District Educational Survey Report

TIRUNELVELI KATTABOMMAN DISTRICT

(Fifth All India Educational survey as on 30.9.1986)

Chapter I

1. General Information : The District Report on the fifth All India Educational survey has been prepared on the basis of the data collected through 128 tables. The report gives the picture of the various educational facilities available in villages in each Block development area and Urban towns as on 30.9.1986 the particulars furnished in the tables have been collected through the village information forms and the ~~and~~ school information forms.

Topography of the District: The then Tirunelveli District

Was bifurcated into two viz. the V.O.Chidambaram District and the Tirunelveli Kattabomman district on 5.9.86. It is flanked by the V.O.Chidambaram district in the east and the western ghat in the west kanyakumari district lies on its southern border while the kamarajar district lies on its northern border. It has an area of 6838 sq. kms. It consists of nine taluks viz Sivagiri, Sankaran Kovil, Shencottah Tenkasi, Tirunelveli, Palayamcottai, Ambasamudram, Nanguneri and Radhapuram. There are 19 Block Municipalities and two townships i.e. courtallam and sankarnagar. The total number of villages in the Rural area is 553 which included 27 uninhabited villages and 1843 habitations.

Irrigation: The Tambaraparani is the main perennial river having its source in the Western ghats at papana sam and manimuthar are the two dams constructed across the river Tambaraparani supply water and hydro electricity regularly.

Sivagiri, Sankarancoil and Padapuram are the taluks in the dry lands having only ~~scanty~~ & ~~scarce~~ rainfall. Hence the forewells and manamari tanks on the source for irrigation in these taluks.

Main crops: The Main crops are paddy, plantain, sugarcane ~~cambu~~, ragi, cotton and chillies in some part of the district where the land is fertile.

Industries: The Tirunelveli Kattabomman district is industrially backward. There is a cement factory at Talayuthu near Tirunelveli. Cotton, ginning and spinning mills are located at Nanguneri, Tirunelveli Verravallur and Ambasamudram. The Madura coats weaving mill at Vickiramasigapuram ~~near~~ papana sam is one of the industry in this district. The Sun paper mill at cheranmahadevi produces new print paper. Tile- makings, brickmaking, ~~mixing~~ pottaries, lion industries, carbide industries brass and aluminium vessels making are some of the minor industries in this district.

Beedi manufacturing is the main cottage industry which provides employment for women at home.

Population: Population as per 1981 census in this district is given below.

68.4% of the total population live in rural areas. As on 30.9.1986 the estimated population is 16,75,922 in rural areas with an increase of 8% when compared to the previous census report.

In urban areas the population as per 1981 census is 7,02,921 and in 1986 it has been estimated at 7,92,495. So the increase in population is 12%. Nearly 52.4% of the population is literate male 63.3% female 41.5%.

The density of the population of the district is 328 per sq. kms. as against 372 per sq. kms. for the state.

Educational aspect: This is an educationally advanced district having many number of institutions of various categories. There are 14 Arts colleges two Teacher Training colleges 2 Engineering colleges and one medical college education primary education is provided in 1588 primary school and 363 upper primary schools. There are 91 Secondary and Higher secondary schools in the district the Higher secondary education covers all the panchayat union areas. Besides there are one school for the blind and two deaf and dumb schools.

However Educational survey is being conducted in every ten years. The National policy in Education 1986 also envisages among other things eradication of illiteracy and universalisation of primary education. Hence the Government of India Ministry of Human Resources Development has decided to conduct survey in the schools education area covering same very important aspects such as schooling facilities for children and their accessibility particularly in rural areas. The date of reference to this survey was September 30, 1986.

