The Present report on "Family Budgets of Cultivators in Haryana" is twenty second in the series released annually since the formation of Haryana. It relates to the agricultural year 1986-1987 (July, 1986 to June, 1987).

The study attempts to provide a comprehensive analysis of cultivators household income and expenditure. It also highlights in detail the pattern of household consumption, his dietary habits and the extent of his dependence on goods other than those produced at his own farm.

I hope this report will prove useful for agricultural planners research workers and administrators.

CHAPTER 1

Introduction

General

1.0 The Present report "Family Budgets of Cultivators in Haryana" 1986-87 is the twenty second in its annual series. It is a comprehensive study of the budget accounts of 79 cultivators and was undertaken with a view to studying the sources of income, pattern of household expenditure and domestic consumption of cultivators. The cultivators selected for study are, however, the same as covered under the concurrent study on "Economics of Farming in Haryana," 1986-87. The list of villages where the selected cultivators were located is given in Appendix-I.

Objectives :

1.1 The objectives of study are :—

- (i) to find out the sources of household income of cultivators;
- (ii) to study the pattern of their domestic expenditure;
- (iii) to find out the proportionate consumption of goods produced at home and of those procured from outside;
- (iv) to examine the dietary habits of households and the extent of their standard of living; and
- (v) to study the impact of the size of holdings on their income and expenditure.

Method of Data Collection :

1.2 The selection of the farming families was purposive in character depending upon co-operation, willingness and capability of the cultivators in maintaining the day to day record of their domestic expenditure in the prescribed registers. The results/conclusions arrived at, therefore, may not necessarily be taken to reflect the situation prevailing in the state.

"Cost Accounting Method" was used for recording the entries in the family budget registers. Necessary training was

imparted for recording the requisite information therein. To ensure proper recording and accuracy of the entries in the registers, timely supervision was undertaken by the Head quarters staff and District Statistical Agencies as well.

Each cultivator was given an incentive of Rs. 50/-per annum as an honorarium for recording the information of income and expenditure of the household in prescribed registers.

Family size :

1.3 The family size of the selected cultivators under study varied considerably. It ranged from 3 to 22 members. The average size of family was, however, 9.64. Since this simple average does not provide a true picture of family size as it gives equal weightage to the children and women, the Atwater's scale of Adult Male Units (Appendix-II) has been applied to work out the family size of the cultivators. In common parlance, children and women do not equalize male adult and are, therefore, to be reduced to adult male units in order to ascertain their real capacity to earn and spend. This conversion is universally applied in National Sample Surveys and other allied surveys conducted through out the country. According to the Atwater's scale, the average size of family worked out to 7.13.

CHAPTER II

Sources of Income

General

2.0 Haryana is predominantly an agricultural State. Introduction of improved farm technology in the field of agriculture has encouraged the Haryana Cultivators to adopt the improved package of cultivation practices, thus enabling them to increase their income. In addition to cultivation, the farmer has also diversified his economic activities so as to augment his income through subsidiary occupations like dairy-ing, poultry, fishery and other small enterprises. The present chapter highlights various sources of income of selected farm families which were drawn from a cross section of the farming community. The selected cultivators possessed all type of holdings including the mechanised and non-mechanised farms. The size of holdings ranged from 0.90 to 16.80 hectares.

Sources of Income


2.1 The different sources of income of cultivators has been classified under the following four broad categories

- (i) Farm Cultivations ;
- (ii) Milk and Milk products;
- (iii) Interest on capital investment in farm equipments and machinery, farm and residential buildings, milch and draught animals , and
- (iv) Income from miscellaneous sources such as rent received from leased out land, remittances received from out side, imputed value of fuel, wood and dung cakes, sale of farm yard manure and income from sources other than farm cultivation, etc.

Annual Income

2.2 The total net income of selected 79 farm families amounted to Rs. 26.81 lakh giving an average annual income of Rs. 33939 per family and per capita income of Rs. 3519. The main source of income of selected families was farm cultivation

which accounted for 58.48% of the total annual income. The contribution of miscellaneous sources, which included subsidiary occupations and remittances received from outside etc. was 24.40%, of interest on capital investment 12.57% and of dairying 4.55%.

