INTRODUCTION

Regional imbalances do exist in the field of educational development just as in urbanisation, industrialisation, distribution of income and wealth etc. With a view to highlight the regional imbalances in the educational sector, the Ministry of Education and Culture brings out the publication "Educational Statistics : District-wise", quinquennially.

2. A volume of this nature was first published by the National Council of Educational Research and Training in 1960-61. Thereafter it was decided that such reviews will be brought out in respect of each State every five year by the Ministry of Education and Culture. Accordingly, the reviews for the year 1965-66 were brought out by this Ministry.

3. For making inter-district comparisons possible, some important indices such as enrolment ratios, percentage of trained teachers and per capita expenditure on education have been worked out. These indices show wide range of variations between the districts and hence the need for formulating educational plans at the district-level.

II AREA AND POPULATION

4. Mizo Hills, in 1971 was one district of Assam/State. It was separated from Assam State in 1972 and the new Union Territory of Mizoram came into being with three districts in it, i.e. Aizawl, Lunglei and Chhimtuipui. Hence area of the newly formed Union Territory of Mizoram is exactly the same (i.e. 21087 Sq.km.) as that of the Mizo Hill district of erstwhile Assam State. The area of various districts varies from 12,892 Sq.Km. in Aizawl district to 3,958 Sq. Km. in Chhimtuipui district.

The population of 'Mizo Hills' district of Assam was 3.32 lakhs in 1971 and it increased to 4.01 lakhs in 1976-77 (2.06 lakh males and 1.95 females). The Aizawl district had 59.7% of the total population of Mizoram whereas Lunglei and Chhimtuipui districts had 21.5% and 18.8% of the total population respectively.

6. The density of population per Sq. Km. for the Union Territory of Mizoram increased from 16 in 1971 to 19 in 1976-77. Tables I gives general view of the extent of variations in area, population and density of population among the three districts.

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7. The total population of the Union Territory as well as population of different age-groups for the year 1971 and 1977 given in the report are based on the revised population projections (as on 1st March of the year) available from the office of Registrar General of India. District-wise estimates of population in the age-groups 6-11, 11-14 and 14-17 have been based on the following formula:-

To get the sex-wise break up of the total population in the various age groups of the district, first of all the girls population is estimated using the above equation with only difference that in the above formula total population is replaced by the girls population. The enrolment is obtained by the residual method i.e.

Boys population in the age-group 6-11

Total population in the age-group 6-11-

.. Girls population in the age-group 6-11

Similar formulas are used for estimating the district-wise population in the age-groups 11-14 & 14-17 years.

8. Of the total estimated population of Mizoram in 1977, the population of the Children in the age-group 6-11 was 56.4 thousand, consisting of 27.8 thousand Boys and 28.6 thousand Girls. This formed 14% of the total population of the Union Territory.

9. The estimated population in the age-group 11-14 in 1977 was 31.2 thousands, consisting of 15.4 thousand boys and 15.9 thousand girls. The population in this age-group formed 7.79% of the total population.

10. Similarly, the population in the age-group 14-17 was 28.5 thousands, consisting of 14.2 thousands boys and 14.3 thousand girls. This formed 7.1% of the total population of the Union Territory.

11. Thus, of the total population of 4.02 lakhs of the Union Territory of Mizoram the school going population in the age-group 6-17 was 1.16 lakhs which consisted of 57.4 thousand boys and 58.8 thousand girls. The population in the age-group 6-17 accounted for 28.9% of the total population. The percentage for boys was 14.3% while for girls it formed 14.6%. District-wise details may be seen in Statement No.3.

III - LITERACY

12. According to the 1971 census, the effective literacy rate i.e. the number of literates per-hundred of the population, for the population in the age-group 4+, in the Union Territory was 62.7. The literacy rates for males and females were 70.1 and 54.7 respectively. Statement No. 7 gives the data on literates.

IV - GENERAL REVIEW

(a) INSTITUTIONS

13. The total number of Educational Institutions in the Union Territory increased from 607 in 1970-71 to 1,040 in 1976-77, indicating an increase of 71.3% during the period of 6 years. In 1976-77 Aizawl had the largest number of institutions (69.1%) followed by Chhimtuipui (17.5) and Lunglei (13.9%). The district-wise details are given in Statement No. 1.

