## Short tille and 1 <br> 1

 CommencementDefinitioin

The Chancellor
(1) These Statutes may be called the Uttar Pradesh Gautam Buddha University First Statutes, 2007.
(2) They shall come into force at once.
(1) In these Statutes -
(a) "Act". means the Uttar Pradesh Gautam Buddha University Act, 2002.
(b) "Department" meanis a Department of Studies and includes a Centre of Studies established by the Ordinances.
(2) Words and expressions used herein but not defined and defined in the Act shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them in the Act.
(1) The Chancellor shall, by virtue of his office, be the head of the University.
(2) The Chancellor shall have such powers as may be conferred on him by the Act or the rules made thereunder.
(3) Every proposal for the conferment of an honorary degree or distinction shall be subject to the conferment of the Chancellor.
(4) The Chancellor may, while conducting any matter referred to him call for such document or such information from the University or the parties concern as may deemed necessary and may in any other case call for any document or information for the University.
(5) Where the Chancellor calls for any documents or information from the University it shall be the duty of the Registrar to ensure that such documents or information are promptly supplied to the Chancellor.

The Vice<br>Chancellor<br>The Pro Vice- 5 Chancellor

(1) The Vice-Chancellor shall be appointed by the Chancellor, on such terms and conditions as may be prescribed by the BOARD OF GOVERNERS.
(2) The Vice-Chancellor shall exercise such other powers and perform such other duties as mav be laid down in the Ordinances.
(1) The Pro-Vice-Chancellor shall be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor in such manner and on such terms and conditions as may be laid down in the Ordinances and exercise such powers and perform such functions as may be assigned to him by the Vice-Chancellor or laid down in the Ordinances.
(2) A Pro Vice-Chancellor shall assist the ViceChancellor in respect of such matters as may be assigned to him by the Vice-Chancellor in this behalf. He shall also exercise such powers and perforin such duties as may be assigned to him by the ViceChancellor.
(3) Where the Vice-Chancellor is the Chairman of any body or committee of the University and he is absent for any reason what so ever from any meeting of such body or committee, the Pro-Vice-Chancellor shall preside over such meeting.
(4) A Pro-Vice-Chancellor shall, on being authorized by the Vice-Chancellor in that behalf is entitled to be present at and to address any meeting of any authority, body or committee of the University but shall not be entitled to vote thereat:

Provided that if the Pro-Vice-Chancellor is a member of such authority body or committee, he shall have all the rights and privileges of a member thereof.
(5) The term of office of a Pro Vice Chancellor shall be such as may be decided by the Vice Chancellor but it shall not be in any case exceed five years or until the expiration of the term of office of the Vice Chancellor whichever is earlier and shall be eligible for re-appointment.
(6) The emoluments and other terms and conditions of service of a Pro-Vice -Chancellor shall be such as may be laid down in the Ordinances

Deanis of
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Faculties
(1) Deans of faculties shall be appointed by the ViceChancellor in such manner to exercise such powers and perform such duties as may be laid down in the Ordinances


Provided that when the office of the Dean is vacant or when the Dean is by reason of illness or absence or any other cause, unable to perform the duties of his office, the duties of the office shall be performed by such person as the Vice-Chancellor may appoint for the purpose.
(2) The Dean shall be the Head of a Department or a School of Studies and shall be responsible for the conduct and standard of teaching and research in the Department, school. Hie shall have such other functions as may be laid down in the Ordinances.
(3) The Dean shall have the right to be present and to speak at any meeting of a board or committee of the Department, school as the case may be, but not the right to vote thereat unless he is a member thereof.

