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Introduction

Lakshadweep constitutes the smallest Union territory in India. These coral islands and reefs are lying scattered in the Arabian sea about 200 to 300 kilometres off the west coast of Kerala between 8° and 12° north latitude and 71° and 74° east longitude. Out of the 27 islands, 10 are inhabited and among the remaining 17 Islands, 12 are uninhabited and the other five are attached islets. The inhabitants of this territory, entirely Muslims by religion, are classified as scheduled tribes.

The population of Lakshadweep was 31,810 in 1971. This has increased to 39,020 in 1979. The density of population in 1971 was 1,214 per sq. k. m. The density of population based on the projected population for 1980 would be 1,528 per sq. k. m. The sex ratio in 1980 is 979 females per 1,000 males.

Prior to independence these islands were administered by the British Government. During the British rule formal education was first started at Amini, Kavaratti, Andrott, Kalpeni, Minicoy and Agatti. The enrolment in these institutions steadily declined with the result that these institutions disappeared in 1884 except in Kalpeni. Though measures were taken to revive these schools with the introduction of *Koran* along with other subjects, they could not achieve the expected progress.

Physical target

At the time of the constitution of these coral islands into Union territory in 1956 there were nine lower primary schools with 28 teachers (untrained island teachers and re-employed pensioners) with an enrolment of 1,521 students. The teacher-pupil ratio during the above period was 1:54.

The efforts made by the department during the five year plan and the operational plans brought new light in these islands with the establishment of new primary school with sufficient staff to teach the students. The enrolment in the educational institutions steadily increased year by year. With the result new educational institutions had to be started to cope up with the increased enrolment. The number of educational institutions increased to 31 in 1966 from 28 in 1956. Similarly the total number of students of 1,521 in 1956 increased to 4,976 in 1966. There were 43 educational institutions in 1979–80. The educational institutions are as under.

The enrolment reached a level of 11,483 in 1979-80 against 10,987 students in 1978-79. The teacher-pupil ratio is 1:25 for Lakshadweep. Besides nine Nursery schools, four Balawadies were also functioning in this Union territory. The Balawadies are managed by the State Social Welfare Advisory Board, Kavaratti.

Pre-primary education

There were 796 students studying in these institutions. The enrolment of girls is more than the boys in the Nursery classes in 1979-80. The opening of Balawadies caused decrease in the enrolment in the Nursery schools. The teacher-pupil ratio is 1:32.

Primary education

There were 21 educational institutions functioning in all the islands with 190 teachers and 6,443 students. The enrolment of

girls was more than enrolment of boys in the Senior Basic schools in 1979-80. The enrolment was 1,198 girls and 677 boys. The teacher-pupil ratio was 1:31 in respect of all the above institutions.

Secondary education

There were 8 High Schools functioning under Secondary Education in eight islands. Vocational classes namely, typewriting, in the High Schools at Kavaratti, Kalpeni, Amini and Andrott were continued during 1979-80. Fisheries Technology was taught in High Schools at Kavaratti and Amini as a part of vocational education. The total enrolment in the secondary schools was 4,233. The total number of teachers in the above institutions was 228. The teacher-pup I ratio was 1:19.

University education

One Junior College at Kavaratti is functioning efficiently. The total number of students on roll during 1979-80 was 250. There were 15 teachers attached with the Junior College. The teacher-pupil ratic was 1:17. Educational tours were conducted for students. After completion of the Pre-degree level course in the Junior College, students aspiring higher education were sent to mainland colleges for various courses. The scholarship holders in the mainland institutions were 344. There were 1.200 scholarship holders in the institutions in the islands.

Hostels

There were four hostels (two for boys and two for girls) functioning in the islands. There were 41 boarders in high school hostels and 202 in Junior College hostel.

Sports and Games

Inter school sports and games were conducted. A football team from High School, Minicoy participated in the Suborto Mukherjee Cup Tournament at New Delhi.

Social and other educational programmes

Social Education Centres and reading room-cum-libraries were functioning in all the islands. The Central Library at Kavaratti functioned efficiently during 1979-80. Parent-teachers associations attached with the Educational Institutions in islands had their meetings regularly to discuss common problems in connection with education in islands.

Mahilasamajams and Youth Clubs were functioning in all the islands.

Financial achievements


Development of education attained greater momentum during the Five Year Plan 1974-79. The efforts and the enthusiasm of the Department made the aspiring students to acquire more academic qualification and to attain maximum enrolment in the educational institutions.


The educational facilities started in the Second Five Year Plan with an actual expenditure of Rs. 11.98 lakhs and continued with higher expenditure of Rs. 35.8 lakhs in the Third Five Year Plan, Rs. 22.43 lakhs in the Annual Plan 1966-69, Rs. 42.89 lakhs in the fourth Five Year Plan and Rs. 80.42 lakhs in the fifth Five Year Plan.


