INTRODUCTION

The first Statistical Abstract of Andhra Pradesh for 1956 closely follows the pattern of the Abstracts issued during the previous years by the Bureau of Economics and Statistics, Hyderabad. This publication is intended to serve as a convenient reference book presenting various types of quantitative data relating to the economic and social aspects of Andhra Pradesh.

The Abstract for 1956 has been compiled for the reorganised State of Andhra Pradesh. Data have been generally presented according to the new set-up. The statistical data relate not only to the period after the formation of Andhra Pradesh but also to four or five preceding years. This entailed considerable work on adjustments for boundaries and estimation for back periods in some cases, on the basis of available data. Unfortunately the required material was not readily available for the reorganised State with the several departments concerned. These had to be obtained from their subordinate offices and it took time to get them in the proper form with all errors and discrepancies removed. This explains to a large extent the delay in bringing out this Abstract, which is sincerely, regretted. It is hoped that the next Abstract will be published during the course of this year. The statistics presented in most of the sections of this Abstract relate to Andhra Pradesh as a whole. In some cases, however, this was not possible; they had to be separately presented for the Andhra and Telangana Regions for lack of uniformity as, e.g., in the sections dealing with "Landholdings" and "Small Scale Industries". In regard to Income Tax statistics, data were available only for the erstwhile States of Andhra and Hyderabad. As no adjustments were possible for the previous years, these have been furnished for the two States separately. Except in a few such cases which are indicated in the footnotes to the tables or the notes preceding them, the statistics given for each year are for the State of Andhra Pradesh with the present boundaries. Footnotes have also been provided to explain the provisional nature of the data contained in some of the tables.

Although the present publication is entitled "The Statistical Abstract for 1956", the previous one for Hyderabad being for 1955, statistics have been furnished for the Calendar year in some sections, for the agricultural year (July 1955 to June 1956) in certain other sections, and for the financial year (April 1955 to March 1956) in quite a few others. In some sections, e.g., Prices, the data have been furnished for 15 months commencing from January 1956 and ending with March 1957, to facilitate the reader who might be interested in data for the financial year.

In view of their importance All-India Statistics covering many important subjects have been included in this Abstract. Ready access to them will facilitate comparison of State data with All-India data.

In accordance with the recommendations of the Central Statistical Organisation, the State totals of Agricultural and Industrial Production, Road Mileage Statistics, etc., have been expressed in the corresponding metric equivalents also to familiarise the public with the new system of weights and measures. Statistical information relating to Prices, Wages, etc., has been expressed in terms of Rupees and naye Paise instead of the old coinage.

Owing to non-availability of certain types of data, there have been some omissions in the range of statistics that should be contained in a reference volume of this kind. It is hoped that such gaps will be filled and the scope of this annual publication further enlarged with better arrangements for collection and compilation of material which are being made by the Bureau of Economics and Statistics.

Our thanks are due to the various Government Departments in Andhra Pradesh for the co-operation rendered in the collection and compilation of the data, without which a publication of this nature would not be possible. The interest shown by them as well as by the public in the Abstract as judged from the enquiries received regarding its progress, make us feel confident of its usefulness to a wide circle of officials, public men, scholars and men of business.

While hoping that this will prove to be a handy reference volume on all the important aspects of the social and economic life of Andhra Pradesh, we shall gladly welcome any comments or suggestions for its improvement.

AREA AND POPULATION

Statistical Tables of Area and Population in Andhra Pradesh are Presented in this Section.

Table 1.—The growth of population from 1901 to 1951 is shown in this table.

The figures for the Andhra Districts were obtained from the District Census Handbooks published by the Madras Government after adding the population of 3 taluqs of Bellary District, for which taluqwise data for the past decades were available. The three taluqs of Adoni, Alur and Rayadrug of the former Bellary District have been merged with the Andhra Districts, the first two with Kurnool District and the third with Anantapur District.

In respect of Telangana Region, population figures in 1951 of the eight districts of former Hyderabad State (the formation of Khammam District in 1953 involved only the redistribution of some of the taluqs from among the districts of Telangana) merged with Andhra, were available for the previous decades. To this data for 1951 were added the population figures relating to 1951 of all these areas merged with the Telangana Region of Andhra Pradesh [Tandur, Kodangal, Alampur, Gadwal, Zahirabad (except Nirna Circle), Narayankhed Taluqs, and the revenue circles of Nyalkal, Mudhol, Bhainsa, Kubber, Bichkonda and Jukkal] at the time of reorganisation.

The population of 1951 for those areas transferred from Adilabad District of Telangana to Nanded District of Marathwada (Rajura, Kinwat Taluqs and Islapur Circle of Boath Taluq) were subtracted.

