PREFACE

Reduction in regional impalances of educational development is a major objective of the National Policy on Education. To promote this programme, it is necessary to collect statistics of educational development in the different regions of the country periodically and to publish them for information and use by all concerned.

The Ministry of Education publishes annually statistics of educational development in the different States of the Indian Union. But as imbalance, of educational development are more pronounced at the district than at the State level, it was decided to collect and publish statistics of educational development in the districts also every five years. Accordingly, such statistics were collected and published, for the first time, for the year 1960-61.

The study is now being repeated for the year 1965-66 and it is proposed to bring out a separate volume on the district educational statistics of every State. It will contain statistics for the year 1965-66 along with comparative data for the year 1960-61. To make inter-district comparisons possible, some important indices such as enrolment ratio, percentage of trained teachers, per capita expenditure on education, etc., will also be included.

In this programme of bringing out 16 volumes for all the States of the Union (except Nagaland), this volume is the fifth and is devoted to the educational statistics of districts in Haryana State. It has been based on the data collected from the State Department of Education.

I take this opportunity to express my appreciation of the co-operation and help received from the Director of Public Instruction, Haryana, and other educational authorities in the State and the staff of the Statistics and Information Division which has prepared this areport.

INTRODUCTION

The Ministry of Education publishes the statistics of education in India annually in their publication 'Education in India - Vol.I & Vol.II'. These publications give the statistics at the National and State levels, but do not provide District-wise statistics.

- 2. To fill up this gap, the National Council of Educational Research and Training brought out a volume entitled 'Educational Statistics District-wise', giving the bench-mark of educational data of various kinds for all districts for the year 1960-61. To make inter-district comparison possible, some important indices such as, enrolment ratios, percentrage of trained teachers and per capita expenditure on education, were also given. These comparative statistics show a wade range of variations between districts in every respect.
- 3, It has now been decided to publish a similar review of educational development in the districts for the year 1965-66. Such periodic reviews are necessary for several reasons. For instance, they will help to judge the effectiveness of the measures taken to remove regional imbalances at the District level. Secondly, such collection and publication of data on different aspects of education at the District level will help the preparation of educational development plans for all districts so that they can be adopted, as recommended by the Education Commission, as the principal unit for administration, planning and development of school education.
- 4. This review will be divided into 16 volumes, one volume being devoted to the educational statistics of the district in every State except Nagaland). The present volume, which is the fifth in the series, gives the data for each of the districts of Haryana in respect of population, number of educational institutions, enrolment, teachers, expenditure, etc., at all levels of

education. Since the State of Haryana came into being in 1964-65 and the districts of the State were reorganised, the pattern of representing the comparative data of 1960-61 and 1965-66, as adopted uniformly in case of other volumes, has been changed, as complete comparative data in respect of the districts is not available for the year 1960-61.

5. This report has been divided into two parts. while part I gives complete district-wise data relating to 1965-66 along with requisite interpretation, part II gives only comparative d; for 1960-61 in respect of those districts which were not affected as a result of the reorganis, tion of the State.

PART - I

-:3:-I - <u>SUMMARY</u>


In 1965-66 the State of Haryana with an area of 44,560 km. and 88.39 lakhs of population, consisted of seven Districts. About 5,844 educational institutions catered to the educational needs of the people of the State. The total enrolment in all types of educational institutions during the year was 11.30 lakhs. This constituted 12.8 per cent of the total population of the State. The percentage of enrolment receiving primary education to the population of the corresponding age-group 6-11 was 50.7 per/in the State as compared to the all India average of about 80 per cent. Facilities for Middle School education were provided to 28.4 per cent of the population of the age-group 11-14 as compared to all India average of 30.8

The total number of teachers employed in all educational institutions was 31,088, of whom 23.4 per cent were women. The average number of teachers per thousand of population was 3.5. The teacher-pupil ratio in Primary, Middle and Secondary schools was 1:45, 1:34 and 1:31 respectively.

The total direct expenditure on educational institutions was Rs. 70.15 lakes during 1965-65. Nearly 77 per cent of this expenditure was met from Government funds.

The per capita expenditure on education (by population) was Rs.7.9. The average annual cost per pupil in Primary schools, Middle schools and Secondary schools was Rs.33.3; Rc.50.9 and Rs.80.0 respectively. The average annual cost per student in Arts and Science Colleges was as high as Rs.323.6.

