PERSONS IN LAKHS

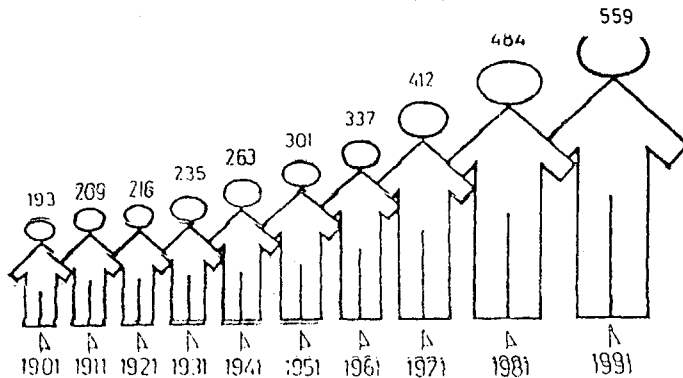

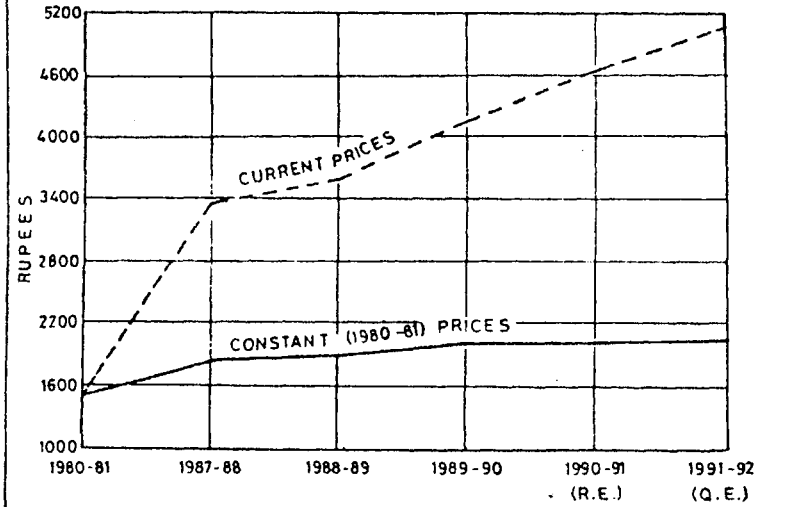

NET STATE DOMESTIC PRODUCT TAMIL NADU

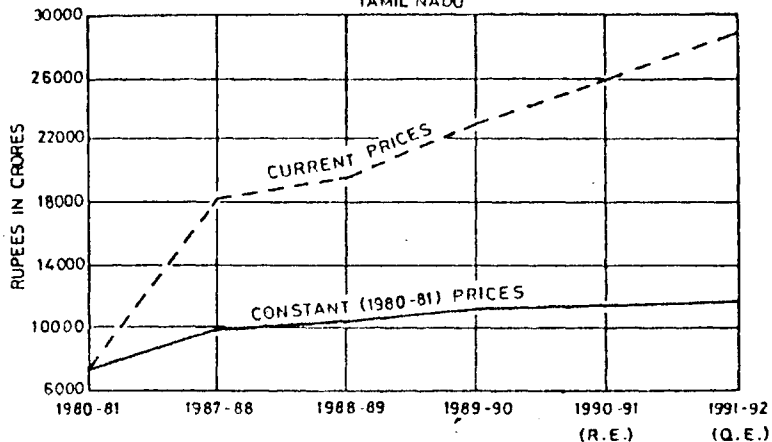

TAMIL NADU - 1992-93

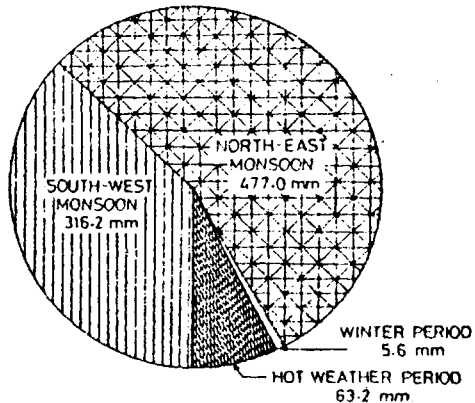

HECTARES IN LAKHS

