
REPORT OF THE UGC EXPERT COMMITTEE TO ASSESS THE PROPOSAL OF **MANADEM WARKANDESHMAR EDUCATION TRUST** FOR CONFERMENT OF DEEMED TO BE UNIVERSITY <u>STATUS UNDER</u> DE-NOVO CATEGORY UNDER SECTION 3 OF THE UGC ACT,1956

I. Background

The Maharishi Markandeshwar Education Trust was established in 1993. With the opening of the first institution in 1995 namely MM Engineering College with three disciplines in B.Tech, the Trust has now made a rapid progress and growth with inclusion of the following 10 more Institutes for which the Trust has requested to UGC to consider their proposal UGC for conferring deemed to be university status under de-novo category through MHRD vide their letter No.F.9-65/2006-U.3(A) dated 14th March,2007.

At present the institute offers 16 PG and 13 UG courses with the intake of 1501 and Cal admitted strength of students in 10 colleges are 4772 and is affiliated to Kurukshetra University. The MMET owns 217 acres of land having 1,55,003 sq.mtrs. covered area. In addition to the Buildings of the above ten Institutes, the MM Educational Complex has constructed over 10,00,000 sq. feet covered area for residential sector, 7 hostels for boys and girls of 3200 students, Guest House. There are two Indoor Auditorium with seating capacity of 2500 students, one open theatre of 2500 persons seating capacity, 66013 book & 671 journals costing Rs.910.31 lakhs including apparatus and equipments of Library.

Now the MMET has provided a new Administrative Block of 9076 sq. mtrs. of three storied with two high power lift for the secretariat of proposed deemed university only.

Apart from having provision for research courses of M.Phil and Ph.D. in various fields, extensional programmes includes Consultancy, Survey Work, Health Camps in rural areas by the Medical College Hospital and Dental College has been undertaken. In addition some projects have also been undertaken by the Entrepreneurship Development Cell under the guidelines of the Central Govt.

The MM Education Trust is a quality private education provider in North India aiming ultimately to raise the standards of educational excellence in the country and particularly in Haryana. As there are numbers of Deemed Universities in other States, it would be the first Deemed University in Haryana and other neighbouring States which is a significant destination and tri junction to the State of Haryana, Punjab & H.P. The Campus is well connected by rail, road and the airport at Chandigarh.

In reply to the above, the MMET informed to affiliating university vide its letter dated 6.4.2007 that there is no provision of NOC of being required from the State Government by the Institution inasmuch as it was the subject matter between the UGC and the concerned State. The Committee further noted that the policy of seeking the comments from the State Government by the UGC is also time bound within 30 days to be supplied to the UGC by the State Government. Keeping the above view in consideration, the MMET requested the University to issue the requisite certificate within three days otherwise it would be presumed that the university has no objection to continue their students already enrolled with Kurukshetra University to enable them to complete their courses and obtain their degree (Annexure-IX). Thereafter, no reply is received from the affiliating university whereas more than three months have passed from the date of application of requisite certificate. However, as per decision taken in the meeting of the Commission held on 13.08.2004 (Annexure-X), the following guidelines were approved in this connection:- " However, if no reply is received within three months, their acceptance shall be taken as granted and the Commission may proceed with the processing of the proposal for giving status of deemed to be university." However, the Institute has given an undertaking to this effect that all their students already enrolled with the affiliating University will be continued to complete their respective courses in the affiliating university till they pass out. 



IV OBSERVATIONS/SUGGESTIONS OF THE COMMITTEE

The Committee made the following observations with regard to each of the following institutions:-

1. MM College of Dental Sciences & Research

DCI representative Dr. S.G.Damle and UGC Committee member Dr. S.Shanmugam visited the Dental College and verified the space, building, infrastructure, staff, equipment, library, laboratory and Research Facilities and have confirmed that the facilities are adequate for BDS and MDS courses for nine branches to conduct the academic programmes. The members recommended the said courses can be affiliated to the proposed Deemed-to-be-University.

2. MM Institute of Management

Observations:-

Shri Roque D'Cruz and Professor J.V.Prabahakar Rao, members observed that the Institute has a good building with excellent ambience. It has good infrastructure with good furniture. Adequate faculties have been appointed. Adequate efforts are made to provide placement to the students. Excellent communication laboratory is provided by the Institute... NBA Accreditation is awaited. The members strongly recommended that MBA Department can be upgraded to the level of Deemed-to-be-University.

