I take this opportunity to express my thanks for the supply of the required data and other help received from the office of the Director of Public Instruction, Government of Orissa for bringing out this publication.

It is hoped that this publication will found to be useful to Planners, Administrators and Researchers in different Organisations.

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I N T R O D U C T I O N

The Ministry of Education & Culture collects and publishes the educational statistics at State level on annual basis. However, keeping in view the wide disparities with in a State, educational data is collected and published on quinquennially basis separately for each State. This volume is the twenty first one in the series of the Educational Statistics - District-wise for the years 1970-71 - 1976-77.

2. For making inter district comparisons, important educational indicators such as enrolment ratio, co-efficient of equality for S.C. & S.T. teacher pupil ratio, cost per student and population served by an institution etc. have been worked out at district level. These indices show wide range of variation among the districts and are of great use for formulating educational development plans at district level.

II - AREA AND POPULATION

3. Orissa consists of 13 districts. The number of districts in the state remained the same during the period 1971 to 1977. The total area of the state, being 1.56 lakh sq. kms., remained unchanged during the period under review. Among the districts the area varies from as high as 27,020 sq. kms. in case of Koraput to as low as 6,394 sq. kms. in case of Balasore.

4. The total population of the State is estimated to be 249.77 lakhs (126.71 males and 123.06 females) in 1977. Among the districts the highest population was in Cuttack (43.57 lakhs) and the lowest in Phulbani (7.08 lakhs). In 1971, the total population of the state was 219.15 lakhs (110.20 males and 108.95 females). The average annual growth of the population works out to be 2.33% during the period 1971 to 1977.

5. The density of population for the state as a whole was 141 per sq. km. in 1971 which is estimated to have increased to 160 by 1977. In 1977, the highest density of population was in Cuttack district (389). The most thinly populated districts were Phulbani (64), Koraput (86) and Kalahandi (112). Statement (I) depicts the district-wise information on area, population and density of population figures for the years 1971 and 1977. Table (1) gives the district-wise percentage share of area and percentage share of population for the year 1977.

Followed by Balasore (326) and Puri (262).

6. The total population as well as population of different age-groups of the State for the years 1971 and 1977 are based on the population estimates available from the office of the Registrar General of India whereas the district-wise population estimates for the age-groups 6-11, 11-14 and 14-17 for the year 1976-77 (as on 1-3-1977) have been worked out by using the following formulae:-

We assume that

7. For getting sex-wise break-up of the population in various age-groups first the girls population is estimated by the above formula by replacing total population by the girls population. Boys population can be obtained by subtracting estimated girls population from the total estimated population.

8. The estimated population in the age-group 6-11 years was 31.56 lakhs (16.07 lakh boys and 15.49 lakh girls) in 1976-77 whereas for the 11-14 year and 14-17 years age-group, the corresponding were estimated to be 18.13 lakh (9.24 lakh boys and 8.89 lakh girls) and 14.37 lakh (7.24 lakh boys and 7.12 lakh girls) respectively.

9. Among the districts this population varied from 2.98 lakhs in Cuttack to 0.48 lakhs in Phulbani. The school going population in the age-group 6-17 years was 66.77 lakhs (34.06 lakhs boys and 32.71 lakhs girls) forming 26.7% of the total education in 1976-77. District-wise estimated population figures and its sex-wise break-up for different age-groups are given in Statement No.(2).

III - LITERACY

10. In 1971 the effective literacy rate viz. total number of literates per one hundred of population excluding 0-4 age-group was 30.4 for the State as a whole. The literacy reate for males was 44.4 whereas for female; it was quite low i.e. only 16.2 at State level. Among the districts the highest literacy was Cuttack (42.0) in followed by Puri (41.1) and Balasore (39.5). Koraput reported the lowest literacy rate (12.4). District-wise details of literacy can be seen from Statement No.(3).