The Registrar $\quad 7$
(1) The Registrar shall be appointed by the Chancellor in such manner and on such terms and conditions as may be laid down in the Ordinances and shall be a wholetime salaried officer of the University.
(2) Ail contracts shall be entered into and signed by the Registrar on behalf of the University
(3) The Registrar shall have the power to authenticate records on behalf of the University and shall exercise such other powers and perform such other duties as may be prescribed or may be required from time to time, by the Chancellor or the Vice-Chancellor
(4) The Registrar shall be responsible for the due custody of the records and the common seal of the University and shall be bound to place before the Chancellor, the Vice-Chancellor or any other authority; all such information and documents as may be necessary for transaction of their business.
(5) When the office of the Registrar is vacant or when the Registrar is by reason of illness or absence for any other cause, unable to perform the duties of his office, the duties of the office shall be performed by such person as the Vice-Chancellor may appoint for the purpose.
(6) The Registrar shall not by reason only of his being Secretary of the Board of Management and the Academic Council, be deemed to be a member of any such authority.
(7) The Registrar shall-
a) be the custodian of the records, the common seal and such other properties of the University as the Board of Management shall commit to his charge.
b) conduct the official correspondence of the Board of Management and the Academic Council.
c) supply to the Chancellor copies of the agenda of meetings of the authorities of the University as soon as they are issued and the minutes of the meetings of the authorities ordinarily within a month of the holding of the meetings.
d) directions for carrying on the work of the University:
e) represent the University in suits or proceedings by or against the University, sign powers of attorney and verify pleadings or depute his representative for the purpose; and
f) perforn such other duties as may be specified in these Statutes or as laid down in the Ordinances or the Regulations or as may be required, from time to time by the Board of Management or the Vice-Chancellor.
g) in an emergency, when the Vice-Chancellor or the Pro-Vice-Chancellor is not able to act, call a meeting of the Board of Management forthwith and take its decision for carrying on the work of the University.
(8) a) The registrar or in relation to Accounts and Audit Staff of the University, the Finance Officer, have power to take disciplinary action against the employees belonging to the ministerial staff and to suspend them pending inquiry to administer warnings to them or to impose on them the penalty of ensure or the withholding of increment:

Provided that no such penalty shall be imposed unless the person concerned has been given a reasonable opportunity of showing cause against the action proposed to be taiken in regard to him.
b) an appeal shall lie to the Vice-Chancellor against any order of the Registrar, or as the case may be the Finance Officer, imposing the penalty of the withholding of increment.
c) in case where the inquiry discloses that a punishment beyond the powers of the Registrar or, as the case may be, the Finance Officer is called for, the Registrar or, as the case may be, the Finance Officer shall, upon conclusion of the inquiry make report to the ViceChancellor along with his recommendations, for such action as the Vice-Chancellor deems fit:

Provided that an appeal should lie to the Board of Management against the order of the ViceChancellor imposing the penalty of dismissal.

## The Finance Officer

8 (1) The Finance Officer shall be appointed by the Chancellor in such manner and shall exercise such powers and perform such duties as may be laid down in the Ordinances.
(2) The Finance Officer shall be the whole time salaried officer of the University.
(3) When the office of the Finance Officer is vacant or when the Finance Officer is by reason of illness or absence for any other cause, unable to perform the duties of his office, such person to whom the Vice-Chancellor may authorize shall conduct the duties of the office may appoint for the purpose.
(4) The Finance Officer shall
a) exercise general supervision over the funds of the University and shall advise it as regard its financial policy; and
b) perform such other financial functions as may be assigned to him by the Vice-Chancellor as may be laid down by the Ordinances
(5) Subject to the control of the Vice-Chancellor, the Finance Officer shall: -
a) hold and manage the property and investments including trust and endowed property for furthering any of the objects of the University.
b) see that the limits fixed by the Finance Committee for recurring and non-recurring expenditure for a year are not exceeded and that all moneys are expended on the purposes for which they are granted or allotted
c) be responsible for the preparation of annual accounts and the budget of the University for the next financial year and for their presentation to the Board of Management.
d) keep a constant watch on the state of the cash and bank balances and on the state of investments.
e) watch the progress of collection of revenue and advise on the methods of collection employed;
f) have the accounts of the University regularly audited by an internal audit party.
g) see that the registers of buildings, land, furniture and equipment are maintained up-todate and that the stock checking is conducted of equipment and other consumable materials in all officers, special Centers, Specialized Laboratories, colleges and institutions maintained by the University.

