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Annual Work Plan and Budget of Mid Day Meal for the year 2014-15

1. INTRODUCTION :-

1.1 <u>Brief history, objectives and rationale of the Mid Day Meal</u> <u>Programme</u>.

(1) <u>Brief History</u>:

- ▶ The National Programme of Nutritional Support to Primary Education (NPNSPE), popularly called Mid-Day-Meal Scheme was launched on 15th August, 1995, with the twin objectives of :-
- **x** Boosting Universalization of elementary education by increasing enrolment, retention and attendance.
- Simultaneously impacting on Nutritional status of children studying in I-V and VI - VIII classes.
- Under this scheme, un-cooked Food Grains (RICE) @ 3kg per month per student, were being distributed to the children of classes I to V, with 80 % attendance for 10 academic months of the year, in all the Govt./Primary Schools and EGS centers under SSA of the entire state, till May, 2003.
- The hot cooked meal programme was launched / introduced in the State in the phased manner. In the first phase, all the schools of Schedule (Tribal) Areas of the State were covered w.e.f. 22nd May, 2003. In the second phase, the scheme was extended to non-tribal areas of the State w.e.f. 1st September, 2004 in which all the remaining Government and Government Aided primary schools were covered.
- The scheme has been extended to Upper primary stage to cover all the students (classes VI to VIII) of all the middle units of Govt. Middle /High / Senior Secondary Schools of the state w.e.f. 1** July, 2008.



(II) Rationale :-

Primary Schools & Upper Primary Schools

- In Himachal Pradesh, the Mid Day Meal Scheme is being implemented in all the 10694 Govt./ EGS Centers of the state covering 364957 children and 4503 Govt.
 Middle units covering 260537 students .
- ► The programme is being implemented by the School Management Committees (SMCs).
- ► The School Management Committees have been constituted in every school and authorized to decide the weekly menu to be served in the school keeping in view of the choice and liking of the children of the area, in order to make the meal more acceptable.
- ▶ Under this Scheme, the conversion / cooking cost approved in respect of primary stage was @ Rs. 3.34 per child per school day for the year 2013-14, out of which Rs. 2.51 is borne by the GOI and Rs. 0.83 is being borne by the State Government.
- The Conversion / Cooking Cost approved in respect of upper primary stage was
 @ Rs. 5.00 per child per school day for the year 2013.14. Out of which, Rs. 3.75 is borne by GOI and remaining Rs. 1.25 is being borne by the State.
- ► Cost of rice is borne by Govt. of India . Further, the GOI also reimburses the transportation cost of rice from FCI depot to respective school premises at the rates prevalent under PDS system. Other ingredients are being procured locally at school level.
- The cook-cum-helper (MDM Worker) engaged under this scheme is being paid honorarium of Rs. 1000/- per month for ten academic months. The cook-cumhelper is engaged as per norms prescribed by the Government of India i.e. 1-25 students =one cook-cum-helper, 26-100=Two cook-cum-helpers, and onwards for every addition of 100 students, one additional cook-cum-helper has been allowed to be engaged.



- In order to make the school environment, healthy and pollution free and in the interest of environmental protection, less polluting fuels have been encouraged by the state. With this objective, gas based cooking has been preferred in schools, wherever possible and each school has been asked to procure gas connection / gas stove.
- ► Further, in order to ensure the monitoring of the MDM Scheme, the Steering-Cum-Monitoring Committees at State, District and Block level have been constituted. Besides this, School Management Committees at School Level have also been constituted.

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


1.2 Management Structure

Present Management Structure under MDMS:


The MDM scheme is being implemented by the Department of Elementary Education in the State.

- ▶ The Director Elementary Education is the administrative Head of the Department.
- The Deputy Director (Elementary Education) is the administrative head at the district level. The Deputy Director is supported by a Block Elementary Education Officer (BEEO) at the Education block level. Himachal Pradesh has 124 Educational Blocks.





