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Issues

(I) Access

- Total number of habitations has increased in comparison to the reported figures of 2007 08. At the same time total number of govt. primary and upper primary schools has decreased. Appraisal Team recommends for an effective School Mapping exercise in the State to reassess and standardise the actual status of access in the State at elementary level.
- State plans to mainstream children from 973 EGS centers to formal schools. However the State has not provided a detailed strategy for mainstreaming.
- OOSC: There is mismatch in Physical and financial progress of 2007-08. The state has proposed for running non residential bridge courses for 71436 children and state representative informs that ground work has been completed to launch the programme from 1st April 2008. The state has provided the break up also and it is advised to re-look into it. In the interest of the children the proposal for coverage of 71436 children @ Rs. 2500/- per child per annum (break up to be chalked out by the state) under AIE is being recommended and the state may be requested to provide exact number of children who will be covered under different bridge courses for 6, 9 and 12 months.

(II) Educational Indicators:

- The primary enrolment is showing an unexpected hike of 5 lakh from 2006-07 to 2007 08...
- The low achievement in enrolment is a very serious issue and special tangible interventions should be developed in coming years to overcome this key issue of enrolling all children in school/AIE centers.
- The comparison between the enrolment and population of 6 to 14 age group of children is showing a difference of 1397854.
- The drop out rate is showing irregular values. In case of Sangrur district the drop out rate in case of 6 to 11 age group is coming to -21.95 and district like Ferozepur and Mansa are having dropout rate 37.40 and 33.00 correspondingly. It is similar in case of 11 to 14 age groups, also 4 districts out of 20 are showing negative dropout rates.

School Infrastructure

a. Civil Works

- Physical progress wrt Civil Works is very low in some areas. For example 4 out of sanctioned 9 Primary schools, 61 out 459 sanctioned CRCs and 534 out of sanctioned 1421 additional classrooms have not been taken up for implementation so far.
- Convergence mechanism at all levels needs to be strengthened so as to achieve 100% coverage in water supply and toilet facilities in schools.
- Third Party Evaluation of Civil Works and School Mapping are yet to be started.

b. Teachers

• Teacher recruitment has remained extremely slow. The State authorities have reported that about 10,000 Primary Teachers and 4,000 Upper Primary teachers would be recruited in March 2008. Teacher rationalization needs to be ensured.

(III) Interventions for Quality Improvement

- Learning achievement, especially at Upper Primary level (as per NCERT surveys) is miserable. State needs to work on learning enhancement in a focused manner.
- Overall quality improvement initiatives till now have been poor. The State needs to strengthen all quality related interventions to improve quality of classroom processes and thereby learning achievement.
- Preparation for Learning Enhancement in Punjab (PLEP) at elementary level is a comprehensive plan for Learning Enhancement. The State must operationalise it based on the recently developed Base Line on Learning Achievement.
- Progress related to teacher training, remedial teaching poor. Needs further improvement.

(IV) SFD:

• State needs to work on reduction of gender gap in 2008 – 09.

(V) Innovative Activities:

- Girls' education: As per the state's information the schools having the computer education have improved in retention, enrollment and in their learning achievement. But there is no evidence of measurement for these outcomes.
- SC/ST: In selected districts such as Hoshiarpur, Nawanshaher, etc. rate of repetition is high. State needs to plan for specific quality improvement initiatives in such districts.
- ECCE: Number of centers for ECCE has decreased from 1660 to 1467. 340 ECCE centers sanctioned in 2007 08 have not been opened.
- Minorities: State may consider for planning innovative activities for the identified locations for minorities.

(VI) Girls' Education

- The KGBVs sanctioned are under model 3 and for 50 enrolment in each. But total number of children enrolled is 51.
- State's appeal is that state has received Rs. 10. 00 lakh only for each KGBV hostel against the norm of Rs. 15.00 lakh. The hostel buildings constructed at the locations with lesser unit

cost lack the capacity to accommodate 50 girls as per the norms and have capacity to house 25 children.

(VII) Research, Evaluation, Monitoring and Supervision:

• The State needs to design detailed plan of action for research in 2008 – 09.

(VIII) Strategies for community mobilization:

• There is no specific training module for the community training.

(IX) Involvement of NGO

• No GIAC meeting held during 2007-08. It is being reconstituted.

(X) Project Management:

• At state level sanctioned posts are 64, out of which 59 are in position. 9 are stipulated for accounts. No Executive Engineer post is sanctioned to monitor the civil works either at SPO or District level. Both state and district office should be strengthened.

(IV) Issues

The expenditure upto December 2007 was Rs. 3937.38 lakh which works out to 21.30 % of the approved outlay. The State has indicated an estimated expenditure of Rs. 12978.25 lakh for the current year which is 70% of the approved outlay. Based on the trend of last year's expenditure, the estimated expenditure for the current year works out to Rs. 12550.22 lakh.

Action taken against approvals of PAB 2007-08

The 97th meeting of PAB for approval of the AWP & B 2007 - 08 of Punjab was held at the MHRD on 9th May 2007. Section I

Introduction

Punjab is Located in the northwestern corner of the nation on 35 degree latitude and 74 degree longitude covering an area of 50362 sq. kms (2% the country's total geographical area), comprising mostly of plain and fertile soil. It is bounded on the north by the Indian state of Jammu and Kashmir, on the east by Himachal Pradesh and the Union territory of Chandigarh, on the south by Haryana and Rajasthan, and on the west by Pakistan. The city of Chandigarh is the joint administrative capital of Punjab and Haryana.

Demographic profile of the State says that total population of Punjab is 244 lakh as per census 2001 comprising 53.3% males and 46.7% females. The two-third of its population is residing in rural areas. The SCs account for nearly 29% of the total population. The overall Literacy rate is 69.70 %. Male literacy rate 75.63%, female literacy rate 63.55% & rural female literacy rate is 55.37%. SC literacy is 56.22% and female SC literacy is 48.22%.

SSA was launched in the State in the year 2001-02. Punjab is divided in 20 Administrative Districts, 72 Tehsils, 141 CD Blocks, 216 ED Blocks and 12711 Villages. The total population is 244 lakh as per Census 2001 with two-third of its population residing in rural areas. In Punjab, school education is managed by the Director of Public Instruction (separate for Primary & Secondary Education). The Education Department covers classes I to VIII and children in the age group 5-14 years.

Section 2

Planning process

The State plan contains the following things in the planning process.

- 1. The process of participatory planning;
- 2. Implementation of Plan and its Monitoring and Supervision; and
- 3. Structure and Functions of Elementary Education Committees;

The following are the comments regarding planning process.

The district plan is based on the data collected by household survey in 2007-08. The planning implementation teams were constituted at village, cluster, block and district levels. DISE data have also been used in the plans. Capacity building for these teams was provided in seminars and workshops. The district plans were prepared by the District Educational Development Committees under the Chairmanship of the Deputy Commissioner.

The main contents of the training were plan formulation, planning for formulation of action plans for all components for civil works, appraisal of the draft district plans and submission of district plans.

As regards the functions of the committees are concerned the district plans mentioned that VEDC prepares village level UEE plans but VEDC only collect and collate the required data and send it at the cluster level. From cluster level it is sent at block level for consolidation and district level for preparation of the district plans.

The state plan indicated that the state of Punjab has transferred 6027 schools without staff to Department of Rural Development during 2005-06. It has proposed district-wise number of teachers in 523 primary schools. But there is no breakup of number of schools required one teacher, two teacher and three or four teachers.

Planning for Disadvantaged Children

As regard the out of children, there are 100,457 children out-of-school in the age group of 6-14, of which 21846 children are out-of-school due to migration, 8856 because of disability and 69755 because of socio-economic and cultural reasons. Following activities will be conducting for bringing children in formal schools and AIE centres.

- 1. Massive media activities will be organized for motivating the parents/community and guardians.
- 2. Publicity and advertisement are being made for this purpose.
- 3. For AIE centres the state has plan to sufficient number of non-government organizations.
- 4. In some of the places where NGOs are not available Education Department will manage the AIE centres.
- 5. The state has already developed textbooks for bridge courses as follows.
 - Bridge course-I: The textbooks are for over-aged children having mental level to the children of class I &II.

- Bridge course-II: For the children having mental level equivalent to children of classes 3 & 4.
- Bridge course-III: For the children having mental level equivalent to those of classes 6 & 7.

The following activities are proposed for AIE centres in 2008-09.

- Honorarium for AIE Volunteers @ Rs. 2500/-
- Training of Volunteers Rs.100/- per volunteer for 10 days.
- Contingency Rs. 500/- per centre
- School Bag/Pencil Box/Pencils/erasers.
- TLM Rs.2000/per centre per annum.
- Health/Hygiene Camps Rs.150 per child per annum.
- Stationary to children Rs. 25/- per child per annum.
- Uniform Footwear etc.Rs.500/- per child per annum.
- Community Mobilization Rs. 50/- per child per annum per centre to be paid to VEDC
- Monitoring and Management Support Rs. 50/- per child per annum per centre.
- Monitoring and Management Support Rs. 50/- per child per annum per centre.
- Board Examination Fee for class V children Rs. 85/- per child per annum.
- Board Examination Fee for class VIII children Rs. 350/- per child per annum.
- Co-curricular activities/field visits Rs 223.75 per child per annum.

State Plan Document provides evidences of school level need based planning for achieving UEE in a holistic manner.

Section 3

Educational Indicators

The data made available is of DISE 2007-08. Data is not avoid of inconsistency. The primary enrolment is showing an unexpected hike of 5 lakh to 2006 - 07 data. State should give importance to accuracy in collecting, assimilating and using the data. State can carry out a study in this regard.

District wise and gender specific data on GER as well as on NER is not provided by the state. The GER of 6-11 age groups of children is 70.67 and that of 11 - 14 age groups is 61.77 which are very alarming. State should consider this low achievement in enrolment a very serious issue and special tangible interventions should be developed in coming years to overcome this key issue of enrolling all children in school/AIE centers.

As per the data provided, state is claiming that the number of out of school children identified is 100457. But the comparison between the enrolment and population of 6 to 14 age group of children is showing a difference of 1397854. State should clarify this huge difference. The data should be re-evaluated for precision.