For all these areas merged with Telangana and transferred to Marathwada, population figures of the past five decades were not available. Hence they have been estimated in the following manner:

The population of Tandur Taluq of Gulbarga which was merged with Hyderabad is assumed to have grown in the same ratio as that of Hyderabad District. Likewise the populations of Kodangal Taluq from Gulbarga District and Alampur, Gadwal Taluqs from Raichur District which were merged with Mahbubnagar District are assumed to have grown at the same rate as that of Mahbubnagar District. A similar procedure was adopted in the case of Zahirabad Taluq (excluding Nirna Circle) Narayankhed Taluq and Nyalkal Circle of Bidar Taluq, merged with the district of Medak, as also in regard to the 3 revenue circles of Mudhol, Bhainsa and Kubbur of Mudhol Taluq of Nanded District, merged with Adilabad District, and the two revenue circles of Bichkonda and Jukkal of Deglur Taluq of Nanded District merged with Nizamabad District.

The population of the transferred areas from Adilabad District (Rajura, Kinwat Taluqs and Islapur Circle of Boath Taluq) which were merged with Nanded District of Marathwada, was estimated to have grown according to the rate of growth of Nanded District. The total for Andhra Pradesh was then worked out combining the figures of Andhra and Telangana Regions.

Table 2.—Data relating to area and population of the districts in Andhra Pradesh in the Census year 1951, are presented in this table.

The area figures for all the Andhra Districts except Anantapur and Kurnool, are those of the Surveyor-General of India. In regard to Anantapur and Kurnool the taluq area figures furnished by the Surveyor-General of Madras for the taluq of Rayadrug of Bellary District (which was merged with Anantapur District) and Alur and Adoni of Bellary District (merged with Kurnool District) were added to the area figures of the respective districts with which they were merged. Though the area figures of districts according to the Surveyor-General of India (with whom taluqwise data is not available) and the Surveyor-General of Madras differ in all cases, the difference between the two sets of figures in the case of Bellary District was only 1 sq. mile. Hence, this difference was ignored and the taluq figures of the Surveyor-General of Madras were added to the districts with which they were merged.

I. POPULATION

In regard to Telangana, the area figures of districts have been estimated with the help of taluqwise figures (furnished by the Settlement and Land Records Office, Hyderabad) to conform to the figures of the Surveyor General of India. The area figures for Telangana Districts according to both these Offices, differ.

The estimation of area figures for all the taluqs and revenue circles that were either merged with, or transferred out of Telangana consequent on the reorganisation, was done in the following manner : Tandur Taluq which belonged to Gulbarga District was merged with Hyderabad District at the time of reorganisation. The area figures of Gulbarga District according to the Settlement and Land Records Office was 7,108.3 sq. miles and that according to the Surveyor-General of India was 7,131.5 sq. miles, which is greater by 0.4% over the figures of the former office.

Tandur taluq, which originally was a part of Gulbarga District had an area of 371.20 sq. miles according to the Settlement and Land Records Office. The area of Tandur was estimated as 372.67 sq.miles by increasing the figures at 0.4%. The estimated figure was then added to the district area figures of Hyderabad with which it was merged.

Likewise the area figures for all the merged and transferred areas have been estimated and added or subtracted from the district area figures of Telangana.

Table 3.—The area figures for districts in this Table are according to the Surveyor-General of India, with whom taluqwise data are not available. The area figures for taluqs in the Andhra Region are according to the Surveyor-General of Madras, and in Telangana according to the Settlement and Land Records Office, Hyderabad.

As stated in Table 2 the area figures for districts according to the Madras and Hyderabad Offices, differ with the figures of the Surveyor-General of India.

Table 6.—The towns mentioned include all places notified by Government as falling under the jurisdiction of Town Committees or declared to be Municipalities in addition to certain other places with district urban characteristics such as the availability of Civic amenities, Contiguity of habitation and the Composition and Size of the Population.

Tables 7, 8 and 9.—The figures in these tables are estimated on the basis of percentages derived from a 10% sample of the Census enumeration slips. The number of males and females in each of the affected districts (consequent on the reorganisation of States) are estimated in the following manner. In regard to the 3 taluqs of Ballary merged with Andhra in 1953 the percentages of male and female population in these taluqs in 1951 were assumed to be the same as that of Bellary district to which they belonged till 1953.

In regard to the taluqs and revenue circles of Telangana merged with it or transferred from it the percentage of male and female population was assumed to be the same as that of the tract to which it belonged in 1951.