II - ARTA AND PCPUL TION

AR EA

The State of Haryana which consisted of seven Districts had an area of 44,056 km. Hissar with an area of 13,934 km. was the largest among districts, the least being Jind with an area of 2,711 km. POPULATION

The total estimated population in 1966 was 88.39 lakhs (47.31 lakes males and 41.08 lakes females). The overall density of population per square mile for the State was 201 in 1966. Compared to an all-India average density of population of 420 per square mile in 1966, all the districts of Haryana State had smaller density of population. The detailed district-wise statistics are given in Statement I.

2. The total population of the children of the age-group 6-11 in 1966 was 15,87,000 (8,49,000 boys and 7,38,000 girls), which was 15.1 percent of the total population of the State. The number of children in the age-group 11-14 in 1966 was 7,25,000 (3,93,000 boys and 3,32,000 girls). This constituted 6.8 percent of the total population of the State. There were 6,73,000 children in the age-group 14-17 in 1966 (3,64,000 boys and 3,09,000 girls). This formed 7.6 percent of the total population of the State. The population in the age-group 17-23 in 1966 was 10,95,000 (5,79,00 males and 5,16,000 females) and this formed 10.3 percent of the total population of the State in 1966. The population in the age-group 6-23 constituted 38.5 percent of the total population of the State in 1966. The distribution of the population in the different age-groups, district-wise, is given in Statement II.

III - TOTAL NUMBER OF EDICATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, PUPILS TEACHERS AND EXPENDITURE INSTITUTIONS AND ENROLMENT


In 1965-66, there were 5,844 educational institutions in Haryana. The total enrolment in all types of educational institutions during the year was 11.30 lakhs (8.39 lakhs boys and 2.91 lakhs girls). The sex ratio was 35 girls for every 100 boys enrolled in 1965-66. Among the districts, this ratio varied from 52 in Ambala to 218 in Jind. The total enrolment in educational institutions constituted 12.8 percent of the total population of the State. District-wise details are given in Statement III.

TEACHERS AND EXPENDITURE

The total number of teachers in all educational institutions in Haryana was 31,088, of whom 7,267 : (23.4 percent) were women teachers. The average number of teachers per thousand of population was 3.5 in 1965-66 in the State.

- 2. The total direct expenditure on educational institutions was m.70.15 lakhs. There is a large variation among districts of the State in the incurring of this expenditure which can be seen from Statement IV.
- 3. Source-wise distribution of total direct expenditure on educational institutions in 1965-66 is given in Statement IV(B). It will be seen there from that 77.3 percent of the total direct expenditure on all educational institutions in Haryana was met from Government funds, 16.3 percent from fees, 0.3 percent from local bodies funds and the remaining 6.1 percent from other sources.

IV - PRE-PRIMARY EDUCATION

As will be seen from Statement V, the facilities for pre-primary education existed only in two districts of the State, namely, Karnal and Mchindragarh. There were only two separate recognised pre-primary schools, one in each of these districts during 1965-66. The enrolment in these schools as well as in the attached pre-primary classes was 271. The five teachers teaching in these schools were all trained. The total annual expenditure incurred on these schools was nearly is.11,000, giving an average annual cost per student as is.122.6.

V - PRIMARY EDUCATION

NUMB N OF SCAL LS

The number of Primary schools in Haryana was 4,457. The area served by a primary school on an average was 9.9 sq. miles. District-wise details are given in Statement VI.

THE M JO HAE

The enrolment in classes I to V in the State was 8.04 lakhs (5.80 lakhs boys and 2.24 lakhs girls) during 1965-66. The percentage of enrolment in classes I to V to the total population in the age-group 6-11, which gives an index of the facilities created for primary stage of education in the State was 50.7 percent in the State as compared to an all India average of about 80 percent. In the case of boys this percentage was 68.4 as compared to 30.3 in the case of girls. It will thus be seen that the facilities provided for children of the age-group 6-11, as a whole, lag very much behind in Haryana State. Further details are given in Statement VII-A.


2. Statement VII-B gives the enrolment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in Class I to V in 1965-66 together with the percentage of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribe population to the total population and the extent of coverage of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in the enrolment in Classes I to V.

