Draft Master Plan

for

Universalisation of Elementary Education in Mizoral during 6th Plan (1976-83)

The Conference of Education Minister held on August 10-11,1977 adopted resolutions on Universalisation of Elementary Education in India. The State Govt.were requested to prepare Master Plan for the implementation of the programme.

In accordance with the decissions of the Conference and of the Working Group on Universalisation of Elementary Education, Education Department of Govt. of Mizoram Union Territory has decided to prepare Master Plans to cover the whole of Mizoram during five years of the 6th Plan to universalise Elementary Education.

Under this scheme there will be a State Level Committee comprising several members until a State Institute of Education/State Council of Educational Research & Training is established. The Directorate of Education and the supervisory staff of the Department will have to be vastly strengthened to deal with Universalisation of Elementary Education in Mizoram effectively.

For the successful implementation of the scheme the administrative machinery in all stages is proposed to be strengthened during the Sixth Plan as follows -

Since the outbreak of disturbances in Mizoram in 1966, villages have been grouped together at Grouping Centres in Aizawl and Lunglei Districts. But grouping of villages have not been done in Chhimtuipui District. Many people have gone back to their old villages where the Education Department will have to make some arrangements for Elementary Education.

The total population of Mizoram on 1.1.1978
as estimated by the Department of Economics & Statistics,
Covt.of Nizoram was 4,45,461. The achievement of enrolment

in Class I-V (6-11 years) for 1976-77 was 87% and 92% for 1977-78. According to the Directorate of Economics and Statics, Mizoram the growth rate in Mizoram 1971-78 is 34%. The total population in 1983 will be 50,3998. There are at present 6000 pupils to be covered and another 6452 pupils + 1548 outside age group during the next five years calculating 16% of the age group 6-11 years. Hence to achieve universalisation of this age group, a little more than 14,000 children have to be enrolled during the plan and retained in schools. In the group of 11-14 years, the enrolment of 48% was achieved during 1976-77, while the target of 1977-78 was 53%. As this has been generally achieved, it may be calculated as 9% of the child population of the age group of 11-14 per usual procedure that there are 22,000 children in the age group of 11-14 years who are yet to be enrolled in schools during the Sixth Plan period. Therefore, the total plan target to be covered for full universalisation of Mementary Education during the 6th Plan comes to 36,000 children in the age group 6-14 years.

It is therefore necessary to open at least 300 new Primary Schools in the villages where no Elementary Educational facilities are provided and at least 100 new Middle Schools in the villages where Middle School Education facilities are not available. It is also proposed to maintain part-time education for the age group 11-14 year as follows:-

There are as many as 547 villages in Mizoram including new villages and small villages in the interior places. It is, therefore, anticipated that 30 boys and girls of the age group of 6-14 yrs who cannot join the formal day schools due to aconomic and other reasons, but able to join morning schools as part time education, will be available in 300 villages.

As regard the manner by which the objectives should be achieved and keeping in view the general positive attitude of the public towards education, it was the concensus of opinion that instead of going in for the two streams of formal and non-formal Elementary Education, it would be better to adopt fultime and part-time schooling in Mizoram keeping in view the attainment of the basic minimum of literacy, numeracy and inculcation of the social and civil responsibilities. In both part-time and

full-time schools, the content of education should be meaning-ful and relevant to the socio-economic needs. Part-time Elementary Education may be imparted by organising three hour classes in the morning from say 5:30 A.M. to 8:30 A.M.

In the whole of Mizoram there are 109 Grouping Centres and 138 recognised villages. In these grouping and recognised villages there are Primary schools and some cases Middle and High Schools also are available. Apart from the Grouping Centres and recognised villages there are 300 villages and 100 habitations (thlawhbawk) where there are no schooling facilities. As stated earlier, persons grouped in the Grouping Centres have gone back to these thlawhbawk villages. It is now the duty of the Government to give schooling facilities to these Thlawhbawk villages in order to universalise Elementary Education.

I. REQUIREMENT FOR OPENING PRIMARY SCHOOLS:

There are 300 villages without schooling facilities where we shall have to give at least minimum facility for education.

Opening of Part-time Schools (Age-group 11-14)

Out of 547 villages, 203 villages already have Middle Schools. One hundred more Middle Schools are proposed to be opened under the present scheme in the villages where there are 60 hous or more. There are still 244 villages which have no Middle School facilities. In the villages where Middle School facilities are not available as also in the villages where Middle School sare provide it is estimated that an average of 30 boys and girls of the age group 11-14, will be available for part-time education of the Middle School level since these children are generally engaged in manual labour and wok in the Jhuns, part-time education may be provided for them in the morning before they go to their daily labour in the Juns, etc. Financial requirements for such part-time education during the 6th Plan period are as follows:-
