## P R E F A C E

This district report on Fifth All India Educational Survey pertains to district GURGAON.

It is the result of continuous, steady and sincere efforts of Dr. Sarwan Kumar, Deputy Director who created family like but responsible attitude to conduct the survey in the most realistic manner that survey could be completed and district report could be written.

All Primary, Middle, High and Senior Secondary schools managed by government, private aided and private unaided bodies have been surveyed and information collected in forms called School Information Forms (SIF).

As schools are located in villages and urbans, so information relating to villages and urbans have been collected in the forms called Village Information Forms (VIF) and Urban Information Forms (UIF) separately.

SIFs, VIFs and UIFs have been got filled under the supervision and arrangement of Block Education Officers (BEOs) and forms collected and kept at the block levels. These forms are consolidated first at the block levels and then all block tables are consolidated at the district level.

Information available in district tables have been interpreted in the first part. Tables of immediate and profound concern have been made available in the second part of the district report.

Mrs. S. Kapoor Sub Divisional Education Officer, Jagadhri was kind enough to attach his clerk and one teacher for cyclostyling work.

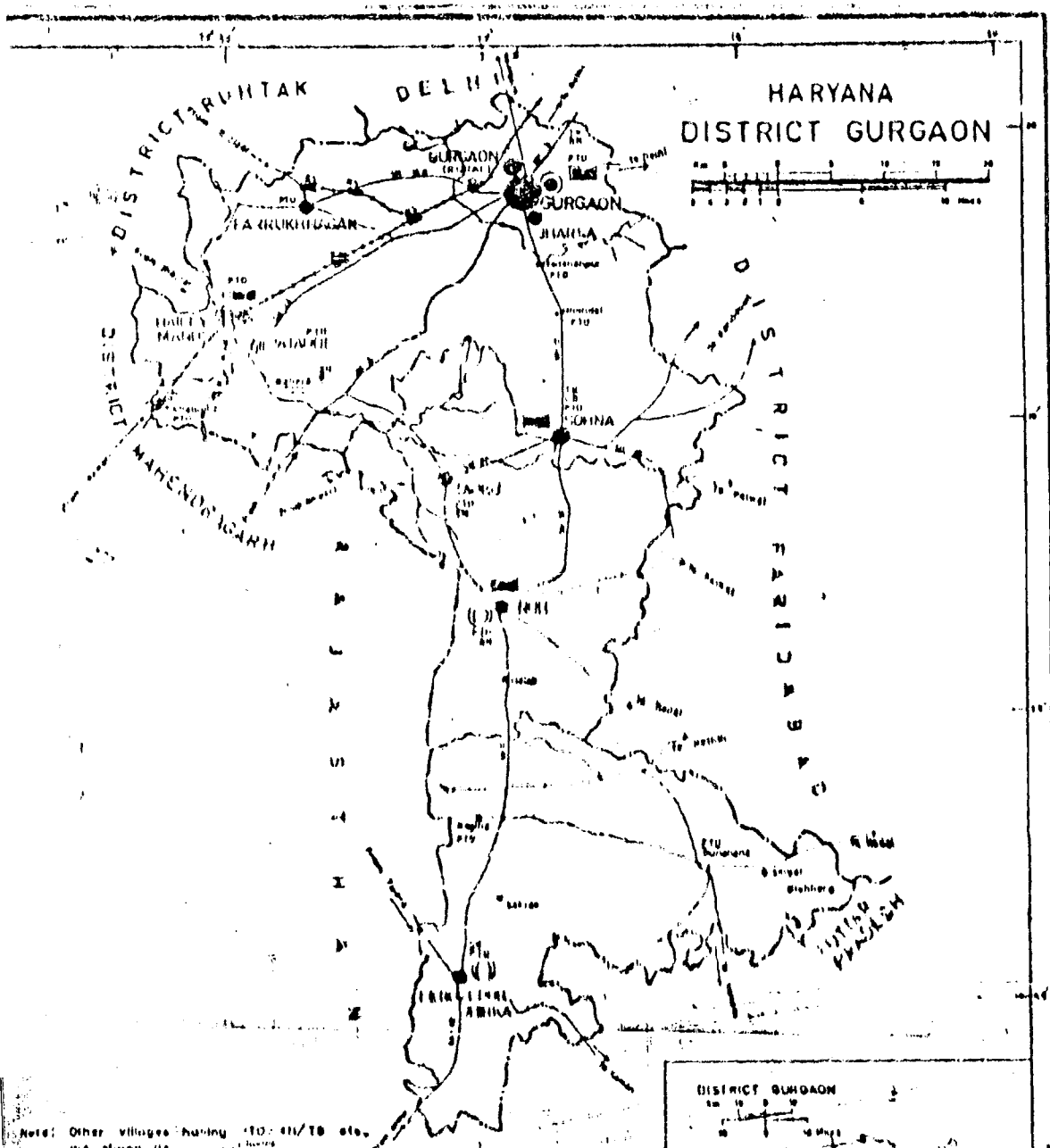
### III

There are yet more unnamed persons who joined me to finish the task successfully at every level and deserve thanks.

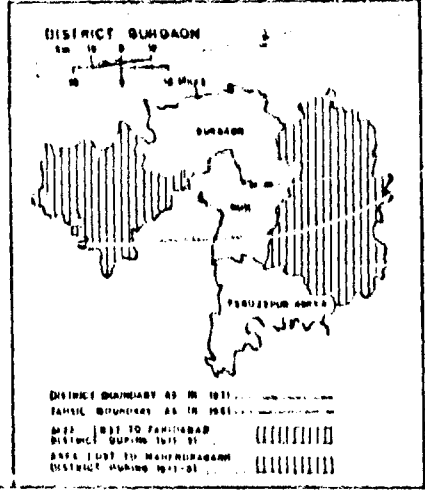

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## CHAPTER-I

### INTRODUCTION

1.1.1 Gurgaon is derived from Guru Gram, village of spiritual leader. The tradition account is that the eldest of Pandavas, Yudhishtira, gave the village to his guru, Daronacharya.

1.1.2 Economy of the district is primarily agriculture, 58.39 percent of the total main workers were cultivators and agriculture labourers, according to 1981 census.

1.1.3 There are factories manufacturing metal products and parts and non-metallic mineral products. Large and medium scale units are engaged in producing cotton yarns, building hardware, wrist watches printing machines, oxygen gas etc.

1.1.4 Small units are manufacturing food products, wood and wood products, metal products and parts, textile products, rubber, plastic, petroleum and coal products.