Tables 10, 11 and 12.—During the 1951 Census, the population was first divided into two broad livelihood categories viz., agricultural population and non-agricultural population. The agricultural population was subdivided into four categories viz. (1) cultivators of land, wholly or mainly owned and their dependants, (2) cultivators of land wholly or mainly unowned and their dependants, (3) cultivating labourers and their dependants and (4) Non-cultivating owners of land and agricultural rent receivers and their dependants. Similarly the non-agricultural population was sub-divided according to four categories of principal means of livelihood. viz., (1) Production (other than cultivation), (2) Commerce, (3) Transport and (4) Other services and miscellaneous sources. These eight livelihood classes cover the total population and comprise self-supporting persons (those who earn income sufficient at least for their own maintenance), earning dependants (those that earn some income which is sufficient to meet only a part of the cost of their maintenance or unpaid family helpers) and non earning dependants (those who do not take any part in procuring their own livelihood). Earning and non-earning dependants were classified under one of the above eight livelihood classes, on the basis of the principal means of livelihood of the self supporting person on whom they have been dependent partly or wholly for their maintenance.

II. RAINFALL

RAINFALL

Tables 13-15.—Tables relating to the seasonwise and average annual rainfall in Andhra Pradesh are presented in this section.

In the Andhra region of the State the tahsilwise monthly data of rainfall are compiled by the Collectorate for working out the monthly average of the district. These averages are totalled up in working out the average rainfall for the district either for the season or the year.

In the Telangana region, the weekly statements of rainfall readings furnished by each of the Tahsil Offices are compiled at the Bureau of Economics and Statistics. The data are tabulated, and the weekly rainfall figures of the tahsils are averaged to give the average weekly rainfall for each district.

The average rainfall for the State as a whole, either for the month or the year is obtained by averaging the corresponding district averages. The averages are all simple arithmetic averages.

AGRICULTURE

Statistical tables relating to Agriculture are presented in this section. The agricultural year in all these tables in this section is the year ending 30th June for the Andhra Region and 31st May for the Telangana Region.

(a) LAND USE AND IRRIGATION

(Tables 16 to 19)

Tables 16 and 17:—The data given in these tables were obtained for the Telangana Region through the Agricultural Census conducted by the Bureau of Economics and Statistics, Hyderabad, during Kharif/Abi and Rabi/Tabi Seasons for each year. The data for the Andhra Region was supplied by the Revenue Department, in the Annual Statistical A-2 returns on the basis of 'Jamabandi'. The definitions adopted and methods of presentation of data are in accordance with the recommendations of the Technical Committee of Co-ordination of Agricultural Statistics appointed by the Government of India during 1949. The standard definitions of the categories of land adopted in these tables are as follows:—

I. Forests.—These include all actually forested areas on the lands classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forests whether State-owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate category of cultivated or uncultivated land.

II. Barren and Un-cultivable Land.—This covers all barren and uncultivable lands like mountains, deserts, etc. Land which cannot be ordinarily brought under cultivation except by incurring high cost, is classed as un-cultivable, whether such land is in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings.

III. Land Put to Non-Agricultural Uses.—This stands for all land occupied by buildings, roads and railways, or under water, e.g., rivers and canals and other land put to use other than agricultural.

IV. Cultivable Wastes.—These include lands available for cultivation, whether not taken up for cultivation or abandoned after a few years for one reason or the other. Such lands may be either fallow or covered with shrubs and jungles which are not put to any use. They may be assessed or un-assessed and may lie in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings. Land once cultivated but not cultivated for five years in succession is also included in this category.

V. Permanent Pastures and Other Grazing Lands.—These cover all grazing lands, whether they are permanent pastures and meadows or not.. Village common and grazing lands within forest areas are included in this category.

VI. Miscellaneous Trees, Crops and Groves not included in the Net Area Sown:—Under this class all cultivable land which is not included under net area sown but is put to some agricultural use is shown. Lands under casurina trees, thatching grasses, bamboo bushes and other groves for fuel, etc., which are not included under orchards are classed under this Category.

VII. Current Fallows.—This class comprises cropped areas which are kept fallow during the current year. For example, if any seedling area is not cropped again the same year it may be treated as current fallows.

VIII. Fallow Land other than Current Fallows.—This implies all lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and not more than five years.

III. AGRICULTURE

The reasons for keeping such lands fallow may be one of the following (1) Poverty of cultivators (2) Inadequate supply of water, (3) Malarial climate (4) Silting of canals and rivers, and (5) Unremunerative nature of farming.

IX. Net Area Sown.—This consists of net area sown with crops and orchards.

As the Forest Department has not been able to furnish districtwise figures for the State partly because the forest area figures according to the present boundaries of the districts in the Telangana Region was not readily available with them, the figures for forest area were based on the returns of Agricultural Census for Telangana Region and data supplied by the Revenue Department for Andhra Region :

The total geographical area is based on village papers because particulars of area according to professional survey are not available. This varies from year to year for Andhra Pradesh because of certain discrepancies in the figures of forest area as reported by the Revenue Department and those furnished by the Forest Department. The variation is relatively greater in the Telangana Region than in the Andhra Region due to the following reasons :—

(1) Resettlement of Jagir areas.

