EXPLANATION

1. **Academic Year.**—For the sake of uniformity, the academic year in these tables is taken to coincide with the financial year, i.e. from April 1st of one year to March 31st of the next.
2. **Current Year.**—For the sake of clarity, it may be mentioned that the current year, wherever it occurs in these tables, means the year for which the statistics are being furnished and not the year in which the form is being filled.
3. **Recognised Institutions.**—Are those in which the course of study followed is that which is prescribed or recognised by the Department of Public Instruction or by University or by a Board of Secondary and/or Intermediate Education constituted by law and which satisfy one or more of these authorities, as the case may be, that they attain to a reasonable standard of efficiency. They are open to inspection and their students are ordinarily eligible for admission to public examinations and tests held by the Department or the University or the Board.
4. **General, Professional, Special, Other Education.**—The types of Institutions to be included under these categories, as stated in Table I, are enumerated under similar headings in Table II etc.
5. **Pre-Primary School/Classes.**—Include all Nursery, Infants, Kindergarten and other such school/classes.
6. **Higher Secondary School.**—Are those schools after passing out from which the student can be admitted in degree classes of Universities.
7. **Under-Graduate Engineering Colleges.**—Include Survey Schools.
8. **Schools for Oriental Studies**—Include Tols, Madrassas, Arabic, Sanskrit and Vedic Schools, Sanskrit Pathshalas and other such Schools.
9. **Schools for Physical Education.**—Exclude Gymnasia.
10. **Local Bodies.**—Include District School Boards, Municipal School Boards, Cantonment Boards, Town Area Committee, Panchayat Samities, Zila Parishads, etc.
11. **Enrolment.**—For definiteness, students on rolls in the institutions on 31st March of the academic year in question are taken. If, however, 31st March falls within a vacation at the end of the

session then the students on rolls on the date before 31st of March and nearest to it should be given.

12. **Government.**—Includes both Central and State Governments, unless otherwise provided for.
13. **THE STATISTICS GIVEN IN THESE TABLES INCLUDE STATISTICS OF CENTRALLY ADMINISTERED EDUCATIONAL OR RESEARCH INSTITUTIONS.**
