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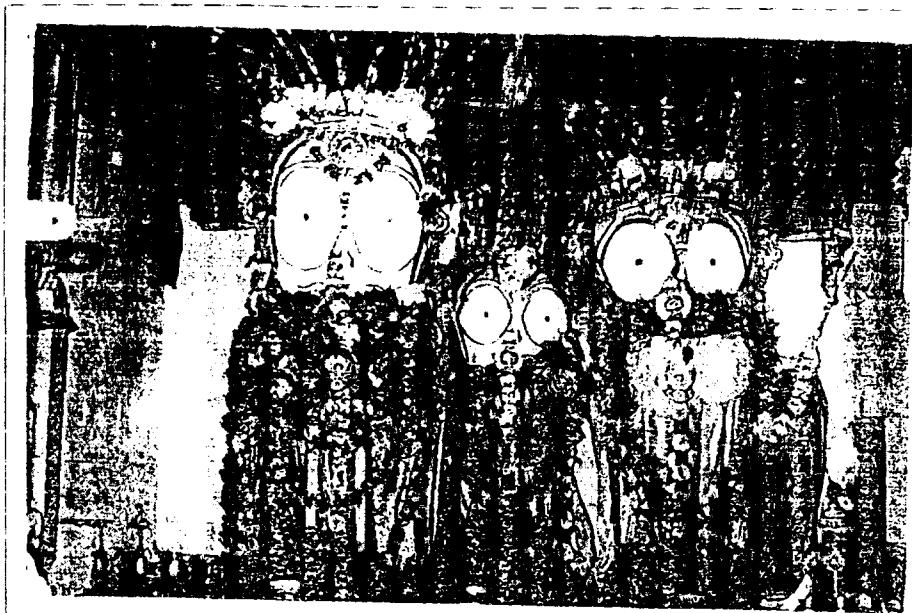

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PLAN OVERVIEW

Broader Strategies:

Community involvement to develop the school as centres of village and child as Centre of the school.

- School as a place to protect child's right.
- Planning for Special focus against child labour.
- Planning simultaneously for the schooling of all the children in the age group of 5-14 years.
- Teacher involvement and motivation.
- Child tracking and focus on actual completion rates and 100% transition from Primary to Upper Primary stage.

1. What are the items planned for?

A) Access

- Improving access by way of opening of 40 New Primary Schools.
- Improving access by way of opening 604 Alternative Schools/ EGS & AIE Centres.
- Enhancing access to Upper Primary Education by way of up gradation of 57 existing Primary Schools to Upper Primary Schools.
- Access facilitation for the Children with Special Educational Needs (SEN) by making provision for Integrated Education in selected existing Primary and UP Schools.

B) Enrollment

- Basti-wise programme for child tracking - Name-wise lists of children in the age group of 0-14 along with in-school, out-of school children and Nature of work in which the Out of School children are involved in
- 100% enrollment of 5-14 years children by 2006-07
- Basti-wise programme for child tracking and conduct of Residential and Non-Residential Bridge Courses for the mainstreaming of Out of School children.
- Convergence with other schemes for the mainstreaming of Out of School children viz. NCIP, Back to School Programme etc.

- 100% retention of 5-14 years children by 2007.
- 93% by 2002, 95% by 2003, 97% by 2004, 98% by 2005, 99% by 2006, 100% by 2007.
- Close and continuous monitoring by the Department of S & ME
- Discouraging repetitions and efforts for regular transition and actual completion rates.

- Regular attendance monitoring in all the Primary, Upper Primary and High Schools through BRPs.
- Regular follow-up of mainstreamed child labour and providing additional support.

C) Quality

- Activity for teacher involvement and motivation - Support to Teachers forums - Teachers networks, exhibitions and other professional exchange programme.
- Development of strong State and District Resource Groups in pedagogy and orientations to teachers viz., existing, newly recruited, untrained teachers
- Regular on job support to the teachers of Primary and Upper Primary schools through CRCs, BRCs & BRGs/ DRGs.
- Professional exchange through conduct of CRC meetings on monthly basis.

- Development of subject-wise Item Banks to make Pupil Assessment procedures more relevant and practicable.
- Conduct of Pupil Achievement Study from time to time to assess the status of Pupil Achievement both Primary and Upper Primary Schools
- Special programmes for improvement of Language, Maths and Science especially 1st generation learners.
- Provision for library books and children literature in Primary and Upper Primary Schools

D) Community Mobilization & Participation

- School is a place for regular meetings with School Committee Members, Parent Teachers Associations, Mother Teacher Association, Self-Help Groups like Youth Groups etc.
- Conduct of Awareness Campaigns, rallies and mobilization of the community for owning and running the schools, reliving the child labour from the employers/ domestic work and mainstreaming them.
- Conduct of Bala Melas, Women Convention and Nodal Village level Gram Sabhas.
- Training to members of 1838 School Education Committees.
- Development of campaign material and dissemination.
- Exposure visits of School Committee Members and other Self-Help Groups to the successful schools/ places.
- Support to School Committees to undertake mobilization against child labour and monitoring the enrollment and retention.
- Conduct of Block level meetings/ meets with Women Group and other Self-Help Groups.

3. Upper Primary Education - New Item Planned?

- Improvement of access to Upper Primary Education by way of upgrading 57 existing Primary schools into Upper Primary schools and 604 into Primary schools.
- Focused monitoring on the transition of all the children from class to class and Primary stage to Upper Primary stage.
- Mainstreaming of Out of School children in the age group of 11-14 through long term Residential Bridge and Non Residential Bridge Courses.
- Pedagogical renewal through curriculum and textbook revision, subject wise training to all teachers Separate Resource Groups for Upper Primary Schools, Teaching Learning Material (as one time grant of Rs.50,000 per schools), on side job support to the teachers through BRC & BRGs regular teachers meet on monthly basis at CRCs for professional exchange and training to all the teachers, subject-wise, in content and methodology every year.
- Special emphasis on utilization of available resources in the schools like Library Books, Kits, TV, VCR etc.
- Supply of TLM to all UP Schools including UP Sections in High Schools.
- Construction of 1 additional classrooms for each new UP School.
- Community involvement for 100% enrolment and retention in the age group of 11-14 years
- DIETs support to UP Schools. Monitoring & on job support - DIET Lecturers as Academic Leaders.
- Conduct of achievement tests in all subjects to the Upper Primary classes (Class VI to Class VII) on annual basis.
- Monitoring of transition of Upper Primary Children to Secondary classes through community and Department monitoring.
- Improving school infrastructure of Upper Primary Schools- New buildings, Additional Classrooms, Toilets, Electricity, Drinking Water, Repairs etc.

- Clear target setting on major indicators of UEE - viz. Access, Enrollment, Retention, Quality, Capacity Building with year-wise targets to achieve the goals of SSA by 2003, 2007 and 2010.

- Improving access to Upper Primary by way of up gradation of existing Primary schools (57) to Upper Primary schools.
- Teacher involvement motivation through Teachers forums, Networking, conduct of exhibitions, Melas, professional exchange of BRCCs, CRCs

- Constitution and development of strong District Resource Group for training and providing on job support along with monitoring.
- Focus is on child rather than teacher or school.

- Mainstreaming of children through conduct of Residential & Non-Residential Bridge Courses

6. Addressing Focused Groups – Strategies.

A) Girl's Education

- Village wise database Name wise lists of Girl children who are out of school/ child labour.
- Mainstreaming of girl children who are out of school through Non-Residential Bridge Courses.
- Conduct of gender issues workshops.
- Involvement of Women groups and other Self Help Groups for motivating community and parents for the schooling of girl children
- Conduct of campaigns, rallies along with campaign material
- Sensitizing the community and parents in Low Female Literacy habitations against girl child labour and their educational issues.
- Separate toilets for girls in Upper Primary Schools.

B) Early Childhood Education

- Strengthening of existing 661 Anganwadi Centres by extending the working hours and shifting of the centres to more needy locations
- Convergence with Anganwadi Centres of ICDS to make them run in school premises during school hours.
- Capacity building of Anganwadi Worker through training, meets, rallies etc
- TLM to Anganwadi Centres

C) Child Labour

- Campaigns/ rallies at Habitation- level sensitizing community, parents on child labour and their education.
- Formation of habitation wise core groups with youth and other Self-Help Groups to campaign on child rights and to relieve child labour and mainstream them.
- Conduct of Residential and Non-Residential Bridge Course camp.

- Convergence with other programmes such as NCT P, Back to School Programmes and NGOs for the mainstreaming of Out of schools children.
- Support to community for their efforts on mobilization for the norm that no child should work – the best place for the child is school.
- Preparation of modules and literature on the process of mainstreaming.
- Special strategies for the street children, platform children and other forms of child labour.
- Exposure visits to the mobilisers, Youth groups and camp volunteers to the successful camps, child labour free habitations to witness and feel the mobilization process and community involvement

D) Child with Special Educational Needs (SEN)

- Name wise lists of children with SEN Habitation-wise
- Conduct of Assessment camps at Block levels.
- Training to Teachers on IED.
- Resource persons at Block and District level.
- Preparation of module for children of Disabled
- Provision for TLM and Teacher Grants and other forms of Teaching Learning Equipment.

