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

Chapter-1

1.1. General information.

(a) Origin of the name of the district.

The District of Rupnagar is named after its district headquarters, the town of Rupnagar. Formerly known as Ropar the town of Rupnagar is said to have been founded by a Raja called Rokeshar who ruled during the 11th century and named it after his son Rupsen.

The town is of considerable antiquity. Recent excavations and explorations conducted at Rupnagar indicate that the first civilized folk to settle here were the Harappans who apparently reached the upper Sutlej towards the close of the third century B.C.

(b) Location.

Ropar District falls between north latitude 30°32' and 31°24' and east longitude 76°18' and 76°55'. The District adjoins Una District(H.P.) in the north , Hoshiarpur District in the north west and Ludhiana & Patiala Districts in the south-west.

(c) History of the District as an administrative Unit.

Rupnagar District was carved out as a new District under the Punjab Reorganisation Act,1966 by the inclusion of 237 villages alongwith Nangal, Naya Nangal & Anandpur Sahib Towns of the Una Tehsil of Hoshiarpur District, 282 villages alongwith Kharar & Kurali towns of the Kharar Tehsil and the entire tehsil of Ropar of Ambala District on 1st Nov,1966. The District comprises three Tehsils i.e. Rupnagar , Kharar & Anandpur Sahib and Six C.D. Blocks namely Rupnagar , Kharar, Anandpur Sahib, Nurpur Bedi, Majri & Chamkaur Sahib. It has the distinction of having Nangal Town in its jurisdiction which was one time the most frequently visited area when the world famous Bhakra Nangal Project was under construction.

(d) Population and its break-up.

The District having an area of 2088 Sq.K.M. has a population of 716662 persons . The break-up is as under :-

(e) Density of population.

According to 1981 census the density of population works out to 344 persons per sq.K.M. slightly higher than the State figure at 333 per sq.K.M.

(g) Level of Industrialisation.

Rupnagar has been primarily an agricultural district its industries confined to the village & collage Sectors. The traditional industry included poultry work, leather tanning, handloom weaving, shoe making and Phulkari embroidery. Most of these trades however have for various reasons been gradually decaying.

Lock making at Rupnagar has also been an important old time industry of the district . Locks made in Rupnagar were famous all over the country. After the migration of muslim artisans to Pakistan in 1947, this industry also declined.

In recent years, some agro based industries were also set up in the areas forming parts of the present district of Rupnagar. Kurali being a cotton market, a cotton ginning & oil-seed crushing unit was set up there in 1912 . Thereafter four more cotton ginning factories were started at Kharar, Rupnagar ,Morinda & Khanpur.

Anandpur Sahib was once famous for shoe making. The shoe were of excellent quality and were sold in Lahore, Amritsar , Delhi & Calcutta. A small quantity of dyed leather and quill work such as boxes etc. were also made at Anandpur Sahib by a few families, the women embroidering the patterns in strings of peacock quills. This work was probably of Nepalese origin. The manufactured articles were similar to those from Bilespur (H.P.) and other places in the hills.

A woollen mill set up at Kharar in 1944 by a partnership firm was later converted into a Public limited Company. Its products such as worsted yarn, woollen yarn, blankets etc found a market in the towns of Ludhiana, Amritsar, Panipat, Srinagar, Kanpur, Delhi and were also sold in the State of Rajasthan. The other traditional small scale industries which continue in the district are 'ban' making,"Munj" making and mats of date Palm etc. Though more and more land has been brought under Plough adequate supply of raw material munj and bhabbar grass grown at the foot of the hills is still available. The design of the matting and of ' ban ' has not undergone any change although the methods of manufacture have improved. Hand made goods have been substituted by machine made goods.

After the partition in 1947, the district has made considerable industrial progress. Industrial units have sprung up at Anandpur Sahib, Nangal, Morinda, Kharar, Rupnagar and S.A.S. Nagar. These include sugar Mills and Units for manufacture of tractors, television sets, steel tubes, cotton textiles, Fertilizers, electrical appliances ,rubber goods, heavy water and some other items. S.A.S. Nagar(Mohali) in particular has emerged as an important production point in the district. The town was sponsored by the government as a Center for industrial growth.

(h) Agricultural Development.

Agriculture is the principal means of livelihood of the majority of people of the district. According to the 1981 census 51.5% of the total working force of the district was engaged in agriculture as cultivators and agricultural labourer. The manner of utilization of land resources reveals the various uses to which the land is put and also indicates improved ways of exploitation of its resources for better production . The following statement gives the classification of area by land use in the District during this period 1986-87.

Irrigation.