IV - GENERAL VIEW

(a) INSTITUTIONS

11. There were 34,411 recognised institutions of all types of education in 1970-71 in the State which increased to 41,056 in 1976-77. The increase worked out to 19.3% during the period under review. In 1976-77, Cuttack had the highest number of institutions (6,838) followed by Koraput (4,347) and Ganjam (3,705). The lowest number of institutions (1,784) was in Keonjhar. District-wise position of institutions for the years 1970-71 and 1976-77 is given in Statement No.(4).

(b) ENROLMENT

12. The total enrolment in all types of institutions was 25.08 lakhs in 1970-71 which increased to 33.09 lakhs by 1976-77. The average annual increase of enrolment works out to 5.3% during the period under consideration. Among the districts the percentage share was the highest (21.5) in Cuttack and the lowest in Phulbani (2.7).

13. The increase in enrolment was observed in all the districts except Sundergarh.

14. The sex-ratio of enrolment viz. number of girls enrolled for every 100 boys was 31 in 1970-71 which increased to 34 in 1976-77.

15. The total enrolment in all educational institutions as a percentage to the population increased from 11.3% in 1970-71 to 13.2% in 1976-77 for the state as a whole. Among the districts it varied from 9.9% in case of Kalahandi to 17.1% in case of Balasore during 1976-77. District-wise particulars of enrolment are given in Statement No.(5).

(c) TEACHERS

16. Total number of teachers in all types of educational institutions in the state increased from 93,975 in 1970-71 to 1,24,122 in 1976-77 showing an annual increase rate of 5.35, during the period. Number of teachers increased in all the districts except Sambalpur and Phulbani.

17. In 1976-77 out of total number of teachers in the state, 1,16,633 were employed in schools thus forming 93.9% of the total strength of teachers in all types of institutions. Among the school teachers only 67.5% were trained. Among the districts the percentage of trained teachers varied from 83.2% in Ganjam to 45.0% in Koraput. The percentage of trained teachers among the women teachers was 72.9% for 1976-77. District-wise particulars of trained and untrained teachers have been given in Statement No.(6).

(d) EXPENDITURE

18. The total expenditure incurred on all types of institutions in the state increased from Rs.26.09 crores in 1970-71 to Rs.68.17 crores in 1976-77 showing an average annual increase of 26.9%. In 1976-77, the percentage share of expenditure was the highest in case of Cuttack (20.0%) and the lowest in case of Phulbani (3.2%).

19. The expenditure on education per head of institution was Rs.7,583 in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.16,603 in 1976-77. Among the districts, the educational expenditure per head of the institution varied from Rs. 48,750 in Sambalpur to Rs.9,262 in Koraput in 1976-77.

20. The educational expenditure per head of population was Rs.11.9 in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.27.3 in 1976-77. The per-capita expenditure among the districts varied from Rs.42.3 in case of Sundergarh to Rs.17.3 in Koraput in 1976-77. The per capita expenditure increased in all the districts in 1976-77 as compared to that of 1970-71. District-wise educational expenditure, expenditure per institution and per capita expenditure can be seen from Statement No.(7).

(e) EXTENT OF COVERAGE OF SCHEDULED CASTES AND SCHEDULED TRIBES

21. The total enrolment of Scheduled Caste students in the State was 4,39,344 (3,01,029 boys and 1,38,315 girls) forming 13.3% of the enrolment at state level. The enrolment percentage for Scheduled Caste boys was 13.7% and for girls 12.4%. Among the districts the enrolment percentage for scheduled Castes varied from the highest of 21.0% in Phulbani to 7.9% in Sundergarh.

22. Percentage of Scheduled Castes population to total population in the State was 15.1% in 1970-71. The extent of coverage of Scheduled Castes population was estimated to be 88.1 in all types of educational institutions at State level in 1976-77. Among the districts the extent of coverage varied from 103.3 in Mayurbhanja to 69.8 in Ganjam. District-wise particulars of Scheduled Castes enrolment percentages and extent of coverage are given in statement No.(8).