# Other Officers

h) call for explanation for unauthorized
h) call for explanation for unauthorized and suggest disciplinary action against the persons at fault; and
i) call for from any office or college or institution under the University any information or returns that he may consider necessary to discharge his financial responsibilities;
(6) The receipt of the Finance Officer or of the person or persons duly authorized in this behalf by the Vice-Chancellor for any money payable to the University shall be sufficient discharge for the same.
(1) Other officers of the University shall be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor with the approval of the Chancellor in such manner and on such terms and conditions of service as may be laid down in the Ordinances.
(1) The members of the BOARD OF MANAGEMENT shall hold office for a term of three years.
(2) Subject to the provisions of the Act, these Statutes and the Ordinances, the BOARD OF MANAGEMENT shall, in addition to any other powers vested in it, have the following powers, namely;
i) to appoint such Professor, Associate Professor, Assistant Professor, Research Associate and other members of the teaching staff as may be necessary, on the recommendations of the Selection Committees constituted for the purpose, and to provide for filling temporary. vacancies therein;
ii) to fix the emoluments and define the duties and conditions of service of Professors, Assistant Professor, Research Associate and other mernbers of the teaching staff;

Provided that no action shall be taken by the BOARD OF MANAGEMENT in respect of the number, the qualifications and the emoluments of teachers otherwise than after consideration of the recommendations of the Academic Council.
iii) to create administrative, ministerial and other necessary posts and to make appointments fhereto:

Provided that any additional post, not provided in the Budget may be created only after due examination by the Finance Committee of the University.
iv) to regulate and enforce discipline among the members of the teaching, administrative and ministerial staff of the University in accordance with these Statutes and the Ordinances;
v) to manage and regulate the finances, accounts, investments, property, business and all other administrative affairs of the University and, for that purpose, to appoint such agents as it many think fit;
vi) to invest any money belonging to the University, including any unapplied income, in such stocks, funds, shares or securities as it shall, from time to time think fit, or in the purchase of immovable property in India, with the like powers of varying such investments from time to time;
vii) a) to accept on behalf of the University any trust, bequest, donation or transfer of any movable or immovable property to the University, and
b) to transfer any movable or immovable property on behalf of the University;
viii) to provide the buildings, premises, furniture, apparatus and other means needed for carrying on the work of the University.
ix) to enter into, vary, carry out and cancel contracts on behalf of the University;
x) to entertain, adjudicate upon, and if it thinks fit, to redress, any grievances of the salaried officers, the teaching staff and other employees of the University who may for any reasons feel aggrieved:

Provided that, in matters of discipline and punishment, where the final power has been vested in the Vice-Chancellor or any other officer of the University, no appeal shall lie to the BOARD OF MANAGEMENT.
$x i)$ to appoint examiners and moderators and if necessary, to remove them, and to fix their fees, emoluments and traveling and other allowances after consulting the Academic Council;
xii) to select a common seal for the University and provide for the custody and use of the seal;
xiii) to institute Fellowships, Scholarships, Studentships, Medals and Prizes;
xiv) to delegate any of its powers to the ViceChancellor, the Registrar or such other officer of the University or to a Committee appointed by it as it may deem fit.

11 (1) Every member of the Academic Council, other than ex-officio members, shall hold office for a term of two years.
(2) Subject to the provisions of the Act and these Statutes, the Academic Council shall, in addition to all other powers vested in it, have the following powers, duties and functions, namely.
i) to report on any matter referred to it by the BOARD OF GOVERNORS or the BOARD OF MANAGEMENT.
ii) to make proposals to the BOARD OF MANAGEMENT for the establishment of Departments, Colleges, Institutions of higher learning, special Centers, specialized laboratories, Libraries and Museums;
iii) to formulate, modify or revise schemes for the organization of, and assignment of subjects to schools of studies;
iv) to consider proposals submitted by the Schools of studies;
v) to promote research within the University and to require, from time to time, reports on such research;