Rainfall in the district is confined mainly to four rainy months from June to September. During the remaining months

water requirements are met from ground or surface water resources viz wells, tubewells and canals. Therefore, these resources are very important for the development of agriculture. With recent expansion of irrigation facilities, the failure of crops for want of rains has become rare.

The construction of the Bhakra Canal System is an important land mark in the development of canal irrigation in Punjab after independence . The Bhakra canal takes off from the left bank of Nangal Dam and upto Rupnagar this canal is known as Nangal Hydel Channel. The Bhakra canal system was completed in 1959. The length of the main canal and the branches is about 11000 Kms. and that of distributaries 3400 Kms. Besides Rupnagar District this canal system also irrigates the area of Punjab ,Haryana and Rajasthan.

It would be worth while to have a look at the following chart showing area, averages and production of major crops of Kharif and Rabi during 1986-87.

The other development aspects of agriculture i.e. Fertilizer consumption, distribution of Zinsum, installation of bio-gas plant , distribution of minikits, implementation of plant production minor irrigation and soil testing schemes are receiving due attention under the guidance of Chief agriculture officer in the District.

Many type of agricultural cooperative societies are functioning properly in this district for the development of agriculture. The farmers of the this district are increasingly using improved

Agricultural implements like Tractors, disc harrows, seed-drills, seed-cum-fertilizer drills, maize shellers, puddlers, bar harrows tillers, levellers. The wooden plough has been completely replaced by the iron plough and the rhematic type has taken place of the wooden cart wheel. There has been a great spurt in the demand for tractors in the district during the last decade. The following figures make interesting reading.

Cattle and Buffaloes play an important role in the economy of the District. These animals are a major source of draught power in agricultural operations and Transportation and also yield milk and other products. For their proper upkeep the Animal Husbandry Department is functioning at district level comprising two wings namely Animal Health and Animal Breeding.

#### Dairy Farming.

There is no regular Dairy farm in the District, but a large number of people in the villages and towns maintain small dairies for supply of milk to the town folk. A milk plant has been set up at S.A.S.Nagar and a Milk Chilling cum Demonstration Centre at Village Jinjeri (Tehsil Anandpur Sahib) these facilities have encouraged this growth of dairy farming in the district.

#### Poultry Farming.

Of late interest in poultry farming has increased greatly and many persons have adopted it on scientific lines. A number of Poultry farmers have sprung up in the Kharar area.

#### Forests.

The Forests in the district are mainly confined to the Shivalik Hills. They play a vital role in the conservation of soil and water resources and in stabilizing climatic conditions. The trees in this district provide timber firewood and some ingredients for medicines and are thus interlinked with agricultural development of the district.

#### I- Cultural Development.

The cultural development of the District is in tune with the desirable trends of social values.

There is no separate institution in the District for imparting training in fine arts like music, Dancing and painting. However music as a subject is taught in some girl schools and colleges.

The Schools and colleges have a number of social cultural and literacy societies. The Cultural and literacy societies functioning in the district are mentioned below :-

Nehru Yuva Kendra is playing an important role for the promotion of cultural development . The above named societies undertake projects of social and cultural values for the welfare of the common people.

Literary Societies.

Literary societies promote the cause of Literature by encouraging young writers constructive criticism of their writing and by publishing their works. They also arrange poetical symposia literary meetings and seminars. Among the literary societies functioning in the district the following deserve mention :-

- 1- Zila Likhari Sabha Ropar.
- 2- Dalit Likhari Sabha Punjab(Regd), Vill Sehon Mazra.
- 3- Punjab Sahit Sabha, Kharar.

The facility of Public libraries and reading rooms is available in almost all towns in the district. Most schools and colleges have their own libraries. All the municipalities and notified area committees in the district maintain libraries and reading rooms for Public use. Most of the Panchayats have also opened libraries.

District library Rupnagar and Nehru Yuva Kendra Library Ropar are worth mentioning.

to the life and teachings of the Sikh Gurus. Built at a cost of 12 Lakhs the building has been filled with transparent fibre domes so as to let in natural light. There are 24 oil paintings depicting important events connected with the lives of Sikh Gurus martyrs and followers.

1.2. Fifth All India Educational Survey

S.I.F.

The School Information form was intended to collect data on recognised schools including Govt, local body, private aided and private unaided schools. This form was got filled by the Headmasters/Principals of the concerned Schools. The S.I.F. contained 46 different type of questions for eliciting useful information pertaining to location, area, enrolment, teachers and other available facilities alongwith urgent requirements of school staff and equipment. It also intended to collect information regarding sports material and play-grounds. The questions regarding the management of the school and different mediums of instruction were also included for tabulation.

