P R E F A C E

I am pleased at the completion of Kapurthala district educational survey as part of the Fifth All India Educational Survey. This survey was accurately completed by my staff with dedicated hard work. It contains a brief outline along with numerous charts and detailed statistics, which will form the basis of our planning, development and promotion of education both formal and informal.

More stress has been laid on development of formal education at the primary, upper primary, Secondary and Senior Secondary school education level. Still the informal education has not been totally neglected. Development of Balwadies, Anganwadies, and Adult education centre have been encouraged. Much more needs to be done in this regard to achieve the national goal of cent percent literacy. Some emphasis have been laid on vocational education keeping in view the self employment avenues for educated youth as the traditional employment sources have dried up.

I commend my colleagues and officers and teachers who conducted this survey i.e. Shri Chaman Lal Gupta F.E.S. District Education Officer (Primary), Sh. Satish Kumar Sc. Master Govt High School, Nathuchahl, Sh. Raj Kumar Centre Head-teacher Govt Primary School, Wadala Kalan, Sh. Tirath Lal Head-teacher Govt Primary School, Dham, Sh. Tara Chand teacher Govt Primary School, Kot Krar Khan, and Sh. Hardip Singh Vocational Master Govt Senior Secondary School, Kapurthala for their accurate recording of survey work. I appreciate their labour of love in the national cause. My special appreciation to Sh. 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PART II

CHAPTER I

1.1 General Information

Formerly a princely State, the Kapurthala district, now one of the twelve districts of the Punjab State, lies in the west, a tract between the rivers Beas and Sutlej. It is peculiar in two ways. Firstly it is the smallest district of the Punjab State from area and population point of view. Secondly it is split up into two, with one of its three Tehsils i.e. Phagwara situated about Forty Kilometers away with Jalandhar district falling in between.

1.1(a) POPULATION & DENSITY: According to 1931 Census, population of the district is 545219 (287236 males and 257983 females) as compared to 16788915 (8937210 males & 7851705 females) that of the State. So it contributes 3.242% to State's population. Scheduled Caste population of the district is 147151 (77393 males & 69253 females). It is 26.99% as compared to that of State which is 28.87.

Density of population i.e. persons per square Kilometer for the district is 334. In matters of sex ratio i.e. number of females per 1000 males, it has recorded a slight improvement of 9 females rising the number from 339 in 1971 to 993 in 1981 as against the St to sex ratio of 979 for 1931 Census.

1.1(b) LITERACY : The district enjoys good education facilities. Out of 100 persons 44.35 are literates (that is being simple reading and writing only) as against 40.36 for the State. Literacy rate for men is 50.77 as against 47.16 for the State and for women is 33.27 as against 33.69 for the State.

1.1(c) AGRICULTURE : The economy of the district is predominantly agricultural. 52.69% area of the district is under cultivation. Sugarcane, Paddy and Wheat are the main crops of the district, are effected by water logging and alkaline Salts (Kallar) .Mize, cotton and groundnuts are the other agricultural products. Tubewell irrigation is common in the district.

1.1(d) INDUSTRY : Kapurthala district has about 300 factories according to the economic Census 1980. There are 1456 enterprises in the district which employ 51500 persons. 2293 of the enterprises employing 12363 workers were located in the rural areas while 9253 enterprises employing 39227 workers were located in the Urban areas.

Recently Railway Coach Factory - The Pride of Kapurthala district has been started at Hussainpur 7.0 Km away from Kapurthala on Kapurthala Sultanpur Road at the cost of more than Rs. 2000 millions. This factory will have great impact on the economy of the State directly as well as indirectly. It will provide employment to more than 10,000 workers directly and many more indirectly because State Govt. has planned to start more than 100 ancillary units to meet the requirement of this big concern.

1.2 Fifth All India Educational Survey is conducted to collect data regarding Educational facilities available and to find out where these facilities are lacking. The reference date is 30.9.63. Three questionnaires sent by the state survey Unit, are distributed in the field.

