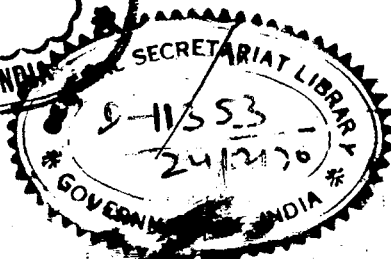
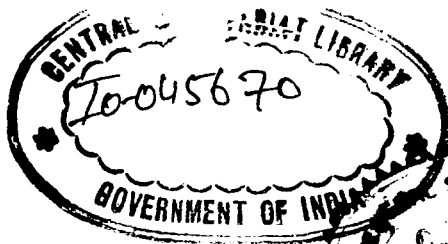

SOME FACTS ABOUT ANDAMAN AND NICOBAR ISLANDS

1. (a) Geographically, the Andaman and Nicobar Islands are situated between the 6th and 14th parallels of north latitude and between the 92° and 94° of east longitudes in the Bay of Bengal.
- (b) The islands consist of two separate groups with the 10 degree channel separating the two. Andamans cover an area of 2,580 Sq. miles and the Nicobars 635 Sq. miles.
- (c) The climate is tropical, warm but tempered by pleasant sea breezes. The actual rainfall recorded during 1964 was 130.86 inches—an increase of 7.53 inches from the average rainfall.
- (d) According to the final results of 1961 census:—
 - (i) The population of these islands has increased from 30,971 in 1951 to 63,548 in 1961, showing an increase of 105 per cent.
 - (ii) The density of population is 7.7 per square kilometre.
 - (iii) The population consists of 31,194 workers and 32,354 non-workers
 - (iv) The male population has increased from 19,055 in 1951 to 39,304 in 1961 while the female population increased from 11,916 in 1951 to 24,244 in 1961.
 - (v) The population of Port Blair town has increased from 8,014 in 1951 to 14,075 in 1961, showing an increase of 75.6 per cent.
2. Forests cover 5,966 Sq. Km. or 72 per cent of the total land area.
3. The area under paddy has increased from 4,000 acres in 1949-50 to 16,991 acres in 1964-65, registering an increase of 424.8 per cent.
4. Out of 31,194 workers, 20.7% are cultivators and only 1.1 per cent are agricultural labourers according to 1961 census.
5. The number of Schools has increased from 84 in 1960-61 to 121 in 1963-64.
6. The number of Scholars studying in the educational institutions has increased from 1,692 in 1949-50 to 8,833 in 1963-64, the number of girl students having increased from 406 to 3,185 respectively.
7. The per capita expenditure on students has risen from Rs. 64 in 1951-52 to Rs. 252 in 1963-64, the total annual expenditure being Rs. 1.25 lakhs and Rs. 22.25 lakhs respectively.
8. The percentage of literacy is 33.6 in 1961 as against 25.1 in 1951.
9. The literacy in Urban area has increased from 46 per cent to 50 per cent while in the rural area it has increased from 18 per cent in 1951 to 29 per cent in 1961.
10. The number of hospitals and dispensaries has increased from 5 and 9 in 1950 to 9 and 36 in 1964 respectively.

11. The area served by either a hospital or a dispensary is 71 Sq. miles whereas in 1950 it was 230 Sq. miles. For every 1,622 persons there is a hospital or a dispensary as compared to that of 2,142 in 1950.
 12. The expenditure on medical relief and public health has increased from Rs. 5.32 lakhs in 1949-50 to Rs. 13.35 lakhs in 1964-65, per capita expenditure having increased from Rs. 17.7 to 22.4 during this period.
 13. The number of veterinary dispensaries and outposts has increased from 6 in 1953 to 16 as on 31st March, 1965.
 14. The average monthly consumption of electricity has increased from 18,258 in 1952 to 1,27,464 K.W.H. in 1964.
 15. 149 Metric tonnes of fish worth Rs. 2.24 lakhs were landed during 1964 as compared to 43 metric tonnes worth Rs. 0.58 lakhs in 1950.
 16. The total revenue receipts have increased from Rs. 71.62 lakhs in 1948-49 to Rs. 217.74 lakhs in 1964-65, the expenditure having increased from Rs. 105.18 lakhs in 1948-49 to Rs. 518.81 lakhs in 1964-65.
 17. Per capita revenue receipts have increased from Rs. 239 in 1948-49 to Rs. 298 in 1964-65.
 18. The total outlay of the Third Five Year Plan is Rs. 979.320 lakhs as against Rs. 603.135 lakhs of the Second Five Year Plan.

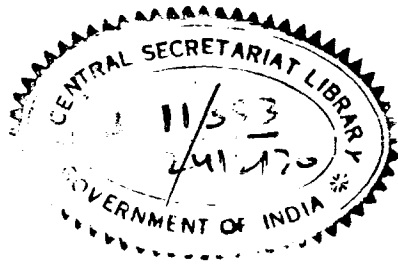

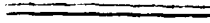