In 1979 - 80 the approved outlay under education was Rs. 30.00 lakes including Arts and Culture against which the Department of Education had spent an amount of Rs. 14.55 lakes, which is 48.5% of the total approved outlay for that year. As regards the expenditure in the development sectors, the sector General Education ranks the first position during 1979-80.

After presenting a general description of the progress of education in terms of physical and financial achievements as explained above, we turn to the pages of this booklet which would, it is hoped, give educational data, pertaining to these islands in physical terms in various combinations of graphical and tabular representation.


EDUCATIONAL LADDER (LAKSHADWEEP)

General

Agatti island is lying at a distance of 57 kilometres towards the west of the headquarter island Kavaratti. It is the most westernly island in Lakshadweep with an area of 2.7 sq. kms. and occupies fifth position among the islands of Lakshadweep, in respect of area and population. In 1971 the population of this island was 3,155 (1,654 males and 1,501 females). In the same year the sex ratio was 907 females per 1,000 males. The estimated population of this island is 3,840 (1992 males and 1,848 females) and the sex ratio is 928 females per 1,000 males in 1979. The density of population based on the estimated population is 1,422 persons per sq. kilometre.

This inhabited island has attached islets namely Bangaram, Thinnakara, Parali and Kalpitti. They are all uninhabited islands. Bangaram is being developed as an international tourist resort in Lakshadweep,

Education

There were five educational institutions in Agatti island during 1979-80. The total enrolment in all educational institutions of this island was 1,082 (597 boys and 485 girls) which is 9.63 per cent of total enrolment in all educational institutions in this Union territory. Agatti island ranks fifth in the enrolment among all the schools and high schools. Out of 47 teachers, 44 are trained teachers. There are 29 Scheduled Tribe teachers working in preprimary/primary/secondary schools in this island. The teacher-pupil ratio is 1:23.




General

Amini island lies about 65 km. away from the headquarter island Kavaratti. The population of Amini island as per 1971 census was 4,542 (2,430 males plus 2,112 females making a sex ratio of 869 females per 1,000 males). The projected population of Amini island for 1980, is 5,619 (2,952 males plus 2,667 females). Amini island stands fourth among the islands in respect of population. The density of population is 1,747 persons per sq. km. in 1971 and 2,161 persons per sq. km. in 1980 as against 1,214 persons per sq. km. in 1971 and 1,528 persons per sq. km. in 1980 in respect of the inhabited islands of Lakshadweep. As regards density of population Amini island holds the first position during the period 1971–80.

In respect of percentage of literacy, Amini island had a rate of 40.6% against Lakshadweep rate of 43.66% in 1971.

Education

In Amini there were one Balwadi, one Nursery School, three Junior Basic Schools and one High School functioning during 1979–80. The total enrolment of these institutions in 1979–80 was 1,492 (909 boys plus 583 girls) which formed 13 per cent of the total school going children of this Union territory. The teacher-pupil ratio is 1:27.

General

Andrott island, situated at North 10°-49′ and East 73°-41′ is the nearest island in the group to the mainland at it has the maximum area (being 4.8 sq. km.) among that of all islands. This island lies East-West unlike other islands which lie North-South. The population of Andrott island as per 1971 census was 5,425 (2,668 males and 2,757 females making a sex ratio of 1,033 females per 1,000 males). It has been estimated that Andrott island has a population of 6,740 (3,336 males and 3,404 females making a sex ratio of 1,020 females per 1,000 males) in 1980. The density of population in 1971 was 1,130 per sq. kilometre and 1,404 in 1979–80.

In the matter of literacy Andrott has the least rate of 34.88% in 19/1 against Lakshadweep literacy rate of 43.66%.

Fducation

There were one Balawadi, one Nursery School, three Junior Basic Schools, one Senior Basic School and one High School during 1979-80. The total enrolment in schools of the island was 1,826 (1,024 boys and 802 girls) which formed 16% of the total enrolment in all schools of Lakshadweep. Out of 60 teachers in all educational institutions in the island, 57 are trained teachers which is 95% of total teachers.

The teacher-pupil ratio in this island during 1979-80 stood at 1:30 against Lakshadweep ratio 1:25.






