as per 1981 Census) inhabiting at the rate of 2 persons per Km. Sq. The District consists of a number of Sub-Valleys formed by the tributaries of Dibang river namely Dri, Mathun, Ithur, Tales, Embra, Ahui and the Sisiri River respectively.

The Dibang Valley, previously an Independent Sub-Division under Lohit District, was declared as separate Independent District under Arunachal Pradesh (Re-Organisation of District) Act 1980.

The Dibang Valley District now comprises the following Administrative centres :-

The Dibang Valley District bounded on the North by Tibet, on the South parts of Lohit District and Assam State, on the East part of Tibet and parts of Lohit District and on the West by West Siang District.

The District contains wild mountainous area and presents a remarkable topographical variety.

The percentage of Scheduled Tribe population of Dibang Valley District to the total population is 48.56.

The main Tribes, namely IDU and Padam (ADIS) inhabit the District.

The entire District has been divided into 3 (Three) Community Development Blocks each under the Charge of Extra Assistant Commissioner working as the Ex-Officio Block Development officer. Details are furnished below as per the Report of 5th All India Educational Survey.

I.1-2. Population of the District according to 1981 Census:

a) Population of the District according to 1981 Census in URBAN AREA IS Nil. Hence population in RURAL Area is furnished below :-

The Dibang Valley District is pre-dominantly in-habited by scheduled tribe population which constitute 48.56% of total population. People from other community including scheduled caste population are basically outsiders and temporarily living in the District for their lively-hood.

The population count of 1981 Census of Dibang Valley District reveals that the total population of 30,978 only constitute 4.90% of a total population of the Arunachal Pradesh, when all the Districts are ranked, it is observed that the Dibang Valley District ranks is sex ratio.

The variation in the population of Dibang Valley District in between 1971 and 1981 has been found to be very high, i.e. 103.37 % as against only 35.15 % in Arunachal Pradesh.

1.3. Density of population :-

The Density of population in Dibang Valley District is only 2 persons living per Sq. Km while it is 7 persons per Sq. Km in Arunachal Pradesh.

1.4. Percentage of Literacy (1981 Census) :-

The percentage of literates to total population in Dibang Valley District is 26.28 % against 20.70 % in Arunachal Pradesh.

1.5. Female Literacy as compared to Male :-

The ratio of school going boys and girls was 132 : 93 respectively in 1987. It reveals that the rate of female literacy is very less as compared to males.

The reason for such disparity lies partly in ignorance of the parents who are not very willing to send their girls to the school and also partly due to communication difficulties.

1.6. Level of Industrialisation :-

There is no large scale Industry available in Dibang Valley District. However, following Industries are available in the District in minor scale - Saw Mill, Veneer and Ply-Wood Mills, Cane & Bamboo Industries, Furniture Making, Rice-Mill, Weaving & Craft Centres.

-1.7. Agriculture Development :-

The Agriculture is the main occupation of the inhabitants of the District. The main crops grown are paddy, Maize, Millet, Potato, Ginger, Chillies etc. The scope for development of Horticulture is much more in Lower Dibang Valley area. The permanent cultivation with irrigation facilities is practised in Lower Dibang Valley area (Roing & Dambuk Circles). In the Middle and Upper Dibang Valley Area, there is acute shortage of plain-cultivable land for taking up permanent cultivation. Hence, in the Middle and Upper Dibang Valley/belt, normally UHUT CULTIVATION is practised by the farmer. But due to unfavourable agro-climatic condition, the yield per acre is very low.

I-1.8. Level of Development in Cultural Fields :-

The Dibang Valley District is pre-dominantly dominated by the local scheduled tribes namely, IDU and PADA (ADI). The major indigenous festival of the District are REH and SOLUNG festivals. Moreover, the Social & Cultural organisations, namely IDU Cultural Society at Anini and ADI Cultural Society at Roing are taking active steps for development of art and culture in the District.

I-2. FIFTH ALL INDIA EDUCATIONAL SURVEY:

I-2-1 Brief Account of 5th All India Educational Survey Programme:-

The Fifth All India Educational Survey was started as per the Government's instruction and guidelines covered vide letter No. ED/ES/4/87 dated 17th March 1987. In view of this, a training programme was organised at Pasighat in collaboration with the N.C.E.R.T., New-Delhi, where the District Education officers and the Adult Education supervisors participated. The Training Programme was conducted for 7 (seven) days with effect from 18th April to 26th April 1987 (Both days inclusive). After the training, SIF, VIP and UIF were received from the N.C.E.R.T. and distributed to the block survey officers, i.e. (DEO/Adult Education Supervisors of three blocks of the District.