23. Total enrolment of Scheduled Castes community in educational institutions of the State was 5,16,376 in 1976-77. This comprised of 3,67,280 boys and 1,49,096 girls. In terms of percentage this was 15.6% (16.8% boys and 13.3% girls). Percentage of Scheduled Tribes enrolment to the total enrolment among the districts varied from 50.9% in Sundergarh to 2.1% in Puri. District-wise particulars of enrolment, enrolment percentages and their extent of coverage are given in Statement No.(9).

V - PRE-PRIMARY EDUCATION

24. There were no pre-primary schools in the State during the years 1970-71 and 1976-77.

VI - PRIMARY EDUCATION

(a) INSTITUTIONS

25. Total number of primary schools increased from 27,728 in 1970-71 to 31,687 in 1976-77 showing an increase of 14.3% during the period under review.

26. The average area served by a primary school was 5.7 sq. kms. of State level. Condition slightly improved during the period as on an average a primary school was available for every 4.9 sq. kms.

27. Population served by a primary school was 790 in 1970-71 whereas in 1976-77 on an average a primary school served 788 persons.

(b) TEACHERS

28. Number of teachers in primary schools increased from 57,413 in 1970-71 to 72,728 (67,565 males and 5,163 females) in 1976-77 showing an annual increase of 4.5% during the period under review. In 1976-77, teachers employed in different districts varied from the highest of 11,434 in Cuttack to 3,071 in Phulbani. District-wise details are given in Statement No.(10).

(c) ENROLMENT

29. Enrolment in classes I-V was 19.30 lakhs (12.65 lakh boys and 6.66 lakh girls) in 1970-71 which is reported to have increased to 25.23 lakhs comprising 16.02 lakh boys and 9.21 lakh girls by 1976-77 at the State level. This shows an annual increase of 5.1% during the period. The increase for boys comes out to be 4.4% and for girls 6.4%.

30. The enrolment ratio in classes I-V to the population of age-group 6-11 gives an index of facilities created at the primary stage of education. For the Orissa State as a whole this ratio increased from 64.6 to 79.9 during the period 1970-71 to 1976-77. The corresponding enrolment ratio for boys increased from 83.2 to 99.7 and for girls from 45.3 to 59.4 during the period under consideration. Taking both boys and girls together these enrolment ratios among the districts varied from the highest of 102.1 in Balasore to 66.8 in Mayurbhanja in 1976-77. In 9 districts the enrolment ratios were more than that of the State level. District-wise details of enrolment are given in Statement No.(11). Enrolment figures in 1976-77 as percentage of 1970-71 for the districts are given in Table No.(2) below:-

(d) SCHEDULED CASTES & SCHEDULED TRIBES ENROLMENT

31. Of the total enrolment, 5.34 lakhs belonged to Scheduled Caste & Scheduled Tribe communities in 1970-71 in classes I-V of this Scheduled Caste & Scheduled Tribe boys were 3.85 lakhs forming 30.4% of the total enrolment of boys. Scheduled Caste & Scheduled Tribe girls formed 28.4% of total girl students in classes I-V. In 1976-77 Scheduled Castes enrolment formed 14.7% (15.3% boys and 13.7% girls). Taking boys and girls together the enrolment percentage for

36. In 1970-71 one teacher was available for every 34 students in primary schools whereas it decreased to 32 students showing an improvement in teacher pupil-ratio. Statement No.(13) gives district-wise details of expenditure on primary schools, expenditure per head of population, cost per student and teacher pupil ratio in primary schools. Table (3) below gives expenditure per head of population, percentage share of expenditure on primary schools, cost per student and teacher pupil ratio in primary schools.