The details of average annual net income per family, per capita and per adult male unit during 1986-87 are given in the following table :-

The analysis of income from various sources of the cultivators is given below :—

Farm Cultivation :

2.3 Farm Cultivation was the main source of income to the cultivators as stated above. The following table gives in brief the gross income, gross expenditure and net income per annum of selected households from farm cultivation.

The above table reveals that the average net farm income per family, per capita and per adult male unit worked out to Rs 19,848.50, Rs. 2,057.78 and Rs. 2,784.64 per annum respectively. The family wise details of the area operated, gross family income derived, expenditure incurred on farm cultivation and net income accrued are given in Appendix IV.

2.4 Classification of net income accrued to farming families by size of holdings is given below for analytical objects.

It will be seen from the above table that the average income per family, per capita and per adult of male unit in farm cultivation had positive co-relation with size of holding and it increased with increase in operational area and vice-versa. The average income per family in every succeeding holding group was almost double and per capita income almost one and a half times of the income in the proceeding group overall, the average income per family in the holdings size group of 12 hectares and above was 15 times and per capita income 8 times of families falling in the holding size group of 0-2 hecs. It indicates that small farmers are great victims of wide variation in sizes of holdings in farm operations.

Milk and Milk Products :--

2.5 Dairying was one of the main subsidiary occupation of selected families and constituted an important source of income. The following table indicates the total and average number of milch animals owned, milk produced, expenditure incurred and the income accrued therefrom

The above table indicates that the cultivators prefer to keep buffaloes generally for milk production because they yield more milk as compared to cows. Cows are mainly kept for the purpose of supplying male calves to be ultimately used as bullocks in the fields. Out of total of 79 families, 2 did not possess any milch animal whereas 48(60.8%) owned buffaloes, 6(7.6%) owned cows and the remaining 23(29.1%) had both cows and buffaloes. The annual milk production of all the 168 milch animals amounted to 2117.39 Qtls valued at Rs. 6,89,814.70. Milk produced per annum per family was 26.80 quintals. The net surplus income per family after meeting the maintenance expenditure on milch animals worked out to Rs. 1542.79 in respect of all the animals. However, in case of families owning cows only, it amounted to Rs. 119.75, in case of families owning buffaloes only Rs. 1319.20 and in case of families possessing both cows and buffaloes Rs. 2514.80.

The net surplus income from milk production has further been classified according to size of holdings for comparative analysis.

The average income from milk production per family, per capita and per adult male unit was found to be Rs. 1542.79, Rs. 159.95 and Rs. 216.44 per annum respectively.

It may be observed from the above table that the income from milch animals had no definite relationship with the size of holdings operated by the selected families. In other words the operational holdings did not in any way contribute towards the productive potential of milch animals and their maintenance expenditure. However it was highest in the size group of 12 & above hectares.

Capital Investment

2.6 Imputed income from capital investment which includes items like farm equipments and machinery, farm buildings and cattle sheds, wells, tubewells and pumping sets and milch and

draught animals is given in the table below :-

The average imputed income per family during 1986-87 worked out to Rs 4268.51. The largest contribution of 41.02% came from farm and residential buildings followed by 24.28% from farm equipment and machinery 14.28% from sheds of animals. 12.48% from milch and draught animals and 7.94% from other items. To assess the impact of size of holdings, the total imputed income from

capital investment has been classified according to various size groups as under :—

The table 2.7 reflects that the average income per family, per capita and per adult male unit from capital investment was Rs. 4268.51, Rs. 442.54 and Rs. 598.85 respectively. The average income per family in the size group of 8-12 hectares was about four times than that of the size of 0-2 hectares. It may also be observed that the highest average income of Rs. 6797.24 per family was also registered in the size group of 8-12 hectares.

Income From Miscellaneous Sources.