1.1.5 Irrigation is done by tube wells. Area under cultivation of food grains was 56 thousand hectare during 1979-80. Among food grains, mostly wheat, bazra are grown. Small area of 3 square kilometre is under reserved forest.

1.1.6 48.61% male and 20.02% female are literate in the district. Males have higher literacy as compared to the State which has 48.20% literate males. However, females of the district have lower literacy as compared to the state having 22.27% literate females.

1.1.7 In 1981 census, it was found that the district had 451861 males and 397737 females including 64318 males and 56363 females belonging to schedule caste community. The said population has been corrected to males as 370613. females as 326941 including males 51793, females 45491 belonging to

schedule caste after adjusting the exchange of one village from Gurgaon to Faridabad and six villages from Faridabad to Gurgaon by the authority as on 30.9.86, reference date for the 5th All India Educational survey. The district does not have Schedule Tribe population.

1.1.8 The district has 313 per square km density of population as compared to the state which has 292 per square km. density of population.

#### FIFTH ALL INDIA EDUCATION SURVEY

1.1.9 , Fifth All India Educational Survey was conducted from 1st April, 1987 to 31st December 1987 with reference date for the survey as 30th September, 1986 under the superb management of Dr. Sarwan Kumar, Deputy Director School Education, Haryana designated as State Survey Officer.

1.1.10 District Survey was conducted by P.L. BABBAR on his appointment as District Survey Officer under the able supervision of the District Education Officer, Gurgaon, Sh. D.S. Parmar.

1.1.11 The survey was led through a set of various items of deep necessities under three different questionnaires called school Information Form (SIF), Village Information Form (VIF) and Urban Information Form (U-IF). SIF consisted of 46 questions pertaining to a physical aspect of a school (Government and private but recognised) like type of building, ancillary facilities, availability of Black Boards, Chairs, qualification of teachers, type of courses taught etc. VIF consisted information of availability of education of primary, middle, secondary and senior secondary level and distance involved for a habitation to walk for any of the said level.