Appraisal of various Interventions

(I) Access

Primary:

• State policy on opening of new schools/branch school

State policy on opening of new primary or branch school is

- habitations with minimum 300 population
- minimum distance of the habitation from the nearest primary school should not be less than 1 km
- community/ Panchayat should provide at least one acre of land for school,
- Infrastructure provided by community/ Panchayat with two class rooms, veranda, boundary walls, girls and boys toilets, drinking water facilities, furniture or class and office room.

At present infrastructure support is provided by the SSA instead of community or Panchayat.

The State representatives have informed the Appraisal Team that certain number of non functional and non existing schools have been removed from the total number of primary schools reported this year, 2008-09. Present data is based on DISE 2007-08 only.

1398 new habitations have been reported by the State in this year, 2008-09, in comparison to the reported figure of 2007-08 due to inclusion of small hamlets as individual habitations. Out of 17059 habitations, 16375 habitations have primary schools, 1004 habitations have EGS centres. Total habitations eligible for primary schools as reported by the State are 31.

The data related to habitation mapping shows lot of overlapping for primary schools and EGS centres in the State. PAB may like to discuss this issue.

Progress:

During initial period of SSA, 2002-03, 1005 branch schools were approved by PAB with 2010 teachers. All these Branch Schools were functional in the State. Teachers of nearby schools were attached to these branch schools in the beginning. Regular teachers were posted during 2005-06 only.

97 EGS centres were sanctioned for up-gradation to primary schools till 2007-08. Out of them 9 EGS centres were upgraded during 2007-08. These 9 upgraded centres were imparting education to the children through Education Volunteers (EV) only. No teachers have been recruited till date. State representatives have informed that land was a major constraint for the state. They have approached to the Government to revise the land norm required for opening of a primary school. Recently five districts have initiated the process for construction of school buildings by up-gradating their EGS centres.

Proposal:

No new (fresh) primary schools have been proposed by the State for the year 2008-09.

4133 EGS centres were sanctioned till 2007-08. 2909 EGS centres were functional till 2007-08. 1905 EGS centres were closed in between either by the community or by the district due to overlapping of EGS with government primary schools as informed by the state. Presently, 1004 EGS centres are running in the school. Out of which, 617 centres are running for 2 years or more.

1004 EGS centres are running in the State till date with an enrolment of 30633 children. 617 EGS centres have completed 2 years and remaining 356 EGS centres are running for less than 2 years.

Proposals:

The State has proposed for up-gradation of 31 EGS centres running for more than 2 years with 40 or more children enrolled in. Remaining 973 EGS centres will be closed down after 31st March 2008.

The State neither proposed for continuation of 356 EGS centres running for less than 2 years nor for upgradation of 617 EGS centres completed 2 years. As informed by the state that either enrolment of these centre are less than 40, unavailability of required size of land in the concerned habitations/ villages or running in the served areas. Children of 973 EGS centres will be mainstreamed in nearby primary schools and some over aged children will be covered under AIE programme.

The State seems to be not clear enough on coverage of existing children of 973 EGS centres after 31st March 2008. Habitation mapping reveals the facts that there are 653 small habitations which are not eligible for primary schools. Exact number of EGS centres running in small habitations with total number of enrolled children is yet to be identified. Even actual status of children enrolled in 1907 closed down EGS centres, needs to be verified

Recommendations:

The Appraisal team has recommended for up-gradation of proposed 31 EGS centres to primary schools along with teachers and infrastructure. It is further clarified that these 973 EGS centers continuing till March end 2008 which is coterminous with the end of the State's academic session in 2007 – 08.

Suggestions:

The State needs to visualize actual scenario of the EGS as a whole to do a needful action ensuring continuation of education of children enrolled in 1004 EGS centres after 31st march 2008. Also, the State needs to initiate a process for trekking of children mainstreamed from EGS or AIE centres

Upper Primary

• State Policy for establishment of Upper Primary Schools:

The State norm for establishment of Upper Primary Schools does not allow opening of any new Upper Primary school except up-gradation of Primary to Upper primary schools with a minimum number of 20 Primary graduates.

At present 5424 government, 245 aided and 4095 upper primary schools are functioning in the State. In comparison to reported figure of 2007-08, 13 government, 240 aided and 1488 private upper schools have decreased in last one year. Present school figure is based on DISE 2007-08.

Progress:

One new upper primary school was sanctioned by the PAB during 2007-08 for the district Moga. The schools have started functioning.

Out of 17059 habitations, 15773 habitations have schooling facilities in upper primary level.1286 habitations do not have access to upper primary. State has identified 142 habitations eligible for opening of new upper primary schools. Presently, the State has primary to upper primary school ratio of 2.38. In districts like Barnala (1.59), Bhathinda (1.49), faridkot (1.54), Ludhiana (1.86), Mansa (1.62), Moga (1.59), Muktsar (1.67), Sangrur (1.84) have a suitable ratio below 2:1. Rest of the districts fall in between 2.27 (Nawanshaher) to 3.4 (Ropar).

Proposal:

The State has proposed for 142 new upper primary schools for Fatehgarh sahib (50), ferozpur (12), Kapurthala (11) Ludhiana(5), Moga (3), Mohali (6), Nawanshahrar (9), Patiala (22) and Ropar (10) in 2008-09 to provide access to identified eligible habitations.

Recommendations:

The Appraisal Team has recommended for 134 new upper primary schools in the proposed districts with primary to upper primary school ratio more than 2 (as per MHRD's latest guidelines). In case of Kapurthala (ratio 2.26) and Nawnshaher (ratio (2.27) the Team

recommends for 11 schools and 9 schools respectively as they fall under the SFD B category. Proposals for Ludhiana and Mansa are not considered because of low Primary to Upper Primary ratio. The State Plan has not proposed for any new Upper Primary Schools in districts such as Gurdaspur (P: UP 3.27). The State authorities may be requested to go for rigorous Habitation Mapping to confirm the real situation in such districts.

Suggestions:

The Appraisal Team has strongly opined for a need of rigorous School Mapping exercise to be carried out in the state to recheck the access facilities available in habitations/ villages for both primary and upper primary sections.

C. Interventions for Out of School Children:

Analysis of the data of OOSC of three years and comparison with the data provided by IMRB survey conducted in 2005 reveals that there is no change in the scenario of OOSC in the state. The following table shows the comparison of three years data which is given below (age wise, gender wise and year wise):

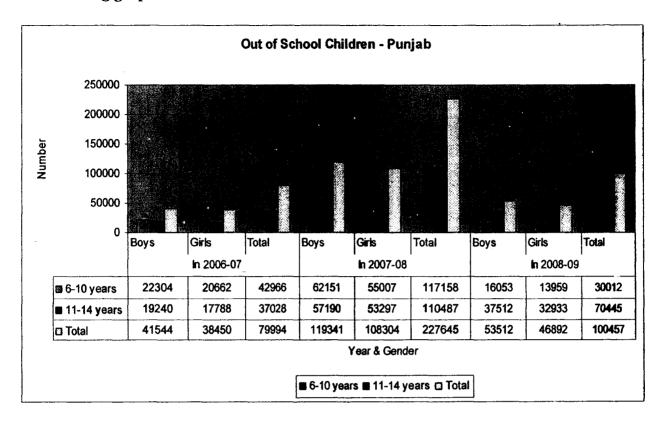

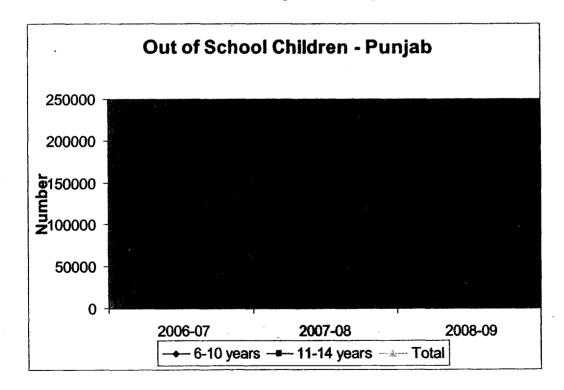

The state reported 2.27 lakhs OOSC as on 31st March 2007. The plan reveals that the state conducted household survey in 2007 and the head count of OOSC came down to 100457. This number is similar to the number estimated during IMRB survey.



According to the State Component Plan and discussion with the state representative it is observed that there shall be no EGS centres after 31st March 2008. The state has reported that 70177 children will be mainstreamed but the mainstreamed plan and timeline is missing.

Observations and Recommendations:

- According to the IMRB Report (Survey conducted in 2005) there were 1.08 lakh children OOS.
- The state has planned for age wise coverage of never enrolled and dropped out children. And proposed for one uniform strategy of NRBC for all children which needs to be relooked into..
- While calculating number of out of school children, drop out rate has not been taken into
 account. If drop out rate is taken into account, the number of out of school children will
 be more than the number reported.
- Analysis of Population, NER and Drop out rate does not match with the number of OOSC.
- The state had identified 21846 migrating children. But plan for bringing the children into the fold of education is missing. The state should analyse the data identify area duration and time of migration and should submit a plan accordingly. These may be work sight schools, residential / non residential bridge courses, seasonal hostels etc. The state should also map source and destination of the children and industry / occupation of these

- children/children belonging to migrating families. The state may be advised to map the magnitude of migration, constitute an interstate/inter district task groups for the same and plan suitable strategy for them
- The state has not planned for hard to reach children like child labourers, children in difficult circumstances, children working in dhabas and garages and engaged in domestic chores.
- The state is yet to chalk out a plan for involvement of NGOs, Self Help Groups etc. for implementation for residential and non residential bridge courses. The state has not reported about the system of desk appraisal and field appraisal etc. The state may invite proposals of NGOs for various categories of OOSC, sentiny the proposals and submit it for consideration before GIAC.
- The state conducted household survey in January 2008. The state may be advised to analyse the data age wise, category wise and gender wise which will help in making different strategies that suits the need of the children of OOSC.
- The state may be advised to analyse the data at block and sub block level to identify the bottlenecks
- The state has reported 19% fresh physical achievement under EGS& 31st December 2007 (3rd Quarter report) and anticipated expenditure of 39% till 31st March 2008. However the state representative informed that 69.6% children under EGS and 58.8% children under AIE have been covered till December 2007 which includes continuing children also.
- The state should look into the data w.r.t. NER, drop out rate, household survey and out of school children and should analyse it.
- The progress report provided by the state shows that the actual execution of the programme takes place after 3-4 months lapse of the financial year.
- The State has proposed for running of RBCs for 1200 children with special needs. The state has identified different category of physically challenged children and has provided in the same in the plan. Hence RBC for 1200 CWSN is recommended @ Rs. 10000/- per child per annum.
- There is mismatch in Physical and financial progress of 2007-08. The state has proposed for running non residential bridge courses for 71436 children and state representative informs that ground work has been completed to launch the programme from 1st April 2008. The state has provided the break up also and it is advised to re-look into it. In the interest of the children the proposal for coverage of 71436 children @ Rs. 2500/- per child per annum (break up to be chalked out by the state) under AIE is being recommended and the state may be requested to provide exact number of children who will be covered under different bridge courses for 6, 9 and 12 months.