2.7 The contribution of "Miscellaneous Sources" to the total income of the cultivators from various sources was 24.40 percent. The Income from the "Miscellaneous sources" has been classified into nine different groups such as subsidiary occupation, remittances received from outside and fuel etc. The details are given in the table below :—

The total income from "Miscellaneous Sources" amounted to Rs. 6,54,069.00, with an average of Rs. 8,279.35 per family. The highest percentage contribution of 34.62% came from "Remittances received from outside" followed by 20.45% from other sources, 18.35% from income from family labour and 14.71% from fuel. The lowest contribution was from Lambardari fee which accounted for merely 0.35 percent.

The income from "Miscellaneous Sources" has been further classified according to size of holdings in the following table.

The average income per family, per capita and per adult male unit from miscellaneous sources worked out to Rs. 8,279.35, Rs. 858.36 and Rs. 1,161.55 respectively. It may be noted that the average income per family from miscellaneous sources was maximum (Rs. 10,010.00) in the size group of 8-12 hectares and minimum (Rs. 6,005.00) in the size group of 12 & above hectares.

Size of Holdings and Income of Cultivators

2.8. The analysis made in the foregoing pages reveals that the size of holdings has a significant bearing on the income of the cultivators. The average income of cultivators increases with the increase in the size of holding simply because farmers with


bigger holdings follow better agricultural practices and can offer a better package of inputs. Details are given below :

It is revealed that the average income of a selected family in the size group of 12 and above hectares was about six times more than that of 0-2 hectares. The per capita income was Rs. 7050.48 and Rs. 2650.03 respectively in the corresponding size groups. In the size group of 2-4 and 4-8 hectares, the per capita income was Rs. 2689.87 and Rs. 3389.50 respectively. It shows that per capita income was higher in respect of large size of holdings because of improved methods of cultivation and subsidiary occupations followed by them.

CHAPTER III

Household Expenditure of Cultivators

General :

3.0 This chapter deals with the household expenditure incurred by the selected cultivators during 1986-87. It throws light on the expenditure made on food and non-food items, sources of supply of items, annual and daily consumption of food, input and output of milk production, disposal of milk, size of holdings, expenditure of selected cultivators and their overall financial position vis-a-vis their land holdings.

The study of the household expenditure covers major items such as food, fuel, housing, clothing, lighting, health, transport, education, marriage and social ceremonies, recreation etc.

Household expenditure

The details of expenditure incurred by the selected cultivators in the various broad groups of items are given in table 3.1.

It is seen from the above table that the average annual expenditure per family was Rs. 30930.24, the per capita Rs. 3206.68 and per adult male unit Rs. 4339.35. Analysis of total expenditure shows that food items claimed the highest expenditure 53.58% followed by clothing 13.58% and marriage and social ceremonies 9.78%. The four major items i.e. food, fuel, clothing and housing together accounted for 78.64% for the total household expenditure. The expenditure on health, transport and education amounted to only 8.98% and on entertainment/recreation/religion just 1.05%.

Size of holdings and expenditure of cultivators

3.2 The distribution of expenditure per family, per capita and per adult male unit under different size of holdings is

shown in the following table :-

The above table shows that the size of holdings has obviously a direct bearing on the expenditure of cultivators. The average annual expenditure of a family with the land holding group of 8—12 hectares was the highest (Rs. 53,322.93). It was lowest in case of families in the size group of 0—2 hectares (Rs. 24,104.45).

Sources of supply of household items :

3.3 The value and proportion of goods and services procured from farm and purchased/procured from outside are shown in the table 3.3


The above table reveals that the bulk of the cultivators household expenditure i.e. 57.63% was incurred on goods and services purchased from outside while the remaining 42.37% was imputed value of expenditure on food and fuel produced at their own farms. Almost 3/4th (71.73%) expenditure on food and 4/5th (81.03%) of their expenditure on fuel constituted the imputed value of these items provided by their farms. For the remaining items such as medicine, education, lighting, social and religious ceremonies and recreation etc. the farmers were totally dependent on market and other services.