VIF consisted of information of estimated population of various habitations in a village, number of habitation and name of habitations. Habitations pertain to rural area and no urban area included in them. Urban Information Forms contained information of various schools and level of learning available, slum areas, etc.

1.1.12 The district was divided into nine community development blocks. Each block was put under the charge of a Block Education Officer (B.E.O.). Each B.E.O. was responsible for the filling of VIFs, SIFs and UIFs from all the schools, villages and urban area falling under him.

1.1.13 Task of filling the forms was encumbersome.

Dr. Sarwan Kumar very intelligently organised various training programmes to train B.E.O's. District Survey Officers not only to finish the task in the schedule time but also to stick to quality and correct information. He arranged inaugural address by the then Director of School Education, Sh. Ravendera Jakhu IAS, in the assembly of all the District Education Officers, Block Education Officer of headquarters, District Survey officers at the State Council of Education Research and training, Gurgaon from 8th April, 1987 to 10th April, 1987. It goes to his credit for arranging other training programmes as follows as never to leave the task a doubt of adequate information, which may hamper the progress of filling scrutinizing, checking and consolidation of informations entered in the UIFs, VIFs and SIFs. The present Director of School Education Sh. Sajjan Singh, I.A.S., himself took very very keen interest in the survey activities to make the work easier.

1.1.14 Dr. Sarwan Kumar personally visited Sohna and Tauru in the scorching heat of summer for sample checking of the SIFs, VIFs and UIFs and asked the B.E.O.'s concerned to revise the forms in the light of the mistakes found. The DSO was asked to tour the district for proper guidelines to the B.E.O.'s. Block Education Officers in coordination with the DSO further arranged meetings with headmasters for filling the forms.

1.1.15 District has nine community development blocks namely Farruk Nagar, Ferozpur Zhirka, Gurgaon, Nagina, Nuh, Pataudi, Punhana, Sohna and Tauru. It has seven Urban areas namely Farruk Nagar, Ferozpur Zhirka, Gurgaon, Nuh, Pataudi, Sohna and Tauru.

1.1.16 Estimated population of urban as on 30.9.86 was 187270 and that of rural was 802859.

1.1.17 There are 729 habitations in total of 667 habitated villages. There are 52 bechraag villages. Nuh block has 103 habitations and Pataudi has 55 habitations.

1.1.18 Education is provided to the population through 700 schools managed by government, private aided or private unaided shown as below:-

CHAPTER-2PRIMARY EDUCATION

2.1.1 There are 471 primary schools in rural area and 21 primary schools in urban area. 99.7% population of the district have primary stage education within a radius of one kilometre, only .3% population covering 11 habitations has to go for more than one kilometre (Km) for the education.

2.1.2 Farrukh nagar, Nagina, Nuh, Pataudi, Punhana community development blocks (C.D. block) have primary stage Education within one km for 100% of their population. 2.5% population of Ferozpur Zhirka have to go for more than one km for primary education. Three habitations are proposed for opening primary schools in Ferozpur Zhirka block.

2.1.3 There are 667 villages. 503 villages have proportion upto 25% of schedule caste population and of these 503 villages, 465 have primary stage facilities. 64 villages have 26% to 50% of Schedule Caste population.

2.1.4 There are 468 government and 3 private aided primary schools in rural area. 21 government primary schools are functioning in urban area. However, primary stage education is available in total of 666 schools adding primary levels of middle, secondary and Senior secondary schools.

2.1.5 Most of the primary schools are housed in pukka buildings. In all, 377 primary schools ~~are~~ working in pukka buildings in rural and urban areas. Nuh block has 48 primary schools out of 63 primary schools working in open space. When talking of open space, it means most of the sections in a school are studying in the open space. 31 out of 60 schools in Tauru block are also working in open space.

2.1.6 135 schools have instructional rooms one each, 192 schools have 2 each. There are 2 schools with more than ten and above instructional rooms in rural area. But 24 schools have no instructional rooms. 5 schools in urban area have no instructional room, 4 schools have instructional room three each.

2.1.7 In rural area, 37 schools need no additional room, 44 schools want one each and 153 schools want three rooms each. In urban area, 2 schools need to have no additional room, 5 schools need to have more than 5 rooms each and 7 schools need to have 3 rooms each.