District for taking up the Survey work in their respective jurisdiction.

The Block Survey Officers, Imparted training to the Headmasters/Teachers of their Block to fill up SIF (School Information Forms) of their respective School and VIF (Village Information Forms) of the feeder village and UIF (Urban Information Forms) for the Town and Cities lying within their jurisdiction.

The Field Officer (Headmaster/Teacher) started their job in the month of July and submitted regular informations in the month of September 1987 to the respective Block Survey Officers. The Block Survey Officers, in turn, checked and scrutinized all informations furnished in collected SIF/VIF and UIF and completed the Block Tables of their respective Blocks and submitted the same to the District Survey Officers i.e. the District Education Officer. The State Survey officer also visited Roing and conducted the Scrutiny of the filledup SIF/VIF and UIF and guided for Block Tables, the District Survey Officer, in the District Education Officer, scrutinized and compiled the District Table and submitted the same to the state survey officer.

The following categories of Schools were functioning in the District :-

2. Secondary Schooos - 3 Nos.
3. Middle Schooes (including V.K.V at Roing -13 Nos
4. Primary Schools (Including I.V.Schools) -36 Nos.

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CHAPTER -II

PRIMARY EDUCATION

1. Blockwise habitation with and without primary school:-

Out of 99 habitations, in Anini-Etalin C.D. Block only 16 habitations having a population of 2,8001 were served by Primary Schools/Sections/within habitations. Out of the remaining 83 habitations, only 5 habitations. Section facilities from at a distance of 0.5 Km. 7 (seven) habitations having 191 population from at distance ranging from 0.6 Km, to 1 Km. 6 (six) habitations having population of 104 at a distance ranging from 1.6 Km to 2 Km. and 65 (sixtyfive) habitations having population of 1,778 at a distance of more then 2 Km.

2. Hunli-Kronli C.D. Block, Desali :-

Out of 69 habitations, 8 (eight) habitations with a population of 899 were served with primary Section within habitation. The remaining 62 (sixtyone) habitations with a population of 2,254 were having Primary School/Sections at a distance of more than 2 Km.

3. Roing-Dambuk C.D. Block, Roing :-

In Roing-Dambuk C.D Block, out of 54 habitations 28 (twenty eight) habitations with a population of 21,456 were served with Primary School/Section within the habitations. The remaining 36 (twenty six) habitations, with a population of 4,717 were having Primary School/Section at a distance of more then 2 Km.

Disparities :-

The Communication difficulties and thin population here, the main reasons of disparities amongst the Block in providing of primary Education Facilities. Lower Dibang Valley area (Roing-Dambuk) are having better facilities in respect of communication and also the numerical of habitations are much higher in that area in comparison to the Middle & Middle Dibang Valley Area there are over, in Upper & Middle Dibang Valley Area there are many scattered villages within 3 to 4 houses only at

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only at the extreme interior areas. In view of above, reasons it has not been possible to open Primary Schools/Sections in every habitations.

4. No. of Habitations served with Primary school/Section

There were 222 habitations in the District and out of which 12 (twelve) habitations were having Primary Schools/Sections. within a distance of 1 Km.

5. Village according to propotion of ST/SC :-

Only one village was having the Scheduled Caste population upto 25 and was covered with the Primary School Section. Rest 221 villages were without Scheduled Caste population.

There were five villages upto 25 population (ST) available. Out of these five billages, one village was having Primary/ School/Section and Higher Secondary School. There villages were served with Primary School/Section and one village with Middle Scyool. Out of 5 (Five) villages having S/T population between 25-50 only one village was having Primary School. One village having ST population between 51-75 was served with Primary School/Section. Out of 211 villages having ST population more than 75, 16 (sixteen) vilblages were having Primary Schools and No. of Schools habitatioj.

6. No. of Primary Schools and No. of Schools having Primary Cl sses :-

A total of 36 (thirty siz) Primary Schools were functioning in the District and all of whci were under the management of the state Government.