Fifth All India Educational survey

As ordered in G.O.Ms.No.8 (Education department) dt. 2.1.87 the fifth All India Educational survey was conducted in Tamil Nadu from February 1987 to November'87. Mr. E. Mohamed Hanipa B.Sc., B.T., was appointed as District Educational Survey officer for this district. He took charge as District Educational survey officer on 12th February 1987. All the Deputy Inspectors of schools were given training at a first phase on 11.5.87 and 12.5.87 in Government High school Tirunelveli in order to the village information forms and school information forms at block levels. Heads of secondary

and Higher secondary schools had also been given training for two days at three centres Valliyur, Tenkasi and Tirunelveliy as to the preparation of villages information forms and school information forms. The Deputy Inspectors of schools in turn gage training in the preparation of the said two forms for two days to the Headmasters of the primary and Middles schools.

The second phase training for the Block survey officers (i.e) Deputy Inspectors of schools for filling up the Block level forms was conducted from 10.9.87 to 16.9.87 at Theerthapathy Higher secondary school Ambasamudram Block Tables from No. 1 to 128 were distributed to them. These tables were prepared by the Deputy Inspectors of schools with the help of school information forms and village information forms.

The village information forms have informations relating to population schooling and other educational facilities in the village they have the materials from the census data of 1986 and information from the village officers. The Block Development officers have also helped to fill up the questionaires 1-9. The V.I.F. has 15 items and the urban information form has 11 items to be filled in which pertains to population school age children, recognised schooling facilities non formal and adult education available in each village. These forms were filled up by the headmasters of the primary upper primary secondary Higher secondary schools pertaining to each village. If there are more schools the Headmaster of the school having the highest standard was entrusted with this work.

School Information forms : All the headmasters of primary upper primary secondary and Higher secondary schools were entrusted with this work to fill up the S.I.F. which has 46 items regarding the type of school enrolment teachers and their qualifications building play grounds, library, book bank, noon meals programme etc.

Survey work: The forms filled by the headmasters were verified and checked by the Deputy Inspectors of schools at block level and consolidated into Block Tables from Nos. 1-128 A Block map and a report were prepared by them and submitted to the District Educational survey officer for District consolidation and preparation of District Tables numbering 160.

Chapter II

primary Education2-1 No. of habitation served with primary schools/sections

There are 1843 habitations in rural area in this district Educational facilities at the primary school level are available for 1734 rural habitations with a total population of 16,47,167. This forms 91.5% of the total population of these 1328 habitations with a total population of 15,32,205 have primary sections within the habitation limit itself and 406 habitations with a total population of 1,14,962 have primary sections within a kilometre reach.

Among the 19 blocks in the district represented (100%) habitations of palayamkottai, shecottah, Tenkasi and kilapavoor blocks are served with primary education only 75.5% of the habitations in Kadayanallur block are served by primary sections. A statement showing the facilities for primary sections in rural habitations is given below.

109 habitations are not served with primary sections of these 50 habitations have been included in the proposals for new primary schools. Radapuram and kadayanallur there are 13 proposals for each of and there are similar proposals for the other 11 blocks numbering less than 5. If new primary schools are opened in the proposed habitations 97% of the total habitations will have facilities for primary education.

2-2 Educational facilities in scheduled castes and scheduled Tribes populated villages

Schedulei castes: Out of 536 inhabited villages 35 villages have no Schedule caste population. 457 villages have below 50% Schedulei caste population and 44 villages have more than 50% Schedulei caste population. Out of 50% schedule caste populated villages habitations have primary sections.

Scheduled Tribes: 400 villages have no S.T. population

66 villages have below 25% S.T. and 63 villages among them have primary Education facilities. One village having 26-50%

Scheduled Tribes population has primary Education Facility. Only one village has more than 75% S.T. population with has not primary Education Facility.

2.3 Number of primary Schools:

There are 1322 independent primary schools in the rural areas of this district 294 upper primary schools one secondary school and one Higher secondary school have primary sections. In the rural area there are 581 Government primary schools 740 private aided schools and one unaided school.

There are 236 independent primary schools in urban area of them 38 are run by Government 48 by local bodies and 150 by private aided agencies. In addition to upper primary schools 6 Secondary schools and one Higher secondary school have primary sections also.

