## EXPERT COMMITTEE REPORT FOR CONFERMENT OF DEEMED TO BE UNIVERSITY STATUS TO CONFERMENT OF DEEMED TO BE

 Background of the Institution giving details of teaching, research and extension programme.

**ISLAMIC ACADEMY OF EDUCATION (IAE)** is a Religious Minority Trust established in the year 1991, under the chairmanship of Al Haj Yenepoya Abdulla Kunhi. The Trust was registered on November 13, 1991. (Annexure – I).

The objective of the IAE is to establish and administer educational institutions, as institutions of minority community, such as, schools, colleges and institutes of general education, medical and dental education, engineering education, commercial education, any other type of professional and non professional education and Institutions of Research or Training in any branch of knowledge and also to establish necessary support facilities such as Hospitals, Nursing Homes, Dispensaries, Clinics, Hostels, etc.

In furtherance of this objective, the Trust has already established the Yenepoya Dental College (YDC), Yenepoya Medical College (YMC), Yenepoya Nursing College (YNC), Yenepoya Institute of Nursing Sciences (YINS) and Yenepoya Physiotherapy College (YPC) during the period 1990-2004. Yenepoya Dental College and Hospital, under consideration for proposed deemed university, is providing free hospitalization, basic dental care including free medicines with subsidized specialist dental care. The Trust has adequate financial resources to continue these activities and to plan for growth and development. Financial viability can be seen from the projected budget.

In addition to the programmes of higher education as detailed above, the Yenepoya Group has also taken active interest in general education and consequently is involved in the Yenepoya School (for pre-primary, primary and secondary levels) & Yenepoya Institute of Spoken English, thereby providing access to quality education from primary and pre-primary level itself.

In 1992, IAE established Yenpoya Dental College (YDC) that was affiliated to Mangalore University and recognized by Dental Council of India. On August 16, 1992, YDC was formally inaugurated. A new facility for Yenepoya Dental College, Yenepoya Hospital and Dental Clinic became functional in 1994. The first batch of BDS students, after completing their internship, came out in 1997. Yenepoya Dental College is affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore, after the latter was created in 1994 as a Centralized University for Health Sciences by the State Government of Karnataka.

This year YDC has completed 15 years of service and celebrated its 10<sup>th</sup> Graduation day. YDC's UG & PG courses are recognized by Dental Council of India and RGUHS,

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Bangalore, By 2002, YDC was sanctioned MDS courses in eight subjects and by 2006 all nine departments (including Community Dentistry) of the YDC have been successfully running postgraduate courses. These courses have attracted a large number of motivated candidates who have excelled in their academic performance & also become active partners in research & extension activities. All the institutions of IAE take part in extension activities, research programs and innovative programs, either individually or jointly and have been able to create an umbrella under which total and holistic health care is offered

Research and extension services form integral part of the academic programmes for the health education courses. Researches of relevance to the problems of local population are undertaken. The details of research projects of the YDC are furnished in Annexure. The YDC conducts frequent dental camps and community awareness camps. The Islamic Academy of Education through its health care institutions adopted Kotepura, one of the wards of Ullal town panchayat for addressing its community health and development needs. The Yenepoya Total Health Care & Development Project was formally launched on 28th January 2005 at the Sayved Madani -Yenepoya Medical & Dental College Rural Hospital, Ullal.

To achieve its objective for a holistic growth of the medical students, it has introduced several innovative and new programmes, such as, (i) Village adoption for total health care. This is an innovative programme, under which a village is provided total and comprehensive dental & medical health care and social up-liftment on a continuing basis as a part of educational programme in the field of Community Medicine. The Kotepura village has been adopted by the Yenepoya Medical & Dental Colleges, for total & holistic health care & betterment. (Annexure V) (ii) In order for the freshly joined students to get a birds eye view of how the overall medical education is going to be, the institutions conduct an orientation program (both under and postgraduates), wherein the students are taken around the campus and introduced to the faculty and the process of the education system is explained to them. By this the students realize what is expected of them & align their vision in a more meaningful manner. (iii) Dissertation writing is a difficult task that every postgraduate student is expected to know. The institutions conduct a 3 day orientation workshop, bringing in the best medical educators in the country to unravel the arduous nature of conducting research, creating a hypothesis, writing protocols &