(b) ENROLMENT

14. The total enrolment in all the recognised educational institutions in the Union Territory increased from 81.8 thousand in 1970-71 to 125.5 thousand in 1976-77 during the period of 6 years. This shows an average exponential growth rate of 7.4% per annum of the enrolment during the period under review. Aizawl accounted for 71.3% of enrolment followed by Lunglei (15.3%) and Chhimtuipui (13.0%).

Table 2 and Statement No.4 give detailed data in respect of enrolment for the year 1970-71 and the year 1976-77.

15. The percentage of girls to total enrolment remained almost the same during the period 1970-71 to 1976-77. Amongst the districts Aizawl had the highest percentage of girls i.e. 47% whereas Chhimtuipui accounted for 44% of girls only.

16. The total enrolment in all the recognised educational institutions as a percentage of total population increased from 24.6 in 1970-71 to 31.2 in 1976-77. The percentage enrolment to total population in 1976-77 was the highest in Chhimtuipui (32.7) and lowest in Lunglei (26.2). Details may be seen in Statement No.4.

Extent of coverage of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes:-

17. Of the total enrolment of 1,25,561 in 1976-77 only 27 students belonged to Scheduled Castes in Mizoram which is a negligible figure. However, bulk of the students i.e. 1,24,647 (66,624 boys and 58,023 girls) out of 1,25,561 belonged to the Scheduled Tribes community which works out to 99.3% for the Union Territory.

Amongst the districts the co-efficient of equality varied from 123.5% to 133.9%.

Details of these figures can be seen from Statement No.9.

(d) TEACHERS :

18. There were 2,344 teachers in the Union Territory in 1970-71 and this number increased to 4,101 in 1976-77 showing average annual increase of 7.1%. Among the Districts, Aizawl was having the highest share of teachers (71.7%) followed by Lunglei (16.3%) and the lowest share was in Chhimtuipui (12.0%). Women teachers formed 28.9% of the total number of teachers. Among the school teachers, the percentage of trained teachers was as low as 41.2% at the Union Territory level. Among the districts it varied from 30.6% in Chhimtuipui to 52.8% in Lunglei. Details of these figures can be seen from Statements No.4 and 6.

(e) EXPENDITURE:-

19. The total expenditure, excluding expenditure on Directorate and Inspectorate, on all recognised institutions, in the Union Territory was Rs.84.37 lakhs in 1970-71 which increased to 4.20 crores in 1976-77 showing an average annual increase of 55.9% of the total expenditure in 1976-77, 72.7% was spent in Aizawl, 18% in Lunglei and 9.3% in Chhimtuipui districts. The average expenditure per institution increased from Rs.13.9 thousand in 1970-71 to Rs.40.4 thousand in 1976-77. The district-wise expenditure per institution varied from Rs. 52 thousand in Lunglei to Rs. 22 thousand in Chhimtuipui.
20. The average expenditure per head of population increased from Rs.55.38 in 1970-71 to Rs. 104.6 in 1976-77. The district-wise expenditure per head of population varied from Rs. 78.4 in Chhimtuipui to Rs. 110.3 in Aizawl. The district wise details are given in Statement No.5.

V - PRE-PRIMARY EDUCATION

21. The number of pre-primary schools in the Union Territory was 12 in the year 1970-71 and during the period of six years. i.e. from 1970-71 to 1976-77 all these schools were upgraded and became part of the primary schools.
22. The total enrolment in the pre-primary classes was 614 (boys 305 and girls 309) in 1970-71 which increased to 4,067 (2,035 boys and 2,032 girls) in 1976-77 showing an average exponential growth rate of 37.6% per annum. Of the total enrolment (4,067) i.e. 99.5% students belonged to the Scheduled in 1976-77.

VI - PRIMARY EDUCATION

(a) Institutions and Teachers

23. The number of primary schools in Mizoram increased from 376 in 1970-71 to 510 in 1976-77 showing an increase of 35.6% over the period of 6 years. The highest number of primary schools was (313) in Aizawl and the lowest number (88) was in Lunglei districts.

