

# **Educational Report - Kathua**

**1977-78 to 1979-80**

**Government of Jammu & Kashmir,**

**Kathua**

INTRODUCTION

Deothua District is situated in the south east of Jammu and Kashmir State and its boundaries touch Himachal Pradesh and Punjab States, and districts of Jammu, Kathua and Boda. The northern part of the district is situated in the foot hills of Himalayas and includes the Shivalik range. The southern part is alluvial plains.

On the East the district is bounded by the River Ravi which has considerable irrigation and power potentiality. At present a part of Deothua tehsil is irrigated by Deothua canal from the Ravi River. A project for additional utilization of water from Ravi and Ujh rivers is under construction. The district is rich in chir and Deodar forests and extraction of resin is taken up at a large scale. There are huge reserves of cement grade limestones in Deothua, Bapoli.

The Jammu railway line passes through the district and there are five railway stations located within the district. Two important roads namely Jammu Kathua national highway and Dhar Udhampur road also pass through the district.

Except for District and tehsil headquarter town the district is entirely rural. The major occupation of the people is agriculture. Development of Industries is at the initial stage only. There is only one medium scale industrial unit namely Chenab Textile Mills located near Deothua. A number of small scale industrial units are being set up.

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DISTRICT PLANNING AND PROCEDURE 1977-78:

District Planning was introduced during 1977-78 with the objective of

- a/ Making Planning more reflective.
- b/ Ensuring speedy and balance implementation of the development programme.

For formulation of district plan a District Development Board has been created with the association of non-officials to increase the involvements of people in the formulation and implementation of planning. The District Development Commissioner is the head of the development Administration and has been given larger delegation of financial and administrative powers. He is assisted by a District Superintending Engineer with the powers of Chief Engineer so that the bulk of the sanctions and administrative approvals issued at the District level.

The procedure adopted for the current year's plan is as follows :-

- (a) The size of the annual plan outlay has been indicated by the Planning Department leaving out sectorwise allocation.
- (b) The District Officers incharge of sectoral programme and District Development Commissioner prepared the draft plan with consultation and approval of the head of the Department. The draft plan thus prepared is now put up for approval of the Board. While forwarding the plan the suggestions made by the members of the Board and the recommendations of the Block Development Boards have been kept in view specially so far as the location of various works is concerned.

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STRATEGY AND PRIORITIES

While formulating the current year plan the following priorities have been kept in view.

The various continuing schemes in different sectors are proposed to be completed as early as possible with increase allocation. The balance amount available for new schemes has been kept for mostly the hilly and backward areas. Rural water supply and rural electrification have been given special importance and additional funds are being demanded for provision of portable water supply to rural population. Primary and secondary education has been given top priority and new schools have been proposed in backward areas to cater to uncovered population of children in the school going age. There is an acute employment problem in the state as a whole and also in the district therefore, maximum employment potential has been tried to be kept. It is also proposed to give wide publicity to various programmes on self employment and industries sector to help educated unemployed to establish their own units and also to create further employment opportunities.

Special efforts are to be made to open up and develop inaccessible areas. The economy which is at present almost wholly dependent on agriculture is to be diversified by promotion of small scale industrial units. In doing so the intensive development of agriculture and horticulture would be continued.

APPROVAL PROGRAMS

1. Ravi Canal Project

The construction of Ravi canal project is under progress. The proposed canal will draw water from the River Ravi through lift from the existing Kethua canal which will be supplemented by river Ujh which flows through the district. A barrage is under construction on the river Ujh. The total allocation of the scheme will be Rs. 41.40 crores. The canal will subsequently join with the Ravi lift canal.

Ravi Canal Project

To fully utilize the irrigation potential created by the proposed Ravi Canal, an authority under Area Development Commissioner has been created which includes the Kethua and Hiranagar blocks of the district. The agriculture production programme and allied sectors including horticulture and cooperation are looked after by the Area Development Org.

Separate funds in these sectors are provided for the two blocks

Small Farmers Development Agency

Kethua District is covered under the SFD. programme. The agency provides assistance to small and marginal farmers in the field of agriculture production and allied activities. Subsidy @ 25% to small farmers and 33 1/3% to marginal farmers is provided. Cases for pump-sets, agriculture implements, cattle and sheep units, poultry etc. have been taken up under the programme.

