INTRODUCTION

Voluntary agencies represent the collective will of the people to innovate, to promote and to implement programmes with or without governmental support. Invariably, they are initiated and governed by their own members on democratic principles without external control. With the definite objectives and a plan for fulfilling these objectives, they carry out the programmes efficiently. Generally, by structure and mobility of attitude they are very flexible.

It is believed that among the number of agencies participating in National Adult Education Programme, voluntary agencies play a major and vital role in implementation. A number of Voluntary organisations have been doing pioneering work in the field of Education including Adult Literacy. ARUL ANANDAR COLLEGE

National Adult Education Programme

INTRODUCTION

Arul Anandar College initiated Adult Education Programme in the year 1970. It aims, in particular, at raising the standards of literacy and of living in what is classified as backward area, and for this purpose, the Department of Rural Development Science has been established. Conscious of the poverty of the masses and the prevailing moral and spiritual corruption and social inequalities that beset our country, the management of the college gives first place to moral and spiritual values and desires to inculate a strong sense of social justice among the students hoping to make the institution both in theory and in practice an agent of social change towards a more just and equitable social order.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

- To undertake community motivational programmes and adult literacy work.
- To create a sense of cooperation and discipline among the students by involving them, in social welfare activities.
- To develop the habit of study among the students through library and other literary activities.
- To impart general knowledge for better citizenship.
- To work for the removal of all disabilities of rural poor whether legal, economic or social and to ensure opportunities for their full and free development and advancement.

STRUCTURE OF THE ORGANISATION

This programme is administered by a panel of Board members formed with a President, programme officer cum Secretary. Supervisor, Leader and staff advisors. However, it comes under the supervision of the Principal for its reason of sponsorship by National Service Scheme, a project by University Grants Commission.

ACTIVITIES

In the field of adult education

 Runs free classes for educating the adults and poor people who cannot afford to study during the day time. About 10 centres with 20 teachers are being run by them.

- Arranges film shows, lectures and symposia for the learners with a view to make them better citizens.
- Imparts knowledge to the school children in nine elementary schools.

IN OTHER FIELDS

- organises village camps and Harijan welfare programmes by the NSS & RDS students.
- teaches carpentary, plumbing, masonry, electric wiring, etc., to the young boys.
- organises welfare projects like family planning activities and vocational training centres.

AREAS OF OPERATION

Operates at the village level, in and around Karumathur village, Usilampatti Taluk.

PUBLICATIONS

It has published literature for adult literacy and follow-up materials.

RESOURCES

Financial

Aids from University Grants Commission and Central Government facilitate to run their programme without much difficulties.

Under National Adult Education Programme it runs Adult Education Centres to educate and inculcate in the minds of the people the essentiality of education in the present society.

- Arranges family planning orientation camps.
- Convenes students and youth camps and training camps for mobilising vouth for national reconstruction work.

At present it is engaged in WATRAP Block, West Ramnad District, though it was proposed to cover the whole Tamilnadu.

The Island of Peace is an integrated rural development project based on self-hep. It was founded by late Father Dominique Pire, Nobel Peace Prize winner for the year 1958. A previous 'Island' had already been completed (1962-67) in Banglatesh and was functioning successfully in the hands of the local people, and a third project subsequently started in 1975 at Timbuctu, in Mali, West Africa. It was established in the year 1968 and became financially and administratively independent from Belgian aid and Management in the year 1975.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

- To conduct and promote in the State the manifold constructive activities required to further the ideals of truth and non-violence.
- To establish and maintain work centres.
- To promote preventive and other measures for the health of the people especially in rural or poverty stricken areas.
- To promote and encourage basic education, training of children and adults for citizenship of women especially in domestic science, handicrafts, cottage industries and other crafts.
- To prepare and supply, if necessary, suitable literature, slides, charts, booklets etc. and to undertake publication of bulletins and other pamphlets.
- To act as an agency with an inter-disciplinary approach committed towards providing three basic technical services such as water development, medical and educational in the rural areas.

STRUCTURE OF THE ORGANISATION

Administered by the Executive Board represented by the elected members of the organisation.