Proposed Management Structure :




Proposed management structure of the scheme is as under



1.3 Process of Plan Formulation

The Mid Day Meal Scheme is being implemented in all the Primary and Middle units of Middle /High /Sr.Sec. schools in the State of Himachal Pradesh. The flow of information for plan formulation starts from the school level . The school sends the proposal to Block offices. The Block office consolidates /scrutinizes the proposal and sends to Deputy Director Office at District level, who after compilation / scrutinizing prepare the plan from the current financial year and forwards it to Directorate of Elementary Education. The proposal received from concerned districts are compiled / scrutinized as per norms prescribed by Government of India and is then sent to the State Government for approval in State level Steering-cum- Monitoring Committee (SL- SMC). After approving the plan, the State Government forwards the same to Government of India appraisal.



Plan is formulated on the basis of School data

- Number of Government primary schools/ EGS Centers/ NRBC and upper primary schools (Middle units of High/Sr.Sec. schools)
- Enrolment
- School days
- Cook-cum-helpers engaged in the school.
- Norms prescribed by the GOI in respect of Food, cooking cost, cost of foodgrains, honorarium & freight rates.



2. <u>Description and assessment of the programme implemented in the</u> <u>current Year (2013-14) and proposal for next year (2014-15) with</u> <u>reference to:</u>

Calorific / Protein Value of the Mid Day Meal Provided.

- Under the MDM scheme, mid-day meal, is being served to all the students of Primary(class I- V) and Upper Primary (VI- VIII) units of Middle / High/ Sr. Secondary Schools on all the school days.
- The SMC of the school is empowered to decide the weekly menu to be served in the school keeping in view the choice and liking of the children of the area.
- ► The scale of different ingredients with Standard Protein & Calorie Content included in the Menu, in r/o per student per day and the item wise Average Calorie & Protein Content as per Standard Chart, for Primary & Upper primary stage is given as under :-

SMCs are advised that ingredients used for the preparation of Mid-Day Meal should preferably be purchased from the local farmers. Purchase of vegetables & other ingredients from the local farmers would not only cost less but also add fresh produce to the menu.

ESTIMATED AVERAGE PER CHILD PER DAY CONVERSION COST FOR PRIMARY & UPPER PRIMARY SCHOOLS FOR THE YEAR 2014-15:-

The Government of India vide letter no. F.No.9-1/2014 -MDM-2-1 dated 17.12.2013 directed that cooking cost be revised/ enhanced by 7.5% for the year 2014-15. Accordingly, the proposed cooking cost for the year 2014-15 in respect of primary and upper primary stages is as under:

- The recommended food norms as mentioned in the table no "2.-A" and "2.-B"
 " in respect of Primary and Upper Primary Stages will remain same.
- Cooking cost includes cost of pulses, vegetables, cooking oil, condiments and fuel.

2.1 <u>Regularity and wholesomeness of mid day meals served to children</u> ; reasons for programme interruptions, if any and planning to minimize them.

- Under the MDM scheme, Hot Cooked Meal of high calorific value and protein content, is regularly being served on all the school days to all the students of Primary and Upper Primary Stage of Middle / High/ Sr. Secondary Schools in the school premises.
- ► The Govt. of HP is making every effort to make the meal served more wholesome, more nutritious, more varied.
- ▶ The School Management Committees have been authorized to decide the weekly menu to be served in the school keeping in view the choice and liking of the children of the area, in order to make the meal more acceptable.
- School Management Committees have also been authorized to purchase the ingredients (other than rice) at the school level.
- The schools have also been directed to ensure that the menu as approved by the School committee is displayed on the Notice Board of the school and to see that the cooking / distribution of meal is strictly, as per the displayed menu.




2.2 <u>Coverage of Children of NCLP schools as per upper primary norms.</u> <u>NCLP schools are primary schools but eligible for benefit as per</u> <u>upper primary norms.</u>

No NCLP school is functioning in the State.