VII - MIDDLE SCHOOL EDUCATION

(a) INSTITUTIONS AND TEACHERS

37. Total number of middle schools in the State was 4,193 in 1970-71 which increased to 6,383 in 1976-77. The schools increased in all the districts. Among the districts the number of middle schools was the highest (1,401) in Cuttack followed by 808 in Balasore and the lowest in Jhulbani 162 in 1976-77. The average area served by a middle school was 37.2 sq. kms. in 1970-71 for the State as a whole whereas in 1976-77 a middle school was available for an area of 24.4 sq. kms. in the State.

38. During 1970-71, on an average a middle school was available for every population of 5,277. The situation improved in 1976-77 as a middle school was available for a population 3,913 persons. Among the districts the population as low as 2,579 in Balasore to as high as 7,726 in Koraput in 1976-77.

39. The total number of teachers employed in middle schools was 14,298 in 1970-71 which increased to 22,667 in 1976-77 at the average annual increase of 9.8% during the period under review. District-wise details of institutions and teachers are given in Statement No.(14).

(b) ENROLMENT

40. Total enrolment in middle schools was 3.23 lakhs in 1970-71 which increased to 4.17 lakhs by the year 1976-77 at State level. At the same time enrolment in middle classes for the State as a whole was 3.23 lakhs (2.52 lakhs boys and 0.71 lakh girls) in 1970-71 and by the year 1976-77 the enrolment in these classes had gone up to 4.30 lakhs (3.06 lakh boys and 1.24 lakh girls) showing an average annual increase of 5.5% during the period. Among the districts the highest enrolment was 115.7 thousands in Cuttack followed by 59.5 thousands in Puri and the lowest in case of Phulbani (6.43 thousands).

41. The enrolment ratio at the middle stage which is defined as the percentage of enrolment in classes VI-VIII to the total population in age-group of 11-14 years gives an index of facilities created at the middle stage education. For the State as a whole the enrolment ratio was 202.2%

(31.0% for boys and 9.0% for girls) in 1970-71. In 1976-77 the enrolment ratio increased to 23.7% (33.0% for boys and 14.0% for girls). Among the districts the enrolment ratio was the highest in case of Cuttack (36.6%) followed by Balasore 32.4% and the lowest in Koraput 8.9% in 1976-77. District-wise details of enrolment in middle education classes are given in Statement No.(15). Table (4) below gives district-wise position of enrolment in 1976-77 as percentage of enrolment in 1970-71.

(c) ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES & SCHEDULED TRIBES

42. In 1970-71 total enrolment of Scheduled Caste & Scheduled Tribe students in classes VI-VIII was 74,991 (59,086 boys and 15,905 girls) constituting 23.2% of the total enrolment in these classes at State level. In 1976-77 the enrolment of Scheduled Castes in classes VI-VIII was 39,433 (31,091 boys and 8,342 girls) forming 9.2% of total enrolment. Boys and girls separately formed 10.2% and 6.7% of their total respective enrolments. Of the total enrolment Scheduled Tribe students formed 8.7% (9.9% boys and 5.6% girls).

43. The extent of coverage of Scheduled Caste & Scheduled Tribe students in classes VI-VIII is worked out to be 60.7% in 1970-71.

44. The extent of coverage works out to be 60.7% for Scheduled Castes and 37.7% for Scheduled Tribes in 1976-77. District-wise details of enrolment for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes are given in Statement No.(16).

(d) EXPENDITURE

45. Total expenditure on middle schools for the State as a whole was Rs.3.69 crores in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.11.70 crores after six years in 1976-77 showing an average annual increase of 36.2% in expenditure during the period under consideration. The total expenditure incurred on these schools doubled in case of 5 districts and tripled in 7 districts during the period. Among the districts expenditure incurred on middle schools varied from the highest of Rs.2.23 crores in Cuttack followed by Rs.1.78 crores in Sundergarh, Rs.1.53 crores in Balesore and Rs.1.09 crores in Puri to the lowest of Rs.6.76 lakhs in Koraput in 1976-77.

46. Expenditure incurred on middle schools as per head of population was Rs.1.7 in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.4.7 in 1976-77 at State level. In 1976-77 among the districts the expenditure per head of population varied from Rs.15.2 the highest in Sundergarh to Rs.0.3 the lowest in Koraput.