Three heads of the sectors, operators, assistants, field maistry, workers, social workers, Nursery school Teachers, Ayah cum cooks, Sewing instructors, attender and watchman constitute the official staff pattern.

About 13 schools are being run with approximately 455 children.

Over 1100 mothers and children now benefit from this Feeding scheme.

Vocational Training Centre

One course for about 24 students. Three ten-month courses have now been held for 72 students.

The activities of the agricultural, social and medical sectors cover the inhabitants of the Kalakad Panchayat Union, plus some beneficiaries from outside. The Kalakad Panchayat Union consists of 20 Panchayats with a total population of roughly 77,000 spread over 88 square miles.

NEW RESIDENTS WELFARE TRUST

INTRODUCTION

New Residents Welfare Trust, a registered voluntary organisation was founded in the year 1971 to bring about social change in the housing estates of Tamil Nadu Slum Clearance Board. Starting with three pilot projects it has rapidly expanded to 32 project areas, covering a population of 1,35,000. These projects are an attempt to meet the evergrowing demand for responsible citizenship, effective leadership efficient and well informed personnel to undertake responsibilities in the departments of community development and cooperation to make education substantive. This trust works for the all round educational, economic, social and cultural advancement of the underprivileged. It is sponsored by the Tamil Nadu Slum Clearance Board Madras Christian Council of Social Service and '77 society'.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

- To foster a sense of community life through serving the social, cultural economic needs of the dwellers.
- To arouse the awareness of the youths in the project areas to understand their own problems and assist them in seeking suitable solutions.
- To enable the youths to serve as activists in youth development programmes and equipped with skills and techniques so that they could be prepared to shoulder more and more responsibilities with special reference to the social and other conditions in an urban area.
- To give educational facilities to the local residents by running pre-school education centres, night school, non-formal and adult education centres, workers education centres, social, health and nutrition education centres.
- To organize special campaign such as special drama and educational programmes to promote awareness on a particular topic.
- To promote self-employment schemes by helping the adults to receive money from the nationalised banks.
- To organize speeches, discussions, camps, seminars, meetings, competitions, baby shows etc. for the promotion of community welfare.
- To collect and diffuse knowledge and information covering the possibilities and achievements of community life.
- To provide health care for dwellers of Slum Clearance Board through stationary clinics. established at various centres and mobile clinics.

STRUCTURE OF THE ORGANISATION

It functions under the supervision of the Executive Board members. Three Representatives from each sponsoring agency constitute the Executive Board. This Executive Board frames the policy and charts out the programmes. Official staff position comprises an Executive officer, two assistant executive officers, six community field assistants, eleven tailoring teachers, sixteen day-care centre teachers; ten Residents Welfare Officers, two Medical officers, seven community health nurses, eleven clinic assistants, five administrative staff,

ACTIVITIES

Community work: The qualified social workers serve as catalysts in the field of community work. They also play the roles of enablers and educators in organising various development activities. Youth groups, women groups and community councils have been set up in the project areas and they are made to take part in the activities,

Youth work: The potentialities of youths are harnessed for the development of their own fellow-residents. There are now 24 active youth groups involved in various kinds of development programmes.

Women work: 90 to 100 women representatives meet every month at the women federation meetings to plan various welfare schemes and co-ordinate the activities to the sangams.

Day-care centres: 11 day-care centres are being run by this trust with a total of about 525 children. Through this centre nutritive food facilities, medical check up facilities, deworming and immunisation facilities are provided.

Adult Education: In collaboration with Women's Voluntary Service it runs four functional literacy centres with a strength of 20-25 persons per centre. Also in, collaboration with the Workers Education Centre, worker education programmes are started at various places. Sixty women workers are educated through this programme. It also offers tailoring training, type-writing training, self employment schemes, etc.

AREAS OF OPERATION

PUBLICATIONS

REGIONAL COUNCIL FOR ADULT EDUCATION

INTRODUCTION .