Those schools which are situated in the Urban areas, have to fill SIF (School Information form) and UIF (Urban Information form) whereas those schools which are situated in the rural areas have to fill SIF and VIF (Village Information form). In rural areas where more than one schools are present, School having Educational facility at higher stage, is given VIF to fill in. Similar procedure is adopted in Urban areas. In this way every school filled its SIF and UIF or VIF is filled by selected schools only.

SIF contains information regarding location, enrolment, teachers and other Educational facilities available in the Schools. VIF contains information relating to population, schooling and other educational facilities in the village. Whereas UIF seeks information relating to population, schooling and other educational facilities in the town/ city.

Maximum efforts have been made to collect reliable data. For this purpose headmasters and Block Survey officers (Block Primary Education Officer) were given training

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at block level w.e.f. 4.6.57 to 5.6.57 and questionnaires were given to them. Duly filled forms, obtained from the school were subjected to minute scrutiny at district level.

Concepts of habitation, village and type of schools covered, were made clear to the trained. Village means revenue village and habitation means a distinct cluster of houses existing in a compact manner with local name and with a population not less than 25.

PRIMARY EDUCATION

2.1 There are 653 habitations in the district. 599 habitations have Primary school/section within the habitation and are providing educational facilities at Primary stage to 96.04 % population in the district. 2.03% population have to walk upto 0.5 Km. for getting this facility whereas 2.10% population receive this facility at walking distance of 0.5 Km. to 1.0 Km.

2.2 According to National norm(To provide educational facility within a walking distance of 1.0 Km) 99.20% population of the district is provided with Primary educational facility. Only 55 habitations having 0.30% population, have to walk more than 1.0 Km. to receive Primary education. In Sultanpur block, number of such habitations is maximum, which counts 37. Two schools have been proposed one each for Nagla and Sultanpur block. These schools will feed three habitations having 0.9% population of the district. After opening these schools 99.39% population of the district will be provided with educational facility at Primary stage.

2.3 Out of 96 villages where there is not even a single person belonging to scheduled castes lives in, 23 villages have primary schooling facility. There are 203 villages in the district which have scheduled caste population upto 25%, out of these villages, 133 villages have this

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facility. Similarly 134 villages have this facility where the population of Scheduled Castes is 26 to 50%, when the total number of such villages in the district is 200. Sixty four (64) villages in the district have scheduled castes population from 51 to 75% and 40 villages have more than 75% Scheduled Castes population. But the number of villages having primary schooling facility is 56 and 26 respectively.

2.4 There are 53; (5 boys, 5 girls and 52; Co-educational) independent Primary Schools in the district. Out of these 25 schools are situated in the Urban areas while all others are situated in rural areas. Only one independent primary school is run by the Centre Govt. and others are administered by the State Govt. Apart from independent primary schools, there are 16 schools (15 Private aided and 1 Private un-aided) which have Primary sections attached to them. Only two schools, with Primary sections attached to them, are situated in rural areas whereas all others are situated in Urban areas.

2.5 About 30% schools, situated in rural areas have pucca buildings. Only 6% schools run in open space whereas 11% schools have partly pucca/Kutchi buildings. In Urban areas 31% schools have pucca-buildings and 13% have partly pucca buildings. No school in Urban areas run in open space.

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- 2.6 23 Primary schools in the district, have no instructional room. There are 32 schools which have only one instructional room. There is no school in the district which have 10 or more than 10 instructional rooms. Majority of primary schools have more than two instructional rooms.
- 2.7 33 Primary schools in the district have sufficient buildings for their use. 47 schools require one additional room and 205 primary schools require two additional rooms. In the district there are 203 schools which require more than two additional rooms.
- 2.8 513 primary schools have 2679 primary sections in rural areas whereas 25 primary schools have 183 sections in Urban areas. 44 % sections in rural areas don't have usable blackboards, 5 % sections have unserviceable blackboards, while, 51 % primary sections have no blackboards at all. In Urban areas position is somewhat better. 60 % sections have usable blackboards, 2% have unserviceable blackboards whereas 33 % sections do not have blackboards.
- 2.9 In the district 91 % primary schools have drinking water facilities. 43 % have Urinals, 3 % have separate urinals for girls, 3 % have lavatory and 2 % have separate lavatory arrangement for girls. So far medical check up is concerned 41 % schools have provided this facility to children while 35 % schools have given vaccination facility to children.