Suggestions:-

- 1. The research output from the faculty members is to be strengthened.
- 2. Placement efforts should be stepped up to provide 100% placement to the students.

3. MM Institute of Computer Technology & Business Management (Hotel Management)

Observations:-

Shri Roque D'Cruz and Professor J.V.Prabahakar Rao team members inspected the above Institute and were satisfied that the Institute has sufficient and qualified faculty members, sufficient class rooms, labortaries in addition to one good language lab. The members found that hygiene and sanitation were maintained and this has been approved by AICTE.

Suggestions:

- 1. There is further scope of for improvement in the kitchens (additional tables and light equipments).
- 2. The computer lab though sufficient needs to be airconditioned.
- 3. House Keeping lab. Has a well appointed model bedroom but needs a chamber maid's trolley and cleaning agents.
- 4. Research activities are to be strengthened and encouraged by the staff.
- 5. There is no postgraduate course in Hotel Management and it may be noted that in general in the present scenario the students prefer to do MBA which organization offers.

4. MM Institute of Computer Technology & Business Management (MCA)

MCA Department was found in the year 1999. It has an intake of 60 per year. The faculty strength is 16 more than the norms and standards of AICTE. The Department has one Professors, three Readers and twelve lecturers. The Department has excellent computer lab with necessary software programmes and internet facility to facilitate good traning to the students. The Library has adequate number of books for the benefit of students.


The members recommended that MCA Department can be upgraded to the level of deemed-to-be university.

5. MM Institute of Medical Sciences & Research

The MCI representative Dr. S.N.Mathur and UGC Committee members and Dr. Vinay Kamal visited the Institute and observed that the Medical College will be admitting a

fifth batch this year of 150 students. The Medical College is being run by MM Education Trust, Ambala. The Trust has money, land, building for hospital, Medical College, Hostels, and Residential accommodations. All the departments have updated equipments, furnished chambers, offices etc. The faculty is qualified and adequate majority of the Professors are retired Government servants and are senior and experienced teachers. The clinicians are having adequate experience. The teaching is hi-tech. Clinical laboratories and Radiology Department are updated as per the need. The workload is sufficient and increasing gradually. There are no post-graduate courses hence, no research work is done. In non-clinical subjects there is no facilities for Ph.D. There are service oriented people and are enthusiastic.

6. MM College of Nursing

The MM College of Nursing established in 2004 has an excellent Nursing faculty as per INC norms. It has adequate infrastructure and facilities. Hostel facilities for students is as per the norms of Indian Nursing Council.

7 MM Institute of Medical Science and Research Nursing College

Observations:-

MM Institute of Medical Science and Research Nursing College established in 2006 and it has adequate faculty, infrastructure and facilities as per the INC norms for Phase-I. However, the labs need to be organized.

Suggestions:-

The nomenclature of the institute needs to be modified indicating the Medical Sciences and Nursing Science as two separate disciplines.

8. MM College of Pharmacy

Dr. A.K.Bandopadhyay and Shri S..L.Nasa visited the Institute and observed as under:-

Observations:-

- (i) The department started only two years back.
- (ii) The Institute has two programmes
- (a) Two years D.Pharm.Course

- (b) Four years B.Pharm.Course
- (iii) At present there is no post-graduate programme. As per rules the Institute can start M.Pharm. courses only after 2 batches of B.Pharm.students passes out.
- (iv) Research activities can start as soon as the postgraduate course starts. There is no research facilities in the Department at present which is not expected at this stage.
- (viii) The building of the department is good. However, the laboratories need reorientation as per PCI norms.
- (ix) Some more machineries and equipments are to be purchased.
- (x) More Pharmaceutical Journals should be subscribed.

Suggestions:-

- (i) The Principal/HOD of the Department should be M.Pharm. with Ph.D. degree having 15 years teaching experience or 10 years of industrial experience as the the PCI/AICTE rules which is not as present.
- (ii) The Institute should get approval from PCI for diploma programme immediately. Should also apply for year-wise approval from PCI for B.Pharm.course under section 12 of the Pharmacy Act.