2.4 Building facility: Out of 1322 rural primary school 1110 have pucca building 137 have partly pucca building and 75 schools have thatched building. In urban area 210 schools have pucca building 8 have partly pucca and 18 have thatched building 6% of the rural schools have thatched buildings and 2% of the urban schools have thatched buildings.

2.5 Instructional rooms: All primary schools in rural and urban areas have instructional rooms 276 rural primary schools and 53 urban schools have only one instructional room 237 rural schools and 78 urban schools have more than five instructional rooms.

2.6 Additional rooms required: Out of 1322 rural primary schools 199 Government schools and 224 private unaided schools need additional rooms of which 9 need five and nine rooms 64 need four rooms 54 need three rooms.

In urban area 17 Government schools 10 Local body schools and 40 private aided schools require additional rooms of which 18 need 5 and above rooms 6 need 4 four and above rooms 9 need three rooms.

2.7 Black Boards: Out of 8411 sections of rural primary schools 491 have no black boards 263 have unusable black boards 7557 sections have usable black boards.

In urban primary schools out of 2299 sections 2244 have usable black boards 33 have unusable black boards and 22 have no black boards. 91% of the rural primary sections and 97.5% of the urban primary sections have usable black boards.

The blocks Nanguneri, Vasudevanallur and Palayamkottai have more than 30 sections without black boards and all the other blocks having 20 to 30 sections are without such facilities. Therefore all the blocks need black boards. But the urban schools in outside the block development area have black boards in all primary sections.

2.9 Teachers in position: Out of 1553 primary schools in the district 523 have five and more teachers 54 are single teachers schools and 419 are double teachers schools. There is no school without a teacher. Nanguneri block has 12 single teachers schools Manur and Kuruvikulam have 7 each and Ambasamudram and Sankarankovil 5 each. There is no single teacher schools in Kadayan Kadayanallur and Cherenmahadevi blocks.

2.10 Qualification of Teachers: There are 4701 primary teachers in rural schools. Among them 2778 are males and 1923 are females. All the teachers are qualified and trained. 42 males graduates and 6 female graduates, 7 male post graduates and 3 female post graduates are working in primary level in rural areas.

In urban primary schools there are 672 male teachers and 1000 female teachers in position. Out of which 10 are graduates and 2 are post graduates.

In rural primary schools 40% of the total teachers are females and in urban 60% are female teachers. Males are more in rural and urban areas who possess higher qualifications.

2-11 Enrolment at primary stage: As on 30.9.86 the enrolment in the stds I-V in rural area is 150425 boys 129564 girls out of them 33758 boys 28821 girls belong the schedule castes. 131 boys 133 girls are scheduled tribes. In urban area the enrolment of the std I-V is 48726 boys 43438 girls out of them 7716 boys 6511 girls are scheduled castes and 29 boys 32 girls are scheduled tribes.

100% of boys has been enrolled at primary level in this district 97% girl students have been enrolled in rural areas and 100% in urban areas.

Pupil teachers Ratio : The pupils teachers ratio works out 40:1 in rural areas and 45:1 in urban towns at primary Level.

Chapter -III

Upper primary Education3-1 No. of habitations served with upper primary schools/sections

1577 rural habitations with a population of 15,26,029 are served with upper primary sections. This is 91% to the total population. A statement showing the facilities for upper primary education in rural areas is given below.

101 habitations with a population of 90045 have been included in the proposal for new upper primary schools. 100% habitations of palayamkottai, Tenkasi and shencottah blocks are served with upper primary schools. These proposals relate to increase the percentage of 85.5% to 97%. 91%

Out of 536 villages in the District 531 have S.C. population out of them 481 villages have upper primary sections. Out of 68 S.T. populated villages 49 have upper primary facilities.

3-2 Number of upper primary schools/sections

There are 299 upper primary schools in rural area and 64 schools in urban area. 11 secondary schools and Higher Secondary schools are attached with upper primary classes in rural area secondary schools and Higher secondary schools are attached with upper primary classes in urban area. The above particulars are given in table 8.