2.3 <u>Food-grains management, including adequacy of allocation,</u> <u>timeliness of lifting, transportation and distribution and</u> <u>suitability of storage at different levels. Challenges faced and plans</u> <u>to over come them.</u>

- ▶ The consolidated annual demand of food-grains is projected on the basis of average number of beneficiaries of the first three quarters of previous year in r/o Govt. Primary (class I-V) and Upper Primary (class VI-VIII) Schools, in the respective prescribed formats to GOI. Accordingly Government of India approves and makes the necessary allocations for the next financial year, @ 100 gram per child per school day for classes I-V, and @ 150 gram per child per school day for classes VI-VIII, on the basis of the average enrollment.
- ▶ GOI provides rice at the FCI distribution Centre. The rice is lifted by the Nodal Transport Agency of the state i.e. Himachal Pradesh State Civil Supplies Corporation (HPSCSC) from FCI distribution Centers and is made available at the PDS depot/ FPS, on the authorization from the respective Deputy Commissioners of different districts. The rice is lifted by SMCs of the school from the PDS for which transportation charges are paid to them.
- ▶ GOI has sanctioned 14959 kitchen-cum stores. Besides, 88 kitchen-cum-stores have been sanctioned in convergence with SSA.
- Storage bins are being provided for proper storage of food grains and ingredients.

Challenges faced and plans to over come them

- Timely supply of rice to the schools / Institutions is main challenge / hurdle in the implementation of the scheme. Due to topographic& climatic conditions, supply of the rice from FCI to school premises takes considerable time.
- To ensure the timely supply and maintenance of buffer stock at the school level, the instructions have been issued to field/ district offices that allocation of rice be made on the quarterly basis. This will considerably curtail the time taken by nodal transportation agency for lifting of rice from FCI godown and making available at PDS depots.
- In case of any delay in lifting the rice, the matter is taken up with the concerned authorities immediately i.e. FCI / HPSCSC.

2.4 <u>System for payment of cost of food grains to FCI. Status of</u> pending bills of FCI of the previous year.

The Government of India vide letter no. F.1-15/2009-Desk(MDM) dated 10.2.2010 has revised guidelines regarding the payment of cost of foodgrains. As per revised guidelines, "The foodgrain is to be supplied by the Government of India through Food Corporation of India. The payment of cost of foodgrains is to be made by the State Government to the Food corporation of India whereas previously, the payment of the cost of foodgrains had been made /released by the Government of India directly to the FCI."

" The FCI will raise the bills pertaining to the supply of foodgrains during a month to a district administration by the 10th day of the next month in the prescribed format and the district administration will ensure payment with in 20 days."

The claims are raised by the FCI for lifted rice from FCI godowns and are being got verified from the districts, then the payment of cost of rice is released to the FCI.

No claim pertaining to the previous year i.e 2012 -13 is lying pending with the State / Department. State has cleared bills raised by FCI upto January, 2014.




2.5 <u>System for release of funds provided under MDM (Central and State) Please indicate the dates when the funds was released to State Authority / Directorate / District /Block/Gram Panchyat and finally to the cooking Agency / School.</u>

- Centre Share : The GOI releases its share directly to the State, for which, the required Financial /Administrative Expenditure Sanction is accorded by the State. Only after that the State Nodal Agency i.e. Department of Elementary Education, releases the budget to its drawing disbursing officers i.e. Block Elementary Education Officers (BEEOs). The Department has given full powers to the Drawing and Disbursing officers (BEEOs) for the purposes of Mid Day Meal Scheme. At the school level the expenditure is incurred by the School Management Committee. The state has made budget provision for the central share in the state budget for the year 2014-15.
- State share : The State makes provision in the State budget in respect of state share and is placed at the disposal of Director Elementary Education. The Director Elementary Education releases funds to the Block Elementary Education Officer (BEEOs) . The BEEOs further release funds to concerned school / SMC.
- ► The budget is being distributed through internet (e-vitran, web application developed by the State). The field offices receive the budget within a day. This process saves time and manpower considerably. This also ensures the transparency in allocating the funds.

a) <u>The date-wise detail of release of funds</u> to Blocks:

2.7 System and mode of payment of honorarium to Cook-cum-helpers and implementing agencies viz. NGOs/SHGs/Trust/Centralised kitchens etc.:

► The GOI vide its letter dt. 24.11.2009 has made separate provision for payment of honorarium to cook cum helper @ Rs. 1000/- per month for ten months w.e.f.1.12.2009. The expenditure on honorarium is also being shared between the Centre and State in the ratio of 75:25.



The State of HP has implemented this decision w.e.f. 1.02.2010. The funds/ budget is allocated to BEEOs, on the basis of number of cook-cum-helper engaged in the block. The BEEO further releases funds to the concerned SMCs/ in the bank account of cook-cum-helper in approximately 60% schools.