9. MM Institute of Physiotherapy & Rehabilitation

The members visited the Institute with the Principal and examined the facilities and infrastructure:

- The Institute was established in the year 2001. They have recently shifted to current location. The building in which college has been shifted is under finishing stage of construction.
- The building in not accessible for persons with disabilities. May be once the lift start functioning the floors beyond ground floor will also become accessible.
- The infrastructure provided to the students is as follows:-
 - Class rooms 4 well furnished which is enough for 50 students each.

Equipments - Exercise Therapy, Electro Therapy, Hydrotheapy which are adequate. Auditorium – sharing with other departments.

Anatomy and physiology lab - share with medical college

Pathology, pharmacology, other basic health science labs share with medical college.

Postings of students and interns for clinical exposure is adequate. Clinics in college, collaboration with various hospitals in Ambala.

Attendance of patients in PT clinic varies from 14-45 – need to be improved. Pass percentage – class passing – 40-60%, rest of the students get supplementary.

One batch so far has passed out final year Placement services – so far not in place.

In view of the efforts made by the organization and growth of the college it is recommended to be included under the Deemed to be University.

10 MM Engineering College, Mullana

Observations:-

Prof. Ashok Kolaskar, Chairman of the Committee and Dr. Ranjeet Singh, UGC Committee Member inspected the Institute along with the AICTE team. The U and members observed as under:-

The institute has good specious laboratory facilities for the Engineering Department for UG courses. The teaching learning for UG Courses is good and there is adequate number of faculties, duly qualified as per AICTE norms. However, cadre ratio needs improvement. There is adequate number of computers in the Computer Centre. The student placement is very good. B.E.Courses as accreditated. There is some research activity in some department. But it needs to be strengthened in all departments. The Institute has good potential to grow in the time to come. Therefore it is recommended that Institute may be included as Deemed to be university.

Suggestions-

There is need to improve consultancy and R&D to be strengthened and more ME Courses to be started.





Report of the AICTE Representative on the UGC Expert Committee

<u>Reference</u>: Assessment of Institutions Established by Maharishi Markendeshwar (MM) Education Trust, Mullana(Ambala) for Conferrment of Deemed-to-be University Status

PREFACE :

The expert committee constituted by thee UGC Chairman visited the MM Institutions on April 19 and 20,2007. As per the MHRD directive, I was nominated by the AICTE and was assisted by two other members, namely, Prof P B Sharma, VC of RGTU, Bhopal and Prof A Sridharan, former Deputy Director, IISc, Bangalore.

The MM trust has established 10 Colleges/Institutes on one campus. Of these 10 institutions, Engineering College, Inst of Computer Technology and Business Management (running both MCA and Hotel Management Programmes), Inst of Management, and Pharmacy College come under the academic purview of AICTE. The UGC nominated Mr R D'Cruz (Goa Inst Hotel Management) for Hotel Management, Prof JV Prabhakar Rao(Andhra Univ) for Management, Prof A K Bandyopadhhayay(Jadavpur Univ) and a Representative of Pharmacy Council for Pharmacy, and Prof R Singh (NSIST) for Engineering.

The AICTE team, accompanied by Prof A Kolaskar (Chairman, UGC team) and Prof Ranjit Singh (UGC Team) visited all departments and laboratories, of the Engineering College. Also, the team visited such facilities as Computer Centre, Library, Hospital, Workshop, Guest House, Hostels for boys and girls, Sport facilities, and the Campus as a whole. Further, the team participated in the interactions with the faculty, students and the staff.

The Experts visiting Management, Pharmacy and Hotel Mgmt colleges provided their input for these institutions/ programmes directly to the Chairman of the Expert Committee

Physical verification of financial, administrative, faculty and academic records was left to the UGC team

Based on our observations and also on the information provided to us by the MMTrust as per the AICTE proforma, a preliminary report was given to the Chairman, Expert Committee at the conclusion of our visit. Copies of the AICTE Proforma completed by the Trust and our preliminary Report are attached. Following is a more detailed report of our observations:

Observations :

1.As far as the UG programmes are concerned, the Engineering College has good infrastructural, laboratory, teaching and library facilities. The number of faculty is adequate though the cadre ratio is not as per AICTE norms.. The teaching programmes follow the affiliating university norms well. The examination results of students are good. The placement of students is reasonably good 2.Extracurricular activities such as sports and NSS need more to be desired

3. Of the seven programmes, namely Electronics & Commun Engg, Computer Engg, Mechanical Engg, Electrical Engg, Civil Engg, Information Technology, and Electronics & Instrumentation, initiated during 1995, only the first four mentioned here have received AICTE Accreditation for only three years on 29/9/ 2006.