Intensive Child Development Scheme

This project has been started in the Billohar block of Kethua District. The scheme aims at improving nutrition and health of children specially for school age children, giving them proper vaccination also to organize elementary education, group activities etc. among them. A large number of village centre are being opened under the scheme for these purposes.

Review of achievement of District Plan 1978-79.

The District Plan 1978-79 was prepared at a total allocation of Rs. 231.73 lakh divided in 20 sectors of development. The initial sectorwise allotment was made by the Planning Department of the Government and broad guidelines were given. The draft plan was prepared in consultation with the concerned Heads of the Department and was finally approved by the District Development Board. An amount of Rs. 264 lakh has been spent which works out to 93 % of the allocation.

1. Agriculture.

Rs. 2.66 lakh has been spent against an allocation of Rs. 4.00 lakh. There are four schemes in this sector. In Agriculture Development including plant protection Rs. 40000 for vegetable development Rs. 23000, Agriculture Rs. 55000 and for Backward Development Rs. 6000 have been spent. In the kandi areas the Agriculture department runs a programme for dry land farming. Rs. 1.58 lakh have been spent under this scheme on staff, subsidy for seed and fertilizers and plant protection services. During 1978-79 as an experiment the cultivation of potato has been introduced in kandi block and the necessary seed has been supplied to the farmers. During the year 1500 Qtls of HYV seed and 5800 Qtls of chemical fertilizers has been distributed to the farmers. The consumption of fertilizer has shown a marked increase over the last year. 78 demonstration plots of various crops have been laid.

2. Horticulture.

There was an allocation of Rs. 3.00 lakh against which Rs. 2.67 lakh have been spent. The cultivation of fruit plants is encouraged in kandi and hilly areas and in plain areas only small patches are taken. During 1978-79, 275 acres have been brought under Horticulture Dev. programme, 530 acres under Dev. of Horticulture in kandi areas and 170 acres in the hilly and backward areas.

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In addition 42000 existing trees in the Ravi area have been topworked to improve their variety. Out of the above 89 acres have been brought under walnuts and 82 acres under other fruit trees in the backward areas of Bani and Mohai Bahar.

### 3. Applied Nutrition

Billwar block of the district has been taken up for Applied Nutrition Programme with an allocation of Rs. 0.84 lakh. An amount of Rs. 0.64 lakh was spent in this sector. 20 villages of the block have been taken up and about 4000 families have been covered in 1978-79. Under various schemes vegetable seeds, fertilizers, and fruit plants were provided free or on subsidy. Poultry birds were also given on 50% subsidy. In addition demonstration plots of pulses and oil seeds were organized and 12 training camps were held.

### 4. Irrigation

An amount of Rs. 55 lakh has been provided for this sector. Out of which Rs. 29.00 lakh have been spent. There are two major and medium projects in the district, namely the Ravi Canal which is under construction and the K. Thus canal which provides water to a part of within Bahar. The target of Irrigation potential utilization for 1978-79 for the district was 17455 Hectares out of which 16847 hectares was achieved. There was a short fall of 600 Hect mainly due to interruption of supplies of Ujh canal due to construction of Ujh barrage for the proposed Ravi Canal. During 1978-79 new potential of 1020 Hect has been created.

12 schemes have been taken up for execution during 1978-79 out of which Rs. 2.00 lakh was kept for Nashir Kull in the Basohli Tehsil. There was some dispute of the villagers at the proposed head works of the canal regarding payment of abiana. The matter has been referred to the PWD for consideration.

#### 5. Land Reforms and Consolidation

Agrarian Reforms have been introduced in the State from 1973. The present Act has been enforced from the year 1978-79. Since the implementation agency, the Revenue Department is already overworked, it has been strengthened for the agrarian reforms work. During 1978-79 an amount of Rs. 4.80 lakh was provided for salary and other charges of the Agrarian Reforms Staff. Preparation of Form No. IV has been taken up in 216 villages in the district and in 102 villages. This work has been completed. This will be followed by attestation of notations in favour of the prospective owners.

