

#### iii) Headmasters Training

As is the H.M, so is the school. It is the Head Master who is central to all organisational matters in school and creates environment that will bring desirable changes. He will be a model in conducting various activities at the school. His timely action would result in motivating the teachers and students. For providing basic information for effective supervision and administration 3-day induction training was conducted for all HMs.

The Components of H.Ms training package are:

- Objectives of DPEP and interventions.
- School organisation and Administration.
- UEE.
- Responsibilities of H.M.
- Baseline Survey.

- Micro Planning.
- Quality Education.
- Communication Skills.
- Trends in methodology.
- Support from MRCs.
- Support from TCs.
- Assessment Procedures.

#### iv) Chinnarula Sabha

Chinnarula sabha were conducted at Cuddapah, Chittoor and Srikakulam as an experimental strategy to bring out the perception of Teachers about the pupils of primary stage and pupils perception about the Teachers in terms of curricular matters such as Methodology of teaching Class timings, homework, leisure time activities etc.

Children expressed freely in their interaction about the way they were considered in the classrooom context. The sabhas facilitated in

- Collecting Teachers' views about childrens participation in Teaching Learning process.
- Eliciting children's views with regard to school curriculum, method of teaching, home work, leisure time activities etc.,
- Eliciting Childrens views on what makes them to attend the classroom with interest?
- Eliciting opinion of School Committee Members with regard to interest shown by the teachers in academic matters and participation in activities for school development.

#### v) Feed back from Schools

Feed back from 2252 schools is obtained using proformae on

- Functioning of Schools (School Visit)
- Classroom observation
- Functioning of School Committees.
- Functioning of Teachers' Centres.
- Utilization of Teacher's Grant.
- Utilization of School Grant.
- Training needs of Teachers.
- Media activities.

For getting feedback ten teams in each district were constituted. Each team comprises one DRG member, One MRP and two MRGs. The teams visited approximately 120 schools in four days. The feed back is being used in formulating specific activities in AWP&Bs.

#### 2 B) Text Books

Textbooks are being developed basing on the adopted minimum levels of learning. Authors and editors involved in developing a particular book of a particular class are continued for preparing textbooks of different classes in the same subject. The books are field tested before introduction.

New textbooks developed by authors are being tried out by classroom teachers under the supervision of authors after developing appropriate formats for pupils as well as teachers to fill in their observations during tryout. In the light of the feed back, Editorial board along with authors sit together and finalises the draft material.

Books have been developed keeping in view the following aspects

- The syllabus approved by Govt. of A.P.
- MLLs developed by SCERT.
- Child's innate abilities
- Child centred pedagogy.
- Continuous and comprehensive Evaluation of Children.

The special features of the textbooks developed under DPEP are

- To suit to the child centred activity method of teaching and learning in the classroom.
- More space for the child to think and act.
- Multi coloured illustrations.
- Competency based exercises at the end of each lesson.
- Blue print on coverage of competencies for guidance to the teachers.
- Allocation of more pages for child's thinking and for practice exercises.

Studies on the impact of new textbooks developed by DPEP, are conducted. From the reports of MRPs, classroom teachers, teacher centre secretaries and Asst. Secretaries, it is observed that their is a overwhelming positive response from children.

- Final refinement of draft book by Editorial Board from 01.02.2000 to 06.02.2000.
- From 07.02.2000 till to date final processing work began to hand over camera ready copy to the Government Printing Press.

#### II) Class III EVS-2 and Class II Maths.

Draft material for Class III EVS-2 and Class II Maths is ready. The material is to be refined, edited and finalised.

English workbook for Class IV was prepared and developed by Regional Institute of English, Bangalore.

#### 2 C) Vidya Volunteers:

The Government have decided to provide assistance to school committees to engage Vidya Volunteers during the year 1998-99 in order to achieve Universalisation of Primary Education (Andariki Vidya). As such Vidya Volunteers were appointed in primary schools also to assist the regular teachers and to address the adverse teacher – pupil ratio. But no assistance is provided to DPEP-I districts during 1998-99. Appointments were made only in DPEP-II districts Vidya Volunteers are provided to existing primary schools and new primary schools opened under DPEP. For each new primary school one Vidya Volunteer is appointed in addition to one regular teacher.

#### 4) Girl Child Education & Early Childhood Education

#### 1. Training:

A 3-day induction training on gender strategies and ECE was organised from 28.1.2000 to 29.1.2000, at Hyderabad. Three member team from each district attended the programme.

The district incharge along with this district teams imparted training to the DRGs of Phase-I and Phase-II districts at district level.

#### 5. <u>Seminars</u>:

A 3 member state team attended the regional seminar on "innovations in early childhood care and development" from 24<sup>th</sup> to 26<sup>th</sup> Nov' 99 at Chennai and presented a paper.

#### 5. Media

- 1. To bring Awareness about DPEP activities Greeting cards, pamphlets, Posters were printed & supplied to the districts.
- 2. Monthly magazine "Chaduvu" is being for giving published academic support to teachers and children
- 3. To convey the message on DPEP activities, diaries-2000 were published and supplied to MRP, MEOs and other DPEP functionaries
- 4. Documentation of best practices by teachers, School Committee members etc. are being done, compilation of success stories collected from different districts is in progress.
- 5. Newspapers clipping both positive and negative were collected, compiled and analysed. Timely action was taken by concerned sectoral officers against adverse comments.
- 6. To reveal the image of teacher from children "Chinnarula sabha" was conducted at P.S. Gollapalli, Tirupati (R) Mandal, Chittoor district. Teachers parents and villagers attended this sabha. Similar sabhas were orgained in Cuddapah and Srikakulam districts.
- 7. A multi-media package on DPEP activities and best practices was developed
- 8. Video documentation on TLM workshop and field testing of TLM in schools was done.
- 9. Networking with UNDP for development and improving the self-appraisal format of School Committees.

#### 6. Research And Evaluation

The following activities were carried out since September' 99 under the Research & Evaluation Components of SPO, DPEP, Hyderabad till February, 2000.

#### Research studies:

- Monitored the conduct of 22 Research Studies assigned to different agencies viz., SCERT, Departments of Education in the Universities of the State, NGOs, Voluntary organisation etc on matters relating to release of funds, obtaining expenditure particulars obtaining progress reports on the studies and also interim reports through periodical review meetings and workshops. These include six social assessment studies (SAS) being carried out in 5 DPEP Phase I districts and 14 DPEP Phase II districts. The studies are at different stages of progress.
- Reports of 7 Action Research projects taken up by 26 Action Researchers in the 5 districts were received by the State Project Office. The remaining 19 projects are also being monitored for completion and report submission.

- To ensure quality in researches being carried out by external researchers sponsored by DPEP a review team was constituted with 3 experts. The first review meeting was held on 25.2.2000 in which work of 4 researchers was reviewed and further guidelines are provided
- Findings of Research and Evaluation studies conducted by DPEP are being consolidated and analysed to provide feedback to district and state level project management in the preparation of AWP & B for 2000-01.

#### **Social Assessment Studies:**

## Activities conducted after he visit of 10th JRM

Resource Groups constituted at state and district levels for training of VECs and community based bodies like women groups, mothers groups, Self Help Groups etc given further training.

The Resource Groups re-oriented to be responsible for developing implementation strategies based on actual field level experiences. The Resource Group also monitors and evaluates activity progress and direction. The resource group is sub divided into teams based on their areas of specialisation viz. Women Empowerment, Children's Participation, Micro Planning and convergence, though their responsibilities occasionally converge. Awareness and oranisational activities are also within their gambit.

Booklet on opportunities for children's Participation. This is a reference book for forming student's governments, conducting children's fair and workshops, and children's clinics.

Leaflet for awareness on Self help concepts and reference book for Resource Persons on guidelines.

Leaflet and guidebook on formation and organising of women groups.

A audio cassette is in the process of development for awareness on DPEP activities.

Micro- Planning extended to all project clusters in all DPEP districts except Karbi Anglong.

Micro-Projects by communities follows the micro planning exercises.

Formation of Sishu Sadan (Student Governments) in all schools is nearing completion. Precede by workshops/clinics for teachers and functionaries at the block level. Hence each district if not block has a Resource Group to ensure continuation of Children's Participation activities.

Sishu Mela have been conducted in all districts and is nearing completion in most districts. These were preceded by intensive model Sishu Melas and workshops for teacher and Resource persons. Activities for conduct of children's workshops/clinics initiated.

Health Awareness Programmes in inaccessible areas have been followed by intensive follow-up activities by the communities. This includes sanitation programmes.

Formation and revival of village level women bodies like Mahila Samitees and traditional women groups to take up self support activities and undertake social action. This is expected to lead to greater women participation is decision making at the village level and that of creating enabling environment for the Girl Child. These are known as Mother's groups Mahila Samitees. Mahila Jagran Manch, etc. Activities of these groups encompass collective thrift and savings. literacy promotion, income generation activities, entrepreneurship and social action. These groups have been involved in negotiating with garden management to improved school conditions. They have organised enrolment and attendance drives at their own initiatives.

A self help Group movement is being promoted in conjunction with other organisations. DPEP sends a strong message on self help activities towards creating—enabling conditions for the improvement in the status of Primary Education.

Organising the formation and revival of village level women bodies like Mahila Samitees an traditional women groups.

Promoting the Self help Group movement with other like minded organisations with and education focus.

Workshops conducted at various levels on children's participation activities resulting in the creating of effective resource teams upto the grassroots.

Workshops for VEC forums on TL practices and opportunities for community participation. Village and hamlet level awareness programmes and inter-active programmes held for organising rural communities particularly women. Various inputs are shared and conscientization exercises initiated.

Regular interactive sessions with VECs and communities through Resource Groups on schools development.

Training on Health Awareness for Resource Persons, VECs and women groups. Follow up support through convergence with district department of Health and Family Welfare.

Community members (Resource persons0 involved in classroom transactions as volunteer teachers.

Resource person from the community participates in teaching children in the school on various cocurricular subjects that community perceives to be crucial learning inputs. These include agriculture, local folklore, items of culture like wood and cane craft etc.

Community taking up micro-projects like sanitation and health awareness programmes.

Community providing and contributing infrastructure including sheds, thatched houses, buildings space for AS centres, NFE centres, ECE centres and schools.

All civil works related to school buildings and CRCs is being carried out through the VECs Community involved in school decoration and development.

#### Children with Disabilities:

Activities conducted under the integrated Education Component of DPEP Assam.

To fulfil the statutory obligation comply the provision of the central Govt. Act, "Person with Disability (Equal Opportunities, protection of Right and full participation) Act. 1995, and as per directions received from MHRD, GOI DPEP Assam introduced the component of integrated Education for Disabled children from 1998-99 and following activities were done:

- One State Programme Co-ordinator having requisite qualification and experience of working for disabled child in the state of Assam has been appointed in December '98 to look after the component of integrated Education. Similarly, District Level Consultants on IED was also place on Sonitpur, goalpara and Darrang Districts and was oriented including an exposure trip to Andhra Pradesh.
- A State resource Group comprising faculties of SCERT (dealing with disability), Deaf & Dumb School, NGOs (Sishu Sarathi, Shayika, Mon Bikash kendra) faculties of Gauhati medical college has been formed and now fully operationalised.
- District Level Resource Group (12-15 members) has also been formed in three districts (Darrang, Goalpara and Sonitpur) and fully operationalised. In the district, district level Resource group and NGOs are members besides some young, educated and willing to work for disabled child. The group has been given twelve days orientation on the line of thinking of DPEP Assam. Physicians dealing orthopedics, ophthalmology, ENT. mental retardation etc has been associating the Resource group whenever needed.
- A comprehensive module has been prepared for the orientation of VEC, HM BRCC. CRCC and other community members.

- Five clusters from one Block has been identified in all the above three districts for initial implementation of the IED component. Survey for identification of disabled children done in all nine, DPEP districts through House to House survey, held in 1998.
- Medical Camps has been organised in the selected five cluster of the identified Block in the district of Sonitpur, Darrang, and Goalpara) for detail examination of extent of disability of the identified child.
- The number and type of Aids & Appliances to be distributed among disabled children is being worked out and Ministry of Social empowerment & Justice, GOI is being requested (through the Social Welfare Department of GOA for supply the same.
- In the General community Mobilisation Programmes under the component of Community Mobilisation & VEC, VEC members have been oriented on various disabilities and need of special attention towards disabled children.
- The issue of inclusion of At least one parent of child with disability in the Village Education Committee has been taken up with GOA and instructions to that effect has already been issued.
- All the selected Block Resource centre Co-ordinators, Cluster Resource Co-ordinator numbering 50 BRCCs and CRCCs and 151 head teachers under the selected cluster have also been oriented on IED. Special teacher and Resource has been sensitised.
- Five number of school readiness of centres has been planned in each of selected blocks. Already interventions have been initiated in 57 schools of Darrang district, 50 schools of Goalpara district and in 57 schools of sonitpur district.
- > In the Module for Mass Teachers Training scheduled to be held during the current year inputs on integrated Education have been included for general awareness of teacher on IED.
- ➤ Daylong inputs in IED have also been included in the Module for 21 days training of Alternative Schools Workers already completed in May-June /99 and are instructed to include all disabled children in the centres.
- > Daylong inputs on IED to ECE workers.
- A Brochure & Information Booklet on IED has been developed, printed and distributed among BRCCs, CRCCs, and Head Teachers.
- > Bi- Monthly meeting of State Resource Group Members is held regularly to discuss various pros & cons of IED.
- ➤ Under the current AWP&B it has been planned to increase the Target Areas to 2 blocks and 10 clusters in each district, opening of Readiness centers in the targeted areas, disbursement of Aids & Appliances to Identified Children in addition to the training of 150 school teachers for facilitating.

## Activities Conducted since visit of the 10th JRM.

1. **EMIS related issues:** It has been felt that due to certain limitations in the data collection process and its authenticity, a fresh exercise should be initiated for collection of last five years data under the same data capture format. And accordingly while collecting the data for EMIS '99-2000 additional Performa has been incorporate for the earlier years. All the nine DPEP districts have carried out the exercise and the compilation process has started in the districts. The complete exercise of compilation and correction of the database will be over by April, 2000.

On the other hand the final database for the year 1999-2000 will be ready by 15<sup>th</sup> of March for further analyzing and sharing of the same with stakeholders.

