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PREFACE

An all-India quinquennial survey of employment and unemployment in India was carried out during the period July, 2004 to June, 2005 as a part of the 61st round of the National Sample Survey (NSS). In this survey, information on various facets of employment and unemployment in India and some individual characteristics associated with household members such as age, sex, level of general and technical education attained, current attendance in educational institutions, vocational training received, etc., was collected at the national and state level. In addition to this, information on the religion of the head of the household was also collected. Based on the data collected during the entire period, estimates pertaining to employment - unemployment situation of people belonging to different religious groups in India along with various characteristics associated with them have been presented in this report.

This report, fifth in the series of seven reports based on employment-unemployment data of the NSS 61st round, provides information about distribution of households and population; households by household type, land cultivated, monthly per capita expenditure, the worker population ratio, proportion unemployed, etc. for major religious groups (viz. Hinduism, Islam and Christianity). This report consists of three chapters and appendix tables including the introductory chapter One. Chapter Two describes the concepts and definitions of only those terms covered in this report. The main findings on employment - unemployment situation among major religious groups and their broad household and population characteristics are discussed in Chapter Three. Relevant state/ut level tables have been presented at the end of the chapter. The detailed tables based on which this report is based are presented in the Appendix A. Detailed description of the sample design and estimation procedures are included in Appendix-B. A facsimile of the schedule of enquiry canvassed in the field is at Appendix-C.

The Survey Design and Research Division (SDRD) of the NSSO undertook the development of the survey methodology as well as drafting of the report. The fieldwork was carried out by the Field Operations Division (FOD) of NSSO while the data processing and tabulation work was handled by Data Processing Division (DPD) of NSSO. The Co-ordination and Publication division (CPD) of NSSO coordinated various activities pertaining to the survey and release of the data and report.

I am thankful to the Chairman and the Members of the then Governing Council and Working Group for the NSS 61st round for their valuable guidance at various stages of survey activities from designing of the Schedule to the preparation of this report. I also place on record my thanks to various officers of different divisions of the NSSO involved in the preparation of this report.

I hope, this report will prove useful to the planners, policy makers, academicians and researchers. Suggestions from readers for improvement of the content of the report will be highly appreciated.

मुख्य परिणाम

यह रिपोर्ट जुलाई, 2004 से जून, 2005 के दौरान संचालित रा.प्र.स. 61वें दौर में रोजगार और बेरोजगारी पर किये गये सातवें पंचवर्षीय सर्वेक्षण पर आधारित है। यह सर्वेक्षण 7,999 ग्रामों एवं 4,602 नगरीय खण्डों में फैला हुआ था, जिसमें 1,24,680 परिवार (79,306 ग्रामीण क्षेत्रों में और 45,374 नगरीय क्षेत्रों में) शामिल हुए और जिसमें 6,02,833 व्यक्तियों (3,98,025 ग्रामीण क्षेत्रों में एवं 2,04,808 नगरीय क्षेत्रों में) की गणना की गयी। इस सर्वेक्षण में प्रत्येक परिवार जिस किसी धर्म को मानता है, उससे सम्बन्धित सूचना पारिवारिक अभिलक्षण के रूप में एकत्र की गई थी। परिवार के प्रधान के सूचित धर्म को ही परिवार का धर्म माना गया, परिवार के प्रत्येक सदस्य द्वारा वास्तव में अनुकरण किये जा रहे धर्म पर विचार नहीं किया गया। इस सर्वेक्षण में सात प्रमुख धर्मों की पहचान की गई। वे हैं हिन्दू, इस्लाम, ईसाई, सिख, जैन, बौद्ध और पारसी धर्म। इनमें से हिन्दू, इस्लाम और ईसाई धर्मों के अनुयायी तीन प्रमुख धार्मिक समूह गठित करते थे। कुछ मुख्य निष्कर्ष नीचे दिये गये हैं।

- ग्रामीण क्षेत्रों में, 84 प्रतिशत परिवार, जिनमें 83 प्रतिशत जनसंख्या शामिल थी, हिन्दू धर्म के अनुयायी थे, जबकि 10 प्रतिशत परिवार, जिनमें 12 प्रतिशत जनसंख्या थी, इस्लाम धर्म को मानने वाले थे। फिर लगभग 2 प्रतिशत परिवार और जनसंख्या ईसाई धर्म को मानने वाली थी। नगरीय क्षेत्रों में, परिवारों और जनसंख्या के प्रतिशत हिन्दू धर्म के लिए क्रमशः लगभग 80 और 77 प्रतिशत, इस्लाम के लिए 13 और 16 प्रतिशत तथा ईसाई धर्म के लिए 3 और 3 प्रतिशत थे। यहां तक कि जम्मू और कश्मीर, जिसमें भिन्न राप्रस दौरों में भिन्न भौगोलिक व्याप्तियां थीं, को छोड़ देने पर भी प्रमुख धार्मिक समूह अनुसार व्यक्तियों का अनुपात लगभग ऐसा ही था।
- लिंग अनुपात सबसे अधिक ईसाइयों में (ग्रामीण क्षेत्र में 994 और नगरीय में 1000) था, उसके बाद मुसलमान (ग्रामीण 968 और नगरीय 932) तथा हिन्दुओं में (ग्रामीण 961 और नगरीय 912) था।
- ग्रामीण क्षेत्रों में, सभी धार्मिक समूहों के लिए 'स्व-नियोजन' ही मुख्य सहारा था। लगभग 37 प्रतिशत हिन्दू परिवार 'कृषि में स्व-नियोजन' पर निर्भर थे। अनुरूपी अनुपात ईसाइयों के लिए 35 प्रतिशत और मुसलमानों के लिए 26 प्रतिशत था। 'गैर-कृषि में स्व-नियोजन' पर निर्भर परिवारों के अनुपात हिन्दुओं के लिए 14 प्रतिशत, मुसलमानों के लिए 28 प्रतिशत और ईसाइयों के लिए 15 प्रतिशत थे। 'ग्रामीण श्रमिक' परिवारों के मामलों में, ये अनुपात 32 प्रतिशत (मुसलमान) से 37 प्रतिशत (हिन्दू) के बीच थे। नगरीय भारत में, 'स्व-नियोजन', 'नियमित मजदूरी/वेतन' और 'आकस्मिक श्रमिक' पर निर्भर हिन्दू परिवारों के अनुपात क्रमशः 36 प्रतिशत, 43 प्रतिशत और 12 प्रतिशत थे, जबकि मुसलमान परिवारों के लिए अनुरूपी भाग क्रमशः 49 प्रतिशत, 30 प्रतिशत और 14 प्रतिशत और ईसाइयों के लिए क्रमशः 27 प्रतिशत, 47 प्रतिशत और 11 प्रतिशत थे।
- ग्रामीण भारत में, संयुक्त रूप से तीन निम्नतम मासिक प्रति व्यक्ति व्यय (मा प्र व्य व्य) (अर्थात् एक महीने के लिए रु. 320 से कम) वर्गों में परिवारों का अनुपात हिन्दुओं में उच्चतम (14 प्रतिशत) था, उनके बाद मुसलमान (12 प्रतिशत) और ईसाई (8 प्रतिशत) थे। नगरीय भारत में, संयुक्त रूप से तीन निम्नतम मा.प्र.व्य.व्य. (अर्थात् एक महीने के लिए रु. 485 से कम) वर्गों में परिवारों का अनुपात मुसलमानों में उच्चतम (25 प्रतिशत) था, उनके बाद हिन्दू (12 प्रतिशत) और ईसाई (8 प्रतिशत) थे। दूसरी ओर, नगरीय क्षेत्रों में, संयुक्त रूप से तीन उच्चतम मा.प्र.व्य.व्य. (अर्थात् एक महीने के लिए रु. 1380 से अधिक) वर्गों में परिवारों का अनुपात ईसाइयों के लिए

38 प्रतिशत, हिन्दुओं के लिए 28 प्रतिशत और मुसलमानों के लिए 13 प्रतिशत था। ग्रामीण क्षेत्रों में, संयुक्त रूप से तीन उच्चतम मा.प्र.व्य.व्य. (अर्थात् एक महीने के लिए रु. 690 से अधिक) वर्गों में परिवारों का अनुपात ईसाइयों के लिए 47 प्रतिशत, हिन्दुओं के लिए 24 प्रतिशत और मुसलमानों के लिए 20 प्रतिशत था।

- ईसाइयों में निरक्षरता दर ग्रामीण (पुरुष 20 प्रतिशत और महिला 31 प्रतिशत) और नगरीय (पुरुष 6 प्रतिशत और महिला 11 प्रतिशत), दोनों क्षेत्रों के लिए निम्नतम थी। ग्रामीण महिलाओं को छोड़कर, हिन्दुओं में साक्षरता अनुपात मुसलमानों की अपेक्षा उच्च था। ग्रामीण महिलाओं में, निरक्षरता दर हिन्दुओं और मुसलमानों, दोनों में लगभग समान (59 प्रतिशत) थी। ईसाइयों में अनुरूपी दर निम्न अर्थात् 31 प्रतिशत थी।
- ग्रामीण क्षेत्रों में, पुरुषों के बीच कामगार जनसंख्या अनुपात (का.ज.अ.) ईसाइयों में अधिकतम (56 प्रतिशत) और उसके बाद हिन्दुओं में (55 प्रतिशत) था। मुसलमानों के लिए अनुरूपी अनुपात निम्न (50 प्रतिशत) था। पुरुषों के मामले के समान ही महिलाओं के लिए का.ज.अ. ईसाइयों (36 प्रतिशत) और हिन्दुओं (34 प्रतिशत) में, मुसलमानों (18 प्रतिशत) की तुलना में काफी उच्च थे। नगरीय भारत में, पुरुषों के बीच का.ज.अ. हिन्दुओं में उच्चतम (56 प्रतिशत) और उसके बाद मुसलमानों (53 प्रतिशत) तथा ईसाइयों में (51 प्रतिशत) था। ईसाई महिलाओं के लिए का.ज.अ. (24 प्रतिशत), हिन्दुओं (17 प्रतिशत) और मुसलमानों (12 प्रतिशत) की तुलना में बहुत उच्च था।
- आयु वर्ग 15 वर्ष और अधिक के ग्रामीण पुरुषों के लिए शिक्षा स्तर माध्यमिक और ऊपर में का.ज.अ. हिन्दुओं के बीच (76 प्रतिशत) सबसे उच्च था। उनके बाद ईसाइयों में (72 प्रतिशत) और मुसलमानों में (67 प्रतिशत) था। तथापि नगरीय क्षेत्रों में यह मुसलमानों और हिन्दुओं के बीच समान (71 प्रतिशत) देखा गया और ईसाइयों के बीच यह निम्न (64 प्रतिशत) था। जबकि उसी शैक्षणिक स्तर वाले उसी आयु वर्ग की ग्रामीण महिलाओं के लिए यह दर ईसाइयों में (37 प्रतिशत) उच्चतम थी। उसके बाद हिन्दुओं में (30 प्रतिशत) और मुसलमानों में (18 प्रतिशत) थी। यही पैटर्न उसी आयु वर्ग की नगरीय महिलाओं के बीच भी देखा गया।
- ग्रामीण क्षेत्रों में आधे से ज्यादा कामगार स्व-नियोजित थे। मुसलमान कामगारों के बीच में यह अनुपात सबसे ज्यादा पुरुष (60 प्रतिशत) एवं महिला (75 प्रतिशत) दोनों में उच्चतम पाया गया। नगरीय क्षेत्रों में भी यही पैटर्न देखा गया। नियमित मजदूरी/वेतन प्राप्त कामगारों का अनुपात ईसाइयों में ग्रामीण और नगरीय क्षेत्रों के पुरुषों और महिलाओं दोनों में उच्चतम था। आकस्मिक श्रमिकों का अनुपात हिन्दुओं में ग्रामीण (34 प्रतिशत) और नगरीय (18 प्रतिशत) दोनों क्षेत्रों की महिलाओं के लिए सबसे अधिक पाया गया।
- ग्रामीण क्षेत्रों में बेरोजगारी दर (बे.द.) हिन्दुओं में (1.5 प्रतिशत) या मुसलमानों (2.3 प्रतिशत) की तुलना में ईसाइयों (4.4 प्रतिशत) में उच्चतम थी। नगरीय क्षेत्रों में भी यही पैटर्न देखा गया। तथापि नगरीय क्षेत्रों में बे.द. हिन्दुओं और मुसलमानों के लिए लगभग समान (4 प्रतिशत) थी। फिर महिलाओं के लिए बे.द. ग्रामीण और नगरीय दोनों क्षेत्रों के पुरुषों की तुलना में सभी प्रमुख धार्मिक समूहों में सामान्यतः उच्च थी। बे.द. नगरीय ईसाई महिलाओं में उच्चतम (14 प्रतिशत) थी।