#### 6. Soil and Water Conservation

There are two agencies for soil conservation works in the district, for forest and agricultural lands respectively. For Forest land an amount of Rs. 2.52 lakh was provided out of which Rs. 2.527 lakh have been spent. This includes barbed wire fencing of closed forests, engineering works, sowing and plantations and maintenance of nurseries. Over 225000 plants and 85000 cuttings were planted in 1978-79. In addition 4.13 lakh left barbed wire and brush wood fence was made and repaired.

For agricultural land against an amount of 1.96 lakh, Rs. 1.47 lakh has been spent. Land levelling, bench terracing, drainage control and gully plugging works have been undertaken in this behalf.

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### 7. Animal Husbandry

An amount of Rs. 1.95 lakh were provided for Animal Husbandry and Rs. 1.45 lakh for poultry development. Against these amounts Rs. 1.72 and Rs. 1.59 lakh have been spent during 1978-79.

One new subunit for Animal Husbandry has been established at Bachhedli in Billaवर Tehsil and a First Aid centre was opened at Hatt. During 1978-79 76300 cases were treated, 47700 were vaccinated and 6900 cases were taken up for artificial inoculation. In addition 79 poster demonstration plots were made and 3 Kisan camps were held for publicity purposes.

In the field of poultry, over 20000 birds were reared and 30 new poultry units were established with the assistance of the Department. Health cover was also provided against Ranikhet disease and fowl pox etc.

### 8. Sheep Husbandry

During 1978-79 an amount of Rs. 4.00 lakh was kept for sheep development against which Rs. 4.04 lakh has been spent. Three new sheep development centres have been opened bringing the total number of centres to 20 and 3 sheep sub blocks. 11 of the centres are migratory which move with the movement of flocks.

The centres give breeding and health cover to the sheep units established in the district. Rs. 30000 have been spent for mass drenching and dipping. The centres and blocks are looked after by six Veterinary Assistant Surgeons.

### 9. Fisheries

Rs. 0.33 lakh was provided for development of fisheries which has been spent. The amount was utilized for construction of fish farm at Nagai and Fish seed farm at Pheraidol.

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10. Forests

Against an allocation of Rs. 5.83 lakh Rs. 5.82 lakh have been spent; this includes Rs. 25000 for demarcation and 0.75 lakh for farm forestry. The existing nursery of the Farm Forestry division has been extended by 2 acres.

Rs. 4.83 lakh was kept for the Billowar Forest division. For rehabilitation of degraded forests 42200 rft fencing was made and repaired and 41000 cft gully plugging was done. 19700 trees were enumerated for resin extraction. 399000 plants were planted, 342 kgs seed was sown in 9500 patches, under economic plantation scheme. In the same scheme 57000 rft brush wood fencing was also repaired and 8000 rft fenced.

In addition 25 kms forest road was repaired and 17 km road was constructed and upgraded.

11. C.D.O. Works

Rural works programme under the HLD sector is implemented by the Block Organisation which also looks after the Agriculture production programme. Rs. 4.45 lakh was provided for the Engineering works out of which Rs. 4.30 lakh have been spent during 1978-79. 14 Nos. irrigation works, 11 rural roads, 14 schemes for improvement and construction of Panchayat Ghats, 3 rural health schemes and 5 Soil conservation works were taken up for execution.

The programme covers three blocks Billowar Basohli and Hari as the other two blocks are looked after the Ravi Tawi Command Area Project. Out of the available Rs. 4.45 lakh, Rs. 0.45 lakh were spent for continual works and the balance amount for new schemes.

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In addition to the normal programme, Rs. 1.25 lakh were available for improvement of zamindari lands and Rs. 0.75 lakh for the maintenance of assets already created.

The HBS organization also looks after the Food for work programme under which 61 schemes have been taken up for irrigation, roads, water supply etc. Food grains at approved rates are provided in lieu of wages under this scheme.

## 12. Cooperation

Rs. 5.39 lakh has been allocated for cooperation sector out of which Rs. 5.13 lakh has been spent. Rs. 0.50 lakh have been given as share capital to Marketing Societies for purchase of fertilizer, Rs. 0.45 lakh has been spent on the common cadre of secretaries appointed in the Primary societies. Rs. 1.60 lakh has been provided to societies for consumer business. A sale and service Coop. Society has been organized at Mohal-Balhar which has been provided an amount of Rs. 1.00 lakh as share capital and godown subsidy. The Jammu Central Coop. Bank has opened a branch at Basohli for which Rs. 0.10 lakh has been given as managerial subsidy.

