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PREFACE

School education in the different States and Union Territories of India is characterized by a wide variation in terms of the duration of various stages of school education, age restriction for admission to Class-I, medium of instruction, introduction of compulsory education at the elementary stage, teaching of Hindi and English, number of working days in a year, academic session and vacation periods, public examinations, provision of free education and tuition fee charged, adoption of no detention policy at elementary stage of education, syllabus and text books followed etc. The publication, 'Selected Information on School Education in India' provides state-wise information on all these aspects of education for an academic year. The present publication relating to the years 2006-07 & 2007-08, has been prepared on the basis of information that has been obtained from the DPI Offices / Directorates of School Education in the States and Union Territories in a pre-devised format.

My thanks to the officers of the State Governments and Union Territory Administrations as well as the officers and staff of the Statistics Bureau for their efforts in bringing out this publication.

It is our constant endeavour to improve the coverage of this publication as well as its presentation based on the feedback from its users. Further suggestions, if any, for improving the publication are always welcome and may be sent to this Department. We are hopeful that this publication will provide useful information to educational planners, policy makers and those engaged in research and development in the field of education.



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Introduction

A uniform structure of school education, the 10+2 system has been adopted by all the States and Union Territories of India. However, within the States and the UTs, there are variations in the number of classes constituting the Primary, Upper Primary, High and Higher Secondary school stages, age for admission to class I, medium of instruction, public examinations, teaching of Hindi and English, number of working days in a year, academic session, vacation periods, fee structure, compulsory education, syllabus and text books followed, adoption of No Detention Policy at Elementary Stage etc. This publication is an attempt to provide information on these aspects for all the States and Union Territories.

The items included in this publication are discussed briefly in the following paragraphs:

I STAGES OF SCHOOL EDUCATION AND NUMBER OF WORKING DAYS

(a) STAGES OF SCHOOL EDUCATION:

The Primary Stage of school education consists of classes I-V, i.e. of five years' duration in 20 States (viz; Andhra Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Manipur, Orissa, Punjab, Rajasthan, Sikkim, Tamil Nadu, Tripura, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand) and 5 U.Ts. (viz; Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Chandigarh, Delhi, Lakshadweep and Puducherry). 8 States (viz; Goa, Gujarat, Kerala, Maharashtra, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland and West Bengal) and 2 U.Ts. (viz; Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu) have Primary Stage of school education consisting of classes I-IV i.e., of four years' duration.

The Middle Stage of school education comprises of classes VI-VIII i.e., of three years' duration in 16 States (viz; Arunachal Pradesh, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Manipur, Punjab, Rajasthan, Sikkim, Tamil Nadu, Tripura, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand) and 4 U.Ts. (viz; Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Chandigarh, Delhi and Puducherry) whereas classes V-VII i.e., of three years' duration comprise Middle Stage of school education in 7 States (viz; Assam, Goa, Gujarat, Kerala, Maharashtra, Meghalaya and Mizoram) and 2 U.Ts. (viz; Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu) followed by classes VI-VII i.e., of two years' duration in 3 States (viz; Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka & Orissa) and UT (Lakshadweep) and classes V – VIII i.e., of four years' duration in 2 States (viz; Nagaland and West Bengal).

The Secondary Stage of school education consists of classes IX-X i.e., of two years' duration in 18 States (viz; Arunachal Pradesh, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Manipur, Nagaland, Punjab, Rajasthan, Sikkim, Tamil Nadu, Tripura, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand and West Bengal) and 4 U.Ts. (viz; Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Chandigarh, Delhi and Puducherry) whereas this stage comprises of classes VIII to X i.e., of three years' duration in 10 States (viz; Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Goa, Gujarat, Karnataka, Kerala, Maharashtra, Meghalaya, Mizoram and Orissa) and 3 U.Ts. (viz; Dadra & Nagar Haveli, Daman & Diu and Lakshadweep).