- 2.10 It is observed from the data collected, keeping in view the teachers in position, that the number of schools is maximum in each block, where there are two teachers in position. About 11.80 % schools have one teacher, 33.35 % schools have two teachers and 16.35 % have three teachers in position. Hardly 1.0 % schools in the district have more than 10 teachers.
- 2.11 In the rural areas, 1546 teachers work at primary stage. Out of which 3 male and 3 female are untrained while 839 male and 701 female teachers are trained. In the Urban areas 9 male and 123 female teachers work at primary stage and they are all trained. It is seen that in the urban areas, the number of female teachers is quite higher as compared to male teachers.
- 2.12 The enrolment at primary stage in the district is 55250 (29236 boys and 25964 girls) out of which 22791 (12043 boys & 10748 girls) belong to scheduled castes. 86.70 % children are in the age group 6 - 11, while 5.21 % children are in the age-group 4 to below 6 years.
- 2.13 Age specific enrolment ratio i.e. enrolment of boys/girls in the particular age-group to population of boys/girls in that very age-group; in the rural areas is higher as compared to the Urban areas, For boys, in the rural areas, it is 33.64 while in the Urban areas it is 35.70. Similarly for girls it is 35.75 and 34.35 in the rural and the urban areas respectively.

Collected data reveals that, the age specific enrolment ratio is low in the urban areas. It is due to the fact that sufficient number of children are enrolled by un-recognized private institutions. And to collect the data from these institutions, if not impossible, is very difficult.

Gross enrolment ratio (Ratio of the enrolment of boys/ girls in class I - V to population of boys/girls in the age group 6-11) for the boys in the rural areas is 96.13 and for girls it is 97.13. In the urban areas it is 42.40 for boys and 41.47 for the girls.

So far the Pupil teacher ratio is concerned, it is 31 and 53 in the rural and the urban areas respectively. Percentage of girls in the rural areas is more as compare to that of in the urban areas. Over all percentage of the girls for the district is 47.

CHAPTER - III

UPPER PRIMARY EDUCATION

3.1 131 habitations in the district having 43.05 % population, have upper primary section within the habitations, 155 habitations with 17.60 % population have this facility at upto 1.0 Km; 206 habitations with 22.53 % population have to walk upto 2.0 Km to receive this facility whereas there are 100 habitations having 9.00 % populations which have to walk from 2 - 3 Km to get upper Primary schooling facility. Only 61 habitations with 2.76 % population in the district have to walk more than 3.0 Kms to get upper Primary schooling facility. The number of such habitations as have to walk more than 3.0 Km, is maximum in the Sultanpur Block as compare to other blocks. Their number is 34.

3.2 592 habitations with 90.66 % population of the district are already served with an upper primary school/section within a walking distance of 3.0 Km. 4 new upper Primary schools have been proposed which will meet the educational need of 1.35 % population of 9 habitations. After opening these schools 92.04 % habitations with 93.17 % population of the district will be served with an upper primary school/section within a walking distance of 3.0 Kms.

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3.3 There are 96 villages in the district where the population of scheduled castes is zero percent. and all these villages are deprived of upper primary schooling facility. out of 203 villages, which have scheduled castes population upto 25 %, only 62 villages have facility for upper primary education within the village. Similarly only 56 villages have the facility where the population of scheduled castes is 26 to 50 % when the total number of such villages in the district is 200. Sixty four (64) villages in the district have scheduled castes population from 51 - 75 % and 40 villages have more than 75 % population belonging to scheduled castes. But the number of villages having upper primary school/section within the village is 9 and 2 respectively.

3.4 There are 65 independent upper primary schools in the district and all administered by the State Govt. 3 middle schools (two private aided situated in the rural areas and one private unaided situated in the urban areas) have primary section attached to them. Apart from these schools 68 secondary schools run by the State Govt. (64 in the rural areas & 4 in the urban areas) and 13 Secondary schools run by private managements (3 in the rural areas & 10 in the urban areas) have upper primary sections attached to them. There are 10 Higher Secondary Schools (7 run by Govt. and 3 by private managements) also which have upper primary sections attached to them.