General

Bitra island, situated at N 11°-36′ and E 72°-10′ is the smallest inhabited island in the territory. It lies at a distance of 56 km. from the nearest island Chetlat and 124 Km. from the head-quarter island, Kavaratti. The population was 112 (56 males + 56 females) in 1971 Census. As per the projected population in 1980, the population reached 146 (74 males + 72 females). The density of population in 1971 and 1979 was 1,120 per sq. km. and 1,460 sq. km. respectively. The density of Bitra island is almost that of Lakshadweep. Percentage of literacy of Bitra, according to 1971 census was 42.86 against 43.66 of Lakshadweep.

Education

It may be remarkably observed that Bitra island has only one Junior Basic School having classes from I to II. No other educational institution exists in this smallest island. The enrolment in this lone school in 1979-80 was 13 (5 boys \pm 8 girls) and 2 teachers were engaged to teach them.

## 1. General

Chetlat island situated at N 11°—41′ and E 72°—43′ is the northern most inhabited island of the group of islands. It lies at a distance of 124 Kms. from the headquarter island, Kavaratti. The island has an area of only one Sq. Km. and is only next to the smallest island (Bitra) in area. It may be observed that the permanent settlers of Bitra island were initially from Chetlat island.

This island had a population of 1,200 (590 males+610 females) making a Sex ratio of 1,034 females per 1,000 males in 1971. According to the projection based on Central Statistical Organisation methods, Chetlat island may have a population of 1,463 persons (723 males+740 females) with a sex ratio of 1,023 females per 1,000 males, in 1980.

As regards, the density of population, it has been observed that it was 1,200 persons per Sq. Km. which would have further increased to 1,463 in 1980. These figures may be compared with the corresponding density of population of 1,214 persons per Sq. Km. in 1971 and 1,528 persons per Sq. Km. in 1980 in respect of the whole inhabited islands of Lakshadweep.

In the matter of literacy Chetlat island has a rate of 43.17% against the rate of 43.66% in respect of the territory.

#### 2. Education

Chetlat island has only one Nursery School and one Senior Basic School (Class I- VII) in 1979 80. Total enrolment in these schools was 395 (192 Boys+203 girls) which formed 3.52% of the total enrolment of Lakshadweep. Out of 15 teachers 13 are trained teachers.

The teacher pupil ratio in the Schools was 1:26 against Lakshadweep ratio of 1:25.



### 1. General

Kadmat island, situated at N 11°-13′ and E 72°-47′, has an area of 3.1 sq. km. and occupies fourth rank in respect of area among the islands of the group. The population of Kadmat island was 2,416 (1,192 males  $\pm$  1,224 females) with a sex ratio of 1,027 females per 1,000 males in 1971. And as per projections, the population of Kadmat island may have reached 3,013 (1,493 males  $\pm$  1,520 females) having a sex ratio of 1,018 females per 1,000 males. Kadmat stands at seventh position in respect of population, even though it takes fourth position in respect of area.

As regards the density of population, Kadmat island has a density of 779 persons in 1971. And by 1980 the density of 779 persons in 1971. And by 1980 the density of population of Kadmat island may have reached 972 persons per sq. km. These figures indicate a considerable low growth of density rate and the density rates themselves are much less when compared to those of the inhabited area, as whole of Lakshadweep being 1,214 persons per sq. km. in 1971 and 1,528 per sq. km. in 1980.

As regards the percentage of literacy in this island, it was 48.8% against Lakshadweep rate of 43.66% in 1971. Kadmat island stood second in respect of percentage of literacy in 1971.

#### 2 Education

There were one Nursery School, two J. B. Schools and one High School functioning at Kadmat during 1979-80. The total enrolment in all Schools was 944 (552 + 392) which formed 8.22% of total enrolment in all educational institutions of this territory. Out of 37 teachers 35 were trained teachers.

The teacher pupil ratio in all Schools of Kadmat was 1:26 against that of 1:25 in respect of Lakshadweep.



#### 1. General

Kalpeni island situated at N 10°-05′ and E 73°-39′ lies 76 kms, almost due south of Andrott. The population of Kalpeni island was 3,152 (1,561 males + 1,591 females) making a sex ratio of 1,019 females per 1,000 males in 1971. The projected population of Kalpeni island for 1980 is 3,749 (1,864 males +1,885 females) having a sex ratio of 1,011 females per 1,000 males.


As regards the density of population, it has increased from 1,370 persons per sq. km. in 1971 to 1,630 persons per sq. km. in 1980 against Lakshadweep population density of 1,214 persons per sq. km. in 1971 and 1,528 persons per sq. km. in 1980 respectively.

In regard to the percentage of literacy, Kalpeni island had a rate of 47.56% against Lakshadweep rate of literacy of 43.66% in 1971.