(2) Under-estimation of forest area in the Agricultural Census. Actually the gross under-estimation in the forest area as reported in the Agricultural Census compared to the figures furnished by the Forest Department was of the order of 3 million acres for the former Hyderabad State. The vast discrepancy in the forest area as reported by the Forest and Revenue Departments was examined in detail in 1954 and a conference of the concerned Revenue and Forest Officers was held in the Bureau and certain measures indicating the nature of co-ordination between the Revenue and Forest Officers at different levels were decided upon to bring about consistency in the data for area under forests. Since then this variation between the two sets of figures has decreased. It is expected that the discrepancy would be totally eliminated in the course of the next few years.

(b) ACREAGE AND OUTTURN

(Tables 20 to 41)

Tables 26 to 35.—The Statistics of acreages, outturn and yield per acre of principal crops given in these tables are obtained for Telangana Region from the Agricultural Census conducted by the Bureau of Economics and Statistics during the Kharif/Abi and Rabi/Tabi Seasons of each year. The returns of area statistics for the Kharif/Abi season are obtained during September, while those for Rabi/Tabi are obtained during January. The area statistics pertain to the entire land area of the region and cover 99 individual crops. However the outturn figures are estimated in the case of only 33 principal crops on the basis of the normal yield and seasonal factor for each crop in each taluk as reported by the Revenue Agency. Production of four food crops namely Rice, Jowar, Bajra and Maize (Kharif) is calculated on the basis of the results of Crop-Cutting Experiments conducted by the Random Sampling Method from 1952-53. Normal yields for 8 crops namely wheat, cotton, castor, groundnut, linseed, sesamum, tobacco and sugarcane were determined in 1930 by Dr. H. Mann D.S.C., Agricultural Adviser to former Hyderabad Government on the basis of the then available material from the following sources :—

- (a) Figures of yield obtained during original settlement operations;
- (b) Figures of yield per acre obtained from Government Farms;
- (c) Figures obtained from tests made in connection with demonstration on cultivators fields;
- (d) The normal yields prevalent in neighbouring States and
- (e) In a few cases independent estimates of yield by business firms or similar business bodies such as Ralli Bros. or the Hubli Co-operative Cotton Sales Society.

The definition of normal yield generally adopted by Dr. H. Mann was the crop which the cultivator has a right (as it were) to expect and with which he is or (he should be) content, while if he gets more he has reason to rejoice and if less, he has reason to complain with some modifications to take into account the diff-

erences in the fertility of soils in different districts. The normal yields for other crops were supplied by the Department of Agriculture in 1945. The normal yield figures worked out by Dr. Mann for the 8 Crops mentioned above are still used in estimating the total outturn of the concerned crops while the figures supplied by the Agricultural Department have been modified on the basis of subsequent experience and are used to estimate the total outturn of these crops. The total outturn under each crop is estimated by the formula :

$$\text{Total Outturn} = \frac{\text{Normal yield per acre} \times \text{Seasonal factor} \times \text{Total area under the crop}}{2240 \times 12}$$

Area figures of Andhra Region are supplied by the District Collectors in their annual statistics (g) returns on the basis of 'Jamabandi'.

The following procedure is being adopted for calculation of production of crops in Andhra Region. The production of the crop is governed by the acreage under the crop, normal yield per acre of the crop and the seasonal factor which is a percentage expressing the relationship between the crop in the field and the crop in a normal year. The anna outturn of the crop reported by the Patwaris or Karanams is converted into percentage of average yield taking 12 anna crop as 100 or normal. The percentage thus arrived at is called the un-corrected seasonal factor. The un-corrected seasonal factor is corrected by applying Stuart's correcting factor which is a percentage representing the average of the anna outturns, converted into a percentage reported over a series of years and is supposed to be taken as equal to 100 percent or normal. Districtwise normal yields per acre for several crops were supplied by the Director of Agriculture of the composite Madras State. The method of working out productions is as follows :

$$\text{PRODUCTION} = \frac{\text{Area} \times \text{Normal Yield} \times \text{Seasonal factor}}{2240 \times 100}$$

In respect of cotton lint, the production is calculated in terms of bales of 392 lbs., and in the case of Deccan-hemp in terms of bales of 400 lbs.

Figures of outturn in all cases except Rice, Jowar, Bajra, Ragi, Maize and Sugarcane are calculated by the annawari method.

Table 37.—However, experience showed that the estimates of total outturn of crops as obtained on the lines indicated above are not reliable because of :

- (a) The normal yields per acre were not determined on any objective basis;
- (b) The normal yields per acre relate to 1919 for the Andhra Region and 1930 for the Telangana Region and, therefore, do not take into account the changes in the agricultural methods obtaining at present, and
- (c) The condition factor of crops reported by the Revenue agency are not determined on any objective basis.