A total of 18 (eighteen) Schools, namely 13 (thirteen) Middle Schools, 3 (three) Secondary Schoolas, and 2 (two) Higher Secondary Schools were also having Primary Classes.

Primary Schools according to the Type : of Building :-

Out of 36 (thirty six) Primary Schools 15 (fifteen) Schools were having Fucca building. 7 (seven) Schools partly Fucca buildings 2 (two) Schools Kacha buildings and 12 (twelve) schools thatched huts. There is no Urban area in this District, hence question of disparities between Rural & Urban area does not arise.

Primary Schools according to No. of Instructional Rooms:-

One Primary School was having only one Instructional Room, 11 (eleven) Schools were having two instructional Rooms, two schools were having 4 Instructional Rooms, 3 (three) Schools were having 5 Instructional Rooms and (three) Schools were having 7 Instructional Rooms.

Primary Schools according to Additional Rooms Required :-

The requirement of additional rooms in primary Schools is furnished below :-

1. In 9 Schools - 2 Rooms.
2. In 7 Schools - 3 Rooms.
3. In 3 Schools - 4 Rooms.
4. In 1 Schools - 5 Rooms.
5. In 2 Schools - 6-7 Rooms.

In remaining 14 (fourteen) Schools no additional rooms were required.

Availability of Black-Boards :-

The availability of Black-Boards in the primary Schools-Blockwise is furnished below :-

- a) Anini-Etalin C.D. Block:- The total number of Primary Sections were 65 (Sixty five) in 14 (fourteen) Primary Schools 42 (forty two) unserviceable Black-Board were available.
- b) Funli-Kronli C.D Block :- The total number of sections were 29 (twenty nine) in 6 (six) primary Schools and only 19 Nos. of Black-boards were available.
- c) Roing-Dambuk C.D Block :- The total number of Sections were 73 (seventy three) in 16 (sixteen) Primary Schools were 73 Black-boards were available.

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The Black-Boards as per requirement could not be procured/supplies to the schools under Anini-Etalin C.D. Block and Hunli-Kronli C.D. Block due to remoteness of the areas and also due to non-availability of proper communication facilities. Moreover, there was no craft Centre or Furniture Shop available in these reasons there were shortage of Black-Boards in the above Blocks.

II. Primary school according to Ancillary Facilities :-

29 (twenty-nine) schools were provided with the Drinking water facility 6 (six) Schools were provided with Urinal facilities and 2 (two) Schools were having Girls Urinal.

There were no laboratory facilities available in any school.

24 (twenty four) Schools were getting the facilities for medical checkup, 29 (twenty nine) Schools were getting the facilities for vaccination and inoculation.

2. No. of Schools according to Teachers Position:-

- a) Every Primary School was provided with Teachers
- b) 2 (two) Schools in Anini-Etalin C.D. Block, 2 (two) Schools in Hunli-Kronli C.D. Block, and 6 (six) Schools in Dambuk-Roing C.D. Block were having Single Teacher.
- c) 10 (ten) Schools in Anini-Etalin C.D. Block, 4 (four) Schools in Hunli-Kronli C.D. Block, and 6 (six) Schools in Dambuk-Roing C.D. Block were having two Teachers.
- d) 2 (two) Schools in Anini-Etalin C.D. Block, 1 (one) School in Dambuk-Roing C.D. Block, 1 (one) School in Dambuk-Roing C.D. Block, 1 (one) School in Roing-Dambuk C.D. Block, were having 3 teachers, 3 teachers, 4 teachers, 6 teachers and 8 teachers respectively.

As mentioned above, 10(ten) Schools were provided with single teacher due to less number of Students in the School and also due to shortage of teachers in the District.

2 Teacher at Primary Stages :-

There were 33 male Untrained Teachers in the Primary Schools out of which one Middle Passed, one Matriculate, two Higher Secondary Passed, 27 Graduates and 2 post-Graduates Besides, there were 30 teachers Middle passed, 7 Matriculate 8 Hr, Secondary, 19 Graduates and 2 post-graduates teachers.

In addition to above, there were 7 Untrained Female Teachers out of which 1 was Middle passed, 1 Hr. Secondary 4 Graduates and 1 post-Graduate teacher. There were also 3 trained female teachers out of which one was H.S.passed, and 2 were Graduates. The entire District was treated as Rural Area and hence the question of Urban area does not arise.