#### 2. Education

There were 4 educational institutions in Kalpeni island during 1979-80. They were one each Nursery School, Junior Basic School, Senior Basic School and High School. The total enrolment in all Schools of this island in 1979-80 was 1,197 (681 boys + 516 girls) which formed 10.42% of the total enrolment of the territory. Out of 58 teachers 52 teachers were trained teachers in these institutions.

The teacher pupil ratio was 1:21 against Lakshadweep ratio of 1:25.





#### 1. General

Kavaratti island situated at N 10°-33′ and E 72°-38′ is the head quarter of the Union territory. This island lies between Agatti and Andrott, but little to the south and 301 kms. from Calicut. The Island is about 6 kms. in length and its greatest breadth is about one km. Total area of the island is 3.6 sq. km. and it occupies third position in respect of area among the group

The population of Kavaratti in 19/1 was 4,420 (2,442 males and 1,978 females) with a sex ratio of 810 females per 1,000 males. The projected population in 1980 is 6,154 (3,311 males + 2,843 females) making a sex ratio of 859 females per 1,000 males. As regards the density of population it has increased from 1,228 persons per sq. km. in 1971 to 1709 persons per sq. km. by 1980. Evidently, as years pass on Kavaratti Island is being more thickly populated than Lakshadweep as a whole.

As regards to literacy rate, Kavaratti has a percentage of 44.37% against the Lakshadweep rate of 43.66% in 1971. Kavaratti stood at 4th position among the group is respect of literacy.

#### 2. Education

There are 6 educational institutions in this island during 1979-80. The only college of this territory is situated at Kavaratti island. The total enrolment in all educational institutions of this island during 1979-80 is 1.863 (1.087 boys  $\pm$  776 girls) formed 16.22% of the total enrolment of this Union territory. Out of 88 teachers 85 are trained teachers.

The teacher pupil ratio in this island is 1:21 against 1:25 of Lakshadweep as a whole.



# Kiltan Island

#### 1. General

Kiltan island lies at a distance of 51 Kms. north east of Amini island and 126 Kms. from Kavaratti on the international trade route between the Persion Gulf Countries and Sri Lanka. The island has an area of 1.6 sq. km. and occupies 8th position in respect of area among the group.

Kiltan had a population of 2,046 persons (1,052 males and 994 females) with a sex ratio of 945 females per 1,000 males in 1971. In 1980 the island population may have increased to 2,600 (1,325 males+1,275 females) having a sex ratio of 962 females per 1,000 males. It has also been observed that population of Kiltan occupies 8th position, the same position as area of the island, among the group throughout the period 1971-80.

As regards the density of population in Kiltan island, it has increased from 1,279 persons per sq. km. in 1971 to 1,625 persons per sq. km. in 1980 against Lakshadweep population density of 1,214 persons per sq. km. in 1971 and 1,578 persons per sq. km. in 1980 respectively.

The percentage of literacy of Kiltan island during 1971 was 41.24% against Lakshadweep rate of 43.66%.

#### 2. Education

There are only 3 educational Institutions in the Island, viz. one Nursery School, one Junior Basic School and one High School. The total enrolment in Kiltan island during 1979-80 is 770 (435 boys + 335 girls) which formed 6.71% of the total enrolment in this territory. Out of 33 teachers 31 are trained teachers.

The teacher pupil ratio is 1:23 against 1:25 in respect of all institutions of Lakshadweep.



#### 1. General

Minicoy island, lies at a distance of 252 kms. from the head-quarter island Kavaratti and has an area of 4.40 Sq. km. and occupies second position among the islands of Lakshadweep in respect of area. This island is the southern most island of the group of islands. The population of Minicoy as per 1971 Census was of 5,342 persons (2,433 males + 2,909 females) making a sex ratio of 1,196 females per 1,000 males. The population of Minicoy may have increased to 6,610 (3113 males + 3497 females) making a sex ratio 1,123 females per 1,000 males in 1980.

As regards the density of population in Minicoy, it has increased from 1,214 persons per Sq. Km, in 1971 to 1,502 persons per Sq. Km. in 1979 against the density of population in Lakshadweep 1,214 persons per Sq. Km. in 1971 and 1,528 persons per Sq. Km. in 1980 respectively.

As per 1971 Census report, Minicoy island stands first in the matter of literacy having 51.03% against that of 43.66%, the Lakshadweep rate.

#### 2. Education

There are four educational institutions in Minicoy island during 1979-80. They are one Nursery School, two Junier Basic Schools and one High School. The total enrolment in all schools of the island is 1901 (1116 boys + 785 girls) which formed  $16.56^{\circ}_{70}$  of the total enrolment in Lakshadweep. Out of 64 teachers 59 of them are trained teachers.

The teacher pupil ratio in all Schools of Minicoy is 1:30 against Lakshadweep ratio of 1:25.


