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CHAPTER I
SOCIAL ECONOMIC BACK-DROP

As per the scheduled castes and Scheduled tribes lists modification Order 1956 passed by the President of India, 91 castes were notified as scheduled castes throughout the State of Orissa. The population of 7 of these castes exceeds 1,00,000. The details are given below.

2. According to 1971 census the total population of the scheduled castes in Orissa is 33,10,854 out of which 16,61,038 are males and 16,49,816 are females. The total population of the scheduled castes in Orissa according to 1961 census was 26,37,832 out of which 13,00,104 were males and 13,31,728 were females. The growth rate of the total scheduled caste population during the decade from 1961 to 1971 was 19.79% (27.18% for males and 23.8% for females) against the general growth rate of 25.05% in the State of Orissa and 24.80% in the country as a whole. The population of the scheduled castes constitutes 15.09% of the total population of the State. The total scheduled caste population of Orissa constitutes 4.13% of the total scheduled caste population of the country.

3. Out of the total scheduled caste population of 33,10,854 in Orissa, 31,08,244 scheduled castes reside in rural areas and they constitute 14.14% of the total population of the State and 15.44% of the total rural population of the State. Only 2,07,610 scheduled castes reside in urban areas and they constitute 11.27% of the total urban population of the State.

The scheduled castes are generally dispersed. In village there are some scheduled caste families but out 13 districts in the State, there are some districts



where the population of the scheduled castes is relatively more concentrated than others. The district-wise population of the scheduled castes is shown in the statement enclosed (Annexure I). The third Educational Survey has also identified some habitations which have concentration of scheduled Castes. The list of these habitations is at Annexure II.

5. There are 314 blocks in the State. In some blocks, the population of the scheduled castes is relatively more concentrated either at the village/Gram Panchayat level. Of the 314 blocks, there are 58 blocks where the population of the scheduled castes is more than 20% of the total population of the block. The block-wise population of the scheduled castes and their percentage to the total population of the block is given in the statement enclosed (Annexure III).

Occupational Pattern

6. The definition of a 'worker' adopted for 1971 census is different from that of 1961. In the 1961 census, a person was considered as a 'Worker' according to his participation in any economically productive work. In the case of regular employment in any trade, profession, service, business or commerce, a person was taken as 'Worker' if he was employed during any of the 15 days preceding the day on which he was enumerated. Thus in the 1961 census a person was categorised basically as a 'Worker' even if such a person's contribution to work was extremely marginal. In the 1971 census, every individual was asked to declare what according to him was his "main activity", i.e. how he engaged him-self mostly. Accordingly, all persons were divided into two broad streams of main activity as "workers" and 'non-workers'. A 'Worker' was defined clearly as a person whose "main activity" was participation in any economically productive work by his physical or mental activity. "Work" involved not only actual work but effective supervision or direction of work. The reference period was one week prior to the date of enumeration in the case of regular work in trade, profession, service or business. In 1971 census, a person was treated basically as a 'non-worker' if he or she did not come under any of the categories of 'worker' mentioned above. Thus a person engaged primarily in household duties such as cooking for one's own household, or performing one's own household duties, or

student attending an institution, or a rent receiver, was classified as such for his main activity and was treated as 'non-worker'. Due to the change in terms of the definition 'worker' in 1971 census, the number of scheduled castes among the category of 'workers' according to 1971 census has substantially reduced. The occupational pattern among the scheduled castes in Orissa according to 1971 census and 1961 census is indicated in the table at Annexure IV. An abstract is given below :

7. From the table given above it would be seen that although the total number of workers according to 1971 census among the scheduled castes has decreased compared to that of 1961 census, in some categories like agricultural labourers, the population has substantially increased.

Distribution of land-holdings

8. No reliable data is available regarding distribution of land holdings among the scheduled castes in the State. However in the whole State 17,56,470 persons have been identified as marginal farmers and 7,84,987 persons have been identified as small farmers. Of them the number of scheduled castes belonging to the category of marginal farmers and small farmers is estimated at 26,5050 and 1,18,455 respectively. It is estimated that in the whole State there are about 2.94 lakhs of landless households of which the number of scheduled caste households is 44,000.

Literacy

9. Among the scheduled castes according to 1971 census, the percentage of literacy is 15.6 against the State percentage of 26.2. This percentage was 11.6 and 21.6 respectively according to 1961 census. The percentage of literacy among the scheduled caste women is as low as 5.2% only compared to the State average of female literacy at 13.9%. This would be evident from the fact that out of 16,41,816 scheduled caste females, there are only 85,243 literates. The caste-wise literacy position among the males and females is indicated in the statement enclosed (Annexure V).