The Regional Council for Adult Education was started in 1966 with a view to conduct adult education programme, to establish institutions for the development and advancement of knowledge among the people and to serve as a link for inter-state co-operation and co-ordination.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

- To spread relevant knowledge relating to welfare and culture.
- To initiate wherever necessary adult education activities in co-operation with various organisations and individuals interested in the programme and to encourage and co-ordinate local efforts and organisations engaged in promoting the cause of adult education.
- To serve as a Regional Bureau for information concerning adult education in the States.
- To co-operate with movements aiming at the removal of illiteracy and the promotion of the civic economic and cultural interest of the people.
- To prepare and supply, if necessary, suitable literature, slides, charts, films, booklets etc. and to undertake publication of bulletins and journals.
- To arrange public lectures, demonstrations, seminars etc. for the furtherance of the objectives of the council.
- To urge Universities, Educational bodies and local bodies etc., to take up
 Adult Education work and to do all other acts that may be incidental to the fulfilment of the above objectives.
- To establish and conduct Educational Institutions, Vidya Peeths (i. e. People's Colleges) for the development and advancement of knowledge among the people.
- To organise Functional Literacy centres for adult literacy and propagate knowledge through audio-visual aids, etc.
- To open free reading rooms to enable the public to acquire knowledge through magazine and literature kept in those places.
- To raise and accept donations from the people in the direction of advancing adult education endowment for the development of Adult Education.

- To undertake such works and functions as may be entrusted to the council either by Central or State Governments for fulfilment of the above objectives.
- To acquire lands, housing sites and social sites and construct buildings, schools etc., in the name of the council to promote the objectives of the council.

STRUCTURE OF THE ORGANISATION

The administration of the Association vests with a Managing Committee consisting of 22 members which is constituted as under:

- (i) Five Permanent Members
- (ii) Five Nominated Members
- (iii) Twelve elected Members

RURAL UNIT FOR HEALTH AND SOCIAL AFFAIRS/RUHSA

INTRODUCTION

The Christian Medical College and Hospital, Vellore, has started a new rural health and development programme through its Rural Unit for Health and Social Affairs (RUHSA). This is an extension and re-emphasis of its commitment in service, training and research for the needs of India, particularly, for its vast rural populations. RUHSA is an agent of social change helping the community to become aware of their own rights and problems and helping them with their future.

Its ultimate hope is to help the rural people to help themselves. As a voluntary agency, it sees its role primarily as a facilitator and catalyst.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The ultimate aim is the improvement of the community's welfare through a organisation that will:

- Implement an integrated multi-disciplinary rural health and socio-economic development programme for a defined area and population in association with the local community and Government consistent with the resources available.
 - Use this programme as an extension of CMCH's service in the community and in the training of its students for the needs of India.

Basic principles on which RUHSA has been founded:

- It covers an area and a population with a programme for the general socioeconomic development of the people.
- The service may be a community scheme in which the local people are involved in all aspects of development, Community acceptance and participation being essential to the final success and liability.
- CMCH is involved in rural development and health as part of its witness and social commitment to the needs of the rural communities.
- The RUHSA unit may be used as a centre for Field study and training for the rural areas, as part of CMCH's contribution to the development and training of health care personal and the delivery of the health care systems.
- The programmes for socio-economic development need to be an interdisciplinary approach ,to the problems of the rural people, health, education, vocational training and agriculture.

STRUCTURE OF THE ORGANISATION

There are six departments such as Administration, Social Development, Health, Socio-Economic Development, Agriculture and Consultancy Evaluation Training and Research (CERT) to cover the various activities of RUHSA. Each department is headed by the Section Head and under their control are middle level and junior level, Field level officials and workers. In all, there are 175 staff members in RUHSA.

The management activities are governed by the Management Committee of RUHSA with the coordination of Administrative committee, Consultative committee and Evaluation committee nominated by CMC council Executive committee.

RUHSA has established 16 peripheral units (one for each 5000 population) in the field covering all 37 panchayats. These are staffed by multidisciplinary, specially trained Rural Community Organisers. Mobile teams of health and development workers visit these centres regularly.

ACTIVITIES

In the field of adult education

- It conducts literacy classes for adult workers. About 30 centres with 900 learners are organised under the National Adult Education Programme.
- with its Agricultural and Social development units vocational training schemes, establishment of cooperatives and co-ownership oriented projects are under taken.
- It surveys the needs of the local people and their literacy status.