## 13. Flood Control.

Rs. 11.60 lakh has been spent on various schemes of flood control in Kathua district. Out of this the newly created Flood control division which looks after three Tehsils of Kathua Biringar and Billwar spent Rs. 11.20 lakh. During 1978-79 survey work of all major rivers and nullas below the National Highway and Ghini and Huj rivers near Billwar was taken up. The total expenditure including the state sector was Rs. 42.70 lakh.

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Major achievements have been that, on River Ravi the creek was got shifted by about 1000 ft from the original bank reclaiming 200 acres, and on river Ujh. The closure bund on Dagh creek helped in averting flood threat to 5 villages of Hiranagar Tehsil. In all 28 works were taken up out of which 25 works have been completed.

#### 14. Floods

Under District Plan for Rural Electrification Rs. 5.96 lakh have been provided out of which Rs. 5.21 lakh has been spent. 16 villages and Morcha have been provided with electricity. In addition Rs. 20.25 lakh was available from Rural Electrification Corporation against which Rs. 24.12 lakh was spent.

#### 15. Industries

The Industries sector plan was prepared for Rs. 12.74 lakh against which Rs. 12.75 lakh has been spent. For Small Scale Industries Rs. 5.38 lakh was spent consisting of incentives to small scale units, stipends to technicians and expenditure on PTC scheme.

Rs. 1.57 lakh was spent on sericulture programme. 28000 lbs of cocoons were produced, 7700 tall plants and 9700 dwarf plants were planted. In addition 25 incubation centres were set up including one centre in Bari.

Under Handloom project an amount of Rs. 0.54 lakh was spent on common facility centre at Basohli. Rs. 4.56 lakh were spent on various schemes of handicrafts.

#### 16. Roads and Drainage

There was an allocation of Rs. 51.00 lakh for the two PWD divisions of Jh. and Basohli including Rs. 9.40 lakh for establishment. The expenditure has been of the order of Rs. 50.50 lakh.

During the year 40.50 kms of road has been constructed or upgraded. The total road length under the management of the department is now 654.75 kms. (13)

The Basohli-Bani road is under construction and has now reached upto 45 kms. The next 9 kms are also under construction but it is felt that it needs a change of alignment, further progress is possible only when this issue is decided. A bridge to connect Billawar across nulla. Naj is also under construction.

The R.D department also constructs the buildings of various other departments.

#### 17. Mechanical and Electrical.

Against an allocation of Rs. 2.00 lakh, Rs. 2.03 lakh has been spent during 1978-79.

#### 18. General Education.

Against an allocation of Rs. 43.00 lakh, Rs. 38.03 lakh has been spent. During the year 47 new primary schools were opened and 21 schools were upgraded. 727 children were provided scholarship besides scholarships granted to 450 Gajjar and Bakarwal students. Science subjects were introduced in two new secondary schools and laboratory grant was provided to 5 schools. Besides 30 part time centres have been opened for adult education with a roll of 644.

On the physical education side play fields were developed in 4 schools and 4 schools were provided with physical training instructors.

For construction of school buildings Rs. 11 lakh were provided through PWD and also there was a very good response of local initiative construction.

#### 19. Health.

The allocation for Health sector was Rs. 8.40 lakh against which Rs. 6.78 lakh has been spent.

During the year one new dispensary has been opened at Uchapind in Tehsil Billawar.

There are one district hospital, 5 PHO, 19 Allopathic and 30 -yurvedic dispensaries. Besides there are four medical aid centres and 16 sub centres. In the Medical institutions of the district during 1978-79, 48000 outdoor and 3730 indoor patients were treated, 114 major and 509 minor operations were performed and 13200 persons were given primary smallpox vaccination. On the family welfare side 157 sterilization operations were carried out.

20. *Water supply*

During 1978-79, (30) villages and <sup>7</sup> ponds have been provided drinking water covering a population of 19000 persons. These figures include the schemes taken up under all India and Punjab provided 12 Point subsidy sub plan and accelerated rural water supply scheme.