Observations

The information furnished by the state on physical and financial progress achieved has been taken for the period 31.01.08 furnished by the state.

Out of 34529.5565 lakhs approved so far a sum of Rs. 33068.10lakhs (99.20%) utilized. Upto end of December 2007 99.90% of works have been completed.

Out of Rs. 3946.19 lakhs approved for 2007-08 a sum of Rs. 2501.65 lakhs (93.8%)have been spent upto 31/01/2008.

The state government officials have mentioned that 1 BRC, 459 CRCs, 9 primary schools and 1421 additional classrooms and 11441 child friendly elements were approved during 2007-08 and the progress is slow and the works which are in progress and not taken up will be completed by June, 2008.

The table given below gives details of works approved during 2007-08 and the amount to be spilled over to the next year. The figures given are based on the costing sheet.

General Observation:

The state till date is not having sufficient technical manpower at all levels (state, district, block/field level) for the planning implementation and monitoring of civil works. However the

state officials mentioned that one post of executive engineer for state level, four sub-divisional engineers for divisional centers and twenty junior engineers for district level have been approved by EC recently. The posts mentioned above would be filled up by taking personnel from state PWD on deputation basis. Regarding the implementation of third party evaluation the state officials mentioned that tenders have been invited and the bids will be opened shortly and the work will be started by April/May 2008. Regarding school mapping they mentioned that the work is yet to be taken up. Provision of toilets and drinking water to schools are provided by Public Health Engineering Department (PHED) in Punjab state under TSC and ARWSP. The state officials mentioned that the list of schools not having toilet & drinking water have been given to PHED. But the work is to be started. There is no close coordination between SSA and PHED for the provision toilets and drinking water to schools. As per flash statistics based on DISE 2006-07 about 13% of schools are not having common toilet and 19% are not having girl's toilet. 99% schools are having drinking water facilities. mechanism with JNURM and Rural electrification activities needs to be improved/ strengthened. As per DISE 2006 there is a gap of 2362 classrooms. Five districts (Amritsar, Faridkot, Fategarhsahib, Nawashar and Ropar) are having no gap in classrooms.

Proposal

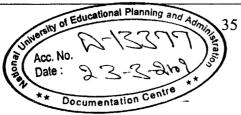
The state has proposed to construct 319 CRCs, 31 primary schools, 134 upper primary schools, 4642 additional classrooms, 1061 common toilets including 71 separate toilet for girls, 635 drinking water, 264495 sq.m verandah arrangements in schools, 1600 electricity facilities, 1148 head masters room, 1428866 Rm boundary wall, major repairs to 102 (72+305) schools, provision of ramps to 2960 schools and furniture for 164216 students in 1175 upper primary schools at an estimated cost of **Rs. 25712.030 lakhs**.

Analysis of the proposal

The buildings proposed are of normal type. The state government officials mentioned that the cost estimates indicated in the proposal is less than the State Schedule of Rates. Same rates adopted for the last year and with the unit cost of school building a sum of Rs. 50000/- has been added towards the provision of compound wall to the school. They also mentioned that the unit cost proposed holds good for all districts and 3% of the total cost of building works has been added towards supervision & monitoring cost .However the design and estimates proposed have not been either approved by the competent authority (State PWD) or by the EC.

Following rates have been adopted for various items of civil works for working the cost estimates.

The state has proposed to take up 319 CRCs during 2008-09. The state officials mentioned that 1499 CRCs are functioning in the state and 1154 CRCs have alone been sanctioned so far. Some the CRCs are functioning in existing Government school buildings and they are badly in need of rooms for CRC. It is to be mentioned here that out of 459 BRCs approved during the last year (2007-08) only 3 are completed, 395 are in progress and 61 are yet to be taken up for implementation. As per the cumulative progress report (31.12.07) out of 1154 CRCs approved so far 677 are completed, 324 are in progress and 153 are yet to be taken up. Based on the requirement 270 CRCs have been recommended for approval.

The state has proposed to upgrade 31 EGS centers to primary schools in 11 districts as the children in these centers are more than 40. However during the last year 9 primary schools were approved and out of which 5 are in progress and 4 are yet to be taken up. Construction of 31 primary schools in 11 districts is recommended.

The state has also proposed to upgrade 142 primary schools to upper primary in 10 districts. Accordingly they have proposed 142 school buildings for upper primary schools. According to the cumulative progress report for the period ending 31.12.07, no upper primary schools have been approved so far to the state. 142 upper primary school buildings proposed are recommended for approval.

It is proposed to construct 4642 additional class rooms. As per DISE 2006 there is a gap of 2362 classrooms. Five districts (Amritsar, Faridkot, Fategarhsahib, Nawashar and Ropar) are having no gap in classrooms. Considering the above the state is eligible only for 1834 additional class rooms. As per report furnished by the state for the month of January 2008 out of 1421 additional classrooms approved during 2007-08 only 2 has been completed, 885 are in progress and 534 are yet to be taken up for implementation. Since the gap in class rooms are to be completed 1640 additional class rooms only are recommended for approval based on the requirement indicated by the state. Wherever the DISE gap was ZERO no ACRs were recommended and there will be a gap of 722 additional classrooms after approval of the above.

The state has proposed to provide drinking water facilities to 635 schools and common toilet facilities to 1061 schools including 71 separate toilets for girls. The state officials mentioned that the drinking water & toilet facilities proposed are for both rural and urban areas. As per the information furnished by them, provision of drinking water to 97 schools and toilet facilities to 238 schools in urban areas. Hence the above is recommended for approval. Similarly provision of 71 separate toilets for girls is recommended for approval. Remaining is for the rural areas, hence not recommended. These are to be covered through convergence. As per flash statistics

based on DISE 2006-07 about 13% of schools are not having common toilet and 19% are not having girl's toilet. 99% schools are having drinking water facilities. In view of the above the convergence mechanism should be strengthened to achieve 100% schools with drinking water & toilet facilities.

It is proposed to provide electric facilities to 1600 schools in 12 districts. A sum of Rs. 10000/- is proposed as the unit cost. Provision of electricity facility, compound wall, and head masters room were not considered for approval due to budget restrictions. However the 264495 Sq.m verandah proposed for 6 districts are not recommended as these are to be constructed as part of the building.

A sum of Rs.265.75 lakhs is earmarked by MHRD for carrying out major repairs to schools in Punjab state. The state has proposed to carry out major repairs to 102 schools (72PS+ 30 UPS) in 3 districts. No details regarding the estimates, age of the building, list of schools and photographs were made available for scrutiny. Hence the above is not recommended.

The state has proposed to construct 2960 ramps in 10 districts. The unit cost for the construction of ramp has been assumed as Rs.7500/- each. Since there is gap in additional class rooms are to be covered the above is not recommended for approval. Moreover this has to be funded by IED. It is proposed to provide furniture for 164216 students in 1175 schools in 13 districts. To adjust the civil works allocation for each district to the optimum level provision of furniture to 76548 students amounting to Rs.382.740 lakhs are recommended.

Recommendations

- 1. Construction of 270 CRCs, 31 primary schools, 134 upper primary schools and 1640 additional classrooms and provision of common toilets to 238 schools, 71 separate toilets for girls, drinking water to 97 schools in urban area and furniture to 76548 students at an estimated cost of Rs. 6847.286 lakhs including a spillover amount of Rs 348.777 lakh is recommended for approval.
- 2. As per flash statistics based on DISE 2006-07 about 13% of schools are not having common toilet and 19% are not having girl's toilet. 99% schools are having drinking water facilities. Convergence mechanism should be strengthened to achieve 100% schools with drinking water & toilet facilities.
- 3. The state should take all efforts to complete the ongoing/ not taken up civil works by end of June 2008 positively.

(III) Interventions for Quality Improvement

The Appraisal Team has attempted to look at progress of different parameters related to quality improvement. Punjab has achieved substantially in the field of access and enrolment under SSA. Now the whole thrust needs to be on quality improvement in the classroom processes and learning achievement of students. The Appraisal Team has attempted to look at the State's vision for overall quality improvement, curriculum/textbooks renewal, teacher recruitment/rationalization, teacher education institutions and training, academic resource centers/groups, classroom practices, approach to learning assessment, use of performance indicators and quality monitoring.

A. Curriculum renewal:

As per the State Plan, the State follows the curriculum developed by Punjab School Education Board. Revision of curriculum is done continuously in phased manner. The National Curriculum Framework 2005 has been studied by the SCERT, Punjab. The recommendations for certain modifications have been sent to PSEB and to NCERT

B. Textual Materials:

The State has provided following information regarding the progress of free textbook distribution in the State under SSA in 2007 - 08.

As per the State Plan, free textbooks were provided to all Non SC girls of classes I - VIII under SSA in 2007 – 08. Free workbooks were provided to all children except Non SC boys of classes I - VIII. The books under SSA were procured from State Education Board. Textbooks to SC girls and SC boys were provided, as usual, by State Govt. through Department of Social Welfare. The Non SC boys could not be provided Free/Workbooks because of the lack of any budgetary provision under SSA for the purpose.

Budget allocation for free text books for non-SC girls and for workbooks for all the children except non-SC boys of classes I - VIII under SSA AWP&B 2007-08 was Rs. 1181.41390 lakh. The entire budget has been used up for the provision of text and work books to children of classes I - VIII.