However, the Higher Secondary/ Senior Secondary stage of school education comprising classes XI-XII (10+2 pattern) i.e., of two years' duration is available in all the States/UTs though in some States/UTs these classes are attached to Universities/Colleges. State/UT-wise details of the different stages of School Education are given in **Statement-I**.

(b) NUMBER OF WORKING DAYS

The number of working days of School Education in a year is generally more than 200 days in majority of the States/UTs. State/UTs-wise details of the number of working days may be seen in **Statement-I**.

II MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION AND AGE RESTRICTION FOR ADMISSION TO CLASS I

The mother tongue or the regional language is the medium of instruction at the primary stage of education in most of the States/UTs. Facilities for studying in a medium other than the regional language vary considerably in different States and Union Territories.

The minimum age for admission to class I of the Primary School stage is generally 5+ or 6+ years. The minimum age for admission to Class I is 5+ in 19 States (viz; Andhra Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Goa, Gujarat, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Manipur, Orissa, Punjab, Rajasthan, Sikkim, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand and West Bengal) and 7 U.Ts. (viz; Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Chandigarh, Dadra & Nagar Haveli, Daman & Diu, Delhi, Lakshadweep and Puducherry). In 9 States, the minimum age for admission to class I is 6+ years (viz; Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Haryana, Maharashtra, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland and Tripura). The detailed information on medium of instruction at Primary, Middle & High/Higher Secondary stages and age restriction for admission to class-I of Primary Stage for all the States/UTs. is given in **Statement-II**.

III TEACHING OF HINDI AND ENGLISH

Teaching of Hindi is compulsory in all the States and Union Territories except the States of J&K, Tamil Nadu and U.T. of Puducherry whereas teaching of English is compulsory in all the States/UTs. However, the classes in which teaching of Hindi/English is compulsory differ from State to State.

Teaching of Hindi is compulsory in classes I-XII in 6 States (viz; Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Haryana, Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand) and UT of Andaman & Nicobar Islands followed by in classes I-X in 3 States (viz; Arunachal Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh and Tripura) and 2 UTs (A & N Islands and NCT of Delhi. Whereas, teaching of Hindi is compulsory in

classes I-VIII in 2 States (viz. Nagaland, and Rajasthan). Teaching of Hindi is compulsory in other 17 States and 4 UTs in different level of education as shown in **Statement-III**.

Teaching of English is compulsory in Classes I-XII in 10 States (viz; Arunachal Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Goa, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Sikkim, Tamil Nadu and Tripura) and 4 U.Ts, (viz; Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Chandigarh, Lakshadweep and Puducherry). 18 States (viz; Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Gujarat, Haryana, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Manipur, Mizoram, Orissa, Punjab, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand and West Bengal) and 3 U.Ts. (viz; Dadra & Nagar Haveli, Daman & Diu and Delhi) where teaching of English is compulsory in different level of education.

Classes in which teaching of Hindi and English is compulsory or optional for different States/UTs are indicated in **Statement – III**.

IV PUBLIC EXAMINATIONS

In all the States/U.Ts., Public Examinations are conducted at the end of X and XII Classes by the respective State Boards of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education. The minimum age for the Secondary School Examination varies from 14+ to 16+ years in 20 States (viz; Andhra Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Karnataka, Kerala, Maharashtra, Manipur, Nagaland, Sikkim, Orissa, Punjab, Tamil Nadu, Tripura, Uttarakhand and West Bengal) and 3 U.Ts. (viz; Delhi, Lakshadweep, and Puducherry). Other States/UTs either do not have age restrictions or it has not been indicated. The minimum age for Higher Secondary School Examination varies from 16+ to 18+ years in 14 States (viz; Arunachal Pradesh, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Kerala, Maharashtra, Nagaland, Orissa, Punjab, Sikkim, Tamil Nadu and Uttarakhand) and 3 U.Ts. (viz; Delhi, Lakshadweep and Puducherry). In other States/UTs, either there is no age restriction prescribed or if it exists, it has not been indicated. In some of the States/UTs, the first Public Examination is also conducted at the Primary and/or Middle stage of School Education.