Highlights

This report is based on the seventh quinquennial survey on employment and unemployment conducted in the 61st round of NSS from July, 2004 to June, 2005. The survey was spread over 7,999 villages and 4,602 urban blocks covering 1,24,680 households (79,306 in rural areas and 45,374 in urban areas) and enumerating 6,02,833 persons (3,98,025 in rural areas and 2,04,808 in urban areas). In this survey information on religion followed by each household was collected as part of the household characteristics. The reported religion of head of the household was considered as the religion of all the household members irrespective of the actual religion followed by individual members. Seven main religions were identified in the survey. They were Hinduism, Islam, Christianity, Sikhism, Jainism, Buddhism and Zoroastrianism. Among these the followers of Hinduism, Islam and Christianity formed the three major religious groups. Some of the key findings are stated below:

- In rural areas, about 84 per cent of households having 83 per cent of population followed Hinduism whereas 10 per cent of households followed Islam with about 12 per cent of population. Further, about 2 per cent of households and population followed Christianity. In urban areas, the percentage of households and population were about 80 and 77 respectively for Hinduism, 13 and 16 for Islam and 3 and 3 for Christianity. Even after excluding the state of Jammu and Kashmir, having different geographical coverage in different NSS rounds, the proportion of persons by major religious groups remained more or less same.
- The sex ratio was the highest among the Christians (994 in rural and 1000 in urban areas) followed by the Muslims (968 in rural; 932 in urban) and the Hindus (961 in rural; 912 in urban).
- In the rural areas, '*self-employment*' was the mainstay for all the religious groups. About 37 per cent of Hindu households were dependent on '*self-employment in agriculture*'. The corresponding proportion was 35 per cent for the Christians and 26 per cent for the Muslims. The proportions of households depending on '*self-employment in non-agriculture*' were 14 per cent for the Hindus, 28 per cent for the Muslims and 15 per cent for the Christians. In the case of '*rural labour*' households, the proportions varied from 32 per cent (Muslims) to 37 per cent (Hindus). In urban India, the proportion of Hindu households depending on '*self-employment*', '*regular wage/salary*' and '*casual labour*' were 36 per cent, 43 per cent and 12 per cent respectively, whereas the corresponding shares for the Muslims were 49 per cent, 30 per cent and 14 per cent respectively and for the Christians 27 per cent, 47 per cent and 11 per cent respectively.
- In rural India, proportion of households in the lowest three monthly per capita expenditure (mpce) classes combined (viz. less than Rs.320 for a month) was highest among Hindus (14 per cent), followed by Muslims (12 per cent) and Christians (8 per cent). In urban India, the proportion of Households in the lowest three mpce classes combined (viz. less than Rs.485 for a month) was the highest among the Muslims (25 per cent) followed by the Hindus (12 per cent) and Christians (8 per cent) On the other hand, in the urban area, proportion of households in the highest three classes of mpce combined (viz. more than Rs.1380 for a month) was 38 per cent for Christians, 28 per cent for Hindus and 13 per cent for Muslims. In rural areas, proportion of households in

the highest three classes of mpce combined (viz. more than Rs.690 for a month) was 47 per cent for Christians, 24 per cent for Hindus, and 20 per cent for Muslims.

- The Christians had the lowest illiteracy rate both for rural (20 per cent for males and 31 per cent for females) and urban areas (6 per cent for males and 11 per cent for females). Except for rural females, the proportion of literates among the Hindus was higher than that among the Muslims. Among the rural females, the illiteracy rates were almost equal among the Hindus and the Muslims (59 per cent). The corresponding rate was as low as 31 per cent among the Christians.
- In the rural areas, *Worker Population Ratio (WPR)* among the males was highest among Christians (56 per cent) followed by Hindus (55 per cent). The corresponding figure for Muslims was lower (50 per cent). As in the case of males, WPR for females for Christians (36 per cent) and Hindus (34 per cent) was much higher than that for Muslims (18 per cent). In urban India, the WPR among the males was the highest among Hindus (56 per cent) followed by Muslims (53 per cent) and the Christians (51 per cent). The WPR for Christian women (24 per cent) was much higher than those among Hindu (17 per cent) and Muslim women (12 per cent).
- For the rural males in the age group 15 years and above, WPR in the educational level secondary and above was the highest among the Hindus (76 per cent) followed by the Christians (72 per cent) and the Muslims (67 per cent). However in urban areas, it was equal (71 per cent) among Muslims and Hindus and lower (64 per cent) among Christians. For the rural females in the same age group with same education level, however, the rates were highest among the Christians (37 per cent) followed by Hindus (30 per cent) and Muslims (18 per cent). Similar pattern was also observed among urban females in the same age group.
- More than half of the workers in the rural areas were self-employed, the proportion being the highest among the Muslim workers both males (60 per cent) and females (75 per cent). In the urban areas also, the same pattern is observed. The proportion of regular wage/salaried workers was highest among Christians in both rural and urban areas among both males and females. The proportion of casual labourers was highest among Hindus for females in both rural (34 per cent) and urban (18 per cent) areas.
- In rural areas, the *unemployment rates (URs)* were higher among the Christians (4.4 per cent) as compared to those among the Hindus (1.5 per cent) or the Muslims (2.3 per cent). In the urban areas also same pattern was observed. However, the *URs* in urban areas were more or less same for Hindu and Muslims (4 per cent). Further *URs* for females were generally higher in all major religious groups as compared to males in both rural and urban areas. The *UR* was highest (14 per cent) among the urban Christian women.

Chapter One

1.1 The report in perspective

1.1.1 An all-India quinquennial survey of employment and unemployment in India was carried out during the period from July, 2004 to June, 2005 as a part of the 61st round of the National Sample Survey (NSS). In this survey, information on various facets of employment and unemployment in India and some individual and household characteristics associated with them at the national and state level was collected through the employment and unemployment schedule (Schedule 10). Information on some general particulars of the household members such as age, sex, level of general and technical education attained, current attendance in educational institutions, vocational training received, etc., was also collected in the survey. Reported religion of head of the household was one of the household characteristics. Based on the data collected during the entire period, estimates pertaining to employment - unemployment situation of people belonging to different religions in India along with various characteristics associated with them have been presented in this report.

1.2 Background

1.2.1 One of the important quinquennial surveys conducted by the NSSO is on employment-unemployment. The first such survey was carried out during September 1972-October 1973 corresponding to the 27th round of NSSO. The present survey is the seventh in the series.

1.2.2 *Past Quinquennial Surveys:* To assess the volume and structure of employment and unemployment, starting with the 9th round (May - September, 1955), NSSO conducted a number of surveys on employment and unemployment. To give a firm conceptual framework for conducting such surveys, the Planning Commission, in the year 1970, set up an "Expert Committee on Unemployment Estimates", (popularly known as the Dantwala Committee), which reviewed these surveys and the indicators generated from such surveys. Based on concepts and definitions recommended by this committee, the first quinquennial survey on employment and unemployment was conducted in the 27th round of NSS (September 1972 – October 1973). After the 27th round, five comprehensive quinquennial surveys on employment and unemployment situation in India have been carried out by the NSSO prior to the present quinquennial survey : 32nd round (July 1977 – June 1978), 38th round (January 1983 – December 1983), 43rd round (July 1987 – June 1988), 50th round (July 1993 – June 1994), and 55th round (July 1999 – June 2000), in which concepts, definitions and procedures were based primarily on the recommendations of the Dantwala Committee. The results of these surveys have been brought out in the form of NSS reports.

1.2.3 *Other surveys on employment-unemployment:* Apart from the quinquennial surveys on employment and unemployment, NSSO has been regularly collecting information on certain key items on employment and unemployment from a limited set of households in each round since the 45th round (July 1989 – June 1990), known as annual series, through the schedule on Household Consumer Expenditure (Schedule 1.0). In the annual series, only some key particulars on the usual and current weekly status of the individuals were collected, and the current weekly status of a person was determined through a direct query. In the 60th round (January – June 2004), there was a change in the procedure of collecting information on employment and unemployment. During the formulation of NSS 60th round survey, the Planning Commission pressed for an annual collection of data on the current daily status of employment and unemployment as well. The collection of data in the current daily status

necessitated the separation of two enquiries on Household Consumer Expenditure and Employment-Unemployment, and as a result, a separate schedule on employment and unemployment (Schedule 10) was canvassed in the 60th round, in which concepts, definitions and procedures were similar to the quinquennial rounds. The results of such surveys have been published in the form of NSS reports.

1.3 Plan for release of reports

1.3.1 It has been planned to bring out a series of seven reports on the basis of the employment and unemployment survey results of NSS 61st round. The present report deals with the employment-unemployment situation of persons belonging to different religious groups in India along with their other co-relates like educational attainment, expenditure levels, land cultivated, etc. The reports already released are: (i) Report No. 515: Employment and Unemployment Situation in India, 2004-05, (ii) Report No. 516: Employment and Unemployment Situation among Social Groups in India, 2004-05, (iii) Report No. 517: Status of Education and Vocational Training in India, 2004-05, (iv) Report No. 518: Participation of Women in Specified Activities along with Domestic Duties, 2004-05. In addition to this report, the other two reports to be released are: (i) Report No. 519: Informal Sector and Conditions of Employment in India: 2004-05 and (ii) Report No. 520: Employment and Unemployment Situation in cities and towns in India: 2004-05.