Systems improvement for monitoring and follow-up

A) Database

- Maintain basic information about schools, /teachers, children, enrollment, retention, achievement etc., at school level and maintaining the data at Block point as basic unit.
- Basti wise information on children in the age group of 0-14 years.
- Maintain Basti wise, Name wise lists of out of school children in the age group of 5-14 years.
- Provision of Computers and Computer Operator at Block level for data management.

B) Validation

- Review the data collected from the field once in a month at Block level and District level.
- Validation of data at village level in Gram Sabhas on quarterly basis.
- Sharing the data in teachers meetings at Block level.

C) Updation

- Provision for regular updating of data on major indicators of UEL along with school facilities at Block point through computers.

D) Utilisation

- Data transfer from Block to schools after analysis.

- Discussion of School-wise data in CRC meetings and checking the targets and achievements
- Using the data for the purpose of planning at Basti level, Block level and District level
- Data use for target fixing and for planning suitable strategies.
- Data sharing between Blocks, Districts and State on a regular basis through internet.

8. Identification of Schools and Teachers - Supervision and Monitoring

- Identification of schools and teachers by way of categorization of schools into 'A', 'B' and 'C' categories based on the various performance indicators.
- Onsite support to schools and teachers through BRPs, BRGs and DRGs
- Support to teachers networks conduct of academic forums is a way for the involvement of more and more teachers with positive outlook in school development programmes.
- Academic monitoring of schools by DIET staff.
- Identification of effective schools - Alternative Schools, Primary Schools, Upper Primary Schools, ECCE Centres, Child Labour Camps BRCs, TRCs etc and monitoring for further improvement
- Capacity building of field staff i.e. BPOs, DRGs, CRC Coordinators, DPO staff, Dy. LS and DPOs on pedagogical renewal and school support systems.

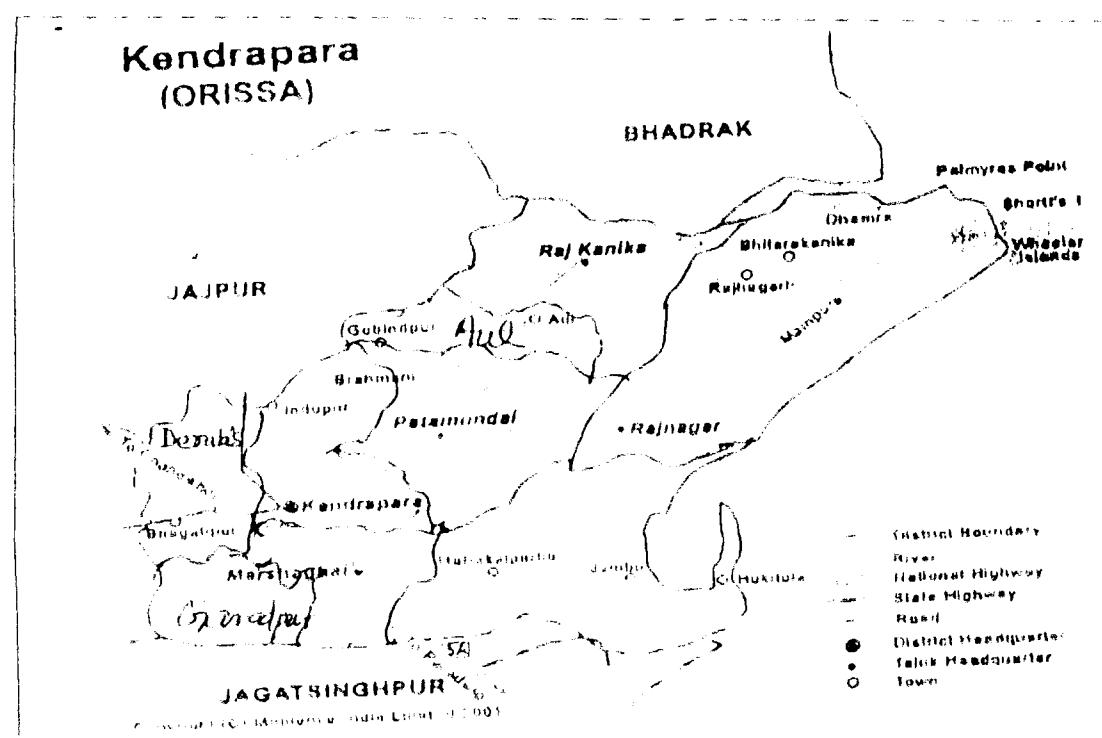
CHAPTER - I

A. Historical Background:

Kendrapara is a place of mythological importance from the vedic age. It is also known as "Tulasi Khetra" which is coined after the name of Tulasi the daughter of the defeated demon king '**Kandarasur**' who became the wife of Lord Baladevjew. The legend of the war between **Kandarasur** and **Sri Baladevjew** still survives among the people. But the modern District Kendrapara came into being on the eve of Utkal Divas i.e. on 01.04.1993 under reconstitution of District in the state of Orissa. Prior to this Kendrapara was a sub-division of erstwhile, Cuttack District. The river Baitarani serves the Northern boundary with Jagatsinghpur District in South and Jajpur and Cuttack District are at Western boundary with Bay of Bengal in the East.

The District has remained as a pioneer place during freedom movement of the Nation. Sacrifice of martyrs like Basu Sethi, Bisuni Madhual, Ananda Jena etc. are considered as some of the major events in the National struggle for freedom. It has also remained as a citadel and birth place for many personalities not only during the freedom movement but also in the field of art, culture, education, science, literature as well as polities. In 1922 three persons were martyred for the noble cause of peoples right.

B. Geographical Features: Kendrapara (Orissa)



Kendrapara District falls on the coastal plains and situated on the eastern side of the state.

It lies between 86°15' E to 87.15'E latitude and between 20.15'N to 20.52'N longitude. The total geographical area amounts to 2548 Sq. Km. It is bounded on South by Jagatsinghpur, North by Bhadrak, East by Bay of Bengal and West by Jajpur and Cuttack District.

Soil:

The plain region having alluvial soil useful for both Rabi and Kharif type of cultivation.

River System:

The main river of Kendrapara is The Brahmani, which serves the Western boundary with Jajpur District. Rivers like The Kharasrota, The Gobari, The Luna, The Karandia, The Chitrotpala and The Paika flow through this District.

Climate and Rainfall:

The District has a mean elevation of 25 meter above the sea level and the climate of the District is moderate hot in summer along with the rainfall of medium range. The temperature in the month of May is approximately 39 degree Celsius. The average rainfall is 140 cms. per year. From April to August the wind blows from South to North.

Forest:

This has a vast area of forest. Existence of forest in the District is about 248.05 Sq. Kms. including 14.49 Sq Kms. of reserve forest.

Mangroves forests are grown near the sea mainly in two blocks namely Rajnagar & Mahakalapara Cashew nut, Mango, Coconut, Neem, Baniyan, Karanje & Peepal types of trees are found in the District. Bamboo bushes are commonly found in this District.

C. Language:

Oriya is the major language of this District. Besides Urdu and Bengali are also used in small communities.

Oriya is the mother tongue of 85% of the total population. Urdu is being spoken by Muslims. The people of some pockets, like Rajnagar and Mahakalapada speak in Bengali. Both Urdu and Bengali speaking people do understand and speak Oriya well during their interaction with Oriyas. In short, people in the District can speak and understand Oriya well.

D. Festivals:

Gajalaxmi Puja, Durga Puja, Holi, Raja, Diwali, Badaosha, Moharumi, Id, Ratha Yatra, Ram Nawami, Puspani are the main festivals observed by the people of the District.

E. Tourist Place:

Crocodile sanctuary and Reserve Forest is Bhitarkanika, Light House at Batighar, Barahjew Temple at Aul, Baladevjew Temple at Kendrapara, Hanuman Temple at Garapui Panchu Barahi Temple at Satavaya, Jagannath Temple at Keradagarh and Righagarh etc. are the main tourist places of this District. A large number of Tortoise and Siberian Birds came to Gahiranatha & Bhitarkanika respectively during early winter every year, which are not only attract Natinal Tourists but also tourists of International Level.

G. Road and Communication:

National High Way No 5(A) connects this District with Jajpur, Cuttack and Jagatsinghpur. Though Govt have started taking steps for the improvements and maintenance of roads, in some villages, people have to use boat for their communication. Mostly rural areas are yet to get good roads and depend upon Kuchha roads and so remain inaccessible mostly during rainy season. Even Municipality and NAC area do not have wide and well-maintained roads for communication.

Road communications to all blocks from District Headquarters except Rajkanika Block are available in the District. In order to go to Rajkanika Block one has to cross the river Kharasota by boat. The bridge over this river is under construction.

Some interior pockets of most of the blocks of this District have not yet been connected with road links due to existence of rivers, canals and other rivulets. Transport and Communication to this place is only by boats and motor lunches.

