Accordingly a scheme was a; raved by the central Gavt. to expand the technical facilities a / the centre has released funds for scund studio, training programmes, receiving sets for schools etc. The grant for a small, the tography room and similar ther ficilities has been Liven-Grants were made available for creating of new justs under the expansion scheme.

So for 75% of the livt. chools have been provided with a radio set each under the programme. Many p vt. High Schands have been supplied with tage- reconferationin-one etc. too Educational broadcasts have also been improved and these are utilised by the schools more and more. Dry battery cells are suplified to the ocho. Is where power supply is not available. Regular elucational broadcast schedules are sent to the schools, well -ahead of time.

Training programmes are conducted to make the teachers more aware of the potentialities of Ecucational Technology,

During 1967-co, only 27 schools were given twoin- ones lesites conducting training for teachers, supplying Frinting and publications, construction of the stulic building (statted in 1967-66) and creation of 3 posts of technical staff.

Proposal for similar activities including supply of T.V sets to schools during 1986-29 is unless consideration of the authorities.

3. CONSTRUCTION DE TRIBAL GIRLS HOSTEL:

This is a Centrally 5 onsored Scheme where the total expenditure is shared by both the centre and the state on 50:50 basis. Up to 15/6-79 the centre had released grants to the State for total expenditure. But since 1979-80 the policy has been changed. Upto 1987-88,10 girls hostel have been constructed at various places of the State Anticipated achievement during 1968-89 is 1 more girls hostel at Baghly. As against anticipated expenditure of 8, 2.00 lakhs (Central share) the amount reposed during 1968-69 is 8, 2.00 lakhs with a proposed target of 1 hostel.

4. NATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP FOR "ALLNIET STUDENTS "ROM RURAL AREAS."

Under this Centrally Sponsored Icheme students from rural areas are awarded scholarship on the basis of competition. The scheme is in operation in this State since 1975-74. Level of expenditure amounting to &, 1.79 lakks are maintained under non-plan, Additional amount are provider by the Centre.

5. ADULT EDUCATION:

The National Adult Education Programme was launched in the State in October, 1978 alongwith the rest of the country. The programme occupies an important position under the new 20-ppint programme.

Under Contral assistance, altogether 6 projects are maintained and another 2 projects, i.e. Wokha and Kiphire "projects are run under State Adult Education programme."

attached to the Directorate of School Education and one State Institute of Adult Education for the purpose of administration training and development of resources respectively. As against achievement of 20,736 adult enrolled during 1987-88 of which 12072 were successful. Under N. L.M. Kohima and Tuensang districts have been taken as Technology Demonstration District by Increasing the learning centres from 200 to 500. This the numbers of Learning centres is in-creased from 750 to 1050 against which likely achievement is 31000 learners.

As per present norms the first phase of the programme for making the illiterate people leterate is taken on shifting basis in a compact area, i.e. taking a block of some villages annually. The neo-literates are, therefore, left uncared after completion of the first phases of twelve months duration. As against 455 post literacy centres of which 65 is under State Plan, 53 Janashikshan Milayams have been stated in Tuensang and Kohima District under TDD under NLM.

During 1988-89 proposed expenditure is Rs, 76.00 plakes for effective implementation of the Rural Functional literacy programme, which includes field costs, teaching and learning materials, training/supervision expenses of functionaries, project administration and strengthening of administrative structure etc, and Jana Sikshan Nilayams under N.L.M.

Under the central sector, 100% expenditure for the 6 on going projects are borne by the Central Government during the entire 7th Plan period. The State Government is maintaing the remaining 2 projects,

The cutlary proposed under this scheme is strictly in conformity with the prescribed pattern of the Central Government.

6. <u>INTEGRATED EDUCATION FOR DISABLED CHILDREN:</u>

This is a centrally sponsored scheme. 100% assistance is released by the centre. The objective of this programme is to provide equal educational opportunities for the handicapped so as to integrate them with general community as equal partners and to help them in their normal growth. This programme facilitates imparting training to teachers, providing equipments, and other facilities for the children.

25 EDN(A)-7(CSS)

During 1986-87 106 handicapped children were integrated in normal schools. At present the programme is taken up at state level and it is contemplated to take up the programme at the block level as well. 4 Blockshave been selected for this under .UNICEF Assisted Project. During 1988-89 4 more block will be brought under the programme.

During 1988-89 anticipated expenditure on emplementation of this scheme is Rs, 10.10 lakhs. Outlay proposed during 1939-90 is Rs, 11.50 lakhs.

7. COMPUTER LITERACY.

Under CLASS programme. subject to 100% Contral assistance, 5 High Schools were provided with working Computers to popularise computer literacy to school children, 2 moro High Schools have been to be observed during 1987-88 under this scheme, Target for 1988-89 is another 2 more schools.

Teachers have been trained in the schools to handle the subject successfully in the school. Once Resource person has been trained under this project to supervise the teacher—un-charges of CLASS project in the schools.

Without adequate facilities of reading materials on computer literature and soft-ware the scheme cannot be implemented successfully. Expenditure during 1987-88 was 8,0.28 lakes and that anticipated during 1988-89 is 8,0.33 lakes, Proposal for 1989-90 is 0.60 lake, for procuring library books, blank disos, programme discs, training facilities and maintenance of programmes.

8. OPERATION BLACK BOARD: # 100% C.S.S#.

311 L.P. Schools in 7 out of 28 TD blacks have been covered in 1987-88, utilising Rs. 25.67 lakhs. This includes provision for 25 teachers posts being created.

Proposal for 1988-89 is to 9 blocks the scheme for which is under consideration of the authorities. Anticipating waverage of the 9 blocks as proposed, 12 blocks may be covered in 1989-90 covaring all the blocks of the state by 1990.

Schools which do not have building facilities are however not covered in the proposal. This may be taken up in the next phase.

9. VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AT HIGHER SECONDARY STAGE

Higher socondary stage of education is, at present facilitated in the Colleges offiliated to the North Eastern Hill University. In order to implement the scheme of vocationalisation of education at + 2 stage 2 Government High Schools are being upgraded from Junior secondary to higher secondary by adding Classes XI and XII, during 1988—89. Simultenously 2 trades of vocational education have been proposed to be introduced in each school, %, 8.00 lakhs was sanctioned by the centre for constructing work sheds and providing equipments, during 1987—88. This is being implemented in 1968—89. Proposal for 1989—90 is for covering another two schools under this scheme.

11. UPGRADATION OF STANDARDS OF ADMINISTRATION:

Under 8th Financ. Commission grant on the above scheme &, 244.92 lakhs was utilised for construction of 165 primary school buildings and 306 primary schools were extended. &, 76.44 lakhs have been released by the centre for construction of Primary schools under 9th Finance Commission grant during 1985-89.83 Primary schools are anticipated to be covered with this grant.