1.4 The survey outline

1.4.1 *Geographical coverage*: The survey covered the whole of the Indian Union *except* (i) Leh (Ladakh) and Kargil districts of Jammu & Kashmir, (ii) interior villages of Nagaland situated beyond 5 kilometres of the nearest bus route and (iii) villages in Andaman and Nicobar Islands which remained inaccessible throughout the year. All the sample first stage units of the districts of Poonch and Rajouri of Jammu & Kashmir, all rural samples of the district of Doda of Jammu & Kashmir, and all rural samples of the district of Nicobar of Andaman and Nicobar Islands became a causality and therefore, these areas remained outside the survey coverage.

1.4.2 *Sub-round*: The fieldwork of the 61st round of NSSO started from 1st July 2004 and continued till 30th June, 2005. As usual, the survey period of this round was divided into four sub-rounds, each with a duration of three months, the 1st sub-round period from July to September 2004, the 2nd sub-round period from October to December 2004 and so on. An equal number of sample villages/blocks (FSUs) were allotted for survey in each of these four sub-rounds. The survey used the interview method of data collection from a sample of randomly selected households.

1.5 Sample design

1.5.1 In the 61st round survey, a stratified multi-stage sampling design was adopted for selection of the sample units for rural as well as urban areas. The first stage units (FSUs) were the census villages (panchayat wards for Kerala) for rural areas and the NSSO Urban Frame Survey (UFS) blocks for urban areas. The ultimate stage units (USUs) were the households for both rural and urban areas. Hamlet-groups/sub-blocks constituted the intermediate stage whenever these were formed in the sample FSUs. For rural areas, the list of 2001 census villages constituted the sampling frame for selection of sample FSUs for most of the states. For the rural areas of Kerala, however, the list of panchayat wards was used as the sampling frame for selection of panchayat wards. For the urban areas, the latest lists of

UFS blocks constituted the sampling frame for selection of sample FSUs. Within each district of a State/UT, two separate basic strata were formed for rural areas and urban areas. All rural areas of the district comprised rural stratum and all the urban areas of the district comprised urban stratum.

1.5.2 At the all-India level, a total number of 12788 FSUs (8128 villages and 4660 urban blocks) was allocated for the survey and this was allocated to the different States and UTs in proportion to population as per census 2001 which was then allocated between rural and urban sectors in proportion to population as per *population census 2001* with 1.5 weightage to urban sector. Within each of the rural and urban sectors of a State/UT, the respective sample size was allocated to the different strata in proportion to the stratum population as per census 2001.

1.5.3 Within a district, if 'r' number of FSUs were allocated for a rural stratum, a total number of 'r/2' sub-strata were formed within that rural stratum. From each sub-stratum of the rural stratum of a district, two FSUs were selected with probability proportional to size with replacement (PPSWR), size being the population as per Population Census 2001. Within a district, if 'u' number of FSUs were allocated for a urban stratum, a total number of 'u/2' sub-strata were formed within that urban stratum. From each sub-stratum of the urban stratum of a district, two FSUs were selected with simple random sampling without replacement (SRSWOR). Within each sub-stratum, samples were drawn in the form of two independent sub-samples in both the rural and urban sectors. All households listed in the selected village/block/ hamlet-groups/sub-blocks were stratified into three second stage strata (SSS). A total of 10 households were selected from each sample village/block for canvassing the employment and unemployment schedule. The sample households from each of the second stage strata were selected by SRSWOR.

1.5.4 Out of the total number of 12788 FSU's (8128 villages and 4660 urban blocks) selected for survey for the central sample, 12601 FSU's (7999 villages and 4602 urban blocks) could be surveyed at the all-India level for canvassing Schedule 10. The number of households surveyed was 1,24,680 (79,306 in rural areas and 45,374 in urban areas) and number of persons surveyed was 6,02,833 (3,98,025 in rural areas and 2,04,808 in urban areas). Out of the 1,24,680 households surveyed at the national level, 95,066 households reported Hinduism, 14,785 households Islam, 8,575 households Christianity, 3,037 households Sikhism. The number of households surveyed for other religions i.e. those reporting their religion as Jainism, Buddhism, Zoroastrianism or others, together was 3,217 at the all-India level.

1.6 Contents of the Report

1.6.1 As stated earlier, this report deals with various estimates on employment and unemployment of the people belonging to different religions along with their correlates as obtained from tables generated from data collected on relevant items for the entire round. We would like to sound a note of caution at the outset that *reported* religion of household was a *by-product* of a *general* household *sample* survey aimed at estimating salient characteristics of employment and unemployment of the *general* population and was *not* specifically designed for collecting information on economic conditions of specific religious communities.

1.6.2 For each household surveyed, the reported religion of the head of the household was considered as the religion of *all* the members of the household irrespective of the actual

religion followed by individual members. Seven known major religions viz. Hinduism, Islam, Christianity, Sikhism, Jainism, Buddhism and Zoroastrianism were explicitly considered for data collection as a part of the household characteristics. Some results like, distribution of households, population; distribution of households by household type, land cultivated, monthly per capita expenditure and the worker population ratio, proportion unemployed, etc. have been obtained for each of the major religions (viz. Hinduism, Islam, Christianity and Sikhism) from the survey. Utilising this information, some selected tables by religious group were generated. Consequently, all discussions in this report are limited to only such items/concepts, based on which estimates have been generated. A detailed explanation of these is given in the next chapter entitled 'Concepts and Definitions'.

1.6.3 One can see from our earlier discussion (ref. para 1.5.4 above) that the sample sizes pertaining to religious groups other than Hinduism, Islam, Christianity and Sikhism were small even at the all-India level. The estimates based on such small samples for the smaller religious groups, may not be sufficiently reliable and hence, estimates relating to these religious groups have not been generated separately. Households belonging to these religious groups have been combined together and their estimates presented as "other" religious group.

1.6.4 The report consists of four chapters and appendix tables including the present introductory chapter. Chapter Two describes the concepts and definitions of only those terms covered in this report. The main findings on employment - unemployment situation among major religious groups and their broad household and population characteristics are discussed in Chapter Three. In Chapter Three, wherever state level tables have been presented, they have been placed at the end of the chapter. The detailed tables based on which this report is brought out are presented in the Appendix.

1.6.5 All the estimates presented in this report are based on Central sample data only. Further, the cell-level figures in any of the detailed tables, when added up, may not exactly be equal to the figure shown against the "total" column (or line) due to (i) rounding off and/or (ii) presence of non-response cases.

Chapter Two

Concepts and Definitions

2.0 The concepts and definitions of some important terms used in the survey and relevant to this report are explained in the following paragraphs.

2.1 **Household:** A group of persons who normally lived together and took food from a common kitchen constituted a household. The adverb “normally” means that temporary visitors and guests (whose total period of stay in the household was expected to be less than 6 months) were excluded but temporary stay-aways (whose total period of absence from the household was expected to be less than 6 months) were included. Thus a child residing in a hostel for studies was excluded from the household of his/her parents, but a resident domestic servant or paying guest (but not just a tenant in the house) was included in the employer’s/host’s household. “Living together” was given more importance than “sharing food from a common kitchen” in drawing the boundaries of a household in case the two criteria were in conflict. However, in the special case of a person taking food with his family but sleeping elsewhere (say, in a shop or a different house) due to shortage of space, the household formed by such a person’s family members was taken to include the person also. Each inmate of a hotel, mess, boarding-lodging house, hostel, etc., was considered to be a single-member household except that a family living in a hotel (say) was considered one household only. The same principle was applicable for the residential staff of such establishments. The size of a household is the total number of persons in the household.

2.2 **Land possessed by the household as on date of survey:** The area of land possessed included land ‘owned’, ‘leased in’ and ‘land neither owned nor leased in’ (i.e. encroached) by the household but excluded land ‘leased out’. For a piece of land under the possession of the household, if the household did not have the title of ownership and also did not have lease agreement for the use of land transacted, either verbally or in writing, such land was considered as ‘neither owned nor leased in’. In collecting information regarding land possessed, the actual position as obtained on the date of survey was considered. The ‘area of land possessed’ did not include the area of land owned, leased-in, etc. by the servants/paying guests who were considered as normal members of the household.

2.3 **Land cultivated (including orchard and plantation) during July 2003-June 2004:** Land cultivated (including orchard and plantation) during the agricultural year 2003-2004, i.e., July 2003 to June 2004 was recorded considering cultivation of land from the land ‘owned’, ‘land leased-in’ or from ‘land neither owned nor leased-in’. Area with field crops and area under orchards and plantations was counted only once in the same year/ season. It may be noted that information on land owned, possessed or cultivated as described above was collected in hectares upto 3 places of decimals.

2.4 **General educational level:** A person was considered as literate if he/she could both read and write a simple message with understanding in at least one language. For all the individuals who were found to be literate, the general level of education was collected in terms of highest level of education successfully completed. Highest level of education successfully completed by each member of the household was decided by considering his/her all general/ technical/ vocational educational level and was recorded in terms of 12 categories viz. (i) not literate, (ii) literate without formal schooling: (a) Education Guarantee Scheme (EGS)/Non-formal Education Courses (NFEC)/ Adult Literacy Centres (AEC), (b)

Total Literacy Campaign (TLC), (c) others; (iii) literate but below primary, (iv) middle, (v) secondary, (vi) higher secondary, (vii) diploma/certificate course, (viii) graduate, and (ix) postgraduate and above. The criterion for deciding primary, middle, secondary, etc. levels were the same that has been followed in the concerned states/union territories. The category ‘diploma or certificate course’ meant diploma or certificate courses in general education, technical education or vocational education, which is below graduation level. Diploma or certificate courses in general education, technical education or vocational education, which is equivalent to graduation level, was considered under the category ‘graduate’. Similarly, diploma or certificate courses in general education, technical education or vocational education, which is equivalent to post-graduation level and above were considered under the category ‘post-graduate and above’.

2.5 Status of current attendance in educational institution: Particulars of current attendance in educational institution were recoded for persons of age below 30 years. It was first ascertained whether the person was currently attending any educational institutions (government or private) or not. For persons who were not currently attending any educational institutions, reason for not attending viz. (i) *school too far, (ii) to supplement household income, (iii) education not considered necessary, (iv) to attend domestic chores, and (v) others*, was recorded. For those who were currently attending any educational institution, the course of study pursued by them was recorded in terms of 20 categories viz. (i) *EGS/NFEC/AEC, (ii) TLC, (iii) pre-primary (nursery/Kindergarten, etc.), (iv) primary (class I to IV/V), (v) middle, (vi) secondary and higher secondary, (vii) graduate and above in: (a) agriculture, (b) engineering/technology, (c) medicine, (d) other subjects, (viii) diploma or certificate (below graduate level) in: (a) agriculture, (b) engineering/technology, (c) medicine, (d) crafts, (e) other subjects, (ix) diploma or certificate (graduate and above level) in: (a) agriculture, (b) engineering/technology, (c) medicine, (d) crafts, (e) other subject.* Persons who were registered for any regular correspondence courses or distance education courses for a stipulated period at the end of which, were allowed to appear in the examination for the course, were also considered as ‘currently attending’. Persons who were awaiting results were also considered as ‘currently attending’.