10. From the findings of the third Educational Survey made in Orissa in 1978, it is abundantly clear that the percentage of enrolment decreases substantially as we go up the primary level in respect of scheduled caste children. This is mainly due to heavy drop outs at the primary stage. Further details are given in the next Chapter.

Social disabilities

11. The scheduled castes of the State suffer from various disabilities which are partly social and partly economical. Untouchability is a social disease which has not been completely eradicated inspite of various legislative measures taken from time to time. Some of the scheduled castes are traditionally engaged in unclean occupations for their livelihood. This, to a certain degree is responsible for the social stigma. Abject poverty of the bulk of the scheduled caste people, lack of avenue for better employment and lack of education among them compel some of the scheduled caste communities to continue their traditional occupations.

12. Some sections of the scheduled caste are following their traditional arts and crafts like bamboo basket making, leather works, weaving. They are not able to compete in the market in respect of quality of their finished product and many scheduled caste traditional craftsmen have become unemployed. There are in the State 26 municipalities and 66 Notified Area Councils. Under these urban bodies, 5262 scheduled caste persons (2584 males and 2678 females) are working as Sweepers and Scavengers. The condition of most of

these people are very deplorable. Due to serious financial constraint the urban bodies have not yet been able to provide proper housing facilities. Their monthly-income is also quite low.

PROTECTIVE MEASURES1. Alienation of Land

In order to check and regulate alienation of land belonging to Sch. Tribes in the scheduled areas of the State, the Orissa Scheduled Areas Transfer of Immovable Property (Scheduled Tribe) Regulation, 1956 has been promulgated and enforced with effect from the 4th October, 1956. In the non-scheduled areas the regulatory control is effected under Sections 22, 23 and 23-A of the Orissa Land Reforms Act to benefit persons belonging to the scheduled castes and scheduled tribes. The provisions of the O.L.R. Act apply to Sch. Caste persons of the Scheduled Areas also. To deal with problem of land alienation in the State all the Sub-divisional Officers of the Scheduled Areas and 9 Special Officers (6 in Koraput district, 2 in Phulbani and 1 in Ganjam district) have been notified to function as "competent authority". Besides 3 Tahasildars of Phulbani district as well as the Sub-divisional Revenue Officers of Mayurbhanj and Sundargarh districts have also been empowered to function as "competent authority" and all the S.D.Os and Sub-divisional Revenue Officers of the State have been empowered to declare invalid the cases of illegal transfer by the Scheduled Tribes and Scheduled Castes. The position in respect of the number of cases of land alienation, persons benefitted and area restored till the end of Aug. '79 covered under Section 23 of O.L.R. act and Regulation 2 of 56 is shown in enclosed statement (Annexure XXXIV & XXXV).

2. Distribution of ceiling surplus lands

Upto the end of Aug. 79 28,723 Sch. Tribes and 23,829 Sch. Castes have been given 21,609 acres of ceiling surplus lands. In respect of these lands, cases of eviction of allottees have been brought to the notice of Govt. But as these cases are being suitably dealt with and the lands restored to the Sch. Castes and Sch. Tribes. Till the end of Aug. 79 583 cases of eviction in respect of Sch. Castes and Sch. Tribe allottees were reported to Govt. out of which in 400 cases relating to Sch. Castes and Sch. Tribes (S.Cs- 181, S.Ts- 219) 514 acres of land have been restored to the Sch. Castes- 280 acres and Sch. Tribes- 292 acres.



3. Distribution of Govt. waste lands for agricultural and homestead purposes

Till the end of June, '79 3673.49 acres of land has been allotted to 51,200 Sch.Castes and 4082.74 acres of land has been distributed to 68,442 homesteadless Sch.Tribes for construction of houses. The year-wise figure is indicated in the table below:

4. Integrated Housing scheme

Under this programme upto 30.9.79 4,487 houses and 5,520 houses have been allotted to the Sch.Castes and Sch.Tribes respectively. During 80-81 it is estimated that Rs.24 Lakhs will be invested under this scheme in the Tribal sub-Plan area out of the State Plan outlay of Rs.60.00 Lakhs and with this amount 1,600 houses will be constructed for Sch.Castes and Sch.Tribes.

5. Bonded Labour

331 bonded labourers have been released so far out of which 328 have been rehabilitated. The details are given below (as on 30.9.79).