3-3 Buildings: Out of 363 upper primary schools in this district 254 rural schools and 52 urban schools have pucca buildings. 85% of the schools have pucca buildings; 12% have partly pucca buildings and 3% of the schools have thatched buildings. Block wise and management wise schools according to type of buildings are given in a form of statement. (Table 8 & 10)

3-4 Library: All the 299 upper primary schools in rural area are have libraries. In urban area 60 schools out 64 have libraries. 245 schools libraries have dictionaries 58% of the total schools are subscribing to news papers and 70% of the schools have book banks.

3-6 Teachers in position: 1902 male teachers and 1519 female teachers are working in 299 rural upper primary schools of them 123 males and 50 females are graduates. 23 males and 8 females are post graduates. 739 male teachers and 805 females teachers are working in urban schools of them 55 males and 30 females are graduates. 3 males and 4 females are post graduates. The percentage of female teachers is more in urban schools. The percentage of graduates and post graduates teachers in rural schools is 6% and it is 7% in urban schools. A statement showing the number of teachers and their qualifications is given in Table 17.

3-7 Enrolment in upper primary classes: The total enrolment in rural upper primary classes (VI-VIII) is 81434 and in urban schools it is 38,277. The enrolment of S.C. in rural area is 22% to the total enrolment and S.T. is 0.2%. In urban area S.C. enrolment is 17% and S.T. enrolment is 0.03% class wise enrolment is as follows.

3-8 pupil teacher Ratio: pupil teacher ratio in rural areas is 25:1 and in urban 36:1. The percentage of girls enrolment in rural areas is 38%, in urban areas 41% and in the district ~~xxx~~ 39.1%

Chapter-IV

Secondary and Higher Secondary Education4-1 Habitations in rural area with secondary and Higher secondary Education stage.

1734 habitations with a total population of 15,09,358 are served with secondary Education stages. This forms 96% to the total rural population. 109 habitations with a total population of 36,564 are not served with secondary Education stage. This works out to only 4%. The above particulars are given below.

4-2 No. of schools: There are 72 secondary schools in rural areas and 19 schools in urban areas. 40 Higher secondary schools in rural areas and 43 Higher secondary schools in urban areas are attached with secondary classes. 5 schools in rural areas and 5 schools in urban areas are only exclusively for girls. 3 schools in urban areas are only for boys. others co. Educational Institutions.

There are 40 Higher Secondary schools in rural areas and 43 schools in the urban areas. One Higher secondary school in rural area and 13 in urban areas are for boys only. 15 Higher Secondary schools in urban are only exclusively for girls. There is no separate Higher secondary school for Girls in rural areas.

4-3 Library facilities: All Secondary and Higher secondary schools have libraries. All schools in urban areas are subscribing to news papers but in rural areas 16 secondary schools and 4 higher secondary schools are not subscribing for news papers.

4-4 Teachers in Secondary schools: 640 male teachers and 241 female teachers are employed in rural secondary schools. 364 teachers are employed in urban schools of them 164 are males 200 are females.

1025 male teachers and 619 female teachers are employed in rural Higher secondary schools 925 male teachers and 576 female teachers are employed in urban Higher secondary schools.

4-5 Science Laboratories in Secondary schools:

Out of 72 Secondary schools in rural areas 5 schools have separate Lab for physics, chemistry and biology. 26 schools have no laboratories out of schools in urban areas 3 have separate labs and 16 have combined labs.

4-6 Laboratories in Higher secondary schools: All the Higher Secondary schools in rural and urban areas offer science subjects and all schools have laboratories Out of 83 schools in the District 38 have separate labs and 45 have combined labs 7 schools offer home science and they also have labs.

4-7 Science teaching in Secondary Schools:

762 teachers are teaching science in this district of them one teacher is M. Phil, 195 teachers are M. Sc. and others are B. Sc. with training qualifications.

4-8 Science teaching in Higher Secondary schools:

There are 261 Science teachers in Higher Secondary schools in this district. Among them 193 teachers are M. Sc. degree holders others are B. Sc degree holders. All are trained teachers.