Socio Economic Structure:

The District retains the Old caste based society that defines the socio-economic status of the people. The District is highly populated with SC people whose economic condition is yet to be developed. About 40% of people live below the poverty line.

Kendrapara in Bird's Eye View:

In the field of education Kendrapara College, Kendrapara at present has the glory to occupy the top position among the private colleges in the state. One Science College is under construction by the Govt. in this District neat Gandakia. One Law College namely Dinabandhu Sahoo Law College after the name of Mr. Dinabandhu Sahoo, worthy child of the soil. Other than these many Sangeet Schools are opened all over the District to educate the learners on music and versatileness on lyrical aspects. One blind school is opened at District Head Quarters to enable the blind children getting education.

In the fields of art & literature, this District has incomparable contribution. The arts, carved on the walls of Binod Bihari Temple at Kendrapara Town in a rare similarities on any other monuments or walls through out the State. The Bhakti Songs of Late Nima Charan Harichandan ever rings the ear of millions of people in and out of the State. The literary aspects of Late Damodar Mishra of Rajkanika has left the memorial imprint on versatile compositions in Sanskrit. No one can forget the lady poet - Night Angle of Orissa – Mrs. Kuntala Kumari Sabat of Kendrapara. Other than these genius of the past days Kendrapara has produced so many of her children to play vital roles in fields of Arts & Literature in modern days, who are worthy and notable enough, as place of mythological and historical importance, Kendrapara has always uphold her own image on spiritualism. So far as the eyes of legends and mythology extends it sees, at the time of Mohabharat war Lord Baladeva wondering as pilgrim and helping the people by killing demons like Kandarasur and establishing the faith in pure love and Bhakti to the common people. In the field of education Kendrapara has paved the way to flourished the university like Puspagiri by 1100 A.D (which were found to be at Lalitagiri & Ratnagiri very closed to Kendrapara) Students came from abroad through Bay of Bengal and Madhusagar river, which flowed in this District then Kendrapara was a meeting place of two great religion - Hinduism & Budhisim and had ever the power of tolerance. This could the people to be enriched spiritually and academically. This flow has still opposed, not stopped to be present time. The founder of Iskon Society Mr. Bhakti Bedanta Swami Prabhupada, Namacharya Srimad Banya and Bhakta Kabi Guru Baikuntha nath Brahmachari could flourish and established the spiritual movement at the modern days in this District.

But to regret that this District could not have a technical education institution even after 55 year of independence. One Engineering School that started in Ninteen hundred sixties collapsed soon after.

CHAPTER - II

History of Educational Development:

Kendrapara as a District came into existence being separated from Cuttack District in the year 1993. It has its special uniqueness as regards to growth and development of Education. After the advent of British in the year 1803, some vernacular schools were established in the town areas, which subsequently came under the control of District board. In pre Independence era in some important places of the District M.E schools were established with the contribution of local Zamindars, which were upgraded into High Schools later. For the development of Vedic culture and to popularize Sanskrit language, Sanskrit Tols were established at different places of the District.

After independence during 1955 - 1965 special Finance allocation for Primary schools gave birth to present set up of Primary Education. In the year 1961 the administration of Primary Schools was diverted from local board to the District inspector of schools under Education Department. The conscious inhabitants and the educated people of the District contributed a lot for expansion and development of academic atmosphere and eradication of illiteracy.

Non-formal education system was introduced in the District During 1989 - 90 to educate dropouts. Total literacy campaign was launched in the year 1999 to educate adult learners and to create awareness for education. Some other scheme like Operation Black Board was introduced in the District with increasing allocation expenditure, attempts were made to achieve the goals of universalisation of Elementary Education. But unfortunately it is still remained an elusive goal. Now time has come to review the achievement of the District in the field of education. Attempt has been made to present the educational scenario of the District in this chapter.

Educational institutions of the District:

Education is a co-operative effort. Elementary Education does not function in isolation leaving other educational institutions as those institutions facilitate vertical and horizontal mobility of learners. Table No. 2.14 presents the quantitative magnitude of Elementary Educational Institution of the District.

The above table indicates that a number of educational institutions are engaged in Elementary Education. In addition to this High Schools, Colleges, Vocational, Technical and Music Institutions are also there in the District satisfying a ground taste of the people.

Elementary Education:

The District has 1258 nos. of Primary Schools and 580 nos. of Upper Primary Schools managed directly by the Govt. in the Department of S & ME and SC and ST Development Department.

In the perspective plan under SSA (DEEP) the District considers it necessary to include only Elementary Schools managed by S & ME Department SC & ST Development Dept. and privately managed aided schools.

Pre-school Education:

Pre School Education plays an important role in setting a base for Elementary Education. It creates conductive atmosphere in developing readiness for Elementary Education. A number of school i.e. English Medium School in urban areas imparting pre school Education in private through nursery classes.

Unfortunately there is no provision for pre schooling Education in the District. The Woman and Child Development Department is imparting pre schooling education through 661 nos. of Anganwadi Centres under I.C.D.S project in rural areas converting 9 blocks with beneficiaries numbering 32118 in the age group 0-3 years and 63496 nos. in the age group 3-5 years. The details of which is reflected in Table No. 2.2.

The centres run under I.C.D.S project are not adequate to cater all the children in the age group 0-5 years. Therefore much attention is needed for establishment of pre schooling centres in the District.

Child population in age group of below 14 years in Kendrapara District is found out by Survey to facilitate the planning how to make every child in this District to get Primary education. Block wise survey is made to achieve above goal. It shall affect every child as to the age group of 0-3, 3-5, 5-11 & 11-14 years. The survey has been made up on every category of children such as General, SC & ST. The numerical data of such population is given in the Table no 2.1(A), 2.1(B), 2.1(C), 2.1(D). Universalisation of Elementary Education targets to educate all these children. Not a single child should get out of this programme and SSA keeps all doors open to educate these children through any means and strategies. Data base for SSA has categorically found out the numerical statistics for General, SC, and ST people of the District. Disable children are also noted through this programme.

To achieve the goal of universalization of Primary education in the District survey has been made to find out a numerical data of enrollment position from pre Primary level to upper Primary level by which it shall be easier to locate the out of school children in every Block areas in every GP level and Village Level. As Primary Education is a right to every child every habitation should have Primary educational institution by which every child shall get an easy reach to the school. On this view the survey had been made to locate school less habitation in each Block. The numerical data of such habitation is given Block wise here with through the Table no. 2.4. In this table, No. of Revenue villages, No. of Primary Schools, No. of Habitations served by Primary schools, No. of EGS Centres opened, No. of EGS eligible Centres under proposal etc. are shown. Hence the no. of habitations having no school facility can be easily detected. This District has 1525 Revenue Villages, 975 Bastis. These Revenue Villages and Bastis are served by 1258 Primary Schools by which 1217 villages/ hamlets are served by Primary Schools. District has opened 201 EGS centres and has proposed to open more 403 EGS Centres with 334 AIE facilities. It is expected to cover up all the habitations as schooling spots and as Feeder Villages or Hamlets in the District.

The survey has been made as per the EGS norms and Block wise School less Habitations have been identified which are to be benefited under the programme. No. of school less habitations, proposed facilities under SSA and EGS with un-served scattered habitations are shown in the Table No. 2.5. Co-ordinating the above schools it is observed that the district has 751 School less habitations where no schooling facility is available within 1 km distance from the residence of the child. Total 604 habitations are brought under this scheme to be benefited and 334 unserved scattered habitations are there which need to be covered under AIE scheme.

After due survey it was found that a number of children were left out of schools. Some were dropped out from schools, some were disabled who could not attend the schools. District planning have taken steps to bring those children under EGS facilities categorically. As per the age norms of those children they are treated as beneficiaries in Primary schools and UP schools. The categorically figures relating those children are shown in the Table 2.13. Budget has been placed under proposal to give benefits to those children by opening of Primary schools and UP schools under EGS norms. 25,383 children will be benefited by opening of new Primary Schools and Upper Primary Schools under SSA norms. 15,040 children will be benefited by the AIE scheme. The survey has detected 2446 children as irregular schooling children who need special care under the AIE norms by opening Mini Schools, Bridge Course, Residential Bridge Course Centre, Camp Schools, Remedial Coaching Centre and Adolescent Girls Camp in the appropriate spot.

Location of proposed UP schooling facility with Feeder habitation, Feeder Schools and No. of children to be benefited has been shown in the Table No. 2.13 and no. of schools and teachers in each Block of different sector such as S.M.E Department, TRW Department, Other Govt. Dept. and Pvt. Sectors have been given in the Table No. 2.14; requirement of TLM Grants in Govt Managed schools have been planned in Table No. 2.15; the requirement of additional class rooms for existing schools in Table No. 2.16; List of Building less schools and completely dilapidated is shown in Table No. 2.17 has been given. To the need of the District Primary Education above requirements are felt to be justified as per the survey ^{of} budget proposals to these effects have been placed. By taking appropriate measures to increase the number of enrollment, by giving schooling facilities to each and every child of the District and taking steps to make every school drop-out-less a good no. of children will emerge in to the next higher class in each year and ceasing of the drop outs.