District and Sub-divisional Vigilance Committees have been constituted under Section 13 of the Bonded Labour Act. Gram Panchayat Level Committees have been constituted for the district of Ganjam, Phulbani, Koraput and Palanandi.

6. Reservation in Services

The Orissa Reservation of Vacancies in Posts & Services (for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes) Act, 1975 has come into force with effect from 1.7.76. The act is applicable to all appointments under the State as defined in the Act. Executive instructions have also been issued to all Public Sector Undertakings, Corporations, Autonomous Bodies in this department memo No. 26826-TW, dated 23.8.76 to follow the principles laid down in the Act.

At present in initial recruitment the percentage of reservation is 24% for scheduled tribes and 16% for scheduled castes. In promotional recruitment the percentage of representation is equal to the percentage of scheduled caste/scheduled tribe employees as on 1.4.75 in the lower cadre from which the promotion is to be made subject to the fact that it shall not exceed the percentage of Sch. Caste/Sch. Tribe persons in the total population of the State.

The following relaxations and concessions have been allowed in favour of the Sch. Caste/Sch. Tribe candidates:-

- 1) Age limit increased by five years,
- 2) Fees for examination or interview reduced to 1/4,
- 3) Sch. Caste/Sch. Tribe candidates attending interview or examination are eligible for getting T.A.

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Section 17 of the Act provides for an Annual Report and presentation of the same in the Assembly in the Budget Session of the preceeding year. The Annual report for the year 1976-77 (i.e. as on 1.4.77) has been placed before the State Legislative Assembly during the last budget session. The representation of Sch. Tribe/Sch. Caste employees in various grades as on 1.4.77 and during the recruitment year 1976-77 is given below:-

The percentage of recruitment of scheduled caste/scheduled tribe candidates in Class III and IV posts during the recruitment year 1976-77 have shown appreciable improvement even though the representation in Class I and II posts is quite low. This is because recruitment to a majority Cl. I and II posts under the Government are made by way of promotion and reservation in the Act is restricted to the percentage of representation in the lower cadres. The increase in the representation of scheduled caste/scheduled tribe in Class I and II posts will, therefore, increase in course of time with the increase in intake in the lower grade of services.

With a view to streamline the working of the Reservation law and increase the intake of scheduled caste/scheduled tribe candidates, an "Employment Cell" in the T & R.W. Department has been set-up with a team of inspecting officers to carry out periodical inspection of different officers and to look into the complaints regarding violation of the Reservation principles expeditiously. A Special Employment Exchange has been created to centralise registration and sponsoring of scheduled castes/scheduled tribe candidates to different appointing authorities.

ATROCITIES AGAINST MEMBERS OF SCH. CASTES

With a view to deal promptly and effectively with cases relating to atrocities against members of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe, the State Government have issued a set of guidelines to the district administration and Police. The Collectors and Superintendents of Police have been made fully responsible. Joint enquiry by the Police and Revenue Officers into the cases of atrocities, identification of the trouble prone areas, preventive measures in those areas against escalation, provision of relief to the victims of atrocity and finally mobilisation of non-official agencies to arouse public opinion against untouchability are the salient aspects of the guidelines. Moreover, the Chief Minister has issued an appeal to the Panchayat Samities and local bodies to tackle these problems at the social level. The sensitive pockets where the problems of untouchability are somewhat endemic have been identified and a special watch is kept by the Police over development arising out of tension between Sch. Castes and the other sections of the population. The Police machinery has also been strengthened with the assistance received from Government of India. A High Level Committee has been set up at the State Level with prominent members of the State Legislature to enquire into the cases of atrocities against Harijans and the Committee has made spot visits and submitted detailed reports giving valuable suggestions in numerous cases. Provision has been made for giving monetary relief to the victims of atrocities belonging to S.C. and S.T.

Antodaya Programme

In the whole State 61143 Antodaya families have been identified so far for financial assistance out of which 16017 families belong to Sch. Castes which constitutes 26.2% of the total number of families identified. By the end of Sept., 79, 6766 Antodaya families have received financial assistance and started their schemes. Out of them 1,777 (26.3%) belong to Sch. Castes. During the quarter ending Sept., 79 loan to the tune of Rs. 22,78 lakhs was sanctioned in favour of 5,849 Antodaya families out of which actual disbursement was of the order of Rs. 14,67 lakhs to 3,954 families. More than 25% of the beneficiaries belong to Scheduled Castes.