Proposal for Text/Work books for 2008-09:

As per the revised norms of SSA text & workbooks would be provided to all the children of classes I to VIII under SSA. Since the books are provided to SC girls & boys by the Department of Welfare, SSA would cover non SC girls & boys at EE level.

The Appraisal Team finds the price of textbooks for Primary level OK. However at the Upper Primary level the price of a total cost of textbooks is on the higher side and can not be considered beyond Rs. 250.00 as per SSA norms for Upper Primary level. Accordingly the Team recommends a total amount of Rs. 2147.566 lakh towards free textbooks for a total of 2094159 children at Primary level and Upper Primary level as per the actual price suggested above.

To select teachers the State advertises in news papers. Candidates with required qualification and professional training apply for the posts. Government constitutes Departmental Selection Committees to scrutinize the applications. Selection is done on merit basis. For Primary level teacher-ship candidate is desired to have +2 with ETT or, higher qualification and for Upper Primary level, the candidate needs be a graduate with B. Ed. or, higher qualification.

After the selection Directorate of Secondary Education issues appointment letters for UP teachers and Director Elementary Education issues appointment letters for Primary teachers. For Panchayati Raj institutions, Director Local Bodies or, Director, Panchayati Raj issues appointment letters. The candidates are placed in districts of their choice.

As per the above table, the State has recruited 1822 teachers against a sanction of 2441 teachers under SSA. However as per the MHRD records (based on PAB minutes and QPR data), it is not correct. SSA website updated up to 6th June 2007 says that a total of 1868 teachers (60%) against a total sanction of 3070 have been recruited and there is a gap of 1202.

As per DISE 2006 - 07, average TPR of the State is 1: 37 at Primary level and 1:25 for Upper Primary level. In Amritsar (1:55), Firozpur (142), Moga (1:45) and Muktsar (1:42), and Sangrur (1:45) at the Primary level the TPR is well above the SSA norms. The State needs to go for teacher rationalization to improve the TPR in these districts.

DISE 2006 – 07 also indicates that the State still has 2107 (13%) Primary schools and 241 (3%) Upper Primary schools, which have single teachers. The State must ensure that the number of single teachers is reduced to zero at the earliest.

DISE 2006 - 07 also indicates that there are 339 Primary schools and 91 Upper Primary schools where the PTR is more than 40. The State must ensure in 2008 - 09 that the number of such schools with PTR > 40 should be brought to zero.

The State has quoted DISE 2007 - 08 to show that there are larger number of schools with higher PTR as indicated in the following table.

State authorities have indicated that the State is going to recruit around 10,000 Primary and 4,000 Upper Primary teachers in March 2008 to bring the PTR lower. Along with this the State has planned for teacher rationalization to reduce the number of schools with higher PTR a per SSA norms. Appraisal Team appreciates this initiative of the State and hopes for improvement in PTR and thereby classroom facilities.

Against a proposal for 1055 teachers the Appraisal Team recommends for a total of new 464 teachers (62 Primary and 402 Upper Primary) for 2008 – 09. The Appraisal Team would like to insist on the fact that as per the revised SSA norms the State must recruit teachers with Science and Maths experience on priority basis at Upper Primary level.

D. Capacity building of Teachers:

(i) Annual In - Service training for regular teachers:

As per the Plan, the training programme under SSA was implemented by training the Key Resource Persons at State Level by National experts. In Punjab the DIETs are the nodal agencies of the Training Programme. Training to Master Trainers was imparted at District Level. Training to Primary and Upper Primary teachers is given at Block/ Cluster level under the supervision of DIETs. Monthly meetings are held by Director SCERT to provide necessary guidelines and directions and also to get the feedback of the progress in Teachers' Training. In 2007 – 08 the following training programmes were undertaken by the State.

• Four State Level workshops were organized for teachers of English at Regional Institute of English, Chandigarh. The workshops were held for teachers of Amritsar, Bathinda, Faridkot and TarnTaran covering 60 teachers from each district.

- Two days State Level workshops for 5 BRPs/ DRPs of each district were organized at C-DAC, Mohali in two batches from 26-27 Dec, 2007 & 28-29 Dec, 2008. The training was imparted by the faculty of National Institute of Administrative Research (NIAR), Mussoorie & Professor from Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar. These master trainers will again be provided one day training at State Level in the month of March & they will further train BRPs/ DRPs in their district. Proposal is also under consideration for providing training to these BRPs/ DRPs through SIEMAT, Himachal Pradesh Shimla. All the BRPs of the State will be provided training by March end 2008.
- BRPs/DRPs of Bathinda, Nawanshahr, Patiala and Ropar were imparted training on Computation of the district specific EDI of Punjab state. A team of 4 members were imparted training on using indicators on planning elementary education and other indicators, computation of an EDI by National University of Education Planning and Administration.
- A Pilot Project was organized for the evaluation of Teacher Training Programme and upgradation of their competency by Tilak Maharashatra Vidyapeeth, Pune in respect of Pre & Post test conducted by TMU, Pune on 13-06-2007 and 26-06-2007 in the seven districts namely Mohali, Ropar, Sangrur, Patiala, Moga, Fatehgarh Sahib, Amritsar covering 907 teachers of English and Mathematics.
- Two days State Level workshops was organized at Ludhiana on Advancement in Educational Performance through Teachers Support (ADEPTS) and Training on special project named as Preparation for Learning Enhancement in Punjab (PLEP) in which 2 lecturers from each DIETs & GISTCs Quality Coordinator from each district were participated. Training was imparted by Chief Consultant Dr. Binay Pattanayak, TSG Ed. CIL, New Delhi.
- One day State Level workshop was organized at Fatehgarh Sahib on Advancement in Educational Performance through Teachers Support (ADEPTS) in which 2 lecturers from each DIETs & GISTCs and Quality Coordinator from each district were participated.
- A special Teacher Training for one day was imparted by the NGO Edushastra Foundation, Mumbai in Amritsar, Fatehgarh Sahib, Ludhiana, Patiala, Ropar and Sangrur from 15-26 June, 2007. The training was appreciated by teachers.
- Teleconference was attended by team of SSA employees at IGNOU centre Khanna on ADEPTS Teacher Training etc.

The Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan Authority, Punjab held a detailed workshop to introspect and suggest measures to improve the Teacher Training component under the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan Programme. The workshop was held in Panjab University, Chandigarh wherein the representatives of the adjoining states, i.e., Himachal Pradesh also participated.

The above table indicates the progress up to January end 2008. However the State representatives have indicated that the progress will go up to nearly 70%. The Appraisal Team would like to insist that the State must expedite the process of teacher training and strive for a better achievement.

(ii) Induction training for newly recruited trained teachers:

The State Plan has indicated that there was no recruitment of new teachers in 2007 - 08 till January 2008. The State is expected to recruit the said teachers in March 2008. Accordingly the there was no induction training in the State.

The Appraisal Team would like to indicate that the State should strive to recruit the target new teachers at the earliest and also should provide them induction training as per the PAB approval.

(iii) Training of Untrained teachers:

The State does not have any professionally untrained teachers. Hence there was no need for training in this area.

Proposal for teacher training in 2008 - 09:

The State has proposed to carry out activities under the teachers' training programme as follows:

The Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan has identified a list of the Master Trainers and specific material has been prepared for distribution amongst the teachers. The SSA intends to engage the professional and experienced agencies to train the Master Trainers who will further train the teachers at Block (Primary Section) and District Level (Pre-primary Section). Two modules of five days each shall be prepared for imparting training to the teachers whereas remaining ten days would be kept for holding one day Workshop as well as the monthly meetings.

- 1. (a) 10 days training for 78577 in-service primary and upper primary Teachers at Block/district level.
 - (b) 10 days training for 78577 in-service primary and upper primary Teachers at Cluster level.
- 2. (a)10 days training to 4940 Education Volunteers at Block/ district level
 - (b) 10 days training to 4940 Education Volunteers at Cluster level.

- 30 days training to new 15827 recruits
 Ten days training to 2470 BRPs/ DRPs
 Five days training to 6807 computer teachers.
 Three days training to 20169 Anganwari workers.

The State had organized a State level Seminar on Teacher Training on 12th January 2008 when Mr. Binay Pattanayak from Pedagogy Unit, TSG and representatives from nearby states participated in that and helped the State in designing a comprehensive Plan of Action for teacher training in 2008 – 09. The State is going ahead with the preparations. The Appraisal Team is happy with the preparations for the same and recommends the proposal of the State for inservice training for regular teachers and induction teacher training for newly recruited teachers for PAB approval. It also recommends the 5 days training for 7009 Computer teachers under the in-service training. However the Appraisal Team would not recommend the proposed 20 days training for Educational Volunteers as they are counted under regular teachers and also the training for Anganwadi workers who need to be covered under the ICDS's programme for training.

Block Resource Centers have been set up to function as sub-district academic support centers at the block level. These are headed by Block Education Officers who are assisted by Block Resource Persons (BRPs) and the supporting staff. The Block Resource Persons are the supervisors and SSA implementing officers for a cluster of 8 to 10 schools. For the purpose of school education the districts have further been splitted into Education Blocks. There are 216 Education Blocks and 141 CD blocks in Punjab. There is a Block Education Officer for every Education Block. Allocation of funds under SSA is based on the data and statistics of CD blocks whereas the implementation of plan is done as per the Education Blocks.

The main functions of BRCs are as follows:

- To provide academic support to CRCs & schools.
- Monitoring of classrooms activities and schools.

- Receiving feedback from clusters on various areas.
- To organize different types of trainings.
- To interact with community and other functionaries.
- Organize the assessment camp for children with special needs.
- Maintenance of EMIS to keep close vigil on overall educational development in the block.

CRCs serve as a key link between the schools and BRCs. The Center Head Teacher (CHT) provides all the academic support to schools in the cluster and serves the purpose of cluster project officer for SSA. The main functions of CRCs are as follows:

- To hold meetings & training programmes for teachers & community.
- To improve position of enrollment and retention, & the quality of education process with the help of VEDCs.
- To hold monthly review meetings of teachers, head teachers, volunteers and other functionaries in the cluster.
- Co-ordinate different village level activities.