Building less Schools

Generally the Educational Institutions are built up under the Private help which is hard to be repaired if damaged once either by the flood or cyclone or by any other cause. Therefore it comes to the responsibility of the Govt to grant financial assistance for reconstruction of damaged buildings and also the building less schools virtually which occurs to the time.

The programme on FGS, SSA and AIE has much alluring prospective to wide spread the Primary Education on the ~~base~~ of Universalisation. In this planning the construction of New Buildings for Building less Schools with all academical dimensional prospective gets top priority. Hence the District has planned to construct New Buildings for Building less Schools with budget proposal keeping view of the climatic condition of the District.

Environment plays a vital role on education. It stimulates the body, mind and spirit of radars to achieve the academicals success. So due attention should be given towards the upliftment of institutional environment such as Construction of School Building, Class Rooms, Toilets, Resources Centres, Drinking Water facility, Electricity, Furniture, Aids and Equipment and any other Civil work as appropriate towards the programme.

This Civil Work shall not only be confined to the school environment but shall extend to impact resourcefulness to the teachers. The guiding lines for the control of the civil work will be

- i) Timely completion of the proposed work to avoid cost over runs and time over runs
- ii) Proper utilization of allocated funds
- iii) To ensure quality in each work
- iv) Maintenance of transference in procedure to avoid criticisms and doubts.

It shall cover up the schools at village level up to administrative units at Block and District Levels.

The numerical statistics and survey data of the District is complied in Table No. 2.18, which is attached here with, and budget planned on this effect.

From survey it is found that a good number of Primary and UP schools have no requisite no. of classrooms. The no. of classrooms somewhere are not sufficient to the enrollment capacity of class / school and somewhere the no. of teachers are more than the classrooms available in the school. Both the situations are not sound for the academically progress of the learners. A statistic is found at every Block level of the District on this effect. The requirement of additional classrooms in each Block for Primary and UP schools in separate category is given in format no. 2.19.

District has planned to maintain and repair the existing, new and upgraded Primary and UP schools of the District. The budget estimate has been set up and shown in the budget sheet and budget has been proposed at the District unit up to 2009-2010 as shown in the Table No. 2.20.

After independence awareness has developed in the minds of people to get their children educated. By the no. of enrollments has increased and the rate of drop out children is also reducing to a visionable expect up to date. By 2002-03 drop outs in Kendrapara District was 21,306 and 7,119 of the age group of 6-11 and 11-14 respectively. District has planned through SSA to reduce this trend up to 17,045 and 5,980 to the year 2003-04. Such reducing process to abolish drop outs in age group of 6-11 fully and to reduce drop outs up to 1424 of the age group 11-14 by the year 2007-08 and to get a drop out less District by 2009-2010.

AIE Centres

The survey has detected a suitable no. of out of school children such Migrants, Adolescent Girls, Physical Handicaps & Child Labours in the District. Necessary steps are to be taken to educate these children through AIE scheme. To achieve this goal, the District Planning has set up to open Adolescent Girls' Camp both Residential and Non-Residential, Bridge Course for Migrant family children, Residential and Non-Residential Adolescent boys camp, Remedial coaching Centre, Mini Schools, Residential Primary Schools as shown in the *Annexure-II*. Footpath children, Orphans, Slum dweller children, Children of minor communities and refugees are taken into targets. Budget proposals are placed to allot funds to meet the demands of those children.

CHAPTER - III

(Planning Process)

Planning Process

Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan is a National Program aimed at achieving the goal for Universalisation of Elementary Education in an effective manner. Specially emphasizing on community involvement. The Planning process includes grass root Level participation to take the problem and issues of Primary Education. The District Prospective Plan has been prepared on the basis of the Data collected through survey, participatory meeting of different groups the work shops details, discussion and exchange of ideas provided clues for strategies to reach the targets.

The Planning process was conducted with the training of the District Planning team at the State Project Office, Bhubaneswar. The team was assembled in two round orientations in the participating approach of Planing. The following activities were conducted at the village, Block and District Level as pre project activities.

Survey:

The household survey was taken up and completed during August 2001. The Upper Primary School teachers were engaged for collection of household Data. They covered all the houses from door to door in the village and formed for the purpose.

The S.I of Schools of all the Blocks and Municipality devoted their time for compilation of village Data and under their direct supervision the Block Data was submitted during 1st week of Sept. 2001. The District Level Survey Data was completed by the Core Team Member by November.

The survey of School Data was conducted with the assistance of the State Project Ofcice. The Headmaster of all Primary Schools, Upper Primary Schools and High Schools having Elementary Section have tried their best to provide accurate Data during the survey period.

Different Block Level focus group discussions were conducted at District and Block Level from September to October. The B.D.Os, Executive Officers of the local bodies took active part in conducting the meeting. The V E C members, P R I worker groups and all Primary School teachers participated in the meeting in groups. Specific problem of the area and their individual requirements were identified. Those are exhibited in the Plan categorically.

A convergence meeting was connected at the District Headquarters. All the Sarapanchas of the District were involved. The District Level Officers and Officers of Education Department have attended the meeting. Aims and objectives of the S S A

were discussed in the meeting. They specified their need based problems and their strategies, which are included in the Prospective Plan.

In addition to that the Block and District Level convergence meeting were held at different times at the Block Headquarters and District Headquarters. The B.D.Os, D.P.Os and all other Officers of the related Department, N.G.Os, P.R.I.s and Teachers Union participated in the meeting. Suggestion was solicited from the grass root level.

The issues that have been identified in the convergence meeting and workshops are classified and discussed in the Planning process.

CHAPTER - V

KENDRAPARA

OBJECTIVES AND TARGETS

INTRODUCTION:

The constitution of India in Article 45 promises to provide free and compulsory Education to all the children of age group 6-14 within ten years from the commencement of the constitution.

The National Education Policy of 1986 and the Program of Action 1992 reiterates the Nation's determination for Universalisation of Primary Education for the age group 6-14. It has been determined in the para 5.12 of the NPE that before entering in the next century all the children will be provided free and compulsory Education up to 14 years of age. Though several steps have been taken for the achievement of the constitutional commitment yet the goals are far away.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES:

The aims and objectives especially for Kendrapara District in DEEP context are

1. To achieve 100% enrolment targets for the age groups 6-14.
 2. To ensure retention of enrolled children till the completion of Upper Primary Education.
 3. To improve the quality of Primary Education.
 4. To promote the rate of girls Education and to reduce the gender disparities.
 5. To reduce the rate of drop outs up to 0%
 6. To ensure public sharing, cooperation and participation in the achievement of UEE and to bring physical development of Schools.
 7. To establish New Schools and EGS Schools to cater the needs of the un-served habitations and provide facilities for Upper Primary Education by upgrading the Primary School.
 8. To ensure a better and balanced student teacher ratio.
 9. To make coordination for better convergence among different Educational offices and other agencies
 10. To strengthen the District Primary Education system by creating a silent social revolution.
 11. To ensure Education for migratory population - special focus group.
 12. To provide better Educational facilities to the children of remote areas and in accessible pockets
 13. To strengthen the infrastructure of the District of the Primary Education.
- For the successful implementation of the Program with above objectives, suitable strategies are to be chalked out.

TARGET GROUPS

The following target groups have been highlighted in the project.

- Deprived and neglected sections (6-14 age group)
- Children from SC (boys & girls)
- Girls from general and minority communities
- Handicapped boys & girls
- Children of inaccessible areas

- Street Children

1. PROJECT MANAGEMENT:

The purposed District Elementary Education Program is an additionally to the ongoing Educational activities in the District. On the other hand it is also a time bound Program having its well-defined objectives, strategies and interventions that are different from the traditional pattern. It aims at building up capacities for the future sustainability of the activities to be undertaken during the project period through the active participation and cooperation of the people

Further, it emphasizes on the need of restructuring of the traditional administrative structure for radical changes in the outlook of officials and nonofficial functionaries Unless, until capable and dedicated functionaries come forward, new project cannot function effectively.

Keeping in view the bottom up Planning process, it emphasizes on teamwork, cooperation, participation, understanding, leadership, convergence, discussion, social relation & effective project Management.

In view of the above the project will be managed by District Project Office in the District with the collaboration of the State Project Office.

DISTRICT PROJECT OFFICE

The District Project Office, headed by District Project Officer (DPO) will be the main executive agency for the effective implementation of the project activities in the District. The DPO will be responsible for the Management of funds and the project activities as per the norms prescribed by the State Project Office. The main functions to be executed by the District Project Office are:

- (a) Planning, implementing, supervising and coordinating the Educational activities in the District at different Levels.
- (b) Preparation of District Educational Plan involving DEET/ST Schools, BRC, CRC, VFC and other agencies
- (c) Administrative and financial control over the project.
- (d) Supervision of construction works and academic activities for quality improvement
- (e) Monitoring of the Programmed activities.
- (f) Establishing inter sector linkages and convergence
- (g) Capacity building of all key functionaries of the District Level & Field Level Officers.