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- 3.5 There is only one middle school situated in the Urban area and is run by the private unaided management. It is housed in pucca building. Out of 67 middle schools situated in rural areas, 2 middle schools are run by private aided managements and have pucca-buildings whereas others 65 middle schools run by State Govt., out of which 54 have pucca-buildings, 10 have partly pucca buildings and one run in open space.
- 3.6 49 Govt. Middle schools in the district have libraries in them. There is only one middle school which have more than 1000 books in the library. Two private aided and one private unaided middle school also have library facilities.
- 3.7 The only middle school situated in the urban area enjoys all the facilities like, drinking water, urinal, separate urinal for girls, lavatory, separate lavatory for girls and medical check up etc. In the rural areas 64 middle schools have drinking water, 60 have urinals, 37 have separate lavatory for girls, 27 have medical check up and 27 have vaccination facilities for the students when the total number of middle schools in the rural areas is 67.
- 3.8 559 male and 323 female teachers are teaching at upper primary stage in the rural areas. All these teachers are trained whereas in the urban areas 142 male and 133 female teachers teach at upper primary stage in the schools.
- 3.9 The total enrolment at primary stage is 19733 (11147 boys & 3636 girls) and 5571 (3139 boys and 2532

girls) in the rural and urban areas respectively whereas the enrolment of scheduled castes students is 4322 (2995 boys & 1927 girls) and 1353(310 boys & 543 girls) in the rural and the urban areas.

3.10 Age-specific ratio at upper primary level in the rural areas for the boys is 35.03 and for the girls it is 69.00 whereas in the urban areas it is 61.33 and 55.27 for the boys & the girls respectively. Total age-specific ratio for the district is 73.93 and 65.60 for the boys and the girls. So far the Gross enrolment is concerned, in the rural areas it is 70.67 and 53.24 for the boys and the girls and in the urban areas it is 55.39 and 51.35 for the boys and the girls respectively.

Pupil teacher ratio at upper primary stage in the rural areas is 22 and it is 13 only in the urban areas. So far the percentage of girls is concerned it is 43.65 and 44.65 in the rural and urban areas respectively. Total for the district it is 43.33 %.

CHAPTER - IV

SECONDARY AND HIGHER SECONDARY EDUCATION (+ 2 S.E.G)

- 4.1 63 habitations having 30.34% population of the district have secondary sections within the habitation. Only 18 habitations with 0.55 % population have to walk more than 3.0 Km. for getting schooling facility at secondary level.
- 4.2 6 habitations with 5.62 % population of the district have Higher Secondary Schooling facility within the habitations. 55 habitations have this facility at a distance of upto 2.0 Kms, 135 habitations have this facility from 2.00 Km to 4.0 Km, 143 habitations have this facility after walking a distance from 4.1 Km to 6.0 Kms and 109 habitations with 15.13 % populations have this facility after walking a distance from 6.1 Kms to 8.0 Kms. whereas 204 habitations with 22.12 % population have to walk more than 3.0 Kms to receive this facility.
- 4.3 69 secondary schools (1 boys, 5 girls and 63 Co-educational) are situated in the rural areas whereas 14 secondary schools (2 boys, 5 girls and 7 Co-educational) are situated in the urban areas. In the Rural areas 64 schools are run by the State Govt., 4 schools are run by the Private aided Managements and one school is run by the Private unaided Management. In the Urban areas 4 Secondary schools are run by State Govt., 9 by Private aided bodies and one by Private unaided Management. Apart from these secondary schools 3 higher secondary schools in the rural

areas and 7 higher secondary schools in the Urban Areas also have secondary sections.

4.1 In the district only 10 schools are there which are providing schooling facility at higher secondary stage. Out of these 3 schools are situated in the rural areas and 7 schools are situated in the Urban Areas.

