I. Background of the Institution giving details of teaching, research and extension programme.

Sri Devaraj Urs Medical College was started in the year 1986 under the aegis of Sri Devaraj Urs Educational Trust for Backward Classes, an organization founded by a few like-minded dedicated people, registered in the year 1984 vide Registration No.135 dated 16.11.1984. (Annexure-I)

The major interest for forming this Trust was to focus on education and social service. The Medical College got the recognition by the Medical Council of India in the year 1992, signifying the commitment of the Trust not to have any compromise on the quality and quantity in terms of infrastructure facilities, qualified dedicated faculty and other supporting man power befitting the motto of the Trust. This success inspired the Trust to start several other educational Institutions in the fields of Nursing, Engineering, Arts & Science, and Primary and Secondary School.

The Medical College further in its expansion programme set up the R.L.Jalappa Hospital & Research Centre in 1994 which currently has a bed strength of 955. Apart from regular facilities, the other facilities available in the Hospital are Dialysis, Endoscopy, CT scan, Echo Cardiography with TMT, Cobalt Therapy Centre, fully equipped ICU, round the clock automated labs, Pharmacy, Blood bank, Accident and Trauma Care.



Following the establishment of the hospital, the Trust started Post Graduate programmes in various disciplines. At present, there are 15 Post Graduate departments which offer MD, MS and post graduate diploma courses recognised by the M.C.I.

The College in its endeavor to achieve academic excellence, has generated the atmosphere conducive for teaching and learning. This has been achieved by well trained qualified and dedicated teaching faculty, who ensure that superior quality education modalities and methodologies are developed and inculcated to the student community. Since the inception, the College has given due importance to research & related activities. The college has been the venue for several National and State level conferences of various scientific associations. With the commencement of post graduate courses in various departments there has been a greater thrust in the area of research. In the last 3 years, this institution has been able to publish about 50 research articles, 42 in National and 7 in International journals. The faculty is encouraged constantly to attend conferences and present papers. In the last 3 years, about 100 paper presentations have been made. Some departments are carrying out sponsored research programmes of World Health Organization (WHO), Raijv Gandhi University of Health Sciences (RGUHS), Bangalore, and Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR). The college in association with its hospital extends programmes beneficial to the rural people of Kolar district and bordering areas of surrounding states of Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu. Some of the extension programmes are rural health check-up camps, mother & child health camps, Blood donation camps, Cataract & cancer detection camps. Programmes like HIV-Hepatitis awareness & pulse polio are also carried out. The ISO 9001 -2000 certification and accreditation by NAAC India at the B+ level are steps forward in this endeavour.

Sri Devaraj Urs Educational Trust for Backward Classes established a separate Trust in the name and style of "Sri Devaraj Urs Academy of Higher Education and Research" in the year 2005 and transferred all the movable and immovable properties of Sri Devaraj Urs Medical College to this academy. IV. **OBSERVATIONS OF THE COMMITTEE**

After going through the various facilities available in Sri Devaraj Urs Medical College and the Hospital, the Committee unanimously recommends it for Deemed University Status. The Committee that certain areas are to be improved for the better teaching and training of Undergrduate and Postgraduat students, academic areas and also to take better care and the development of the society in and around the Institute. The areas which need to be improved are as follows :-

- 1. Strict implementation of Government's Reservation Policy in admissions and recruitment of teaching and non-teaching at all levels.
- Implementation of various National Health Policies. 2.
- A pyramidal system from the level of Professor upto Lecturer should be followed in teaching 3. departments.
- Infrastructural facilities need to be augmented like ICCU Additional ABG machine (for ICU, 4. CCU and emergency) must be made available to cater to the need of the patients in case the existing one goes out of order.
- 5. Ventilators are to be provided in acute care unit.
- Library Though there are large number of journals, yet more hard copies need to be made 6. available and hard copies of standardized international journals must be made available in respective speciality.
- Teachers should publish more number of research papers in their respective field. 7.