2.1.8 471 primary schools have 2583 number of sections in rural area. 1381 sections have facilities of black boards, but 1084 sections have no black boards. Ferozpur Zhirkha block has 126 out of 251 sections no black board. Nuh has 201 out of 381 sections with no blackboard. Urban areas have 161 sections in 21 schools. 41 sections have no black board. 16 sections out of 58 sections in Gurgaon urban have no blackboard. Farrukh nagar urban has all the section equipped with black board. 8 sections of Tauru have no black board..

2.1.9 228 primary schools have drinking water facilities in rural area. 94 schools have urinals in the schools and 91 schools have medical check up. 17 schools in urban area have drinkingwater facilities, 16 schools have medical check up..

2.1.10 55 primary schools in rural area have single teacher each to teach primary classes. One such school is in Pataudi, 10 schools in Nuh. 18 in Punhana 9 in Ferozpur Zhirkha.



236 schools in the Distt. have 2 teachers each and 30 schools have more than 5 each. 16 schools in Nuh has 3 each, 36 schools in Nagina have 2 teachers each. There is no school in urban area with a single teacher to teach. Most of the schools have more than 5 teachers each. Pataudi urban has 4 out of 5 schools with more than 5 teachers each and Sohna has all the three schools in the urban with more than five teachers each. Most of the schools in urban area have teachers four or above in number.

2.1.11 In rural area, there are 2133 trained teachers teaching at primary levels, only 7 teachers are untrained. 1204 teachers are male and 929 are female. 1929 teachers are matriculate 19 teachers have qualifications middle pass, 11 teachers are post graduates.

2.1.12 In urban area, 411 trained teachers are teaching at primary stage. There are more females than males in numbers teaching to primary classes as only 50 trained males are teaching at this stage as compared to 361 female teachers. 234 females are matriculate out of 275 teachers. 98 females out of 105 are graduates.

2.1.13 In rural area, there are 53919 boys and 30301 girls studying in various age groups in primary classes. There are 8506 boys and 6280 girls belonging to schedule caste community in the primary classes.

2.1.14 In urban area, 1807 boys and 1647 girls belonging to schedule caste are studying in the primary classes. 8686 boys and 7542 girls belong to all community including schedule caste.

2.1.15 Age specific ratio has been calculated for the district for the age 6 years to below 11 years by the following formula.

$$\text{Age specific ratio} = \frac{\text{Enrolment of Boys/girls in the age 6-11 years}}{\text{Population of Boys/girls in the age 6-11 years}} \times 100$$

(Boys/Girls Rural/Urban)

2.1.16 The district has 74.07 age specific ratio for rural boys and girls together, urban has 65.60. 86.44 is for boys of rural and urban together, 70.29 is for urban boys.

2.1.17 Age specific ratio of rural boys for Ferozepur Zhirkha is 28.2, 6.5 for rural girls for this block. Punhana C.D. Block has 87.2 for boys and 26.2 for girls. Nagina has 91.5 for boys and 30.4 for girls. Tauru has 89.62 for boys and 59.6 for girls.

2.1.18 Gross Enrolment ratio has been calculated by the following formula.

$$\text{Gross Enrolment ratio for boys rural} = \frac{\text{Enrolment in Class 1-V}}{\text{Child population in 6-11 years age group}} \times 100$$

2.1.19 The district has 85.91 as its gross enrolment ratio, rural has 88.43. It is 102.48 for boys out of which Rural has 108.43. It is 67.78 for girls out of which rural has 66.58 for girls.

2.1.20 Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) for Pataudi rural boys is 116.00 and its girls have 94.37. It is 89.38 for boys and 20.12 for girls for Ferozepur Zhirkha. Punhana has 78.26 for boys and 28.90 for girls. Gurgaon urban has 69.66 for boys and 71.21 for girls. Farrukh Nagar urban has 55.45 for boys and 61.05 for girls.

2.1.21 Pupil teacher Ratio (PTR) for both urban and rural is 39:1, Farukh Nagar rural has 44:1 and its urban has 40:1. Ferozepur Zhirka has 37:1 for rural and 38:1 for urban. Pataudi has 43:1 for rural and 48:1 for urban.