2.8 <u>System for procuring cooking ingredients (pulses, vegetables</u> <u>including leafy one ,salt, condiments, oil, & fuel etc.),</u> <u>Commodities, which are centrally purchased and supplied to</u> <u>schools or locally purchased at school level .</u>

System for procuring cooking ingredients (fuel, condiments, oil, etc.)

- Rice is made available free of cost to the State by Govt. Of India
- The state has authorized the School Management Committees (SMC) to procure all the other provisions / ingredients. The cooking ingredients are purchased by the SMCs at the school level.
- ▶ No commodity is being purchased centrally and supplied to schools in the State.

2.9 <u>System for Cooking Serving & Supervising Mid Day Meals in School</u> and measures to prevent any untoward happening: -

Under cooked Mid Day Meal Programme in the state of Himachal Pradesh, the meal is being cooked & served in the school premises.

The meal is cooked & served by the Cook-cum-helpers engaged under the programme.

The cooked meal is served in every school under the supervision of teachers/ SMC members.

Apart from above, mothers have also been mobilized to supervise the preparation and serving of mid day meal.

Mothers are encouraged to see that :

- Ingredient used for cooking i.e. pulses , vegetables , rice , spices are of good quality and properly cleaned before cooking.
- The utensils used for cooking are being cleaned properly before use.
- The food is being tasted by the teacher and mothers before serving to the students.
- Clean and adequate drinking water is available.
- Clean water is being used for preparation of food.
- Children are encouraged to wash hands before eating.

Measures To Prevent Any Untoward Happening:

No untoward incident has come into the notice of the department. Following measures have been taken to prevent untoward happenings:



- Instructions have been issued for installation of fire extinguishers in the schools and also train the staff in this regard.
- The school buildings are to be kept free from inflammable & toxic material, if inevitable ,material be stored safely.
- The teachers and mothers may test/ taste the meals before serving to the children.
- The concerned institutions have also been instructed to clean the water tank periodically.
- Instructions have been issued to construct the kitchen-cum-store at safe distance from the school.

2.10 Procedure and status of construction of kitchen-cum-store :

The work of construction of said kitchen sheds has been assigned to the engineering wing of SSA. The GOI has already sanctioned 14959 kitchen shed upto 2013-14 besides this 88 kitchen shed has been constructed with convergence of SSA. Status may kindly be perused at Table- AT-11. Out of sanctioned kitchen -cum-store 14959, 13303 has been constructed, 1195 are in progress and 461 have not been started due to non availability of land / schools running in rented or rent-free accommodation. However separate room is used as kitchen in the available accommodation of the schools. There is no requirement of funds for 2014-15 for the kitchen-cum-store in new schools as there is an inbuilt provision under SSA to construct kitchen-cum-store in the new schools.

2.11 <u>Procedure of procurement of kitchen devices from (i) funds</u> released under the Mid Day Meal Programme (ii) other sources:

In the state of Himachal Pradesh the School Committees have been authorized to purchase the kitchen devices as per requirement of the school.

Funds released under the Mid Day Meal Programme:-

The Government of India releases funds for the procurement of kitchen devices @ Rs. 5000/- per institution. The funds are transferred / allocated to concerned School through Block Offices. The school committee purchases kitchen devices as per their requirement. Status of funds released by GOI is attached at Table- AT-12. The funds released by Govt. of India during the year 2012-13 for 7557 institutions(Rs. 377.85 lakhs) for replacement of kitchen devices funds have been utilized for 6233 institutions (Rs.311.66 lakhs). Balance amount of Rs. 66.17 lakhs (17.19+48.98) is yet to be utilized. Sanction for Rs. 17.19 lakhs has not been received for the state Govt. and case for re-appropriation of Rs. 48.98 lakhs from ST component to Gen. Component has been taken up with the GOI by the state.



2.12 <u>Capacity building and training conducted for different categories</u> of persons involved in the Mid Day Meal Programme.