24. On the average, in 1970-71, a primary school was serving an area of 56.1 Sq.Kms. Over the period of 6 years this position improved and a primary school was serving an area of 41.3 Sq. Kms. The average area served by a school was the minimum in the case of Chhimpuipui (36.3 Sq. Kms.) and maximum in Lunglei (51.6 Sq. Kms.)

25. The population served by a primary school in the Union Territory registered a decrease from 881 in 1970-71 to 788 in 1976-77. Among the districts the population served by a primary school varied from 885 in Aizawl to 458 in Chhimtuipui. The district-wise details are given in Statement No.11.

26. Total number of teachers in primary schools in the Union Territory increased from 1297 in 1970-71 to 2011 in 1976-77. This shows an average annual increase rate of 9.2%. Women teachers formed 37% of the total number of teachers in 1976-77. The highest percentage of teachers was in Aizawl (70%) whereas the lowest percentage was in Chhimtuipui (11%). Of the total number of teachers working in primary schools in Mizoram only 55.2% were trained teachers as given in Table No.3:-

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


(b) ENROLMENT:

27. The total enrolment in primary schools in Mizoram was 60,096 in 1970-71 which increased to 81,708 in 1976-77. The enrolment in classes I-V also increased from 60,096 (30,714 boys and 29,382 girls) in 1970-71 to 77,641 (40,275 boys and 37,366 girls) in 1976-77 showing an average annual growth rate of 4.4%. The enrolment growth rate for boys was 4.6% and in the case of girls it was 4.1%.


Percentage of Enrollment (Boys) in classes I-V to population

28. The percentage of girls to total enrolment was 48.9 in 1970-71 which slightly decreased to 48.1 in 1976-77. Among the districts it varied from 48.6 in Aizawl and Lunglei to 45.3 in Chhimtuipui. Table No.4 indicates the percentage of girls in the total enrolment during the years 1970-71 and 1976-77.

29. The percentage of enrolment in classes I-V to the total population in the age-group 6-11 i.e. the enrolment ratio is the index of the facilities created at the primary stage. In Mizoram this percentage was 119.7 in 1970-71 and it increased to 137.7 in 1976-77. In 1976-77 the enrolment ratio for boys was 144.9 and in respect of girls it was 130.7 at the Union Territory level. The maximum enrolment ratio in respect of girls was achieved in the district of Chhimtuipui where it was 142.1 and the same was as low

as 109.7 in the district of Lunglei. Amongst the various districts, taking boys and girls together, enrolment ratio was highest i.e. 163.7 in Chhimtuipui and lowest in Lunglei 109.7. The details may be seen in Statement No.12.

(c) ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES AND SCHEDULED TRIBES:

30. All the children enrolled for classes I-V i.e. 60,096 belonged to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes during 1970-71. Of the total enrolment in classes I-V, 77,114 students belonged to Scheduled Tribes in 1976-77 which formed 99.3% of the total enrolment. The coefficient of equality i.e. extent of coverage of Scheduled Tribes at the primary stage is 127.3%. The Scheduled Caste enrolment is negligible in the Union Territory. The details may be seen in Statement No.13.

(d) 31. Expenditure: The total expenditure on primary schools increased from Rs.38.32 lakhs in 1970-71 to 173.08 lakhs in 1976-77 during the period under consideration. This gives an average annual growth rate of 58.6%. The total expenditure on primary schools formed 45.4% of the total expenditure on education in the Union Territory in 1970-71 which decreased to 41.1% in 1976-77. The expenditure per head of population on primary schools was Rs.11.56 in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.43. in the year 1976-77. District-wise details may be seen in Statement No.13.

33. The average cost incurred per student in primary schools was Rs. 63.8 in 1970-71 and it increased to Rs. 211.8 in 1976-77 at the Union Territory level. Among the three districts, the cost per student in primary schools varied from Rs. 177.1 in Chhaintuipui to Rs. 231.0 in Lunglei in 1976-77. There is a negative correlation between the cost per student and the teacher pupil ratio. The cost per student is the highest where the teacher pupil ratio is the lowest. At the Union Territory level, teacher pupil ration was 46 in 1970-71 which improved to 41 in 1976-77. Table No.5 summarises the position.