- 2. **PMIS related issues:** District and the state representative have attended national level workshop on PMIS. The findings have been shared and accordingly a state level workshop finalisation and development of software is scheduled on the last week of March 2000. Under the process an integrated online mechanism will be adopted for close monitoring from various ends.
- 3. Steps on implementation of a geographical based monitoring system through GIS have also been initiated and digitising the first phase of the system is expected to be over by May 2000.
- 4. As a part of the National IT Policy and the decision to introduce IT education in schools, a Pilot project has been thought for the DPEP-II districts. Under the process it has been decided to select the best school in the district where the necessary IT infrastructure and trained man power will be provided. The project will be in close collaboration of TT and MIS component, resources like computerised Teaching aids and TLM materials with 3D Animation and visual effects will be used to capture the classroom transaction use it as substitute teaching learning mechanism. A detailed introductory with the state and district programme Officers were held at the state level and workshop to develop some modules and model demonstration is though of during April, 2000.
- 5. All the MIS Unit were provided and upgraded with latest configured systems and peripheral devices to take the Y2K issues. A detailed dial up connectivity with the districts and LAN on State Office has been worked out and is in the Verge of completion. The complete integrated on line and off-line and system will facilitate the data and information browsing from various spheres of DPEP structure as per the needs. More over the system will provide and integrated single database source monitoring Mechanism which will avoid the data and job duplicity and will also facilitate in monitoring the interdependent issues by the stake holders and injecting the remedial measures as per the local instantly.
- 6. To have internet connectivity and Home Page has been worked out but due to the unavailability of connectivity from DOT, the process has been delayed and it will be initiated by having connectivity from a private service provider satyam during the month of April, 2000.

- The System Analysts in place. District Programmers are in place except in two districts.
- EMIS Data of 1998-99 of all districts available. Data of 1999-2000 is likely to be completed by March/April
- PMIS software is being developed.
- Student Attendance Management Information System (SAMIS) software has been developed and implementation is in progress for the academic year 2000.

## (k) Micro Planning

- Micro planning is being initiated in Muzzafarpur, Ranchi, West Champaran. Sitamarhi, East Singhbhum, Chatra, Rohtas, Dumka, Bhagalpur, Bhojpur. Gaya, Munger, Vaishali, West Singhbhum and Hazaribagh.
- PRA techniques is used. DRG is constituted in every district to supervise micro planning process which is carried out by facilitators and animators at the village level. An in-house module on micro planning "Prasoon" developed detailing therein the concept, methodology and activities involved. A training module for the Abhipreraks/Prerak developed.
- In every district sufficient number of Abhipreraks/Preraks have been trained. These trained Abhipreraks/Preraks have been engaged in micro planning exercises in one or two blocks in every district. The Preraks are drawn from VECs.
- Altogether 1868 villages have been covered under micro planning which are spread over 29 blocks in 15 districts.
- State level workshop was organised at Patna.
- State Level Resource persons training programme (TOT) held at Dumka on December, 1999.
- Monthly Reflections with Coordinators take place at the State level.

# (N) Tribal

- At the State level the ALS co-ordinator is looking after this component as well. The tribal population resides only in the southern part of the State. These districts are Chatra, Hazaribagh, Dumka, Ranchi, East and West Singhbum. In every district tribal Co-ordinator is in place. BEP team working in tribal areas is well oriented and fully identifies itself with the tribal issues.
- The Community Mobilisation campaigns have been organised among the tribal population.
- Theatre workshops have been organised in Santhali & HO tribal languages.
- Audio-cassettes of educational songs in "Nagpuri" have been prepared and distributed in tribal areas around Ranchi.
- Calender with slogans in tribal languages distributed.
- The tribal people form mainstay of community construction processes in tribal areas.
- The Mothers Committee in tribal areas consist of tribal mothers and run Apna/Angana Vidyalayas.
- Emphasis has been laid in opening up of Apna/Angana Vidyalayas in tribal dominated villages of tribal districts. The ECCE centres have also opened in those areas.
- New schools sanctioned in the tribal areas and started in most of the cases with the help of community teachers called Sahyogis.
- Bridge Language inventory prepared in HO/Mundari languages in Ranchi district. The development of textbooks in HO, Mundari, santhali, Kuru languages in progress.
- Dramas in tribal languages developed. Artists from tribal areas participated in the workshop which aim at capacity building of cultural groups. The cultural groups are participating in awareness campaigns.

- Awareness material on 'Munia Beti Padhati Jaya' campaign developed in the form of calender where slogans in all the tribal languages namely, Mundari, Ho, Kurukh, Khariya etc. have been developed. The calender was distributed in tribal areas.
- In the teacher training, emphasis on sensitisation with the tribal culture is being given.

# **Status and Progress**

- Progress in the filling of the teacher vacancies has been made by Govt. of Bihar. In every DIET established in the Project Districts 3-4 faculty members and one principal has been positioned.
- A month wise implementation schedule has been prepared and being rigorously monitored at the SLO &DLO level. The progress of construction is encouraging.

Most of the CRCs have heen operationalised and CRC Coordinators are providing pedagogical follow-up in the classrooms. All block education officers have been imparted training by SIEMAT so that they are enabled to provide onsite pedagogical follow-up in the classrooms. During inspection the officers are providing pedagogical support to the teachers.

- An implementation schedule for 5 days VEC training has been drawnup by all DLOs and training has been accelerated. The Master Trainers were imparted refresher training in Dec., 99 so that quality in the process is maintained.
- for AWPB for 2000-01 is being formulated. The planning teams are following more analytical and realistic approach as suggested by the JRM.

# Plan implementation and review of Functional Areas

# A. Planning and Management (P & M)

• A fully staffed P & M unit is in place at the State Project Office.

## B. Micro planning

- Micro planning, initiated in a total of 90 villages of three districts on a pilot basis, has been completed.
- Microplanning for 500 villages in all the three districts is under progress.
- Additional BRC Coordinators recruited to assist BRC Coordinators, as a move to strengthen the BRCs.

#### **Draft Proposal Plan for the new districts**

DPEP is to cover 6 more districts i.e. Jamnagar, Junagadh, Sabarkantha, Kutchh, Bahavnagar and Surendranagar. The District Draft Plan and the State Draft Plan are under preparation. Both the Plan Proposals are using Participatory Planning process and Documentation method. The districts have submitted the first Draft report at SPO on Jan.31, 2000. The district core team has prepared the AWP & B for 2000-2001 (First year). The State Core Team has visited the districts, in February 2000, to discuss the proposal, apprise the plan and to provide the necessary guidance. The Final District Draft Plan will be submitted to SPO by March 5,2000. The State Draft Plan which is under preparation will be ready by March 15,2000. Financial documents such as, (1) Preliminary Costing, (2) Procurement Plan and (3) Updated Finance Study, etc are under preparation. March 31, 2000 is the deadline for the submission of the Project Implementation Plan (PIP) to the MHRD, New Delhi.

#### C. Community Mobilisation

- The VECs, MTAs, PTAs have been meeting regularly.
- Orientation cum training programme for VEC, MTA, PTA members was organised in Oct Jan. 2000 at village and school level in Banaskantha.

- Panchmahals and Dangs districts. More than 70,000 VEC, MTA and PTA members were trained. During this programme they were oriented on how they could organise enrollment drive and work towards 100% enrollment.
- They were oriented on other thrust areas of the project, e.g. education of the girl child, SC/ST children, disabled children, etc. The concept of alternative schooling was explained to them. They were also trained on preparing village mapping and school improvement plan. The local CRC Coordinators provided the training support.
- 'Chaudhary Mahila Jagruti Sammellan' was organised at Dhanera block of Banaskantha on Jan. 20,2000. Around 6,600 community people attended the sammellan. The aim is to build community opinion in favour of primary education and education of girl child.

# D. <u>Pedagogy/Teacher Training/ Textbooks</u>

- The Ravi Mathai Institute for Educational Research, Indian Institute of Management, Ahmedabad, undertook the evaluation of the new textbooks (March-July, 1999). The suggestions and recommendations made by them are being processed so that they can be incorporated in the next print (i.e., June, '2000).

• New text-books for std. I, which were being introduced during the previous quarter, elicited tremendous response and favorable feedback from academicians, primary school teachers and parents. Taking into account the enthusiastic response, these new textbooks have been introduced in all the schools of Banaskantha, Panchmahal and Dangs. Statewide introduction will be done, during the academic year 2000-2001, the costs of which will be borne by the Government of Gujarat.

- The new text-books for std. II, which are undergoing trial since June 1999, are expected to be introduced in all the schools of Gujarat by the Year 2000-2001, the costs of which will be borne the Government of Gujarat.
- Gujarat State Board of School Textbooks (GSBSTB) and Gujarat Council of Educational Research and Training (GCERT) are preparing the new textbook for Std. III, which may be put into trial in 2001-2002 in those schools where the text books of std. II & I were tried out.
- Flash cards and English Work Book (Part I & II) for Std. V. have been developed by the Key Resource Persons (KRPs). These have been under trial in 40 selected schools, under DPEP districts, since January 2000. These will be ready for introduction in all DPEP schools by June 2000 after incorporating the necessary changes. Voluntary educationist, Greta Jackson from England along with H. M. Patel Institute of English, Vallabh Vidyanagar assisted the process.
- The second phase training of newly appointed Vidya Sahayaks (VS), as per the training schedule, was held. In a 6 days long training programme around 3,200 vidya sahayaks were trained. The Master Trainers (MTs) ware trained first, who, in turn, imparted training to VS at the cluster level. Many important aspects such as, TLM preparation, use of TLM in classroom transaction and concepts like DIET, GCERT, DEP, etc were taught in this training.
- The Key Resource Persons (KRPs) trained 3 expert teachers belonging to the Cluster Resource Group (CRG), at the block level, in all three districts. They were trained on preparation and effective use of TLM in classroom transaction who, in turn, will train the teachers at the cluster level.
- During Sep-Nov.'99 one day workshops on Quality Achievement and Retention were held in Banaskantha, Panchmahal and Dangs, where 23 BRCC, 23 Add.BRCCs and 482 CRCCs were trained. In these workshops, issues such as, retention and quality achievement were discussed. The suggestions of the participants were noted and strategies prepared which the CRCCs would be implemented by the CRCCs.
- A ten days residential programme was organised at the Varahi Training Centre in district Banaskantha from Nov. 21-30, 1999 to orient the Master Trainers who in turn will train the English teachers of Std.V. Around 40 participants from all the three districts participated in these workshop. Greta Jackon, the voluntary educationist imparted training.
- A teleconference on 'How to prepare Teaching Learning Material' using 'no-cost' and 'low- cost' materials, was organised at ISRO, Ahmedabad on Oct.6, 1999. Around 1500 teachers, Head Masters, BRC, Additional BRC and CRC Coordinators from both DPEP as well as non-DPEP districts participated.
- A teleconference on 'How to use Flash Cards and newly developed English Work-books for Std.V was held on Dec. 10, 1999 at ISRO, Ahemdabad. Greta Jackson made the presentation. Teachers, BRC and CRC members from both DPEP and non-DPEP districts participated in this conference.
- A series of TLM workshops were held during Nov.-Dec., 1999 in all the three project districts to train the teachers on how to prepare TLM and put them into effective use.
- From Jan. 1-30, 2000, around 200 Master Trainers were trained in an intensive training programme organised at Din Dayal Institute of Land and Survey, Gandhinagar. The key resource persons included Greta Jackson and experts from various educational institutions of Gujarat. These MTs will train the English teachers of Std.V, at the block level, during summer vacation (My-June).

- A 3-day workshop on preparation of Module of Multigrade Teaching was organised from Nov.3-5, 1999 at Warahi, dist. Banaskantha. Multigrade teachers of all three districts participated in the workshop.
- A 6 days residential training programme was conducted at Warahi training centre in district Banaskantha from Nov.25-30, 1999. The training oriented and equipped 60 teachers who could face the Multigrade situation effectively.
- Awareness material on Multigrade Teaching for teachers, BRC and CRC Co-Ordianators has been developed. The production of Audio and Videocassettes is underway. The context would be demonstration lessons of handling classes, concept and practices of Multigrade Teaching etc.
- A total of 10 Multigrade schools were provided with infrastructure. An additional classroom for each of these schools is under construction.

## E. <u>Alternative Schooling</u>

- AS centres for girls have started. In Banaskantha 5 and Panchmahal 15 AS centres for girls have opened providing access to 2099 students.
- Under the Back-to-School programme 500 centers in Banaskantha, 500 centres in Panchmahal and 100 in Dangs are targeted during 1999-2000. At present the total no. of AS centre is a total 870, i.e. 375 (B.K.), 454 (P.M.) and (41) Dangs. The programme has provided access to 20122 students.
- In Dangs during the Bridge Course for Alternative Schooling, 1726 pupils joined the course, 1442 appeared the examination out of which 1240 were successful.
- A total of 34 AS supervisors for supervision and monitoring of AS Centres have been appointed at a ratio of 20:1. They have completed 10 days of residential training at VAV AS-training centre district Banaskantha from January 1-10, 2000.
- This second phase of in-service training for AS teachers has been started at Vav from Jan.1, 2000 and by February, 100 teachers have completed training.
- The AS training centre of Halol in district Panchmahal has become operational since January 2000. A total of by March 2000, a total of 243 AS teachers, in three batches, have already completed their training; out of which 82 are females.

#### F. Media and Documentation

- The monthly issues of Prathmik Shikshan Sarvani, the magazine for DPEP functionaries and primary teachers of the project districts regularly published from State Project Office.
- To provide continuous educational support to ICDS, and social welfare Balwadis, a monthly Gujarati periodical "Balmandir" was launched since Oct.1999. The periodical covers support materials, like, health and nutritional articles, articles on activity based learning, 'Balgeet', stories gender issues, flash cards and fictions are some of the regular features. The 6<sup>th</sup> issue has already come out. At present, the circulation has reached 7,000.
- The progress report for the 10<sup>th</sup> Joint Review Mission was prepared at the State Project Office. The comprehensive report with colour photographs and glossy, art- cover pages are also an in-house production.
- On November 24, 1999 honorable Prime Minister of Netherlands, Mr. Wim Kok, with a large delegation, visited the Warahi AS training Centre in district Banaskantha. Both Videography and Photography have been used to cover the

event. This event has got coverage in both national and local dailies i.e. Times of India, Gujarat Samachar, Sandesh and Gujarat today, respectively. Door Darshan and Akashvani also covered the event.