2.1.22 37.67% girls are studying in primary classes in the district, 46.48% girls are in urban areas and 35.98% girls are in enrolment in rural area.

2.1.23 Ferozepur Zhirka has 17.03% girls enrolment in rural area and 37.36% in urban area. It is 21.59% in Nagina rural area. 21.74% girls are in enrolment in Punhana block, Nuh has 28.57% for rural 40.90 for urban. Farukh Nagar has 44.48% for rural and 50.16 for urban. The following formula has been used for calculating the percentage of girls for class 1-V :-

Enrolment of girls in class 1-V in rural area  
Total enrolment in class 1-V in rural area

CHAPTER-3

UPPER PRIMARY (MIDDLE) EDUCATION

3.1.1 There are 74 upper primary schools in all in rural areas and all of them are government schools. However, there are 5 upper primary schools including 2 schools private unaided in the urban areas in the district.

3.1.2 Out of 729 habitations in the district 151 habitations have middle education within habitations, it covers 46.4% of the population to have middle stage education within habitation. 93.2% of population have middle stage education within 3 Km 6.8% population have to go for more than 3 Km.

3.1.3 14.8% population of Tauru have to move for more than 3 km for middle stage education. Ferozpur Chirkha has its 17.5% population to walk for more than 3 km. Sohna has 2.6% population to walk for more than 3 Km.

3.1.4 2 villages have zero percent proportion of Schedule Caste in the villages for upper primary education, 137 villages have upto 25% proportion and 13 villages have 26-50% proportion of Schedule Caste.

3.1.5 There are 159 government schools where education from VI to VIII classes is provided in rural area. Out of 49 schools providing middle stage education, 24 belong to government, 14 schools are private aided and 11 are private unaided.

3.1.6 Most of the middle schools in the district are held in pukka buildings. Out of 74 school, 64 schools are working in pukka buildings in rural areas and all the 5 schools in urban area are also in pukka buildings.

3.1.7 All the schools in Farrukh Nagar, Nagina, Pataudi, Punhana are held in pukka building. One school each in Nuh, Ferozpur, Zhirka, Gurgaon, Sohna are held in open space.

3.1.8 26 middle schools in rural area have five to six rooms used for instructional purposes. 3 schools have no instructional room. All the middle schools in Urban areas have rooms for instructional purposes, ranging from 3 to 8. 14 schools need to have 4 rooms each. 33 schools want rooms more than 5 and above for instructional purposes. In urban area, 4 schools need 5 and above rooms for instructional work.

3.1.9. All 74 schools have library, 40 schools have books from 201 to 500 and 51 have book bank and subscribe newspapers in rural area. 5 School in urban area have library, 4 schools have books from 201 to 500. All 5 schools subscribe newspaper. 4 schools have book bank.

3.1.10. 57 schools in rural area have drinking water. 35 have urinals and 20 of them have separate urinals for girls. In urban areas 4 schools have drinking water and urinals, 2 schools have separate urinals for girls, 3 schools have lavatory.

3.1.11 In rural area, there are 829 teachers teaching at middle stage. 587 male teachers are trained. In all 310 teachers are graduates which include 71 trained females and 237 trained males. Only 68 teachers are post graduates. 389 teachers are teaching at middle stages in Urban area. 299 teachers are female and 90 are male. 154 teachers are female graduates and 14 are male graduates. 24 female teachers are post graduate.