MIDDLE SCHOOL EDUCATION


(a) INSTITUTIONS AND TEACHERS :

34. Total number of middle schools in Mizoram increased from 160 in 1970-71 to 224 in 1976-77 showing an increase of 40% during the period under review. The largest number of middle schools (147) was in the district of Aizawl. The number of teachers in middle schools increased from 668 in 1970-71 to 1036 in 1976-77 showing an annual growth rate of 9.1%. The number of women teachers formed 21% of the total number of teachers in 1976-77. The highest percentage (74.8) of teachers was in Aizawl district whereas the lowest percentage (12.3) was in Lunglei district. Of the total number of teachers working in middle schools of Mizoram 28.9% were trained teachers as given in Table No. 6.




Percentage Enrollment (Boys) in classes VI-VIII to

35. On an average, in 1970-71, a middle school served an area of 131.8 Sq. Kms. The position improved considerably in 1976-77, and a middle school was available for every 94.1 Sq. Kms.

36. The population served by a middle school in the Union Territory decreased from 2,077 in 1970-71 to 1,794 in 1976-77. Among the districts the population served by a middle school varied from 2,419 in Lunglei to 1,084 in Chhimtulpuia. Statement No.15 shows the district-wise details.

(b) ENROLMENT:

37. The total enrolment in middle schools was 14,476 in 1970-71 which increased to 23,575 in 1976-77. The enrolment at middle stage i.e. in classes VI to VIII increased from 14,476 (8,356 boys and 6,120 girls) in 1970-71 to 23,575 students (12,943 boys and 10,632 girls) in 1976-77 showing an average annual exponential growth rate of 8.4% during the period under consideration.

38. The percentage of enrolment in classes VI to VIII to the total population in the age group 11-14 i.e. enrolment ratio is an index of facilities available at the middle stage of education. In Mizoram this percentage was 51% in 1970-71 which improved to 75.3% in 1976-77. In the case of ^{Aizawl} this ratio improved from 44.3% in 1970-71 to 60.9% in 1976-77. Enrolment ratio was highest (79.2) in Aizawl and lowest in (63.0) in Lunglei district. The details may be seen in statement No.16.

39. The percentage of girls to total enrolment in 1970-71 was 42.3 which increased to 45.1 in 1976-77. Among the districts it varied for 45.5% in Aizawl to 42.8% in Chhimtuipui. Table No.7 indicates the growth in enrolment and the percentage of girls in enrolment during 1970-71 to 1976-77.

(c) ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES AND SCHEDULED TRIBES:

40. Of the total enrolment of 23,575 in classes VI-VIII in 1976-77, 23,443 students belonged to the Scheduled Tribes which works out to 99.4% of the total enrolment. The population of the Scheduled Tribes is 78% of the total population. Thus the coefficient of equality of the Scheduled Tribes works out to 127.4%. In 1970-71 all the students (100%) in classes VI-VIII belonged to the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes.

(d) EXPENDITURE:

41. The total expenditure on middle schools increased from Rs. 22.56 lakhs in 1970-71 to Rs. 114.10 lakhs in 1976-77. This gives an average annual increase of 67.6%.

42. The per capita expenditure on Middle Schools in Mizoram was Rs. 6.8 in 1970-71 which increased to Rs. 28.3 by the year 1976-77. Amongst various districts the per capita expenditure does not vary much from the Union Territory level.

43. The expenditure on middle schools Rs. 22.56 lakhs in 1970-71 formed 26.8% of the total expenditure on education of the Union Territory which marginally increased to 27.1% in 1976-77. Among the districts Chhimtuipui spent 36.2% of the total educational expenditure on middle schools whereas Aizawl and Lunglei each spent about 26% of their total educational expenditure on middle schools.

44. The average cost per student in middle schools was Rs. 155.9 in 1970-71 which increased to Rs. 484.0 in 1976-77. Among the districts cost per student was highest in

Lunglei Rs.541.8 and the lowest in Aizawl Rs.468.2 in 1976-77. There is not much change in in the teacher-pupil ratio during the period under review. Details of expenditure may be seen in Statement No.18 and Table No.8.