Capacity building of BRC and CRC personnel:

Two days training was provided to the personnel at BRCs and CRCs at Mohali by NIAR, Mussoorie. In the first week of March the State is going to train all BRPs and DRPs for 4 more days. Overall progress of training of RPs is provided below.

F. Changes in Classroom Processes:

In 2007 – 08 the State has initiated some quality improvement initiatives in different subjects including reading. They have been discussed below under the innovative activities for quality

improvement. These activities are expected to improve the quality of classroom processes in 2008-09.

G. Learning Assessment System in the State:

The State tests children's performance thrice in a year: quarterly, half yearly and annual. This is reflected in the following table.

The present initiative under PLEP (Preparation for Learning Enhancement in Punjab at Elementary level) is appreciated by the Appraisal Team as it assesses the performance of children on sample basis for children in 50 schools in each district for classes I to IV in Language, Mathematics and EVS. This will enable the State to construct a Base line of learning achievement at Primary level. To improve the performance the State has linked up teacher training, academic support through BRCs, CRCs and remedial teaching. This is expected to improve the quality of learning assessment in the State.

H. Learning Achievement:

The Appraisal Team has looked at the findings of the NCERT's Base Line Achievement Survey for Classes III, V and VIII for a broad idea about the performance of students. Following table provides the information along with the national mean averages.

The above table indicates that there is a decreasing trend in the performance of students in MAS over BAS.

The State needs to improve the performance of schools and students on a continuous basis through organized pedagogical renewal processes.

I. Remedial Teaching:

- The State has designed remedial teaching as a part of the Preparation for Learning Enhancement in Punjab at elementary level (PLEP).
- Presently the State has undertaken a state wide learning achievement survey on sample basis for classes I to IV.
- Based on the learning achievement of students in Language, Mathematics and EVS, students, schools, clusters, blocks and districts will be graded.
- Learning difficulties will be identified in each subject areas for each school.
- Teacher training, remedial teaching and role of BRCs, CRCs will be redesigned based on the learning difficulties in different subject areas.
- Teacher training, remedial teaching and academic support through BRCs, CRCs will be carried out in a systematic manner to ensure that children perform better in the next round of learning achievement tests.
- Remedial activities would include effective use of workbooks in classrooms, peer cooperation in each school for assisting students who need additional support and
- Teachers in concerned schools and trainers at BRCs and CRCs will play a crucial role in facilitating effective learning practices in schools.

Based on this plan for remedial teaching the State has proposed for an amount of Rs. 631.075 lakh for remedial teaching of 126215 children. Appraisal Team recommends an amount of Rs. 516.990 lakh for remedial teaching of 103398 children as per SSA norms. The State must ensure that this amount is utilized for providing remedial support to children mostly in higher age group, mainstreamed children and poor performing children in learning achievement tests.

J. Tracking attendance of students and teachers:

As per the study undertaken by RESU, TSG on attendance rates, attendance rate of students at Primary and Upper Primary level are 83.5% and 78.1% respectively. The State has strengthened its attendance tracking mechanism through revision of the monitoring formats in the State. However the State has not undertaken any survey to assess the attendance of teachers and students.

The Appraisal Team insists on the necessity for carrying out surveys on students' and teachers' attendance at the earliest and also at a regular interval to improve the attendance and performance of teachers.

K. Quality Monitoring:

As per the State Plan, the State has sent required information in the STLF to the NCERT. Information for the present quarter is due. However the State authorities have clarified that it is ready and they would be sending that to NCERT at the earliest.

L. Performance Indicators:

The State has designed the following Performance Indicators for teachers and trainers for 2008 - 09.

The State Plan has reported that these Performance Indicators were useful in 2007 - 08 in assessing the performance of teachers and trainers at different levels. In 2008 - 09 will be revised a bit to make them more focused.

M. Learning Enhancement Programme (LEP):

The State has designed a comprehensive School Performance Enhancement Plan in the name of Preparations for Learning Enhancement in Punjab (PLEP) at elementary level under the guidance of Mr. Binay Pattanayak, TSG. Salient features of the plan are narrated below for reference.

The programme to be implemented at different levels are as follows:

- (a) State level training to KRPs
- (b) Training to Master Trainers at DIET level by the trained KRPs or as convenient to the districts with local needs.
- (c) Training at Cluster / Block level would be conducted (10 working days) for all Primary and Upper Primary teachers.

This whole Quality improvement initiative is named as 'Preparation for Learning Enhancement in Punjab at Elementary level' (PLEP). Salient features of the programme are as follows.

STEP-I: 3days training

- (a) Developing of resource material: (i) Reading (ii) Test Papers (iii) Working papers.
- (b) Action plan for PLEP.
- (c) Preparation of implementation of PLEP

STEP-II: 20 Districts, master trainers, GISTC, DIETs

- (a) Orientation of MTs for implement of PLEP.
- (b) Facilitation, reading & consensus building.
- (c) Orientation for development and effective use of TLM.
- (d) Role of DIETs, GISTC, PRC, CRC, RG.

STEP- III: Teachers Primary, Upper Primary (Per class 25-50)

- (i) Reading; Dialogue; Consensus building (4 days)
- (ii) How to understand test. (How much our children know) (1 day)
- (iii) Marking & Grading process (Alternative Question Papers for practice)
- (iv) Collaboration with VEC, CRC, BRC, DIET, GISTC.
- (v) Remedial measures for poor performance.
- (vi) Development & effective use of TLMs (5 days)

STEP- IV: School level activities – Cluster level- Block level- Distt.- State.

School level: Test- Marking- Grading- Consolidation- Analysis- Remedial measures.

Cluster level: Data collection, Consolidation, Analysis, Remedial strategies.

Block level: Data collection, Consolidation, Analysis, Remedial strategies.

District level: Data collection, Consolidation, Analysis, Remedial strategies.

State level: Data collection, Consolidation, Analysis, Remedial strategies.

During the base line assessment survey undertaken in 20 districts in February 2008 children of classes I to IV have been tested in language, mathematics and EVS covering 50 schools in each district. Their marks (scores) will be converted into grades as per the following break ups:

A grade: 80% and above B grade: 65% - 79% C grade: 50% - 64% D grade: 35% - 49% E grade: Less than 34%

Basing on the performance of students grading will be done for schools, clusters, blocks & districts. It will be attempted to extend remedial support on a continuous basis to the poor performers to improve their performance to higher levels.

The Appraisal Team appreciates the preparations of the State for PLEP.

The Appraisal Team recommends the LEP activities as per SSA norms. Also the Team recommends for establishment of Reading Cells at State and District level by utilizing a part of the LEP grant. The State authorities have already made the necessary consultations with NCERT and should pursue the related activities by utilising the required amount from the LEP grant.

L. Innovative Practices for quality improvement:

Recruitment of Teachers

Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan Authority Programme was implemented in the State of Punjab during the year 2001-02 with the objective of providing universal elementary education to all the children in the schools, bridging gender and social gaps, retaining all the children in the elementary education and achieving the desired levels of quality in education. State Government realizing the importance and need to improve the quality of education decided to fill up all the vacant posts of teachers during the current financial year i.e. 2007-08. Advertisements to recruit 9998 teachers in the primary section and another 4000 teachers in the master scale i.e. for upper primary schools has already been issued. Applications have been received and the process of recruitment has already started. The recruitments of these posts shall be made by the State Government by 31st March, 2008. Further, the State Government has also decided to expedite the promotion of the teachers so that supervision and monitoring in the education system do not suffer.

Campaign for OOSC

A massive campaign was organized by Government under Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan Authority to bring all the out of school children in formal education system. 1325 EGS centres to impart education for the out of school children are running in the State. Out of these 1325 centres 31 centres would be upgraded as primary schools, where as remaining children would be mainstreamed by bringing them to the near by schools. Further a Household survey has been conducted under the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan programme by the State Government in the January, 2008. The survey report reveals that there are still 100457 Children who are out of school. Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan Authority Punjab has planned to bring these out of school children to the education system through AIE centres or with the help of the NGOs. Steps to prepare the software i.e. "Child Tracking System" have already been initiated. It is felt that this system will help the State Government / SSA Authority to monitor the progress made in imparting education to the out of school children.

Punjab Edusat Society

The State Government realizing the importance of the latest technology in imparting quality education has decided to register a society namely Punjab Edusat Society under the chairmanship of Chief Minister Punjab to impart education with the help of Satellite net work. The Society nas already set up 300 Satellite Interactive Terminals (SITs) of which 216 have been set up in

various institutes in the school education system. The society will prepare the contents to be broadcast through the satellite network. An expenditure of Rs. 12 crores has been incurred during the 10th Five year plan where as an outlay of Rs. 121.48 crores has been kept for 11th five year plan for the project. 26.00 new SITs shall be added by the year 2011-12.

ICT Project

Punjab Information Communication Technology Education Society (PICTES), a society registered under the Registration Societies Act, has been mandated to impart computer education in all the schools from classes 6th to 12th. The society has implemented the project in the three phases. In phase I and II of the project, 2879 schools have been covered whereas in the phase III remaining 2085 schools have been covered. The society out of its own sources has provided hardware and other infrastructure and is also providing 7100 computer teachers for various schools 5.00 lakh children are being benefited out of this project.

Convergence of ICDS & SSA

Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan Authority has made efforts to converge the ICDS component of the Department of Social Security and Pre Nursery Education for all the children in the age group of 3 to 6 years. Teaching Learning Material has been provided for Anganwari Centres under the component ECCE.

Teacher Training

A workshop was organized by SSA Punjab in the Panjab University to suggest measures to improve teacher training. The officers from the adjoining states in the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan programme also participated in this workshop. A copy of the recommendations made in the workshop is enclosed at Annexure 'A'. Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan Authority Punjab intends to provide the teacher training as per the above recommendations during the year 2008-09.

Rationalization Policy

The State Government has decided to come out with a policy of Rationalization of posts. The State Government has already taken a decision in this regard in a meeting chaired by Chief Minister Punjab. A copy of the minutes of the meeting is enclosed as Annexure 'B'.

Appointment of 1000 English Teachers

The State Government is to employ 1000 English Teachers for the first time to improve the standard of English of the students. Earlier, only the teachers in the Social Studies have been teaching English in schools. Special training in consultation with the British Counsel of India is being arranged for 1000 English teachers.

