Observations of the Committee

• The Lingaya Institute of Management is situated at Nachauli in Faridabad district of Haryana amidst a rural setting. Established by a Charitable society namely the Lingaya Jan Kalyan Sikshan Sanshthan. The Institute is spread over an area of around 18 acres. Even though the location of the Institute is in the semi urban area on the outskirts of Industial town of Faridabad, the Management of the Institute has invested in a big way for creation of infrastructure with all modern facilities. This is perhaps one of the reasons that the Institute has been able to attract a large number of bright and promising students from the adjoining areas of Delhi, Noida and Gurgaon, apart from the students of other parts of the country. Established in 1998, the Institution has

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made a remarkable progress during the last 10 years and created a niche for itself among the good ranking Engineering Institutions of the State. During its visit to the Institute, the Committee had discussions with the Chairman and Secretary of Sponsoring Society about the ongoing activities and future plans for the growth of the Institute. The Director of the Institute made a presentation highlighting the salient features of the Institute. The members of the Committee visited the teaching departments, inspected the various facilities like libraries and labs, interacted with the Faculty and students and also examined the various documents produced by the Institute. On the basis of its physical inspection of academic programmes, infrastructural facilities, assessment of research component and teaching practices and interaction with faculty and students, the Committee makes the following observations:

- 1. The Management of the Institute has created nice infrastructure in terms of Buildings, Library and Lab facilities, Hostels and other amenities. The construction activities going on in the campus were indicative of expansion plans of the Institute. The Management appeared willing and capable of investing on upgradation and augmentation.
- 2. The Admission process is regulated in accordance with the system prescribed by the M.D. University under which students are drawn from the AIEEE. The committee was told that that the cut off rank for admission of students is 31000. The Committee, after interacting with the students was convinced that the Institution has been attracting bright and talented students.
- 3. There is a Central Library in place but the Committee observed that the number of volumes and titles need to be increased. The Committee also felt that the Institute should subscribe more international journals. Though the Library has access to the Internet, the Institution needs to install more PCs with latest configurations.
- 4. The Committee observed that despite having adequate resources, institutional support for the research activities is not encouraging. With an enthusiastic faculty and adequacy of resources, a lot could have been achieved on research front with proper motivation from the Management. The Committee was of the view that the Management should adopt a pro-active approach in supporting and motivating the research activities. The Institute should also motivate the faculty to get consultancy projects from the local Industries and governmental agencies.
- 5. The number of faculty with Ph.D is very low and Institution should take a serious note of this. Wherever possible, the Management should sponsor teachers for pursuing Ph.D in reputed Institutions of the country.
- 6. Placement of the students is the remarkable aspect of the Institute. Almost in all the departments, majority of the graduates are placed in reputed industries.

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- 7. On the front of social responsibility, the Institute has launched a number of schemes including scholarships and freeships to provide access to the economically backward sections of the society. The Institute also conducts skill upgradation programmes for the youths of the nearby villages.
- 8. The faculty retention rate is fairly good. Most of faculty members are young and energetic and if groomed and nurtured with visionary approach, can prove to be an asset to the Institute.

Recommendation

The Institution has the potential for innovation. The Management has the will as well as resources to excel and innovate and if academic freedom in the form of university status is available, the Institute can emerge as a centre of excellence in the region. The Committee, therefore, unanimously recommends that the Lingaya Institute of Management and Technology, Faridabad may be declared as a Deemed to be University under Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956.



It has reference to the UGC's letter No.F .6-32/2006 (CPP-I) dated 7th February 2008.

Kindly find enclosed herewith the copy of the report of the AICTE team (Annexure-I) based on the spot assessment of Lingaya's Institute fo Management and Technology, Faridabad The AICTE team has submitted its recommendations as under:

"On the basis of the presentations made by the departmental faculty, visits to the laboratorie, library, infrastructural facilities, interaction with the faculty. students and the management, the committee has found that the management, faculty and students have shown potential and commitment for improving the quality of education and want to promote emerging areas in engineering and technology. The committee, therefore, recommends that the Lingaya's Institute of Management and Technology, Faridabad can be considered for conferment of Deemed to be university Status so far as engineering and technoogy programmes are concerned. This shall, however, be subject to the conditions that the norms and Standards as specified from time to time by the statutory bodies such as UGC and AICTE are maintained"

Following deficiencies have been pointed out by the expert committee (copy at Annexure-II) in the proposal as regard to the eligibility guidelines of the AICTE for grant of Deemed to be University status:

- 1. The PG programmes are only 4 years old as against the AICTE requirement of 5 years.
- 2. No doctoral programmes are being conducted in any of the major department as against the AICTE requirement of such programmes in all the major departments.



- Student turn out in Post Graduate courses (M.Tech / ME /MBA/ MCA / M.Arch. / M.Pharma. should be at least 6 per department / discipline / year for last 5 years. The instituite does not meet this requirement
- 4. No Research Scholars have been registered for Ph.D. during last five years as against the AICTE requirement of 4 per department in all the departments.
- 5. The institution has not awarded any Ph. D as against the AICTE requirement of 10Ph.Ds during last 5 years.
- 6. The institution does not meet the requirement of completion of at least 5 sponsored research projects of Rs.8. Lacs each or more, in the last 5 years.
- 7. The requirement of guiding doctoral research by at least 5 faculty members per discipline/ department is not fulfilled.
- 8. The institution does not meet the requirement of publishing 50 research papers in referred journals in the last 5 years involving sizeable number of disciplines/departments and faculty members.
- 9. The requirement of generating income of Rs.15 Lacs through consultancy during last five years is not fulfilled.
- 10. The requirement of at least 50% faculty having Ph.D. qualification is not fulfilled.