CHAPTER-III

ANNUAL PLAN 1980-81- A GENERAL APPRAISAL

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The Scheduled Caste Component Plan was prepared for the first time in 1979-80. The individual benefit oriented schemes under different sectors were identified and the share of the Sch. Castes quantified. Out of the original plan outlay of Rs.200.00 crores for the current financial year(1979-80), Rs.163.42 crores was accounted for by schemes relating to basic infrastructure like irrigation, power roads, transport, public health etc. Out of the balance of Rs.36.58 crores, Rs.19.42 crores represented divisible outlay and Rs.46.95 lakhs had been quantified under Scheduled Caste Component Plan.

The Draft Component Plan 1979-80 was discussed with the representatives of the Planning Commission, Ministry of Finance and Ministry of Home Affairs on 2nd June 1979 in New Delhi. Various suggestions were made by the representatives of the Planning Commission as well as the Home Ministry for enlarging the scope of the Component Plan by earmarking more funds for the benefit of the Sch.Castes out of sectoral outlays & including special schemes with direct S.C. orientation. A copy of the proceedings of this meeting was sent to the Secretaries of concerned Departments and concerned Heads of Departments. Copies of guide-lines issued from time to time by the Planning Commission as well as the Ministry of Home Affairs with regard to formulation of Special Sch.Caste Component Plan were also sent to the concerned Departments and Heads of Departments. This matter was also discussed in several meetings with the concerned Officers at the State level. As a result of all these measures, it has been possible to enlarge the scope of the Sch.Caste Component Plan for 1980-81.

The State Plan outlay for the year 1980-81 has been envisaged as Rs.301.55 crores out of which Rs.173.25 crores account for irrigation and power projects and Rs.22.50 crores for communication

projects which are location-specific and whose benefits will accrue (L/L) after some gestation period. The allocations under these 2 items represent more than 60% of the total State Plan outlay. The employment component can only be quantified in respect of these schemes. The suggestion made by Government of India regarding extension of preferential treatment to labour Cooperatives with majority membership of Sch.Caste labourers has been brought to the notice of the executing agencies. The Registrar of Cooperatives has initiated action to organise such labour Cooperatives.

In the case of education and health, plan provision is limited and a larger part of it is meant for items like Universities, Medical Colleges, Central Hospitals etc. which benefit the community at large. In case of agriculture, a major part of the provision is for agricultural extension programmes financed by the World Bank. The scope for conscious diversion of larger funds under individual benefit schemes to the Sch. Caste Component Plan is very much limited.

The major bottleneck for larger flow of funds to the Sch.Caste Component Plan under individual benefit-oriented schemes like land reclamation, dairy development, fisheries, supply of agricultural implements, supply of bullocks etc. is non-availability of credit to match the subsidy component which again is lower than the rate prescribed for the Sch. Tribes. Cooperatives continue to be the main source of credit and contribution of Commercial Banks is still insignificant. The Cooperative Credit structure in this State is lagging behind other States and the situation with regard to Sch.Castes is compounded by their poverty, landlessness, ignorance and the illiteracy. It is considered necessary that the pattern of subsidy should be made equal for the Sch.Castes and tribals as far as small and marginal farmer categories are concerned.

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The following sectoral programmes provide for quantification of direct benefits from the outlays provided for 1980-81. The value of such benefits works out to Rs. 2.58 crores. Loans that will be attracted as a result of subsidies provided under the different schemes like I.R.F., S.F.D.A. & J.T.D.P schemes and margin money that will be made available by Sch.Caste Component may be of the order of Rs. 8 crore. Thus the total direct benefit accruing to Scheduled Castes, out of ^{Plan} outlay & institutional finance will be more than Rs.16 crores. This will go up further if due account is taken of the Non-Plan outlay which is substantial in many sectors.

of the various infrastructure development programmes. It has been estimated that 111.62 lakhs mandays of employment will be provided to the Sch.Castes, the money value of which is estimated at Rs.10.32 crores.

The total quantification made for the Sch.Caste Component Plan amounts to Rs.19.00 crores.

The flow of funds under Central and Centrally Aided schemes has not yet been fully assessed. However, under this sector Rs.505.80 lakhs is likely to flow into the S.C. component Plan out of the Central Government's assistance in respect of Central Schemes(100%) Centrally Aided Schemes (50%) and Special Central Assistance released by Government of India for sub-Plan programmes as detailed below.

Thus the total size of the S.C. Component Plan 1980-81 will be of the order of Rs.32.96 crores including Institutional Finance.

The Sector-wise flow of funds out of State Plan resources to the S.C. component Plan for the year 1980-81 is shown in the statement enclosed (Annexure-VIII.)