Expenditure on Food

3.4 Food claimed 53.58% of the cultivator's household expenditure during 1986-87 (Table 3.1). The details of the items covered under cereals, millets, pulses, milk and milk products, fruits and miscellaneous items are as under :-

3.5 The annual expenditure on food during 1986-87 per family, per capita and per adult male unit worked out to Rs. 16571.75, Rs. 1718.07 and Rs. 2324.93 respectively. The above table also throws light on the dietary habits of cultivators and clearly establishes that Haryana cultivator is primarily a vegetarian. His expenditure on milk and milk products was the highest i.e. 49.67%, followed by cereals 21.37%, Sugar 8.36%, fruits and vegetables 5.57%, edible oils 3.35% and pulses 2.61%. The expenditure on meat and meat products was only 0.47%. In other words more than 4/5th of the cultivators household expenditure was on cereals, pulses, milk and sugar.

A close study of table 3.5 shows that wheat is the staple food of Haryana cultivators and its daily consumption per family during 1986-87 was the highest (4089 grams) with calories intake of 1952 units. Its consumption was about 9 times higher than that of rice, maize and bajra. The daily consumption of maize and other cereals was the lowest (69 grams). Consumption of milk and milk products per adult male unit was substantially higher 537 grams and constituted 793 units of calories where as the daily consumption of meat and meat products per family/adult male unit was almost negligible.

Milk and Milk Products

3.6 Milk and milk products claimed 49.67% of their total expenditure on food items in 1986-87. It has, therefore, become necessary to discuss in detail the cost of production and disposal of milk and milk products separately

Cost of Production of Milk

3.7 The cost of milk production has been worked out separately by taking into account the various variable and fixed costs. The variable cost comprises of items such as fodder, concentrates, labour (family and hired), medical care etc. and the fixed cost includes interest/depreciation on capital investment made in milch animals and cattle sheds etc

(i) Fodder : The cost of milk production includes both green and dry fodders which are normally produced at the cultivator's farm or procured from outside. Since quantity/value of fodder fed to each milch animal separately was not available, the total quantity/value of fodder fed to the farm animals was, therefore, apportioned in accordance with the number of milch animals maintained by the selected cultivators. A milch animal over 3 years (dry or in milk) was taken to be an adult unit. An animal in the age of 1-2 year was considered as 1/2 adult unit. Young stock below one year was excluded.

(ii) Concentrates : Concentrates include cereals (wheat, maize, barley etc.), millets (Jawar and Bajra), gram, gowar, rape and mustard/cotton seed, oil seed cakes, edible oils, gur, shakkar, mineral mix and ready made food.

(iii) Depreciation : Depreciation at the rate of 10% on the capital investment in milch animals has been calculated. Depreciation at the rate of 2.5% on pucca and 5% on Kucha cattle shed has also been taken into account.

(iv) Interest : Interest on capital investment made in milk animals and cattle sheds has been calculated after allowing depreciation. The rate of interest per annum on capital investment made on milk animals was 12.5%.

(v) Medical care : Medical care of animals includes insemination charges, medicine and injection expenditure, veterinary doctor fee and expenditure on items such as oil, soap and warm clothes.

(vi) Miscellaneous : Expenditure on ropes and chains, dehorning of shoes, ironing of hoofs, dairy utensils and the amount paid to gowala etc. are included under this head.

Cost per Quintal of Milk

3.8 The cost per quintal and quantity of milk produced is given in the table 3.6.

Table 36 shows that it is the variable cost which almost determines the cost of milk production. It constitute about 3/4th of the total cost of milk production. Fodder and concentrates are the two major components of variable cost. These claimed 59.00% and 56.93% of total cost of milk production in respect of buffaloes and cows respectively. Capital investment in the form of interest and depreciation formed 24.28% and 19.27%

respectively. The cost of production of milk per quintal for cows and buffaloes worked out to Rs. 246.09 and Rs. 231.12 against an income of Rs. 331.88 and Rs. 337.06 thus resulting in a net income per quintal of Rs. 85.79 and Rs. 105.94 respectively.