The Lingaya's Institute fo Management and Technology, Faridabad, may submit a compliance of above referred deficiencies to the UGC and a copy thereof may be forwarded to AICTE for necessary action.

In view of the above deficiencies and expert committee report (copy enclosed as above), the UGC may take its own view on the matter regarding the grant of Deemed University status to Lingaya's Institute of Management and Technology, Faridabad.

The observation and the recommendation of the committee based on the presentation made by the institution, visit to its facilities and discussions with the various stakeholder groups are given in this report.

Lingayas institute of Management and Technology, Faridabad has applied to UGC for the conferment of Deemed to be University status. The institution is offering following courses, which fall in the purview of AICTE.

A. **GENERAL**

The institution is spread over an area of 18.15 acres with constructed area over 72,000 sqm. The quality of construction is of acceptable standards. The institution has academic blocks. and has developed central facilities such as library, workshops, laboratories, auditorium, student activity centre, play ground, gymnasium, hostels etc.. There is well equipped computer centre with Wi-Fi which provides adequate opportunities for the faculty and students for the effective teaching learning activities. The institution has separate boys and girls hostels on the campus. The ambience in the institution is good and conducive to learning. Though the institution has a few staff quarters, it requires further augmentation for effective academic ambience.

The central library is reasonably equipped. It has about 6500 titles comprising of 28000 volumes. It subscribes to more than 60 journals and is regular member of INDEST-AICTE consortium for online access to international journals. It has also acquired the membership of NICAIR and DELLNET. For a university the library space should be increased by adding additional building.

The institution has provided 3 Mbps Internet connectivity in the campus which needs be raised. Though the facility has been made available to faculty members in the institute, this facility has not been provided in the hostels which restricts access to the internet after institution hours. The hostel should also be provided this facility.

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The institution has adequate financial resources to pursue the ideals and goals of a university. However, proper planning and transparency with more faculty participation in Budgeting, Management and Decision making at all levels is recommended.

Teaching learning process is in place and is effective.

The institution need improvement in Research and Development activities and need to be supported by the management with a greater thrust. Further suggestions are given in the subsequent paragraphs.

All the eligible UG programs have been accredited by the NBA for the period 2008-2011. Other programs should go for accreditation as and when eligible.

B. **FACULTY**

The number of faculty is adequate and as per the AICTE norms. The total no. of Faculty is 182 with 27 professors, 4 Assoc. Professors, 27 Asst. Professors and 124 lectures/senior lecturers. The teacher-student ratio is 1:15. However, the cadre ratio needs improvement as it is skewed towards lecturers. The selection procedures are transparent and are as per norms.

The number of Ph.Ds in the faculty is just 33. However, as informed by the management during presentation 6 teachers are registered for Ph.D. It is recommended that more Ph.D. degree holders should be recruited as faculty and the existing faculty members should also be encouraged to attain higher qualifications from reputed institutions. in order to give wider exposure and training in the contemporary subjects the faculty members should be encouraged and provided adequate financial support to attend training programs, short term courses, conferences, workshop etc. in the country and abroad. All faculty members should generally attend at least one such programs every year. The Institute should also organize such events in their campus.

C. Research and Development

At present the in house research and development activities are as is expected from a college. It was evident from the presentation and discussion that the Institute is now

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geared up to take up the R&D activities like those of a good university. Faculty and some of the M.Tech. students have made joint publications in journals, International and National conferences. Some of the publications are for a period when the faculty members were either pursuing their own Ph.D. or for a period when they were working elsewhere prior to joining this Institute. R&D culture and zeal of the faculty is reflected from this fact. The Institute should start regular Ph.D. fellowships and recruit full time research scholars to promote quality research activities in all the departments. Some in house funded research projects have been completed. In the automobile engineering laboratory considerable research and development work is in progress. Some innovative and highly educative models/projects are being developed. The Institution has also taken Collaborative Research initiatives to interact with various research organizations. More sponsored research and R&D projects should be obtained from industry and other funding agencies. Industry Institute collaboration cell should be established to further strengthen the existing marginal industrial collaboration.

D. STUDENTS

Several students of the college in different engineering branches have secured positions in the first 15 ranks over the years. Pass percentage and first divisions are high; for the past 5 years the first divisions are over 50%. The placement record is good with maximum pay package in the range Rs. 4 to 4.5 lakh in different branches and the annual average is around Rs. 2.2 to 2.8 lakh. However, more core companies should be invited for campus placement. The training and placement cell should be further strengthened.

In the interaction session with the students they showed their concern about the existing system of examination. They were nearly unanimous in their presentation favoring the university status for the college.

Adequate opportunities are provided for developing the skills, competencies and overall personality of students. As conveyed by the faculty during the presentations value added programmes are provided to improve the employability and professional skills of students.

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RECOMMENDATIONS

On the basis of the presentations made by the departmental faculty, visits to the laboratories, library, infrastructural facilities, interaction with the faculty, students and the management, the committee has found that the management, faculty and students have shown potential and commitment for improving the quality of education and want to promote emerging areas in engineering and technology. The committee, therefore, recommends that the Lingaya's institute of Management and Technology, Faridabad can be considered for conferment of Deemed to be University Status so far as engineering and technology programmes are concerned. This shall, however, be subject to the conditions that the Norms and Standards as specified from time to time by the statutory bodies such as UGC and AICTE are maintained.