3 Enrolment of primary State :-

The enrolment at primary Stage for all communities was Boys-2,742 and Girls 1,747. Out of this the enrolment of SC students were Boys 11 and Girls 4 and ST Students Boys 550 and Girls 1,161 respectively.

The enrolment of SC and ST students in I-V under age group 6-below & 11 years along with the percentage of students is furnished below :-

4. Indicators of Educational Development at Primary level :-

The age specific enrolment ration at Primary level was 173.15 where the ration of boys were 98.38 and the girls 74.77 the entire area is treated as Rural Area

and therefore the question of disparities in comparison to Urban area does not arise.

The gross enrolment ratio of the students in Primary Section was 258.92 where the ratio of the boys was 147.65 and the girls 111.27.

The disparities were due to the enrolment of the students above the age range of 6-11 years. In fact the age of students was calculated approximately on the basis of physical appearance of the student since no record of the date of birth of the students was maintained by their parents due to ignorance and illiteracy.

The pupil Teacher ration was 55.42 in the primary were ~~mix~~ Schools. Some Schools were having more students and some were with less students. Normally, the teachers were posted against the school for smooth functioning of the Schools irrespective of the enrolment.

The percentage of girls was 38.91 in the Primary level Schools. The reason for less percentage of girls was that due to illiteracy and ignorance of the parent. The education of females (ST) was not very encouraged by their parent. Moreover, the girls (ST) are married during their child-hood.

1. Blockwise habitation with the without Upper-Primary Schools Sections in Rural areas :-

Out of 222 total habitations, along with the population of 34,542 in the District, a total of 16 (sixteen) habitations were having Upper-Primary Schools within the habitation itselfes, The remaining 206 habitations were served with Upper-Primary Schools located at a distance ranging from 1 to more than 5 km.

The detailed Blockwise position is furnished below:-

1. Anini-Etalin C.D. Block :- Out of 99 habitations with a population of 5,216 only, 2 (two) habitations were having Upper-Primary Schools within habitations. Remaining 15 (fifteen) habitations with School at a distance of 1 to 5 km. and 82 (eightytwo) habitations were served with Upper-Primary Schools located at distance of more than 5 km.

2. Hunli-Kronli C.D. Block:- Out of 69 habitations with a population of 3,153 only 2(two) habitations were having Upper-Primary Schools within the habitation. and remaining 57(sixtyseven) habitation were served with Schools located at a distance of more than 5 km.

3. Dambuk-Roing C.D. Block :- Out of 54 habitations with a population of 26,172, only 12 (twelve) habitations were having Upper-Primary Schools within habitations and remaining 42(fourtytwo) hanitations were served with Schoas located at a distance of more than 5 km.

2. Habitation & Population served by existing & proposed Upper-Primary Schools/Sections:-

Out of total habitation of 222 (two hundred and twenty two) with a population of 34,542, 16(sixteen) habitation were having Upper-Primary Schools within habitations 15(fifteen) habitations at a distance remaining from 1 to 5 km and 191 (hundred nintyone) habitations at distance of more than 5 km.

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In view of very thin population and very small scattered villages, opening of more Upper-Primary Schools was not proposed.

Villages in various population slabs according to proportion of SC/ST Population and availability of Educational facilities:-

There was only one village with Scheduled Caste population upto 25% which was having Upper-Primary School within habitation 5 (five) villages having ST population below 300 were served by Upper-primary Schools. 2 (two) villages having ST population ranging from 400-499 had not Upper-Primary School. 3 (three) villages having population ranging from 500-999 were served by Upper-Primary Schools.

In the population range from 5000 and above, there was one village having Upper-Primary School.

Schools according to Area Management and Type:-

1) There were 12 (twelve) Upper primary Schools under the management of the Government and 1 Upper-Primary School under the Management of the V.K.V All the School were in Rural area.

2) There were 13 (Thirteen) Upper-Primary Schools supported by the Primary Section, 3 Upper-primary Schools attached to the Secondary Schools and 2 Upper-primary School attached to the Higher Secondary Schools, i.e there were 18 (eighteen) Upper-Primary Schools/Sections in the District and all were managed by the Government except one Upper-Primary School.

Schools according to Type of Building :-

Out of 13 (thirteen) Upper-Primary Schools, were having pucca buildings, one School partly pucca buildings and one School Kacha building.