- Annual Report, 1998-99 was prepared and sent to MHRD, New Delhi.
- Major events, Seminars and Workshops were projected through Newspapers and Doordarshan.
- Major processes and events under all the interventions in DPEP were documented. Photo and Video documentation were done.

#### G. Gender

- Mahila Sangam, which is an innovative scheme for Gender education, under DPEP that has been implemented in Dist. Dangs, has been yielding encouraging results. The review meeting, organised on Oct. 26 '99, at Saputara in Dangs, revealed the progress of the scheme as under:
  - 100% enrolment
  - AS centres identified and 7 of them have already been started.
  - The selected Mahila Sangam Volunteers have been presently undergoing training for teaching of AS centres.
  - A total of 144 girls have been enrolled.
  - 20 children reenrolled under 'Back-to- School' programme.
  - A total of 46 irregular children have been regularised.
- In 'Focus Area' village schools of dist. Dangs, Std.V has been started. As a result of which a substantial number of dropout children have been re-enrolled. The figure is awaited.
- At present there are 15 ECE-AS centres in Panchmahals and 5 Centres in Banaskantha districts have become fully operational. The training of both the ECE and As workers have been completed.

- Gender sensitization training for teachers has been imparted. The training of female teachers of both Banaskantha and Panchmahals have been completed. In Dangs, Master Trainers were trained during March 1-2, 2000 and by March 11,2000, all the female teachers will be trained.
- The Mahila Sarpanches and Panchayat members in district Panchmahal will be given gender sensitization training during March 13-16,2000. The training will be conducted at the CRC level.
- During Dec '99. -Feb '2000, a total of 6 mahila Jagruti Sammellans were held in gender focus areas in Panchmahals.
- Chaudhary Mahila Jagruti Sammellan was organised at Dhakha Village of Dhanera Block in district Banaskantha on Jan.20, 2000. Chaudhary Community is educationally one of the most backward communities of Banaskantha with a female literacy of 10.72%. To convince and motivate the community women on importance of primary education and education for girl child the sammellan was

- organised. Around 7000 people participated in the sammellan and solemnly pledged to send their children to school.
- In 'Focus Area' villages, another 8 mahila jagruti sammellans will be organised by the female CRC co-ordinators, at their respective CRCs, by the end of March 2000 in Panchmahals.

# H. <u>SC/ST/Minorities</u>

- A handbook on tribal education has been prepared and supplied to all the schools in tribal areas of project district.
- A training programme was conducted for Master Trainers on Module preparation.
- A total of 432 Tribal AS- Centres have been opened enrolling 9745 students out of which 4880 are girls.
- In an effort to improve the quality at the tribal AS centres 200 Flashcards i.e Figure Cards and Counting Cards have been developed. The figures and pictures are being depicted in these cards in both Gujarati and Local Ville and Dangi dialect. These printed cards have been distributed in all the schools.

## I. <u>Disabled Children</u>

- SRG in place.
- IED Coordinators at the district level in place
- A workshop for preparing IED modules was held from Dec.20-24, '99. In this workshop Resource Teachers and Non-Governmental Organisations working with disabled children participated.
- Post of Resource Teachers for all the 23 blocks have been sanctioned and appointment will be made in April 2000.
- On February 10, 2000, a one-day workshop on Learning Disability was organised at Tulip School, Bopal, Ahmedabad. It was basically an awareness workshop for teachers, principals and educational administrators of Gujarat dealing with learning disabilities. At present there is no organised effort to tackle the problem of Learning Disability. In this backdrop, DPEP Gujarat felt the need to share the innovative techniques and skills with Maharashtra Dyslexia Association, an-NGO, supporting Maharashtra Education Department in helping children with Learning Disability. It has been a learning experience for the participants.
- Teachers training module for all the four disabilities have been developed. These modules will be printed and distributed in schools soon.
- A technical consultant has been appointed in DPEP-cell to assist IEDC cell.
- Provision of ramps in new schools.
- Parents of disabled children in VEC.

# Preparation of Self Instruction Materials (SIM)

• Six Self-Instructional Materials (SIM) for teachers on Mathematics. EVS. Language, Activity Based Teaching, Community Mobilization, Classroom Management etc are ready for printing and will be distributed among teachers.

# ACTION TAKEN REPORT ON THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF 10TH JOINT REVIEW MISSION (JRM) AND 2ND IN-DEPTH REVIEW MISSION (JRM) OF DPEP - HIMACHAL PRADESH

The 10th Joint Review Mission cum 2nd In-depth Review Mission of DPEP had visited Himachal Pradesh w.e.f. November 12-30, 1999. The following steps have been initiated on the recommendations of the Mission.

## Aide-Memoire recommendations:

1.

- (i) Timely release of funds to the State societies:
  - The Govt. of India had released a sum of Rs. 5,00,00,000/- on 6.4.1999 followed by another release of Rs. 10,00,00,000 on 4.11.1999.
  - The state Govt. of Himachal Pradesh released a sum of Rs. 87,76,000/- on 20.4.1999. Another release of Rs. 1,72,71,000/- was made by the State Govt. on 11.2.2000. The Directorate of Primary Education has moved another case for the release of Rs. 1,76,47,059/- to the HPPES to the Administrative Department and it is likely to be released in the month of March 2000.

## (ii) Strengthening of the training modules and materials:

• The recommendations have been shared with the districts and District Institutes of Education and Training (DEITs). SPO has taken an initiative to build the capacity of DIETs, BRCCs, and CRCCs to address the issues of multilevel multigrade situations in the schools and also to introduce continuous comprehensive evaluation at the primary level. Addressing the multilevel and multigrade situations with the help of interventions in the filed of curriculum content and process, time tables and teacher training has been identified as a major thrust area for 2000-2001. Efforts are also being made to identify and strengthen academic support teams at the cluster and block level. The districts have also started to focus on the preparation and use of content specific TLMs instead of routine TLMs prepared during training workshops.

## (iii) Development of context specific strategies to ensure education of comparable quality for all children on a sustainable basis.

• The problem of street, working and migrant children is not very severe in the DPEP districts in Himachal Pradesh. However, the recommendation has been shared with the districts with the direction to evolve context specific strategies where ever required. Keeping in view the remoteness and the topographic features like steep climbs, glaciers, avalanches, dense forests, torrential rivulets etc. 177 alternative schools have been notified by the State Govt. to be established during 2000-2001.

#### (iv) Sustainability Studies and Institutional Planning for DIETs:

• The State is yet to take up the sustainability study for DPEP, it will be conducted during 2000-2001. With the launching of Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan by the Govt. of India the sustainability of the DPEP interventions will not be a problem in the State. The SPO has also planned to initiate institutional planning for the DIETs in DPEP districts during 2000-2001.

## (v) Refining the strategies for ECE component:

• The State Govt. has notified for the establishment of 158 ECCE centres in the DPEP districts of Himachal Pradesh vide its notification number EDN-C-A (1)2/2000 (DPEP) dated 8th March, 2000. Convergence meetings with the Secretary and Director of Social and Women Welfare Department was held on 21.12.99 wherein it was decided that the ECCE centres will be established in the DPEP districts as auxiliary centres of existing ICDS centres to increase the coverage of beneficiary children. ICDS will provide for nutrition and immunisation in these centres and preference will be given to absorb these auxiliary centres during expansion of ICDS programme in the DPEP district. The possibility to develop model ECCE/ICDS centres will be explored in the locations where surplus accommodation is available in the primary schools and services of ICDS Supervisors will also be utilised for ECCE centres. The recommendation regarding continuity in approach with regard to curriculum transaction from pre-primary to primary education has been shared with the districts for compliance.

# (vi) Research and appropriate actions to ensure that the disadvantaged children particularly girls, SC and ST get equitable opportunities for participation and learning.

• The MAS study conducted for DPEP districts in Himachal Pradesh during October-November, 1999 has revealed that in most of the instances the girls have out performed boys. Further the differences in learning achievements among the girls and boys; and the social groups are not very significant. However, the districts have been advised to take up teacher sensitisation with specific focus on equitable opportunities for participation and learning among the deprived and disadvantaged children.

## (vii) Rationalisation and improvement in the use of Data:

• To improve the reliability of DISE data collected in respect of Himachal Pradesh 5% sample checking was taken up in two districts in 1998-99. The sample checking has confirmed the reliability of data. During the collection of DISE data for 1999-2000 special emphasis was laid on the training of concerned staff. The DISE reports are also generated after consistency checks. The DISE data collected so far has been analysed and used during annual planning. The districts have been advised to share the 1999-2000 data with the schools, clusters and blocks. Efforts are also being made to devise processes to integrate the findings of micro planning exercises with Annual Workplan and Budget.

## Himachal Pradesh State Report Recommendations:

## (I) Incidence of high repetition in classes I to IV and strategy to reduce the same.

- The recommendation has been shared with the districts; and they have been advised to address this problem effectively.
- The analysis of class wise repetition rate at the primary stage for the last four years is also being shared with the districts so that they are able to address the issue in proper perspective.
- The SPO has initiated steps to sensitise the districts towards the issues of pupil evaluation with focus on continuous comprehensive evaluation. The issues of stagnation and wastage are also being discussed with the districts resource groups.
- The capacity building in the introduction of continuous comprehensive evaluation of children at the primary level has been identified as a major thrust area for 2000-2001.
- The education policy provision regarding pupil evaluation at the primary level have been shared with the districts and they have been advised to sensitise general teachers in this regard.

## (ii) Pedagogical renewal in the multigrade context;

- Capacity building in effective handling of multigrade situations in the schools has been identified as a major thrust area for 2000-2001.
- The groups working on curriculum development and content renewal have been sensitised towards the issue of multigrade situations in the schools. Efforts are being made to develop the content and process of curriculum in such a manner so that it is able to facilitate effective teaching learning in multigrade situations.
- The revised and updated teacher training module also lays stress on capacity building for handling multigrade / multilevel situations.
- The SPO has also initiated steps to sensitise the districts resource groups towards the handling of multigrade situations.

## (iii) Anchoring of DPEP activities in SCERT and DIETs.

- In order to sensitise DIETs and SCERT towards DPEP interventions they were actively associated in the State level presentations and wrap up meeting during the visit of Joint Review Mission.
- The SCERT has constituted a DPEP cell to take up the DPEP interventions. Capacity building of the cell is in process and the members have started participating in the DPEP initiatives.
- With a view to decentralise further and involve the district level institutes the core groups on curriculum development with major contribution from the DIETs have been formed and sensitised in Sirmour and Kullu districts, to take up curriculum development in the field of mathematics and EVS respectively. A similar core group for the development of curriculum in Hindi has been constituted at DIET Solan (Non DPEP DIET). The text book renewal for the classes 3,4 and 5 in these subjects will also be taken up by these groups.

- The DIFTs at Chamba, Kullu and Sirmour conducted the teleconferencing in February 2000 on the role and functions of CRCCs in which all the CRCCs. BRCCs and DIET faculties participated.
- Institutional planning for DIETs is also scheduled to be experimented at least in two DIETs in 2000-2001.
- Kullu district has initiated a novel process for the effective involvement of DIET in DPEP activities. All the BRCCs come to the DIET in the last week of every month to discuss and sort out the academic problems faced by them during the month. They also finalise the next months training programme with the DIET resource persons in this meeting.

- 34122 teachers trained in phase I districts. 6 days per training from 1.4.98 to 31–1–2000.

- Resource persons at the state level train the BRC faculty who in turn train the teachers. DIET faculty are nominated as nodal officers.

#### `Nali-Kali'

• Multi level and Multigrade teaching approach on the lines of HD Kote experience has been extended to one Block each in 4 DPEP-I districts. Teachers handling 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> standards of these blocks have been trained on preparing T-L materials for ladders of Level 1 and Level 2. Workshops for review of T-L materials have been conducted in all the four districts during January, 2000.

## ii. Work books and Supplementary Material

- Activity based textbooks, workbooks and guidebooks introduced in class I-IV in Kannada. Urdu/Telugu, Tamil and Marathi medium in language, Maths and Environment Studies.
- Development of similar material for class V is complete and under trailing.

## 7. Plan Implementation Review of All Functional Areas

## (a) <u>Pedagogy</u>

#### (i) Teacher's Training

## • <u>Coverage</u>:

- In 98-99, 66430 teachers in 19 phase-I districts & 57404 teachers in 15 phase-II districts have been given 12 days training. Additionally, 8182 gurujis of EGS schools have been trained in phase-I and 8303 in phase-II districts.
- In 99-2000, 32060 teachers of phase-I districts and 20808 teachers of phase-II districts received 5 days training on class V TLM.
- Under Quality Watch programme, 27515 gurujis of EGS Schools (16279 of phase-I & 11236 of Phase-II) received 12 days training on the TLM developed for Alternative Schools which is being implemented in EGS Schools.
- 450 Alternative School supervisors were also trained during this year.
- 7335 teachers of Shishu Shiksha Kendra and Jhoolaghars were also trained in the year 1999-2000. The District Resource Persons and the Gender Coordinators who imparted this training were also trained at Pre Primary Teachers Training Institute, Jabalpur.
- Based on the analysis of Baseline Evaluation results which was done in Jan-Feb.'99, every district through its academic group and teachers developed their own training module in order to find solutions to district specific problems being encountered in classroom transactions. The AS and EGS teachers were then trained based on such training modules.

## • Monitoring and training:

The monitoring of the AS, EGS and primary schools was entrusted to the cluster academic coordinators and the supervisors of the Alternative Schools. From the last academic session of 1999, the pedagogic approach of Alternative Schools were introduced in the EGS Schools. The CACs were found unaware of this new pedagogic approach and the books which gives emphasis on non-graded system of teaching-learning according to the child's own pace. In addition to this, some of the issues which came out through the monitoring done by the personnel of State Project Office are:

- i. The Gurujis were found to be not competent enough to prepare the lesson plan and maintain the Guruji's diary and its analysis.
- ii. Preparation, maintenance and use of learning record was not properly done.
- iii. Jan Shikshaks (CACs) were not able to give proper guidance to the Gurujis on academic issues as they themselves were unaware of these issues.
- To address all these weaknesses, two fold strategies were administered:

## 1. Training of Jan Shikshaks:

• Keeping all these issues in mind, it became imperative to orient the Jan Shikshaks on the mentioned issues. For this, a module was developed at the state level by the above State Academic Group of SPO. In the first round 457 resource persons were given training at the district level for three days by the State Academic Group of SPO. In the second phase, Jan Shikshaks from all the DPEP districts imparted training for three days at the block level.