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This form was canvassed for all urban areas . The main items of information in the form are as:-

- 1- Actual /estimated population of the city/town and also of the slum areas.
- 2- Actual/estimated child population in various age groups in all areas and also separately for slum areas.
- 3- Number of institutions of different types.
- 4- Institutions for the disabled (handicapped) .
- 5- Centres for non- formal education their number and enrolment.
- 6- Centres for adult education their number and enrolment.
7. Institutions for pre school education Training Programme.

The work of distribution , collection and scrutiny of the above said forms was done with utmost care to ensure that the information collected was complete and free from all

as per instructions given in chapter Vth of " Guidelines for Survey officers' connected with the Fifth All India Education Survey.

The State Survey officer, Punjab alongwith her team of experts from SCERT Punjab-Chandigarh conducted orientation programme for the District Survey officers at Chandigarh from 18.5.87 to 20-5-87. The District Survey officer Ropar(Dy. Distt Education Officer,Ropar.1) , Six Block Primary Education Office of concerned C.D. Blocks, Statistical Assistant and the dealing hand joined this programme of training. The training team including experts from NCERT provided useful guidance regarding canvassing of forms, procedure for scrutiny of filled in forms, preparation of tables at Block level.

#### Training of Headmasters.

The District Survey team on their part conducted further orientation programme at Tehsil level and Block level(Primary side) for school Heads regarding data collection, scrutiny, tabulation and reporting. The different type of forms were distributed to the concerned Heads during these orientations courses i.e. from 2.6.87 to 5.6.87.

#### Data collection at Block Level.

The above said forms were collected as per schedule fixed earlier during the period 10-6-87 to 13.6.87 pertaining to the following C.L. Blocks.

#### Tabulation and Scrutiny of Block tables.

In all 128 tables were compiled at Block Level Tables 1 to 31 were compiled with the help of village information forms and urban information forms Tables 32 to 120 were prepared from the school information forms. The remaining tables from 121 to 128 were based on village information , Forms and some Block

tables. The scrutiny was done through various checks including cross checking and adding up system.

#### Preparation of District Tables.

Another orientation course was conducted at State level from 10-8-87 to 12-8-87 regarding preparation of tables at District level and drafting of District report covering main findings of the fifth All India Educational Survey.

In all 161 tables were prepared with help of the Block tables. The Block level data was got scrutinized at State level before consolidation at District level. The scrutiny of District table was done through various checks mentioned earlier.

#### Preparation of Maps.

One of the main objectives of the fifth All India Educational Survey was to draw maps indicating all the villages with habitations, educational facilities and their level in the habitations PUKKA Roads as well as rail roads if any in the Block, rivulets, forests, marshy and desert areas. Thus maps were prepared separately for each block. They will prove useful for planning, location of new institutions and delimiting the areas of existing and proposed institutions. Uniform indications were provided in the maps for ready reference and convenience.

Some of the important concepts and terms used in connection with the Survey work are as follows :-

#### Habitation.

A habitation has been taken to be a centre where people live in compact and contiguous manner.

#### Village.

A village means a revenue village. A village may consist of one compact habitation or a number of habitations. One of the habitations may bear the name of the village itself.

#### Recognised School.

In the survey the school has been taken to be

courses of study followed are prescribed or recognised by Govt. (Centre/State) or a university or a Board constituted by law or by any other agency authorised in this behalf by centre or State Govt. and which satisfies one or more of the authorities i.e. Directorate of Education Municipal Board, Secondary Board etc. with regard to its standard of efficiency. It runs regular classes and send candidates for public exams. The type of schools covered are boys, girls and co-educational or Govt. Local body, Private aided and Private unaided so far as management is concerned.

There are 925 villages in the District including 38 uninhabited and merged villages. The number of towns is 8. There are 995 habitations in the District in the rural areas. The estimated population of the District according to the present survey is 801376.

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## CHAPTER. II

### Part. I Primary Education

In this chapter the main findings of Fifth All India Education Survey in respect of Primary Education in the district have been given.

#### 2.1.

Number of habitations and their population served with a primary school/Section with in themselves or at different walking distances (Emphasis on disparities among blocks and walking distances upto 1.0 Km. and more than 1.0 Km.)

In this District, the children from 79 habitations comprising 3.39 % of population have to walk upto 0.5 Kilometer to get primary school facilities and from 84 habitations comprising 1.95 % of population have to walk upto 1 kilometer to get primary school facilities. Only the children from 69 percent of the population have to walk for more than 1 kilometer to reach their school.

The teacher-pupil ratio in the rural areas is 1-34 which is tolerable. In urban areas the ratio goes upto 1.61 which is clear indication of over crowding in urban areas.