In view of the above facts, the yield per acre and outturn of Rice, Jowar, Bajra, Ragi, Maize and Sugarcane have been estimated on the basis of the results obtained from Crop Cutting Experiments conducted according to the principles of the Random Sampling Method from the year 1945-46 in the case of Paddy ; 1950-51 in the case of Millets and 1954-55 in the case of Sugarcane in the Andhra Region ; and in regard to the Telangana Region from 1951-52 for Paddy and Millets and from 1954-55 for Sugarcane. This method of estimating the outturn of crops is more objective than the condition factor method and broadly consists of :

- (a) Selection of a few villages in each taluk according to Random Sampling Method ;
- (b) Selection of a few fields in each selected village according to Random Procedure ;
- (c) Selection of a plot in each selected field randomly and estimating the yield per acre of that plot by actual measurement of the crop harvested on that plot and,

(d) Estimation of the yield per acre of the crop in the concerned district and the State by the method of weighted arithmetic average of the yields per acre from the selected villages.

Tables 38 and 39.—Farm average prices shown in these tables relate to average harvest prices in Telangana Region, collected during both the seasons of Kharif and Abi and Rabi and Tabi from 1952-53 to 1955-56. Figures for 1951-52 relate to the harvest prices collected in Rabi season only. In the Andhra Region, farm prices are collected for the commodities only once a year and not separately during the Rabi and Kharif seasons.

(c) LAND HOLDINGS

(Tables 42 to 51)

Introduction.—The Census of Land Holdings and Cultivation in the erstwhile Andhra State was conducted during 1955, and in the Telangana Region of the erstwhile Hyderabad State during 1954. The data presented in the tables have been adjusted upto taluq level.

Andhra Region

The definitions adopted and the procedures followed for the Land Census in the Andhra Region are as follows :—

Standard Acre.—The land revenue assessment was the basis for formulating the standard acre which denotes one acre of wet land on which the assessment exceeds Rs. 7-8-0 but does not exceed Rs. 10. In the case of dry land one acre with an assessment of Rs. 1-8-0 to Rs. 3 was taken as 6 annas or 6/16 of a standard acre, while other lands with varying assessments were shown as fractions of the standard acre.

Area Owned.—Includes land held as ‘Owner’ as well as land held under rights of occupancy.

Personal Cultivation.—Area under personal cultivation of the land holder (with personal labour as well as hired labour) includes lands leased for less than a year. Current fallows are also included.

Area Leased out.—Denotes the area which was leased out for more than one year.

Holding.—Includes all land held by a person as “Owner” or under “Occupancy rights” anywhere within the territories of the Andhra State.

Telangana Region

Converted dry acres.—The area in converted dry acres denotes, the actual geographical area of dry land or the area of “single crop wet land” and “double crop wet land” converted into equivalent dry acres on the basis of the proportion of the area of dry land to wet land determined as the “family holding” for each taluq or part of taluq delimited as a “Local Area” by the State Government. A “Family Holding” represents the acreage which is expected to yield, annually a produce of the value of Rs. 800 after deducting fifty percent of the gross produce as cost of cultivation, according to price levels prevailing at the time of determination i.e., 1954.

Ownership Holding.—Consists of all plots of land held by a person with rights of ownership i.e. with rights of permanent heritable possession, and comprises of the land cultivated by the owner himself and the land leased out by him to tenants for cultivation.

Personal Cultivation Holding.—All plots of land owned and personally cultivated by the owner, form a “Personal Cultivation Holding”. Personal cultivation means cultivation on one’s own account (1) by one’s own labour or (2) by the labour of any number of one’s family (3) by servants on wages payable in cash or kind, but not in crop share or by hire labour under one’s personal supervision or personal supervision of any number of one’s family.

III. AGRICULTURE

With regard to Ownership Holdings and Personal Cultivation Holdings, the unit of holdings includes all land held by an individual in different villages situated within a local area (taluq or part of a taluq) but does not include the land held by him in villages situated outside taluq or local area.

Cultivation Holding.— A cultivation holding consists of all plots of land cultivated by an individual in a village whether they are owned by him or taken on lease from the other owners or from Government. The unit of cultivation holding includes only such land as is cultivated by the holder within a village and does not include the land cultivated by him in other villages situated within the taluq or local areas.

The last Census of 1956 was conducted separately in the former Andhra and Hyderabad States with 15th of April, 1956 as the reference date, and the data have since been compiled for the State of Andhra Pradesh comprising the Andhra and Telangana Regions. The returns for the Census were obtained from all the villages and towns through the Revenue Department and certain other suitable agencies. The Census covers the number of livestock, poultry and agricultural implements in the State.