Separation of EE & SE Directorates

With the objective of providing continuity the schools during an academic year, the State Government vide a public notification has allowed the teachers to continue till the end of academic year who attain superannuation during the course of an academic year. A copy of the notification is attached as annexure 'C'.

Adarsh Schools:

State Government has decided to set up one Adarsh School in each block at a cost of Rs. 4 Crores (approximately) for rural, poor and intelligent students. Schools will have classes from Nursery to Class 12th. These schools will be the institutions of excellence in the local area.

Adarsh Schools

The construction work has also started at three places except Bhikhiwind, District Tarn Taran. Further, funds' amounting to Rs. 75 crores as an additional central assistance has been earmarked for Adarsh schools for the year 2007-08 which has been received from Government of India. Liability of the State Government would be limited to 50% of the cost of construction. These schools would be set up in collaboration with the private parties.

PRIs

The State Government has decided to empower the Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRIs) and with this objective, the State has transferred 6000 schools to the Panchayati Raj Institutions. Recruitments of teachers in the schools have been made by the Department of Rural Development and Panchayat with a clear policy that teachers shall not be transferred under any condition except in case of married girls. This policy of the State Government has reinforced the rationalizing policy of teachers indirectly and has been successfully ensuring the presence of the teachers in the schools. The cadre of these teachers is school based and there is no possibility of transferring them from one institution to other.

Examination of 5th Class by PSEB

The State Government has taken a decision to get examination conducted by the Punjab State Education Board of all the schools appearing in class 5th. This decision of the Government has resulted in improving the education system and fixing the accountability of the teachers.

Cell for Mathematics

The State Government realizing the importance of mathematics has decided to open a "Cell for Mathematics" under the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan Program. The workshop was organized by the Indian Institute of Scientific and Education Research, Mohali on the request of State Government on 15/02/2008. The recommendations of the group have been received and the same are being examined by the State Government. A copy of the report study of IISER is enclosed as annexure.

PLEP

To improve the learning levels of the students in the primary schools, the State Government has decided to introduce a programe namely "Program for Learning Enhancement in Punjab" (PLEP) at Elementary level. All students studying in class 1st to 4th have been examined by the DIETs in the districts in 50 schools in every district. After that, the result of the examination are compared by the SCERT, a definite action plan shall be prepared by the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan Authority Punjab.

Reading Cell

The Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan Authority Punjab has also set up a "Reading Cell" on the recommendation made by the National Council of Education Research and Training (NCERT) at the State level as well as at the district level to prompt reading habits among the students. A workshop has been organized by all the officers in the district level and on the recommendation made by NCERT; an advisory group has been set up at the Head Office. Reading corners shall be established in every class. Further, supplementary material is being prepared by Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan for Punjabi and English as well as Mathematics for the students so that sufficient material is available for the students.

Publicity

An Action Plan has been prepared under Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan Program to give wide publicity to the importance of Girl Education and community participation in the education standard.

Specific prints and electronic material shall be prepared by the "Media Cell" under Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan program and the same shall be widely distributed with the help of projectors etc. Assistance of the renowned local artists shall also be taken.

Working Group on English

The State Government has set up a Working Group to improve the standard of English on the recommendations made by the National Knowledge Commission. The group is headed by, the Mrs. Kusumjit Sidhu, IAS, Financial Commissioner (Co-operation) Government of Punjab. The study carried out by the group and recommendations made by the group are enclosed as annexure. A definite action plan is under preparation on the basis of these recommendations. Promotion of Science Education

To promote the Science Education in the schools, the State Government has already decided to appoint the full time Science Supervisor at the district level. Science Fairs shall be organized at the various places to promote and encourage the learning of science among the students.

Strengthening of Monitoring System

Under the SSA program, monitoring details and systems have been restructured. All the inspection carried by the senior officers shall be in the form of a prescribed Performa. A copy of the registers maintained in all the schools is enclosed herewith. Further, the dates of the monthly meeting at all levels have been fixed. Detailed guidelines have also been issued to all concerned. It shall be an endeavor of SSA during the coming financial year to prepare software and internet connectivity to all the education blocks so that the MIS is received electronically and analysis is done on monthly basis. Further, all the officers of the rank of Center Head Teacher (CHT) in the Education Department and above shall be connected through mobile telephones so as to improve the exchange of information.

N. Overall direction towards quality improvement under SSA:

The State has a long way to go to achieve the SSA goals related to quality. However preparations made in 2007 - 08 for overall quality improvement bear promise for a better performance in 2008 - 09.

(IV) SIEMAT

The State has not initiated any activities related to establishment of SIEMAT in the State nor has it proposed for this.

Recommendation

Appraisal Team does not recommend for the same.

(V) IED

Progress in 2007-08:

- 77.71% CWSN covered through regular schools, AIE/ EGS and home-based education
- 10 NGOs involved
- 390 teachers trained through 45/90 day training
- Only 11% schools provided with ramps
- 168 resource teachers appointed
- Only 36% CWSN provided aids and appliances.

The State of Punjab has shown slow progress in the area of IE since the inception of the programme in comparison to the funds allocated to it on IE. Neither the State has involved the NGOs actively in the IE programme nor has it conducted intensive capacity building exercises for functionaries at the various levels to increase awareness on IE. However, activities like identification, assessment, aids and appliances etc. have been taken up. But the overall progress has been slow.

In the year 2007-08, the State had identified 49152 CWSN and the total budget provided the State was 393.22 lakh. The State was able to spend only Rs. 156.97 (319.91%). The financial progress of the State is given below.

Recommendation:

The Appraisal Team recommends a total of Rs. 394.27 lakh for 49283 CWSN @ Rs. 800/as the State has shown only 39.9% actual expenditure on IE in 2007-08. The State should also strengthen it's identification procedures as CWSN constitute only 1.15% of the total child population against the accepted prevalence of 2-3%.

Tasks Ahead

The State should:

- Recruit a well oriented and trained person at the state level.
- Immediately appoint the remaining 48 resource teachers, 620 fresh volunteers and 20 good district coordinators
- Include the evaluation guidelines and thee assessment guidelines circulated to all the States as a part of their teacher training programmes.

(VI) Innovative Activities:

a. Girls Education:

Funds @ Rs. 10 lakh per districts and total Rs. 200 lakh for 20 districts were sanctioned under SSA for the year 2007-08. The amount is utilized for Computer Education for all the children of classes VI-XII. Computer Education is imparted by a registered society named as PICTES which

has provided Hardware, Computer Teachers & Text books for computer education in around 5000 upper primary.

The funds @ Rs. 15 lakh per district are proposed for girls' education for 2008-09 to pay computer fee to PICTES for girl students of classes VI-VIII. Total budget proposed for girls' education for 20 districts would amount to Rs. 300.00 lakhs.

As per the states information the schools having the computer education are improved in retention, enrollment and in their learning achievement. But there is no any evidence of measurement for these outcomes. State has proposed for an amount of Rs.300 lakh under girls education activity to pay the fee for computer education to girls i. e. Rs. 20 per child per month.

Recommendation:

If state pledges to make surety of enhancement in the educational indicators then the same amount may be approved.

b. Early Childhood Care & Education (ECCE):

Progress:

The State has opened 1660 ECCE centres till 2007-08 in existing primary schools. Out of these centres 1467 ECCE centres have been sustained through 2834 ECCE workers during 2007-08.

340 new ECCE centres were sanctioned for the newly created districts Tarantaran, Mohali and Barnala by the PAB in 2007-08. None of these ECCE centres were opened by the State in 2007 - 08.

There was a sanction of Rs 300 lakh for ECCE component by the PAB during 2007-08 covering all 20 districts. Total expenditure incurred by the state till 31st Jan 2008 was Rs. 144.5 lakh on Training of ECCE workers, supply of materials for preparation of TLM at the rate of Rs 500 per centre, organizing TLM workshop for ECCE workers. State has decided to spend the balance fund for providing TLM to Anganwadi centres run by the ICDS.

Proposal:

The State has proposed for continuation of all 1467 ECCE centres with 2843 ECCE workers. Financial break up is shown below –

Recommendations:

The Appraisal team has recommends Rs 300 lakh for ECCE component.

Suggestions:

The Appraisal team suggests that the state should carry out a study to review the performance of ECCE programme in the state. This will help the state know the reason for decreasing trend of ECCE centres in the state.

c. Education of SC/ST children:

13 out of 20 districts of Punjab are predominantly SC dominated districts. For quality education of girl children the State has designed a vocational education plan that is being run in 1880 Vocational Education Centers. Activities undertaken by the state for SC children during 2007-08 were:

- Supply of textbooks for all SC children by the state
- Continuation of vocational education (VE) for SC children of upper primary level through 1880 vocational education centres.
- Payment of computer fees to PICTES for SC girl child at @ Rs20/- per child.

The Appraisal Team is not clear about how the State has provided fees to an organization (PICTES) and whether they have taken approval from EC for the same. PAB may like to discuss this issue.

Proposal:

The State has proposed for continuation of all 1880 vocational education centres for all children of Upper primary, and also payment of fees @ Rs 20/- per girl child to PICTES for upper primary level. Total amount proposed by the State is Rs. 300 lakh.

Recommendations:

The Appraisal Team has recommended the proposal of the State for Rs 300/- lakh as proposed by the State against the concerned head. However the Team would like to raise the issue of providing Rs. 20 per child to PICTES as fees for the course and would request the PAB to seek further clarification regarding this.

Suggestions:

State needs to focus on quality issues of SC children along with Vocational education of SC children especially in the districts like Hoshiarpur, Nawanshaher, etc. with high repetition rate.

c. Computer Aided Learning (CAL):

Progress:

- 2085 upper primary schools had been covered by setting up of 2085 computer labs.
- 11904 items of hardware had been installed in 51 multimedia CDs concerning computer aided learning for primary and upper primary students. These CDs were developed on different subject areas like English, Mathematics, Science.
- 4813 teachers were trained by Microsoft on use of computer as Teaching aids on different subject areas.
- 8351 Upper primary teachers were trained under Degital Equillisation programme organized by American Indian Foundation to integrate information technology in teaching of different subject ares.