47. Total expenditure made on middle schools for the State as a whole formed 14.1% of the total educational expenditure in 1970-71. This percentage increased to 17.2% by 1976-77. The percentage expenditure for middle schools varied from the highest of 35.8% in Sundergarh to the lowest of 1.8% in Koraput followed by 9.8% in Ganjam during 1976-77.

48. Cost per student in middle schools was Rs.114.1 in 1970-71 for the State as a whole which increased to Rs.280.4 in 1976-77. Among the districts it varied from the highest of Rs.712.1 in Sundergarh followed by Rs.497.2 in Phulbani to the lowest of Rs.49.8 in Koraput in 1976-77. In 6 districts cost per student in middle schools works out to more than the State average.

49. For the State as a whole the teacher-pupil ratio in middle schools was 21 in 1970-71 which decreased to 18 in 1976-77 showing a significant improvement. Among the districts in 1976-77, it varied from 25 in Outback followed by 24 in Puri to the lowest of 10 in Keonjhar. Statement No.(17) indicates the district-wise details of expenditure on middle schools, expenditure per head of population, cost per student and teacher pupil ratio. Table (5) below indicates percentage of educational expenditure to the total expenditure, expenditure per head of population, cost per student and teacher pupil ratio for the districts separately.

VIII - HIGH/HIGHER SECONDARY SCHOOLS

(a) INSTITUTIONS AND TEACHERS

50. There were 1,665 high/higher secondary schools in the state in 1970-71 which incurred to 1,971 in 1976-77 showing an average annual increase of 3.06% during the period under consid ration. In 1976-77, the highest number of such institutions was in Cuttack 505 followed by Balasore 255 and the lowest in Phulbani 35.

51. In 1970-71 the average area served by a high/higher secondary school was 93.6 sq.kms. Conditions improved by 1976-77 as for every 79.1 sq. kms. one such institution was available. In 1976-77 the average area served by a high/higher secondary school varied from 22.2 sq. kms. in Cuttack followed by 25.1 sq. kms. in Balasore to the lowest of 365.1 sq. kms. in Koraput.

52. Average population served by a high/higher secondary school in the State was 13,162 in 1970-71. In 1976-77 slightly increased educational facilities were available as for every population of 12,672 one such institution was available. In the year 1976-77 average population served by a high/higher secondary school varied from 8,171 in Balasore to 31,427 in Koraput district.

53. Total number of teachers employed in high/higher secondary schools in the State was 16,940 in 1970-71 which increased to 21,238 in 1976-77 showing an average annual increase of 4.2% during the period. Statement No.(19) shows district-wise number of high/higher secondary schools, teachers employed, area and population served by high/higher secondary schools.

(b) ENROLMENT

54. Enrolment in high/higher secondary schools was 4.02 lakhs in 1976-77 against 1.81 lakhs in 1970-71. Enrolment in classes IX-XI in the State increased from 1.33 lakhs (1.08 lakhs boys and 0.25 lakh girls) in 1970-71 to 2.29 lakhs (1.78 lakh boys and 0.51 lakh girls) in 1976-77 at an average annual increase of 12.0% during the period. Corresponding annual increase among the boys was 10.8% and for girls was 17.3%. It may be seen that enrolment in these classes increased in all the districts. In 1976-77 enrolment varied from 67,872 the highest in Cuttack followed by 31,069 in Puri to 2,794 the lowest in Phulbani.

55. At the State level enrolment ratio at the high/higher secondary classes (i.e. enrolment in classes IX-XI as percentage to the population of corresponding period in the age-group 14-17 years) increased from 9.3% to 13.4% during the period of six years. In case of boys it increased from 14.9% to 20.4% and for girls from 3.9% to 6.1% during the period under consideration. The enrolment ratio increased in all the districts during the period under review. In 1976-77 the ratio varied from 4.4% in Koraput to 22.8% in Cuttack. District-wise details of enrolment are given in Statement No.(19). Table (6) below gives enrolment in 1976-77 as percentage to that of 1970-71 and percentage of girls enrolment.