*Expenditure*

Under the district plan/water an amount of Rs. 42.11 lakh was provided against which Rs. (48.30) lakh was spent. Besides Rs. 12.70 lakh under Food subsidy and Rs. 18.00 lakh under ARWS was available and Rs. (11.20) lakh and Rs. 18.00 lakh has been spent against these two schemes.

At the end of 1978-79, out of 535 inhabited villages of Bathua district 133 villages and 14 norhas have been covered under 52 water supply schemes. The total population so far benefited now is 97000. The problem is particularly acute in hilly and kandi areas.

A problem was faced in the backward areas of Bari where the carriage of pipes is very costly. The PWD has restricted the amount that can be spent on such carriage to 15% of the cost of the pipes which is insufficient as the carriage

involves animal or human transportation. The ceiling should therefore be increased to 40% for hilly areas and 20% for semi-hilly areas of Billawar and Basohli Tehsils.

#### 21. Housing.

An amount of Rs. 2.70 lakh was provided under this sector which has been fully spent for providing loans for low income group and middle income group housing and provision of house building advance to government employees.

#### 22. Urban Development.

Rs. 2.49 lakh has been spent against Rs. 2.11 lakh in this sector. The amounts represent loans to local bodies and amount spent for environmental improvements.

#### 23. Police Housing.

An amount of Rs. 2.80 lakh was allocated for construction of three police posts at Bahadrapur, Bari and Raskot. The expenditure has been of the order of Rs. 0.95 lakh.

#### 24. Social Welfare.

Under this sector the entire amount of Rs. 1.40 lakh has been spent. Under various schemes of this sector, 31 persons have been provided with sewing machines, 28 destitute children were given scholarship and aid was given to physically handicapped children. The department also runs a Bal Ashram with 25 children and Hari Niketan with 25 inmates.

Rural women's camps were also organized for functional literacy programme of women.

#### 25. Welfare of scheduled caste and other backward Classes.

Rs. 3.38 lakh was provided in this sector which has been spent in full. Under Welfare of scheduled castes, scholarships have been given to 2200 students,

520 students have been given aid for books and uniforms and the examination fees has been reimbursed to 200 students.

33 families were provided housing subsidy and 4 persons were given aid for industrial units.

In case of other backward classes 750 students were given scholarships, 200 students aid for books and uniforms and 100 students were reimbursed with examination fees. In addition 8 families were given housing subsidy and industrial aid was given to 4 units. A cottage industries training centre is also being run at Band giving training to 25 persons.

#### 26. Wages and Materials.

Rs. 0.16 lakh has been kept for 1978-79 for strengthening of the agency.

#### 27. Employment.

Against an allocation of Rs. 1.31 lakh Rs. 0.95 lakh have been spent. There was a target to select 100 entrepreneurs for setting up units. Due to lack of adequate response only 76 persons were selected and registered. 31 cases of Self employment units have so far been referred to the Banks and in 17 cases margin money and stipend have been released.

In the earlier phases ~~110~~ units have been set up. Some of the sick units are being considered for provision of interest subsidy and rehabilitation assistance.

#### 28. Non functional Buildings.

Rs. 5.82 lakh was spent against an allotment of Rs. 6.19 lakh.

#### 29. Grants and Materials.

Rs. 807 lakh was provided and only Rs. 3.83 lakh could be spent. Out of this an amount of Rs. 6.00 lakh was kept for construction.

of hostel for Duggar and Marwala but due to non-availability of material work could not be completed. Scholarships were given to 450 students, besides housing subsidy and reimbursement of examination fee were also provided.

Shortage of Material etc.

There has been some shortfall in the construction works of buildings due to the fact that during major portion of the year there was a shortage of cement and bricks. Although the availability position of cement later improved, bricks continued to be in short supply. In case of Public Health, CI pipes of 6" diameter also remained in short supply.

In case of Band and Hospital there is another difficulty that is non-availability of execution agency. Although tenders are invited a number of times adequate response is not available. There is some difficulty in the availability of timber also which is very commonly used in hilly areas for construction purposes.

Various incentives will be given for enrolment drive and a few schools will be provided grants for science units and library.

During the last few years it has been observed that there is good response for the local initiative works for providing school buildings. An amount of Rs.2.50 lakh has, therefore been kept for aid for construction of school buildings in such cases.
