

GOVERNMENT OF ORISSA POLITICAL AND SERVICES (PLANNING) DEPARTMENT AUGUST 1957

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This publication is intended to show the direct and indirect benefits which will flow to the various districts of the Orissa State under the Second Five-Year Plan. The total outlay on the State Plan is Rs. 99.97 crores including Hirakud and Delta Irrigation. Besides, a programme of the order of Rs. 16.91 crores will be taken up in this State as part of the Centrally Sponsored Programme. The schemes included in the Plan can be broadly classified as (1) Schemes of a general nature benefiting the entire State, and (2) Schemes of local importance or benefit which are planned for execution at the district level or below. The total expenditure on State Plan schemes under the category (1), namely, General Schemes at the State level is estimated at Rs. 47.4 crores and that in resp²ct of category (2), namely, District Schemes, at Rs. 52.5 crores for the Five-Year Period, 1956—61.

Districtwise break-up has been attempted within the broad frame work of programmes projected under the State's Second Five-Year Plan. The break-up in regard to Community Projects and National Extension Service has been based on the assumption that the total provision of Rs. 16.22 crores will be available for these programme although the present Plan provision for the programme is Rs. 5.98 crores. With regard to programmes for Village and Small Industries, funds are made available by the All-Inda Khadi and Village Industries Commission to the State Board from year to year. The districtwise break-up for this Sector will therefore remain flexible.

On account of difficulties in obtaining foreign exchange and due to shortage of suitable technical personnel it may become necessary to modify and adjust the programmes periodically. It may be necessary to divert funds and available resources to fresh schemes promising quicker returns.

The districtwise break-up shown in this publication is, therefore, indicative of broad outline of programmes proposed to be undertaken in the various districts of the State and should to this extent be treated as tentative.

Schemes which will be taken up in the State under the programmes sponsored by the Centre outside the State Plan are also shown separately in Part III of this publication indicating, wherever possible, the distribution of provision and physical targets smong the various districts.