4.5 In the Rural Areas 66 secondary schools, out of the total of 69, have Library facilities whereas in the Urban Areas all the schools (14 schools) have this facility. Similarly all the higher secondary schools both in the rural and urban areas have library facilities.

4.6 343 males and 133 females are teaching at secondary stage in the Rural areas. Out of the total of 526 teachers, teaching at ^{secondary} stage, 171 are graduates, 153 are Postgraduates, 133 are language teachers & 69 teachers are of other categories.

In the Urban Areas 229 teachers are teaching at secondary stage. Out of them 129 are graduates, 67 Post-graduates, 22 language and 11 teachers are of other categories.

4.7 Only 46 (40 males 6 females) teachers teach higher secondary classes in the rural areas. Out of them, 23 are Postgraduates. Whereas 112 teachers teach at this stage in the Urban areas. Out of them 44 are graduates and 68 Post-graduates.

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- 4.8 Only one Secondary Private aided school in rural area have separate Lab. for Physics, Chemistry and Biology whereas all other (63 schools) have common **Science** Lab. for all the Science subjects.
- In Urban Areas all the 14 schools have Science Lab. 2 schools (One Govt. & other Private aided, Secondary school) have separate Lab. for Physics, Chemistry, Biology whereas other 12 schools have common Science Lab.
- 4.9 All higher secondary schools in the rural & urban areas have Science Lab. One in rural and 2 in urban areas have separate Lab. for Physics, Chemistry and Biology subjects whereas 2 Higher secondary Schools/^{each} in rural and urban area have common Science Lab.
- 4.10 1 Ph. D, 7 M. Sc, 131 Trained and 1 untrained Bsc. teacher is teaching Science subjects at secondary **and** higher secondary stage in the rural areas. Whereas in the Urban Areas 26 MSc, 53 Trained BSc. teachers are teaching science subjects at secondary & Higher Secondary stages.
- 4.11 Total enrolment of the students at secondary and higher secondary stage in the district is 11557 (6442 boys & 5115 girls) and 1063 (625 boys & 433 girls) respectively. whereas the enrolment of scheduled caste students is 1932 (1243 boys & 634 girls) and 143 (101 boys & 47 girls) at secondary and higher secondary stage respectively.

4.12 All the State Govt. administered secondary and higher secondary schools in the district are provided with drinking water facilities. But if we view the ~~over 200~~ picture for the district, it is observed that 95 % Secondary and 100 % higher secondary schools enjoy this facility. Similar is the position of facility for urinal in the schools. So far medical check is concerned, approximately 70 % schools have this facility.

4.13 All the higher secondary schools in the district have Physical teachers. So far secondary schools are concerned, 96 % Govt., 77 % Private-aided and 100 % Private unaided schools have Physical teachers.

4.14 30 % Higher secondary schools are providing Science Education to the students. Only 20 % schools have facility for Commerce subjects. Similarly 30 % Higher Secondary Schools have facility for Home Science Subject. Not even a single school is providing Vocational Education at +2 Stage. No doubt, some Higher secondary schools have Vocational stream, but they are providing this facility to students at secondary stage only.

CHAPTER - VOTHER EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES

- 5.1 Thirty three villages in the district have 34 non-formal centres. 4 Centres are exclusively for the girls whereas 30 centres are co-educational. All the centres are providing educational facility at primary level only. All the centres in the district are run by the State Govt. In these centres, 480 boys and 655 girls are meeting their educational needs. There is only one non formal centre situated in the urban area and that is situated in the Phagwara town, In this centre 5 boys and 25 girls are being taught.
- 5.2 There is not even a single centre in the district for the Adult education because this scheme has not been introduced by the State Govt.
- 5.3 There is no school for the disabled in the district.
- 5.4 Two blocks of the district i.e. Nadala and Sultanpur are provided with the facilities of Anganwadies and Balwadies. In 194 villages of the district, there are present 251 such institutions. Out of these 131 are situated in 92 villages in Nadala block and 120 are situated in 102 villages in Sultanpur block.

New primary schools/sections have been suggested in the habitations using the survey data on the basis of the following criterion or modified criterion by the state.