STRENGTHENING OF DISTRICT PROJECT OFFICE

The District Project Office will be provided with office building, adequate academic and non-academic staff, vehicle and other facilities for its better functioning and Management of project activities. The DPO building will function in the campus of the ST School for better cooperation, coordination and monitoring of project activities. The State Project Office for the Management of Programmed activities will train the DPO staff according to the needs. Library facilities will also be provided at the DPO for providing academic support.

2. PLANNING AND MANAGEMENT:

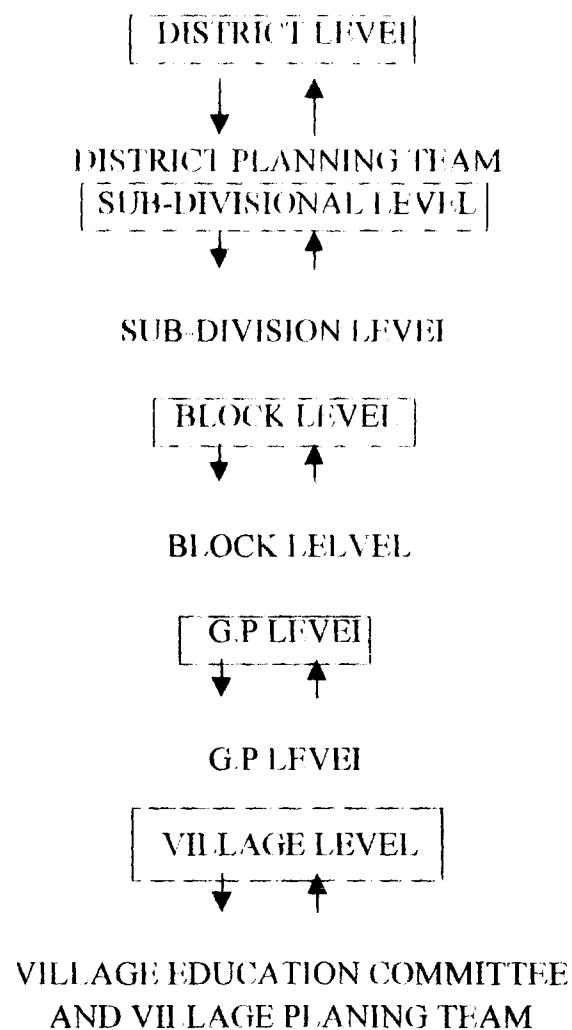
Planning is the basic need for the successful implementation of the Program. It aims at filling up the gaps, reviewing the human resources and available facilities for its best utilization, making adequate provision for effective supervision and monitoring as well as ensuring better cooperation and coordination with other agencies. In view of the above objectives due emphasis has been given for bottom up

Planning process through the right kind of communication net works with different functionaries at all the Levels of the District.

ORGANISATION STRUCTURE

In order to achieve the objectives of the Program through its successful implementation due emphasis has been given to create an effective organizational structure starting from village Level to District Level. The structure of Planning is as follows.

PLANNING MANAGEMENT STRUCTURE



A. DISTRICT LEVEL:

At the District Level there would be a District Planning Team (DPT) which would over see the implementation of the Programmed activities in the District. The DPT will be headed by Collector & District Magistrate and the Additional District Magistrate will act as Vice-Chairman. The Collector & District Magistrate will nominate the members of the DPT from among different communities such as SC &

SI, voluntary organization, members of PRJs, DIET/ST School personnel, District Level Officer of Education Department and other Departments. The meeting of DPT will be held once in every month to review the progress and Plan for future. The functions of the DPT will be as follows:

- (a) To observe the implementation of different components of DEEP.
- (b) To make adequate provision for supervision of civil work.
- (c) Strengthening of Management Information System.
- (d) To have a better linkage between various Departments for effective convergence for Elementary Education at the grass root Level i.e. village Level.
- (e) To establish better coordination between DIET/ST School and Primary Education Management functionaries.
- (f) To formulate and issue policy guidelines for different activities under different components of the Program.
- (g) To develop suitable mechanism for participatory Educational Planning and development.
- (h) To approve the Budget and expenditure of the project

Besides this at the District Level Core Planning team, Core Advisory and purchase Sub committee, Budget Sub-committee, Plan Preparation Sub-committee, Monitoring and Evaluation Sub-committee, recruitment cell, Task Force for supervision, Resource Groups have been constituted for decentralization of project Management and its effective functioning.

B. VILLAGE LEVEL:

At the village Level, village Education Committee has already been set up. This committee will act as the Primary units for the formulation, implementation, and supervision of project activities at the lowest Level. The committee will also be given the responsibilities of micro Planning, village Education Plan for providing Education to all the children through formal or Alternative Schooling systems. The functions of the VEC will be:

- a) Community involvement and environment building.
- b) Supervision of construction works.
- c) A special measure for the Education of dropout sections specially for girls.
- d) Supervision of the Schools.
- e) Micro Planning, village Education Plan & identification of local issues and problems
- f) Better implementation and monitoring of activities to increase enrolment
- g) Organization of cultural Programs, functions, Melas, & special campaigns.
- h) Organization of convergence services for better Primary Education.

3 CIVIL WORKS:

Civil works have a unique place in the Program as it School environment as well as retention of the learners. W estimated cost of the Program will be spent towards civil wor attentions is to be paid for its best utilization with transparency project emphasizes on community participation and cooperative civil works on decentralized manner. The guiding principles for works will be:

- i. Timely completion of the purposed works to avoid time over runs.
- ii. Proper utilization of allocated funds.
- iii. Quality insurance in each work.
- iv. Maintenance of transparency in procedure to avoid doubts.

From the information collected through the house-hold Survey the need for construction of School buildings and construction of Residential School, major and minor repair of present School buildings of B.R.C and C.R.C buildings and boundary walls are as follows:

4. ACCESS AND ALTERNATIVE SCHOOLING

In order to cope with the Education of specific and deprived groups the following strategies have been fixed from DEHP Context.

Retention of these children in School by providing residential facilities during the period of migration.

- a) Courses of studies EGSC curriculum
- b) Feeding of the children through Mid Day Meal
- c) Additional contingency to be provided through DEHP for teachers to prepare TLM.
- d) School Improvement Grant.

The household survey shows an important reason of non enrolment of children of age group 6 to 14 is engagement of such children in cattle grazing, goat keeping and helping their parents in earning. This practice cannot be stopped because poverty of the parents compel the children to assist in their earning. The following strategies have been fixed to deal with the Education of the children.

Alternative School facility will be provided in shape of EGSC. Timing of such Schools will be 4 hours duration as per the suitability of the students. During this period these children take rest at home with the animals.

153 Primary School teachers will be deputed, as CRC Coordinator and 9 Elementary teacher of Level III will be BRC coordinator. They will be selected through visioning workshops. 18 Upper Primary teacher may act as Training Assistant. As 180 teachers will be deputed and they will not take part in teaching of their respective Schools, this number of new teachers will be appointed as additional teacher. So the teaching is not disturbed. If these numbers remains vacant the teaching work will be disturbed.

5 PEDAGGGICAL IMPROVEMENT:

This is the crucial area of the project. The District has not observed much improvement in the quality of elementary Education for the last two decades. While probing the reasons for such stagnation in the quality Education, absolute teaching learning process, may factors came to forefront. The reasons were discussed in the meetings of the teachers' group, parents and Educationists. The strategies are already mentioned in Chapter IV. The renewal of Pedagogic improvement requires holistic approach involving stakeholders at each Level. This multipoint strategy also involves measures to make the project efforts sustainable even after the completion of the project.

The major areas chosen are:

- i. Teacher Empowerment.
- ii. Curriculum and Teaching – Learning Materials
- iii. Continuous academic supervision, support mechanism and evaluation.
- iv. Developing academic support system at Block and Cluster Level.
- v. Empowering a team of resourceful persons.
- vi. Institutional capacity building
- vii. Imparting need-based training to teachers.
- viii. School-efficiency reports and preparations of School development Plans.
- ix. Quality monitoring of Schools

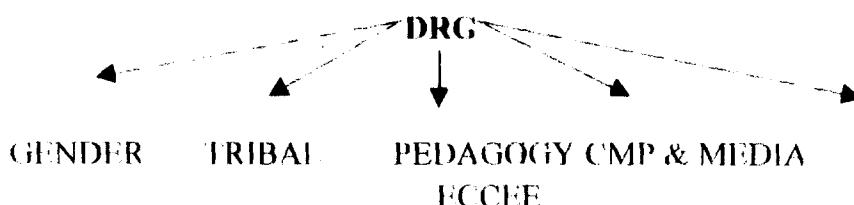

Formation of Resource Groups:

- a) DRG - One common DRG will be formed consisting of 20 members from DIET/ Secondary Training Schools, Retired Educationists to provide training on different aspects to the Master Trainers (MT) at the District Level in DIET. All the training Program will be residential in nature.