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### IV. OBSERVATIONS OF THE COMMITTEE:

Islamic Academy of Education is a Religious Minority Trust established in the year 1991 under the Chairmanship of Al Hai Yenepova Abdulla Kunhi. The Trust was registered on November 13, 1991. IAE Trust has an established Yenepoya Dental College in the year 1992 and the same Trust has established Yenepoya Medical College, Yenepoya Nursing College, Yenopoya Institute of Nursing Sciences and Yenepoya Physiotherapy College during the years 1990-2004.

The Yenepoya Dental College is supported with Yenepoya Dental Hospital which was established in the year 1994. Presently, Yenepoya Dental College is running Undergraduate and Postgraduate courses in nine subjects. All the above Education Institutions are having well earmarked buildings, with sufficient space and infrastructure for running the said colleges. The colleges are located in an area of 32 acres of land owned by the same trust. The Yenepoya Dental College has more than 10 years of existence as per the UGC guidelines. The YDC has completed 15 years on the day of inspection of the UGC Committee (16th August, 2007). The YDC is running nine PG courses in various specialties. The laboratories are decently maintained, well established demarking with necessary pre-clinical and clinical laboratories and each department has well demarked areas for the UG and PG training programme supported with necessary and modern equipments including special equipments and accessories required for PG students. Every PG department has separate seminar rooms with LCD and Audio-visual facilities along with departmental library. The institution has provided three museums (1) Dental Material Museum (2) Histology Museum and (3) Anatomy Museum. The Committee was very much impressed with innovative displays, especially in the Dental Material Museum which is of its own kind in the country. One of the Pedodontia Department staff has specially designed a dental chairs which are innovative in nature and meant for children. In addition, special facilities are provided for physically and mentally challenged children in the Pedodontia Department. Magnified laminated display board in the department of Oral Medicine is quite useful for UG/PG students and also for patients' education amount and understanding.

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The Institute has provided adequate faculty members in most of the nine PG Departments who are full time and regular teaching faculty. Most of the teachers have got ID cards given by the Dental Council of India after their approval as recognized teachers by DCI. The faculty members are committed and most of the faculty members have been working in this Institution for more than 10 years and some of them are doing innovative research work. Two faculty members have written text books for Dental students which have been published. There are three well established laboratories, well equipped for research activities.

The Institution is carrying collaboration research work with international companies like Dental Implant Courses with Noble Bio-care Company, USA and Micro Mini Implants System Orthodontics with a Swiss based company. Research is being conducted after approval from Rajiv Gandhi University for Health Sciences and they have their own Medical Ethics Committee as per the instruction/guidelines of Govt. of India. The institution has provided a good library located in spacious building demarking separate space for Medical and Dental students. The Dental Library has 7126 books and 43 journals and 44 journals are online with digital library with internet and indexing facility. Further, the Institute has provided separate reading rooms for faculty members, for girls and boys in the library. The Institute is having an auditorium accommodating around 500 students and there is one well established canteen for faculty members, girls and boys students. The Institute has provided 10 quarters for the faculty members in the campus itself and 18 in the city of Mangalore and two guest houses meant for the visiting faculty members. The accommodation for the faculty members is well furnished and rent free. The institution has further provided separate hostel for boys accommodating 250 boys and 250 girls students respectively.

The Institution has provided Fixed Deposit for Rs. Five Crore as per the norms of UGC. Original necessary documents are physically verified. The institution has taken up the community activities by having two mobile dental vans well equipped for community dental services for rural population around Mangalore. Transportation facilities are there with a fleet of more than 14 buses and two vans. The Institute has two peripheral Community Centres of their own. The Institute is organizing Dental Camps minimum two per month throughout the year for people in rural village areas in

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the periphery of approximately 50 kms. The Institution has its own rain water harvesting system within the campus.

### **Recommendations:**

In view of the observations of the Committee, the Committee felt that Yenepoya Dental College deserves a deemed university status and thereby the Committee unanimously recommends the deemed university status to proposed Yenepoya University comprising of Yenepoya Dental College, Mangalore.