2.6 Economic activity: The entire spectrum of human activity is taken to consist of two categories –economic activities and non-economic activities. Any activity resulting in production of goods and services that add value to national product was considered as an economic activity for the employment and unemployment survey of NSS 61st round. Such activities included production of all goods and services for market (i.e. for pay or profit) including those of government services, and, the production of primary commodities for own consumption and own account production of fixed assets.

2.6.1 The full spectrum of economic activities as defined in the UN system of National Accounts (1993) was not covered in the definition adopted for the NSS 61st round survey of Employment and Unemployment. Production of any good for own consumption is considered as economic activity by UN System of National Accounts but production of only primary goods for own consumption was considered as economic activity by NSSO. While the former considers activities like own account processing of primary products as economic activities, in the NSS, processing of primary products for own consumption was not considered as economic activity.

2.6.2 The term 'economic activity' as defined in the employment and unemployment survey of NSS 61st round, therefore, included:

- (i) all the market activities performed for pay or profit which result in production of goods and services for exchange.
- (ii) of the non-market activities,
 - (a) all the activities relating to the primary sector (i.e. industry Divisions 01 to 14 of NIC-98) which result in production (including free collection of uncultivated crops, forestry, firewood, hunting, fishing, mining, quarrying, etc.) of primary goods for own consumption
 - and
 - (b) the activities relating to the own-account production of fixed assets. Own account production of fixed assets includes construction of own houses, roads, wells, etc., and of machinery, tools, etc., for household enterprise and also construction of any private or community facilities free of charge. A person may be engaged in own account construction in the capacity of either a labourer or a supervisor.

As per the practice followed in earlier rounds, certain activities like prostitution, begging, etc., which though fetched earnings, were not considered as economic activities. Activity status of a person was judged irrespective of the situation whether such activity was carried out illegally in the form of smuggling or not.

2.7 Activity status: It is the activity situation in which a person was found during a reference period with regard to the person's participation in economic and non-economic activities. Each person was classified into one or a combination of the following three broad activity statuses during a specified reference period:

- (i) working or being engaged in economic activity (work) as defined above,
- (ii) being not engaged in economic activity (work) but either making tangible efforts to seek 'work' or being available for 'work' if the 'work' is available and
- (iii) being not engaged in any economic activity (work) and also not available for 'work'.

Broad activity statuses mentioned in (i) and (ii) above are associated with 'being in labour force' and the last with 'not being in the labour force'. Within the labour force, broad activity status (i) and (ii) were associated with 'employment' and 'unemployment', respectively.

2.7.1 Identification of each individual into a unique activity status could pose a problem when more than one of the three broad activity statuses listed above were concurrently obtained for a person. In such an eventuality, the identification uniquely under any one of the three broad activity statuses was done by adopting *either the major time or priority criterion* (see para 2.22.3 below). The former was used for classification of persons according to the 'usual activity status' approach and the latter for classification of persons according to the 'current activity status' approach. Each of the three broad activity statuses was further sub-divided into several detailed activity categories. If a person categorised as engaged in economic activity by adopting one of the two criteria mentioned above was found to be pursuing more than one economic activity during the reference period, the appropriate detailed activity status code related to that activity in which relatively more time had been spent. A similar

procedure was adopted for assigning detailed activity code for persons categorised as engaged in non-economic activity and pursuing more than one non-economic activity.

2.7.2 The detailed activity statuses under each of the three broad activity statuses (viz. employed, unemployed and not in labour force) and the corresponding codes used in the survey are given below:

It may be noted that codes 61, 62, 71, 72, 82 and 98 were applicable for current weekly status and current daily status approaches only.

2.8 **Workers (or employed):** Persons who were engaged in any economic activity or who, despite their attachment to economic activity, abstained from work for reason of illness,

injury or other physical disability, bad weather, festivals, social or religious functions or other contingencies necessitating temporary absence from work, constituted workers. Unpaid helpers who assisted in the operation of an economic activity in the household farm or non-farm activities were also considered as workers. Relevant activity status codes within 11 to 72 were assigned for workers. Workers were further categorized as *self-employed* (relevant activity status codes: 11, 12, 21, 61, 62), *regular wage/salaried employee* (relevant activity status codes: 31, 71, 72), and *casual wage labour* (relevant activity status codes: 41 and 51).

2.9 **Seeking or available for work (or unemployed)**: Persons, who owing to lack of work, had not worked but either sought work through employment exchanges, intermediaries, friends or relatives or by making applications to prospective employers or expressed their willingness or availability for work under the prevailing conditions of work and remuneration, were considered as those who were 'seeking or available for work' (or unemployed). Activity status codes 81 or 82 were assigned for unemployed.

2.10 **Labour force**: Persons who were either 'working' (or employed) or 'seeking or available for work' (or unemployed) constituted the labour force. Persons with activity status codes 11 – 82 constituted the labour force.

2.11 **Not in labour force**: Persons who were neither 'working' nor 'seeking or available for work' for various reasons during the reference period were considered as 'not in labour force'. Persons under this category are students, those engaged in domestic duties, rentiers, pensioners, recipients of remittances, those living on alms, infirm or disabled persons, too young persons, prostitutes, etc. and casual labourers not working due to sickness. Activity status codes 91-95, 97 and 98 were assigned for persons belonging to category 'not in labour force'.

2.12 **Self-employed**: Persons who operated their own farm or non-farm enterprises or were engaged independently in a profession or trade on own-account or with one or a few partners were deemed to be self-employed in household enterprises. The essential feature of the self-employed is that they have *autonomy* (i.e., how, where and when to produce) and *economic independence* (i.e., market, scale of operation and money) for carrying out their operation. The remuneration of the self-employed consists of a non-separable combination of two parts: a reward for their labour and profit of their enterprise. The combined remuneration is wholly determined by the revenue from sales after netting out value of purchased inputs used in production.

2.12.1 **Categories of self-employed persons**: Self-employed persons were categorised as follows:

- (i) **own-account workers**: those self-employed persons who operated their enterprises on their own account or with one or a few partners and who, during the reference period, by and large, ran their enterprise *without hiring any labour*. They could, however, have had unpaid helpers to assist them in the activity of the enterprise;
- (ii) **employers**: those self-employed persons who worked on their own account or with one or a few partners and, who, by and large, ran their enterprise *by hiring labour*; and
- (iii) **helpers in household enterprise**: those self-employed persons (mostly family members) who were engaged in their household enterprises, working full or part time and did not receive any regular salary or wages in return for the work performed. They

did not run the household enterprise on their own but assisted the related person living in the same household in running the household enterprise.

2.13 **Regular wage/salaried employee:** These were persons who worked in others' farm or non-farm enterprises (both household and non-household) and, in return, received salary or wages on a regular basis (i.e. not on the basis of daily or periodic renewal of work contract). This category included not only persons getting time wage but also persons receiving piece wage or salary on a regular basis and paid apprentices, both full time and part-time.

2.14 **Casual wage labour:** A person who was casually engaged in others' farm or non-farm enterprises (both household and non-household) and, in return, received wages according to the terms of the daily or periodic work contract, was a casual wage labour.

2.15.1 **Usual principal activity status:** The usual activity status relates to the activity status of a person during the reference period of 365 days preceding the date of survey. The activity status on which a person spent relatively longer time (i.e. major time criterion) during the 365 days preceding the date of survey is considered as the *usual principal activity status* of the person. To decide the usual principal activity of a person, first a two stage dichotomous classification was followed for determining the broad usual principal activity status (either employed or unemployed or not in labour force) of the person. At the first stage, persons were first categorised as those in the *labour force* (either employed or unemployed) and those *not in the labour force* depending on the major time spent during the 365 days preceding the date of survey. Persons thus adjudged as not belonging to the labour force were assigned the broad activity status 'neither working nor available for work' (*not in the labour force*). At the second stage, for persons belonging to the labour force, the broad activity status of either 'working' (*employed*) or 'not working but seeking and/or available for work' (*unemployed*) was ascertained based on the same criterion viz. relatively longer time spent in accordance with either of the two broad statuses within the labour force during the 365 days preceding the date of survey. Within the broad activity status so determined, the detailed activity status of a person pursuing more than one such activity was determined once again on the basis of the relatively longer time spent on such activities. In terms of activity status codes, codes 11-51 were assigned to persons classified as workers and codes 91-97 to those not in the labour force. In the usual status approach, a single code 81 was assigned to persons seeking or available for work (unemployed persons) while two separate codes 81 (sought work) and 82 (did not seek but was available for work) were assigned to unemployed persons according to current weekly status and current daily status approach.

2.15.2 **Usual subsidiary economic activity status:** A person whose usual principal status was determined on the basis of the major time criterion could have pursued some economic activity for a shorter time throughout the reference year of 365 days preceding the date of survey or for a minor period, which is not less than 30 days, during the reference year. The status in which such economic activity was pursued was the subsidiary economic activity status of that person. Activity status codes 11-51 *only* were applicable for the subsidiary economic activity performed by a person. It may be noted that engagement in work in subsidiary capacity may arise out of the two following situations:

- (i) a person may be engaged in a relatively longer period during the 365 days in economic (non-economic activity) and for a relatively minor period, which is not less than 30 days (not necessarily for a continuous period), in another economic activity (any economic activity). The economic activity, which was pursued for a relatively minor

period but not simultaneously with principal activity, was considered as his/her subsidiary economic activity.

- (ii) a person may be pursuing an economic activity (non-economic activity) almost throughout the year in the principal status and also simultaneously pursuing another economic activity (any economic activity) for a relatively shorter time in a subsidiary capacity. The economic activity, which was pursued for a relatively shorter time, was considered as his/her subsidiary economic activity.

2.15.3 Usual activity status considering principal and subsidiary status taken together: The usual status, determined on the basis of the usual principal activity and usual subsidiary economic activity of a person taken together, is considered as the usual activity status of the person and is written as usual status (ps+ss). According to the usual status (ps+ss), workers are those who perform some work activity either in the principal status or in the subsidiary status. Thus, a person who is not a worker in the usual principal status is considered as worker according to the usual status (ps+ss), if the person pursues some subsidiary economic activity for 30 days or more during 365 days preceding the date of survey.

2.16 Industry and occupation of the work activity: For the employed persons, to record the industry of work, 5-digit classification of NIC-1998 was used and to record the type of occupation, 3-digit classification of NCO-1968 was used. In case two or more industry-occupation combinations corresponding to the status code were reported by a person, the industry-occupation was taken as the one in which *the person spent relatively longer time during the reference period*. To identify certain category of workers under Division 95 (Private households with employed persons) of NIC 1998, six additional codes were used in the survey viz., housemaid /servant (95001), cook (95002), gardener (95003), gatekeeper/chowkidar/watchman (95004), governess/baby-sitter (95005) and 'others' (95009). This apart, separate industry codes were used for recording the activities of letting of building for residential purposes (70104) and letting of building for non-residential purposes (70105).