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HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATION

(a) INSTITUTIONS AND TEACHERS:

45. Mizo Hills of Assam in 1970-71 had two types of schools i.e., high and higher secondary. By the year 1976-77 all schools at this stage became high schools. As a result there were no higher secondary schools in Mizoram in 1976-77. The number of high/hr. secondary schools in Mizoram increased from 54 to 106 during the period under consideration showing an increase of 100% during the period under review. Among the district in 1976-77 the largest number of high schools (47) was in Aizawl and the smallest number was in Chhimtuipui (69).

46. On an average there was a high/higher secondary school for every 390.5 Sq. Kms. in 1970-71. By 1976-77 the situation improved and a high school served an area of 195.2 Sq. Kms.

47. The average population served by a high/higher secondary school was 6155 in 1970-71 whereas a high school was available for population of 3721 in 1976-77. The average population served by a high school varied from 3,579 in Aizawl to 4158 in Chhituipui. The details may be seen in Statement No. 19.

48. The number of high school teachers increased from 317 in 1970-71 to 649 in 1976-77 showing an average annual increase of 17.5 percent. The number of women teachers was 13.7% w of the total number of teachers in 1976-77. The highest percentage

of teachers (72.4) was in Lizawl district and the lowest percentage (10%) was in Chhimtuipui. Of the total number of teachers working in high schools of Mizoram 17.4% were trained teachers as given in Table No.9 :




(b) ENROLMENT :

49.. The enrolment in high/hr.secondary schools which was 5831 in 1970-71 and it increased to 13,339 in 1976-77. The enrolment at the secondary, stage i.e. in classes IX-XI/IX-X which was 5831 (3803 boys and 2028 girls) in 1970-71 increased to 13,339 (7,739 boys and 5,600 girls) in classes IX & X in 1976-77. This shows an average


Percentage of enrolment (Boys) in classes IX-X to population

exponential growth rate of 14.6 annum during the period. Among the districts the percentage of enrolment varied from (71.4) in Aizawl to (10.7) in Chhimtuipui.

50. The enrolment ratio improved from 33.3% in 1970-71 to 46.8% in 1976-77. There was wide disparity in enrolment ratio for boys (54.5) and girls (39.1) at the Union Territory level during 1976-77. The enrolment ratio for girls (41.2) was observed in Aizawl district whereas lowest was observed in Chhimtuipui (29.7). In the case of boys the enrolment ratio improved from (42.3) in 1970-71 to (54.5) in 1976-77 while in the case of girls it showed better improvement i.e. it increased from (23.9) in 1970-71 to (39.1) in 1976-77. The details may be seen in Statement No. 20.

The percentage of girls to total enrolment was (34.8) in 1970-71 which increased to (42%) in 1976-77. Among the districts it varied from (42.8%) in Aizawl to (39.5%) in Chhimtuipui. Out of the total number of 5,600 girls the maximum number i.e. 4,082 (73%) were enrolled in Aizawl district. Table No. 10 shows position of enrolment of girls at high stage.

(c) ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES AND SCHEDULED TRIBES:

51. There were no scheduled castes students in 1976-77 at high school stage of education. The scheduled tribes enrolment was 13,252 in 1976-77 which formed 99.34% of the total enrolment of the Union Territory whereas the Scheduled Tribes population was 78.0%. Thus co-efficient of equality in respect of Scheduled Tribes at high school stage was 127.35%. In 1970-71 all the students at High/Hr. Sec. stage of education belonged to the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes.

(d) EXPENDITURE:

52. The total expenditure on high/higher secondary schools in the Union Territory increased from Rs.16.68 lakhs in 1970-71 to Rs.84.64 lakhs in 1976-77 showing an average annual increase of 67.9% during the period under review.

53. The per-capita expenditure on high/higher secondary schools in the Union Territory was 19.8 in 1970-71 and the same increased to 21.1 in 1976-77. Among the districts, the per capita expenditure varied from Rs.9.0 in Chhimtuipui to Rs.24.1 in Lunglei in 1976-77.

54. The total expenditure on high schools formed 19.8 percent of the total expenditure on education in the Union Territory in 1970-71. By 1976-77 this percentage marginally increased to 20.1. District-wise details may be seen in statement No.22.

55. The cost per student in high/higher secondary schools in 1970-71 was Rs.286.0 in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.634.6 in high schools in 1976-77. Among the districts

the cost per student was the highest in Lunglei (804.1) and the lowest in Chhimtuipui (375.9). The teacher pupil ratio which was 18 in 1970-71 became 21 in 1976-77. Table No.11 summarises the position.