In other fields

- It plans for increasing jobs and possible income generating schemes for the economically and socially weaker sections.
- works with the Government voluntary agencies and banks on socioeconomic schemes that can be taken up in their area and helps in the establishment of the same.
- It helps in the marketting of local products, especially, those with which RUHSA has been associated.
- It organises pragrammes such as, Dry land development, poultry development, Dairy development, Sericulture development, Agro support services, General agricultural extension activities and training programmes.

- Arranges programmes for training of medical, nursing, paramedical students, rural community organisers and village level workers in the rural environment where the individuals get an understanding of the socioeconomic conditions.
- It has developed a planned, comprehensive, community based health programme giving emphasis to the promotion of health, prevention of disease and low cost, easily available primary health care. This will include antenatal and family welfare services, care of the children under five, special disease programmes, nutrition, immunization, etc.

AREAS OF OPERATION

RUHSA covers a population of 1,00,000 people (about 20,000 families) in over 80 villages in a total area of 125 sq. miles K. V. Kuppam Block has been chosen and the operational Headquarters in a village 25 miles from Vellore.

- To undertake such other objectives as are consonant with the aims and objectives of the Association.

- To do rural development works within the project area where the State central Governments have not taken up. Such works are counselling the agriculturists within the project area of improvements in their respective field; to form link roads; to plant avenue trees on either side of the roads; to give protected water supply; to construct over-head tanks; to give family planning guidance to the people; to implement the nutrition and health programme; to develop small scale industries with the help of the people of the project area and to initiate rural development works which are necessary for the rural area within the project area.

STRUCTURE OF THE ORGANISATION

The organisation is administered by an executive committee consisting of a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer and six executive members.

The official staff pattern is formed with one co-ordinator and one clerk cum typist.

Stree Seva Mandir, a primordinate organisation, was formed with the objective to promote education, vocational training, employment and community welfare activities for school dropouts, destitute women, divorcees and widows, with or without children and orphans. From the date of its establishment, 2nd Oct. 1949, its strenuous efforts are being stretched into varied angles.

- Narmada Women's Academy-cultural association for the local ladies at Saligramam.

TAMILNAD GANDHI SMARAK NIDHI

INTRODUCTION

The Trust is a voluntary organisation dedicated to the service of the needy on the basis of Gandhian principles. It was established in 1950 as a state memorial to perpetuate the memory of Mahatma Gandhi with the object of carrying on constructive activities all over Tamil Nadu and to collect, preserve and publish his writings and teachings in Tamil language and to maintain a museum where articles connected with Gandhiji are preserved. The main purpose is to further manifold constructive activities in which Gandhiji was interested and such of the activities which gave concrete shape to his ideas. The trust was registered under the societies Registration Act of 1860.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

- Organisation and promotion of the manifold constructive activities with which Gandhiji was associated during his life time and any other activities in furtherance of his ideas including such activities as would conduce to the general development and uplift of the poor and needy.
- Establishment and maintenance of hospitals for the poor and charitable dispensaries, convalescent homes, sanitoria, homes for women and children, maternity homes, child welfare centres and other institutions of similar nature such as ante-natal clinics.
- Provision of sanitary facilities and promotion of preventive and other measures for the health of the people specially in rural or poverty stricken areas of India.
- Measures for the prevention and cure of leprosy including the establishment of leper colonies and other allied institutions as well as research centres,
- Promotion and encouragement of education, particularly basic education for children, and of adults in citizenship and of women in domestic science and training in handicrafts, cottage industries, and other useful crafts and arts.
- Collection, preservation and publication in various languages of Mahatma Gandhi's writings and teachings, study and propagation of his message and teachings of non-violence, world peace and fellowship, maintenance of study centres and libraries of such purposes.
- Maintence of a museum where various relics and objects of veneration, books and articles connected with Mahatma Gandhi may be preserved, etc.

STRUCTURE OF THE ORGANISATION

The Executive Board consists of Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer and eight other members. 1/3 or all the members are elected at the end of every third year.

It has 5 Grama Seva Centres at Shanarpatti, Pullambadi, Bogaiur, Perianaickenpalayam and Uthiramerur as its sister units, and is affiliated to rhe Gandhi Smarak Nidhi, Rajghat, New Delhi.