2.17 Manual work: A job essentially involving physical labour was considered as manual work. However, jobs essentially involving physical labour but also requiring a certain level of general, professional, scientific or technical education were not termed as 'manual work'. On the other hand, jobs not involving much of physical labour and at the same time not requiring much educational (general, scientific, technical or otherwise) background were treated as 'manual work'. Thus, engineers, doctors, dentists, midwives, etc., were not considered manual workers even though their jobs involved some amount of physical labour. But, peons, chowkidars, watchman, etc. were considered manual workers even though their work might not involve much physical labour. Manual work was *defined* as work pursued in one or more of the following occupational groups of the National Classification of Occupations (NCO 1968):

Division 5 (Service workers):

Group 52: cooks, waiters, bartenders and related workers (domestic and institutional).

Group 53: maid and other housekeeping service workers (not elsewhere classified).

Group 54: building caretakers, sweepers, cleaners and related workers.

Group 55: Launderers, dry cleaners and pressers.

Group 56: hair dressers, barbers, beauticians and related workers.

Family 570: fire fighters

Family 574: watchmen, gate-keepers

Family 579: protective service workers not elsewhere classified.

Division 6 (Farmers, Fishermen, Hunters, Loggers and related workers):

Group 63: agricultural labourers

Group 64: plantation labourers and related workers

Group 65: other farm workers

Group 66: forestry workers

Group 67: hunters and related workers

Group 68: fishermen and related workers.

Division 7-8-9 (Production and related workers, transport equipment operators and labourers):

All groups excluding group 85 (electrical fitters and related workers) and group 86 (broadcasting station and sound equipment operators and cinema projectionists).

2.18 **Rural labour:** Manual labour working in agricultural and /or non-agricultural occupations *in return for wages* paid either in cash or in kind (excluding exchange labour) and *living in rural areas*, was taken as rural labour.

2.19 **Agricultural labour:** A person was considered as engaged as agricultural labour, if he/she followed one or more of the following agricultural occupations in the capacity of a wage paid manual labour, whether paid in cash or kind or both:

- (i) farming,
- (ii) dairy farming,
- (iii) production of any horticultural commodity,
- (iv) raising of livestock, bees or poultry,
- (v) any practice performed on a farm as incidental to or in conjunction with farm operations (including forestry and timbering) and the preparation for market and delivery to storage or to market or to carriage for transportation to market of farm produce.

Working in fisheries was *excluded* from agricultural labour. Further, 'carriage for transportation' referred *only to the first stage of the transport* from farm to the first place of disposal.

2.20 Procedure for determining household type: On the basis of the sources of the household's income during the last 365 days preceding the date of survey, the household types were assigned. For this purpose, only the household's income from economic activities was considered. The income of servants and paying guests was not taken as the income of the household. For the **rural** areas, five household types were distinguished as follows:

self-employed in non-agriculture; agricultural labour; other rural labour; self-employed in agriculture; others.

For a rural household, if a single source (among the above mentioned five sources of income) contributes 50% or more of the household's income from economic activities during the last 365 days, it was assigned the type code corresponding to that source. For a household to be classified as 'agricultural labour' or 'self-employed in agriculture,' its income from that source must be 50% or more of its total income. If there is no such source yielding 50% or more of the household's total income, the following procedure was followed.

To be classified as self-employed in non-agriculture, the household's income from that source must be greater than its income from rural labour (all wage-paid manual labour) as well as that from all other economic activities put together (a three-way division is to be considered here). Out of the remaining households a household was classified as other rural labour, if its income from rural labour (all wage-paid manual labour) is greater than that from self-employment as well as that from other economic activities (again a three-way division). All the remaining households were treated as (residual) "others".

For **urban** areas, the four household types were distinguished as follows:

self-employed; regular wage/salary earning; casual labour ; others.

An urban household was assigned the type corresponding to the major source of its income from economic activities during the last 365 days. A household, which does not have any income from economic activities, was treated as "others".

2.21 Procedure for determining household industry and occupation: To determine the household principal industry and occupation, the general procedure followed was to list all the occupations pertaining to economic activities pursued by the members of the household excluding those employed by the household and paying guests (who in view of their staying and taking food in the household were considered as its normal members) during the one year period preceding the date of survey, no matter whether such occupations were pursued by the members in their principal or subsidiary (on the basis of earnings) capacity. Out of the occupations listed that one that fetched the maximum earnings to the household during the last 365 days preceding the date of survey was considered as the principal household occupation. If one or more members of the household pursued the household occupation in different industries, the particular industry out of all the different industries corresponding to the principal occupation, which fetched the maximum earnings, was considered as the principal industry of the household.

2.22 Procedure for collecting monthly per capita consumer expenditure (MPCE): For collection of data on total consumer expenditure of the household in employment and unemployment schedule (Schedule 10), a worksheet was used in the NSS 61st round. The

approximate value of consumer expenditure obtained through the worksheet has been used for studying employment and unemployment characteristics by levels of living of the household. The worksheet contained 36 different items of household consumer expenditure. Depending upon the type of item, either of the two reference periods viz., 30 days and 365 days, was used to record consumption of different groups of items. Three approaches viz (a) consumption approach, (b) expenditure approach and (c) first-use approach, were followed for defining consumption of the following four broad groups of items : (i) *food (other than 'cooked meals'), pan, tobacco & intoxicants and fuel & light (consumption approach)*, (ii) *cooked 'meals, miscellaneous goods and services including education, medical, rent, taxes and cess (expenditure approach)*, (iii) *clothing and footwear (first use approach)* and (iv) *durable goods (expenditure approach)*. The definition of household consumer expenditure and the procedure for valuation was the same for both Schedule 10 and Schedule 1.0. (the survey of consumer expenditure). We may note that the worksheet of 36 items of consumption used in Schedule 10 on employment and unemployment tends to understate the *level* consumer expenditure in comparison with the detailed consumption Schedule 1.0 used in the survey devoted exclusively to consumer expenditure.

Chapter Three

Summary of Findings

3.1 Introduction

3.1.1. The 61st round survey, was carried out in 79,306 sample households in 7999 villages and 45,374 sample households in 4602 urban blocks of India during July 2004 – June 2005. In the survey, information on religion of the household was one of the recorded household characteristics. Based on this data, this chapter presents main findings on certain other household characteristics and employment - unemployment indicators for the different religious groups. The estimates of key indicators are given for all-India and different states/uts. However, the discussion in the text is mostly confined to all-India estimates only. Comparison with the earlier survey results has also been presented at the all-India level.

3.1.2. Since the sample sizes pertaining to the religious groups other than Hinduism, Islam, Christianity and Sikhism were either small even at the all-India level (as mentioned in para 1.5.4 of Chapter One) or were concentrated only in a few states, the estimates of broad indicators pertaining to only four major religious groups, viz., Hinduism, Islam, Christianity and Sikhism, at the all-India level are discussed in this chapter. Tables 0.1 and 0.2, appearing at the end of this chapter, give the number of households and persons surveyed, respectively, in the different states/uts by the religion of the head of the household. Though the data have been presented for all states/uts, the comparison of the estimates among the states/uts has been restricted to only major states. The comparison of estimates of various characteristics for the states/uts with a small number of sample observations may be attempted with due caution.

3.1.3. Generally, the population estimates obtained from the NSS are found to be lower than those in the population census or the projections thereof. The differences are mainly due to differences in coverage and methods adopted by the NSS in comparison with those of the census operation. However, ratios obtained from the NSS are expected to be reasonably robust. Hence, the estimates on employment- unemployment are presented as ratios. To estimate an absolute number in any category, it is advisable to apply the survey estimates of ratios to the census population, or projections thereof, for that category. The estimates of aggregates given in the detailed tables are meant to help us to combine the ratios and should not be used for deriving estimates of absolute numbers for a particular characteristic. As the tables are generally presented for per thousand distributions, the figures are rounded off. Thus, while using the ratios from the survey results, it is to be noted that the accuracy of these derived aggregates will be limited to the number of significant digits available in the ratio or percentage estimates presented in the report. The estimated aggregates, wherever possible, can be used to get ratios up to desired decimal places.

3.2 Households and Population

3.2.1. Distribution of households and persons by religious group:

3.2.1.1. Statement 3.1 gives per thousand distribution of households by religion separately for rural and urban areas at the all-India level. The corresponding figures for state/uts are given in

statements 3.1.1R and 3.1.1U respectively, for rural and urban areas. Similar distributions for persons at the all-India level are given in statement 3.2(a). The corresponding figures for states/uts are given in statements 3.2.1R and 3.2.1U. It may be seen that in rural India during 2004-05, about

84 per cent of households having 83 per cent of population followed Hinduism whereas 10 per cent of households followed Islam with about 12 per cent of population. Further, about 2 per cent of households and population followed Christianity. In urban areas, the percentage of households and population were about 80 and 77,

respectively for Hinduism, 13 and 16 for Islam and 3 and 3 for Christianity.

3.2.1.2. Statements 3.1 and 3.2(a) give the comparison of the three quinquennial rounds of NSS, viz., 61st round in 2004-05, 55th round in 1999-2000 and 50th in 1993-94. It may be noted that in the 50th round, only 3 out of 14 districts of Jammu & Kashmir could be surveyed whereas, in the 55th round 12 of these districts were surveyed. In the 61st round, Leh and Kargil districts of Jammu & Kashmir were excluded. Further, all the sample first stage units of the districts

Poonch, Rajouri and the rural samples of district Doda were also out of the survey coverage. Therefore, to study the changes in the estimates of households and population over time for the

various religious groups, in Statements 3.1 and 3.2(a) a comparable set of estimates at the all-India level has also been given by excluding the whole of Jammu & Kashmir for the 61st, 55th and 50th rounds. However, all other statements in this chapter include unadjusted figures for Jammu & Kashmir. It is observed that in rural areas, the proportion of Hindu households shows a steady decline whereas that for Muslim households, it shows a rise during the period from 1993-94 to 2004-05. For urban area, the proportions remained almost unchanged during this period. The proportions of all other religious groups during the same period remained almost unchanged both for rural and urban areas. Similar patterns are observed in the distribution of persons in different religious groups during the periods 1993-94, 1999-2000 and 2004-05.

3.2.1.3. In the population census 2001, religion of each person in the country was also ascertained. In the NSS, however, the religions of all the members of the household were taken to be the same as

unadjusted and adjusted proportions of Hindus, as per NSS, are about 1 percentage point higher as compared to those of population census 2001. As regards the Muslim population, the difference in the adjusted proportion is almost negligible whereas in the unadjusted proportion, the population census 2001 figure is about 1 percentage point higher. The marginal differences in the proportions in the two sources may be due to method of data collection, concepts followed, etc.