vi) to make recommendations to the BOARD OF MANAGEMENT with regard to the creation and abolition of teaching posts in the University and the classification of the said posts and the emoluments and duties attaching thereto;
vii) to recognize degrees of other Universities and institutions and to determine their equivalent degrees of the Gautam Buddha University;
viii) to appoint Committees for admission to the University;
ix) to publish lists of prescribed or recommended text books and to publish the syllabuses of prescribed courses of study;
x) to make such arrangements for the instruction and examınation of persons, not being members of the University, as may be necessary;
$x i)$ to recommend to the BOARD OF MANAGEMENT draft Ordinances regarding examinations of the University and the conditions on which students should be admitted to such examinations;
xii) to make recommendations to the BOARD OF MANAGEMENT in regard to the appointment of examiners and, if necessary, their removal and the fixation of their fees, emoluments and traveling and other expenses;
xiii) to make arrangements for the conduct of examinations and to fix dates for holding them;
xiv) to declare the results of various University examinations, or to appoint Committees or Officers to do so;
xv) to make recommendations for the conferment of honorary degrees and to confer or grant degrees, academic distinctions, honours, diplomas, licenses, titles and marks of honour;
xvi) to make proposals to the BOARD OF MANAGEMENT for the institution of fellowships, scholarships, studentships, medals and prizes and to award the same;

xvii) to perform in relation to academic matters, all such duties and to do all such acts as may be necessary for the proper carrying out of the provisions of the Act, these Statutes and the Ordinances.

12 (1) The University shall have such schools of studies, special centers and specialized laboratories as may be specified in the Ordinances.
(2) a) Every school of studies (hereinafter referred to as the school) shall consist of such Departments as may be assigned to it by the Ordinances;
b) each Department shall consist of the following members, namely;
i) teachers of the Department.
ii) persons appointed to conduct research in the Department.
iii) honorary Professors, if any, attached to the Department.
iv) such other persons as may be members of the Department in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinances.
v) each Center/Department shall have a Chairperson who shall be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor from amongst the Professors for a period of two years:

Provided that where in any Center/Department, there is only one Professor the Vice-Chancellor shall also appoint one of the Associate Professors as the Chairman of the Center/Department.
(3) The duties and functions of a Chairperson of the Center, Department shall be as laid down by the Ordinances.


## The Finance Conmittee

13 (1) The Finance Committee shall consist of:
a) the Vice-Chancellor, who shall be the Chairperson;
b) the Finance Officer;
c) one officer not below the rank of Special Secretary to the State Government nominated by the State Government, and
d) two members to be nominated by each Development authority (Noida \& Greater Noida).
(2) The Finance Officer shall be the Secretary of the Finance Committee.
(3) Three members of the Finance Committee shall form the quorum.
(4) Every members of the Finance Committee, other than ex-officio members, shall hold office for a term of three years.
(5) The Vice-Chancellor shall preside over the meetings of the Finance Committee.
(6) The Finance Committee shall meet at least twice every year to examine accounts and scrutinize proposals fro expenditure.
(7) The anniual accounts and financial estimates of the University prepared by the Finance Officer shall be laid before the Finance Committee for consideration and comments and thereafter submitted to the BOARD OF MANAGEMENT for approval with or without amendments.

Funds

Resignation
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14 (1) The amount of permanent endowment fund shall be deposited in a Public Sector Bank.
(2) The amount of funds shall be operated and maintained by the Finance Officer with the approval of Board of Governors.

15 (1) Any member other than ex-officio members of the BOARD OF GOVERNORS, the BOARD OF MANAGEMENT the Academic Council or any other Authority of the University or Committee may resign by a letter addressed to the Registrar and the registration shall take effect as soon as such letter is received by the Registrar.

(2) Any officer of the University (whether salaried or otherwise) may resign his office by letter addressed to the Registrar:

Provided that such resignation shall take effect only on the date from which the same is accepted by the competent Authority.