## 2. Strengthening of monitoring system by the formation of District Academic Groups (DAGs) and Block Academic Groups (BAGs):

- As an academic support system, an additional group at the state as well as at the block level has been formed. The objective of this group formation was to build a support system for the Jan Shikshaks, Supervisors as well as the Gurujis.
- The BAG comprises of four members including the BRC Coordinator of the concerned block, selected Jan Shikshak, teachers and the Supervisors at the block level.
- The BAGs were entrusted the responsibilities to monitor the EGS Schools, find out the academic problems faced by the gurujis and give them academic support accordingly. They also have the responsibility of giving academic support to the Jan Shikshaks and the Supervisors.
- Likewise a District Academic Group was also formed at the district level comprising of the DPC of the district, EGS incharge from the DIET and selected BRC Coordinators.
- The DAG is entrusted the responsibility of finding out the academic weaknesses of the district, analyse the weaknesses, prepare the training packages to address these weaknesses and to impart training to the gurujis.
- The DAG was given two days field based training by the Academic Core Group of SPO. The BAG was also given a two days field based training by the DAG at one of the clusters of the district.

#### • Focus:

- The training focussed on teaching-learning materials of classes I-V.
- Khoji Guruji Concept is the unique scheme to get better academic results in the schools. Under Quality Watch programme, the teachers and gurujis of AS & EGS. by doing a regular research (khoj) on their teaching method will now be able to know the class specific problems being encountered in day to day classroom transaction and they themselves will choose the right options to resolve their academic problems by finding the appropriate solutions.

## • <u>Action Research:</u>

- Under Quality Watch, an Action Research programme was initiated in four districts namely- Betul, Raisen, Rajgarh and Shahdol. Thirty schools in one of the blocks of each district comprising of ten Primary Schools, ten Alternative Schools and ten Education Guarantee Schools were taken for Action Research programme.
- The objective of the programme was to train the teachers with reflective practices in some of the educational activities, such as, Teaching Learning Materials. Teachers training, classroom transaction, achievement of children etc.
- Prior to launching the programme, a series of meeting were held with John Shrotten in Dec '98, Bridge Smith (19-20 July) and Vandana Mahajan.
- The academic group of SPO developed a training module entitled "Guruji Banenge Khoji" which focussed on reflective practices, Teacher's Diary, Case studies. identification of problems, analysing the problems, developing the suitable strategy for addressing the problems.
- Two orientation programmes for the Core Groups of each district were held during 4-5th and 6-7th August '99 in which DPCs, BRCCs CACs and teachers participated. The core groups further conducted orientation programmes for the teachers of identified schools with the assistance of the members of SPO. These programmes were held during August and September '99.
- As a follow up of the Action Research programmes, two review meetings of two days duration each were held in SPO during 22 to 29th Nov '99. The teachers and the core group members of each district participated in the review meetings.
- The review meetings helped in understanding the message that has gone across the identified group of the teachers regarding the Action Research and the work that the teachers have done during the last two months. The teachers reported the case studies, reflections on their school, the problems faced by the teachers during their day-to-day work and the strategy which they plan to overcome the problems.

## (ii) Textbooks/Other Supplementary Materials:

- Textbooks for class I-IV under 'Seekhna Sikhana Package' had been introduced in all the schools in June 1998. Textbooks for class V have also been introduced in 1999.
- Supplementary teaching learning material for tribal students in district Jhabua in their local dialect has been prepared and is being introduced.
- All the eight series of textbooks of AS approach have been revised for the coming session i.e. 2000-2001.

- Text books for class V of Seekhna Sikhana Package will also be revised as per the AS approach and will be tried out in the coming session in the EGS Schools.
- Action has been initiated for developing Self-Learning Material for better classroom transaction.

## (iii) Alternative Schooling:

- In all, 5112 AS centers and 17733 EGS schools are functional both in phase-I and phase-II districts.
- 7598 AS teachers and 332 supervisors in DPEP-I districts and 1599 teachers and 76 supervisors in DPEP-II have been recruited. All these teachers and supervisors have been trained for 21 days on the AS pedagogy.
- Similarly, all the EGS teachers have also been trained this year for 21 days on AS pedagogy.
- State AS coordinator is in position.
- State Resource Groups and District Resource Groups have been formed.
- The Alternate Schools pedagogy is now being applied to all EGS Schools so that they are in a better position to handle multi grade child based learning.

# (b) Community mobilisation (including training of VEC members and other community leaders)

- All the 35081 VECs in 19 districts are operational. Formation of 24408 VECs in the expansion districts has also been completed. All the VECs have been given orientation on school management last year.
- In those habitations where AS and EGS schools are running, School Management Committees have been formed with the local panch as its chairman and guruji/teacher of AS as member secretary, besides parents and community representing SC, ST groups and women. In this connection, total number of 22845 SMCs have been formed.
- The Institutional Reforms of School Management recently approved by the State Government have also strengthened the VECs. On the one hand the constitution of VECs which previously was through nominations have been made elective while on the other hand the VECs have been brought further close to the schools by making then habitation based. Substantial powers have been delegated and quite a number of functions have been added so as to make school more accountable to the VECs.
- IEC materials like posters, handouts brochures have been developed and are being used for VEC training and mobilisation.
- Mahila Shiksha Abhiyan was taken up in 1997 and again in 1998 and is also going on this year to encourage out of school and unenrolled girls to come to the school with the active involvement of local Panchayat representatives, teachers and guardians.
- Lok Sampark Abhiyan-II, a participatory exercise is being conducted to develop school education plan that will be consolidated at cluster, block and at district level to form the district education plans. This will form the basis to plan for UEE.
- A workshop has been held from 6th to 9th March '2000 in which expert from state and district participated. The strategy for participatory microplanning or Lok Sampark Abhiyan (LSA) and orientation of VEC & SMC was reviewed and consolidated on the basis of the past experiences. Training modules for VEC.

training module for involving community and VEC in participatory microplanning, training materials, revised formats for Village Education Registers have been finalised in this workshop.

• Based on this finalised material, training of VECs will be organised. The LSA-II will be held between April-June '2000.

## (c) Micro-planning:

- State had initiated door-to-door survey of children in the age group of 5-14 years through the Lok Sampark Abhiyan in 1996-97 and again in 1997-98. The exercise involved micro level information gathering and planning for the requirements in the villages. In the current year, the LSA is covering the children of 6-14 age group and door-to-door contact is going on in the EGS & AS village/habitations of 34 DPEP districts.
- The Village Education Registers in 25000 habitations covering over 12 lakhs children have been updated.
- Three rounds of Shiksha Panchayats in 6296 clusters have been conducted with a view to bring the school related problems into community focus by using the available Panchayat structures for education related problems solving.
- Large scale Institutional Reforms for the education sector is being approved. The reforms attempt to bring School Management close to the community by involving the members of the Panchayats responsible for school planning, management and development.
- Locally relevant strategies to bring 'out of school children' into the school and their retention.
  - LSA-II is presently being planned to be held between April to June 2000 in all the districts so as to plan for "Education For All" on the basis of village specific needs. The Lok Sampark Abhiyan-II would also form the basis for preparing elementary education plans for each district.
- Based on the data generated through Lok Sampark Abhiyan, the Mission came out with the Education Guarantee Scheme (EGS) for providing schools in accessless habitations.

#### (d) Media

- Weekly publication of 'Panchayat Gazette' focussing on Mission activities being mailed directly to all villages/habitations of the state.
- Continuous publication of Mission activities and achievements on monthly basis in the SCERT magazine called 'Shaikshik Palash'.
- Preparation of audio cassettes on classroom transaction and teaching methodology of Maths, Language and Environmental study for teachers and students during the workshops held under Distance Primary Education Programme, DPEP, SCERT and IGNOU.
- Short introductory film 'Neev' made by Madhyam on EGS schools.
- A programme 'Shiksha Paati' has been started to establish direct contact with clusters and schools. For this, a separate post box number has been given to all the teachers and gurujis to write about their problems and achievements direct to SPO. Directly mailing to select teachers every week on a specific theme to elicit their response is also being done through this.

- Various publications and brochures being developed at cluster/block levels in the districts
- Formation and distribution of audio cassettes of educational songs to the districts and block headquarters on Republic Day.
- Production of five educational films on the basis of teleconferencing held in the month of January '2000 and also the production of other 14 short educational films.

## (e) Gender:

- State Gender coordinator/District gender coordinators are in position except in districts Bilaspur, Rajnandgaon and Panna in Phase-I districts and Damoh, Seoni and Raipur in Phase-II districts.
- During July-August 1998, a special enrolment drive called Mahila Shiksha Abhiyan II was organised focussing enrollment of SC/ST girls and also in the current year, the MSA-III is going on in the DPEP districts.
- 30% posts are reserved for female teachers.
- 4008 Shishu Shiksha Kendras (SSKs) have been established in Phase-I districts.
- 287 Jhoolaghars are functional in Phase-II districts. The posts of teacher and helper are reserved for females.
- Mahila Samakhya is operational in three districts of Phase I namely Raisen, Rajgarh and Mandsaur and in two districts Seoni and Shivpuri of Phase-II.
- 282 Sahayoginis in DPEP-I & II districts have been put into place at selected clusters for bringing gender related issues pertaining to education into clear focus.
- The Teaching Learning material prepared under the Seekhna Sikhana package and the Alternate Schools pedagogy have been screened for its gender sensitivity.

## (f) SC/ST/Minorities:

- 21 Ashram schools of tribal children are functional in Phase I and 73 in Phase II districts.
- Convergence with Tribal Welfare Department for Ashram Schools achieved.
- In the year 96-97, 7 Madarsas were started in district Ratlam on pilot basis in which 419 children of minorities are getting primary education along with Dini Taleem (religious education).
- For Muslim minorities (specially girls) scheme of "Modernisation of Madarsas" has been launched this year in 7 districts of Phase-II namely Bhind, Dewas, Jhabua, Khandwa, Morena, Seoni and Shivpuri by introducing the state curriculum including Urdu, Maths, Hindi and Environmental study in 547 Madarsas. The main aim is to modernise Madarsas by incorporating in them the features of curriculum so that they are able to mainstream their education while keeping the basic features of 'Dini Taleem' (religious education) intact. This is with a view to make Madarsas professionally more relevant and practical for student.
- Training of Madarsa teachers have been done on Seekhna Sikhana Package this year.

#### (g) Children with Disabilities:

#### (Integrated Education for the Disabled Children)

There are 10.39 million disabled children in the 5-14 year age group (POA 1992) out of an estimated 202 million children. Thus accounting for about 5 percent of the elementary school going population. This is a sizeable number that can not be overlooked if the goals of universal elementary education are to be achieved by the turn of the country. It appears that quantitatively educational coverage of this group will not be fulfilled by the small number of special schools. Moreover the qualitative aspect of special educational practices is not satisfactory. It often creates various physcho-social disadvantages in case of disabled children (Dunn. 1968). Disabled children have not only deficiencies but are also equipped with strength and vigour. It is felt that 90% of the disabled children can be educated in regular schools (UNICEF, 1982).

#### Incidence of disability in Madhya Pradesh:

A state wide survey to estimate the number of disabled in Madhya Pradesh was conducted in the year 1981 with the assistance of UNICEF. On the basis of this survey, 67.707 (32%) visually handicapped, 25,500 (12%) hearing handicapped, 1,02,211 (49%) Orthopaedically handicapped and 12,474 (6%) Mentally handicapped; thus, a total number of 2,07,692 handicapped have been reported. Since the Survey was undertaken about 15 years ago, the number of handicapped persons must have gone up now with the increase in population, changing values in social order and increasing mechanical and accidental problems.

With special reference to the State of Madhya Pradesh, on the basis of census of 1991, 4.6% of total population of 6,61,00,000 about 30,40,600 persons are handicapped. It include 12,16,240 Orthopaedically handicapped, 4,56,090 visually handicapped, 4,56,090 mentally handicapped, 3,04,060 hearing handicapped and 6,08,120 suffering from epilepsy, fits, leprosy and other mental problems.

Total number of disabled children (5-14 years) in DPEP districts in M.P. State is 64,861 in which 56.28% are boys and 43.72% are girls (LSA-1996).

Disabilities are variously classified as locomotion, visual, speech and hearing. Here we have concentrated on the following types of disabilities selected on the basis of "guidelines for Integrated Education for the Disabled Children" (DPEP Guidelines).

- 1. The orthopaedically handicapped children.
- 2. The visually impaired children.
- 3. Hearing and speech impaired children.
- 4. Learning disabled children.
- 5. The Mentally retarded children.
- The State has selected 1 block in 19 districts for coverage under the IED scheme.
- At present, IEDC scheme with 58 trained special teachers is in place in 6 DPEP districts.
- The State has a core group that functions as SRG.
- Survey has been done with the help of Panchayat and Social Welfare Department in all districts.

- A Disabled Children Assessment Camp was organised in Rajnandgaon district by RGPSM in collaboration with the Red Cross Society and Panchayati Raj Department.
- Parents of disabled children included in VEC.
- In Tikamgarh district, special initiatives have been taken by the District Project Director for bringing handicapped children in the mainstream. Under "Chunauti" scheme the district administration has secured an assistance of Rs. 2.5 lakhs from Central Assistance Aid for the handicapped children under Ministry of Social Welfare, GOI. With this fund 250 calipers and 90 tricycles have been provided to the school going handicapped children of the district. Apart from providing physical aids, an assistance of Rs. 150/- per month is being given to the handicapped children, who are regularly attending the school from the State Government scheme of "Nirashrit Pension".
- The Mission has also established a cell for handicapped children at all the BRCs. This cell would collect database of the handicapped children attending the school and monitor the progress of these children throughout their schooling tenure.
- In order to improve the functioning of the existing IEDC scheme, the Mission has decided to get its essential features, its usefulness and its impact appraised. The appraisal will be done by the joint team to be drawn from the offices of SCERT, DPI and other related organisations. Based on such evaluation, a comprehensive strategy with required modifications will be evolved and would then be implemented by pooling in resources available for this activity under various governmental and non governmental programmes.
- The district core group has also been requested to do the same exercise and come out with their own models both for major and minor disabilities. The districts have also been given freedom to implement their chosen model atleast in a cluster or group of clusters so that large scale replication in future becomes easier.