3.2.1.4. There were wide variations in the shares of households and populations among different religious groups among the major states. In rural areas, the proportion of Hindu households was more than 96 per cent in Orissa, Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh. Apart from Jammu & Kashmir, the states with high proportions of rural Muslim households were Assam and West Bengal. About 21 per cent of the households in rural areas of Kerala were Christian households. In urban areas, Haryana, Chhattisgarh and Orissa had more than 90 per cent of Hindu households. Apart from Jammu & Kashmir, the proportion of Muslim households in urban areas was high in Uttar Pradesh and Kerala while the proportion of Christian households was the highest in Kerala. The state-wise distributions of persons broadly follow similar orders of magnitudes as those observed among households for major religious groups. In rural areas, Himachal Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Orissa have more than 96 per cent Hindu population. In addition to Jammu & Kashmir, the proportion of Muslim population was more than 25 per cent in Kerala, West Bengal and Assam. Kerala had the highest concentration (19 per cent) of Christian population. In urban areas, the proportion of Hindus was more than 91 per cent in Chhattisgarh, Orissa, Haryana and Himachal Pradesh. As regards Muslims, the proportion was more than 21 per cent in Karnataka, Kerala and Uttar Pradesh. The highest percentage (19 per cent) for Christians was found in Kerala.

3.2.2. Sex Ratio:

3.2.2.1. An important indicator of the social condition, particularly with respect to women's status, of any society is its 'sex ratio' (number of females per 1000 males). Statement 3.3 gives the sex ratios for three major religious groups during 2004-05, 1999-2000 and 1993-94. During 2004-05, in both the rural and urban areas, the sex ratio was the highest among Christians (994 in rural and 1000 in urban areas) followed by Muslims (968 in rural and 932 in urban). For Hindus, it was 961 in rural and 912 in urban areas. In rural areas, the sex ratio for Hindus showed a steady improvement between 1993-94 and 2004-05 whereas it fluctuated in the case of Muslims and Christians. The sex ratio for the entire rural population showed a steady improvement.

population showed a steady improvement.

3.2.2.2. In urban areas, for Hindus, though there was some improvement in sex ratio during 1993-94 to 1999-2000 but it remained unchanged from 1999-2000 to 2004-05. For Muslims, it showed a steady increase between 1993-94 and 2004-05 whereas for Christians, though there was a remarkable rise in sex ratio between 1993-94 and 1999-2000 it showed some decline between 1999-2000 and 2004-05. Similar to the rural areas, the sex ratio for the entire urban population showed an upward movement.

3.2.3. Distribution of Households by Household Type:

3.2.3.1. In NSS 61st round (2004-05), each surveyed household was categorised under an appropriate 'household type' (See para 2.20 in chapter 2). The type/nature of work that fetched

maximum income to the household during the reference period of 365 days preceding the date of survey determined its household type. Distributions (per 1000) of households by household type for major religious groups in rural and urban areas are given in Statements 3.4R and 3.4U.

3.1.7 In the rural areas, ‘self-employment’ – in agriculture as well as non-agriculture -- was the mainstay for all the religious groups. In 2004 – 05, about 37 per cent of Hindu households depended on ‘self-employment in agriculture’. The corresponding proportion was 35 per cent for the Christians and 26 per cent for the Muslims. The proportions of households depending on ‘self-employment in non-agriculture’ were 14 per cent for the Hindus, 28 per cent for the Muslims and

15 per cent for the Christians. In the case of ‘rural labour’ households, the proportions varied from 32 per cent (Muslims) to 37 per cent (Hindus). Between 1999-2000 and 2004-05, the proportion of self-employed as a whole increased for all the major religions. The proportion of ‘rural labour’ households decreased for all the major religions. In urban India, during 2004 - 05 the proportion of Hindu households depending on ‘self-employment’, ‘regular wage/salary’ and ‘casual labour’ were 36 per cent, 43 per cent and 12 per cent, respectively, whereas the same for Muslim households were 49 per cent, 30 per cent and 14 per cent, respectively, and for the Christians 27 per cent, 47 per cent and 11 per cent respectively. It can be observed that, though there were noticeable differences in the proportion of self-employed or regular wage/salaried persons over the religious groups, the proportions of the casual labourers were not substantially different among various religious groups. The proportion of casual labourers declined for the major religious groups during 1999-2000 and 2004-05. During the same period, for Muslims, the proportion of ‘regular wage/salaried’ households showed some rise while it declined for Christians. For Hindus, this proportion fell from 46 per cent in 1993 – 94 to 43 per cent in 2004 - 05.

3.2.4. Distribution of households by size class of land cultivated:

3.2.4.1. For the purpose of the survey, land cultivated was defined as the net area sown during the agricultural year (AY) 2003-04, i.e. July 2003 to June 2004, corresponding to the survey period of 2004-2005. In the rural areas, amount of land cultivated by a household reflects, to a great extent, the economic status of the household. Proportions (per 1000) of households in five different

proportions of households, with land cultivated 2.01 to 4.00 hectares was highest among Hindus (8 per cent) followed by Christians (5 per cent) and Muslims (3 per cent). It can also be seen that proportion of households with land cultivated 4.01 hectares or more which was at only 4per cent at the all-India level, was the highest among Hindu households followed by Christian households.

3.2.4.2. A comparative picture of these households for the agriculture years 2003-04,1992-93 and 1998-99 is also given in the statements. It is observed that the proportion of households with land cultivated area 0.40 hectare or less remained almost the same for Hindus, increased by 2 percentage points for Muslims and decreased by 9 percentage points for Christians in AY 2003 – 04 as compared to AY 1992 - 93. In the other categories, Hindu and Muslim households generally either showed no change or a decline but Christian households showed a rise during AY 1993 – 94 and AY 2003 – 04. The details at state/uts level are given in statement 3.5.1.

3.2.5. Distribution of household monthly per capita expenditure (mpce) class:

3.2.5.1. Household monthly per capita expenditure (mpce), which serves as a proxy for income, is usually taken to reflect the living standard of household members. In the 61st round survey on

surveyed in the NSS 61st round (2004-05), statements 3.6R and 3.6U are given for rural and urban population respectively. It may be noted that the class limits for mpce class-intervals given in the statements and the appendix tables of this report are based on the data collected in detailed schedule 1.0 (household consumer expenditure) in this round. The class-limits of mpce classes were determined, separately for rural and urban sectors of all-India, in such a manner that each of the first two and last two classes contained around 5 per cent of the population and each of the remaining classes around 10 per cent population. Having the mpce class intervals so determined, the distribution of household by mpce class interval was obtained for major religious group based on the data on household consumer expenditure collected through the abridged work sheet.

3.2.5.2. From statement 3.6R, it may be seen that in rural India, the proportion of households in the three lowest mpce classes combined (viz. less than Rs. 320) was higher among Hindus (14 per cent) and Muslims (12 per cent) as compared to Christians (8 per cent) and Sikhs (2 per cent). However,

employment-unemployment, data on consumption expenditure was collected through a separate abbreviated work sheet, which was integrated with the employment-unemployment schedule. In addition, while a reference period of 30 days was used for most of the items, for durables and a few other relatively infrequently purchased items (education, institutional medical expenditure, clothing and bedding, footwear, furniture, cooking and household appliances, etc.) a 365-day reference period was used. On both counts, the results based on the 61st round employment survey and the corresponding results of the previous rounds are not strictly comparable. Based on the data on household consumer expenditure collected through the worksheet from the sample households

less than Rs. 485 a month in 2004-05 was the highest among Muslims (25 per cent) followed by Hindus (12 per cent), Christians (8 per cent) and Sikhs (5 per cent), while the proportions of those spending Rs. 1380 or more was the highest among the Sikhs (45 per cent) followed by the Christians (38 per cent), Hindus (28 per cent) and Muslims (13 per cent). Also, it is observed that in rural sector, the proportion of households with mpce Rs. 455 or less, was highest for Muslims (44 per cent) closely followed by Hindus (41 per cent) whereas those of Christians (22 per cent) and

Sikhs (14 per cent) were remarkably low. On the other hand, in the urban sector, the proportion of households with mpce Rs. 790 or more, was the highest for Sikhs (80 per cent), followed by Christians (70 per cent), Hindus (60 per cent) and Muslims (38 per cent).

3.2.6. Age distribution of persons:

3.2.6.1. The distribution of population by age group and sex for each religious group can help in better understanding of the results on employment and unemployment. In statement 3.7, the distributions of rural and urban populations by broad age group are presented for the three major religious groups and sex for years 1993 – 1994, 1999 – 2000 and 2004 - 2005. The proportion of children (0-14 years) in the rural areas had remained almost at the same level for the three major religious groups during 1993-94 and 1999-2000 both for males and females but decreased during 1999-2000 and 2004-05. These proportions had decreased continuously during 1993-94 and 2004-05. in the urban areas among all of these religions for both the sexes. The proportion of children during 2004-05 was the highest among Muslims followed by Hindus and Christian. As regards the working age populations (15 – 59 years), the proportion was generally the highest among Christians for both rural and urban areas and both for males and females during 2004 – 05 followed by Hindus and Muslims.

3.2.7. Distribution of persons by education level:

3.2.7.1. Educational attainment represents human capital accumulation and determines, to a large extent, the employment prospects of an individual. Thus, it is important to study the distribution of population by educational attainment before taking up a discussion on employment and its

correlates. Distribution of persons of age 15 years and above by their educational level has been presented in statements 3.8R and 3.8U respectively for rural and urban areas. Estimates obtained from the previous quinquennial surveys on the subject are also presented in the statement to see the changes over time in the levels of literacy and educational attainment. Among the major religious groups, Christians had the highest literacy rate for both rural and urban areas and in both

males and females. Except for rural females, the proportion of literates among Hindus was higher than that among Muslims. As expected, the proportion of illiterates was higher in the rural areas than that in the urban areas in all the religious groups. During 2004 - 05 only among the rural females, the literacy rates were at par among Hindus and Muslims (41 per cent). The corresponding rate was as high as 69 per cent among Christians. The proportion of educated persons, i.e. those with educational level secondary and above, was also far greater among Christians than that in the other two major religions in all the three years under study. Between 1993-94 and 2004-05, Hindus and Muslims managed to catch up with Christians in literacy, the increase in the proportion of literates among Hindus and Muslims being higher than among Christians. The proportions of the educated, however, increased among all the three major religions during 1993 - 94 and 2004 - 05.

3.2.8. Educational institution attendance rate:

3.2.8.1. The school attendance rate, i.e. the number of children attending any educational institution per 1000 children, along with literacy levels, also reflects human capital in making for the future workforce. The educational institution attendance rates of children by broad age group (up to age 24) separately for each major religious group during 2004-05 (61st round), 1999-2000 (55th round) and 1993-94 (50th round) are given in statement 3.9. School attendance rates, as in the case of literacy rates, were the highest among the Christians in both the sectors as well as both the sexes, followed by those among Hindus and Muslims. The rates were higher among males than

among females and also higher in urban areas than in rural areas. They were the highest in the age-group 10-14 years for all the major religious groups among males. However, for females, attendance rates in age groups 5 – 9 and 10 – 14 years for most of the religious groups were more or less the same. While there was all-round increase in the attendance rates in different age groups between 5 to 24 years between 1993-94 and 2004-05 among the major religious groups for all the categories (males-females, rural-urban), the magnitude of increase for Christian girls was lower than that for other religious groups.

3.3 Employment & Unemployment

3.3.0. The NSS generates estimates of indicators of employment-unemployment from the data collected through its quinquennial employment-unemployment surveys using three different approaches, viz. 'usual status (us) approach, current weekly status (cws) approach and current daily status (cds) approach'. Estimates with respect to religious groups included in this report have been generated using only the usual status approach.