- ▶ Training to cook-cum-helper:-
- ► As per the direction of GOI Training to cook-cum-helpers be imparted in the identified Hotel management Institute for HP i.e. Hotel Management Institute Kufri, preferably in the vacation schedule of the schools. Accordingly the matter was taken up with the Institute at Kufri. It was intimated that training could be held in the vacation schedule of the institute in the month of Dec. 2013. But it could not be held during December 2013 due to inclement weather. Now the institute has intimated that training could be held in the vacation schedule of the institute in the month of Dec. 2013. But it could not be held during December 2013 due to inclement weather. Now the institute has intimated that training could be held in the vacation schedule of the institute in the month of July, 2014.
- The department has also imparted training to cook-cum-helpers at the cluster level regarding maintenance of cleanliness, hygeine proper cooking procedures for maintenance of nutritive.
- ▶ Training to 10445 cook-cum-helper has been provided so far by state experts.
- ▶ District level official have been imparted training regarding MIS and preparation of Annual Work Plan and Budget of Mid Day Meal Scheme.

b) Capacity building of SMC members :-

Awareness programme for the members of SMCs has been conducted through SSA under community training module. They are being made aware of the role & responsibility of SMC members and rights/ entitlement of the students under this scheme.

2.13 <u>Management</u>, Information System at School, Village/ Gram <u>Panchayat</u>, Block, District and State level and its details :-

Presently, the Management Information System MIS MDMS is maintained at Block level by the existing ministerial staff of Blocks / at school level by the Center Head Teacher by paying Rs. 20 per format. The department has provided 4 computers at state level, 24 computers at district level and in all 124 block offices out of MME funds.

Due to shortage of staff at block level the pace of data entry is quite slow. In order to expedite the data entry process, the department intends either to deploy 50 Data Entry Operators at Block level which is being proposed in the Plan 2014-15 or to utilize the services of Data Entry Operators engaged at BRC level under SSA.



In order to streamline the flow of information in the state at different levels the state has taken the following steps :-

- ► The Head Teacher OR the Senior Teacher of the school submits the Quarterly Feedback Reports / Accounts Statements to the Block Elementary Education Officer, who further compiles and submits the consolidated Report of his Block to the Deputy Director Elementary Education, who further consolidates these reports of his entire district and submits the consolidated reports of his District to the Directorate of Elementary Education. The Directorate further consolidates, the information of entire state and submits reports to the State as well as to the Govt. of India.
- Department has provided internet facility to all block and district level offices. Information is being sent to or received from District to State and vice-versa through e_ mail.
- ► Department has developed the website of the MDM scheme where the all type of information is uploaded.

Web enabled Management Information System integrated with IVRS

Presently State has adopted web based Management Information System developed by the Government of India and Interactive Voice Recording System (IVRS) is yet to finalized.

The State intends to introduce SMS based monitoring system in 1000 schools on pilot basis the cost of which will be approximately Rs.302.30 lakh (Rs. 2519.20*12*1000).

2.14 <u>Systems to ensure transparency, accountability and openness in</u> all aspects of programme implementation, including inter alia, food grains management, ingredients procurement, cooking and serving ,appointment of cooking staff, construction of kitchen sheds, procurement of cooking devices.

- ► The Steering-cum Monitoring Committees at different levels i.e. at STATE, DISTRICT, and BLOCK level have been constituted in the state of Himachal Pradesh.
- ► For ensuring the Transparency and Accountability at School Level, especially w.r.t. quality of meals, food-grains and cash, the School Management Committees(SMC) have been constituted for every school. The SMC is responsible for the implementation of the programme at school level.



- School Management Committee (SMC) has been authorized to purchase the cooking ingredient at the school level.
- The School Management Committee (SMC) is empowered to engage / disengage the cook-cum-helper. The guidelines have been issued / notified for engagement of cook-cum-helper.
- ▶ The School Management Committee(SMC) is empowered to decide the weekly menu keeping in view the liking of the students.
- The weekly menu is being displayed in the schools .
- ► The State of H.P, with a view to ensure transparency and openness in all aspects of programme is encouraging the participation of mothers .
- ► The SMCs are instructed to form roster of mothers so that one of the mothers could be present in the school on every working day and supervise the preparation and serving of meal process. They are also assigned to keep a check on the quantity as well as the quality of meal severed to enhance their level of satisfaction.
- The kitchen-cum-store is being constructed through civil wing of SSA.
- ► The funds are released to SMCs for the purchase of cooking devices. The SMC purchases cooking devices as per requirement of school.