Scheme-wise financial outlay and quantification made for the S.C. Component Plan for the year 1980-81 in respect of different sectors are shown in the statement enclosed (Annexure-IX).

It is also possible to quantify certain percentage of the staff expenditure towards S.C. Component Plan with reference to the representation of Sch.Caste at different levels. Similarly expenditure on some of the schemes like Central Hospitals, Universities etc. can lend themselves to quantification with reference to number of Sch.Caste students studying in Colleges and average number of Sch.Caste persons treated in Hospitals. It is proposed to make a more detailed exercise after the size of the Annual Plan is fixed and sectoral outlays determined. A detailed write up on sectoral targets will also be prepared. As was pointed out in the Sch.Caste Component Plan for 1979-80 it has not been possible to take up many new schemes which specially benefit Scheduled Castes. The extremely limited size of the Plan and the severe constraint do not admit of much flexibility. It is very essential that Government of India comes forward with special central assistance for filling up this vital gap.

CHAPTER - IV

SCHEDULED CASTE FINANCING COOPERATIVE CORPORATION, ORISSA

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The Corporation was constituted in August, 1979. The main objectives of the Corporation are as follows.

i) The Corporation shall plan, promote undertake and assist programmes of agricultural development, animal husbandry, marketing, processing, supply and storage of agricultural products, small scale industry, village industry, cottage industry, trade, business or any other activity which will enable the members of the Scheduled Castes to earn a better living and help them to improve their standard of living.

ii) To undertake a programme for setting up employment oriented industries, cottage and small scale industries, village industries etc. by itself or by providing technical know how, managerial assistance, financial assistance and any other form of assistance which may be required in achieving the above objective including providing the necessary financial guarantee to financing institutions on behalf of the Societies concerned.

According to the guide-lines issued by Government of India, the Corporation is to act as catalyst by providing margin money, guarantees, underwriting loans, etc., and also induce the institutional agencies to step up flow of credit to the Scheduled Caste beneficiaries for implementation of different bankable schemes. Among other things, the Government of India's guide-lines stipulate that the Corporation should focus on the economic development of the scheduled castes which are below the poverty line and those whose annual income is within the limit of Rs.3500/- and Rs.4500/- in rural and urban areas respectively. Further, in order to cover larger number of families of scheduled castes who are below the poverty line, the limit of non-recurring total cost has been fixed at Rs.6,000/- for each scheme. However this norm may be relaxed in special case.

During the current financial year the State Government have sanctioned Rs.20 lakhs out of their plan resources under Backward Classes Sector towards the share capital of the Corporation. Further grant of Rs.20 lakhs towards share capital is likely to be received during the current year. Since the State Government will be providing Rs.40 lakhs constituting 50% of the total share capital, Rs.38.40 lakhs will be received from the Government of India towards 4% matching share of the share capital. Thus the total share capital that will be made available to the Corporation during the current financial year will be of the order of Rs.78.40 lakhs.

The schemes included in the Action Programmes are shown in the Statement enclosed. (Annexure -X)

Action programme drawn up by the Corporation envisages investment of about ~~Rs.5~~ Rs.8 Crores. Margin money contribution by Corporation will range from 20% to 50%. The share capital requirement of Scheduled Caste Financing Cooperative Corporation will be at least Rs.5 crores. Due to resource constraint the State Government could provide only Rs.20 lakhs so far. Steps have been taken to find another Rs.20 lakhs. In the Annual Plan for 1980-81 a provision of Rs.30 lakhs has been initially proposed. This may be augmented later by another Rs.20 lakhs. Including matching contribution of Government of India, the share capital of Scheduled Caste Financing Cooperative Corporation will be of the order of Rs.176.40 lakhs by the end of 1980-81. Hence the initial action programme may take 2 years to be completed. The State Government have been representing for enhancement of share capital contribution for backward States. This principle has been recognised in the case of ~~Cooperation~~ Cooperation Sector and Eastern States which lag behind are given higher rates of share capital and subsidy. Unless this is done the poorer States will continue to lag behind

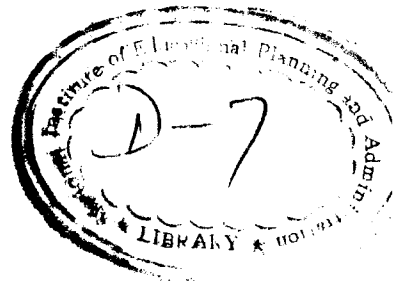