- 3.1.12 There are 21986 boys and 6731 girls belonging to all communities studying from VI to VIII classes in rural area. 3333 boys and 963 girls belong to schedule caste. In urban area, there are 9055 boys and 6028 girls studying in VI to VIII th classes. 1212 boys and 508 girls are schedule caste.
- 3.1.13 Age specific enrolment ratio for the district for middle stage is 59.64. Boys have 71.29 for rural and 97.10 for urban. Girls have 98.95 for urban and 28.09 for rural.
- 3.1.14 Ferozepur Zhirkha has age specific enrolment ratio 35.2 for rural boys and 2.4 for rural girls. Nagina has 54 for rural boys and 6.2 for rural girls. Tauru has 67.2 for rural boys and 22.75 for rural girls. Urban Sohna has 76.4 for boys and 13.5 for girls. Farrukh nagar has 95.9 for urban boys and 96.43 for urban girls.
- 3.1.15 The gross enrolment ratio for middle level is 62.66 for the district. It is 82.60 for boys, out of which 72.81 is for rural boys. It is 30.47 for girls including 25.12 for rural girls.
- 3.1.16 Gross enrolment ratio for rural for Nuh block is 58.41 for boys and 7.51 for girls. Ferozepur Zhirkha has 33.95 for boys and 2.25 for girls. Punhana has 62.21 for rural boys and 7.90 for girls. In urban area Ferozepur Zhirkha has 31.01 for boys and 91.37 for girls. Farrukh nagar has 105.31 for urban boys and 93.65 for urban girls.
- 3.1.17 Pupil teacher ratio at upper primary stage is 35:1 for rural and 39:1 for urban at the district level. Ferozepur Zhirkha has 26:1 for rural and 46:1 for urban. Nagina has 30:1 Nuh has 29:1 for rural and 53:1 for urban. Sohna has 39:1 for rural and 52:1 for urban. Famkh nagar has 37:1 for rural and 27:1 for urban Gurgaon has 37:1 for rural and 31:1 for urban.

3.1.18 Percentage of Girls in middle class at the district level is 29.13. It is 23.44 for rural and 39.97 for urban. It is 10.10 for Punhana block, 7.16 for Nagina block. Ferozpur Zhirkha has 5.51 for rural 32.01 for urban. Sohna has 24.41 for rural and 39.57 for urban . Tauru has 17.90 for rural and 27.28 for urban. Gurgaon has 35.75 for rural and 44.91 for urban.

CHAPTER-4

SECONDARY (HIGH) AND SENIOR SECONDARY EDUCATION

4.1.1 There are 80 secondary schools in rural areas and 5 senior secondary schools in rural areas. All of them are Government schools. There are 36 high schools in urban areas 15 are governments, 13 are private aided and 8 are private unaided. 6 schools are senior secondary schools managed by the government, one each is managed by private aided and unaided body.

4.1.2 Secondary schools impart education of primary, upper primary and secondary level. Senior secondary schools impart education upto 12 classes.

4.1.3 There are 85 secondary stages in rural areas and 44 secondary stages in urban areas. 5 stages are senior secondary in rural and 8 are in urban areas.

4.1.4 94.8% population of the district have high stage facilities within 6 Km. Farrukh nagar has 96.1% population, Pataudi has 100% population to go within 6 Km radius for secondary stage education. 99.7% population of Puhana has secondary stage facility within 6 km. 7.3% population of Nagina has to go for more than 6 Km.

4.1.5 59.5% population of the district has senior secondary education facility upto 8 Km. Ferozepur Zhirka has 70.5% of its population to go beyond 8 km for senior secondary education. Gurgaon has 1.9% of its population within habitations.

Pataudi has 16.1% of its population to move for senior secondary education within habitations.



4.1.6 80 secondary schools and 5 higher secondary schools have library. All the secondary schools and higher secondary schools subscribe newspaper. Only 1 school has library with more than 5000 books. All the secondary schools and senior secondary schools have book bank in rural area. In urban area, 36 secondary schools and 8 senior secondary schools have library. 9 high schools have books in library from 501 to 1000. 8 secondary schools subscribe newspapers and magazines.

4.1.7 There are 663 teachers at secondary stage and 40 teachers at senior secondary stages in rural areas. 495 teachers are males at secondary stage and 33 teachers are male at senior secondary level. All the teachers at senior secondary stages are post graduates but most of the teachers at secondary stage are graduates. In urban area, there are 382 teachers teaching at secondary stage, most of them are female as 226 are females and 156 are males. Most of them are graduates. At higher secondary stage there are 79 teachers and 65 of them are post graduates.

4.1.8 In rural areas 72 secondary schools have combined laboratories for practicals and in urban, 19 secondary schools have combined laboratories. 15 schools have separate laboratories for physics, chemistry and biology.

4.1.9 In urban areas 6 senior secondary schools have science subjects and all the 6 have separate science laboratories for physics, chemistry and biology. 3 senior secondary schools in rural areas have science subjects, 2 of them have separate laboratories for physics, chemistry and biology.