VI. INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTION

INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTION

This Section contains Statistical Tables of Industrial Production in Andhra Pradesh for some of the Major Industries for the years 1953 to 1956.

Tables 61 to 66 :—The data presented in these Tables have been compiled from the statements of *Monthly Production Statistics* furnished by the Large Scale Industrial Establishments in the State for the year 1956, and the Annual Returns for the preceding years. The coverage for these industries was not complete in all cases. The scope and limitations of the data have been explained in the footnotes published along with the relevant tables.

Tables 67 to 72 :—The data presented in these Tables relate to ten of the Major Industries in Andhra Pradesh for the years 1954 and 1955. The data were compiled from the Annual Returns furnished by the Industrial Establishments under the Industrial Statistics Act, 1942 and Census of Manufacturing Industries Rules 1945. The Census of Manufacturing Industries Rules cover only those factories which employ 20 or more workers on any particular day during the year.

Productive Capital :—Productive Capital is the total of Fixed and Working Capital employed by the industries during the Calendar year, or the accounting period falling within that year. Value of factory land, buildings, machinery and other miscellaneous assets such as furniture, fixtures, fittings, railway sidings, automobiles, patents, trademarks, etc., constitute the Fixed Capital. Working Capital represents the total of all stocks of raw materials, finished and semi-finished products and cash on hand or at Banks as on the day on which the accounts were closed during the year.

Persons employed and Wages paid : In this Table are shown the average number of persons employed on each manufacturing day during the year. This includes the workers, and the clerical, supervisory and managerial staff. The salary and wage amounts include bonuses and all other cash benefits, as also the cash value of other benefits provided to the employees.

Fuels and Materials consumed : This excludes any fuels or materials manufactured within the factory and consumed in it. Electrical energy generated and consumed within the factory is a case in point. The coal used in generating the energy is, however, included since it is brought in by the factory from outside.

Value of Work done for Factory by Other Concerns : This denotes the cost of services rendered to the Factory by other Concerns and by Individuals other than its own employees.

Products manufactured for sale : This includes all products made during the year for sale whether actually sold during the year or not.

Value of Work done for Customers : This denotes the cost of services rendered by the factory for other concerns or individuals.

Value added by manufacture : This represents that part of the value of the product which is created in the factory and is computed by deducting from the total ex-factory value of the products, etc., the value of fuels and materials used, work done for the factory by other concerns, depreciation on fixed capital, value of reduction in stocks of semi-finished products and value of finished parts and products manufactured earlier but used for further manufacture during the year.

JOINT STOCK COMPANIES

As the data relating to Joint Stock Companies in Andhra Pradesh for the years 1954-55 and 1955-56 were not available, an attempt was made to collect the data from the records of the Office of the Registrar of Companies, Andhra Pradesh. Data relating to the Telangana and Andhra Regions (Private and Public separately, Number and Capital of Companies at work by Types of Business, Companies newly registered and Companies ceased to work) were extracted from the records and were combined for arriving at the figures pertaining to Andhra Pradesh.

As data relating to Joint Stock Companies in Andhra Pradesh for the year 1956-57 regarding Companies newly registered and ceased to work during the year were also not readily available, an attempt was made to arrive at the figures for 1956-57 by extracting the information from twelve issues of monthly Blue Books on Joint Stock Companies for April 1956 to March 1957.

PUBLIC FINANCE

INCOME TAX

The Statistical tables of Income Tax for 1955-56 presented in this Section relate to the former States of Andhra and Hyderabad, as data for the reorganised State of Andhra Pradesh are not available.

The Statistics contained in the tables are in respect of assessments completed in the financial year 1955-56. They do not, however, represent the result of all assessments for that year, since a fairly large number of assessments for earlier assessment years have been completed during the year while some assessments relating to 1955-56 have been carried over to the next year.

Figures of income represent the total income of the assessee before deduction of the allowances for earned income.

Figures of tax do not include tax paid under Section 18-A and 23-B of the Income Tax Act nor do they include miscellaneous demands (e.g., penalties, warrant fees, amounts of composition money etc.). The figures of taxes given represent the demand raised and not the collections actually made against these demands.

Table 79—This statement analyses the demand of Income Tax and Super Tax according to the different classes of income assessed and refunds and rebates allowed, besides the amounts of tax deducted or otherwise paid at source and Double Income Tax Relief allowed. The effect on tax demanded as a result of reassessments, rectification appeals, revisions etc., of the assessments is shown as “Unclassified Demand” and “Unclassified Refund”.

The number of assessees shown in the statement is in respect of each source of income. An assessee having income from more than one source is included under each of the sources from which the income is derived.

Table 80—Income from business and profession and tax thereon have been classified under various heads in this statement.