- To coordinate agencies concerned with Non-formal education throughout the State, so as to strengthen and support their efforts, promote mutual assistance and the exchange of ideas and experience, and to act as a clearing house for projects of Non-formal education in Tamil Nadu.
- To provide a link between these agencies and the larger National and International agencies concerned with the spread of education.
- To undertake studies and investigations into the proper content, methodology and educational aims of Non-formal and formal education for people of all ages, both sexes and of different environments.

ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE

It is formed with a Board, Council and an Executive Committee. The Council is constituted by President, Treasurer, Secretary, Joint Secretary, Director of Nonformal Education, Government of Tamil Nadu and 24 members of the Board. The members of the Executive Committee are partly elected by the council and partly nominated by the Executive Committee. In all activities of the organisation, the administration is vested with the Executive Committee.

State Resource Centre for Non-formal Education, Tamil Nadu, initiated on the basis of the proposal of Government of India has been affiliated to this organisation.

INTRODUCTION

It is a voluntary organisation functioning at the State Level to enact the dreams of Mahatma Gandhi on Khadi work. It was established in the year 1958 to achieve the Gandhiji's new khadi policy propounded in the year 1945. It is a non-political non-profit making and non-secretarian association working primarily for the poor unemployed rural people. The main purpose is to further manifold constructive activities in which Gandhiji was interested and such of the activities which gave concrete shape to his ideas.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

- To Establish a Sarvodaya Social order, free from all forms of exploitation, based on Truth and non-voilence through Gramdan and Gramodoyog;
- To develop a spirit of community life among the people by promoting cooperation and mutual sharing, leading ultimately to voluntary community ownership of the basic means of production such as land, and fulfillment by the village community of responsibility for the total welfare of all the members:
- To make the village self-sufficient in the primary needs of life, such as food, clothing and shelter and to promote the total development of each village along with the neighbouring villages of the region:
- To develop self-reliance in the individual and initiative in the community and to enable the people to manage all their affairs themselves for the relisation of Gram Swaraj;
- To arrange for preparing and organising programmes for the production and development of Khadi and Village Industries, including training of personnel, manufacture and supply of equipment, supply of raw materials, marketing research and study of economic problems of different village industries;
- To endeavour to be a clearing house of technical information, experience and statistical data relating to those industries;
- To take over all the existing projects carried on today by the Akhil Bharat Sarva Seva Sangh in the State of Tamil Nadu;
- To work in future also in close cooperation with the Akhil Bharat Sarva Seva Sangh, Wardha, with the State Government with the State Khadi and Village Industries Board and with the All India Khadi and Village Industries Commission and such other institutions having objectives akin to those of the Sangh; and

— To publish Sarvodaya literature and periodicals, to run training camps, to organise exhibitions and to propogate the idealogy of the Sangh in all possible ways.

STRUCTURE OF THE ORGANISATION

The Tamil Nadu Sarvodya Sangh has pioneered in this field for the past several years. It is now organized on a three tier system consisting of

- 1. The Apex organization—The Tamil Nadu Savodaya Sangh coordinating, servicing and providing the Socio-economic path finding, Research and and other infra-structural facilities.
- 2. Fifty one District Savodaya Sanghs providing the organizational framework, the finances and the skills and market facilities and the productive tools and equipments.
- 3. The primaries consist of the actual field organization of producers and consumers of a wide variety of products and sources. They consist of nearly 200 organizations at present and are likely to grow nearly to 500 te 600 in the next three years.

Almost all the members of the entire establishment is associated with the process of decision-making through this three tier system.

The Sangh is managed by a Board of Trustees consisting of not less than 12 members with powers to co-opt not more than three annual members, who shall hold office for a period of one financial year only, besides the Ex-officio members consisting of the Chairman and Secretaries of the affiliating institutions who shall be members by virtue of their office.