Schools with Library and Allied Facilities :-

Out of 13 (thirteen) Upper-Primary Schools, 12 (twelve) Schools were having Library facilities. One School had books range between 101-200, 5 (five) Schools and 3 (three) Schools had books more than 1000.

One School which was newly upgraded, could not be provided with Library Books immediately after upgradation

School according to Ancillary Facilities:-

The ancillary facilities provided to Upper-Primary Schools are furnished below:-

All the Schools were located in Rural Area and therefore, the question of disparities with Urban area does not arise.

Teachers according to Qualification/Sex :-

There were 26 male trained Teachers and 47 male untrained teachers out of which the trained teachers were middle passed 2, matriculate 3, Post-matric 4, graduates 12 Post-graduates 5. Out of the untrained male teachers, matric 1, Post-matric 2, Graduate 32 and post-graduates 12 Out of 24 female teachers, there were 17 trained teachers and 7 untrained teachers. Out of trained female teachers, there were 2 middle passed, 5 Matriculate, 5 post-matric and 5 Graduate. There was not post-graduate trained teachers. The un-trained female teachers were Matric 2, post-matric 1, Graduate 4 and post-graduate Nil.

All these teachers were working in Rural area

a) The age specific enrolment ration of the students of Upper-primary level in age group 11 to below 14 years was 80 : 80 : 71, where ratio of boys was 51.99 and girls 28.72.

b) The gross enrolment ration of the students of Middle level in age group 11 below 14 years was 104.15 where the ratio of boys was 66.29 and girls 37.86.

All the Schools were located in Rural area and therefore the question of disparities between Rural and Urban does not arise.

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1. Blockwise habitations with & without Secondary School/Section in Rural & Urban area :-

There was 1 (one) School/Section each in Anini-Etalin C.D. Block and Hunli-Kronli C.D. Block covering the population of 5,217 and 3,153 respectively. There were two Schools/Sections in Dambuk-Roing C.D. Block covering the population of 26,172.

One habitation with population of 1,587 in Anini-Etalin C.D. Block, one habitation with population of 172 under Hunli-Kronli C.D. Block and 3 (three) habitations with population of 10,154 were having Secondary Schools/Section within habitation. 12 (twelve) habitations covering population of 580 upto 8 Km under Anini-Etalin C.D. Block were getting the facilities of Secondary Education.

86 (eightysix) habitations with population of 350 beyond 8 Km. were getting the facilities of Secondary Education in Anini-Etalin C.D. Block. 68 (sixtyeight) habitations with population of 2,981 beyond 8 Km. were getting facilities of Secondary Education in Hunli-Kronli C.D. Block. 51 (fiftyone) habitations covering population of 16,018 beyond 8 Km. were getting the facilities of Secondary Education in Dambuk-Roing C.D. Block.

2. No. of habitations and their population served with & without Higher Secondary Schools :-

There was one Higher Secondary School each at Anini-Etalin C.D. Block covering 99 habitations with population of 5,217 and at Dambuk-Roing C.D. Block covering 54 habitations with population of 26,172 respectively. There was one Higher Secondary School within one habitation with population of 1,587 in Anini-Etalin C.D. Block.

12 (twelve) habitations with population 580 upto 8 Km. were getting Higher Secondary facilities in Anini-Etalin C.D. Block.

86 (eightysix) habitations with population of 3,050 beyond 8 Km. were getting the Higher Secondary Education facilities in Anini-Etalin C.D. Block. There was Higher Secondary School facilities within habitation covering population of 7,683 in Dambuk-Roing C.D. Block. There was no habitation covered by Higher Secondary Education upto 8 Km. in Dambuk-Roing C.D. Block.

53 (fiftythree) habitations with a population of 18,489 beyond 8 Km. were getting Higher Secondary Education facilities in Dambuk-Roing C.D. Block.

69 (sixtynine) habitations with population of 3,153 beyond 8 Km. in Anli-Kronli C.D. Block were covered by Higher Secondary Education facilities of Dambuk-Roing C.D. Block.

3. Schools according to area Management and type :-

There were two secondary Sections one each attached to the Higher Secondary Schools under Anini-Etalin C.D. Block and Dambuk-Roing C.D. Block respectively. Both the schools were managed by the Government.