There were nearly 87.21 thousand Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribe children enrolled in Classes I -V in Haryana State in 1965-66. Of this, 74.74 thousand were boys and 12.47 thousand were girls. The Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes children formed 10.8 percent of the total enrolment in Classes I-V. The corresponding percentage was 12.9 for boys and 5.6 for girls. There was wide variation in the percentage of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribe pupil to the total enrolment in Classes I to V.

3. The extent of the coverage of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe population is worked out in Cols. 11 to 13 of the Table. This extent of coverage is defined as the percentage of the proportion of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes students of the total enrolment to the corresponding population of these communities. These columns show whether the percentage of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes enrolled in classes I to V is similar to the percentage of enrolment of all the children in classes I - V to the total population. If the extent of coverage is 100 percent, this will show that the percentage enrolment of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes and the percentage population of Scheduled Castes/Tribes to the total population are the same. For Haryana, as a whole, the extent of coverage for the boys and girls together was 60.0 percent. The extent of coverage was 72.9 percent for boys and 30.6 percent for girls.

TEACHTES

There were 11,781 teachers in primary schools in Haryana in 1965-66. Of the total 22.3 percent were women teachers. As will be seen from Statement VIII. Jind District, with 8.8 percent of women teachers in Primary schools, was at the lowest ebb, as against 31.6 percent (highest) women teacher in Primary schools in Rohtak District. Of the total number of teachers in 1965-66, 96.1 percent were trained. Among males 98.9 percent were trained and among females 86.1 percent were trained. The pupil-teacher ratio in Haryana in 1965-66 in Primary schools was 45. Districtwise details are given in Statement IX.

EXP IN DITURE

The direct expenditure on Primary schools amounted to 3.176 lakhs in 1965-66. It formed 25 percent of the total direct expenditure on education in Haryana State. The per capita expenditure on Primary schools was Rs.2.0. The average annual cost per pupil in Primary Schools was 33.3.

VI - MIDDLE SCHOOL EDUCATION

NUMBER OF SCHOOLS

The number of Middle schools in Haryana State was 720 during 1965-66. The population served by a Middle school was 12,276 during 1965-66. The district-wise details are given in Statement X.

THEM JOHNE

The enrolment in Classes VI to VIII in Haryana State was 2.06 leths, of which 42,000 were gir. The percentage of enrolment in Classes VI to VIII to the population in the age-group 11-14 gives a index of the facilities created for middle stage of education. In Haryana, the percentage of enrolment in Classes VI to VIII to the population in the age-group 11-14 was 28.4 (41.8 percent for boy and 12.5 percent for girls). The District-wise details are given in Statement XI.

2. Of the total enrolment in Classes VI-VIII in 1965-66, 9.5 percent boys and 3.3 percent girls belonged to the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribe communities. Both boys and girls together formed 8.3 percent of the total enrolment in these classes.


3. The extent of coverage in the enrolment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in class VI-VIII was 46.1 percent only. In the case of boys, this percentage was 53.7 and in the case of girls 18.0 percent. The details are given in Statement XII.

TEACHERS

There were 7,165 teachers in the Middle schools in Haryana State in 1965-66. Of these, 25.6 percent were women. The number of trained teachers formed 98.2 percent of the total number of teachers in 1965-66. The percentage of trained man teachers was 98.3 and women teachers was 97.9. The position of the trained teachers was almost the same in all the Districts as can be seen from Statement XIII. The pupil-teacher ratio in 1965-66 in the Middle Schools at the State level was 34. Statement XIV gives district-wise position.

END END ENERGY

The direct expenditure on Middle schools was is. 125.52 lakes in 1965-66. The expenditure of Middle schools as a percentage of total direct expenditure on education in the State was 17.9. The direct expenditure per capita on Middle schools was only is, 1.4 in 1965-66 at the State level. The average direct expenditure per student per annum in Middle schools in Haryana in 1965-66 was is, 50.9.