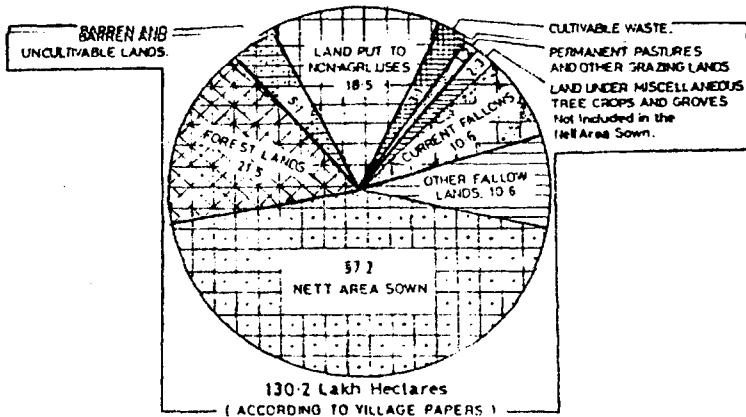

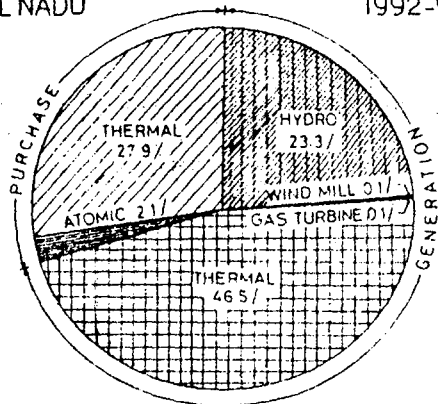

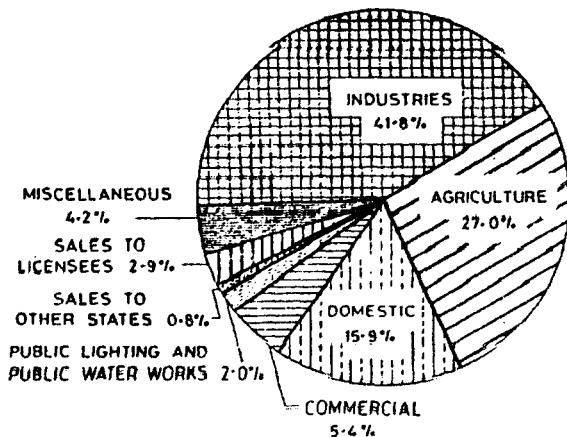

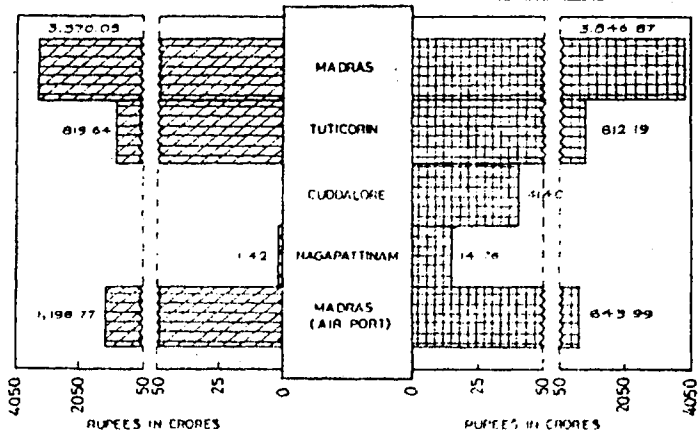

FOREIGN TRADE TAMIL NADU - 1991-92 (QUANTITY IN TONNES)

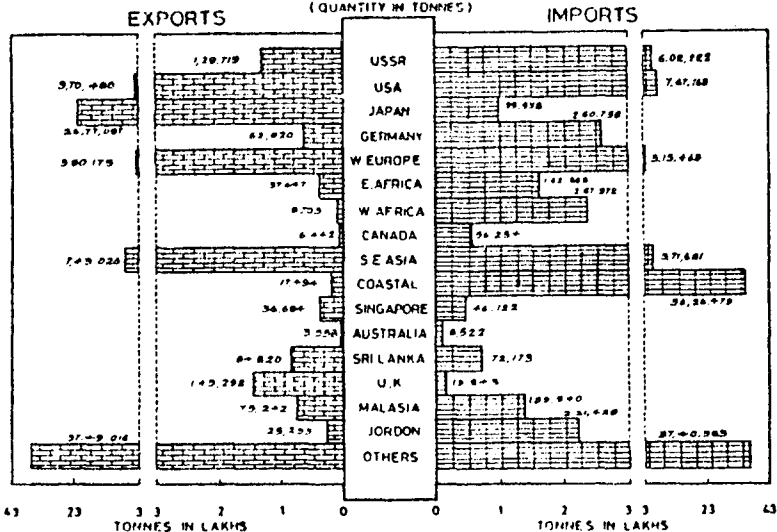