#### Identification of disabled children:-

- The mission has identified:
- The disabled children in the age group (5-14) years in the State.
- Out of school children with special needs so that they can be brought into regular schools.
- Disabled children from amongst the school going children in ordinary school in order to retain them as they are the potential drop outs of the system.
  - This was done by the school teacher along with the VEC/Panchayat members of the concerned village.
  - The Mission has identified 5 NGOs working in the field of disability to work in 10 districts. The NGOs have been assigned the task of preparing a contextual teacher's training programme on IEDC based on which they will provide training to 25 selected teachers in a block. These teachers would act as a Resource Group for giving training to other teachers in future. The field visits are currently being done and the training would be taken up in June-July 2000.

#### (h) Distance Education:

- State plan for Distance Education has been prepared.
- Distance Education has been included in AWP&B 1999-2000 for both DPEP-I and II districts.

- State Resource Group constituted.
- Workshops involving teachers, CACs, Media persons, teacher educators, gurujis, and DIET persons were organised in 5 DPEP districts viz. Vidisha, Rajgarh, Shivpuri, Shahdol and Mandsaur. In these workshops about 115 video and 8 audio cassettes were screened/played so as to decide upon the cassettes useful for wider dissemination. Such selected material will then be used during training programmes and monthly meetings of teachers.
- SCERT has been using the medium of All India Radio for monthly broadcasting and problem sharing. This broadcasting will be held on the first day of the every month has proved to be very useful for the upward and downward movement of information/ideas related to the schooling. The broadcasting also coincides with the monthly meeting of all the teachers within the cluster at the CRC.
- Two round of teleconferencing with the Cluster Academic Coordinators and the State has been organised. This has been done by using the broadcast facility available at the State level and the reception facility available in the DIETs at the district level. Teleconferencing has proved to be very useful in disseminating inputs to the CACs and the other resource persons at the district level on the one hand and getting their feed back and suggestions on the other hand.
- After monitoring the Education Guarantee Schools some hard spots were recognised without eliminating which the desired aim of children's achievement cannot be fulfilled. To make understand these hard spots, the State Project Office of Rajiv Gandhi Prathmik Shiksha Mission had organised a satellite teleconferencing programme on 4th and 25th January '2000 for Gurujis and Jan Shikshaks (CACs) of Education Guarantee Schools. This programme was telecasted each day in all the 45 DIETs with the help of ISRO, Ahmadabad. About 100 Gurujis and 20 Jan Shikshaks in each of the 45 DIET of M.P. imparted this special training. Following points were made clear in the training programme:

### Language:

- 1. Importance of lesson plan and group teaching.
- 2. Activities on listening, speaking and reading.
- 3. Process of writing and
- 4. Activities on developing writing skills.

#### Maths:

- 1. Easy way of learning mathematics.
- 2. Activities for proper understanding of numbers.
- 3. Activities for learning addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.
- 4. Concept of space and activities on geometrical figures and
- 5. Activities on values by using different coins and measurement etc.

#### • Environmental Studies :

- 1. Importance of preliminary activities and also
  - Importance of guruji Diary.
  - Method of recording and
  - Learners record and continuous evaluation was explained.

• On 21st and 22nd February '2000, again a recording of a programme was done in New Delhi with the help and coordination of Indira Gandhi National Open University on following topics:

#### Language:

- 1. Reading with correct pronunciation.
- 2. Dictation.
- 3. Listening, speaking and making the stories with the help of pictures and
- 4. Glossary of words and grammar.

#### • Maths:

- 1. Place value.
- 2. Addition and subtraction.
- 3. Multiplication and division and
- 4. Standard Units.

#### • Environmental Studies:

- 1. Observation.
- 2. Measurement.
- 3. Classification and
- 4. Experiment.

In this way, to help understand clearly the hard spots, six modules in Language, three modules in Mathematics and three modules in Environmental Studies are prepared for Gurujis with the help and coordination of DEP- DPEP personnel. These training modules have been recorded in the cassettes which will be used in the forthcoming training programmes.

#### (i) MIS:

#### DPEP-I

- The State Project Office (SPO) and all the District Project Offices (DPOs) have a fully operational MIS.
- The State Project Office is fully staffed. The DPOs also have one programmer and two Data Entry Operators each, expect in Sehore, Rajgarh and Raigarh where the post of programmer is vacant. The process is going on to fill the vacant posts.
- EMIS data for DPEP-I districts for 1998-99 received and transmitted.

#### DPEP-II

- Out of 15 districts, the programmers are in place in 12 districts while the process to appoint programmers in districts Jhabua, Khandwa and Raipur is going on.
- Hardware is in place in all the 15 districts.
- Manpower is available in all 15 districts to operate MIS.
- The State is implementing three kinds of soft wares for its Management Information System:

- The Integrated Project Monitoring System has been used for monitoring the key activities under the project. The data is collected right at the school level and gives updated information pertaining to adequacy/inadequacy of the key inputs pertaining to the schools.
- The Lok Sampark Abhiyan has been used as a People's Information System for getting village level information pertaining to the enrolment and out of school children.
- The Education Management Information System gives the stock information about the school and the various components associated with the schools.

### Research / Evaluation :

i)

- The EMIS analysis has been completed till the year 1997-98.
- The draft report of "Impact Evaluation of DPEP" has been prepared.
- The survey to collect data for "Learner Evaluation and Impact of Classroom process and practices" has been completed and the analysis of the collected data is in process.
- Data is being collected so as to do attendance monitoring in sample districts.
- More than 30 studies have been conducted by independent agencies to evaluate the Primary schooling innovative and community based initiatives -Alternative school and EGS School in M.P.
- Districts have also conducted over 20 studies in the area of Gender, SSK, and Tribal Education.

#### <u> Civil Works :</u>

#### DPEP-I

An expenditure of Rs. 115.16 crores has been made against the total plan of Rs. 118.96 crores in phase-I districts while in phase-II, the total target was 99.02 crores out of which 67065 crores have been spent till January '2000.

• The State has also come up with a document titled "NEEV". "NEEV" is an effort to use alternative technology for bringing down the costs of construction. The alternative

designs and material suggested in "NEEV" has brought down the unit cost of the school buildings from Rs 2 lakhs to Rs 1 lakh. The 1317 buildings being constructed this year under DPEP-II have used the suggested technology and designs.

"NEEV" also includes the methods for improving the outside space enclosing the school by developing them as activity centers. Many districts have come up with such activity centers in the state.

#### (1) School Grant / Teacher Grants:

• The State has released school grants to 35142 schools during 1998-99 under DPEP-I. Similarly under DPEP-II, 24156 schools have received school contingency while in the year 1999-2000, the contingency of Rs 3000/- has been disbursed to 59237 schools of phase-I & II districts. TLM grants to school teachers have also been distributed.

#### 1.1 Systemic Issue:

- Teachers vacancy Position
- All vacant teacher's positions have been filled. Most of the Shiksha Karmis have been recruited and are in position.

### 1.2 Functioning of DIETs:

The staff position in the DIETs across the districts is highly unsatisfactory. The current status of staffing in DIETs is as follows:

• Rest of the vacant posts have been abolished.

#### Achievements:

- SCERT has developed new textbooks for classes I to V. Teachers training modules have been developed by SCERT.
- To bring about the quality improvement in the working of DIETs, a committee has been constituted under the chairmanship of Principal Secretary, School Education. The committee is examining the present structure and working of DIETs and would give suggestions for qualitative improvement pertaining to the management and

academic issues of DIETs in the state. The first meeting of the group has been held and draft recommendations have been put up.

### Concerns:

• Linkages with the SCERT, DIETs, BRCs and CRCs need to be strengthened.

# Functioning of SIEMT:

- As per the decision of last Executive Committee, the SIEMT now works as a separate cell in SPO under Rajiv Gandhi Prathmik Shiksha Mission.
- The State Academic Coordinator for SIEMT has been taken on deputation. He along with his core team of lecturers, Programmers and Data Entry Operators has operationalised the SIEMT.

#### 1.5 Impact of DPEP Experiences on the overall system:

- Text books developed for Classes I and V have been introduced in the entire State.
- **Teacher Training Modules** developed under DPEP being imparted to all the DPEP and non-DPEP districts.
- Decentralisation of printing The printing of text books for EGS schools has been decentralised from the last year in which the Mission has authorised the districts to print and distribute the books on their own to all the EGS and AS schools on time. This decentralisation has saved the cost and has also created accountability among district functionaries towards timely supply of books to the children. As a result of this operation,
- Books have reached all the children on time.
- Costs have been saved to the extent of Rs 1.53 crores last year. Out of which, Rs 1.03 crores have been saved in printing and Rs 0.50 crores in transportation.
- Universalisation of Elementary Education The RGPSM has converted the primary education into a Mission Mode in 1994 and after having worked on this Mode for the last 5 years, the State Government has recently initiated wide ranging Institutional Reforms.
- On 30th September 99, the government of Madhya Pradesh has issued instructions for the Institutional Reforms. The main aim of this to give momentum as well as a Mission Mode programme and management to the activities of Adult Education and School Education upto middle level. This Mission Mode working is to be developed at district, block and cluster level alongwith the state level.
- The new structures are being developed by redefining the tasks of existing organisations and reorganising resources. This will make the programme more economical.
- At the state level, now there will be Rajya Shiksha Mission, to provide technical and administrative support to literacy programme and the school education upto the middle level. This Mission will be able to increase the community participation to involve the public representatives in middle education and literacy programme and to mobilise financial resources.
- In addition, the management of these programmes has been decentralised upto the village level. A Jan Shiksha Kendra at the Cluster level to be created all across the state and would be used as a hub for integrating activities at this level

of converging academic resources and panchayat leaderships. Since a major issue in management of elementary education relates to quality, the management of DIETs has been decentralised and brought laterally under the districts.

#### 1.6 Innovations:

- The State had experimented with the alternative pedagogy so as to provide non-graded schooling system based on the children's individual pace of learning. The textbooks and the supplementary teaching learning material for the alternative schools have been prepared and put to use. Based on the encouraging response and the impact of the pedagogy on the learning achievement of the students, the pedagogy has been scaled up to cover the Education Guarantee Schools as well.
- In order to get the first hand information from the villages pertaining to the needs and aspirations of the people and children towards primary education an alternative people's information system called Lok Sampark Abhiyan have been put into place in the State. The Lok Sampark Abhiyan as a micro planning exercise has been able to provide the feed back pertaining to the out of school children on the one hand and it has also been able to throw light on the schooling gaps on the other hand. LSA has also been used as a strategy for updating Village Education Registers and bringing the elements of community focus and pressure to push out of school children into the schooling fold.
- Based on the feedback of large scale primary schooling gaps which came from LSA, the State initiated a demand based community centred schooling initiative wherein the State acknowledged the right of the children to primary education. The scheme titled Education Guarantee Scheme has been instrumental in enabling the State to provide universal access to primary education to all its habitations within one km.
- The state has also embarked upon the innovative strategy for modernizing the Madarsas curriculum. Under this the State entails to incorporate the elements of modern education besides keeping the basic features of the Deeni Talim intact. This has been a successful experiment of using orthodox social process for a modern education programme.
- The project of 15 Sahayoginis at the cluster level in the selected block in each district is being implemented in order to bring gender related issues into critical focus at the cluster level.
- In order to stimulate the creative energies of the students by providing them an environment which enables learning by doing, the State has embarked upon a programme for creating Activity Centers in order to fulfil the ecological, cultural, recreational and physical requirements in a school. The Activity Centre would enable the students to creatively express their ideas and views and would make classroom learning more enjoyable and would improve the achievement levels of the students.
- The State has also taken on the task of improving the school building and their designs so as to enrich them functionally. The school building design has been transformed from the point of view of making them fit into the changes which have come about in the academic designs of the primary school during this year. By using the alternative building technology, the State has been able to come up with cost effective solutions to school building without compromising on the

- availability of space and other construction features. The State is planning to use the alternative structure as a case for wider replication in the longer run.
- The state has also decentralised the printing of textbooks pertaining to EGS school this year. This innovative experiment have been an eye opener and resulted in the timely distribution of the text books to the schools on the one hand and effecting huge reductions in the printing and the transportation costs on the other hand. The State also innovated by digitalising the contents of the text books and then transmitting them to the districts thereby ensuring 100% error free text books.

#### Pedagogy **(b)**

#### *(i)* **Teacher Training**

During the first two rounds of teacher training, the basics of activity-based methods of curricular transaction following this method in early two grades (Grades I and II) in mono and multi-grade situations were mainly addressed. The problems of children belonging to disadvantaged sections of society in the school and in the classroom transactions were included.

In the third round of teacher training during 1999-2000 the main themes are:

- Reinforcement of management of classroom processes with special focus on children of disadvantaged groups.
- Curricular transaction of contents of classes III-V in activity-based approach with the development and use of contextual TLMs.
- Learners' evaluation

The extent of training of teachers in the three rounds is as under:

#### (ii) Reinforcement Activities

To reinforce the training and classroom activities the following efforts have been made:

- To remove the difficulty of planning activity-based teaching on curricular topics particularly in higher grades eight booklets, four for each of the grades IV and V have been developed and are now being printed. These are expected to be distributed among teachers of all primary schools by April 2000 so as to enable them plan and transact classroom activities right from the commencement of next academic session.
- A news letter for sharing innovative ideas on classroom practices has been drafted and is likely to reach the schools by April, 2000.
- Selected 360 Block Resource Group members from the eight DPEP districts were exposed to a tele-conferencing programme on activity-based teaching learning process on 14-15 January, 2000 conducted by the Pedagogy Unit in collaboration with DPEP, IGNOU, New Delhi.

#### (iii) Strengthening Resource Groups

- Faculty members of the DIETs and Secondary Training Schools (ETTIs) have been included in CTTs and District Resource Groups. The members included in the DRG have been in trained activity-based participatory methods of teaching and training, monitoring school activities and providing academic support.
- District Resource Groups having 15-20 members in each group comprised of faculty members from DIETs of STSs, SIs, BRC Coordinators, Headmaster of Primary Schools have been constituted. These groups have been imparted five days' training on activity-based methods of teaching learning.