Rs. 1.9 lakh has been spent for CD replication till 31st January 08. The balance amount of Rs. 298.00 lakh is anticipated to be spent by February-March 08. This amount will be handed over to ICT project as appropriation toward ICT as part payment of annual rental for utilizing their infrastructure viz Hardware, Software, teacher training and salary etc.

Fresh Proposal

- The state has proposed for coverage of 1000 primary schools under CAL by establishing 1000 computer labs with 2 sets of computer with speakers, scanners to each primary schools.
- Training of 1000 teachers on CAL.
- Training of upper primary teachers will be organized by Microsoft in free of cost.

As per the State Plan, the State has already floated tender for equipping the schools in establishing computer labs, development of multimedia CDs and teacher training. The total allocation proposed by the state under these heads Rs. 1000 lakhs.

Recommendation

The Appraisal Team is ready to recommend the state proposal for Rs. 1000 lakh to carry out activities under Computer Aided Learning head. However it would like to adhere to the SSA norms that says that CAL is meant for the Upper Primary level. Accordingly the State must design a plan of action for CAL for Upper Primary level only for 2008 – 09.

Additional proposal for Reading Cell:

Other than these the Appraisal Team would like to highlight that the State Plan has not indicated any activities under the Innovation head for urban deprived children and also children from minorities. On the other hand the State has proposed for establishment of Reading Cells at State and District level by utilizing an amount of Rs. 5 lakh (consolidated – one time grant) per district.

Recommendation:

The Appraisal Team appreciates the plan of the State to establish Reading Cells in each and every district and State level. However the Team would like to indicate that such an initiative should be taken up by utilizing the funds available for LEP.

SSA - Punjab was sanctioned 2 KGBVs till 2007-08. The schools are sanctioned under Model 3 for 50 children each. But total number of children enrolled is 51. State should take initiation in this regard to enroll 100 children.

State's appeal is that the State has received Rs. 10.00 lakh only for each KGBV hostel against the norm of Rs. 15.00 lakh. The hostel buildings constructed at the locations with lesser unit cost lack the capacity to accommodate 50 girls as per the norms and have capacity to house 25 children.

2008-09 costing proposal consists of one more new KGBV in Malerkotta of Sangrur district under cities with minority concentration having female literacy below 53.67%.

Total non recurring amount proposed is Rs. 44.675 lakh which includes boundary wall for the two hostels already constructed. The states justification is that the unit cost provided was very less and no provisions made earlier to construct the same and hence boundary wall is not constructed. But boundary wall is very essential for the hostels where girl children are housed.

Total recurring amount proposed is Rs.34.35 lakh for 50 children each.

Recommendation:

The proposal of additional grant of Rs. 10.00 for two hostels for additional construction is recommended for PAB approval.

The total amount proposed including an amount of Rs.3.00 lakh for the compound wall and back log amount of Rs.10.00 lakh which is amounting to Rs. 79.025 lakh. Out of this Rs. 76.025 lakh is recommended for PAB approval.

(VIII) Research, Evaluation, Monitoring and Supervision (REMS):

Not much information is available regarding research, evaluation, monitoring and supervision in district plans. In 2007-08, Household survey was the major activity completed by the districts in Punjab. On the basis of which about one lakh out-of-school children will be enrolled through AIE centres.

The REMS activities to be conducted in 2008-09 are as follows.

- I. Baseline assessment of performance levels of children will be done in reading and writing and mathematical skills by ETT students.
- II. Evaluation of primary school children in respect of comprehensions of subjects by ETT students.
- III. Monitoring of the classroom transaction by non-government organizations.

However, information was not available on the following points in state Plan as far physical targets and required fund for the activities are concerned.

- I. Child tracking for monitoring of out-of-school children.
- II. Workshops and Seminars on Research Methodology.
- III. Specific topic-wise research studies state level and district-wise.
- IV. Action research at school level.
- V. Documentation of research studies including dissemination of findings (proposed publications of research abstracts, research reports, dissemination seminars etc.

(IX) Strategies for community mobilization:

A. Progress for the Year 2007-08:

During 2007-08 approval was given to train 91826 members, out of which 21584 community members were trained till 20th Feb, 2008 and rest of community members are to be trained by March 2008.

■ Budget requirement for training of 108212 Community Members for 2008-09 = 108212xRs.30x2 days = Rs. 6492720

The members involved in these training are 4 members form the village panchayat. The other two members are the head of the school and a teacher. Out of the 4 village members one or two local political leaders will also be involved. There is a clear linkage between the PRI and the school.

The training involves policy and norms of all SSA activities. Supervision and monitoring of SSA civil works, involvement of Village Council members to give suggestions in the improvement of schools etc. During training sessions in districts like Kapurthala, Taran Taran, Jalandhar etc., Deputy Commissioner, Assistant Commissioner also participated and gave direction to the members to involve in everyday activity of the school including teaching & learning activity.

Recommendations:

Proposal is given to 6 members equally from all schools. But as per norms two persons from schools and 4 members from village hence the trainees number comes to 91578 and the costing can be allowed for Rs. 54.946 @ Rs. 30 per member for two days.

Adequacy of sanctioned post including accounts staff:

At state level sanctioned posts are 64 out of which 59 are working. 9 are stipulated for accounts. No executive engineer post is sanctioned to monitor the civil works either at SPO or District level. Both state and district office should be strengthened.

No experts recruited from NGOs/Universities at state or district level offices.

When ever there is a training session from NUEPA related officers from both SPO and DPO are being sent and Capacity building is through periodically. No induction programme is provided to the officers when they join the project.

The proposed amount for management and MIS is recommended as per the 6% limit of management cost.

The sanctioned posts of SPO during 2007-08 are maintained and state should take initiation to fill all the posts sanctioned.

State's status for the integration and involvement of SSA with mainstream educational structure and the steps taken/required for further improvements.

All the 3 Directorates of Education DPI (EE), (SE) & Director SCERT at state level are regularly consulted and involved in decision making, planning and implementation of the scheme.

DEO (EE) is the member of DEDC at district level. At block level Block education officer is the member secretary of BEDC.

There is no evidence of SCERT involving in teacher training. DIET's faculty is involved in carrying out trainings as per the instructions of SPO to the extension of financial transactions. No academic support in terms of development of modules or preparation of resource persons or assessment of training needs of teachers is done by SCERT/DIETS etc.

5. Special Focus Districts and Minorities

A. Special Focus Districts:

State has three categories of Special Focus Districts. Distribution of districts are shown below

Special Focus districts – category A

Two districts fall under this category, namely, Gurdaspur and Fatehgarh Sahib on the basis of infrastructure gap. The State has proposed for 990 additional class rooms for Gurdaspur and 331 for Fatehgarh Sahib.

Based on district wise information from DISE 2007 – 08 on infrastructure gap the Appraisal Team has recommended for 392 additional class rooms to Gurdaspur only.

• Special Focus Districts category B

14 districts were categorized under this category, namely, Amritsar, Bhathida, Gurdaspur, Faridkot, Fatehgarh Sahib, Ferozpur, Hoshiarpur, Jalandhar, Kapurthala, Mansa, Moga, Muktsar, Nawanshaher, Sangrur . 12 districts excluding Ferozpur and Gurdaspur were SC predominant districts. Amritsar, Ferozpur and Gurdaspur had been identified as boarder area districts.

As per the State Plan reported GER for primary is too low for Gurdaspur (28.59) in contrary to GER at upper primary level (58.83). The same for Fatehgah Sahib is 61.55 and Hoshiarpur with 65.69. GER at upper primary level for districts like Ferozpur (43.60), Hoshirpur (46.24), Mansa 62.0) are much low in comparison to other SFD districts.

Over all repetition rate at upper primary level is too high for Ferozpur (87.77). The same for Hoshiarpur (21.34), Fatehgarh Sahib (20.02), Bhathinda (18.53), Faridkot (18.45), Nawanshaher (18.0) are in higher side.

Special Focus Districts Category C:

Nine districts are fall under category C: Bhatinda, Faridkot, Hoshiarpur, Jalandhar, Kapurthala, Mansa, Nawashaher, Patiala and Ropar. Total 32 new upper primary schools has proposed by the state and recommended by the Appraisal Team.

No specific plan or strategy has been developed by the state for minimizing gender gap in primary and upper primary area.

B. Minority Education

Only one area namely Malerkotla has been identified as Minority dominated area. Forty two Urdu teachers have been proposed by the state for the Sangrur district.

The Appraisal Team does not recommend these teachers as PTR in these areas do not allow recruitment of new teachers.

7. Financial Status

The State has provided detailed information about state share, and related matters. This has been discussed in the Executive Summary.

8. State Commitments

The Appraisal Team has checked the activities undertaken by the State against the PAB commitments. Overall it is satisfactory.

9. Others

There is no problem wrt to the State share and maintenance of expenditure at elementary level.

10. The major findings of Monitoring Institutes:

Punjab University is the Monitoring Institution for SSA - Punjab. They have monitored progress of SSA activities in Ludhiana, Moga, Faridkot, Jallandhar, Kapurthala and have submitted their report for the period 1st April 2007 to 30th September 2007.

Following are the salient observations of the Monitoring Institution in the progress of various interventions under SSA.

- In Punjab a large number of schools do not have their own buildings. These are operating from private buildings, rent free buildings and even in Ludhiana district few are building less schools. Punjab University did not mention the reason. Therefore there is need to focus on providing assistance to the schools for construction of school buildings in all schools either these are in private, rent free or building less schools.
- As regard the civil work up-gradation process of EGS centers and construction of building is very slow.
- In all the districts under reference additional classrooms in large numbers were not constructed because the grants were not received for this purpose.
- Most of the schools under these districts did not utilize their school grants and maintenance grants till September, 2007.
- Free textbooks were almost distributed in time, that is, in April except few schools in Moga district.
- In all the districts under reference TLM were used timely and appropriately.
- Distribution of MDM is irregular at EGS centers almost in all the districts. Almost all the schools do not have a proper system of cocking meals.
- Village education Committees are not very active. The reason is lack of adequate number of VEC members.
- In all the districts of the state there is an acute shortage of teachers in all the schools. The teachers were recruited on the basis of their merit but no written test or interviews were conducted for the recruitment of teachers.
- In the districts as mentioned above Kasturba Gandhi Vidyalayas were sanctioned.
- No additional incentives were proposed for girls at elementary level in all the districts.
- No research study was conducted in these districts as reported by the Monitoring Committee.
- DISE data were not published after March 2006.