4. No. of Higher Secondary Schools :-

There were two Higher Secondary Schools ~~were~~ in the District covering the 3 (three) C.D. Blocks.

5. Availability of Library Facilities :-

Both Secondary and Higher Secondary Schools were provided with the Library facilities. The news papers, periodicals and magazines were available in the school.

One Secondary School was having Library Books ~~between~~ range from 500-1000 books and one Secondary School was having library books between the range of 1001-2000 books.

One Higher Secondary School was having library books in the range of 1001-2000 books and one Higher Secondary School in the range of 2000-5000.

Teachers according to Qualification/Sex & Stage :-

There were 23 male teachers and 7 female teachers in Secondary Schools. Out of 33 male Teachers, the trained teachers were 2 Matric, 1 Post-matric, 7 Graduates and 7 Post-graduates and the untrained teachers were, Graduates 8 and Post-Graduates 8. Out of 7 female teachers, the trained teachers were 4 Graduates while the untrained teachers were Matric 2 and Post-graduate 1.

There were a total of 41 male teachers and 6 female teachers in Higher Secondary Schools, out of which the trained teachers were Post-matric 2, Graduates 8 and post-Graduates 1 while the untrained teachers were Milled passed 1, Graduate Post-Graduates 7 and Language teacher 1.

Out of 6 female teachers, the trained teacher was Post-Graduate 4 while the untrained teachers were Post-matric Graduate 2, Post-Graduate 1 and Language Teacher 1.

All the teachers were working in Rural area.

Secondary Schools having Science Laboratory :-

There were 2 separate Science Laboratories for Physics, Chemistry and Biology in two Schools. This was provided by the Government. The Science Laboratory in one newly graded School could not be provided immediately after upgrade.

Higher Secondary Schools having Science Laboratory :-

There was one separate Science Laboratory for Physics, Chemistry and Biology equipped with all equipments and chemicals in one School. Science Stream was not provided in the remaining one Higher Secondary School.

Science Teacher & their Qualification (Secondary only)

There were total of 7 Science Teachers in Secondary Schools. Out of these teachers the trained

the trained teachers were post-Graduate 1 and Graduates 2 while the untrained teachers were post-Graduates 2 and graduates 2.

UPPER-PRIMARY AND SECONDARY

One trained Graduate and one untrained post-graduate teacher.

SECONDARY AND HIGHER SECONDARY STAGE.

Only 4 trained post-Graduate teachers.

The district was basically pre-dominated by Scheduled Tribes and the population of the Scheduled Caste was very insignificant.

Ancillary Facilities :-

Two Secondary Schools were provided with facilities of drinking-water, lavatory and medical checkup. One Secondary School was provided with girls' lavatory and Urinal. One School was provided with the facilities of medical checkup but; drinking water supply and lavatory facilities could not be provided.

All the Higher Secondary Schools were provided with the facilities of drinking water supply, laboratory, separate girls lavatory, Girls urinals and medical checkup.

Facilities of Physical Education:-

Only one Higher Secondary School was provided with a physical Education Teacher. There was

no physical Education Teacher in Secondary School and also in the remaining Higher Secondary School.

Higher Secondary School according to Courses offered :-

One Higher Secondary School was functioning with two streams namely science stream and Humanity stream while remaining one Higher Secondary School was functioning with Humanity Stream.

CHAPTER - V.

OTHER EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES

1. Non-Formal Education Centres and Enrolment :-

There were only 3 Centres running in Dambuk-Roing C.D. Block with the total enrolment of Boys 21 and girls 29. There were no Centres available in Anini-Etalin C.D. Block and in Hunli-Kronli C.D. Block.

2. Adult Education/Functionaries Literacy Facilities :-

There were 45 Adult Education/Functional Literacy Centres spread over all the three C.D. Blocks with the total enrolment of men 296 and women 298.


3. Schools for Disable :-

4. Pre-Primary Education Facilities :-

i) Balwadi/Anganwadi :- 39 (thirty nine) villages were having the facilities of Balwadi/Anganwadi Centres. The facilities like special nutrition programme and Medical, were provided by the Block Development Officers of the respective Blocks.

ii) There was one Pre-Primary School and also 11 (eleven) Pre-Primary ~~Sub~~ Classes were attached to the Primary Schools under the management of the Government.