#### (iv) Developing the Monitoring and Academic Support System

- Major thrust during the year has been on posting and empowering the Cluster Resource Centre Coordinators which have been selected based on their experience.
- A training package was developed by the CTT members in collaboration with Pedagogy Unit of the State Project Office, and the TSG (pedagogy) of Ed.CIL during 18-27 January, 2000. Through this package efforts have been made to sensitise CRC coordinators through participatory approach.. Problems of children belonging to disadvantaged groups have been targeted and ways have been devised to provide academic support to this group.
- The training of all the CRC coordinators in position is expected to be completed by 20<sup>th</sup> April, 2000.
- Training of all faculty members of DIETs/STSs in monitoring, academic support systems and building resource bases in the districts has been scheduled to be held during April-May, 2000.

#### (v) Curriculum and Text Book

There is a growing need to revise the text book for primary education in the ligh of new pedagogy. Accordingly a meeting under the Chairmanship of Commissioner cum-Secretary, S & ME Department was held which was attended by SPD, Director and Faculty members of SCERT, EFA & intervention heads of SPO. In the meeting it was decided to develop activity based text books upto Class III and make it available in DPEI District from the academic session 2000-2001, In developing the scripts, gender and tribal bias is to be removed both in the scripts and in the illustrations. It was also decided to give emphasis on contextually in the text. The task will be completed by May-June 2000.

#### (vi) SC and ST Education:

- Completion of Attitudinal Training in remaining tribal populated Blocks.
- Sustaining attitudinal issues in BRC/CRC through workshops and meeting. Guidelines have been provided to field functionaries. All DPEP districts have started this activity.

- Preparation of Tribal Language Training Module for non-tribal teachers is completed.
- Preparation of Saora Primer.
- Supplementary reading materials (tales/riddles) for tribal area teachers and children have been prepared.
- A state level workshop was organised for identification of problems and issues on education of SC children in DPEP districts, where major issues were discussed. Participants were from eight highly SC populated Blocks from 8 DPEP districts.

#### (c) Planning & Management:

#### Planning:

- Officers and staff of SPO, SIEMT, DPOs and BRCs are oriented in a workshop on Effective Programme Implementation with the resource persons from DPEP Bureau. GOI, NIEPA, TSG of Ed.CIL, New Delhi at Bhubaneswar.
- Micro Planning completed in six districts and is in progress in rest two districts. Location of new schools are now available through Micro Planning and action has been initiated to open new schools.
- The AWP & B for 2000-2001 is being prepared.
- District functionaries attended workshop on plan preparation at DPEP, Calcutta.

#### Management:

Management of the primary schools by the community members has been the concern and for this providing professional resource support is being aimed at in the DPEP.

The activities undertaken by DPEP in the State are in three broad areas.

- (i) Empowerment of the Village Education Committees in school management.
- (ii) Institutional management
- (iii) Effective Supervision System.
- Three-day Training for the VECs is almost complete in all the DPEP districts.
- Workshop for review of Training of VECs and the training modules was conducted during 16-18<sup>th</sup> September, 1999.
- The detail of the improved training module on VEC has been decided.
- Review of training module on effective supervision completed and printing of module is in progress.
- Module on training for institutional management is finalised and printing is in progress.
- Training of DRC (VEC) has been conducted during December, 1999.
- SPO plans to promote participatory planning process in villages. Focus will be on preparation of Community Action Plan for villages by the Villagers. This operation is

expected to take 15-20 days for a G.P. Reconstitution of VEC is also planned to be made a part of this programme.

#### (d) Access and Alternative Schooling:

- Govt. of Orissa sanctioned the opening of 734 new schools.
- Govt. of Orissa has created 1468 posts of teachers for these schools.
- 694 new primary schools have been opened and 741 teachers have been posted in these schools.
- Scheme of A.S. for unserved habitations developed and submitted to Govt. of Orissa for approval.
- District resource groups (AS) have been constituted for all the DPEP districts.
- 380 AS centres have been opened in unserved habitations.
- 5 day induction training of ASIs commenced from 7.1.2000.
- Supplementary reading material booklet has been developed at SPO for ASIs in a 7 day workshop.
- Input has been provided for the development of CRC Coordinators training module for supervision, monitoring and on site support to Alternative Schooling Instructors.
- The draft AS instructors' training module has been revised at SPO in a 5 day workshop. The module is scheduled to be tried out form 27<sup>th</sup> March to 5<sup>th</sup> April, 2000 at Dhenkanal DIET.

#### (e) Media and Community Mobilisation:

Community mobilisation and participation has a vast area of operation. Its ultimate aim is to sensitize the community so that the country will take up the ownership of primary education system. To administer the activities and monitor the progress under CMP the following in built system is developed:

- At the State Level Cores Group is formed to aid advise on Media and similarly mobilisation activities as well as to provide required resource support.
- Similarly, DRG and BRGs are formed at district and block level.
- The BRGs are trained in CMP activities, so that they can organise the Block and Cluster level CMP activities and monitor them.
- MTAs are formed in each village taking women representatives of the village alongwith village school headmaster to organise the mothers and to get their participation in school management.
- VECs are trained to take managerial responsibility of village level educational institutions.
- District, block and cluster level conventions are organised to get feed back from the people on project operation and suggested measures for improvement.

#### Activities undertaken/planned:

i. State Group Meeting – September 20, 1999

- ii. Strategy Building Workshop on Community Mobilisation. Activities from 7-9 October, 1999.
- iii. State level Workshop DPEP RPI Interface from 28-30 October, 1999.
- iv. Review of Activities on Media & community mobilisation in all DPEP districts (April & May 1999)
- v. Organisation of Special Enrolment Week (July 15-20)

#### (f) Girls' Education and ECCE:

- Two rounds of CEC training have been completed. The gender issues have been duly taken care of in the training of VEC members by way of inclusion of appropriate training materials.
- MTAs have been formed in all most all villages of the 87 blocks. With a membership
  of about 8-10 members in the Executive Body, the Association itself comprised all
  mothers of students in the school, all teacher of these schools, PRI representatives of
  the village, Anganwadi workers, Social Activist in the village and lady members of
  the VEC.
- A 2 day training package has been prepared to orient MTA on their need, role and responsibilities in educating girls of the village.
- A group of Master Trainers in the Districts have been trained to orient the MTAs in the five villages of each block.
- The package was tried out in Dhenkanal district before finalisation.
- Teachers are being sensitised in third round teacher training programme regarding teachers attitude towards girls education. Behaviour of the teachers towards girls while classroom transaction is going on, and teachers role to mobilise the parents for sending the girl child to school regularly.
- Free Text books have been regularly supplied to all girls children.
- Celebration of girl child week at the village level.
- Training to BRC Coordinators on the gender issue in the context of promoting girls' education.
- Formation of Core Team to promote girls participation in schools.
- Two day orientation of Resource Persons for the Training of Master Trainers on Preschool Education.
- Training of Master Trainers on Pre-school Education has been conducted. 146 Master Trainers have been trained.
- The Training of A.W. Workers on pre-school education has been organised. A format for supervision and monitoring has been developed.
- Procurement of Pre-school Education Kit in process.
- 1045 number of AWWs have been trained for 10 days on pre-school education in 8 DPEP districts.
- Training modules have been printed and supplied to districts for distribution in 7382
   AWCs and ICDS functionaries.

#### (g) MIS

- Computer installed at State Project Office and DPOs.
- DISE has been implemented in all DPEP districts.
- National level workshop on "Dissemination of DISE data for effective planning & progress Monitoring" conducted at Puri.
- PMIS data collected and compiled manually as per the format provided by Gol.

#### (h) Research and Evaluation:

- Four Research proposals are identified and agencies to conduct the Research Projects are being finalised to conduct evaluation/impact studies.
- To build capacity at institutional level in Action Research, a module on Action Research Methodology was developed and reviewed. The module is again field-tested before a group of participants drawn from the DIET/ST schools. Printing of the module is being done.
- 23 short-term Research projects are conducted through the faculty members of DIET/ST schools. Research abstracts are prepared and will be printed and shared by the district and state level functionaries.
- District-wise meetings on monitoring of the Research and Evaluation activities were held at the SPO to evaluate the Research proposals and preparatory activities to be done at the district level.
- Four studies finalised and will be commissioned through the DIET faculty members of Keonjhor district.
- A study on "Causes of Low Enrolment and Retention of SC Children" will be undertaken by the R & e wing of SIEMT.
- To promote capacity to undertake Action Research among the practitioners and the primary school teachers, a module on "Action Research Methodology" was developed. It has been reviewed twice and filed tested during a workshop. After printing of the module, District level Master trainers will be oriented on the module.
- To monitor the research activities at the district level, a state level meeting was held where the district project teams, which include on faculty member from the DIET/ST school concerned and District Tribal Co-Ordinator, were invited for identification of district based research projects.
- Two day workshop on developing areas for institutional linkage has been organised and recommendations are also placed before the Govt. for appraisal.
- Initiatives are also being taken to commission research studies through external agencies like Universities, Xavier Institute, Ed.CIL, etc.

#### (i) Distance Education:

Distance Education unit of the State Project Office works in close collaboration with the Distance education programme of IGNOU, New Delhi. The following activities have been undertaken:-

Productions of Distance Learning Materials.

- Self-Learning Materials (SIM) on content hard-reports for teachers as identified through the need assessment have been developed entitled "Ekalavya" on three areas i.e. on Language, Mathematics and Oriya.
- These SIMs have been integrated in the training Block Resource Group in Pedagogy and to all schools of Gajapati districts on trial basis.
- Production of audio materials
- Twelve audio scripts on hand spots of content have been developed and are ready for production.
- Eight programmes produced by SIET, Bhubaneswar on community mobilisation gender equality, teaching learning process, TLM were adopted, modified and have been produced along with its user manual. It was used in teacher training programme during the third round.
- Five programmes have been identified for Video production.
- The first teleconferencing programme in the DPEP Orissa was held on 14-15 January, 2000. It was telecast from the studios of IGNOU at New Delhi. The programme was conceived prepared and conducted by the CTT team of the pedagogy unit of the state with direct assistance from DEP-DPEP, IGNOU, New Delhi.
- To build capacity for writing scripts, participating in the programme functions at the teaching and learning ends and the follow-up activities were developed in two workshops conducted.
- Teleconferencing programmes on different aspects of pedagogy, community mobilisation, education of SC & ST children, girls education, etc. are being planned on regular basis.

### (j) Integrated Education for the Disabled Children (IED)

To ensure that every child with disability has access to free education in an appropriate environment till they attain the age of 18 years, the following activities are proposed for achieving this goal:

- Door to Door identification survey of disabled children.
- In school survey of disabled children by the Special Teachers, IED.
- Enrolment of children with disability in the local primary schools and Anganwadi centres
- Developing linkage with order allied institutions/departments for support services and convergence.
- Awareness generation and community mobilisation and participation in planning for the children with disability through VEC, MTA Mandals, etc.
- Capacity building (Primary School Teachers Anganwadi workers) and Resource support (academic and non-academic).
- Training of DRC & Special Teachers on Planning and Management of IED.
- Monitoring of IED at District level.
- Orientation of DPCs, DPOs, BRC, SI of Schools, ICDS Supervisors, CDPOs, on IED component clubbed up with other interventions.
- Procurement and maintenance of special aids and appliances.
- Curriculum Modification (if required)

- Reform in Examination system.
- One day orientation of parents of disabled children and 5 days training of teachers.
- Appointment of special teachers.

- SIEMT is not yet registered as an autonomous society and is a part of SPO.
- Planning Department of SIEMT prepares plans for SPO and provides source support to District planning teams in plan preparation. One Asst. Director takes care of Micro-Planning for SPO.
- Educational Management Unit of SIEMT takes care of VEC training and other institutional management issues.
- One Research Associate is there to take care of research and evaluation wing.
- SIEMT officers and staff are engaged in plan preparation of existing and proposed expansion districts under DFID support.

#### (a) Pedagogy - teacher training (since project startup)

#### 4. Review of Functional Areas

#### 1. Pedagogy:

#### (i) <u>Teacher Training:</u>

During 1997-98 & 98-99, out of total number of 51596 primary school teachers. 51236 teachers have been trained under the "Shikshakodaya Training programme, which was formulated with the assistance of DEVNET, Patna, Bihar. This first round of teacher training was motivational and aimed at sensitizing teachers towards their roles responsibilities, basic issues in primary education particularly education of disadvantaged groups and girls, community participation, better school management etc.

The package for second round of teacher training "SABAL" was developed by SRG training, field trialled and finalised. Trainers were identified from among the teachers and training of trainers was organised by SRG. This round is focussed on teaching learning process, learning language, Maths and issues, classroom transactions, use of teaching learning material activity based teaching learning etc. It was more focussed on 'Maths' particularly keeping in view, the newly introduced textbooks for classes 2-3. A two day inbuilt followup programme and strategy regarding follow up of teacher training was also incorporated in the package designed for BRC, NPRC coordinators. This year teacher training is decentralised and is being organised at Block level under academic supervision of DIETs. 32583 teachers have been trained so far.

#### (ii) Curriculum and textbook development:

Curriculum for primary classes (I-V) has been revised and new textbooks have been developed based on it. Maths text books for class 2 & 3 have been introduced from July, 1999. Rest of the textbooks are targeted to be introduced from coming session i.e. July 2000. Teacher handbooks for Maths textbooks (Class 2-3) have been developed. Teacher handbooks for rest of the textbooks are also planned to be developed. Language & EVS textbooks for classes 1-3 had been field trialled in 99-2000 in six linguistic regions of U.P. & modifications carried out based on relevant feedback. The books have been approved by the UP Basic Shiksha Parishad on 6.3.2000 and are undergoing printing for state wide use in the July academic session. The textbooks for classes 4 & 5 are at the finalization stage. The curriculum has also been supplied to all schools after a monthly segmentation, so that teachers can use it effectively.

## (iii) BRC - NPRC:

Out of 215 BRCs and 2109 NPRCs 213 BRC coordinators and 1945 NPRC coordinators are in place respectively. BRC & NPRC coordinators have been oriented towards their roles & responsibilities through a 5 day training package "Samarthan". DIET BRC - NPRC linkages are also being strengthened through school visits, monthly meetings etc. In continuity separate workshops are being organised for a selected team from each district comprising of DIET faculty. District Coordinator (training) BRC & NPRC coordinators. These workshops are aimed at planning and managing academic supervision of different levels in the district. Detailed guide lines, checklists, plan of action are developed by the participants of the workshop.