Following are the detailed observations in different areas.

1. Opening of Schools

<u>Ludhiana</u>: In District Ludhiana 88 schools out of 1444 schools operate from private buildings, 13 operate in rented buildings 59 govt schools operate from rent free building. In this district there are 5 schools which have no building at all.

<u>Moga</u>: District Moga has no building less school. Only 8 schools are operating from private buildings.564 schools have their own buildings. 25 schools operate from rent free buildings.

<u>Faridkot</u>: Only one school in district Faridkot is building less. Most of the Govt schools in this district have their own building. None of the schools operate from rented building

<u>Jalandhar</u>: None of the schools in Jalandhar district operates either in private buildings or is acquired on rental basis. Only 7 schools in this district are operating from rent free buildings. However there are still 16 schools without their own building

<u>Kapurthala:</u> Except for Block Phagwara of district Kapurthala all other 4 blocks have one school each with no building. Only one school in this district operates in a rented building and five in private buildings.

2. Civil works:

<u>Faridkot:</u> In 2007-2008 one EGS centre at Balmik Colony Faridkot (Block Faridkot) was proposed to be upgraded to a primary school but the process of up gradation is still in the process. No grants released till September, 2007.

<u>Kapurthala</u>: In all seventy four EGS centres are functional in District Kapurthala since 2006-2007.But only four have been upgraded in 2007-2008.

Moga: Moga has 147 EGS centres in its four blocks.

Ludhiana: SPO information did not show up gradation of any EGS centre of Ludhiana or district Moga. Neither the DPO nor schools visited by MI during April-September 2007 confirmed up gradation of any EGS centre in these two districts.

Grants for additional rooms:

The grants for civil works/construction were not reportedly received by schools in Punjab in the beginning of the financial year 2007-2008.

<u>Kapurthala:</u> Most of the schools in Dist Kapurthala have 2-3 rooms. But still 39 schools are without or only one classroom. There are still two schools in district Kapurthala with no classroom

Moga: Grants for construction of rooms or other civil works were not received in many schools of District Moga till September 2007.

Although maximum number of schools have been reported to have 3 or more than 3 classrooms now but there are still 31 schools which need additional rooms

<u>Jalandhar</u>: Most of these schools have 2, 3 or more than three rooms. Inspite of the fact that the villages of this district have modern and western impact due to number of NRIs belonging to this area, there are still some schools (28+47) which have no or only one classroom.

<u>Faridkot</u>: Most of the schools in district Faridkot have 2,3 or more than 3 classrooms. However there are still two schools in Block Kotkapura where classrooms are much needed.

3. School Grant and Maintenance Grant:

Most of the schools in the selected districts had received or not received these grants. But none of them had utilised it by the end of September, 2007. However the schools reported to have used last years school grant according to their requirements.

<u>Ludhiana</u>: Like all other districts, District Ludhiana too disbursed school grant and Maintenance grant in September, 2007.

Moga: GPS, Baghapatti, (Block-Baghapurana) had not received any grant by September, 2007. (Block-Baghapurana) had received school grant and maintenance grant on 18.9.2007 but have not yet utilised it.

<u>Faridkot</u>: However previous years school grant and maintenance grants were used to repair doors, windows, Black boards, electricity wires, taps, verandah, whitewashing the rooms, paints for doors and boards etc.

Jalandhar: Jalandhar too distributed grants in sptember/October, 2007.

<u>Kapurthala</u>: GPS, Vajidowal (Block Phagwara) reported to have not received school grant till September, 2007. They have not yet utilized previous year's grants. Most of the schools visited by MI in district Kapurthala received school grant, Maintenance grant and TLM together in September, 2007.

4. Free textbooks:

The distribution of text-books is through BPEO's office and schools collect the books according to the number of students in \each of these categories. DPO of respective districts informed that the books were distributed in April and May, 2007. Only a few schools informed that books were distributed in July since the schools closed in mid May for summer break. SSA Authority Punjab has provided free text books to all non SC girls in Primary and Upper Primary studying in class 1 to VIII.

<u>Ludhiana</u>: Field observations in District Ludhiana revealed that books were distributed in March/ April, 2007

<u>Faridkot:</u> Text books and workbooks for the session started pouring in from the publishers in February 2007. The books were further distributed to BPEO within a week's time.

<u>Jalandhar:</u> Text books for grades 1 to V were distributed for all the subjects except for Punjabi Praveshika books in grade I, Punjabi text-book in Grade II and III, Maths in grade IV. Complete sets of books were not given to eligible students of grade VI to VIII.

Moga: Like all other districts distribution of books started in March and the last installment reported by some school was in August, 2007

<u>Kapurthala</u>: In district Kapurthala the enrolment of SC students is 20358 Boys & 18680 Girls & 12174 Non SC girls.

5. Teaching Learning Materials (TLM):

The teachers reported that they used their TLM during training. In some schools teachers purchased models, charts copies, slates. Teachers in most of the schools in all thdistricts reported to have bought charts and play materials out of TLM. The materials were displayed in the classroom.

<u>Ludhiana:</u> Teachers of GPS SRS Nagar, (Block Jagraon) used TLM in purchasing pens and pencils for children. GES Mullanpur, (Block -Ludhiana -2) received TLM for 8 teachers and used it for buying slates, colours, hard boards, some schenaries according to topics of study.

Moga: Most of the schools in the district reported to have used their previous years TLM grants in purchasing stationary items for students GES. Teachers of GPS Rajiana, (Block-Baghapurana) purchased

Boards, map sets, out of 5000/- TLM grant of six teachers.

<u>Faridkot:</u> TLM grant for 2007-2008 did not reach the teachers till september2007. Chalks pencils stationary, charts, models are routine type of answers to a question of how did they spend it.

<u>Jalandhar</u>: Teachers of GMS Chuhar Wali, (Block-Adampur) and GPS Manak Rai, (Block-Adampur) used TLM for buying charts and stationary items for the children.

<u>Kapurthala</u>: TLM was used by teachers of GPS, chachoki Nagar (Block Phagwara) to buy science models/ books/ slates/ watch/ primers/ books for general boys who are not given books by Punjab Govt or SSA Punjab.

6. EGS Centres:

Ludhiana: There are 246 EGS centres with enrolment of 5311 children

Moga: There are 147 EGS centres with enrolment of children

Faridkot: There are 92 EGS centres with enrolment of 2151 children

<u>Jalandhar</u>: There are 64 EGS centres with enrolment of 2151 children, 44 AIE centres with 1633 children and 179 ECCE centres with 2217 children

<u>Kapurthala:</u> According to Household survey 4811 children are out of school, Out of 4811, 1410 students are covered by EGS Centes and 3401 are covered by AIE Centers.

Mid-Day Meals for EGS Centres

Till last year midday meals were not served in EGS centres. The scheme of MDM was extended to EGS centres since last year. The students of EGS centres get Mid-day meals from the cluster-In- charge School. However field observations revealed that there is not yet a very regular system of MDM for EGS centres.

7. Children with Special Needs (CWSN):

129 camps were organized in 20 districts of Punjab and total 38953 children were identified as CWSN. The second phase of identification and assessment camps started in Jan-Feb. 2007. A total of 140 camps were held under technical collaboration with DDRC Patiala, DDRC Sangrur, DDRC Bathinda, Redcross Faridkot, ALFC under Red Cross Amritsar; NIVH, Dehradun, district Red cross Societies and Local Civil Hospitals and 46320 CWSN were identified during second phase.200 teachers who are trained in special education have been appointed in almost all the blocks of all districts.

8. Village Education Committees (VECs):

VEC's in almost all villages have been formed according to the prescribed guidelines.

The VEC's meet once in a month or in two months, as reported by Head Teachers of many schools.

But most popular modus operandi is that one or two members remain very active and take keen interest in the activities of school. But remaining were inactive and only signed the documents which are sent to them.at their respective places.

9. Mid-Day Meals (MDM):

None of the schools visited by MI had a proper pucca kitchen shed, yet meals are being prepared in schools on improvised chullahs using Firewood. Although no proper shed/room is available in most of the schools yet it seems that essential conditions of hygienically cooking are being taken care of. Some of the schools where no adequate space/shed is available older rooms/verandah are being used for the purpose. Supervision of MDM. This is also done by the cook under the supervision of teacher. The teachers reported to constantly supervise cooking daily in all the schools without any exception. Normally food is distributed by the cook herself but teachers invariably get involved in each aspect of MDM.

10. Teachers and Training of Teachers:

The teachers were recruited according to the merit formed on the basis of basic requisite qualifications. No test or interview is conducted. There has been an acute shortage of teachers in almost all the schools of all the districts in Punjab. Additional teachers were recruited on contract basis whereas ETT teachers have been recruited on regular basis. This seems to have improved the situation a lot.

Primary teachers (entire Master category and C & V) were imparted training under SSA. Resource persons are called form the reputed colleges, education colleges, public/ private Institutions to impart training to the teachers. A proper time table is prepared by the state to Conduct teacher training.

<u>Kapurthala:</u> 712 teachers at the district level and the district Kapurthala followed the timetable and 942/1112 numbers of primary teachers and 1138/1677 number of upper primary teachers was given training by the DIET. Almost all eligible teachers took up training programme in district Kapurthala.

<u>Ludhiana</u>: First 10 days training is given during vacation i.e. second half of May and June and remaining 10 days are completed in September/ October. First ten days were devoted to Environment Éducation.

11. Kasturba Gandhi Ballika Vidyalaya (KGBV):

No Kasturba Gandhi Ballika vidyalaya has been sanctioned for districts Ludhiana, Moga, Faridkot, jallandhar, Kapurthala.

12. NPEGEL:

For education of girls at Elementary School level no additional incentives were proposed or implemented in any district of Punjab.

13. Research and Evaluation;

Schools have not undertaken any kind of research work, at least the schools visited by MI in all the five selected districts reportedly have not heard about any research being carried out involving their schools.

14. DISE status:

DISE data was not updated beyond March 2006.