Table 81 to 84 :—These tables show the total tax demand (including surcharge) payable by the assessees according to the class of the assessees.

X. EMPLOYMENT

EMPLOYMENT

Tables 104 to 106 :—In these Tables Self-supporting Persons and Earning Dependents in Agricultural Classes and Non-Agricultural Classes are presented. Self-supporting Persons are those who earn an income sufficient at least for their own maintenance and Earning Dependents are those, who earn some income which is sufficient to meet only a part of the cost of their maintenance, or unpaid family workers.

In the 1951 Census the Means of Livelihood which provided the largest income was considered as the Principal Means of Livelihood for a Self-supporting Person who had more than one Means of Livelihood. The classification of Earning Dependents under one of the different livelihood classes was done on the basis of the Principal Means of Livelihood of the Self-supporting Person on whom they were dependent for their maintenance.

Table 107 :—In this Table Self-supporting Persons of Non-agricultural Classes are classified according to their secondary Economic Status, namely Employer, Employee and Independent Worker and are distributed in the various divisions and sub-divisions of Industries and Services. The following instructions explain the criteria applied during the 1951 Census for classifying a person as Employer or Employee or Independent Worker.

(a) An ‘Employer’ is only that person who has necessarily to employ other persons in order to carry on the business from which he secures his livelihood. A person who employs a cook or other person for domestic service should not be recorded as an employer merely for that reason.

(b) Persons employed as Managers, Superintendents, Agents, etc., who control other workers are also employees only, and should not be recorded as Employers.

(c) An “Independent Worker” means a person who is not employed by any one else and who does not also employ anybody else in order to earn his livelihood.

Self-supporting Persons who derive the Principal Means of Livelihood from Unproductive Activities such as income from investments, pensions and family remittances, proceeds of begging, etc., are excluded from the purview of this table.

Table 110 to 115 :—(1). There are 13 Employment Exchanges in Andhra Pradesh. The number of applicants on the Live Register shows the number of candidates who register for employment and who continue to renew their registrations at the prescribed intervals. The number of placements denotes the number of persons actually provided with employment by the Exchanges.

(2). The retabulation of statistics of the working of Employment Exchanges in Andhra Pradesh has been done according to geographical location of the Exchanges. In cases where a district or part thereof has been transferred from the jurisdiction of one Exchange to another as a result of the Reorganisation of States, no adjustment in the statistics was possible as separate data at the district level was not available. It is, however, considered that the extent of error as a result of this would be of an insignificant order.

(3). As the Employment Exchanges catered only to certain special categories of applicants, e.g., Ex-servicemen, Displaced personnel, etc., in the initial period of their existence, the statistics relating to the earlier period were of limited scope and coverage. The revised statistical series relating to the National Employment Service have, therefore, been taken back only to 1953.

PRICES

In the following Tables are presented data relating to Consumer Price Index Numbers, Wholesale Price Index Numbers and Retail and Wholesale Prices of Selected Commodities.

Tables 122 to 126—The Consumer Price Index Numbers for Working Classes are being constructed monthly for Hyderabad City, Warangal, Nizamabad and Weekly for Visakhapatnam and Eluru. The base year for Hyderabad City, Warangal and Nizamabad is August 1943 to July 1944. The base year for Visakhapatnam and Eluru is July 1935 to June 1936. Only normal and routine items of expenditure (*i.e.* excluding items like debts, marriage expenses, litigation etc.) are included in constructing these Index Numbers. These Commodities were selected on the basis of their importance in the Family Budgets of Industrial Working Class Families in the Telangana Centres and of Low Paid Employees in the Andhra Centres. The possibility of getting comparable Price Quotations throughout the year also influenced the selection of Commodities. In all 126 Commodities (including varieties) were included in the Index for Hyderabad City, 120 for Warangal, 120 for Nizamabad, 43 for Visakhapatnam and 40 for Eluru. In Telangana Region the total Average Expenditure of a Working Class Family at the three Centres included in the Index Numbers for the concerned centre generally accounted for about 90% of the total expenditure of a family on normal and routine items of consumption. The weights which show the relative importance of the items included in the Index were assigned on the basis of the results of Family Budget Enquiries conducted among Industrial Working Class Families and Low-Paid Employee Families at these centres during the base period. The Index Numbers for all five centres are constructed by the method of Weighted arithmetic Average. For each item the monthly Average Retail Price has been expressed as a Price relative with the Price in the base year. The Price Indices for all Commodities are then worked out and the Weighted Price Indices of individual commodities are suitably combined to give the Consumption Group and the general Consumer Price Index Numbers for Working Classes.