VII - TRANSFER RATES FROM PRIMERY STAGE TO MIDDLE STAGE

denerally, the transfer rate from the Primary stage to Middle stage is calculated as the enrolment in class. VI as a percentage of enrolment in Class V. However, since the class wise enrolment is not available district-wise, the transfer rate has been calculated with the enrolment in classes VI to VIII as a percentage of the enrolment in Classes I to V in the same year. At the State level, the transfer rate as defined above was 25.6 percent during 1965-66 for both boys and girls together. In the case of boys, the transfer rate was 28.3 percent and in the case of girls it was 18.6 percent. The District-wise position of transfer rate in 1965-66 is given in a Table below.

2. Among the boys, the lowest transfer rate from Primary stage to Middle stage was in Jind (22.1 percent) followed by Hissar (24.1 percent) and Gurgaon (25.1 percent). The highest transfer rate was observed in Ambala (36.4 percent). Among the girls, the lowest transfer rate was in Mchinder agarh (10.6 percent) followed by Hissar (14.6 percent) and Jind 16.8 percent). The highest transfer rate among girls was in Ambala (27.0 percent) followed by Karnal (20.5 percent) and Gurgaon (17.4 percent). Taking both boys and girls together, the lowest rate was obtained in Jind (21.3 percent) and the highest transfer rate was observed in Ambala (33.0 percent). At the all India level, the transfer rate was 23.8 percent for boys and 15.6 percent for girls and 20.8 percent both sexes together in 1965-66.

VIII - HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATION


NUMBER OF SCHOOLS

The number of High/Higher Secondary schools in Haryana was 548 in 1965-66. The area in sq. miles served by a High/Higher Secondary School in the State as a whole was 80.4. The population served by a High/Higher Secondary school was 16,130 at the State level. Statement XV gives the District-wise details. ENK CLMENT

The total enrolment in High/Higher Secondary schools in 1965-66 was 84,963, of which 15,429 only were girls. The percentage enrolment in classes IX to X to the population in the age-group 15-17 was 12.6 at the State level. In the case of boys and girls the corresponding percentages were 19.1 and 5.0 respectively. Statement XVI gives the District-wise data.

2. Statement XVII gives the enrolment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in Classes
1. 3 XI. Of the total enrolment in classes IX to X, 6,938 students belonged to the Scheduled step and Scheduled Tribe communities. Of this, 6,682 were boys and 256 were girls. The percentage of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes statements to the total enrolment was 8.2 (9.6 in the case of boys and 1.7 in the case of girls). The extent of coverage of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribe students in the enrolment in classes IX to XI was 45.6 percent, at the State level. In the case of boys belonging to those communities, the coverage was 54.2 percent and in the case of girls it was 9.3 percent. The extent of coverage of both boys and girls together varied from 76.7 percent in Robtak to 22.3 percent in Karnal.

TTACHERS

The total number of teachers in these schools was 10,397; of whom 2,464 were women. Of the total number of teachers in 1965-66, 93.3 percent wore trained. While in the case of men teachers 92.5 percent were trained in the case of women teacher 95.8 percent were trained. Further details are given in Statement XVIII. The pupil-teacher ratio in High/Higher Secondar was 31 in 1965-66 at the State level.

EXP IN DITURE

The total direct expenditure at High/Higher Secondary schools was Rs. 261 lakhs. It formed 37.2 percent of the total direct expenditure incurred on educational institutions during 1965. The per capital expenditure on High/Higher Secondary schools was only Rs. 3.0 at the State level in 1965-66. The cost per student in High/Higher Secondary schools in Haryana was As 80:0. District-wise data on the expenditure is given in Statement XIX.

IX - THAN SET RATE FROM MIDDLE SCHOOL STAJE TO HIGH SCHOOL STAGE


Since the class-wise enrolment at the Middle stage as well as at the High school stage is not available District-wise, the transfer rate has been calculated with the enrolment in classes IX to XI as percentage of enrolment in Classes VI to VIII of the same year. At the State level, the transfer rate was 41.2 in 1965-66. In the case of boys, the transfer rate was 42.3 and in the case of girls it was 37.1. The District-wise position of transfer rate in 1965-66 is given in a Table below:-

2. Among the boys, the lowest transfer rate from middle stage to high school stage was in Mohinder agarh (34.8 percent), followed by Rohtak (40.4 percent) and Hissar (42.4 percent) districts. The highest transfer rate was observed in Ambala (46.2 percent) followed by Gurgaon (45.3 percent) districts. The lowest transfer rate among girls was in Mohindragarh (19.9 percent) and the highest transfer rate was in Karnal (46.2 percent) districts. Taking both boys and girls together, the lowest transfer rate was observed in Mohindragarh (33.4 percent) and the highest rate in Ambala (45.8 percent) districts. At the all India level, the transfer rate was 47.3 percent in the case of boys, 35.3 percent in the case of girls and 44.2 percent in the case of both sexes together.