State-wise details on public examinations at various stages of school education are given in **Statement-IV**.

V ACADEMIC SESSION AND VACATION PERIODS

The academic session begins from the month of June in 9 States/U.Ts. (viz; Andhra Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Goa, Gujarat, Karnataka, Kerala, Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu) and 4 U.Ts. (viz: Dadra & Nagar Haveli, Daman & Diu, Lakshadweep and Puducherry). In rest of the States and U.Ts. the academic session begins from different months of the year.

In majority of the States/U.Ts. the long vacation periods are availed during the summer season while in some of the hill States, these fall in the winter months. The State-wise information on academic terms and vacation periods is given in **Statement-V**.

VI COMPULSORY EDUCATION

Education has been made compulsory at the elementary stage in all States except Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Manipur, Meghalaya, Rajasthan, Sikkim, Tripura, Uttar Pradesh and UTs Dadra & Nagar Haveli, Delhi and Lakshadweep. States/UTs-wise details on introduction of compulsory education in rural and urban areas are given in **Statement VI**.

VII FREE EDUCATION IN GOVERNMENT SCHOOLS

Majority of the States and Union Territories have introduced free education in Classes I-XII in their schools. However, education is also free only for girls in classes I-XII in 9 States namely Assam, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Orissa, Punjab, Rajasthan, Uttarakhand and UT Chandigarh, and Daman & Diu and in classes I-X in 4 States namely, Bihar, Jharkhand, Manipur and Meghalaya. The State-wise details on free education in Government schools for boys and for girls are given in **Statement VII**.

VIII TUITION FEE CHARGED PER CHILD PER ANNUM IN GOVERNMENT SCHOOLS

In 14 States and 6 UTs namely Andhra Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Goa, Gujarat, Jammu & Kashmir, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Mizoram, Nagaland, Tamil Nadu, Tripura, Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal, A&N Islands, Dadra & Nagar Haveli Daman & Diu, Delhi, Lakshadweep and Puducherry, education is free at all level of education and no tuition fee is being charged either from boys or girls. However, it is free upto class X in 8 States namely, Assam, Bihar, Himachal Pradesh, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Meghalaya and Orissa. In the States/UTs where education is not free the annual fee varies considerably from the highest level of Rs.720/- to the lowest at Rs.72/-. Details of Tuition Fee charged per child per annum in Government schools have been provided in **Statement-VIII**.

IX NO DETENTION POLICY

Five States namely, Andhra Pradesh(I to IX), Assam, Madhya Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir and Orissa and one UT of A&N Islands have adopted no detention policy up to Middle stage of education whereas 14 States and 4 UTs namely Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Goa, Gujarat, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Kerala, Punjab, Tamil Nadu, Tripura, Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal, Chandigarh, Dadra & Nagar Haveli, Delhi and Puducherry have adopted it upto primary stage (Classes I-II, I-III, I-IV/ I-V) of education. 10 States and 2 UTs namely, Arunchal Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Rajasthan, Sikkim, Uttarakhand, Daman & Diu and Lakshadweep have not yet adopted this Policy at any stage of education. The State-wise position on no detention policy adopted by the States/UTs at Elementary Stage of education is given in **Statement IX**.

X SYLLABUS AND TEXT BOOKS

Majority of the States and Union Territories have followed syllabus and text books prescribed by the State Government and the State Board except Arunachal Pradesh, A & N Islands, Chandigarh and Delhi where the syllabus and Text books followed in schools are exclusively of CBSE/ NCERT.

Whereas, States of Chhattisgarh, Goa, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Karnataka, Nagaland, Sikkim, Tripura, Dadra & Nagar Haveli, Lakshadweep and Puducherry are using NCERT/CBSE as well as States Govt./Boards text books in different levels of classes. The State-wise details on Syllabus and Text books followed by schools are available in **Statement X**.

N.B: The reports from Haryana and Jharkhand for the year 2006-07 and 2007-08 have not been received. Therefore, some previous information has been repeated for these States.