## (iv) DRG-DIET

- A District Resource Group for Pedagogy has been notified in all the 15 DPEP districts. This group is being strengthened and made functional.
- The staffing position of DIET in DPEP districts may be seen at Annexure-III. Efforts are being made to fill vacancies in DIETs.
- Academic Resource Group (ARG) is constituted in DIETs and it helps in reviewing planning & implementation of programmes.

#### 2. <u>Alternative Schooling:</u>

1047 AS centres have been opened to date with a total enrolment of 36785 including 19306 Boys and 17479 girls.

In Firozabad district 03 wards of Firozabad city have been selected for the primary education of child Labour and out of school children in 1st phase having SC and Muslim population majority. In these three wards 24 centres are in operation having 618 children including 323 boys and 295 girls.

In Moradabad city, a survey for identification of child labour and out school children has been conducted with collaboration of Labour Deptt. UP. In Moradabad City 15 AS centres are running in which 196 Boys, 258 Girls i.e. total 454 children are enrolled.

In Sonbhadra and Lakhimpur Khiri 51 Rishi Valley Model based AS centres are running in scattered and remote habitations. At present 1581 children including 967 boys and 614 girls are enrolled in these centres.

A 30 days training for instructors of Bal Bodh Kendra (AS for working children) in Firozabad has been conducted by CREDA, Mirzapur.

In Block Birdha (District – Lalitpur) after 3 days short catchup camp, a 90 days long term bridge course camp was organised for the working children and out of school children with the help of MV Foundation, Hyderabad. 75 children, 47 boys and 28 girls participated in the camp. After completion of camp, 41 children were mainstreamed in primary schools and 17 children mainstreamed in upper primary schools.

Training programme for Shikshaghar, Prahar Pathshala and Maktab / Madarsas have been organised with the support of "Nalanda" Lucknow.

# 3. Community Mobilisation

- 11,996 VECs out of 14,659 Village Education Committees conducted their meetings. 277120 VEC members and other enthusiastic community members of 13,856 VECs have been trained.
- Proposals of NGOs for community mobilisation were invited through advertisement. Desktop appraisal has been completed and field appraisal is going on for selection of eligible NGOs.

# 4. School Mapping and Microplanning

• There are 14,659 VECs out of which 13,856 have been trained. Around 14,440 villages have completed the Microplanning. Village Education Plans have been completed for 11,260 villages.

#### 5. Children with Disabilities

- Two blocks of each of the five district viz. Basti, Sidhartha Nagar, Sonbhadra, Bareilly and Hardoi have been selected for Integrated Education under DPEP. A total of 18,773 disabled children (12,389 boys and 6,384 girls) have been identified through the survey. In Bareilly district, District Coordinator (Integrated Education) has been appointed.
- A voluntary organisation, Shikshit Yuva Sewa Samiti after approval from the World Bank has started work for integrated Education in four blocks of Basti & Siddhartha Nagar (2 blocks in each district). 798 children with disability have been integrated in Basti and Siddhartha Nagar.
- 892 disabled children have been integrated in general schools.
- 41 Master Trainers of the above five districts have been trained. 912 primary school teachers have completed five days training.
- To ensure increasing participation of NGOs, 2 additional NGOs were selected through desktop and field appraisal for Bareilly and Hardoi. Proposals have been sent for the approval of World Bank.

#### 6. *MIS*

- Hardware with UPS and software is in place in all the project districts.
- Systems are fully operational.

- Data entry operators are in position 13 districts.
- EMIS reports for 97-98 have been generated for all districts.
- EMIS reports for 98-99 have been generated for 14 districts.
- EMIS reports for 99-2000 have been generated for 10 districts and entry work is in progress in the remaining districts.
- Analysis of EMIS reports has been done for the year 97-98 & 98-99.
- PMIS is being generated regularly. PMIS for the quarter ending Dec'99 has been submitted.
- Computer personnel of SPO and DPOs have been trained twice in this year.

#### 7. Free Text Books distribution

Free text books were distributed to 2434309 children studying in 1 to 5<sup>th</sup> class including SC/ST boys and all girls during the year 1999-2000.

#### 8. Distance Education

- Distance Education Co-ordinator has been appointed at SPO.
- Planning meeting has been organised to develop a plan for distance education for DPEP districts.
- 24 video programme have been identified from programmes produced by SIET, Lucknow and NCERT.
- 16 content briefs have been developed for preparation of scripts for audio/video/print material.
- Action has been initiated for development of distance education model for Bareilly and Badaun districts.
- Meeting with the Distance Education experts and pedagogy unit of SPO held to identify areas for teleconferencing.
- 3 difficulty areas and 2 contextual issues identified in teacher training Package II by SRG (training) for video illustration.
- Content-brief on 1323 difficulty areas and 2 contextual issues developed by by SRG (training), video scripts ready.
- 11 SIM developed[ seven finalized, ready for printing.
- Video documents of 'Sabal' in 2 parts (20 minutes, 19 minutes) ready for duplication.
- Newsletter enrichment workshops held for DIET lecturers responsible for publication of DIET Newsletter.
- Five SIM on hard spots in Mathematics e.g. concept of zero, place value borrowing & Carryover, Fraction, large difficulties in mathematics prepared and suitably illustrated to be used in teleconferencing for TOTs.

#### 9. Gender

District gender co-ordinators are in position in 14 districts. SRG & DRG have been constituted for girls education & ECCE S.R.G. is meeting quarterly and helping in planning & implementation. Generic/integrated as well as specific interventions are being adopted for promoting girls education. Curriculum, text books revision & development in the gender perspective has been made. Teachers training & VEC training trg. package are also having proper weightage to gender & girl's education

issues. A model cluster development approach is being followed for promoting girls education as specific pockets and population section in DPEP districts of U.P. show very low female literacy rate especially among SCs & minorities. There fore, to tackle the severity of the problem, it was decided to work intensively and 2180, MTAs, 1983 PTAs and 362 women motivator groups were trained.

- 1050 ECCE centres are being run in convergence with ICDS. in first Phase A.W. workers are trained and centres are located in the premises of Primary Schools with coterminous timings to the schools.
- 1050 more ICDS centres have been identified during 1999-2000.
- 50 master trainers have been trained and training ECCE workers is in the progress.
- To promote girls education, free text books to all girls in DPEP districts are provided.

#### 10. Civil Works

- For consultancy service on "Design, Supervision and Management" of 215 BRC construction, contract between SPO and consultant has been signed.
- Installation work of handpumps has been entrusted to UP Jal Nigam, MOU has been signed and work has started.
- Of the 2109 NPRC, 1926 have been completed, the remaining are in progress.
- RES engineers have been given training regarding supervision of Civil works.
- 12738 toilets are being constructed out of which 4496 have been completed.
- Construction of 3627 schools had been planned of which 1270 have been completed and 1902 are in progress.
- Prototype construction (five) work have been completed.
- The new designs (five) are proposed to be used for the 4 expansion districts and remaining schools of the original 18 districts as well as for DPEP III districts.
- The physical and financial progress of Civil Works for UP-DPEP II may be seen at Annexure-IV.
- The supervision strategy using Rural Engineering Service (RES) engineers has not proved very effective. This may affect the pace and quality of the remaining works DPOs are recruiting engineer on contract for technical support & supervision.

# 11. Opening of new schools:

- 607 new primary schools have been established during 1997-98. The posts of Head Teacher and Assistant Teacher have been created and filled.
- During 1998-99, 1777 primary schools have been opened. Posts of Head Teachers have been created and filled. Construction work has started. Newly created 1777 Asstt. Teacher posts are being filled by Shiksha Mitra (Para teachers)

# PREPAREDNESS TO LAUNCH DPEP-III

# Conditions of Effectiveness:-

The Project Agreement and the Development Credit Agreement for U.P. District Primary Education Programme-III (Credit 3307-IN) was signed on 23-2-2000 between Govt. of U.P., Govt. of India and the World Bank. A Memorandum of Understanding between the UP Education For All Project Board and Govt. of India (MHRD) has been signed on 26-2-2000. As required by the World Bank, the legal opinion of the Advocate General, U.P. about the enforceability of the Project Agreement and the Development Credit Agreement in respect of UPDPEP-III has also been made available to the Ministry of Finance and the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India. Thus, in order to make the Project effective both the conditionalities have been duly met in time. In this background the UPDPEP-III is being launched in 38 additional districts of the State from Ist April, 2000.

# **READINESS TO LAUNCH**

# **SETTING UP DPO & ACTIVISATION**

The following pre-launch preparatory activities have been carried out:

Soon after the project negotiations, detailed preparatory instructions alongwith a copy of the finalized District Perspective Plans from State Project Office were sent to the districts on 2-11-99 to set up the processes for programme implementation from 1-4-2000. The strategy was to utilize the interregnum to complete certain procedures, processes and formalities so that the programme may be implemented as soon as the funds are released by the Govt. of India. To facilitate the preparatory tasks, the following check points for the first year activities were identified & communicated to the following:-

1.

- (i) the EBSA's + DIETs + DMs and
- (ii) to the Divisional Level officers which includes Assistant Director of Education(Basic) + Commissioners.

The detailed instructions issued to the District & divisional levels were as follows:

- 1. Constitution of District Education Project Committee
- 2. Opening of Bank Accounts- at DPO & DIET level
- Earmarking accommodation for DPO in BSA office or locating rented accommodation if Govt. building is not available and procurement of furniture & fixtures.
- 4. Selection of habitations, sites and schools for the civil works viz construction of new primary schools, dilapidated schools, additional classrooms, toilets, handpumps, NPRCs and BRCs provided in the first year
- 5. Listing of Gram Sabhas and a/c no. of their Gram Nidhi for transfer of funds.
- 6. Constitution of Block Resource Groups for VEC training.
- 7. Selection of Resource Persons & Master Trainers for teachers training.
- 8. Identification of alternative venues for teachers training till BRCs get established.
- 9. Selection of BRC and NPRC Coordinators though merit based processes in the DIET's

On the basis of above check points, some steps have already been taken at the district level in order to launch the programme in a time-bound manner. These are shown in the following tabular form:

- DEPC in each of the 38 districts has met, at least once, and reviewed the preparation progress.
- Separate Bank Accounts have been opened for D.P.O. and DIETs to effect flow of project funds.
- DPO offices have been set up in 20 districts in the existing infrastructure and in 13 districts in rented accommodation.

#### 2. DIET PREPAREDNESS

Detailed instructions from SPO were sent on 25-11-99 to Principals of DIETs of 38 districts asking them to undertake preparatory works in respect of conducting quality related programmes. DIETs were provided with the following list of check points:-

- 1. Selection of trainers for teachers training.
- 2. Selection process for BRC/NPRC coordinators
- 3. Constitution of District Resource Groups
- Listing of schools, teachers & VECs
- Identification of alternative venues for teachers training
- 6. Nomination of DIET faculty blockwise to monitor & supervise quality programmes in one block each.
- 7. Organisation of Orientation/Visioning Workshops for project functionaries.

The procedure and methodogy for selection of Resource persons, Master Trainers and BRC/NPRC coordinators were explained in detail. DIET's were required to make wide publicity for requirements of trainers and coordinators. They were asked to invite applications from competent and enthusiastic candidates. A written test, group discussion and interview through participatory observation were prescribed and on the basis of candidate's performance in these, the selection should be made on merit through a selection committee headed by the Principal, DIET, BSA, Senior lecturer of the DIET and one nominee from SPO as members of the committee.

#### 3. SELECTION OF PERSONNEL FOR KEY STAFFING POSTS

- (i) As per the recommendation of the Identification Mission, the State Govt. had promptly created and posted an IAS Officer as Addl. Project Director and a senior officer from the State Finance and Accounts Services as Chief Finance Officer in the S.P.O.
- (ii) 38 Asstt. Accounts Officers, one each for a district, have been selected through a selection process based on merit and posting orders were issued on 24-2-2000. They have joined at respective DPOs of 38 districts. One week Orientation & Training of these AAOs has been proposed in 2 batches from 23-28 March 2000 at State Govt's Finance & Accounts Training Institute, Lucknow. Training to these officers is being imparted by experts in finance & accounts from SPO/SIEMAT and experts from TSG, EdCIL. The Financial Manual, Project Adm. Manual, LACI formats etc will be distributed also.
- (iii) All the posts proposed under the project were placed before the Executive Committee which had, in its meeting on 24-2-2000, created all the required posts for the SPO, Divisional Project Offices, DPOs, BRCs and NPRCs. The details of the posts is given at Annexure-A.

(iv) The district Basic Shiksha Adhikari who is the District Project Coordinator is in place in all the districts and is being designated as Expert BSA through a Govt. order. SIEMAT is organising three Orientation/ Visioning Workshops for the BSAs & the DPO project team of 38 districts in the month of April, 2000.

Two professionals from SPO will be nominated as resource person in the above workshop.

(v) Selection of the district coordinators -4 in each district specifically for Community Mobilisation, Alternative Schooling, Gender and Quality programmes is nearing completion. The interviews were held on 25-27,28 March, 2000 and appointment orders are under issue. These district coordinators will be given a 6 day intensive orientation programme in the middle of April 2000 in State Project Office, Lucknow with collaboration of EdCIL, New Delhi and other concerned organisations.

After the orientation programme the co-ordinators will work in their respective areas in the field and after a month they will be given 3 days integrated training in State Project Office in the middle of May, 2000.

- (vi) DIETs have started the selection process for BRC coordinators and NPRC coordinators. Applications from interested and experienced teachers have been invited. These have been processed and DIETs are holding written tests, group discussions and interviews.
- (vii) Selection of computer operators, one for each of the 38 districts is nearing completion. The first stage of screening based on technical test was completed on 4-5 Feb 2000 and the interviews for final selection held on 23-3-2000. The appointment orders are under issue.
- (viii) Instructions have been sent to the District Magistrates of all 38 districts for recruitment of other subordinate DPO staff on deputation or on contract basis.
- (ix) The creation of posts in SPO, sanctioned in the Executive Committee meeting on 24-2-2000, was merely a notional creation. All the posts proposed in the State Plan, presently under U.P. Basic Education Project, stand transferred to UP DPEP-III and are filled.