Disposal of Milk

3.9 The table 3.7 given below indicates that 85% of the total buffaloes milk produced was consumed at home in the form of milk and milk products and only 15% was sold. Further half of the buffaloes milk was consumed in liquid form and remaining half was converted into curd, butter, ghee etc. 98% of cow's milk was consumed at home in the form of milk and milk products and only 2% was sold. Out of the total cows milk consumed at home 74% was used in liquid form and remaining 26% was consumed in the form of curd, butter etc.

Consumption of Sugar

3.10 Sugar formed 8.36% of the total consumption basket of Haryana cultivators during 1986-87 and is therefore, essential to work out the annual consumption of sugar per family. The following table shows the average quantity and

current value of sugar consumed per family, per capita and per adult male unit.

The above table reveals that the annual consumption of sugar per capita during 1986-87 was 42.69 Kgs. valued at Rs. 232.21. An average family of 10 members consumed 325.28 kg. of sugar and spent Rs. 1769.40 per annum. The proportion of raw sugar in the total consumption of sugar was about 66 per cent.

Size of Holdings and Expenditure on food items :

3.11 To assess the impact of various size groups, the expenditure on food items has been classified according to different size of holdings as presented in the table given below; -

It is evident from the above table that the per capita expenditure on food articles had no direct relationship with the size of holdings. There was not much difference between the per capita expenditure of families falling in the size group of 0-2, 2-4 and 8-12 hectares. It was rather low in the size group of 4-8 hectares as compared to the per capita expenditure of families falling in the 0-2 and 2-4 hectares group. This shows that the necessities of life like food articles have to be satisfied irrespective of the size of land owned.

Non-Food Items —

312 Non-food items like clothing, social ceremonies, housing and fuel claimed 34.84% of the expenditure of household. It is, therefore, desirable to analyse the expenditure on these important items in some details separately.

Clothing :

Clothing was another major item of expenditure 13.58% of the total expenditure was made on clothing. The garments, footwear, bedding, cosmetics and toilets and other miscellaneous items covered under the expenditure on clothing included the following items.

Garments :

These includes shirt, pant, dhoti, turban, underwear, sweater, coat, towel, needle, thread and button, etc.

Beddings :

Beddings include bed sheets, bed cover, quilt, blanket etc,

Footwear

All types of leather, rubber, plastic and canvas shoes and chappals, socks, boot polish and brush etc are included under footwear.

Cosmetics :

These include bathing soap, comb, tooth brush, looking glass, face powder/cream and bangles etc.

Miscellaneous

These items include service rendered by tailor, Barber, washerman, cobbler, dry cleaner and weaver etc.

Break up of clothing expenditure

3.13 The breakup of expenditure on clothing is given in table 3.10

The table above shows that 59.31% of the total expenditure on clothing was incurred on garments and 12.09% on cosmetics and toilets. Footwear claimed an expenditure of another 11.18%. The expenditure on clothing per family and per capita worked out to Rs. 4199.73 and 435.41 respectively.

Housing expenditure :

3.14 Housing is also one of the major item of expenditure. House construction and repairs, alteration and additions, utensils, furniture are also included under this item. The break-up of the expenditure on housing is given in the table 3.11.

It is seen from table 3.11 that per family and per capita expenditure on housing was Rs 2047.09 and Rs. 212.23 respectively. 82.27% of the total expenditure on housing was made on the construction and repairs, 7.46% on furniture and 7.60% on utensils.

Size of holding and expenditure on non-food items :

3.15 Expenditure on non-food items under different size of holdings is shown in the table below :

It may be inferred from the above table that there is no direct co-relation between the size of holdings and expenditure incurred on non-food items. The highest per capita expenditure of Rs. 2009.21 was recorded in the size group of 8-12 hectares followed by Rs. 1771.36 in the size group of 0—2 whereas the lowest (Rs. 1008.05) was observed in the size group of 12 & above hectares.