VOLUNTARY HEALTH SERVICES MEDICAL CENTRE

INTRODUCTION

The voluntary Health Services is a registered non-profit society working on many modern ideas of improving the existing families for medical relief, education and research. The society was registered in July 1958. The medical centre was fully equipped and staffed before July 1963, when the first patient was admitted.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

- The first concept of the Society Is that in a country with so many preventible diseases and deaths, the emphasis should be on prevention and services to illness and to the comparative exclusion of minor or day to day illness. It is felt that this matter can be handled by large number of public dispensaries and unaided private practioners who are welcome to utilize the services of the medical centre.
- The second concept is that the family should be the unit for medical care and that every family should be attached to a combined public health and curative centre and should learn about all diseases and their prevention from the same social worker, Health vistor, a public Health Nurse attached to the Medical centre to which the family belongs.
- To create awareness about community participation to achieve the above said objectives.

STRUCTURE OF THE ORGANISATION

— This centre is organised by the Board of Trustees elected by the members of the central committee. The total members on 31st December 1979 are patrons, 238 life members, 2 ordinary members and 10 Ex-officer members.

This medical centre constitutes college of Medical Technology, Institute of General practice, M. A. Chidambaram Institute of Community Health, Dr. A. Lakshmipathi unit for Research in Indian Medicine as its sub-units.

Apart from fhis, it runs a Mini Health centre at Mapillai Naickenpatti under the Tamil Nadu Government scheme. The proposed referral hospital is still in the planning stage. At Appakoodal, Erode District survey has been carried out to build another referral hospital.

ACTIVITIES

In the field of Adult Education

The Social Welfare Board has continued to sponsor the vocational training programme for adult workers. 15 adult women were trained under this programme during every year in private Nursing Homes and other hospitals. VHS is also training six male candidates every half year to provide the base for recruitment of hospital workers. There is a demand for candidates trained under the programme.

The department of community Health of the VHS continued to run two Adult Literacy classes at Thuraipakkam and Chemancheri in collaboration with the women's Voluntary Service.

An introductory book in Tamil for Non-formal Education has been prepared by Dr. K. S. Sanjivi, in the interest of rural development.

In other fields

Every year about 4,000 students are medically examined and advised.

Short term orientation courses in community health for medical, para-medical and para-professional personnel are given to two batches, each containing 13 and 12 candidates. Female candidates on completion of training were attached to the Andhra Mahila Sabha for a period of two months for training in maternity and child welfare.

Community level workers training programmes are also arranged for different groups of students throughout the year.

AREAS OF OPERATION

It functions at State level.

PUBLICATIONS

The VHS publishes a bulletin every six months. The first issue was published in July 1978. The bulletin is sent free of cost to all the Medical colleges in India, IMA branches of Tamil Nadu and also various consultants and General practitioners.

Apart from this, it has produced numerous primers and supplementary readers for animators and community health volunteers. These publications are priced.

RESOURCES

Financial

Contributions by philonthropists and Institutions appear to be the major input to its financial source. Yet, it receives adhoc grant from the Central Government and recurring grants from the State Government and Social Welfare Board:

In course of time, it expanded its activities to the field of education. This was established in the year 1972 as a State Branch of the All India Women's Voluntary Service, New Delhi, to-ordinate the various independant women working through voluntary and a statutory bodies.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

To bring together women social workers and organize measures for the amelioration of the living conditions especially of the weaker and under privileged sections of society, and render various categories of services, such as

4 District units at Madurai, Kanyakumari, Ramnad, Coimbatore function as its branches.

ACTIVITIES

The committees incharge of Ambulance, Hospital Welfare, Adult Literacy, Career institute, Scholarships, Community Welfare, Youth wing are carrying out numerous activities in their respective field.

To illustrate, the Adult Literacy Committee has been taking active interest in promoting adult literacy among women living in the slum areas of the city and has been implementing for the second year in succession a scheme of adult-cumfunctional literacy programme sanctioned by Govt. of India on a 75 per cent grant-Inaid from June 1978. Under this scheme, 20 centres area run in the city in collaboration with organisations like rhe V. H. S, New Resident Welfare Trust, V. shwa Hindu Parishad etc. who provide accommodation and local supervision. In the centres, lessons about environmental hygiene, nutrition, health, mother and child care etc. are being taught.

AREAS OF OPERATION

This association conducts its campaigns mainly in the city and sub-urban areas of Madras. With their branches at various places it almost covers whole Tamil Nadu.

PUBLICATIONS

Annual report and Memorandum of Association are the only two publications.