Organisation of Training Programs:

Three tier training Program at DIET, BRC, CRC, Level will be organized for, BRGs, MT and teachers on different aspects like Pedagogical, IED, Gender disparities, attitudinal, pre-School Education in order to acquaint the teachers and other functionaries with activity based teaching learning process & new methods of teaching.

PROVIDING SUPPORT TO DISADVANTAGED GROUPS

In order to check the drop out rate and to increase the retention of the disadvantage groups like girls, SC/ ST (mainly SC), minority communities, handicapped learners & special focused groups material support in the form of reading writing materials will be provide to these children each year for a period of Nine years during the project period. Convergence will be made with Welfare Departments for supply of Text Books.

STRENGTHENING OF ST SCHOOL:

At the District Level as there is no DIET, ST School. Kendrapara is functioning as a Nodal Institute in providing academic as well as managerial support to the Primary Education of the District. It plays a vital role in imparting training to the teachers of the District, conducting activities on Institutional Planning, research studies, designing curriculum, developing audio and Video Programs in the field of Elementary Education. Through the Programmed activities, ST School will be strengthened, so that it can bear the workload of training Programs and other related activities of DEEP. Also the necessary steps will be taken to upgrade the ST School to DIET.

BLOCK RESOURCE CENTRE (BRC)

BRC acts as a link between STS and CRC. It will be a forum where the CRCs will meet and interact with each other and share their experiences. The difficulties faced at the CRCs Level will be solved at BRC. 09 BRCs will be established in the District one for each Block. Further it will provide guidance and technical support to 205 CRCs and will also monitor and evaluate the functioning of CRCs. The BRC will be provided with office building, whole time coordinator and other official staff, library facilities, furniture, equipment and resources groups. The BRC will have residential facilities. The functions of the BRC are as follows:

- To provide academic, technical support and guidance to CRCs
- To act as a field Laboratory of DRIJ for testing training materials development at the District Level.
- To develop locally relevant materials.
- To conduct research activities at the Block Level on Block specific issues.
- To organize orientation Program for teachers, other functionaries under the guidance of DRG members.
- To monitor the functioning of the Schools.
- To participate in the monthly meetings of CRCs.
- To hold monthly meeting at BRC for review of academic progress and implementation of Programmed Activities.
- To develop and supply TLM
- To document & disseminate the information.
- To organize seminars discussion workshop.

Cluster Resource Centre (CRC)

Being the lowest Level in the hierarchy, it plays a vital role in organizing the activities of the Program at the grass root Level keeping coordination with the community. For the better and effective functioning of the CRC, all the CRC's will be provided with office building, whole time coordinator, furniture, equipment library facilities etc. It will act as a forum for sharing of experiences of teachers among themselves. Resource support will be provided by the CRC to the teachers for better classroom performance. At the CRC teachers will meet once in a month to solve their academic problems. Each CRC will be provided with grants for conducting of research activities, micro Planning & School mapping.

153 CRC's will be established in the District to cater the academic need of the teachers. The functions of the CRC are as follows.

- Training in multi-grade teaching to teachers.
- Training of VEC members.
- Capacity building of teachers
- Development of TLM.
- Organizing awareness campaign
- Organizing rallies Melas, Padayatra, Patha Pranta Natak etc

- Coordinating with ECCE activities
- Providing feed back to BRC and Schools.
- Organizing meeting of PTA, MTA, NGOs etc.
- Training teachers on different subjects.

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT ACTIVITIES:

It is a part of carefully. It is no doubt local community leaders can be materialized thru under this provision of existing School build

6 EDUCATION FOR SC/ST:

In Kendrapara District only 0.40% of the total population are S. C and 19.62% are SC population.

7 GIRLS' EDUCATION:

DEEP reaffirms the commitment of Universalisation of Primary Education giving emphasis on equal and universal participation of all children irrespective of caste, creed, religion, sex, place of birth etc. In the light of the above commitment it is

obvious that special attention is required to bring the socially disadvantaged groups of children to the main stream for the achievement of desired objectives. Among the disadvantaged groups girls occupy one half of the eligible child population who need special attention for their participation in Primary Education. Because of low enrolment and retention of girls as compared with boys, the gender gap has widened, which is to be reduced through this Programmed activity.

It is a wrong notion that educating girls is unnecessary as they are to run the house and after marriage, they will have to leave their parental house and will take care of the children and also the house-hold activities. In this circumstance the girls do not get adequate support of their respective families to continue their studies.

In Kendrapara District the retention of girls is very poor especially among the poor and backward communities. The obvious reasons behind this are the lack of awareness among the parents, due to low literacy, tendency of engaging the girls to meet the domestic needs like engaging them in sibling care, negative attitude of teachers and parents towards girls' education, distance of Schools from their residence.

Low Female Literacy:

Kendrapara has 77.33% of literacy out of total population in the District. In the comparison to that the woman literacy is 67.29%, which is approximately 10% less of the total literate. From the survey of enrollment position of age group 5-14 years, it is observed that the rate of enrollment of girls is lower than the enrollment of boys in the District. There are some GPs where the literacy of women is very low which pulls back the total literacy of the GP and down the percentage women literacy at the Block and District Level. Steps may be taken to literate these literate women to the NGOs, Mahila Samitis by mobilizing adult Education in these GPs.

Factor related to non enrolment and dropout:-

1. Poverty and in different attitude of proper learning.
2. Engagement of children in House hold.
3. Lack of awareness of parents in Primary Education
4. Engagement of children as agricultural Labour
5. Low literacy of parents & poverty

Due to repeated flood, cyclone and regular crop failure migration is a major problem in Kendrapara. After careful study and from the statistics of house hold survey, it is found that a large section of School going children remain out of Schools. In this way there is a continuous interruption of Primary Schooling of children year after years. Due to stagnation the age group of children became higher. Opening of Alternative Schooling is only Alternative for such children. The nature of these Alternative Schooling need to be a quasi-residential and may be opened in each Block in the specific area. The Education support may be brought from DEEP and the food will be provided by M.D.M.

1. Suggested Strategies:-

Due to over age and as they were away from formal School only EGS School is suitable where they can study soon and also to reach the minimum Level of learning

2. Temporary Alternative School:- (AIE)

These temporary camp Schools will be opened in the specific area of each Block. It will be temporary quasi-Residential School having a provision of Mid-Day-Meals facilities. The teachers engaged in that School will reside with the students for the temporary period of six months till their parents return from the migrated area.

1. Mid-Day-Meals will be provided by District authority. It needs convergence with W & CD.
2. The house for camp School will be provided by the community and District Authority and Educational expenditure including contingency in EGC model will be provided by DEEP.
3. The teachers of Alternative Schooling will be paid by DEEP.
4. After completion of course the students are to be allowed to give examination and they will come in to main stream.
5. They may join the formal School if their parents desire to continue their study without interruption.
6. Camp A/S house will be provided by the community support by the District Authority.

Development of Database – conduct of door to door survey

The accurate details of children, who are in School and out of School and the particulars of out of School children, i.e. the nature of work they are involved with, along with other family background is very much necessary for Planning UEE. This can form the basis to workout various strategies for the Schooling of out of School children i.e. never enrolled and dropped out simultaneously in the age group of 6 - 14 years.

Therefore, family survey was Planned and conducted in all the Bastees of the selected Districts. The required information was collected in a proforma to capture the information of children aged 0 - 14 year family wise and Bastee wise in each and every School catchment area. The information is pertained to children Education viz. enrolment, Institution where studying, dropouts, reasons for out of School children, nature of the handicap if any, social status, in addition to capturing children's family background. Village Level meetings with parents of out of Schools children and never enrolled children, women groups, Bastee elders and youth activists.

Training and capacity building

The District-Level core teams were oriented at state Level by the state-Level core team at State Project Officer. These core teams further trained District-Level core team. Further, all the District-Level core teams have been trained at District Level in a two-day orientation programme.

The District Level core teams have conducted a one-day orientation programme to all village Level core teams at District headquarters along with distribution of survey sheets, and guidelines.

The family survey was conducted during July and August in all the Bastees monitored by District Level core teams. The Bastee core team has developed a list of out of School children manually both never enrolled and dropped out along with other particulars and displayed at every School. However, all the family survey sheets have been computerized and checked the output as a process of validation, involving the community in all the Bastees.

Development of Village Education development Plans

The entire process of generation of Database on children in the age group of 6 - 14 yr. Who are in School and out of School with family background have been developed with involvement of local community. The community along with teachers have displayed the names of out of School children in the village.

A series of village meetings have been conducted during September onwards on a fortnightly basis and take up validation of survey Data as a first measure for UEE. The village meeting is represented by other community based organizations like School Committees, Youth groups, NGOs, etc. After validation, the community discussed the village Educational status and developed village Educational Plans. The nodal Officer of the District and as well as village also participated in the deliberations. All the village Level Plans have been furnished to District Level team.