3.15 Expenditure on housing, clothing, marriage and social ceremonies and education constituted 71% of the total non-food expenditure of families. It has been presented according to size of holdings in the table given below :

The above table reveals that expenditure on housing, clothing, education and social ceremonies had no direct relationship with the size of holding. On clothing highest per capita expenditure of Rs. 569.82 was recorded in the size group of 8–12 hectares followed by Rs. 496.81 in the size group of 0–2 hectares.

Similarly highest per capita expenditure of Rs. 553.85 was recorded on marriage and social ceremonies in the size group of 0–2 hectares. The lowest expenditure of Rs. 30.28 was found in the size group of 12 hectares and above.

In case of housing, the highest per capita expenditure of Rs. 394.11 was observed in the size group of 8–12 hectares. The highest per capita expenditure of Rs. 150.73 on Education was recorded in the size group of 8–12 hectares and lowest of Rs. 39.06 was registered in the size group of 12 hectares and above.

Other Items

3.16 Mechanization of agriculture, expansion of communication and educational facilities, development of roads and electrification of all the villages have encouraged the cultivators to add various items of comforts and luxuries to their household's possessions. The breakup of these items is shown below : –

The study reveals that 66 families out of 79 were having bicycle. 69 were possessing radio/transistors and eight families were in possession of television sets for entertainment. This shows that the traditional background was giving way to modern outlook. The use of chair and tables was quite common which shows that the Haryana cultivators now prefer to decorate their drawing rooms with modern furniture instead of using traditional cots etc.

Almost every family was found in possession of atleast one wrist watch, thus showing the increasing time consciousness among the cultivators. Fans were used by 78% of the families whereas the use of electric press was restricted to 43%. Only three families were having refrigerators.

Financial Position of the Families

3.17 Income, expenditure and net surplus per family and per capita are given in the table 3.14

The above table reveals that, on an average, a cultivator family spent Rs. 30,930.24 against gross income of Rs. 33939.15, thus showing an annual surplus of Rs. 3,008.91 during 1986-87. The per capita surplus was of the order of Rs. 311.45. It was positive in the holding size groups of 4-8 hectes, and above but negative in the size groups of 0-2 and 2-4 hectares with highest deficit of Rs. 921.00 found in the size group of 0-2 hectares. This shows that families with large size of holdings are economically better than the families with small size of holdings.

CHAPTER IV

Summary and Conclusion

The present report on "Family Budgets of Cultivators" provides a comprehensive analysis of Haryana cultivator's household income and expenditure. It also highlights the pattern of household consumption, his dietary habits and the extent of his dependence on goods other than those produced at his own farm. The main findings of the study are :--

1. The family size of the selected cultivators ranged from 3 to 22 members. The average size of the family worked out to 9.64 members. According to Atwator's scale, the average size of family was 7.13 adult male units.

2. The annual income of a cultivator family during 1986-87 was Rs. 33,939.15. Farm cultivation contributed 58.48% of his total income. The annual household expenditure amounted to Rs. 30,930.24 leaving him an annual surplus of Rs. 3008.91.

3. 43% of his total requirements were met from the farm and the rest procured from outside. Over 2/3rd of his requirements of food and 3/4th requirements of fuel were met from his own farm.

4. 53.58% of the cultivator household expenditure was on food alone. Clothing accounted for 13.58%, housing 6.62%, fuel 4.86% and education 3.15% of the total domestic expenditure.

5. Milk and dairy products formed the major portion of his normal consumption of food. Haryana cultivator is primarily a vegetarian and his expenditure on non-vegetarian items was negligible i.e. 0.47% of the total expenditure on food.

6. The cost of production of milk per quintal from cow and buffalo worked out to Rs. 246 and Rs. 231 respectively. The

average milk yield per annum of a cow was 6.44 quintals and of a buffalo 14.47 qtls.

7. A farming family sold 15% of buffaloes milk and the rest was retained to meet the domestic requirement. The daily consumption of milk and milk products per adult male unit was 537 gms.

8. Radio/transistor was the main source of entertainment of the cultivator families.

9. The bicycle was the most common source of domestic transport as each family was having atleast one bicycle.