RESOURCES

Financial

It receives grants from both the Central and State Governments for their specific programmes. Further, it collects Rs. 3/- towards annual membership fees Rs. 30/- towards life membership fee and Rs. 25/- towards affiliation fee to its institutions.

WORKING WOMENS FORUM

INTRODUCTION

The Working Women's Forum, a registered voluntary organisazion was founded in the year 1977, to mobilise self-employed, lower and middle class working women to fight to improve their economic, social and professional status. In many aspects the Forum is similar to the Self-Employed Women's Association (SEWA) in Ahmedabad.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

- To federate existing organisations striving for working women and to establish branches of the Working Women's Forum in all the districts and villages of Tamil Nadu.
- To assist in improving the condititions of working women though cooperation and secure for them more time and leisure for creative work, cultural activities and recreation.
- To help self-employed women expand their business through arranging loans from nationalised banks and to improve their professional and social status by giving them training and establishing day care centres of their children.
- To solve the civic and other problems of members by acting as a liaison between members and civic authorities, government and other national and international organisations.
- To mobilize all working women to fight for their rights by acting as a pressure group.

STRUCTURE OF THE ORGANISATION

Initially, the Forum grew out of another organisation, the Vidya Bharati Trust, a well known voluntary organisation. It consists of 110 groups of women and each group has a leader chosen by the consensus of the group itself. Every group leader automatically becomes a member of the Governing Body. The Governing 3ody Members elect the President, Secretary, Treasurer and others. At present the organization has six paid members on its roll. They are Chief organizer, organizer for South Madras, organizer for North Madras, Two field workers, and accountant. About 1000 women are enrolled as members of the organisation.

ACTIVITIES

In the field of adult education

- It runs classes for its semi-literate and illiterate members.
- The forum has 20 coaching centres with a minimum number of 30 students in each of the centres for the illiterate children of the self-employed working women.
- Trains family planning workers who will acts as motivators for Family Welfare Projects.

In other fields

- Arranges loans for poor people.
- Jobs for the unemployed, arrangement of inter-caste marriages are some of its officer activities.
- Technical help for business women.

AREAS OF OPERATION

Services are limited to the city of Madras.

RESOURCES

Financial

Membership fee contribution, grants and aids form philanthropic societies makes the organisation to run its programmes efficiently. However, much more aid, from both the Central and State Governments are expected to encourage their welfare activities.

WORTH TRUST

INTRODUCTION

In the year 1963, a rehabilitation workshop was established by the SWEDISH RED CROSS, as part of its leprosy control work. From the begining, it was an integrated unit, catering to all types of physically handicapped. The aim was to provide training and employment and reach economic self-sufficiency. When the Swedish Red Cross withdrew, the "WORTH" TRUST, standing for Workshop for Rehabilitation and training of the Handicapped, came into being. it was established in the year 1963 and has been registered under the Act of Societies Registration.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

- To protect, advance and promote the social, economic and cultural interests and activities of the handicapped.
- To train handicapped personnel as wage earners.
- To offer non-formal education in better methods to learn discipline and develop the capacity to work in co-operation with others.
- To organise non-formal training to about twelve boys who are not eligible for the recognised course.

STRUCTURE OF THE ORGANISATION

A Board of trustees at the Headquarters govern the activities of this trust. It has 7 sub units located at different places. They are as follows:

The production centres come under the Factories Act, Provident Fund Act etc. and compete with open industries.

The welfare of the workers is carefully looked after. Physiotherapists posted in the Katpadi and Tiruchirapalli Units. maintain detailed records of treatments given, medical tests done etc. The limbs of all workers, especially those who have anaesthetic limbs are frequently examined.

At Katpadi Training Centre, residential training programme is undertaken. A batch of twelve trainees are taken every year for a two year course. Applicants admitted are physically handicapped, in the group 18-26 and have studied upto 10th standard.

AREAS OF OPERATION

it functions at State level.

PUBLICATIONS

It does not have any specified publication except the Annual Report.

Financial

Neither it receives grant nor aid from outside sources (i. e. Govt. and other philanthropic societies). It entirely depends upon the production units which forms the basic source of finance.