4-9 Enrolment: As on 30.9.86 the total enrolment in Secondary Classes is 18692 in rural areas. Of them 25% are S.C. and 0.3% are S.T. In urban schools the total enrolment is 18,800. Of them 18% are S.C. and 0.1% are S.T.

The total number of enrolment in Higher Secondary classes in rural areas is 6966 and in urban areas it is 9462. The S.C. enrolment in rural area is 1569 and in urban it is 1051. S.T. enrolment in rural area is 17. There is no S.T. enrolment in urban area schools. Girls enrolment in rural area is 35% and in urban area is 38%

The above statement shows that all the Local Body and private unaided secondary schools are having 100% Ancillary facilities. Private unaided Higher secondary schools also having 100% Ancillary facilities.

4-11 Physical Education teachers: All the Secondary and Higher

Secondary schools in this district have physical Education Teachers. There are 80 physical education certificate holders and 16 Diploma holders in secondary school. 162 certificate holders and 39 diploma holders are working in higher secondary schools.

4-13 Vocational courses: Regarding vocational courses Audit and

Accountancy, Secretaryship and office management, Engineering Electrical, Agriculture, Nursing and midwife, weaving, Typewriting and Teacher Training are offered in the Higher Secondary schools. 20 schools have workshops for the courses. As on 30.9.86. 618 students are given vocational Training in XI std and 491 in std XII.

Chapter-V

Other Educational Facilities

5-1 Nonformal Education: 7 villages in this District are served with Non-formal Education centres at primary level and are village is served with upper primary level a rural area. There is no Non formal Education centre in urban areas. 96 boys and 149 girls are enrolled at primary level and 37 boys and 26 girls are enrolled at upper primary level.

5-2 Adult Education centres: There are 166 Adult Education centres in 91 rural areas and 162 centres in 3 urban towns. Out 166 rural centres 18 for men, 137 ~~and~~ for women and 11 for both men and women. Out 162 urban centres 5 ~~are~~ for men 7 for women and 150 for both. Total enrolment in rural area is 1273 men and 8654 women and in urban 106 men and 256 women.

5-3 Special schools: There is a school for blind and two schools for deaf and dumb in this district.

5-4 preprimary facilities: Out of 536 rural villages 281 villages have Balawadis, 14 villages have independent pre primary schools and 5 villages have pre primary stage attached with schools. There are 434 Balawadis. 28 independent preprimary schools 5 centres are preprimary attached schools.

In urban areas 10 towns are served with 114 Balawadi centres, 3 towns are served with 10 independent preprimary schools and 3 towns are served with preprimary attached schools.

Chapter- VI

Conclusion

Existing Educational Facilities:

Primary Education : There are 19 block development areas in this district consisting of 1843 habitations 1734 habitations are served with the existing primary schools. proposals have been enuminated open new schools in 50 habitations. All the urban areas have primary schools.

Upper primary Education: 1577 habitations are served with upper primary sections. 236 habitations are left unserved. At present proposals have been made to open new upper primary schools in 101 habitations.

Secondary Education: A total of 1734 habitations are served into secondary education facilities. But 109 habitation are left unserved. There are 10 girls secondary schools in this district.

Higher Secondary Education: 1462 habitations are served with Higher secondary schools. 371 habitations are left unserved. 15 schools in this district are servei exclusively for girls.

The findings of the Fifth All India Educational survey shows that the following points are to be given more importance in the near feature to improve the quality and quantity of Education in this district.

1. Physical improvements like buildings, furniture for pupils and teachers urinal and lavatory are to be made especially in primary schools.

2. Teachers may be appointed considering the pupil teachers ratio as 1:25. More over every primary school having 5 standards may be allotted minimum of 5 teachers to handle each standard. So that they may teach the cover the whole syllabus if the classes fully.

3. priority may be given for the following blocks in improving the primary school facilities.

1. Ambasamudram
2. Kadayan
3. Kalakadu