IX - PROFESSIONAL, VOCATIONAL, SPECIAL AND OTHER (SCHOOL) EDUCATION.

56. A glance at statement No.23 shows that almost the entire development of Professional, Vocational; Special and other(School) education has taken place during the period 1970-71 to 1976-77. The number of schools for Vocational, Professional, Special and other education increased from 3 in 1970-71 to 185 in 1976-77. Of these 185, most of the educational units i.e. 170 were established in Aizawl whereas 5 were in Lunglei and the remaining 10 were in Chhimtuipui. The number of teachers in these institutions increased from 16 in 1970-71 to 262(151 men and 111 women) in 1976-77, women formed 42.4% of the total number of teachers.

57. The total enrolment in these classes increased from 95 in 1970-71 to 4,319 in 1976-77. Of these 4,319 students 3,564 ie. 82.5% were studying in Aizawl only.

The total enrolment of SC/ST in 1970-71 was 95 of which 43 i.e. 45.3% were girls. All the students i.e., 4,319 enrolled for these classes (100%) belonged to Scheduled Tribes community in the year 1976-77. Of the total enrolment during 1976-77 50% were girls. Out of the total number of girls(2,160) in Mizoram 84.1% were studying in Aizawl district.

57. EXPENDITURE: Total expenditure on Professional, Vocational, Special and other Schools education was Rs.4,00.958 during 1976-77 which formed 1.0% of the total expenditure on education in Mizoram. Of the total expenditure on Professional,Vocational

Special and other education 66.4% of the amount was spent in Aizawl district, 29.4% in Tanglei and 4.2% in Chhimtuipui.

X - HIGHER EDUCATION.

(a) INSTITUTIONS AND TEACHERS :

58. Almost the entire higher education seems to have developed in Mizoram during the years 1970-71 to 1976-77. The number of colleges for higher education was 2 in 1970-71 and these increased to 13 in 1976-77. Of the 13 institutions in 1976-77, 5 were affiliated colleges (degree level) 6 non-affiliated colleges (below degree level) and 2 were colleges for intermediate education. Out of the 5 affiliated colleges (degree level), 4 were arts and sciences colleges and 1 was college for education. Of the 13 institutions for higher education, 11 were concentrated in Aizawl district while 2 were in Lunglei district. The district of Chhimtuipui had no institutions of higher education.

59. Total number of teachers in higher education increased from 29 in 1970-71 to 143 in 1976-77. Out of these 77.6% of teachers were working in Aizawl district while the remaining 22.4% were working in Lunglei district. Women formed 14.7% of the total number of teachers in 1976-77. The details may be seen in Statement No. ... 24.

(b) ENROLMENT :

60. The enrolment of higher education was 662 (545 boys and 117 girls) in 1970-71

which increased to 2,620 (1,945 boys and 675 girls) in 1976-77 showing average annual increase of 49.3% per annum. Of the total number of students 2,110 (1,585 boys and 525 girls) were studying for general education where as 510 (360 boys and 150 girls) had taken up professional education.

61. Percentage of girls in total enrolment was 17.7 in 1970-71 which improved to 25.8 in 1976-77. Of the total number of girls, 92% were studying in Aizawl district. Detailed statistics may be seen in Statement No.26.

(c) ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES AND SCHEDULED TRIBES:

Total number of Scheduled Caste students was 25 (17 boys and 8 girls) which formed 0.9% of the total enrolment of higher education in 1976-77. The number of Scheduled Tribe students was 2,473(1,809 boys and 664 girls) which formed 94.4% of the total enrolment of higher education. Girls formed 26.8% of the total number of Scheduled Tribes students and 92% of Scheduled Tribe girls were enrolled in Aizawl district.

(d) EXPENDITURE:

63. Expenditure on higher education was Rs.44,74,200 in 1976-77 and it formed 10.6% of the total expenditure on education in Mizoram. Of the total expenditure on higher education 85.5% was spent in Aizawl district while 14.5% of the amount was spent in Lunglei district. Detailed expenditure data may be seen in Statement No. 28.