Tables 127 and 128—The Index Numbers of Wholesale Prices given in these tables are based on the Prices of 66 Commodities prevalent on the last day of each month in Hyderabad City. The base period for the Index Number is taken as August 1939. The Wholesale Price for each Commodity on the last day of the month is expressed as a Price Relative with the Price in August 1939 as base. The Indices for all Commodities are then worked out. The Index Number for all the Commodities and the General Index Number for a group of Commodities are compiled as the simple arithmetic Average of the Index Numbers for the individual Commodities in the group and all the 66 Individual Commodities respectively.

Tables 129 to 142—The Retail Prices for the months shown in these tables are the Simple Arithmetic Averages of the Weekly Retail Prices prevailing at different Markets collected by the Bureau of Economics and Statistics, Government of Andhra Pradesh. The retail prices shown for the years are simple arithmetic Averages of monthly Average Retail Prices during these years. In Telangana the price obtained for each commodity (or variety) for each week is the average of prices ruling at three different shops. In Andhra the price obtained for each Commodity for each week is the quotation from one shop. Only those shops that cater largely to the needs of the Working Classes and Low Paid Employees are selected while the grades and varieties of the articles selected for price reporting are those which are usually popular with the Working Classes and Low Paid Employees.

In the Telangana Region the Price Quotations are reported by the Statistical Inspectors of the Bureau and in the Andhra Region, the Prices are reported by the Revenue Department.

Tables 143 to 157—The Wholesale Prices of Telangana Region relate to Primary Wholesale Prices (*i.e.*, transactions that take place between the Producer and the Wholesaler at the place) of certain important agricultural Commodities at important Regulated Markets. These Prices are reported by the Market Superintendents in each centre on every Friday. The Wholesale Prices of Andhra Region relate to the Secondary Wholesale Prices (*i.e.*, the price at which bulk transactions take place between one Wholesaler and another Wholesaler, or between Wholesaler and the Retailer.) These prices are also collected on each Friday. The Reporting Agency in this area are the Agents of State Bank of India.

Table 186 :—The figures in this table are estimated on the basis of percentages derived from a 10% Sample of Census Enumeration Slips. The number of males and females are estimated in the following manner :—

(i) In regard to the 3 taluqs of Bellary District merged in the Andhra Region in 1953, the percentages of male and female literates were assumed to be the same as that for the Bellary District.

(ii) In regard to the Taluqs and Revenue Circles of Telangana area merged with the respective district or transferred from it, the percentages of male and female literates were taken to be the same as those of the Census Tracts to which they belonged in 1951.

Table 187 :—During the 1951 Census the number of Literates were sorted and tabulated at the “tract” level and Tahsilwise and Circlewise figures were not available for calculating the number of literates in each of the newly constituted districts of Andhra and Telangana Regions. Villagewise figures of literates in each tahsil were however available in the District Census Hand Books and these have been made use of in working out the data in this table. These villagewise figures of Literacy were however calculated on the basis of the entries in the parts of the National Register of Citizens of each village made in most cases by the same Census Enumerators who had filled up the entries in the Census Enumeration Slip of the concerned village. It was however noticed that the number of entries of literates in the National Register of Citizens of a village was invariably smaller than the corresponding entries of literates as recorded in the Census Enumeration Slips of that Village.

There is a difference between the Percentage of Literacy in this Table (12.0%) and that shown in table 186 “Literate Population by Age Groups (13.06%). The percentage in the latter table are calculated upon a sample basis taking a ten percent Sample of the Enumeration slips and hence the difference.

C O O P E R A T I O N :

Data regarding the working of cooperative societies in Andhra Pradesh are presented in Tables A, B & C, below. The data for Agricultural Cooperative Societies include particulars for Central Banks, Agricultural Credit Societies, Agricultural Non-Credit Societies and Primary Agricultural Land Mortgage Banks. The data for Non-Agricultural Cooperative Societies include particulars for Non-Agricultural Credit Societies, Non-Agricultural Non-Credit Societies and Central Non-Credit Societies.

Coverage: Data for the Telangana region of the State were not available according to the reorganised set up of the districts for the years prior to 1955-56. Hence the figures according to the old set up of these districts in the former Hyderabad State have been adopted. Particulars for the Andhra Region are also not available for the year 1951-52. Hence the coverage of the data for Table A, is as follows:-

- 1951-52 - Figures for Telangana Region only (as per old set up) and are not inclusive of the Andhra Region.
- 1952-53 - Figures for both the Regions are included. The data for Telangana region included in them are as per the old set up.
- 1955-56 - Figures for both the Regions are included. The data relate to the re-organised State of Andhra Pradesh.

Districtwise data (Tables B & C,):- Provisional districtwise figures are given in Tables B and C below. The totals of the districtwise figures do not agree with the State figures shown in table A and the figures are still under reconciliation. As however the differences notices between the two sets of figures are minor, ~~being of the order of tax per cent~~ the districtwise details furnished here may still be considered useful.