4.1.10 165 teachers teaching science at secondary level are trained, 122 of them are B.Sc. trained, 17 are B.Sc. honours and 25 teachers are untrained. 26 teachers teaching science at senior secondary stage are trained, 23 of them are M Sc. Only 2 teachers are untrained.

4.1.11 In rural areas, there are 6528 boys and 1394 girls at secondary stage. 89 boys and 110 girls out of them are schedule caste. In urban areas, there are 4065 boys and 2410 girls studying at secondary level. 416 boys, 100 girls of them are schedule caste. 457 boys and 50 girls including 50 boys and no girls of schedule caste community are studying at senior secondary level in rural area.

4.1.12 In urban area there are 1310 boys and 1193 girls including 130 boys and 28 girls belonging to schedule caste are studying at senior secondary level.

4.1.13 76 secondary schools and 5 senior secondary schools have drinking water in rural area. 68 secondary schools have separate urinals for girls while 4 senior secondary schools have separate urinals for girls.

4.1.14 35 secondary schools in urban areas and 8 senior secondary schools in urban areas have drinking water facilities. 29 secondary schools have separate urinals for girls. 7 senior secondary schools have separate urinals for girls. 28 secondary schools and 8 senior secondary schools have lavatories. 24 secondary schools and 8 senior secondary schools have separate lavatories for girls.

4.1.15 In rural area 70 secondary schools have physical education while 14 senior secondary schools have physical education. In urban areas, 27 secondary schools including 15 government and 7 private aided have physical education. There are 8 senior secondary school which have physical education.

4.1.16 5 schools of senior secondary level offer arts, 3 each offer science and commerce in rural areas. In urban areas, 8 senior secondary schools offer arts and 6 each offer science and commerce group.

4.1.17 There is no system for vocational courses in the senior secondary schools in the district. However, there are vocational courses at +2 stage under the Industrial Training directorate. In this vocational courses 37 students in rural area in 11th class and 60 students in 12th class are studying different trades. In urban area 73 students in 11th class and 57 students in 12th class are studying various trades, like designer and master cutter, motor and body builders etc.

CHAPTER-5

SPECIAL EDUCATION

5.1.1 In rural areas, there are 132 villages having 198 Non Formal Education Centres of primary level managed by the government. 3526 boys and 3027 girls are studying in these centres.

5.1.2 3 urban places have 19 and one urban has 5 centres imparting Non-Formal Education of primary level to total of 733 boys and 582 girls.

5.1.3 There is no village with Non-Formal Centre for upper primary level. However, there is one urban place with two centres managed by the government. 121 boys and 40 girls are studying in these centres.

5.1.4 Farrukh Nagar, Ferozpur-Zhirkha, Nagina and Pataudi have no Non-Formal Education Centre. 2652 children are studying primary level centres in Punhana block. Gurgaon block has 194 children on roll. Nuh block has 1875 children including 853 girls. In urban Nuh has 90 including 58 girls on roll. Sohna urban has 985 children including 596 boys studying at primary level.

5.1.5 161 children including 40 girls are studying at upper primary level in Sohna urban.

5.1.6 There are 128 villages with 235 centres for adult education or functional literacy. 73 centres for men, 116 for women only and remaining for both men and women. All of them are managed by the government. Out of 7943 numbers of enrolment, 4656 are women. There are three urbans which have 19 centres for women and one for men. These centres are managed by the government. 520 adults are studying in these centres. 490 are women.

5.1.7 203 villages have 289 Anganwadi. 4 villages have 4 independent primary schools, and 2 villages have 2 institutes with pre-primary stage attached with them. 2 urban places have 14 institutes with anganwadi.

5.1.8 There is no institute in rural area having facility for blind, orthopaedically handicapped or for mentally retarded children. However, there is only one institute in Gurgaon urban having co-educational centres for deaf and dumbs.

CHAPTER-6

CONCLUSIONS AND SUGGESTIONS

6.1.1 98.49% habitations in the district have primary stage facilities within a radius of one km. 9% habitations of Ferozepur Zhirkha have to walk for more than one km. to study primary classes.

6.1.2 Mohd Baas, Sulela and Nangal Jamalgarh habitations in Ferozepur Zhirkha are suggested for opening Primary Schools.

6.1.3 Most of the primary schools are working in pukka building. However Nuh block needs attention as most of its schools are working in open space. School buildings must be raised in this area.