· X - TRAINING INSTITUTIONS

There were only 12 teachers' training Institutions in the State in 1965-66. Of the total, seven were of under-graduate standard and five were post-graduate colleges. The total enrolment in these institutions was 8,421. District-wise position is given in Statement XX.

XI - VOCATIONAL AND TECHNICAL SCHOOLS

During 1965-66, there was only one technical school in Karnal district with an enrolment of 11 students. Desidesthis, there were 50 institutions of industrial training and junior technic schools with an enrolment of 4,313 students (3,236 boys and 1,077 girls) for which district-wise details were not available. The total direct expenditure on the technical school located in Karnal district was 3.41,415 in 1965-66. The expenditure on the 50 students of industrial comming and junior technical schools for which district wise details are not available, emounted to 3.36.36 lachs.

XII - HIGHTR EDUCATION

IN STITUTIONS

During 1965-66 the total number of institutions of nigher education, including universities was 60. Of the total, there were one university (located at Kurukshetra - Karnal District), 38 Arts and Science colleges, 2 Medical colleges, 2 Engineering colleges, 12 Teachers' Training colleges and 5 colleges for other professions and special education. There was at least one or more arts and science college in every district of the Haryana State in 1965-66. Statement XXII gives the district-wise details.


ENKOLMENT_

The total enrolment in institutions for higher education in Haryana in 1965-66 was 27,017.

Of this, 721 students were studying in university teaching departments, 21,369 in Arts and Science colleges, 343 in engineering colleges, 591 in Medical colleges, 2,882 in teachers training colleges and the remaining 1,111 in colleges for other professional and special education. The distribution of the total enrolment of higher education by standard or by various levels of higher education in 1965-66 was: - pre-university/Intermediate (7,408 - 22.8 percent); Graduate (Arts) (8,285 - 25.5 percent); Graduate (Science) (2,473 - 7.6 percent); Post-Graduate (including research) (562 - 1.7 percent); Teachers Training (8,421 - 25.9 percent) and other professional and special education 5,378 - 16.5 percent). At the State level, nearly 3 percent of the population of the age-group 17-23 received higher education. In case of boys this percentage was 4.1 and in case of girls it was 1.7. If strict-wase details are given in Statement VXIV.

2. There were 1,268 students of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes studying in classes of higher education in 1965-66 in Haryana. Of this, 1,170 were boys and 98 girls. The enrolment from the general population was very low. The extent of coverage of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes children of both sexes was 21.7 percent at the State level. In the case of poys it was 27.7 percent and in the case of girls it was only 6.0 percent.

TEACHTES

The total number of teachers in institutions of higher education was 1,627, of whom only 262 (15.1 percent) were women. The highest number of teachers (1,015) were in Arts and Science colleges and the least 135 were attached in university departments. The pupil-teacher ratio in Arts and Science colleges was (21). District-wise position is shown in Statement XXVI.

The total direct expenditure in 1965-66 on institutions of higher education in the State as a whole was Rs.137.84 lakhs. Of this total, 17.6 percent was spent on universities, 50.2 percent on Arts no Scine colleges; 6.3 percent on Medical colleges; 3.8 percent on Figure colleges; 6.6 percent on teachers training colleges and the remaining 15.5 percent on other professional and special education colleges.

- 2. During the period under report the direct expenditure on higher education formed 19.6 percent of the total direct expenditure on education in the Haryana State.
- 3. The average direct expenditure per student per annum in 1965-66 in Haryana was is.323.6 in Arts and Science colleges; .s.1,508.7 in Engineering colleges, s.1,469.7 in Medical colleges and s.317.3 in Teachers Training colleges.

4. The expenditure per student in Arts and Science college varied from 3.358.8 in Mohindrag to 3.222.9 in Jind District. District-wise position is given in Statement XXVII.