2.15 Measures taken to rectify

a) Inter-district low and uneven utilization of food grains and cooking cost

- b) Intra-district mismatch in utilization of food grains and cooking cost.
- c) Delay in delivering cooking cost at school level.
 - Sometimes delay in releasing the cooking cost leads to uneven utilization of cooking cost as compared to foodgrains.

As the funds are released by GOI category wise i.e Gen. SC.ST which takes considerable time to complete the procedure formalities as the matter has to be taken up with different departments. The GOI is therefore requested not to release the funds category wise but the guidelines may be issued to utilize the funds in different categories.

In order to reduce the delay in delivering the cooking cost at school level, the state of HP has made provision in the State budget for centre share from the current financial year 2014-15.

Also the State distributes the funds from State directly to the Block level. The Block Elementary Education Officer(BEEO) further distribute the budget / funds to SMC / Schools as per requirement. The budget is being distributed through e_vitran, the web based application, from Directorate to concerned Block office. Since the budget is distributed through internet, field offices receive budget immediately and directly.



2.16 <u>Details of Evaluation studies conducted and summary of its</u> findings.

During 2013-14 no evaluation study/report has been submitted by the monitoring institutions.

2.17 Brief write up on best practices followed in the State

- ▶ The State of HP has adopted the rice based hot cooked Mid Day Meal which is prepared a fresh every day in the school on working day .
- ► The School Management Committees(SMC) have been constituted for every school. The SMC is responsible for the over all implementation of the programme at school level, therefore teacher are least involved.
- School Management Committee (SMC) has been authorized to purchase the cooking ingredient at the school level.
- ► The School Management Committee (SMC) is empowered to engage / disengage the cook-cum-helper. The guidelines have been issued / notified for engagement of cook-cum-helper.
- ▶ The School Management Committee(SMC) is empowered to decide the weekly menu keeping in view the liking of the students.
- ▶ The weekly menu is being displayed in the schools .
- To make the public aware regarding the scheme instructions have been issued to display food norms and cooking cost norms in the notice board.
- ▶ 23784 Cook-cum-helpers have been engaged out of which 80% are female maximum of them are mothers of the students.
- Health screening / checkup of cook-cum-helper is made mandatory twice in a year.
- ▶ Training to cook-cum-helper has been provided regarding maintenance of . cleanliness, hygiene and proper cooking procedures.
- ▶ Funds are being transferred to the implementing agencies through e-transfer.
- ▶ 60% of the Cook-cum-Helpers have opened the bank account and the honorarium is being transferred directly to their account by the blocks.
- ▶ Instructions regarding registering complaint regarding MDM on Toll free no. 1800 180 8007 have already been issued vide below mentioned letter.
- Public suggestions are also invited and directions have been issued to install a Suggestion Box in the schools.
- ▶ Water Purifier have also been installed in some schools.

2.18 <u>Instances of unhygienic food served, children falling ill, sub-</u> standard supplies, diversion/misuse of resources, social discrimination and safety measures adopted to avoid recurrence of such incidents.

- No incident has come into the notice of the department.
- However, the department has issued instructions regarding safety measures to the field offices in the light of Bihar tragedy.
- To clean the water tank weekly and to check it before use. Water Purifier have also been installed in some schools.
- Repair the tanks in case of any damage immediately.
- To test and taste the meals before serving to the children.



Social Equity :-

Two instances of discrimination pertaining to Mandi and kullu District have been reported. Inquiry got conducted and it has been found that the complaint is not based on facts.

2.19 System of tasting to food by teachers and testing of food sample by any reputed labs.

Instruction have been issued to the field offices that teachers should test and taste the food before serving to children and certificate to this effect is being recorded in the MDM register. Efforts will be made to get the food sample tasted by the one lab at Kandaghat distt. Solan.

2.20 Extent of involvement of NGOs and Civic Body Organizations (CBOs) / PRIs in the implementation and monitoring of the Scheme.

In the State, no NGO and Civic Body organization(CBOs)/ PRI is involved in the implementation of the mid day meal scheme. The scheme is being implemented through School Management Committee (SMC).