## **CIVIL WORKS**

The selection of sites for primary schools to be constructed in the first year of the project have been identified and the districts are ready to execute the civil works for the first year. The demand for 60% JRY/SRY share has been placed with the respective DRDA's. The district wise summary of first year civil works- schools, addl. classrooms, NPRC, BRC toilets, handpumps & ECCE rooms is annexed as Annexure - B.

Five innovative prototype designs for construction of primary school buildings
have been completed under the innovation fund of DPEP-II and construction

manuals are ready. These are being disseminated to 38 districts so that VECs & engineering staff can be trained in April - May 2000 in all the 38 districts.

- The consultancy for BRC construction under DPEP-II was given to UPJN (C&D). The World Bank approved the SPO proposal to extend the same arrangements to DPEP-III. Sites for BRC Construction have been identified in all 38 districts & the contract with UPJN (C&D) is to be signed after TOR's are vetted by GOI.
- For technical supervision of civil works (other than BRCs) a decision has
  already been taken in the Executive Committee meeting that the District
  Magistrates shall be authorised to take necessary action in this regard
  keeping in view the local situation & requirements, to either utilize the
  services of RES on honorarium basis or to engage engineers on contract for
  short term.

## 5. <u>COMPUTER HARDWARE</u>

International competitive bidding process was adopted & bids were invited for computer hardware for 38 districts and SPO by floating an open advertisement in the month of Aug, 1999. Processing of the bids and bid evaluation was completed and approval from the World Bank / GOI obtained on 22.12.1999.

The purchase orders have been issued on 19.01.2000 in favour of M/s Progresive Infotech, M/s Wipro and M/s VINITECH. The supply in the district is expected by mid of April, 2000.

Districts have been instructed to establish a MIS cell. Proposals and estimates for construction of computer rooms have been received from 3 districts – Mau, Rae Bareilly & Faizabad. Funds are being released. The other districts have been asked to send in their requests latest by end April'2000.

## 6. EMIS TRAINING

In order to gearup the districts for EMIS data collection in 2000-2001 itself and to train the districts to use the DISE software for EMIS a detailed schedule has been drawn up:-

## **FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT**

- As mentioned earlier, Assistant Accounts Officers have been posted in all the 38 districts. One week Orientation Training for these AAO's has begun on 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2000. They are being trained in two batches.
- 2. As per commitment, a new Financial Management Information System is to be developed which will be LACI compliant. An advertisement was published on 1st Dec. 99 seeking bids for software development, as well as development of relevant manuals. 5 proposals were received which were processed and sent to GOI & World Bank on 12<sup>th</sup> Jan, 2000 for approval of shortlist. They were rejected by World Bank on the ground that they do not have any prior experience in the area of development of financial management systems. A second advertisement was published on 25 Jan, 2000. 5 proposals were received which after examination have been sent to GOI & World Bank for approval.
- 3. Procurement of computer hardware for the DPO's & SPO is under process, as described earlier.

#### 8. AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS

The first release of grants for launch of UPDPEP-III is awaited from GOI. A demand for Rs. 102.40 crores has been made by the SPO on 2.3.2000 from Govt. of India. A sanction for Rs. 3 crores has been received from GOI on 23.3.2000.

The SPO has received Rs. 50.00 Lacs from GOI for pre-project activities for UPDPEP-III. An expenditure of Rs. 1.65 crores has already been incurred under the project which is eligible for retroactive financing.

## 9. COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION

- Instructions from the SPO have been issued to the districts to constitute Block Resource Groups and to organize their training so that the trained BRG members can take up training programmes for the VECs. The DIETs are constituting the BRG. The BRG consists of members drawn from Nehru Yuva Kendra, Mahila Mangal Dal, Yuva Mangal Dal, Mahila Samakhya, NPRC Incharge and retired teachers/Educationists located in the block.
- Meanwhile the VEC training module has been revised at SPO level to include the new delegation of Basic Education to the Panchayati Raj Institutions.
- Instructions for printing of microplanning formats, training modules have been issued to the districts which they are to complete by June, 2000.
- The time scheduling and names of VECs earmarked for the first phase of training is being done by the DIETs. In the first year, half the VECs in the district are to be trained. DIETs are expected by 30.4.2000 to give their detailed schedule of training of BRG's and VECs. The training of BRG's is expected to start in the month of May, 2000 whereas the VEC training will start from June-July, 2000.

#### **ECCE & AS**

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 Instructions have already been issued for identifying ECCE centres in convergence with ICDS as well as for Alternative Schooling centres alongwith EGS centres, to be opened in the first year. Most districts have completed the selection for the first year targets.

#### **QUALITY IMPROVEMENT**

- I) Text Books
- (i) New text books for Maths in class 2 and class 3 have already been developed last year and are being taught in the current academic session. Text books for class-I, 2 and 3 in Language and EVS have been revised and the Basic Shiksha Parishad, a statutory body under the Act, has given approval to these new text books in its meeting on 6.3.2000. These are being printed by the Director of Basic Education and all these new text books for classes 1 to 3 will be operational in the DPEP-III districts also from the next academic session starting from July, 2000.
- (ii) Text books for class 4 & 5 in language, Science, Maths and EVS have also been revised after a thorough & intensive process of interaction at various levels. The manuscripts are ready and these are to be tabled before Basic Shiksha Parishad on 29.3.2000 for approval. Then these books will also be printed by the Director of Basic Education in the month of April May, 2000 so that these are also used from the next academic session in the DPEP-III districts.
- (iii) Instructions have been issued to the district level officers for collecting the data on number of girls students as also the number of Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribes students for free distribution of text books in the 38 DPEP-III districts. Approximately 50 lakhs free text books will be distributed in the DPEP-III districts. Director of Basic Education has been informed accordingly and procedure for printing sufficient free text books is in process. The distribution system for free text books will remain the same. The BSA will

- make the supply order and the distribution will be effected through the VEC at school level.
- (iv) There is a provision of Book Banks in every primary school of DPEP-III districts. Instructions have been issued to the Director of Basic Education and BSA's to make available 10-10 books of each subject to every class at the school level so that the needy boys can make use of them.
- (v) In every such text book meant for free distribution the cover page as well as 2-3 pages inside will carry the stamp of "Free distribution under DPEP".

## II) TLM

- (i) For better use of teacher grants, TLM guidelines already prepared in DPEP-II will be circulated to teachers of DPEP-III districts during the first round of teachers training.
- (ii) Orientation workshops for TLM at district, block and cluster levels will be organised Oct, 2000 onwards.

## III) Training

(i) Selection of master trainers for in-service teacher training is currently going on in the districts. Detailed instructions have been issued in this regard on 25.11.1999. These Master Trainers are being selected at the district level by a committee comprising Principal DIET as chairman & EBSA, District coordinator (Trg.) & a nominee from SPO. Training of Master trainers (from DIETs) will be organised in May 2000 at 8 regional centres. These master trainers will in turn train block level Resource Persons. At least 3 resource persons will be trained for each block and then teacher-training will be organised at block level during June-August, 2000. In order to identify the resource persons at the block level, a one day interactive workshop will be arranged in every block in which

- selection will be made through activity based group discussions & written tests.
- (ii) A 6-7 days training of 'The Quality coordinators' at DPO will be organised in April – May, 2000 by SPO & SCERT, based on the new text books, activity based teaching learning, EGS, effective academic supervision etc.
- (iii) 'Shikshkodaya', the first round training module and 'Sabal' package developed for second round teacher training in DPEP-II has been amalgamated as the training package for the first round of teacher training in DPEP-III districts. Thus the package for teacher training in the first round in DPEP-III will be motivational, sensitizing teachers towards gender issues, community relations and in primary education aspects such as activity based methods, class room transactions, specific approaches to learning language, Maths & EVS, and the use of new text books in classroom etc.
- (iv) SCERT has developed a training module for Shiksha Mitra & another for Acharyaji's of EGS. The training module & the instructional material has been prepared based on the inspiration of 'Shiksha Karmi' module of Rajasthan.
- (v) Teacher's training will be arranged at DIET and at such appropriate places at Tehsil and block level where training can be conducted smoothly & qualitatively. The DIETs are already on the path of selecting these decentralised sites for teacher's training.

#### **ACADEMIC SUPERVISION**

Instructions for selection of BRC and NPRC coordinators/Assistant coordinators have been sent and selection process is currently going on in the districts. The selection process comprises of written test and interview. Once selected the BRC & CRC coordinators will be trained & oriented about their role/responsibilities & academic supervision. District

level teams (comprising of DIET faculty and 2-3 newly selected coordinators) will be trained during May 2000 who in turn will train the BRC – NPRC coordinators at DIET level during July – August, 2000. SAMARTHAN a training package developed under DPEP-II will also be used for training BRC, NPRC Coordinartors in DPEP-III.

## 12. <u>BUILDING INSTITUTIONAL CAPACITY</u>

The districts of UP DPEP-III are fortunate that they will benefit from a fully operational & effective SIEMAT and an SCERT which has already introduced path breaking reforms in textbooks, training & pupil evaluation. The main focus of institutional development will remain on the DIET's, improving SIEMAT & SCERT and strengthening the Basic Shiksha Parishad & State Institute of Education.

A three day Institutional Capacity Building Workshop was conducted in collaboration with World Bank & GOI at SIEMAT on 8,9 & 10<sup>th</sup> March, 2000 for the development of Institutional Development Plans for the 33 DIET's of UPDPEP-III districts, the SCERT & SIEMAT. A detailed follow up action plan has been drawn up to ensure that all required Institutional Plans are ready by Nov'2000.

A time schedule has been drawn up accordingly and specific responsibilities assigned to Directors, SCERT & SIEMAT respectively to prepare the first draft of the Institutional development Plans by 31 August, 2000. A core group of resource personnel has been identified to disseminate the outcomes of the workshop to all the 33 DIETs. Regional DIETs were also identified to be nodal points to help & guide the 5-6 DIETs in their jurisdiction.

A review committee under the chairmanship of State Project Director has also been constituted comprising Director SCERT, Director SIEMAT, Director Basic Education, Addl. Project Director, Addl. Director

(BEP) as members and Addl. Director (DPEP) as member secretary. This committee will meet once in a month to monitor progress.

The Basic Shiksha Directorate has already presented the SPO with a TOR for computerization of teacher & staff records as well as for financial management. The TOR's are under examination at SPO before being forwarded to GOI/WB for approval.

The SIE & The Textbook Office is in the process of finalizing the specifications for equipments to be purchased for upgrading the Text book office & for DTP facilities..

## **FOCUS ON CHILD LABOUR**

## (i) Mirzapur & Jaunpur

Mirzapur and Jaunpur are two districts of DPEP-III which have considerable concentrations of working children in the carpet weaving belt of UP.

A two day workshop with GOI collaboration on child labour of six identified carpet weaving districts of Uttar Pradesh - Allahabad, Mirzapur, Jaunpur, Bhadohi & Sonebhadra was held Varanasi. on 11,12 Jan, 2000. It was attended by representatives of Department of Education, GOI, Ministry of Labour. Government of India, State Project Office, DPEP, UP and a team from each district comprising their District Magistrates, Chief Development Officers, officials from the education and labour department, NGOs, representatives from UNICEF & UNDP and faculty members of SIEMAT. The aim of the workshop was to identify the extent of child labour, coverage of existing interventions and the structures required to implement Action Plans for universal coverage of basic education for working children in these districts. Followup workshops at the district level to finalise the detailed action plans for each of the six districts including strategies of mainstreaming

working children & preparation of project proposals for universalisation of elementary education were held.

Mirzapur has drawn up a detailed action plan which is to be implemented with DPEP-III assistance and in convergence with the NCLP, local NGO's & the revamped NFE scheme of GOI. The Jaunpur plan is nearing finalization.

## (ii) Pottery Industry of Khurja

Khurja is located in Bulandshahar district and is covered by UPDPEP-III. As per a report submitted by the National Labour Institute, NOIDA, the pottery industry is a hazardous industry where a large number of working children are engaged. The report emphasises the need for primary education & convergence of other services like health, child care etc. for children to break free from working situations.

With the assistance of NLI, teachers, panchayat members and district & block education officials have been sensitized through a series of workshops to the issue of child labour and its amelioration. Action planning & convergent strategies have been worked out to address child labour in Khurja. NLI has agreed to help DPEP-III in its execution.

## 14. **DOUBLE SHIFTING**

It is proposed to take up the strategy of shifting in primary schools on a pilot basis in DPEP-III districts for optimum utilisation of available resources. The innovation will initially be taken up in 2 blocks of each DPEP-III districts where 5 schools will be selected per block. It will be piloted in schools with large enrolments and where existing infrastructure can be used to the optimum by double shifting/flexible timings. It will

particularly enhance girls enrolment by providing a shift time which is convenient for girls to attend.

The support of the community & the local VEC will be ensured before going in for flexible timings/double shifts. The coverage will be enlarged after the experiment is evaluated by the Mid-Term Review of DPEP-III.

The district BSA's have been asked to select appropriate 10 schools in 2 blocks for the 1st years' pilot. The BSA's have been asked to select any 2 models out of the 5 proposed under UPDPEP-III which are suitable locally.

## **FOCUS ON GIRLS EDUCATION**

The model cluster approach with focus on girls education evolved under DPEP-II will continue at a faster rate in DPEP-III. It targets low girls enrolment/retention areas and pockets of disadvantaged groups. It is a focussed set of all interventions which promote girls participation. Key strategy includes community mobilization and development of women's group. The programme will be initiated in 5 clusters situated in two blocks each of DPEP-III districts. Training modules developed in DPEP-II will be in use for specific capacity building of action groups in these clusters. Selection of clusters are scheduled, once the gender coordinators are in place.


#### MONITORING BY SPO

SPO had started monitoring the progress of the project districts in respect of readiness to launch the Project immediately after negotiations. An orientation cum workshop was organized at the SPO on 8-12-99 in which all the divisional officers (Asstt. Directors, Basic Education) participated. The SPO has involved these officers right from the beginning of this project. The next meeting to review the progress in 38 districts was

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held on 14-2-99 in which the BSAs of 38 districts and the divisional Asstt. Directors (Basic Education) participated. The third review meeting was held on 15-3-2000 in which itemwise monitoring was undertaken. In addition SPO staff has been visiting the districts to guage progress, help resolve bottlenecks and facilitate local decision making. It was found that the districts have completed the preparatory tasks assigned to them for launching the Project.