3.3.1. Labour Force

3.3.1.1. Labour force, or in other words, the 'economically active' population, refers to the population, which supplies or seeks to supply labour for production and, therefore, includes both 'employed' and 'unemployed' persons. The Labour Force Participation Rate (LFPR), which gives the number of persons belonging to the labour force per 1000 persons, has been obtained according to usual status taking into consideration both the usual principal status(ps) and the subsidiary status (ss).

3.3.1.2. **Estimates of LFPR:** The estimates of LFPRs have been given for all-India in statement 3.10 for the years 1993 – 1994, 1999 – 2000 and 2004 – 2005.

3.3.1.3. It can be seen that the rural-urban differentials exist in the LFPRs for all the religious groups. The LFPRs for males are much higher than those for females - the differentials being greater in the urban areas and particularly among Muslims during all the three years. The movements of LFPRs generally indicate a dip between 1993-94 and 1999-2000 before showing some rise in 2004-05 in both the rural and the urban areas for all the major religious communities.

3.3.1.4. The details of LFPR at states/uts level are given in statement 3.10.1R and 3.10.1U for rural and urban areas, respectively.

3.4. Employed (Workforce)

3.4.0. In the usual status approach, the workforce has been defined as the 'number of persons who worked for a relatively longer period during a reference period of 365 days preceding the date of survey.' In the usual status approach, the estimates of usually employed population are provided in two categories - usually employed in the principal status (ps workers) and usually employed in the subsidiary status (ss workers). The two categories taken together (ps + ss) constitute the total usually employed or 'all' workers. The number of persons employed per 1000 persons is referred to as the workforce participation rate or worker population ratio (WPR). The estimates for WPR have been generated only for 'all' (ps + ss) workers and hence the discussions are restricted to 'all' workers only.

3.4.1. Estimates of WPR:

3.4.1.1. The estimates of WPRs per 1000 persons according to the usual status (ps & ss taken together) have been given separately for each major religious group in statement 3.11. during 2004 - 05. In the rural areas of the country, WPR among the males of all ages in 2004-05 was the highest among Christians (56 per cent) followed by Hindus (55 per cent). The corresponding figure for Muslims was lower (50 per cent). As in the case of males, WPR for females for Christians (36 per cent) and Hindus (34 per cent) was much higher than that for Muslims (18 per cent). In urban India, the WPR among males was the highest among Hindus (56 per cent) followed by Muslims (53 per cent) and Christians (51 per cent). The WPR for Christian women (24 per cent) was much higher than that for Hindu (17 per cent) and Muslim women (12 per cent). The comparative estimates of WPRs for persons of age 15 years & above are given in the table within parentheses.

3.4.1.2. A comparison of the WPRs between the three points of time, viz. 1993-94, 1999-2000 and 2004-05, shows that the movements observed for the labour force participation rates (discussed in para 3.3.1.2.) broadly also hold for WPR also. WPRs for Hindus fell from 1993-94 to 1999-2000 for both males and females in the rural areas and for females in urban areas before showing some

Fig 3.11 Worker Population ratios in major religious groups in 2004-05 in urban India

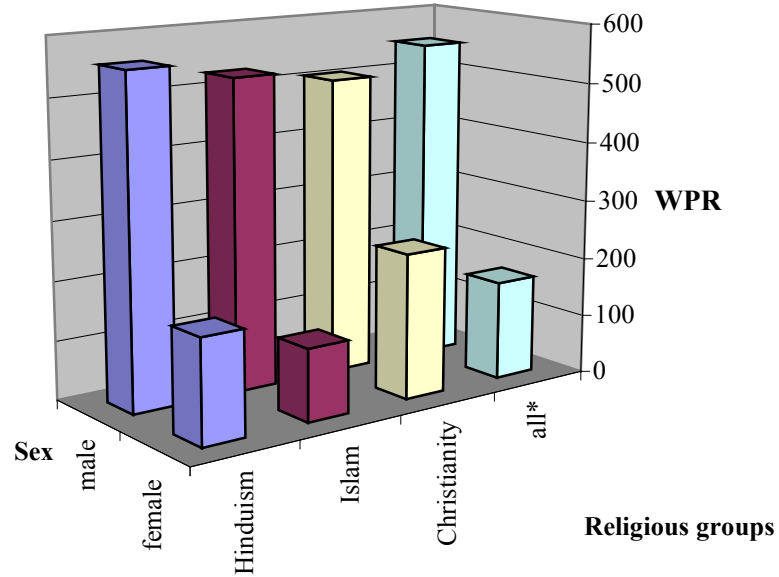
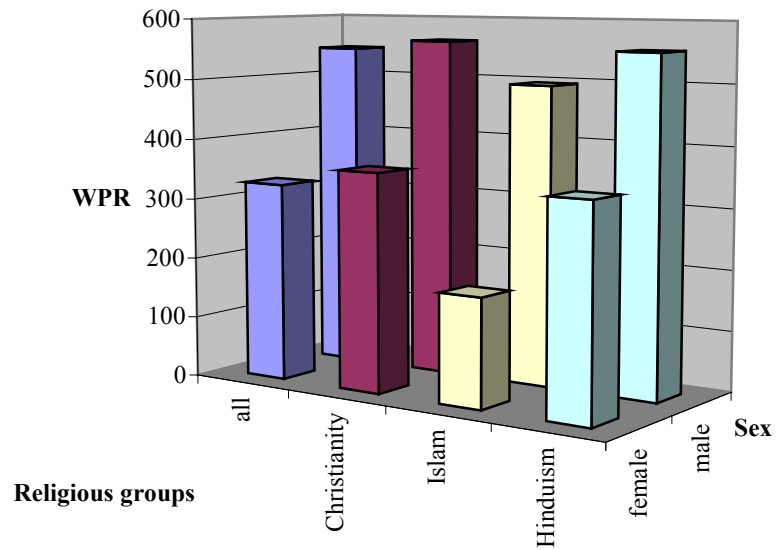


Fig. 3.11 Worker Population Ratios in main religious groups during 2004-05 in rural India



rise in 2004-05. But, for Muslims, the WPR remained around the same level for rural females and urban males between 1993-94 and 1999-2000. The WPR has, however, increased marginally only for the rural males and urban females among the Christians between 1993-94 and 1999-2000 before levelling off.

3.4.2.1. The distribution of the employed persons across educational levels for a given section of population at a given point of time reflects the quality of its workforce at that time. For that purpose, per 1000 distribution of the usually employed workers of age 15 years and above is presented in statements 3.12R and 3.12U for rural and urban population, respectively, for the three

main religions. The corresponding distributions for 1993-94 obtained from NSS 50th round and for 1999-2000 obtained from 55th round are also given in the statement. The quality of the workforce in terms of educational level is much better for Christians than for Hindus or Muslims. The position of Hindus is better than that of the Muslims in this regard. Between the periods 1993-94 and 2004-05, there was a noticeable improvement in the educational standards of workers in all the major religious groups except among Christians where the proportion of 'not literate' category of male and

female workers remained almost constant in urban area. In the urban areas, the education level among workers was, in general, higher than that in the rural areas, irrespective of the religion. The proportion of 'educated' i.e. those with educational level secondary and above, among workers showed an increase during 1993 – 94 and 2004 - 05 except for Christian women workers in urban areas, where it remained at the same level. The proportion of the workers with secondary and above educational level among urban males remained virtually unchanged among Hindus, increased among Muslims but decreased among Christian during 1999 –2000 and 2004 – 05. However, the

same proportion increased for urban females among Hindus and Muslims and decreased among Christians during the same period.

3.4.3. Education level-specific usual status worker population ratio for persons of age 15 years and above:

3.4.3.1. Among persons of age 15 years and above, the number of persons who are usually employed (ps + ss) in a particular education category per 1000 persons in that education category is defined as the education level-specific worker population ratio. For working out such education-specific worker-population ratios, the persons of age 15 years and above are classified into 6 categories, viz., 'not literate', 'literate and up to primary', 'middle', 'secondary', 'higher secondary' and 'graduate and above' and a combined category of 'educated', i.e. those with education 'secondary & above'. The relevant worker-population ratios for rural and urban India for 'all' usual (ps + ss) status workers are shown in statements 3.13R and 3.13U. Across the three rounds, for males/females, for all the major religious groups and for the rural and urban areas, with a few exceptions, WPRs generally showed a tendency to decline with education till the higher secondary level before rising for the highest educational level of graduate and above. It can also be seen that

for the male WPR for the 'educated' category was the highest among Hindus followed by that among Christians and Muslims in the rural areas. However, in the urban areas, it was almost equal among Muslims and Hindus and lower among Christians. For females in the 'educated' category, however, the rates were the highest among Christians followed by Hindus and Muslims in both rural and urban areas. Between 1993-94 and 2004-05, the rural WPRs for the 'educated' category generally increased - for females in all religious groups as also for Hindu and Christian males. Between the same two time-points in the urban areas, declining tendencies were observed for Muslim and Christian females whereas increases were recorded for Muslim males and Hindu females.

3.4.4. Workers by status of employment:

3.4.4.1. Employed persons (in principal and subsidiary status taken together or 'all' workers) are categorised into three broad groups according to their status of employment. The groups are self-employed, regular wage/salaried employees and casual labourers. Statement 3.14 shows the

distribution of workers by employment status for major religious groups at the all-India level for the years 1993 – 94,1999 – 2000 and 2004 - 05. As expected, during 2004 - 05 more than half of the workers in the rural areas were self-employed, the proportion being the highest among Muslim workers, both males and females in both rural and urban areas. The proportion of casual labourer was highest among Hindus females in both rural and urban areas. This proportion was the lowest among Muslims for both rural and urban males and highest among Christians for urban males. A comparison between 1999 – 2000 and 2004 – 05 reveals that the proportion of self-employed generally increased for both males and females in both rural and urban areas for all major religious groups. The proportion of regular wage/salaried females generally increased during this period among all major religions in both rural and urban areas. The proportion of casual labourer generally decreased during this period for males and females among all religious groups. The magnitudes of percentage point declines in the proportions of casual labours were higher among Christian males and females than those in other major religious groups in rural areas.