Development of District Plans

The District-Level core groups have discussed the salient features of village Level Education Plans and consolidated and developed District Level Educational Plan. These Plans again randomly discussed in village. The perceptions of Bastee elders and parents have been taken into consideration to reflect the local spirit for the improvement of Education of children.

Development of District Elementary Education Plan

The District Planning team has gone through the entire process of Planning starting from village Level. The team members have actively participated in the meetings of village, campaigns, District -Level meetings and finally developed District elementary Education Plan in conformity with the guidelines of SSA and as well as State Project Office, to achieve UEE in fourteen Districts. Further, it has also worked out an Annual Work Plan & Budget for 8 years (2002- 2010) showing the prioritized activities to be carried out for the year 2002-2003.

Awareness Programme

Education is a right to all. It is found that some people are there who do not come forward to take Education or want to make their children to be educated. It may be due to poverty or lack of common sense or lack of Schooling facilities. Even today some hatred ness is also there among common people towards some categories of people. A child of leprosy parent or a child of sex worker does not fill it sound to attend a School. People do not see them in good eyes. Some migrating times are there whose children do not get a regular Schooling facility. Girls- mostly of SC & ST categories do not come to School. Boys become dropouts. Children at footpath & bastee areas mostly do not come to School even if Schooling facility is there. Child labour is an another factor that for which some do not get chances to come to School.

Social out look for Education for all is yet in a narrow vision that the common people do not give importance on Primary Education. For which illiteracy is a disease in the society. For this to motivate the common people with a vision to eradicate illiteracy a prime factor Every man or Woman should know the importance of Education as a highly essential factor to live a better life. Education is a light that drives out a darkness to realize a subject as it is.

Keeping the above factors in view District has Planned for wide awareness programme among the people to motivate to get Education near the door or at best at a distance of 1 k.m. from home For this media services may be availed, cultural Centres at different local places may be utilized, mobilizers may be appointed, placards, wall magazines, leaflets may distributed among the people of such back ward habitations and villages Opera Pendals, Pala, Daskathias etc. may be arranged for community mobilization. The necessities of EGS Centres and AIE programmes are to be widely propagated NGOs may be requested for the purposes. For this District has Planned and placed Budget proposals to meet the funds

Management & Information System

It is an important component of Planning and implementation SSA. It is to look after the setup of the programme and to look after -

1. Infrastructure facilities, ILM, Furniture, Equipment etc. of the Primary & Upper Primary Schools.
2. Child population.
3. Out of School children.
4. Teachers information.
5. Achievement of pupils.
6. Enrollment, Retention
7. School - Pupil Ratio, Classroom – Pupil Ratio, Teacher – Pupil Ratio
8. Progress in the project.

It objects on the Database Primary Education Level, to minority enrollment and retention, performances, implementation of all programmes and scheme under SSA. As it covers a wide range of service a Budget proposal on unit cost is placed for it in the District Plan.

Research, Evaluation, Supervision & Monitoring

Research under the project is regarded as a valuable and guiding course for taking of various new initiatives for realizing the objectives of Universalisation of Elementary Education.

Mainstreaming of out of School children, improvement of pupil abilities in the language, arithmetic, creating interesting classrooms, disabled children Education, net

working of pictures Education for focused group - SC,ST, Girls , ECCE, Minorities shall be the objectives on research. Necessary training program will be conducted to the field staff.

Evaluation aspects shall include

1. Functional aspects of various initiatives and their impact
2. Progress in forms of achievement of objective of SSA
3. Participatory evaluation through community participation
4. Peoples achievement

District supervision and monitoring shall include the chairs of DIET staff, DPO, DRG, BPO, CRCC. This network of supervising and monitoring will take care of the output of the entire system of the scheme will help of the society.

Girls Education

Education of girls is the Primary focus in Sarva Sikhya Abhiyan . In all the activities of SSA efforts will be made mainstream gender concerns. The proportion of girls in the total enrollment is indicating of their forward march. Still a good number of girls are dropped out and non-admitted. Education for girls of SC and ST categories and other back ward classes is the main focus in SSA and AIE programme. Followings are the strategies purposed for mainstreaming the girls who are out of School.

1. Appointing a local lady as AIE teacher
2. ECC Centres to encourage the adult girls to attend Schools
3. Special bridge Centre for girls (both residential and non-residential)
4. Separate toilet facilities in Schools.
5. Orientation programme for teachers on girls Education
6. Development of forums of women teachers to take up awareness campaigns on girls Education specially on low female literacy areas – village and bastees.

ICDS dept may be requested to co-operate in convergence.

District has Planned and placed Budget proposals on this connection.

Provision for Cluster persons

Cluster persons are to render valuable services in both EGS and AIE system on Primary Education. Resource Centres are opened at Block Level and Cluster Levels in each Block. Cluster coordinator are to be placed in these Levels who are to help the BPO at BRC. As these persons are to work as whole time coordinators they are to get their salaries, office building (CRC building), furniture, equipment, library facilities etc. It shall be like a forum to interact among the teachers. Teachers are to get direct resource support from these cluster persons and keep wide contact with the BRC. CRC's are therefore to act as via media between the BRC and teachers. Therefore each CRCC will be provided with grants for research activities, micro Planning and School mapping.

The cluster resource Centre has a vital role to play in the total structure of planning to get the cent percent result on enrollment and classroom performances. Hence keeping in view of the above importance the Budget proposals are placed. Block as a unit shall look after the entire process of functioning in Primary Education and BPO as the pivotal of system necessary accommodations are purposed in the Budget for his office. BRC buildings whole time coordination and official staff, library facilities, furniture, equipment and resource groups and residential facilities shall be given to him for this Budget proposal have been placed.

Teachers Training

Teachers are the fast persons to come in direct contact of the learners and to influence them to get proper Education by various of means. The innovative and Alternative Education can basically be fulfilled as the true senesce of the term only by the teachers. The teacher has to act as the friend, philosopher and guide of the learners. As the learning mainly depend upon the child's own attitude and aptitude, the teacher as a first observer is to chanalise the whole thing accordingly successfully. There depends the success of imparting Education. So it is very essential to train up the teacher to modify the child's behaviour and inculcate the essence of Education in him /her. Teachers of different- higher / lower academically qualifications are found in service. They are also of different individual capacities. Taking all differences into accounts teachers training program is to be fixed in a common manner. There should be provision for orientation training program. Sources of information - library facilities, news paper, audio visual instrumentals etc. should be made available to the teacher. A Budget provisional has been placed on this by the District Planning.

Exposures visit

District has Planned to send its resource persons and outstanding calibre's to other states or Districts to know how the respective units managed their Primary Education to achieve the goal of Universalisation. It shall help in earning first hand knowledge on this prospective of different systems of study and Management. It shall enrich the resources and helped to impart Education to all in this District more effectively. Keeping the above in views Budget proposals have been placed to allot financial assistance.

It also shall carry the proposals of inviting exposures and experienced resource personals from other states or Districts and a two hour training camps. Our trainees may hope to gain more ideas on this subject. The interaction between the outers and the inner shall facilitates the exchange of ideas so that the process of Alternative and innovative shall be easier.

AIE to beneficiaries

AIE is a focus program to educate the focus group of out of School children. It has importance to carry regular supervision and monitoring. The beneficiaries under this scheme are scattered in different areas and allotted for different time-fixed Schooling. The educators have to give different time monitoring to the beneficiaries. The Migrants, disabled children, child labours, adult girls students come under this category. A good no of migrants from Bangladesh have settled in the District in a scattered area. Some have Schooling facilities, some EGS Schools are purposed to be opened in slum areas for rest of the villages or Padas. Still there are some scattered house folds are leaving out of EGS norms. District has Planned to offer them AIE Schooling facilities and Budget proposal have been placed.

Moral Teaching Camp

It is detected that some students in the age group of 9-14 suffers from adolescence for which they do not like to attend the School rather avoid Schooling and add to drop outs. So also happens to a child suffering from Leprosy . Some times other children at School hate him and on the other hand that child feels unsound to sit with them. In either of the cases illiteracy of the family stands as barrier to know the reasons and causes the drop out of the learner. Hence moral teaching camps are to be arranged to make the child aware of his fault and people not to consider leprosy as sin, but a disease curable under medical treatment. District has planned with Budget proposal to regularize such type of dropout cent percent by 2002 A.D.

IED

As revealed from survey Kendrapara District has 1056 IED children of different age groups from 5-14 years of age. As these children are physically inefficient in comparison to others they generally neglected by guardians and they also feel neglected. To avoid such unhygienic state of mind of the people to educate such child and make him/ her stand with others on foot to foot. Such type of child have equal right to be educated. Keeping above point in view District has Planned with Budget proposals to provide him/ her all kinds of reading writing materials, physically equipment, teacher to teach at home and medical & health check up by Doctors.