A. The College received approval for starting MTech programmes in Computer Sc & Eng and in Manufacturing during 2003 and for Electronics & Comm during 2005. Only one batch (presumably CSE- though not stated anywhere) has passed out during 2006. Of course, these programmes have not been accredited.

5. The Engineering faculty is 142 strong, with 15 PhDs (including 8 retired professors from other institutes), 44 M. Techs, and 112 B Techs. Cadre-wise, there are 14 Professors, 28 Assistant Profs, and 100 Lecturers. The cadre ratio is 1:2:7.14.

6. The Applied Science and Humanities Department is reasonably good. It has a Faculty strength of 37, with 8PhDs ,and 29 MA/ MSc qualifications. Cadre-wise, there are 5 Profs (including 2 retired Profs and two Not-qualified ones), 7 APs, and 25 Lecturers

7. Engineering and Applied Sc&Hum combined together has 124 lecturers at BTech/MSc/MA level which constitutes 70% of the total faculty. Some APs donot have requisite MTech qualifications. Further , 46 members of the faculty have been hired within the last one year or so.

8. All academic programmes are conventional. There are no frontier/ thrust area, innovative, upconventional, or multidisciplinary teaching, programmes.

- 9. The College has given a list of 14 students registered for PhD in three departments. In the absence of any R&D facilities, the students are registered to work in outside institutions. No evidence of quality R&D has been presented to us.
- 10. The College has given a list of 74 research publications (supposedly in refereed quality journals) by the faculty. This information is misleading and incorrect. Most of the publications of the faculty (such as that of Dr Vandana Sharma or Dr D. Singh, both of Physics) are for their work done elsewhere before joining this college. Some publications have no reference, and some are published in unknown journals. The no of credible publications in known journals of some quality is very small and that too by one or two members of the faculty.
- 14. The College has listed several R & D projects. This is a misleading information. All projects are actually grants from AICTE for improving the teaching laboratory facilities. No R&D project has been received by the College so far

12. Except for the Civil Engg department which does some routine testing -based consultancy, no other department has any consultancy from any agency.

13 Although reports by the experts on Management, Pharmacy and Hotel Management will be given directly to the UGC Committee Chairman, it needs to be pointed out that B.Pharma programme started during 2005 and the first batch has yet to pass out. There is no PG programme in Pharmacy.

Further, the programmes MCA started in 1999, MBA started in 2003, and Hotel Management in 2002 are not accreditable so far.

14. The MM trust is financially rich. However, as per the information given by the Trust, all moveable and immovable assets are in the name of the Trust at present.

Recommendation:

Based on the above observations of the lack of accreditation of all the existing UG programmes, lack of evaluation /outcome information on the existing PG programmes, absence of any innovative / thrust area programme, lack of research facilities and quality R&D by the faculty, and dependence on a large percentage of BTech qualfied faculty, I conclude that the Engineering College of the MM Trust does not meet the criteria stipulated in the guidelines of UGC (and AICTE) for a Deemed-to-be University status at present. Further, there being no evidence of any novel or innovative academic programme initiated or proposed to-be-initiated by the MM Trust, any consideration of a DeNuovo status for the Deemed-to-be University is not justified.

gestions :

1. It would be proper for UGC to seek possible nominations from AICTE for professional programmes under the purview of AICTE. In any case, nominees for such programmes should be advised by the UGC to assist the AICTE representative in finalizing the report.

2. The UGC guidelines for a Deemed-to-be University status need to be clarified point-wise in a simpler, verifiable and some-what quantifiable (wherever possible) language so that the aspiring institution does not present misleading and exaggerated information. Clarification of guidelines for a DeNuovo status is even more important.

3. In a limited time of two days, no expert committee can verify completely physical facilities, finances, academic records, etc. It may be considered to have such certification done by a suitably qualified and independent agency of repute before the visit takes place.

4. UGC should consider mentoring aspiring institutions towards a University Status, and encouraging them by helping to get academic autonomy from the affiliating universities as an intermediate step on trial basis towards a University Status.