Disqualification 16 (1) A person shall be disqualified for being chosen as, or for being, a member of any of the authorities of the University.
a) if he is of unsound mind or is a deaf-mute or suffers from contagious leprosy;
b) if he is an undischarged insolvent;
c) if he has been convicted by a Count of Law of an offence involving moral turpitude and sentenced in respect thereof to imprisonment for not less than six months.
(2). If any question arises as to whether a person is or had been subjected to any of the disqualifications mentioned in subsection (1), the question shall be referred for the decision of the Chancellor and his decision shall be final, and no suit or other proceedings shall lie in any BOARD OF GOVERNORS of law against such decision.

Honorary 17 (1) Any proposal for the conferment of honorary Degrees

18 (1) The Academic Council may, by a special
Degrees, etc. degrees shall be made by the Academic Council to the BOARD OF MANAGEMENT, and the proposal if accepted by the BOARD OF MANAGEMENT shall require the assent of the BOARD OF GOVERNORS before submission to the Chancellor for confirmation. resolution passed by a majority of not less than two-thirds of the members present and voting, withdraw any degree or academic distinction conferred on, or any certificate or diploma granted to, any person by the University for good and sufficient cause:


## Selectiont committees

Provided that no such resolution shall be passed until a notice in writing has been given to that person calling upon him to show cause within such time as may be specified in the notice why such resolution should not be passed and until his objections, if any, and any evidence he may produce in support of them, have been considered by the Academic Council.
'19 (1) There shall be Selection Committees for making recommendations to the BOARD OF MANAGEMENT for appointment to the posts of Professor, Associate Professor, Assistant Professor and other Officers. The committee shall consist of such members as may be laid down in the Ordinances.
(2) The procedure to be followed by a Selection Committee referred to in sub-statute (1) in making recommendations shall be such as may be laid down in the Ordinances.

Special mode of 20 (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in these
appointment.
Statutes the BOARD OF MANAGEMENT may invite a person of high academic distinction and professional attainment to accept a post of Professor or Associate Professor in the University, as the case may be, on such terms and conditions as it deems fit, and on the person agreeing to do so, appoint him to the post. services of officers employees etc.

Conditions of 21 (1) Every employee shall be appointed under a written contract, which shall be lodged with the University and a copy of which shall be furnished to the employee concerned.
(2) Any dispute arising out of the contract between the University and an employee shall, at the request of the employee, be referred to a tribunal of arbitration consisting of one member appointed by the Board of Management, one member nominated by the employee concerned and an umpire appointed by the Chancellor.
(3) The decision of the tribunal in such matter shall be final.
(4) The procedure for regulating the work of the tribunal shall be such as may be prescribed.
(5) Any dispute arising out of a contract between the university and those mentioned in these Statutes, at the request of the teacher or officer or employee concerned, or at the instance of the University, be referred to a Tribunal of Arbitration consisting of one member appointed by the BOARD OF MANAGEMENT, one member nominated by the Officer or teacher concerned and an umpire appointed by the Chancellor and the decision of the Tribunal shall be final.

Removal of teachers

22 (1) Where there is an allegation of misconduct against a teacher, the Vice Chancellor may, if he thinks fit, by order in writing place the teacher under suspension ad shall forthwith report to the BOARD OF MANAGEMENT the circumstances in which the order was made.

Provided that the BOARD OF MANAGEMENT may, if it is of the opinion, that the circumstances of the case do not warrant the suspension of the teacher revoke that order.
(2) Notwithstanding any thing contained in the terms of his contract of service or of his appointment, the BOARD OF MANAGEMENT shall be entitled to remove a teacher on the ground of misconduct.
(3) Same as aforesaid, the BOARD OF MANAGEMENT shall not be entitled to remove a teacher except for good cause and after giving three months notice in writing or payment of three months salary in lieu of notice.
(4) No teacher shall be removed under these Statutes until he has been given a reasonable opportunity of showing cause against the action proposed to be taken in regard to him.
(5) The removal of a teacher shall require a twothirds majority of the members of the BOARD OF MANAGEMENT present and voting.
(6) The removal of a teacher shall take effect from the date on which the order of removal is made:


Removal of 23 (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in the terms of his contract of service or of his appointment, an employee of the University, other than a teacher, may be removed by the authority which is competent to appoint the employee
a) if he is of unsound mind or is a deaf-mute or suffers from contagious leprosy;
b) if he is an undischarged insolvent;
c) if he has been convicted by a BOARD OF GOVERNORS of law of any offence involving moral turpitude and sentenced in respect thereof to imprisonment for not less than six months;
d) if he is otherwise guilty of misconduct.