Intervention of disabled Children

1. Identification of Children with special Educational need.
2. Mainstreaming of disabled children into special Schools depending upon the type of extent of disability
3. Convergence with other dept working for the disabled viz /health, PRW, women & child welfares
4. Efforts for integrating the disabled with the mainstreaming Schools

CHAPTER - VI

URBAN AREA DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

It is absorbed from the Survey Report that a good no. of children are dropped out of the Schools in the Municipal and NAC areas of Kendrapara District. Some have not enrolled in Schools. Child Labour and Migrants constitute the basic factor of such problems. The children in the slum areas come under this category as they do not attend schools on plea of Poverty or Child Labour. District has planned to make easy to every child in the urban areas of the District to get Primary Education to Achieve the goal of universalisation of Primary Education. For this Mini Schools, Bridge Course Centre, Residential Bridge Course Centre, Girls Camp for the Girls children of Minority communities, Communities awareness programme basically on Women awareness in the minority communities, particularly in Muslim Bastis. Remedial Coaching Centres are to be opened for low learners in the town areas of the District, who do not attained School regularly.

Keeping the above factors in views, the District has planned with budget proposals to reach at the target of universalisation of Primary Education.

Kendrapara Municipality has 150 children of age group 6-11 and 276 children at the age group 11-14 which are out of Municipality to achieve the goal. Pattamundai NAC has 272 children of age group 6-11 and 237 children of age group 11-14. 1 EGS Centre and 9 AIE Centres are planned to be opened for the above purposes.

CHAPTER - VII

General Statements on Budget Provisions of Kendrapara District

Every benevolent and prospective plan needs a progressive and systematic Budget to establish the scheduled target in the proposed way. It is useless to plan a scheme without Budget proposals and to chalk out a Budget proposal without planning the scheme. Money is a power to be utilize in the right way to get the maximum outcome. An up right plan chanalises the treasure house into a vision of success and materializes the financial power in to wealthy symbol of behavioural livelihood.

Keeping the above aspects in view the noble target of industrialization of Primary education in the Kendrapara district, a suitable master planning is chalked out With utmost care to every corner of demand for getting primary education for everyone in the district. A progressive Budget is placed under proposal by the district to materialized the plan by scheduling physical target to be achieved. In the Budget every care has been taken to allocate funds to every bit of popular target concerned not to exclude any single child of the district, to be deprived of the birth right of education. For the above proposal intervention wise Budget estimate from 2002-03 to 2009-10 has been placed with physical needs and cost units. The summary of such Budget proposals are shown in the table No. 6.1. of the this book.

Intervention wise Budget proposal with cost unit

1. Project Management:

This item comes first as it holds the entire system of planning and key points to management. Total structure of the managements the project includes this item which shows the net work of the system step by step.

One District Project Officer holds offices at the top of the District Level to manage the system. Next to him comes District Project Co-ordinator on the Civil Work of the Project work. As this project intensifies on the universalisation of Pri. Education. The question of Pedagogy is of the most important factor to it. So there is a provision of coordinator at the District Level. Similarly the services of Coordinators , Planning & Management Information System reserves importance, other than these the coordinator Media & IED, Girls Education, ECCE, Community Mobilisation & SC/ST Education, Junior Engineer on Civil Work, Sr. Programme Assistant. Jr. Programme Assistant holds the respective post to carry out the project. Hence the Salary and their service facilities are allocated for these persons. Other than these financial allotments miscellaneous contingency for DPO, his office Consumables, TA & DA for Staff of DPO, Hiring cost of Vehicles and POI charges for three vehicles, Purchase and installation of Fax (One Time), Installation of Phone for DPO(one time) charges for telephone & Fax Equipments and furniture for DPO, Rent charges for any

hired building, electricity and Water Charges for District Level Offices, Library facility with books and journals and periodicals with daily magazines are to be required. It must include the consultancy charges for experts in pedagogy, involvement, documentation, finance, participatory planning and management, review of the progress by National and State decision, Monitoring and supervision by District Office and Annual Budget Report preparation, Salary for Data Entry Operator, Salary Contingent Peon including the Budget provision to allot funds as per the unit cost stated in the table no. 5.1. Total management cost about 4% of the Total Budget and amounts to Rs.461.76 lakhs from 2002-2003 to 2009-2010 under proposals

2. Civil Work 33%

Special care has been taken towards the civil work of the project which cost the major part of the Budget. It includes the total construction work. It also includes the construction of new school buildings and repairing of old ones. Construction of BRC, CRC, the official residential facilities for DPO, BPO, Supply of drinking water facility, Electricity to all schools and construction of boundary wall. Separate Toilets for Boys & Girls are to be constructed. Other constructive work i.e needed at places in the net work of the project of UEE are to be included in this item. At present the Budget is proposed in a phased manner from year 2002-03 to 2009-2010 at unit cost meet a demand of Rs.3788.72 lakhs (d) 33% of Total Budget.

3. Pedagogical Improvement

It is the most important element on which the fundamental aspects of the UEE must depend. It directly affects the standard and quality of education to all level of children of the age group 5-11 and 11-14 years in the society. A reasonable amount has been placed in the Budget in phased manner from 2002-03 to 2009-10. It includes teachers training, training of community leaders, provision for research, evaluation, Supervision and Monitoring of the academicals aspects of the Budget. It includes the visit of experts and resource persons. As the development of capacity of quality improvement in the view of Primary Education is the basic cause of Pedagogy, every steps concerned to that effect is undertaken. Supply of FTV, TLL, TLE, Proposals of Teachers Training, Hand book for MLE based teaching. Preparation of unit test and their evaluation, materials, improvising the quality of existing pre service teacher education, improvising activity base teaching learning process. Providing remedial teaching and enrichment programme at due accordingly all class rooms. District has planned to spend 454.482 lakhs of rupees from 2002-03 to 2009-10 which is the largest part on the Budget proposals. Contingency to BRC, Furniture to BRC, CRC, 20 days service training to all teachers, 30 days training to fresh recruited teachers & SIG to all schools

4. Access of Deprived Children

District has planned to enroll each and every child of the age group 5-11 and 11-14 into the school with a special focus of the adolescent girls, dropouts, boys and girls of SC/ST and minor communities, Migrant Children, Handicaps, Child Labourers, Children living on Footpath, Orphans. Care has been taken not to deprive any child in the district of the primary education. Every steps are taken through EGS & AIE norms to fulfill the goal of UEE. For this district has planned with a Budget property of Rs 1027 898 from 2002-03 to 2009-10.

5. Management & Information System

For this section of the Project District has planned to supply MIS equipments to the cell into software, air conditioning to MIS rooms with furniture and other consumable articles. Rs. 57 lakhs have been under Budget proposal under unit cost for 2002 to 2010.

6. Planning & Management

District has planned to prepare AWP, BMVR & GP educational profiles and give orientation training to resource persons on the planning process. For this a Budget has been proposed.

7. Community Mobilisation and Participation

Every success of plans depend upon the positive response and cooperation of the community for whom it is served. Hence for the successful of the UEE and formation of EGS & AIE centres units a cordial community participation is to be expected.

8. Girl's Education

Girls are generally neglected mostly in minor communities, SC/ST communities and in illiterate habitations and villages. With an active community mobilization and financial support to the families the girls will come forward to the mainstreaming of UEE. The adolescent girls suffers from certain problems in schools and in habitations which need to be irradiated. Keeping above points in view District has planned to train up the Teachers and administrators, CRCC, VEC and community Leaders to prepare training module of MTA. To achieves the goal district has put a Budget proposal of Rs.106 lakhs to be spent from 2002-10.

9. SC/ST Education

Formation of DRG and workshop on SC/ST education, Training to community leaders, educated youth in specific GPs. Training workshop to SC mobilizers are to be undertaken to achieve this goal. This district has planned to spend 96 lakhs in the Budget proposal during the period 2002-10.

10. ECCE

It is very grass root programme to achieve the goal of UEE. District has planned to take care of every child from the time of uttering mother tongue and the see the outer world to get a directive education to make hem/her self stand as a human being on this earth. Training to supervisors and ECCE provision for pre school kit to AWC and ECCE centres, training to AWC workers, opening of new ECCE centres, toys & learning materials to AWC have been given importance at strategies to achieves the goal. District has planned with Budget proposal of Rs.95 lakhs from 2002-10.

11. Computer Education

As it is a progressives part of modern education on Science and technology district has planned to impact education to children in some of selected schools and put a Budget provision of 103 lakhs for the purpose by 2002-10.

12. Integrated Education for Deprived Children

A good number of such children are deprived of getting primary education by the common schooling programme of the present time. They also have every right to get education. Some disable children have proved their outstanding caliber by virtue of their efforts through out the world. The planning of UEE has a focus target on such type of children. So the district planning of Kendrapara has the provision to give them full support by providing uniformity among others, adding appliances, providing medical assistance, health check up and in cases giving residential education to such children. A Budgetary provision of Rs.116.976 lakhs has been placed under the proposal for the year 2002-10.

13. Research & Evaluation

It is very important to evaluate the progress on achievement and find scopes to conduct more research work on the object. It shall be make every participant more resourceful and active in the field of teaching and administration. Hence district planning has a proposal of Budget of Rs.130 lakhs to be spend from 2002-10.