2.21 <u>Status of School Health Programme with special focus on provision</u> of micro-nutrients, Vitamin-A, de-worming medicine, Iron and Folic acid, Zinc and recording of height, weight etc..

The School Health programme is being implemented by the Health and family Welfare Department. The detail of School Health programme is attached at Table **'AT-21.'**

2.22 <u>Present monitoring structure at various levels. Strategy for</u> <u>establishment of monitoring cell at various levels viz. Block.</u> <u>District and Sate level for effective monitoring of the Scheme.</u>

Third party monitoring can be important tool for effective implementation, proper monitoring and supervision of the scheme. SDM / Tehsildar, CDPO/ Two Officers of urban local bodies have been authorized to monitor the scheme in their jurisdiction.

Presently, the scheme is monitored by the officers of the department. The scheme is being monitored regularly in the monthly meeting held at district and State level.

To strengthen the monitoring system, State has engaged 26 personnel through outsourcing, the detail of which is as under:

2.28 Grievance Redressal Mechanism if any, used by the State /UTs.

State has established the Grievance Redressal Mechanism under MID DAY MEAL SCHEME, the following officers has been appointed as nodal officer :-

- 1) State Level : Additional Director (Admn)
- 2) District Level : Deputy Director (Elementary Education)
- 3) Block Level : Block Elementary Education Officer
- 4) School Level : Centre Head Teacher



The State/ District nodal officer sends the complaints received in respect of district / block /school to the concerned nodal officer on the next working day and concerned nodal officer has been directed to address the complaints within next three working days.

Further , the State has also installed / established the TOLL FREE NUMBER (1800-180-8007) at the directorate level. The complaints / grievance are being received on every working day between 10.30 am to 3.00 pm. 93 complaints have been received during 1-4-13 to 31-12-13. Out of which 70 complaints were informatory and were solved telephonically, 23 were regarding delay funds/ honorarium and rice and which were solved.

At present , in the HP Govt. Portal , there is application software " E-Samadhan " in which any one can register his grievances . Department also received the grievance of the public through post.

2.29 Awareness generation /Media campaign , if any :

To give the wider publicity of the scheme and initiative will be taken by the department .

2.30 Overall assessment of the manner in which implementation of the programme is contributing to the programme objectives and an analysis of strength and weaknesses of the programme implementation :-

The overall assessment of the programme implementation in the state of H.P. is as under:-

- ▶ The programme is being implemented smoothly and regularly in the state without involving any serious complaint or interruption and this scheme is helping the state in achieving the targeted objectives.
- ▶ Under this scheme, rice based nutritious Hot cooked meal prepared fresh daily on all school days, is being served to all the students of the targeted schools. The menu of the meal is allowed to be varied at the school level, as decided by the school committees keeping in view the liking of the students of the area. This scheme has also helped the malnourished students of poor families in improving their nutritional status and has also helped in inculcating good habits among them.

Issues of concern (Problem Areas)

1. LPG:- The process to provide subsidized LPG cylinders should be discontinued and all the cylinders required for MDM should be made non subsidized.

<u>REASONS:-</u>

- Linkage with Aadhar Card.
- Involvement of manpower for un-necessary calculations of subsidized and non subsidized cylinders (School wise), thereby wastage of time, money and energy.
- > Easily availability of non subsidized LPG cylinders.

2. <u>SEPARATE PROVISION FOR LPG CYLINDERS:</u>

The budget provision for fuel/LPG cylinders should be kept under separate component from cooking cost. <u>REASONS:-</u>

3. <u>Revision of cooking cost for low enrolment</u>:-

It is getting very difficult to meet the cooking cost in the schools, where the enrolment is low i.e between 1-25. Therefore cooking cost needs to be revised in such cases.

4. Component wise release:-

Some times the amount in one component remains in excess but Govt. finds it difficult to pay the inevitable Payment under the other component(s).

Administrative Department may be given the power and flexibility to decide the component/ category wise release. Flexibility should be given to state for re-appropriation from one category to another.

5. <u>Enhancement in the honorarium of Cook-cum- helpers</u> from Rs. 1000/- per month as it has not been enhanced since February 2010.

It is not feasible for the low enrolment school to meet the cost of LPG cylinder from the existing cooking cost keeping in view the price escalation.

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