Provided that no officer of the University shall be removed from his office unless a resolution to that effect is passed by the BOARD OF MANAGEMENT by a majority of two thirds of its members present and voting.
(2) No such employee shall be removed under these Statutes until he has been given a reasonable opportunity of showing cause against the action proposed to be taken in regard to him.
(3) Where the removal of such employee is for a reason other than that specified under these Statutes, he shall be given three months' notice in writing or paid three months' salary in lieu of notice.
(4) Notwithstanding any thing contained in these Statutes, an employee of the University, not being a teacher shall be entitled to resign.

Procedure of appeal and arbitration int disciplinary cases against students.

i) in the case of a permanent employee, only after giving three months' notice in writing to the appointing authority or paying to the University three months salary in lieu thereof;
ii) in any other case, only after giving one month's notice in writing to the appointing authority or paying to the University one month's salary in lieu thereof.

24 (1) Any student or candidate for an examination whose name has been removed from the rolls of the University or a constituent college by the orders of the Vice-Chancellor or the principal or by the resolution of the Academic Council, as the case may be, and who has been debarred from appearing at the examination of the University for more than one year, may, within ten days of the date of receipt of such order or copy of such resolution, appeal to the Board of Management which may confirm, modify or reverse the decision of the Vice-Chancellor, the Academic Council or the principal, as the case may be.
(2) Any dispute arising out of any disciplinary action taken by the University against a student shall, at the request of such student, be ferried to a tribunal of arbitration and the provisions under these Statutes, mutatis mutandis, apply to a reference made under this sub-section.
(3) All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action in relation to students shall vest in the Vice-Chancellor.
(4) The Vice-Chancellor may delegate all or any of his powers, as he deems proper to the Pro-Vice-Chancellor and to such other persons as he may specify in this behalf.
(5) Without prejudice to the generality of his powers relating to the maintenance of discipline and taking such action in the interest of maintaining discipline as may seem to him appropriate, the Vice-Chancellor may, in the exercise of his powers aforesaid, order or direct that any-student or students be expelled from any college or institution maintained by the University, Department, Special Center or Specialized Laboratory, or be, for a stated period rusticated
or be not, for a stated period, admitted to a course or courses of study in any such college or institution, Department, Special Centre, or specialized Laboratory, or be fined in a sum of rupees that may be specified, or be debarred from taking an examination or examinations for one or more years or that the results of student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which he has or they have appeared be cancelled.
(6) The Principals; or, as the case may be, the Heads of the Colleges, Institutions, Departments, Special Centres or Specialized Laboratories shall have the authority to exercise all such disciplinary powers over the students in their respective colleges, institutions, Departments, Special Centres or Specialized Laboratories as may be necessary for the proper conduct of such Colleges, Institutions, Departments, Special Centres or Specialized Laboratories.
(7) Without prejudice to the powers of the ViceChancellor as aforesaid, detailed rules; of discipline and proper conduct shall be framed. The Principals, or as the case may be, the Heads of the Colleges, Institutions, Departments, Special Centres or Specialized Laboratories may frame such supplementary regulations as they deem necessary for the aforesaid purposes. Every student shall provide himself with a copy of such regulations.

Resolution of
Disputes Disputes

25 (1) The dispute between the University and its officers, faculty members, employees and students shall be resolved by the ViceChancellor. For this purpose the ViceChancellor shall constitute a committee consisting of the concerned Dean, concerned Head of the Department and one member of the BOARD OF MANAGEMENT and shall take decision after the recommendations of the committee.

Creation of

26 (1) The Chancellor may in consultation with the Education Society create, abolish or restructure any department or faculty of the university.

## Audit of Accounts

27 (1) The University may grant freeship and may institute and award, scholarships, fellowships (including traveling fellowship), studentship, medals and prizes in accordance with the provisions to be laid down in the Ordinances.

