## Foreword

The Third All-India Educational Survey was started at the beginning of 1974 with specific objectives to provide data on school education about availability of schooling facilities'(particularly in the rural areas), enrolment, teachers. equipment etc. The second AlzIndia Eaucational Survey was conducted in 1965, but compared to that the scope of the present survey was much larger in respect of items on which information was collected and the types and levels of education covered.

The survey has been conducted in collaboration with the Departments of Education in the States and the Union Territories. Because of the large scope and coverage of the present survey, two different strategies were adopted for processing and tabulation of data. While for some data it was decided to have manual tabulation first at the block level and further at the district and state levels, for the other set of data it was found more convenient to go in for computer processing.

Some of the states have finalised the manually prepared state tables and others are in the process of completing this work. The computerised tables are likely to take some more time. As there is demand from several quarters to provide data on selected important items as early as possible, it has been decided to compile and release some selected tables for each state separately out of the man $\because \because$ prepared tables received from the different States.

Keeping in view this specific objective, the present set of "Selected Tables of Pondicherry" is being

of educational planners, administrators and other interested persons. The set includes nine tables, three relating to institutions by stage and type; four relating to availability of schooling facilities in rural areas and two relating to enrolment. The reference data for data contained in these tables is December, '31, 1973.

Compilation of these tables has been possible largely due to the cooperation of the Department of Education of Pondicherry. I express my gratitude to the Director of 'Education and the State Survey Officer , who had the main responsibility for preparing the manual State tables, and to Shri P.N. Aroma, Lecturer in our Unit, who compiled this'set of selected tables in its present form out of the tables received from Pondicherry.