(c) ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES & SCHEDULED TRIBES

56. In 1970-71, of the total students 16.5% were of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes community. In 1976-77, 9.9% enrolment was of Scheduled Castes and 9.2% was of Scheduled Tribes community in classes IX-XI at State level. Scheduled Caste boys accounted for 10.6% of the total boys enrolment whereas Scheduled Caste girls accounted for 5.6% of the total girls enrolment in the State in classes IX-XI during 1976-77. Among the Scheduled Tribes the percentage enrolment was 10.1% and 6.0% respectively when compared to the total boys and girls enrolment. Among the districts the percentage of Scheduled Castes enrolment varied from 13.9% in Phulbani followed by Balasore 12.7% to the lowest in Dhenkanal 5.2% during 1976-77.

57. In 1970-71 the population of Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes taken together was 38.2% and the extent of coverage or co-efficient of equality was estimated to be 43.2% in classes IX-XI. In 1976-77 the extent of coverage works out to be 62.9% for Scheduled Castes and 39.8% for Scheduled Tribes separately in high/higher secondary classes. District-wise details of Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes enrolment are given in Statement No.(20).

(d) EXPENDITURE

58. Total expenditure on high/higher secondary schools in the State was Rs.6.17 crores in 1970-71 which rose to Rs.12.45 crores in 1976-77. Average annual increase of expenditure works out to be 17.0% during the period of six years. Among the districts the expenditure incurred on high/higher secondary schools varied from Rs.2.90 crores the highest in Cuttack to Rs.30.47 lakhs the lowest in Phulbani district in 1976-77.

59. Expenditure on high/higher secondary schools as per head of population was Rs.2.8 in 1970-71 which rose to Rs.5.0 in 1976-77 for the State as a whole. In 1976-77 among the districts it varied from Rs.7.7 the highest in Sundergarh to Rs.2.2 the lowest in Koraput. In 6 districts the expenditure on high/higher secondary schools was more than the State average.

60. Per capita expenditure in high/higher secondary schools was Rs.341.2 in 1970-71 which decreased to Rs.309.6 in 1976-77. In 1976-77 among the districts cost per student varied from Rs.520.5 in Phulbani followed by Rs.440.7 in Sundergarh and Rs.433.0 in Koonjhar to the lowest of Rs.231.7 in Ganjam. In 9 districts per capita expenditure in these schools was more than the State average. Teacher pupil ratio was 11 in 1970-71 for the State as a whole which increased to 19 in 1976-77. In 1976-77 teacher pupil ratio was the highest in Puri 22 and

the lowest in Phulbani and Keonjhar 13 each. There was a negative correlation between cost per student and teacher pupil ratio, i.e., average cost per student is high where the teacher pupil ratio is low and vice-versa. Statement No.(21) gives district-wise details of expenditure on high/higher secondary schools. Table(7) below gives district-wise particulars of expenditure on high/higher secondary schools as percentage of total expenditure, expenditure per head of population, cost per student and teacher pupil ratio.

IX - PROFESSIONAL, VOCATIONAL, SPECIAL & OTHER (SCHOOL) EDUCATION

61. Total number of institutions of professional, vocational, special and other (school) education was 644 in 1970-71 which increased to 801 in 1976-77 showing an average annual increase of 6.1% during the period. In 1976-77 four districts had only a few institutions of such type. There are Mayurbhanja 2, Keonjhar 5, Dhenkanal 10 and Sambalpur 18. Total enrolment of these institutions was 12,873 (10,579 boys and 2,294 girls) during 1970-71 which increased to 28,459 (21,896 boys and 6,563 girls) in 1976-77 showing an average annual increase of 20.2% (17.8% for boys and 31.0% for girls) during the period under review.