28 (1) The number of seats in different courses of studies and the procedure of admission to such courses shall be such as may be laid down in the Ordinances. The reservation of the seats shall be made in accordance with the law and the orders for the time being in force.

29 (1) The university may charge fees from students for various courses of studies in accordance with the provisions to be laid down in the Ordinances.

30 (1) The posts of teachers and other employees of the University shall be created or abolished by the Board of Governors.

31 (1) The annual accounts and balance sheets of the University shall be audited annually by the Examiner, Local Funds Accounts and any expenditure incurred by him in connection with such audit shall be payable by the University to the Examiner Local Funds Accounts.
(2) The accounts of the university as certified by the Examiner, Local Funds Accounts or any person authorized by him in that behalf together with the audit report thereof shall be forwarded annually to the State Government.

Regulations 32 (1) The authorities of the University may make Regulations consistent with this Act, these Statutes and the Ordinances:
a) laying down the procedure to be observed at their meetings and the number of members required to form a quorum;
b) providing for all matters, which by this Act, these Statutes or the Ordinances are to be prescribed by Regulations;

c) providng for all other matters solely concerning such authorities or committees appointed by them and not provided for by this Act, these Statutes or the Ordinances.
(2) Every authority of the University shall make Regulations providing for the giving of notice to the member of such authority of the dates of meetings and of the business to be considered at meetings and for the keeping of a record of the proceedings of meetings.
(3) The BOARD OF MANAGEMENT may direct the amendment in such manner as it may specify, of any Regulation made under this Statute or the annulment of any such Regulation.

Degrees

Provident Fund
33 (1) The University shall confer the following Degrees, namely:-
i) Doctor of Literature, Science and Laws;
ii) Doctor of Philosophy, Master of Philosophy;
iii) Master of Surgery, Doctor of Medicine;
iv) Master of Arts, Science, Commerce, Laws, Engineering, Technology and Management;
v) such other Bachelors or Sandwich or integrated or-Master Degree as may be laid down in the Ordinances.

34 (1) The University shall constitute for the benefit of and Pension
Funds

University. its employees such provident or pension fund and provide such insurance scheme as it may deem fit in such manner and subject to such conditions as may be laid down in the Ordinances

35 (1) All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action in relation to students shall vest in the Vice-Chancellor.
(2) The Vice-Chancellor may delegate all or such of his powers, as he deems proper to the Dean of students and to such other persons as he may specify in this behalf.

(3) Without prejudice to the generality of his powers relating to the maintenance of discipline and taking such action in the interest of maintaining discipline as may seem to him appropriate, the Vice-Chancellor may, in the exercise of his powers aforesaid, order or direct that any students or students be expelled from any college or institute maintained by the University, Department, Special Centre or Specialized Laboratory, or be, for a stated period rusticated or be not, for a stated period, admitted to a course or courses of study in any such college or institution, Department, Special Centre, or Specialized Laboratory, or he fined in a sum of rupees that may be specified, or be debarred from taking an examination or examinations for one or more years or that the results of students of students concerned in the examination or examinations in which he has or they have appeared be cancelled.
(4) The Principals or, as the case may be, the Heads of the College, Institutions, Departments, Special Centres or Specialized Laboratories shall have the authority to exercise all such disciplinary powers, over the students in their respective colleges, institutions, Departments, Special Centres or Specialized Laboratories as may be necessary for the proper conduct of such Colleges, Institutions, Departments, Special Centres or Specialized Laboratories.
(5) Without prejudice to the powers of the ViceChancellor and the Dean of students as aforesaid, rules, of discipline and proper conduct shall be framed. The Principals or, as the case may be the Heads of the Colleges, Institutions, Departments, Special Centres or Specialized Laboratories may frame such
supplementary rules as they deem necessary for the aforesaid purposes. Every student shall provide himself with a copy of these rules.

Matters not 36 (1) Any matter which is not provided in these provided in dhess.antutas statutes shall be provided by an order of BOARD OF GOVERNORS to be issued with the prior approval of State Government.