6.1.4 25% sections each of Pataudi and Farrukh nagar have no black board. Others blocks also are not well equipped with black boards. It is the basic necessities of a school. All schools must be equipped with black boards, chairs and tables.

6.1.5 Primary schools are mostly lacking facilities of urinals, drinking water, lavatory. These facilities must be made available.

6.1.6 55 schools in the district are single teacher school. There should be at least two teachers one male and other female posted in every primary school. Punhana followed by Nuh block has maximum number of such schools, (called single teacher schools).

6.1.7 Qualification of the teachers teaching at primary stage is mostly matriculates. Government should form a policy that teachers must improve qualification upto graduate level for teaching at primary stage. Subject matters are getting tough with the advent of Computer and Television age.

6.1.8 Ferozepur Zhirkha has age specific ratio for girls as 6.5 for rural area. Punhana has 26.2 for girls. It is possible that girls with age group 6-11 years are not fully on roll.

6.1.9 Pupil teacher ratio for both rural and urban is 39:1. It must come down to 25 to 30 for very individual attention. It means more teachers be employed at the primary level.

6.1.10 Percentage of girls enrolment in the rural area is less than that of urban. People in rural area are mostly orthodox and hesitate in sending girls to schools. Villagers should be given stimulating touch by way of wide publicity for girls education.

6.1.11 Middle stage education in the rural area is mostly located in the radius of 3 km. About 12% habitations have to walk for more than 3 km for this stage of education. 32% habitations of Ferozepur Zhirkha followed by 16% of Nuh has to walk for more than 3 km. Elementary Education must be made available within 2 km. instead of 3km. As such more schools be opened for middle stage education keeping in view availability of school going children.

6.1.12 Bharroj, Hassanpur Blonde, Almedbas habitations of Ferozepur Zhirkha, Chandeni, Rahna, Babupur, Bibipur habitations of Nuh block are suggested for opening new middle schools. Other habitations of Nuh and Ferozepur Zhirkha may have Non-formal type of education centres.

6.1.13 Most of the middle schools are working in pukka building in rural area. However, nearly all of them need additional rooms for teaching purpose. So new rooms must be raised to meet the needs.

6.1.14 Black Boards, Chairs, tables etc. must be available in all the sections. Urinals, lavatories, drinking water are must for children studying in the schools.

6.1.15 Teachers teaching at the middle stages are mostly graduate. Ladies are outnumbering men in urban area. However, men are outnumbering ladies in villages. As far as possible, couples must be posted in rural area. Children in rural areas need motherly and affectionate touch to attract girls students from villages.

6.1.16 Enrolment of girls in the rural area is very low, for, gross enrolment ratio for girls is 39.47 as compared to boys having 82.60 as gross enrolment ratio.

6.1.17 About 11% habitations walk for more than 6 km for secondary level education and 41% habitations walk for more than 8 km for senior secondary level education. More senior secondary schools with non-science subjects be opened in the district in rural areas.

6.1.18 All the secondary schools and senior secondary schools must be equipped with library with posting of librarians in each school and atleast one teacher in each school must be guide counsellor.

6.1.19 Most of the teachers teaching at the secondary level are graduates. They must be asked to improve education upto post graduate level in view of difficult syllabi. Improvement of qualification should be binding for better professional efficiency.

6.1.20 Vocational trainings are not provided in the senior secondary level or secondary level. A few useful trades must be introduced in the schools so that students may learn some technical trades to settle down for earning in case they cannot carry on their studies further.



6.1.21 Girls are not sufficient in enrolment in rural area. Girls enrolment at secondary level is 17.5% in rural area and 37.2% in the urban area. It is 9.8% in rural and 47.6% in urban areas at Senior Secondary level. There must be educational drive for girls at all levels of learning.

6.1.22 Pupil teacher ratio at secondary level is just 12 for rural and 17 for urban. It is 12 for rural and 32 for urban for senior secondary level. Schools in rural area has less pupil teacher ratio but more in urban area. It further stresses upon enrolment drive at secondary and senior secondary level.

6.1.23 Gurgaon is basically a Guru Gram and it must be unique in quality and quantity of instructions and enrolments for girls in particular.