62. Out of the total enrolment in 1970-71, the enrolment of Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes was 7,628 (7,294 boys and 334 girls). In 1976-77 there were 2,824 Scheduled Caste students and 3,922 Scheduled Tribe students.

63. Total number of teachers employed in these institutions increased from 1,274 in 1970-71 to 1,681 (1,513 men and 168 women) in 1976-77 showing an average annual increase of 5.3%.

64. The expenditure incurred on all type of institutions of professional, vocational, special and other (school) education was Rs.50.45 lakhs in 1970-71 which decreased to Rs.41.69 lakhs in 1976-77. Statement No.(22) gives district-wise particulars of the number of institutions, enrolment, teachers and expenditure for institutions of professional, vocational, special and other (school) education.

X - HIGHER EDUCATION

(a) INSTITUTIONS AND TEACHERS

65. Total number of all types of institutions of higher education was 93 in 1970-71 which increased to 214 in 1976-77 showing an average annual increase of 21.7%. Out of the total number of higher institutions in the State there were 4 universities, 1 agricultural college, 1 college of business management, 6 institutions of education, 3 engineering, technological and architectural colleges, 3 law colleges and 4 medical colleges. The number of arts, science & commerce colleges was 83. All the districts in the State had at least one college.

66. Total number of teachers employed in all institutions of higher education increased from 4,050 in 1970-71 to 5,808 in 1976-77 showing an average annual increase of 7.2%. District-wise details of institutions and teachers are given in Statement No.(24).

(b) ENROLMENT

67. Total enrolment in all types of higher education courses was 43,680 in 1970-71 which increased to 99,390 in 1976-77. Of the total enrolment in 1976-77, 2,723 were studying in universities, 73,011 in arts, science & commerce colleges, 633 in agriculture and forestry colleges, 283 in colleges of business management, 1,771 in institutions of education, 1,879 in engineering colleges, 4,626 in law colleges, 2,135 in medical colleges and 295 in institutions of other education. There was an annual increase of 11.2% in the enrolment during the period under consideration. District-wise details are given in Statement No.(24). Statement No.(25) also gives district-wise details of enrolment in general higher education and professional higher education by type of education for the year 1976-77. Total enrolment in general higher education was 77,703 (64,644 boys and 13,059 girls) and in professional higher education, it was observed to be 21,687 (18,353 boys and 3,334 girls) during 1976-77.

(c) ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES & SCHEDULED TRIBES

68. In 1970-71 the enrolment of Scheduled Caste & Scheduled Tribe communities jointly was 2,328 (2,212 boys and 116 girls) forming 5.3% of total enrolment in classes of higher education. In 1976-77 the corresponding enrolment of Scheduled Castes was 4,064 constituting 3,759 boys and 305 girls. On the other hand 2,915 students (2,649 boys and 266 girls) of Scheduled Tribes were enrolled in 1976-77. Percentage enrolment of Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes was 4.1% and 2.9% respectively in classes of higher education in 1976-77. District-wise details of Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes enrolment have been given in Statement No.(26).

(d) EXPENDITURE

69. Total expenditure on all types of institutions of higher education was 5.46 crores in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.16.05 crores in 1976-77 at an average annual increase of 32.4% during the period under consideration. Total expenditure on institutions of higher education in 1976-77 formed 23.5% of total educational expenditure of the State. Of the total expenditure on higher education Rs.3.00 crores (18.7%) was on universities, Rs.10.44 crores (65.1%) on affiliated institutions, 0.97 crores (6.0%) on affiliated institutions of below degree level and Rs.0.81 crores (5.0%) on boards of secondary education. Of the total expenditure on affiliated institutions (degree level) the substantial part viz., 66.8% was incurred on arts, science & commerce colleges in 1976-77. Statement No.(27) gives district-wise details of expenditure made on institutions of higher education.

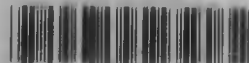