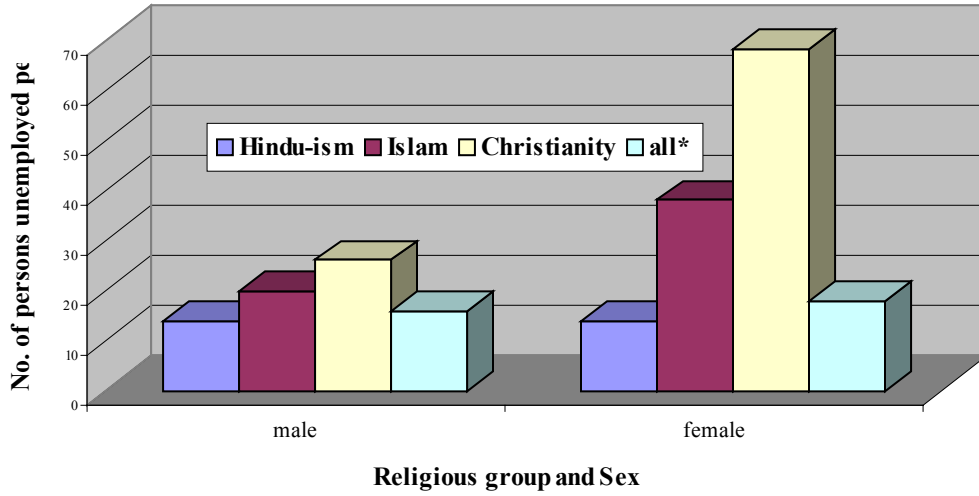

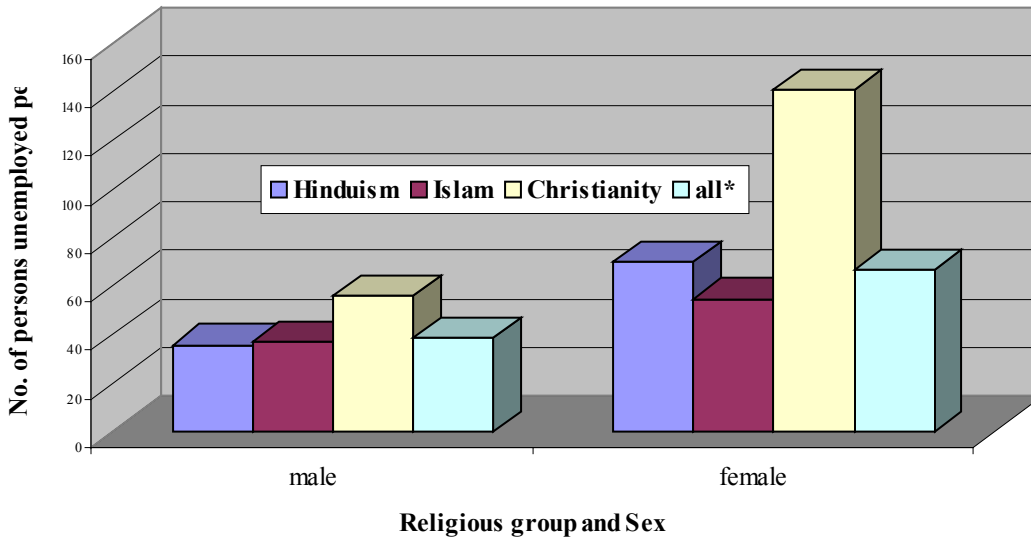
3.5.1.2. During 2004-05, the unemployment rate was higher for males as well for females in rural as well as urban areas among the Christians than Hindus or Muslims. It was highest among urban Christian women. The unemployment rate was higher in urban areas for both males and females as compared to rural areas. Further unemployment rates for females were higher in all major religious groups as compared to males in both rural and urban areas.

Sample Design and Estimation Procedure

1 Introduction

1.1 The 61st round (July 2004-June 2005) of NSS was earmarked for survey on 'Household Consumer Expenditure' and 'Employment and Unemployment'. The survey covered the whole of the Indian Union *except* (i) Leh (Ladakh) and Kargil districts of Jammu & Kashmir, (ii) interior villages of Nagaland situated beyond 5 kilometres of the bus route and (iii) villages in Andaman and Nicobar Islands which remained inaccessible throughout the year. All the sample first-stage units of the districts Poonch and Rajouri of Jammu & Kashmir, all rural samples of the district Doda of Jammu & Kashmir, and all rural samples of the district Nicobar of Andaman and Nicobar Islands became casualty and therefore, the district Poonch and Rajouri of Jammu & Kashmir, rural areas of the district Doda of Jammu & Kashmir and rural areas of the district Nicobar of Andaman and Nicobar Islands are outside the survey coverage. The survey period was divided into four sub-rounds of three months duration each and an equal number of sample villages/blocks (FSUs), as far as possible, were allotted for survey in each of these four sub-rounds.

2 Sample Design

2.1 A stratified multi-stage sampling design for rural as well as urban areas was adopted for selection of the sample units for the 61st round survey. The first-stage units (FSUs) were the census 2001 villages (panchayat wards for Kerala) for rural areas and the NSSO Urban Frame Survey (UFS) blocks for urban areas. The ultimate stage units (USUs) were the households for both rural and urban areas. Hamlet-groups/sub-blocks constituted the intermediate stage whenever these were formed in the sample FSUs.

2.2 *Selection of the first-stage units:* The various steps involved before making the selection of the FSUs are discussed at length in the following few paragraphs before taking up the issue of selection of USUs within a FSU.

2.2.1 *Sampling frame for the first-stage units (FSUs):* For rural areas, the list of 2001 census villages constituted the sampling frame for selection of sample FSUs for most of the states. For the rural areas of Kerala, however, the list of panchayat wards was used as the sampling frame for selection of panchayat wards. For the urban areas, the latest lists of UFS blocks constituted the sampling frame for selection of sample FSUs.

2.2.2 *Stratification of the first stage units:* Within each district of a State/UT, two separate basic strata were formed as follows:

1. rural stratum comprising all the rural areas of the district
2. urban stratum comprising all the urban areas of the district.

However, if there were one or more towns with population 10 lakhs or more as per population census 2001 in a district, each of them formed a separate basic stratum and the remaining urban areas of the district were regarded as another basic stratum. As per census 2001, there were 27 towns with population 10 lakhs or more at the all-India level.

2.2.3 *Sub-stratification of the first-stage units in rural areas:* Within a district, if 'r' number of FSUs were allocated for a rural stratum, a total number of 'r/2' sub-strata were formed within that rural stratum. The villages within the stratum were first arranged in ascending order of population as per the frame and then 'r/2' number of sub-strata were formed in such a way that each sub-stratum comprised a group of villages of the arranged frame having more or less equal populations.

2.2.4 *Sub-stratification of the first stage units in urban areas:* Within a district, if 'u' number of FSUs were allocated for an urban stratum, a total number of 'u/2' sub-strata were formed within that urban stratum. The towns within the stratum, except those with a population of 10 lakhs or more, were first arranged in ascending order of population as per the frame and then UFS blocks of each town were arranged by IV unit no. × block no. in ascending order of the number. From this arranged frame of UFS blocks of all the towns within the stratum, 'u/2' number of sub-stratas were formed in such a way that each sub-stratum had more or less an equal number of UFS blocks. For towns with population 10 lakhs or more, the urban blocks were first arranged by IV unit no. × block no. in ascending order of the number and then 'u/2' number of sub-strata were formed in such a way that each sub-stratum had more or less equal number of UFS blocks.

2.2.5 *Allocation of FSUs among Strata:* At the all-India level, a total number of 12788 FSUs (8128 villages and 4660 urban blocks) were allocated for survey and this was allocated to the different States and UTs in proportion to population as per census 2001 subject to the availability of investigators, ensuring more or less uniform work-load. The State/UT level sample size was then allocated between rural and urban sectors in proportion to population as per census 2001 with 1.5 weightage to urban sector subject to the restriction that urban sample size for bigger states like Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu, etc., should not exceed the rural sample size. A minimum of 8 FSUs has been allocated to each state/UT separately for rural and urban areas. Within each of the rural and urban sectors of a State/UT, the respective sample size was allocated to the different strata in proportion to the stratum population as per census 2001. Allocations at stratum level, for both rural and urban strata, were adjusted to a multiple of 4 with a minimum sample size of 4.

2.2.6 *Selection of first-stage units:* From each sub-stratum of the rural stratum of a district, two FSUs were selected with probability proportional to size with replacement (PPSWR), size being the population as per population census 2001. From each sub-stratum of the urban stratum of a district, two FSUs were selected with simple random sampling without replacement (SRSWOR). Within each sub-stratum, samples were drawn in the form of two independent sub-samples in both the rural and urban sectors.

2.3 *Selection of ultimate stage units within a FSU:* The remaining paragraphs of this sub-section gives an outline the various steps leading to the actual selection of USUs within a FSU.

2.3.1 *Selection of hamlet-groups/sub-blocks:* Large villages/blocks having approximate current population of 1200 or more were divided into a suitable number of hamlet-groups in the rural areas and sub-blocks in the urban areas as given below:

For rural areas of Himachal Pradesh, Sikkim and Poonch, Rajouri, Udhampur, Doda districts of Jammu and Kashmir and Idukki district of Kerala, the large villages were divided into a suitable number of hamlet-groups as follows:

@ number of hamlet-groups formed = 1 indicates that the whole FSU was considered for listing.

Hamlet-groups/sub-blocks were formed by more or less equalising populations. Two hamlet-groups/sub-blocks were selected from a large village/UFS block by SRSWOR. Listing and selection of the households were done independently in the two selected hamlet-groups/sub-blocks.

2.3.2 Sampling frame of households: All households listed in a village/UFS block where no hamlet-group/sub-block formation was done, or the households listed in the two selected hamlet-groups/sub-blocks of the village/UFS block where hamlet-group/sub-block formation was done, constituted the sampling frame of households.

2.3.3 Stratification of rural households: For the employment and unemployment survey of the 61st round, all households listed in the selected village/block/ hamlet-group/sub-block were stratified into three second-stage strata (SSS). The three second-stage-strata (SSS) formed in the rural areas were:

- SSS 1: relatively affluent households
- SSS 2: from the remaining households, households having principal earning from non- agricultural activity
- SSS 3: other households

A household was classified as ‘affluent’ if the household (i) owned any of the items like motor car/ jeep/tractor/truck/bus/van/colour TV/DVD/VCP/telephone/fridge/ washing machine, etc., or (ii) one of the household member was a professional such as doctor, advocate, etc., or (iii) the household owned 7 hectares or more of cultivable land/3.5 hectares or more of irrigated land or (iv) owned at least 10 heads of cattle or buffaloes.

2.3.4 *Stratification of urban households:* The three second-stage-strata (SSS) formed in the urban areas were:

SSS 1: households with $MPCE > A$

SSS 2: households with $MPCE$ such that $B \leq MPCE \leq A$

SSS 3: households with $MPCE < B$

The two cut-off points A and B were determined at NSS Region level in such a way that top 10% of households had $MPCE$ more than A and bottom 30% had $MPCE$ less than B .

2.3.5 *Selection of households:* For the employment and unemployment survey, a total of 10 households were selected from each sample village/block. In both rural and urban areas, in case no hamlet-group/sub-block formation was done in the village/block, 2, 4 and 4 households were selected from the second stage strata SSS1, SSS2 and SSS3, respectively. In case hamlet-groups/sub-blocks were formed in the village/block, 1, 2 and 2 households were selected respectively from the second stage strata SSS1, SSS2 and SSS3 of each of the hamlet-groups/sub-blocks. The sample households from each of the second-stage strata were selected by SRSWOR.

2.4 The number of village/blocks allotted for survey in the NSS 61st round along with the number of village/blocks actually surveyed and number of persons enumerated in respect of employment and unemployment survey are given for different states and union territories in Table 1 at the end of Appendix-B.
